Tech faces Duke in first ACC home series of 2012

The weekend series: Tech continues its 119th season of baseball this weekend as the Hokies will host Duke in their first three-game ACC home series at English Field, where they have won eight straight contests to start the season.

Tech enters with a two-game winning streak and are now just one win shy of 2,000 in their program's history - career program record is 1,999-1,365-25.

History vs. Duke: The Hokies have faced the Yellow Jackets 45 times in their history and hold a 20-25 record all-time, which includes a 10-11 mark in ACC action.

Tech does hold the edge in games played in Blacksburg, 9-7, and have won two straight series against the Blue Devils. That includes last year in Durham, N.C., as the Hokies won the series when Joe Parsons pitched the team's only complete game shutout of the season, 9-0, on Sunday after the Hokies won the day before in extra innings, 6-5.

Off to a hot start: The Hokies come into the weekend's ACC series with an overall record of 17-6, which is the best start at the school in 20 years and better than the 2010 and 2003 squads by two games. That 2010 team, which made the NCAA tournament, was 15-8 after 23 games, while in 1993, the Hokies started that season 19-4. The fastest teams to 20 wins over the last 20 years includes 2010 (29), 2003 (28) and 1993 (27).

Thanks to some home hospitality: Off to the fast start is helped when the team has opened the season with eight straight wins at home. The mark is the best to open a season at English Field, just passing the 1993 team that started 7-0 at home. It is noted that in 1992, the team went unbeaten in 13 games, but tied the third game of the year. Ironically (No. 1), in both of those years, the team lost its first game on April 3.

The last time Tech started 8-0 at home was in 1983 (at Tech Park), and that team lost its ninth game. In 1982, the Hokies started 12-0 at Tech Park, ironically (No. 2) both of those teams lost their first game at home on April 10.

Speaking of that 2010 squad: Through two weeks of the ACC season, only the 2010 and 2007 teams had at least two wins, now matched by this year's team. Those previous seasons, the Hokies were 4-5 record after week three, the most wins in ACC play at that point. It could go either way, though, after as in 2010, they were the only Tech team with a .500 or better ACC mark at 16-14, while in 2007, they finished 7-23.

Preseason All-American: After a stellar 2011 campaign, redshirt-junior **Andrew Rash** has been named to a pair of preseason All-American teams. He picked up his first major honor as he was selected as preseason Louisville Slugger All-American, third team as an outfielder, as chosen by Collegiate Baseball. That was followed by a third team outfield AA honor by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association.

Doubling up a record: **Chad Pinder** made a bit of history in the team's first weekend at the Kennesaw State Tournament. Pinder tied an ACC and Tech record for doubles in a game with his four two-baggers against Bradley on Feb. 18, becoming just the second Hokie and ninth ACC player to accomplish the feat (see chart below).

Assisting a record: Second baseman **Alex Perez** also made a bit of history in the team's win at High Point (2/28). He became just the third Hokie to register 10 assists in a single game, matching **Rick Wade** (3B, vs. Marshall, 4/28/76) and **Mike Terhune** (2B, vs. Fresno State, 3/17/95) for the most in a game.

Shaban's record watch: Before his senior season, **Ronnie Shaban** became just the sixth Hokie to reach the 200-hit plateau as a junior (box right) with the milestone hit coming on an RBI double on May 19 against Georgia Tech.

He has a chance to place his name in a number of categories in Tech's record book, as he approaches the top five all-time in the following career categories: at-bats (130 shy of fifth), hits (45), triples (2), total bases (95) and RBI (34).

The double record is within reach for Shaban, as he just tied **Bo Durkac** (1993-95, 60) for second on the all-time list and is six away from school record holder **Addison Bowman** (1998-01, 66).

He also has a chance to move into the top 25 all-time in the ACC in doubles (two shy) and RBI (52).

Driving Tech to wins: Known as "Big Ron", Tech finished its 2011 season with a 14-3 mark when the Abbott bus driver drove the Hokies to their game-day site. Of the three losses, two were on walk-off home runs - a 6-5 defeat at Coastal Carolina (2/20) and a 5-3 loss at Wake Forest (4/10). The other one, a 3-2 loss at Duke, in which the winning run was scored in the eighth frame. "Big Ron" has been behind the wheel for all of Tech's destination this season and has posted an 9-6 mark so far in 2012.

Facing nationally ranked teams: At this point, there are six teams on the Tech schedule that are nationally ranked by at least one poll, and the Hokies have already faced two of them - Virginia and Georgia Tech, going 2-4 against the pair. Still on their schedule are four more ranked teams and three others receiving votes and that doesn't include Clemson, who isn't on the schedule this year. All-time under Hughes, the Hokies are 27-67 against ranked opponents (*more box right*).

Putting runs on the scoreboard: Last year, Tech scored 10+ runs 16 times and finished the season 14-2, but were 0-6 when their opponent scored 10+. They are 7-0 so far in 2012, and have allowed just 10 once.

Meanwhile, Tech was 4-0 in shutouts last year and have posted one so far this year, March 4 against Yale. The Hokies have not been shutout in 116 straight games - the longest such streak in the ACC. The Hokies were last held without a run in a 5-0 loss to Wake Forest (3/27/10-G1).

Adding to that, on March 18, 2008, the Hokies were shutout in an exhibition game against the New York Yankees, 11-0. Since then, a combined 230 games, they have only been shutout three times.

Home run breakdown: Of the 20 home runs hit this season, 14 have been solo shots - with seven of those leading off an inning. Four have been hit with on man aboard, and two have been hit with two. Last year, Tech recorded almost 30 percent of its RBI via the long ball, this season just 17.8 percent (28 of 157).

Using power and speed: Last year, the Hokies finished among the nation's top 10 in home runs hit and this year is no different, they were ranked 16th in home runs hit entering the week. However, a big difference in their scoring, which had them 15th in the nation in runs scored entering the week, has been their speed - 25th in the nation in stolen bases. They have already swiped 38 bags this season, 12 shy of last year's total, and tied for second among ACC teams.

More on national numbers: It's early, but the NCAA ranks 25 team categories and Tech is in the top 100 in 23 (sac bunts, 157 and ERA, 108). They are in the top 50 in 17 categories and the top 25 in 11. That includes sac flies (10), hit by pitch (19), hits (13), triples (13), slugging (21) and strikeouts per nine innings (17).

Irony runs through first walk-off win: The Hokies 4-3 walk-off win over Iowa (2/26) at Watson Stadium on Coastal Carolina's campus held a bit of irony. The last time Tech played a game on that field, the Chanticleers were celebrating a 6-5 walk-off win (Feb. 20, 2011) over Tech.

The second ironic part of the victory, was the last time the Hokies played on the field before that loss, they registered their last win when trailing entering the ninth inning. The Hokies trailed Tennessee Tech, 9-8, but scored three in the top of the ninth and held on for an 11-9 victory.

Hokies walk-off again: Under Coach Hughes, Tech has registered eight walk-off victories, which includes three this season - against Iowa, Yale, and Cornell. Rash's solo home run against the Bulldogs in Game 1 (3/4) lifted the Hokies to a 6-5 win. He became the second Hokie (under Hughes) to hit a walk-off home run, as *Austin Waters* did the same, but in the 10th frame, a 5-4 win over No. 10 Virginia on May 14, 2009. Of the eight wins, two have been in extra innings.

Comeback wins: Certainly, it's up for debate what is truly a comeback win, but Tech has pulled out wins in 12 games this season in which they have trailed. However there should be no debate to these comebacks, as they have registered victories in nine games when trailing as late as the bottom of the fifth inning, including two games entering the ninth. They had just one win when trailing in the ninth all of last year.

Tech a bit sloppy: In their first loss of the season at Kennesaw State (2/19) and in the first game of the Baseball at the Beach tournament versus West Virginia (2/24), the Hokies registered back-to-back five-error games. The last time Tech committed at least five errors and won was April 9, 2012 - they actually had six - in a 9-7 win over Miami

Since the win over the Mountaineers, the Hokies have registered just 15 errors in 680 chances (18 games), for a fielding percentage of .978.

Starting pitching is deep/experienced: For the first time in head coach **Pete Hughes'** tenure at Tech, he has two starting pitchers returning to the mound that made 14 starts each and logged more than 84 innings apiece. Redshirt-senior **Marc Zecchino** and junior **Joe Mantiply** highlight an experience starting rotation that adds redshirt-senior **Manny Martir** (six career starts in two years at Tech), junior **Patrick Scoggin** (eight starts) and sophomore **Eddie Campbell** (six starts).

Newcomers with starting experience include redshirt-senior **Andrew Aizenstadt** (26 career starts at Babson College), junior **Tanner McIntyre** (26 career starts at Butte College) and redshirt-sophomore **Devin Burke** (three career starts at Duke).

Starters start season strong: Opening weekend, Tech starters allowed just one earned run (second inning of game one) over 24 innings pitched with 26 strikeouts. In all, the starters combined to throw 31 straight frames without allowing an earned run before Coastal Carolina scored a single run in the sixth. Martir (9), Mantiply (12), Zecchino (5) and Scoggin (5) notched the unearned outings, which was the longest such stretch during the Hughes' era.

Bullpen continued unearned streak: The starters combined with the bullpen during the opening weekend to throw 28 straight frames and not allow an earned run. That streak continued until the fifth inning against West Virginia, but the 32 total frames was the longest in the Hughes' era, passing last year's staff that notched 29 straight during the Bryant series (March 4-5).

Gimme two: Tech has turned 19 double plays, which is tied for seventh in the ACC and was 47th in the nation entering the week.

Eleven pitchers have been on the mound for the twin killings, with six pitchers benefitting from at least two already - **Eddie Campbell** (4), **Manny Martir** (3), **Andrew Aizenstadt** (2), **Joe Mantiply** (2), **Colin O'Keefe** (2) and **Patrick Scoggin** (2) - while **Jake Joyce** (1), **Clark Labitan** (1), **Ronnie Shaban** (1) and **Marc Zecchino** (1) each have one.

Staying put: This season, the Hokie bullpen has inherited 42 runners, with 15 of them scoring (35.7%). **Eddie Campbell** (9) and **Tanner McIntyre** (3) have not allowed any to score. **Andrew Aizenstadt** has allowed one of six, while **Jake Joyce** has inherited 18 with 10 crossing the plate and **Clark Labitan** has allowed four of six to score.

Getting help from the outfield: Tech has just one outfield assists this season.

Kyle Wernicki 1 - vs. Bradley (2/17) at third base.

Getting help from the bench: Tech has been helped, not only from its pinch-hitters, who have come through with eight hits, five RBI and two walks in 19 pinch-hit opportunities, but from its bench as a whole. Below are the differences between Tech and its opponents from both batters and pitchers.

Success on the road: Last year, after dropping its first ACC series at Miami, Tech finished 12-4 in its last 16 road games, 8-4 in conference including winning its last three series. Overall, Tech's 14 wins on the road was the most since 2009 (13) and before that was the 16 won in 2003.

It also ranked tied for the 18th-most won in the nation at the end of the regular season. Their 16 wins away from Blacksburg tied the 2003 and 2000 teams, which had 16 wins away from Tech, the most of any team since the turn of the century. That mark was tied for 14th in the country at the end of the regular season.

Lastly, their eight wins on the road in the conference was the most ever since joining the ACC Conference and the Hokies overall 8-7 record marked the first time they finished over .500 in league play.

Tech success in home openers and in Blacksburg: Since 1989, when the Hokies began playing at English Field, they are 19-5 all-time in home openers after its 15-3 win over Yale in game one on March 3. They have won 12 of their last 15 home openers and under Coach Hughes, they are 5-1.

All-time, Tech is 388-200-3 in 23-plus seasons at English Field and 1,163-487-17 in games played at home.
