Tech travels to Florida for ACC series with Miami

The weekend series: The Hokies continue their 120th season of baseball this weekend in Florida with a three-game ACC series with the Miami Hurricanes.

Facing the Hurricanes: In 24 games against Miami, all regular season ACC contests, the Hokies are just 6-18 overall and 1-8 in Coral Gables. All six of those wins though have come under Coach Hughes, including the last two games in 2012, in which Tech won in walk-off fashion.

Also, the only time the Hokies have faced Miami when they have been ranked (2010), they took two of three from the Hurricanes.

Another return to the Top 25: With its success the first weekend of the season, Tech found itself ranked in the Top 25 in the first in-season Baseball America poll, entering at No. 24. It marked the first time the Hokies had been ranked since the end of the 2010 season, when they were 16th in the BA poll heading into the NCAA Baseball Championship.

After dropping a pair to No. 14 Georgia Tech, the Hokies fell out of the top 25, but returned to the No. 24 position after a 5-1 week and an ACC sweep at Duke.

As a ranked team: The Hokies haven't played too many games as a ranked team, however, overall, under Hughes, Tech is 29-16 when ranked, but 13-10 away from home. Their record against non-ranked team when ranked is 20-4.

A fast start to the season and in the ACC: Before this season, Tech had never been above .500 after the first two weekends of the ACC slate and only once, in 2007, were they .500, standing at 3-3. After its three-game sweep at Duke, the Hokies are entering the weekend at 4-2.

After the weekend, the Hokies will have played 25 games, nine in the ACC. Only the 2007 and 2010 teams had four wins in nine tries and only the 2012 team had 17 wins (17-8).

English Field - Home of the Hokies

English Field was officially dedicated during a special ceremony on April 8, 1989 and is named for the late E.R. 'Red' English and his wife, Ruth, who provided financial support for construction of the field.

English, a native of Altavista, Va., played as an offensive and defensive guard on the Tech football teams from 1930-33 and graduated from Tech in 1934. English contributed to Tech athletics for more than 50 years and was one of the founders of The Student Aid Association in 1949. He served as president of that organization two of its first three years. English received the most outstanding alumni award at Tech in 1984.

Through a generous gift from alumnus George Sampson, the home team dugout was named for long-time Tech baseball coach G.F. 'Red' Laird during a ceremony on April 12, 1991. Laird recruited and coached Sampson at Tech.

The Tech athletics department continues to make upgrades to the facility, with its newest completed in the spring of 2012. The natural grass surface was replaced with artificial turf. The \$1 million field enables the Hokies to practice even during inclement weather, as grounds keepers can remove snow off of it quickly.

Plus, it also drains quickly, allowing for a speedy resumption of play following any rain delays. Also, as part of this project, the dugouts were expanded to almost twice the size, and a new batter's eye and a new padded outfield fence were added.

The Hokies opened play at their new home with a 7-2 victory against George Mason on March 22, 1989, and went on to post a 17-7 home record during their first season in the facility. The team's year-by-year and overall mark in its 25th seasons at English Field can be seen in the graph on the right.

Prior to the 2004 season, a new lighting system was installed and the Hokies played their first baseball game under the lights in Blacksburg on April 28 of that year, defeating VMI, 8-0.

Before English Field, Tech played its home baseball games at Tech Park, where it compiled a 431-122-1 record over 34 seasons.

Home (state) away from home: During the 2013 season, Tech is scheduled to play 28 games at English Field, a good sign, because entering the season the team had a .659 winning percentage in its 24-year history and have had just two losing seasons at their home.

Of their 28 road games scheduled, the Hokies are playing in the state of North Carolina 16 times, which included a 4-0 start to open the season and a 3-1 mark in the third weekend. The Hokies are getting used to the I-81 to I-77 road trip, as they just completed a 4-1 stretch last week that included a three-game sweep at Duke.

This weekend's trip to Florida will mark the first games played by Tech outside of Blacksburg or the state of North Carolina. The other locations Tech will travel to this year include three games each in the state of Maryland and Massachusetts, while playing two others in Virginia and one in Tennessee.

The 28 games in North Carolina does not include any games in the ACC Championship, if the Hokies advance, which will be played in Durham at the DBAP. Interestingly, with its three-game sweep at Duke, Tech has now won five straight games at DBAP.

Tech in Florida: The Hokies have played in the state of Florida 133 times and own a 46-87 record (34.6 percent) all-time and have lost six in a row. Their last win was a 14-2 victory over Florida Atlantic on March 11, 2011.

Tech in Blacksburg: All-time, Tech is 408-211-3 in 24 seasons at English Field (chart previous page). The Hokies are also 1,178-498-17 in games played in Blacksburg and a 6-3 this year.

Facing RV teams: Although the loss to then No. 22 Notre Dame was the first for Tech this year against a ranked opponent (top 30), Tech was 5-0 against teams receiving votes in various polls - Kent State (2-0), UNCW (2-0) and Radford (1-0) (chart on left).

Four games versus 2012 conference champs: In the opening weekend of 2013, Tech was the only team in the country to face two conference tournament champions (who were also picked to repeat), and went 4-0 over the weekend.

Tech was one of just four teams in the nation that started the year with a total of four games against a team (or teams) that won a 2012 conference tournament title. The others:

A long non-conference win streak comes to an end: The Hokies ended the 2012 season on an 18-game non-conference winning streak, the longest streak at the school since 1982, when Tech posted 20 straight in a single season. There has been just three streaks longer than the 2012 Hokies' streak in a single season.

Tech then extended its non-conference winning streak to 22 straight, before losing to Temple (2/23). That streak was the third longest ever in the program's history (spanning more than one season and excluding postseason).

Before the loss to the Owls, the Hokies were just three wins shy of matching the streak that set the standard almost a century ago.

More non-conference win streaks end: With the Hokies' 4-3 loss to Elon on Wednesday, a pair of win streaks were snapped by the Phoenix.

First, a 21-game midweek non-conference win streak came to an end - the last loss was on March 19, 2011 versus Radford (7-5).

The other was a 14-game midweek non-conference road win streak - the last loss was on April 22, 2009 at Liberty (ironically 4-3).

Comeback wins: Certainly, it's up for debate what is truly a comeback win, but last year Tech pulled out wins in 25 games in which they trailed. However there should be no debate to the 19 times they came back when trailing as late as entering their at-bats in the fifth and included four games entering their at-bats in the ninth.

They have four wins this year already when trailing as late as their half of the fifth frame.

Comeback win - not necessary in first weekend: Twenty-five of 34 (73.5 percent) of Tech's victories last year saw the team trail at one time during the contest. This season, its been just eight of 17 (47.1 percent).

The reason, Tech did not trail at any point during its first weekend. More impressive, excluding its first at-bats of the game, the Hokies came to the plate just four times in 30 innings with the game tied. That was mostly due to the team scoring in the first frame in three of the games.

So far this year, the Hokies have 26 first-inning runs (compared to allowing just five). They are 8-2 when scoring in the first inning.

Still haven't trailed too often: Going into weekend number six, the Hokies have come to the plate just 44 times in 190 innings trailing in the contest. That includes five versus Notre Dame (a loss), a total of 18 innings in a three-game set versus Georgia Tech, in which they were victorious in one of them, and seven times at Duke, a three-game series they swept.

A welcomed rest: Tech's scheduled game with William & Mary on March 6 was cancelled due to weather, giving Tech a four-day rest heading into its first weekend ACC series. It may have been welcomed as the Hokies were just coming off a stretch of playing nine games in nine days - they went 7-2 - and a week in which they played six games - 5-1.

The last time that happened was in 2010, when Virginia Tech played nine games from March 12-20, and they went just 4-5. They also played six games in a week in that span (March 15-20) and posted a 2-4 mark.

Hokies walk-off seven times: Under Hughes, Tech has registered 12 walk-off victories in six years, which included seven last season.

Andrew Rash's solo home run in game 1 of a doubleheader against Yale (3/4/12) lifted the Hokies to a 6-5 win. He became the second Hokie (under Hughes) to hit a walk-off home run, as Austin Wates did the same, but in the 10th of a 5-4 win over No. 10 Virginia (5/14/09).

Of the 12 walk-off wins, three have been in extra innings.

Speaking of extra innings: Last weekend, when the Hokies defeated Duke, 2-1 in 11 innings on Friday, it marked the fifth straight victory in extra innings on the road for the team. Their last extra inning road loss was at North Carolina on March 15, 2008.

In regular-season games, Tech has won seven-of-eight (since the Wates' home run), with the only loss a 4-2 decision in 11 innings to NC State last year at English Field.

Starting pitching a question coming in: A huge unknown entering the 2013 season was going to be starting pitching, as the Hokies returned just 15 career starts from its rotation minus those of staff ace **Joe Mantiply** and his 34 career starts. Interestingly, Mantiply has made just two starts all season, while **Brad Markey** and **Devin Burke** have made five each, **Tanner McIntyre** has made four and **Eddie Campbell** and **Sean Keselica** three each.

In those 20 starts, those five have combined for 12 quality starts (6.0+ IP, 3ER or less) and in six games, the starter has lasted at least seven innings.

Bullpen keeps rolling: Last year, Tech's bullpen was solid and seeing two of its pitchers move into a starters role (Burke and McIntyre) did not cause any problems. In the first weekend, **Jake Joyce** (W,S), **Clark Labitan** (S) and the rest of the pen combined to toss 12.0 innings and post a 1.50 ERA.

Two weekends ago, the relievers combined for a total of 11 scoreless frames and picked up a win and a save. Overall, the pen has a 4-3 record with six saves.

Burke in rare company: **Devin Burke** improved to 5-0 with his win over Duke last Saturday to become the first Tech pitcher as a member of the ACC to win his first five starts in a season. He also joined Rhett Ballard (2007) as the only pitchers to earn wins on the mound in the first two ACC weekends.

Josh Biber was the last Hokie starter to post a 5-0 mark, but that was after six starts of the 2003 season (as a member of the Big East). Joe Saunders was the last Hokie to post a 6-0 mark, but that was after nine starts during the 2002 season. Brad Clontz was Tech's last pitcher to win his first five starts, and actually won his first seven starts to the 1992 season.

Pounding out some offense at Duke: Tech registered a season-high 16 hits in Saturday's 14-7 win at Duke, which was the most by the team in an ACC game since 2011, when the team had 18 against Florida State (4/16). The 14 runs scored were the most scored in an ACC game by Tech since May 15, 2000 when the Hokies beat Duke at English Field, 18-8. The last time they scored 14 or more on the road in the ACC was a 19-18 loss at NC State on March 29, 2009.

The road sweep and ACC win streak: Tech swept its first ever road ACC series outside of Maryland (2009 and 2011) with its sweep at Duke last weekend. The three wins also extended the Hokies' ACC win streak to four games for just the third time in their history (2010 - five and 2009 - six).

Two guys streaking: **Mark Zagunis** and **Chad Pinder** both extended their reached base streak to all 22 games this season, while Pinder extended his career-high hit streak to 13 games. Zagunis had a 13-game hit streak already this year and a 13-gamer last year. The longest streak before that was Steve Domecus and Austin Wates in 2010, who each had a 17-game hitting streak.

After 500 comes 200?: **Pete Hughes** notched his 500th career win as a baseball coach with the Hokies' victory at Duke. With his next win, Hughes will pick up career win number 200 as Tech's head coach.
