Tech's ACC second half starts with No. 6 Miami

The weekend series: Tech continues its 119th season of baseball this weekend welcoming No. 6 Miami to English Field for a three-game ACC series. The Hokies have won 13 straight non-conference games after their 13-5 win at Radford on Tuesday, which continued an overall five-game winning streak that included a three-game ACC series sweep of Boston College last weekend in Blacksburg.

History vs. Miami: This is the eighth straight year the Hokies will face Miami, two teams that never played each other before Tech joined the ACC. Miami holds the edge in the series at 17-4, but three of those Hokie wins have been in Blacksburg, including a win over then-No. 1 Miami, 7-6, on May 10, 2008. It also includes Tech taking two of three from the No. 9 Hurricanes the last time the two teams squared off at English Field in 2010. The Hokies won Friday, 9-7, lost Saturday, 9-2, and took Sunday's game, 4-2.

A Chase to 25 and 30: Enjoying a five-game winning streak, Tech has now pushed its season win total to 23 in 35 games. Only two teams since 2000 have reached 25 wins before game number 40 - the 2003 (36) and 2010 squads (38). Beyond that, only during those two seasons did a team reach the 30-win plateau before the 50th game of the year with the 2010 team getting there in 44 and the 2003 team in 46 contests.

Enjoying the home-field advantage: The Hokies opened the season with eight straight wins at home. The mark was the best ever to open a season at English Field, passing the 1993 team that started 7-0 at home.

The last time Tech started 8-0 at home was in 1983 (at Tech Park), and that team lost its ninth game as did the 2012 Hokies. The eight straight victories at home was the longest in a single season since 2004 (March 6-20) when the team won seven in a row (also done in 1993 and 1999) and was one short of a 1997 streak (April 19-May 11).

Since joining the ACC, only the 2010 squad won more than 20 games at home (24), something the 2012 team has a chance at, since 14 of its next 17 are at English Field.

What's trending with a third of the season left: With 35 games played and 20 regular season games left, here is some trends for the team. The Hokies are 18-2 when registering 10+ hits, 17-6 when they steal at least one base, 12-2 when they score first, 12-1 when they strike out 10+ batters, 7-3 when they hit at least two home runs and 0-1 when allowing two or more.

Individually, the team is 12-1 when **Chad Pinder** doubles, 14-3 when **Jake Atwell** scores a run, 13-3 when **Johnny Morales** notches a multi-hit game and 6-2 when **Tyler Horan** hits a home run - ironically 0-1 when he hit two in a game (Duke, 3/23).

When checking the scoreboard, it's noted that Tech is 19-2 when either leading (15-1) or tied (4-1) after six innings, 21-2 when either leading (18-1) or tied (3-1) after seven frames and 21-1 when either leading (19-1) or tied (2-0) after eight innings.

One man streaking: **Mark Zagunis** has reached base in 27 straight games, the longest current and overall streak on the team this year and the longest for a Hokie since **Austin Wates** (28 straight, 2010). Before that was **Anthony Sosnoskie** (2009) at 41 straight.

Preseason All-American: After a stellar 2011 campaign, redshirt-junior **Andrew Rash** has been named to a pair of preseason All-American teams. He picked up his first major honor as he was selected as preseason Louisville Slugger All-American, third team as an outfielder, as chosen by Collegiate Baseball. That was followed by a third team outfield AA honor by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association.

Doubling up a record: **Chad Pinder** made a bit of history in the team's first weekend at the Kennesaw State Tournament. Pinder tied an ACC and Tech record for doubles in a game with his four two-baggers against Bradley on Feb. 18, becoming just the second Hokie and ninth ACC player to accomplish the feat (see chart below).

Approaching a "second": Pinder enters the weekend with an ACC-best 18 doubles which is also among the nation's best. However, he is still five shy of placing his name among the five best in a single season at Tech (*Alan El-Amin*, 22, 1988), but is only nine shy of tying the single-season record held by *Steve Domecus* (27, 2010).

Matching a "third": **Alex Perez** tied a Tech single game record last week when he tripled two times against Boston College (4/6). Perez had matched a feat that had been done just 11 times prior to the Friday contest and most recently by former Tech player *Austin Wates* (Feb. 28, 2010). It was also tied an ACC record, done 51 times prior.

Assisting another: Second baseman Perez also made a bit of history earlier in the season in the team's win at High Point (2/28). He became just the third Hokie to register 10 assists in a single game, matching *Rick Wade* (3B, vs. Marshall, 4/28/76) and *Mike Terhune* (2B, vs. Fresno State, 3/17/95) for the most in a single game.

Shaban's record watch: Before his senior season, **Ronnie Shaban** became just the sixth Hokie to reach the 200-hit plateau as a junior with the milestone hit coming on an RBI double on May 19 against Georgia Tech.

He has a chance to place his name in a number of categories in Tech's record book, as he approaches the top five all-time in the following career categories: at-bats (114 shy of fifth), hits (37), triples (2), total bases (86) and RBI (28).

The double record is also within reach for Shaban, as he just passed *Bo Durkac* (1993-95, 60) for second on the all-time list and is five away from school record holder *Addison Bowman* (1998-01, 66).

He also has a chance to move into the top 25 all-time in the ACC in doubles (one shy and ties him at 23rd all-time) and RBI (46).

Putting runs on the scoreboard: Tech has scored 10+ runs 10 times and are 10-0 when doing so. The Hokies have allowed 10 or more three times and have lost all three.

Meanwhile, the Hokies shutout streak just ended against Duke (3/24) as they were shutout for the first time in 118 straight games - which was the longest streak in the ACC. The Hokies were last held without a run in a 5-0 loss to Wake Forest (3/27/10-G1), almost two years.

Adding to that, on March 18, 2008, the Hokies were shutout in an exhibition game against the New York Yankees, 11-0. Since then, a combined 242 games, they have only been shutout four times.

Home run breakdown: Of the 31 home runs hit this year, 20 have been solo shots - with nine of those leading off an inning. Seven have been hit with one man aboard, and four have been hit with two. Last year, Tech recorded almost 30 percent of its RBI via the long ball, this season just 20.1 percent (46 of 223). The last grand slam hit by Tech was hit by **Ronnie Shaban** on April 16, 2011 at English Field against Florida State. In fact, he's hit the last two (4/3/10 at FSU) and has three in his career.

A pair of two home run games: Tyler Horan and Chad Pinder have now each hit two home runs in one game with Horan going deep on Duke's Marcus Stroman with two solo shots (3/23), while Pinder hit his two solo home runs at Florida State (4/1). Last year, the Hokies had three players hit a pair of home runs in a single game six times, with **Andrew Rash** doing it three times. The last time a Tech player hit three home runs in a game was **Chris Kay** on May 10, 2009 against Delaware State and the last player to do it in an ACC game was **Sean O'Brien** against Maryland on April 4, 2008 in Blacksburg.

Using power and speed: Last year, the Hokies finished among the nation's top 10 in home runs hit and this year is no different, they were ranked 16th in home runs entering the week. However, a big difference in their scoring, which had them 48th in the nation in runs scored has been their speed - 14th in the nation in doubles (76), seventh in triples (16) and 53rd in stolen bases. They have already swiped 47 bags this season, three shy of last year's total of 50.

Irony runs through first walk-off win: The Hokies 4-3 walk-off win over Iowa (2/26) at Watson Stadium on Coastal Carolina's campus held a bit of irony. The last time Tech played a game on that field, the Chanticleers were celebrating a 6-5 walk-off win (Feb. 20, 2011) over Tech.

The second ironic part of the victory, was the last time the Hokies played on the field before that loss, they registered their last win when trailing entering the ninth inning. The Hokies trailed Tennessee Tech, 9-8, but scored three in the top of the ninth and held on for an 11-9 victory.

Hokies walk-off again: Under Coach Hughes, Tech has registered eight walk-off victories, which includes three this season - against Iowa, Yale, and Cornell. Rash's solo home run against the Bulldogs in Game 1 (3/4) lifted the Hokies to a 6-5 win. He became the second Hokie (under Hughes) to hit a walk-off home run, as **Austin Wates** did the same, but in the 10th frame, a 5-4 win over No. 10 Virginia on May 14, 2009. Of the eight wins, two have been in extra innings.

Comeback wins: Certainly, it's up for debate what is truly a comeback win, but Tech has pulled out wins in 16 games this season in which they have trailed. However there should be no debate to these comebacks, as they have registered victories in 11 games when trailing as late as entering the fifth inning, which includes two games entering the ninth. They had just one win when trailing in the ninth all of last year.

Tech a bit sloppy: In their first loss of the season at Kennesaw State (2/19) and in the first game of the Baseball at the Beach tournament versus West Virginia (2/24), the Hokies registered back-to-back five-error games. The last time Tech committed at least five errors and won was April 9, 2012 - they actually had six - in a 9-7 win over Miami.

Since the win over the Mountaineers, Tech has registered just 30 errors in 1,143 chances (30 games) for a fielding percentage of .974.

They did, however, register another five-error game, their third of the season, against Wofford, but it was another win.

Starting pitching is deep/experienced: For the first time in head coach **Pete Hughes'** tenure at Tech, he has two starting pitchers returning to the mound that made 14 starts each and logged more than 84 innings apiece. Redshirt-senior **Marc Zecchino** and junior **Joe Mantiply** highlight an experience starting rotation that adds redshirt-senior **Manny Martir** (six career starts in two years at Tech), junior **Patrick Scoggin** (eight starts) and sophomore **Eddie Campbell** (six starts).

Newcomers with starting experience include redshirt-senior **Andrew Aizenstadt** (26 career starts at Babson College), junior **Tanner McIntyre** (26 career starts at Butte College) and redshirt-sophomore **Devin Burke** (three career starts at Duke).

Starters start season strong: During the opening weekend, Tech starters allowed just one earned run (second inning of game one) over 24 innings pitched with 26 strikeouts. In all, the starters combined to throw 31 straight frames without allowing an earned run before Coastal Carolina scored a single run in the sixth. Martir (9), Mantiply (12), Zecchino (5) and Scoggin (5) notched the unearned frames, which was the longest such stretch during the Hughes' era.

Bullpen continued unearned streak: The starters combined with the bullpen during the opening weekend to throw 28 straight frames and not allow an earned run. That streak continued until the fifth inning against West Virginia, but the 32 total frames was the longest in the Hughes' era, passing last year's staff that notched 29 straight during the Bryant series (March 4-5).

Gimme two: Tech has turned 34 double plays, which is tied for second in the ACC and was 23rd in the nation entering the week. Fourteen pitchers (all but one, **Jake Atwell**) have been on the mound for the twin killings. Here is the breakdown by pitcher - **Patrick Scoggin** (6), **Eddie Campbell** (4), **Marc Zecchino** (4), **Manny Martir** (3), **Jake Joyce** (3), **Andrew Aizenstadt** (2), **Devin Burke** (2), **Clark Labitan** (2), **Joe Mantiply** (2), **Colin O'Keefe** (2), **Ricky Hodges** (1), **Sean Keselica** (1), **Tanner McIntyre** (1) and **Ronnie Shaban** (1).

Staying put: This season, the Hokie bullpen has inherited 58 runners, with 20 of them scoring (34.5%). **Eddie Campbell** (11) has not allowed any to score, while **Andrew Aizenstadt** has allowed one of six and **Patrick Scoggin** one of four. **Tanner McIntyre** has allowed two of eight, **Clark Labitan** has allowed five of eight to score and **Jake Joyce** has inherited 21 with 11 crossing the plate.

Getting help from the outfield: Tech has just one outfield assists this season.

Tyler Horan 2 - vs. Wofford (4/3) at third base; vs. Boston College (4/6) at home.

Jake Atwell 1 - vs. Duke (3/24) at second base as part of a double play.

Kyle Wernicki 1 - vs. Bradley (2/17) at third base.

Getting help from the bench: Tech has been helped, not only from its pinch-hitters, six RBI on 11 hits and two walks in 27 pinch-hit opportunities, but from its bench as a whole. Below are the differences between Tech and its opponents from both hitters and pitchers.

Tech success in home openers and in Blacksburg: Since 1989, when the Hokies began playing at English Field, they are 19-5 all-time in home openers after their 15-3 win over Yale in game one on March 3. They have won 12 of their last 15 home openers and under Coach Hughes, they are 5-1.

All-time, Tech is 391-203-3 in 23-plus seasons at English Field and 1,167-490-17 in games played at home. Under Coach Hughes, the Hokies are 95-70 in games at English Field.

Success on the road: Last year, after dropping its first ACC series at Miami, Tech finished 12-4 in its last 16 road games, including 8-4 in conference and won its last three series. Overall, Tech's 14 wins on the road was the most since 2009 (13) and before that was the 16 won in 2003.

Their 16 wins away from Blacksburg tied the 2003 and 2000 teams, which had 16 wins away from home, the most of any team since the turn of the century.

Lastly, their eight wins on the road in the conference was the most ever since joining the ACC and the Hokies overall 8-7 record marked the first time they finished over .500 in league play.

This season, Tech has already won 11 away from Blacksburg and seven on the road. However, they are just 2-7 in road ACC contests.

Driving Tech to wins: Known as "Big Ron", Tech finished its 2011 season with a 14-3 mark when the Abbott bus driver drove the Hokies to their game-day site. Of the three losses, two were on walk-off home runs - a 6-5 defeat at Coastal Carolina (2/20) and a 5-3 loss at Wake Forest (4/10). "Big Ron" has been behind the wheel for most of Tech's destination this season and has posted an 10-6 mark so far in 2012.
