Top 25 matchup highlights ACC weekend at English Field

The weekend series: The Hokies, currently ranked No. 24 by Baseball America, continue their 120th season of baseball this weekend against No. 14 Georgia Tech, welcoming the Yellow Jackets to English Field for a three-game ACC set.

A return to the Top 25: With its success the first weekend of the season, Tech found itself ranked in the Top 25 in the first in-season Baseball America poll, entering at No. 24. It marked the first time the Hokies had been ranked since the end of the 2010 season, when they were 16th in the BA poll heading into the NCAA Baseball Championship.

Facing a ranked GT: Since joining the ACC, Virginia Tech has faced Georgia Tech 25 times, which includes a game in the 2010 ACC Championship in Greensboro, N.C. The Hokies have not faced an unranked Yellow Jacket team in their time in the ACC, as Georgia Tech has been ranked as high as No. 3 and as low as 21 in those matchups.

Ranked and facing GT: Of those 25 games against a ranked Georgia Tech team, the Hokies have been ranked just four times and all four were during the 2010 season. The first three came in an ACC series in Atlanta, Ga. when VT was

No. 20 and GT was No. 3. VT won the series, 2-1. The last

time was in the ACC Championship, when the No. 18 Hokies defeated the No. 6 Yellow Jackets, 6-2, on the first day of the tournament.

An unfamiliar start: In nine season in the ACC, this will be just the second time Virginia Tech will open the conference slate at home, ending a seven-year stretch of opening on the road. The last time the Hokies opened an ACC season at home, they hosted No. 11 North Carolina. The series consisted of the opener - a UNC victory - while the rest of the weekend was cancelled due to rain. In season-opening games, Tech is now 3-5 with wins over the Yellow Jackets (5-3) in 2007, Duke (19-4) in 2009, and an 10-8 victory in 11 innings last year at Virginia.

English Field - Home of the Hokies

English Field was officially dedicated during a special ceremony on April 8, 1989 and is named for the late E.R. 'Red' English and his wife, Ruth, who provided financial support for construction of the field.

English, a native of Altavista, Va., played as an offensive and defensive guard on the Tech football

teams from 1930-33 and graduated from Tech in 1934. English contributed to Tech athletics for more than 50 years and was one of the founders of The Student Aid Association in 1949. He served as president of that organization two of its first three years. English received the most outstanding alumni award at Tech in 1984.

Through a generous gift from alumnus George Sampson, the home team dugout was named for long-time Tech baseball coach G.F. 'Red' Laird during a ceremony on April 12, 1991. Laird recruited and coached Sampson at Tech.

The Tech athletics department continues to make upgrades to the facility, with its newest completed in the spring of 2012. The natural grass surface was replaced with artificial turf. The \$1 million field enables the Hokies to practice even during inclement weather, as grounds keepers can remove snow off of it quickly.

Plus, it also drains quickly, allowing for a speedy resumption of play following any rain delays. Also, as part of this project, the dugouts were expanded to almost twice the size, and a new batter's eye and a new padded outfield fence were added.

The Hokies opened play at their new home with a 7-2 victory against George Mason on March 22, 1989, and went on to post a 17-7 home record during their first season in the facility. The team's year-by-year and overall mark in its 25th seasons at English Field can be seen in the graph on the right.

Prior to the 2004 season, a new lighting system was installed and the Hokies played their first baseball game under the lights in Blacksburg on April 28 of that year, defeating VMI, 8-0.

Before English Field, Tech played its home baseball games at Tech Park, where it compiled a 431-122-1 record over 34 seasons.

More on the ACC Openers: The Hokies have only won one of their ACC series openers against No. 21 Georgia Tech in 2007 (2-1). They have been swept in openers by No. 21 Miami (2006), No. 19 Georgia Tech (2008), No. 7 Clemson (2010) and Miami (2011). They've lost to Duke (2009) and No. 27 Virginia (2012).

Including this year, the Hokies have faced a ranked opponent in seven of their nine openers. This will mark the first time as a member of the ACC that Virginia Tech will be ranked in its ACC season opener.

One last note on the series opener: Tech enters the weekend a winner in its last game, a 7-3 victory over Tennessee in the final day of the Irish Baseball Classic. Ironically, in six of the previous eight ACC openers, whatever the Hokies result was in the previous game before the conference opener, they repeated in the opener.

The only two times the result was not repeated was in 2011, after the Hokies beat Florida Atlantic, they lost at Miami, and in 2008, when the Hokies dropped a 14-1 decision to Georgia Tech after defeating Radford in its previous game.

More on the rankings: In the column to the left is the history of Virginia Tech baseball versus ranked opponents all-time, as well as a detailed breakdown of the Hokies under head coach Pete Hughes. Tech is 4-15 all-time against teams ranked 11-15 - while they are 1-5 all-time and 1-2 under Hughes against teams ranked No. 14.

However, what is not listed is the Hokies success versus ranked opponents when they have also been ranked. That mark is a respectable 8-10 with all but one of those games occurring during the 2010 season. They lost a 3-0 decision just last weekend to No. 22 Notre Dame in Cary, N.C.

Overall, under Hughes, Tech is 27-14 when ranked and that includes a 14-4 mark at English Field.

Facing RV teams: Although the Notre Dame loss was the first for Tech this year against a ranked opponent (top 30), Tech was 5-0 against teams receiving votes in various polls - Kent State (2-0), UNCW (2-0) and Radford (1-0) - seen on the left, bolded for the week played.

Tech success in Blacksburg: Speaking of English Field, all-time, Tech is 405-208-3 in 24 seasons at English Field and 1,174-495-17 in games played in Blacksburg. That includes a 4-1 mark this season and a current four-game winning streak (see *chart previous page*).

Helping to Strike Out ALS: The Virginia Tech baseball team is partnering with Bull & Bones Brewhaus and Grill to help raise awareness and funds for ALS research. With every strikeout recorded by Tech's pitching staff this season, \$5 will be donated to The Angel Fund in the name of Pete Frates - a former Hughes player (at Boston College) who was diagnosed with the disease just last year. The amount will go up to \$10 for strikeouts recorded in any ACC Tournament game and \$25 for any **2013 Strikeouts Total money raised** strikeout in an NCAA Regional or Super \$435

Four games versus 2012 conference champs: In the opening weekend of 2013, Tech was the only team in the country to face two conference tournament champions (who were also picked to repeat), and went 4-0 over the weekend.

Tech was one of just four teams in the nation that started the year with a total of four games against a team (or teams) that won a 2012 conference tournament title. The others:

Portland (0-4) at Mississippi State (SEC)
Miss. Valley St. (1-3) vs. Prairie View A&M (SWAC) West Michigan (0-4) at Pepperdine (West Coast)

Regional game.

Non-conference win streak: The Hokies ended the 2012 season on an 18-game nonconference winning streak, the longest streak at the school since 1982, when Tech posted 20 straight in a single season. There has been just three streaks longer in a single season.

The Hokies then extended their non-conference winning streak to 22 straight, before losing to Temple (2/23). That streak was the third longest ever in the program's history (spanning more than one season and excluding postseason) and was just three wins shy of matching a streak that set the standard almost a century ago.

Home (state) away from home: During the 2013 season, Tech is scheduled to play 28 games at English Field, a good sign, because entering the season the team has a .659 winning percentage in its 24-year history and have had just two losing seasons at their home.

Of their 28 road games scheduled, the Hokies will play in the state of North Carolina 16 times, which included a 4-0 start to open the season and a 3-1 mark last weekend. The Hokies will get used to the I-81 to I-77 road trip as they play five more there next week.

The other locations Tech will travel to include three games each in the state of Florida, Maryland and Massachusetts, while playing two others in Virginia and one in Tennessee.

The 28 games in North Carolina does not include any games in the ACC Championship, if the Hokies advance, which will be played in Durham.

Comeback wins: Certainly, it's up for debate what is truly a comeback win, but last year Tech pulled out wins in 25 games in which they trailed. However there should be no debate to the 19 times they came back when trailing as late as entering their at-bats in the fifth and included four games entering their at-bats in the ninth.

They have three wins this year already when trailing as late as their half of the fifth frame.

Comeback win - not necessary in first weekend: Twenty-five of 34 (73.5 percent) of Tech's victories last year saw the team trail at one time during the contest. This season, its been just five of 11 (45.5 percent).

The reason, Tech did not trail at any point during its first weekend. More impressive, excluding its first at-bats of the game, the Hokies came to the plate just four times in 30 innings with the game tied. That was mostly due to the team scoring in the first frame in three of the games. They scored in the first frame six times and are 5-1 in those contests.

Still haven't trailed too often: Going into weekend number four, the Hokies have only trailed when they've come to the plate in 17 innings this season, which includes eight in their two losses - three against Temple, five versus Notre Dame.

A fast start: Through 13 games, Tech is 11-2 for the second straight season and only the 10th time in the school's history (1914 - 13-0; 1992, 1987 - 11-1-1; 2012, 1993, 1982, 1981, 1969, 1920 - 11-2). Only eight teams (1982 did not) have started with 12 wins through 14 games. Earlier, they became just the sixth team to post 10 wins by their 11th game.

A welcomed rest: Tech's scheduled game with William & Mary on Wednesday was cancelled due to weather, giving Tech a four-day rest heading into this weekend's ACC series. It may have been welcomed as the Hokies were just coming off a stretch of playing nine games in nine days - they went 7-2 - and a week in which they played six games - 5-1.

The last time that happened was in 2010, when Virginia Tech played nine games from March 12-20, and they went just 4-5. They also played six games in a week in that span (March 15-20) and posted a 2-4 mark.

Starting pitching continues to shine: A huge question mark entering the 2013 season was starting pitching, as the Hokies returned just 15 career starts from its rotation minus staff ace Joe Mantiply's 34 career starts. However, Devin Burke (6.0IP/1H/0R/6K), Brad Markey (7.0IP/8H/1R/5K) and Tanner McIntyre (6.0IP/3H/2R/8K) all produced quality starts and helped Tech sweep the weekend in Wilmington, N.C. Overall, Tech starters have combined for a 8-1 record with a 3.25 ERA and 64 strikeouts in 74.2 innings pitched.

Not to be outshined: Last year, Tech's bullpen was solid and seeing two of its pitchers move into a starters role through the first 13 games did not cause any problems. In the first weekend, Jake Joyce (W,S), Clark Labitan (S) and the rest of the pen combined to toss 12.0 innings and post a 1.50 ERA. Last weekend, they threw a total of 11 scoreless frames and picked up a win and a save. Overall, the pen has a 3-1 record with five saves and an ERA of 3.57 in 40.1 innings. Minus the Radford game, when freshman were seeing their first action ever in (at the time) a 14-3 blowout - the Highlanders scored seven runs late - the pen has a 2.53 ERA.

Hokies walk-off seven times: Under Hughes, Tech has registered 12 walk-off victories in six years, which included seven last season.

Andrew Rash's solo home run against Yale in Game 1 (3/4/12) lifted the Hokies to a 6-5 win. He became the second Hokie (under Hughes) to hit a walk-off home run, as Austin Wates did the same, but in the 10th in a 5-4 win over No. 10 Virginia (5/14/09).

Of the 12 walk-off wins, three were in extra innings giving Tech six straight regular-season extrainning wins including a pair last year - also winning at Virginia (3/9) in 11 innings - before NC State beat them in 11 frames in the second to last weekend of 2012.

Quick Notes:

Mark Zagunis currently has a 13-game hitting streak, matching his longest streak from last year. The longest streak before that was Steve Domecus and Austin Wates in 2010, who each had a 17-game hitting streak. Nationally, he is listed among the top 50 in six categories - runs (32nd, 14), hits (6th, 22), doubles (18th, 6), RBI (44th, 14), total bases (28th, 31) and stolen bases (36th, 6)

Chad Pinder's five RBI in Tech's 10-9 win over Kent State to open the season was the most by a Hokie since Michael Seaborn knocked in five on March 15, 2010 in a game versus Columbia. Pinder is in the top 50 in two categories - RBI (17th, 16) and hit by pitch (12th, 6).

Tyler Horan is ranked in the top 50 nationally in three categories, hits (37th, 19), RBI (44th, 14) and total bases (36th, 30).

Andrew Rash is also ranked in the top 50 nationally in three categories, hits (37th, 19), RBI (17th, 16) and doubles (45th, 5).

Eddie Campbell has not allowed a hit before the fifth inning in either of his first two starts. Not surprisingly, he is 26th in the country in hits allowed per nine innings at 4.2 per game.

Devin Burke has won his first three decisions, becoming the first Tech weekend starter to go 3-0 in his first three starts since Jesse Hahn did it to start the 2010 season. Nationally, Burke is tied for fourth in wins with his three

Brad Markey is third in the nation in strikeout-to-walk ratio at 22.0 to 1. Of note, the nation's leader is GT Friday starter Buck Farmer (33.0-1). Markey is also sixth in walks per nine innings (0.43) and 39th in strikeouts (22).

Clark Labitan is tied for 20th in the country with his three saves.

Coach Pete Hughes is five wins shy of 500 for his career and seven shy of 200 in his Tech career.



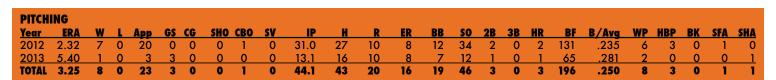
