Tech travels to Cary, N.C. for four games in Irish Classic

The weekend series: The Hokies continue their 120th season of baseball with a four-game series at the USA Complex in Cary, N.C. They open with Rhode Island, who after this weekend will have played 10 of 11 games against ranked opponents, and Ohio in a doubleheader on Friday before squaring off with No. 22 Notre Dame on Saturday and the first of two games this year against Tennessee on Sunday.

A return to the Top 25: With its success the first weekend of the season, Tech found itself ranked in the Top 25 in the latest poll released by Baseball America, entering at No. 24. It marked the first time the Hokies have been ranked since the end of the 2010 season, when they were 16th in the BA poll heading into the NCAA Baseball Championship.

Still ranked at No. 25, and with Notre Dame ranked No. 22, it will mark the first time since June 6, 2010 that a ranked Tech team will face another ranked team. They lost that game to No. 8 South Carolina, 10-2, in the regional.

Four games versus 2012 conference champs: In the opening weekend of 2013, Tech was the only team in the country to face two conference tournament champions (who are also picked to repeat), and went 4-0 over the weekend.

Tech was one of just four teams in the nation that started the year with a total of four games against a team (or teams) that won a 2012 conference tournament title. The others:

Portland (0-4) at Mississippi State (SEC) Miss. Valley St. (1-3) vs. Prairie View A&M (SWAC) West Michigan (0-4) at Pepperdine (West Coast)

Facing RV teams: Although the Notre Dame game will be the first for Tech this year against a ranked opponent (top 30), Tech is 5-0 against teams receiving votes in various polls -Kent State (2-0), UNCW (2-0) and Radford (1-0).

English Field - Home of the Hokies

English Field was officially dedicated during a special ceremony on April 8, 1989 and is named for the late E.R. 'Red' English and his wife, Ruth, who provided financial support for construction of the field.

English, a native of Altavista, Va., played as an offensive and defensive guard on the Tech football

teams from 1930-33 and graduated from Tech in 1934. English contributed to Tech athletics for more than 50 years and was one of the founders of The Student Aid Association in 1949. He served as president of that organization two of its first three years. English received the most outstanding alumni award at Tech in 1984.

Through a generous gift from alumnus George Sampson, the home team dugout was named for long-time Tech baseball coach G.F. 'Red' Laird during a ceremony on April 12, 1991. Laird recruited and coached Sampson at Tech.

The Tech athletics department continues to make upgrades to the facility, with its newest completed in the spring of 2012. The natural grass surface was replaced with artificial turf. The \$1 million field enables the Hokies to practice even during inclement weather, as grounds keepers can remove snow off of it quickly.

Plus, it also drains quickly, allowing for a speedy resumption of play following any rain delays. Also, as part of this project, the dugouts were expanded to almost twice the size, and a new batter's eye and a new padded outfield fence were added.

The Hokies opened play at their new home with a 7-2 victory against George Mason on March 22, 1989, and went on to post a 17-7 home record during their first season in the facility. The team's year-by-year and overall mark at English Field can be seen in the graph on the right.

Prior to the 2004 season, a new lighting system was installed and the Hokies played their first baseball game under the lights in Blacksburg on April 28 of that year, defeating VMI, 8-0.

Before English Field, Tech played its home baseball games at Tech Park, where it compiled a 431-122-1 record over 34 seasons. For a complete history of all the improvements made to English Field, visit http://www.hokiesports.com/baseball/englishfield.

Non-conference win streak: The Hokies ended the 2012 season on an 18-game non-conference winning streak, the longest streak at the school since 1982, when Tech posted 20 straight in a single season. There have been just three streaks longer in a single season.

The Hokies then extended their non-conference winning streak to 22 straight, before losing to Temple last Friday. That streak was the third longest ever in the program's history (spanning more than one season and excluding postseason) and was just three wins shy of matching a streak attained almost a century ago.

Comeback wins: Certainly, it's up for debate what is truly a comeback win, but last year Tech pulled out wins in 25 games in which they trailed. However there should be no debate to the 19 times they came back when trailing as late as entering their at-bats in the fifth and included four games entering their at-bats in the ninth.

Comeback win - not necessary in first weekend: Twenty-five of 34 wins (73.5 percent) of Tech's victories last year saw the team trail at one time during the contest.

During the first four games of this season, Tech did not trail at any point during the weekend. More impressive, excluding its first at-bats of the game, the Hokies came to the plate just four times in 30 innings with the game tied. That was mostly due to the team scoring in the first frame in three of the games, for a total of six runs.

Still haven't trailed too often: Going into weekend number three an following up on their first weekend's success, the Hokies have only trailed when they've come to the plate in eight innings this season, which includes three in their loss to Temple.

In its four wins this past week, Tech trailed just five times when coming to bat. In three of those instances, their opponent scored in the top half to take the lead only to see Tech respond with runs of its own in its home half and never looked back.

Hokies walk-off seven times: Under Hughes, Tech has registered 12 walk-off victories in six years, which included seven last season.

Andrew Rash's solo home run against Yale in Game 1 (3/4/12) lifted the Hokies to a 6-5 win. He became the second Hokie (under Hughes) to hit a walk-off home run, as Austin Wates did the same, but in the 10th in a 5-4 win over No. 10 Virginia (5/14/09).

Of the 12 walk-off wins, three were in extra innings giving Tech six straight regular-season extra-inning wins including a pair last year - also winning at Virginia (3/9) in 11 innings - before NC State beat them in 11 frames the second to last weekend of 2012.

Starting pitching continues to shine: A huge question mark entering the 2013 season was starting pitching, as the Hokies returned just 15 career starts from its rotation minus staff ace Joe Mantiply's 34 career starts. However, Devin Burke (6.0IP/1H/0R/6K), Brad Markey (7.0IP/8H/1R/5K) and Tanner McIntyre (6.0IP/3H/2R/8K) all produced quality starts and helped Tech sweep the weekend in Wilmington, N.C. Overall, Tech starters have combined for a 6-0 record with a 3.38 ERA and 43 strikeouts in 50.2 innings pitched.

Not to be outshined: Last year, Tech's bullpen was solid and seeing two of its pitchers move into a starters role did not cause any problems. In the first weekend, Jake Joyce (W,S), Clark Labitan (S) and the rest of the pen combined to toss 12.0 innings and post a 1.50 ERA. Overall, the pen has a 2-1 record with four saves with an ERA of 4.60 in 29.1 innings. Minus the Radford game, in which they scored six runs late, the ERA is 3.33.

Freshman class came through all season: Tech's first-year guys last year held their own at the plate all season. Below is the "by class" stats for the 2012 team.

Home (state) away from home: During the 2013 season, Tech is scheduled to play 28 games at English Field, a good sign, because entering the season the team has a .659 winning percentage in its 24-year history and have had just two losing seasons at the place.

However, of their 28 road games scheduled, the Hokies will play in the state of North Carolina 16 times, which included a 4-0 start to open the season and four games this weekend. The Hokies will get used to the I-81 to I-77 road trip.

The other locations include three each in the state of Florida, Maryland and Massachusetts, while playing two others in Virginia and one in Tennessee.

Helping to Strike Out ALS: The Virginia Tech baseball team is partnering with Bull & Bones Brewhaus and Grill to help raise awareness and funds for ALS research. With every strikeout recorded by Tech's pitching staff this season, \$5 will be donated to The Angel Fund in the name of Pete Frates - a former Hughes player (at Boston College) who was diagnosed with the disease just last year. The amount will go up to \$10 for strikeouts recorded in any ACC Tournament game and \$25 for any 2013 Strikeouts **Total money raised** strikeout in an NCAA Regional or Super \$305

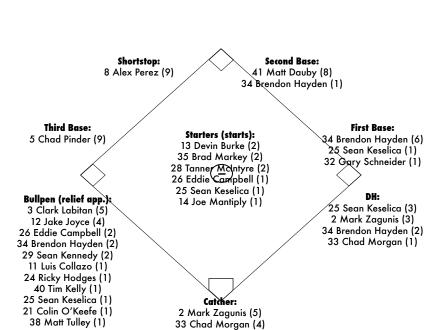
