Hokies return to state of North Carolina for ACC series

The weekend series: The Hokies continue their 120th season of baseball this weekend with a three-game ACC series against No. 25 NC State at Doak Field at Dail Park.

This will be the fourth trip the Hokies will take to the state of North Carolina, and they have fared pretty well there in their three previous trips. Tech is now 11-2 in the state and includes a three-game sweep at Duke three weeks ago (more on this later).

Facing the Wolfpack: The Hokies have faced NC State a total of 57 times with the Wolfpack holding a 35-20-2 record in the series and are 22-8-1 at home.

Since Tech joined the ACC, the team is 6-11 against NC State and that includes a 3-6 mark in Raleigh, N.C. In the series, never have both teams been ranked.

The Wolfpack are 5-3 when they are ranked and won the only game when the Hokies were ranked, which was during the 2010 ACC Championship tournament - a 10-9 decision in 10 innings when Tech was No. 18.

A winning start in the ACC: Before this season, Tech had never been above .500 after 12 games of the ACC slate. In 2010, the Hokies were 6-6 after 12 games.

After 15 games, the team has been above .500 just once, in 2010 when the Hokies were 8-7 and the most wins after that is five in both the 2009 and 2012 seasons.

20 wins, no fooling: The Hokies said farewell to the month of March with a 20-9 record. Only twice in their history before this year had the Hokies reached the 20-win mark before April 1 - 1985 (March 30) and 1992 (March 29). They won game 20 this year on March 30.

Also, only now 18 times in their history has Tech reached 20 victories before its 30th game, the last time 2010 (20-9), while in 2003 it took just 28 games and 1993 it took 27 games.

English Field - Home of the Hokies

English Field was officially dedicated during a special ceremony on April 8, 1989 and is named for the late E.R. 'Red' English and his wife, Ruth, who provided financial support for construction of the field.

English, a native of Altavista, Va., played as an offensive and defensive guard on the Tech football teams from 1930-33 and graduated from Tech in 1934. English contributed to Tech athletics for more than 50 years and was one of the founders of The Student Aid Association in 1949. He served as president of that organization two of its first three years. English received the most outstanding alumni award at Tech in 1984.

Through a generous gift from alumnus George Sampson, the home team dugout was named for long-time Tech baseball coach G.F. 'Red' Laird during a ceremony on April 12, 1991. Laird recruited and coached Sampson at Tech.

The Tech athletics department continues to make upgrades to the facility, with its newest completed in the spring of 2012. The natural grass surface was replaced with artificial turf. The \$1 million field enables the Hokies to practice even during inclement weather, as grounds keepers can remove snow off of it quickly.

Plus, it also drains quickly, allowing for a speedy resumption of play following any rain delays. Also, as part of this project, the dugouts were expanded to almost twice the size, and a new batter's eye and a new padded outfield fence were added.

The Hokies opened play at their new home with a 7-2 victory against George Mason on March 22, 1989, and went on to post a 17-7 home record during their first season in the facility. The team's year-by-year and overall mark in its 25th seasons at English Field can be seen in the graph on the right.

Prior to the 2004 season, a new lighting system was installed and the Hokies played their first baseball game under the lights in Blacksburg on April 28 of that year, defeating VMI, 8-0.

Before English Field, Tech played its home baseball games at Tech Park, where it compiled a 431-122-1 record over 34 seasons.

The yo-yo that is the Tech ranking: With its success the first weekend of the season, Tech found itself ranked in the Top 25 in the first in-season Baseball America poll, entering at No. 24. It marked the first time the Hokies had been ranked since the end of the 2010 season, when they were 16th in the BA poll heading into the NCAA Baseball Championship.

After dropping a pair to No. 14 Georgia Tech, the Hokies fell out of the top 25, but returned to the No. 24 position after a 5-1 week and an ACC sweep at Duke. They again fell out of the rankings after a 2-2 week that included a pair of losses at Miami, but find themselves back in the poll at No. 22 after a series win over No. 4 Florida State.

Facing ranked teams: In the column to the left is the record of Tech baseball versus ranked opponents all-time, as well as a detailed breakdown under head coach Pete Hughes.

With a trip to No. 25 NC State coming up, the Hokies are 29-75 all-time against teams ranked No. 25 or better, but ironically have never faced a team ranked No. 25.

As a ranked team: Tech is 11-6 this season as a ranked team, which includes a 7-3 mark at home, 4-3 away from English Field and 1-3 against other ranked teams. Under Hughes, the Hokies are 31-18 overall as a ranked team and that includes a 17-6 mark at home, 14-12 away from English Field and 9-12 against other ranked opponents.

Facing RV teams: Although Tech is just 1-3 against ranked opponents this year (top 30), Tech was 5-0 against teams receiving votes in various polls the week they played them - Kent State (2-0), UNCW (2-0) and Radford (1-0) (chart on left).

Four games versus 2012 conference champs: In the opening weekend of 2013, Tech was the only team in the country to face two conference tournament champions (who were also picked to repeat), and went 4-0 over the weekend.

Tech was one of just four teams in the nation that started the year with a total of four games against a team (or teams) that won a 2012 conference tournament title. The others:

Portland (0-4) at Mississippi State (SEC)
Miss. Valley St. (1-3) vs. Prairie View A&M (SWAC)
West Michigan (0-4) at Pepperdine (West Coast)

Tech in Blacksburg: All-time, Tech is 411-213-3 in 24 seasons at English Field (chart previous page). The Hokies are also 1,181-500-17 in games played in Blacksburg and a 9-5 this year.

Helping to Strike Out ALS: The Virginia Tech baseball team is partnering with Bull & Bones Brewhaus and Grill to help raise awareness and funds for ALS research. With every strikeout recorded by Tech's pitching staff this season, \$5 will be donated to The Angel Fund in the name of Pete Frates - a former Hughes player (at Boston College) who was diagnosed with the disease just last year. The amount will go up to \$10 for strikeouts recorded in any ACC Tournament game and \$25 for any strikeout in an NCAA Regional or Super Regional game.

A long non-conference win streak comes to an end: The Hokies ended the 2012 season on an 18-game non-conference winning streak, the longest streak at the school since 1982, when Tech posted 20 straight in a single season. There has been just three streaks longer than the 2012 Hokies' streak in a single season.

Tech then extended its non-conference winning streak to 22 straight, before losing to Temple (2/23). That streak was the third longest ever in the program's history (spanning more than one season and excluding postseason).

Before the loss to the Owls, the Hokies were just three wins shy of matching the streak that set the standard almost a century ago.

More non-conference win streaks end: With the Hokies' 4-3 loss to Elon earlier this season, a pair of Hokie win streaks were snapped by the Phoenix.

First, a 21-game midweek non-conference win streak came to an end - the last loss was on March 29, 2011 versus Radford (7-5).

The other was a 14-game midweek non-conference road win streak - the last loss was on April 22, 2009 at Liberty (ironically 4-3).

With the Hokies' loss to VMI on Tuesday, March 26, it ended a 14-game winning streak on Tuesdays, the last loss being the Radford defeat.

Comeback wins: Certainly, it's up for debate what is truly a comeback win, but last year Tech pulled out wins in 25 games in which they trailed. However there should be no debate to the 19 times they came back when trailing as late as entering their at-bats in the fifth and that included four games entering their at-bats in the ninth.

They have four wins this year when trailing as late as their half of the fifth frame.

Comeback win - not necessary - especially in first weekend: Twenty-five of 34 (73.5 percent) of Tech's victories last year saw the team trail at one time during the contest. This season, it's been just eight of 21 (38.1 percent).

A good reason, Tech did not trail at any point during its first weekend. More impressive, excluding its first at-bats of the game, the Hokies came to the plate just four times in 30 innings with the game tied. That was mostly due to the team scoring in the first frame in three of the games.

So far this year, the Hokies have scored 34 first-inning runs (compared to allowing just 12). They are 10-3 when scoring in the first inning and 14-4 when scoring first.

Still haven't trailed too often: Going into weekend number seven, the Hokies have come to the plate just 72 times in 260 innings (27.7 percent of the time) trailing in the contest. That includes 44 times in ACC games (107 innings, 41.1 percent). The ACC innings include 18 versus Georgia Tech, in which they won one, seven times in a three-game sweep at Duke, 10 frames at Miami, and nine against Florida State.

A welcomed rest: Tech's scheduled game with William & Mary on March 6 was cancelled due to weather, giving Tech a four-day rest heading into its first ACC weekend series. It may have been welcomed as the Hokies were just coming off a stretch of playing nine games in nine days - they went 7-2 - and a week in which they played six games - 5-1.

The last time that happened was in 2010, when Virginia Tech played nine games from March 12-20, and they went just 4-5. They also played six games in a week in that span (March 15-20) and posted a 2-4 mark.

Starting pitching a question coming in: A huge unknown entering the 2013 season was going to be starting pitching, as the Hokies returned just 15 career starts from its rotation minus those of staff ace **Joe Mantiply** and his 34 career starts.

However, **Brad Markey** and **Devin Burke** have stepped up as weekend starters and all they've done is combine to post an 8-3 mark in 14 starts, throw 92.1 innings, strike out 59 and hold a 3.21 ERA.

Mantiply, who sat out a few weeks due to forearm stiffness, has returned and gives Tech a tremendous 1-2-3 punch. The trio, in ACC games, are a combined 5-2 in 11 starts, have thrown 69.2 innings with 39 strikeouts and sport a 3.75 ERA.

Burke in rare company: **Devin Burke** improved to 5-0 with his win over Duke to become the first Tech pitcher as a member of the ACC to win his first five starts in a season. He also joined Rhett Ballard (2007) as the only pitchers to earn wins in the first two ACC weekends.

Josh Biber was the last Hokie starter to post a 5-0 mark, but that was after six starts of the 2003 season (as a member of the Big East). Joe Saunders was the last Hokie to post a 6-0 mark, but that was after nine starts during the 2002 season. Brad Clontz was Tech's last pitcher to win his first five starts, and actually won his first seven starts to the 1992 season.

Burke was on the losing end of a 2-0 loss at Miami, ending his bid to make it six for six.

Mantiply a solid game three starter: **Joe Mantiply** improved to 2-0 on the season with his win over Florida State last Saturday, which helped the Hokies improve to 4-0 in game threes of the ACC weekend. Interestingly, he joined Georgia Tech's Buck Farmer as the only two pitchers with two career regular season wins over Florida State - he also beat the Seminoles 2-1 back in 2011.

The only Hokie pitcher to post a 3-0 record in the ACC was Mathew Price, who won his first three starts to the 2010 season (not consecutive). Justin Wright, in 2009, was the only pitcher to win three straight ACC starts, as he actually won four.

ACC game threes successes: Thanks in part to **Joe Mantiply**, the Hokies have no matched the game three win total of last year and 2011 (four games each season). That is the second-most ever during an ACC season, with the 2010 squad winning the most at five.

In their history in the ACC, the Hokies had never won four straight games (in terms of game 1s, game 2s or game 3s), and had just seven streaks of winning three in a row. The most ever games won is six game one victories during the 2010 season.

Pounding out some offense at Duke: Tech registered a season-high 16 hits in a 14-7 win at Duke, which was the most by the team in an ACC game since 2011, when the team had 18 against Florida State (4/16). The 14 runs scored were the most scored in an ACC game by Tech since May 15, 2000 when the Hokies beat Duke at English Field, 18-8. The last time they scored 14 or more on the road in the ACC was a 19-18 loss at NC State on March 29, 2009.

The road sweep and ACC win streak: Tech swept its first ever road ACC series outside of Maryland (2009 and 2011) with its sweep at Duke. The three wins also extended the Hokies' ACC win streak to four games for just the third time in their history (2010 - five and 2009 - six).

Making some history at Duke: In the March 16 game at Duke, **Tyler Horan** recorded a pair of triples, tying both a Tech and ACC record for most triples in a game. He became the 13th Hokie to do it, the last was Alex Perez, last year against Boston College (April 6). He became the 57th ACC player to accomplish the feat.

Another rare feat: **Sean Keselica** won his second game of the season after throwing six frames in a start against Liberty on March 19. He also hit a two-run home run in the game, becoming the first Hokie to hit a home run and pick up a win as the starting pitcher since Larry Bowles accomplished the feat on May 1, 1999 at Duquesne.

After 500 came 200?: **Pete Hughes** notched his 500th career win as a baseball coach with the Hokies' victory at Duke on March 17. With the Hokies' win at Miami a week later (March 24), Hughes picked up career win number 200 as Tech's head coach.

Hokies walk-off seven times: Under Hughes, Tech has registered 12 walk-off victories in six years, which included seven last season.

Andrew Rash's solo home run in game 1 of a doubleheader against Yale (3/4/12) lifted the Hokies to a 6-5 win. He became the second Hokie (under Hughes) to hit a walk-off home run, as Austin Wates did the same, but in the 10th of a 5-4 win over No. 10 Virginia (5/14/09). Of the 12 walk-off wins, three have been in extra innings.

Interestingly, Rash has played in 102 of Coach Hughes' victories, his record is 102-67.

Speaking of extra innings: When the Hokies defeated Miami, 8-5 in 10 innings on Sunday, it marked the sixth straight victory in extra innings on the road for the team. Their last extra inning road loss was at North Carolina on March 15, 2008.

In regular-season games, Tech has won eight-of-nine (since the Wates' home run), with the only loss a 4-2 decision in 11 innings to NC State last year at English Field.

The Hokies also lost a 10-inning game to the Wolfpack on May 29, 2010, but that was during the postseason - at the ACC Championship tournament in Greensboro, N.C.



Home (state) away from home: During the 2013 season, Tech is scheduled to play 28 games at English Field, a good sign, because entering the season the team had a .659 winning percentage in its 24-year history and have had just two losing seasons at their home.

Of their 28 road games scheduled, the Hokies are playing in the state of North Carolina 16 times, which included a 4-0 start to open the season and a 3-1 mark in the third weekend. The Hokies are getting used to the I-81 to I-77 road trip, as they completed a 4-1 stretch during the fifth weekend of the year that included a three-game sweep at Duke.

Their Florida trip (to face Miami) was the first games played by Tech outside of Blacksburg or the state of North Carolina. The other locations Tech will travel to this year include three games each in the state of Maryland and Massachusetts, while playing two others in Virginia and one in Tennessee.

The 28 games in North Carolina does not include any games in the ACC Championship, if the Hokies advance, which will be played in Durham at the DBAP. Interestingly, with its three-game sweep at Duke, Tech has now won five straight games at DBAP.

The turning point: The 2010 season has now been referenced many times in the notes in regards to successful starts. Looking back on that season, it compares pretty similarly to this season.

On March 31, 2010, the team was 18-9 after a win at ETSU and entered the ACC weekend 4-5 as the Hokies were heading to No. 4 Florida State.

On March 29, 2013, the team was 18-8 after a loss to VMI, but entered the ACC weekend 5-4 as getting ready to host ... No. 4 Florida State.

The 2010 Hokies took the first two games of that series - their first ever series win over the Seminoles - to get to 20-10 overall and 6-5 in the ACC.

The 2013 Hokies won games 1 and 3 of their series - their second ever series win over the Seminoles - to get to 20-9 overall and 7-5 in the ACC.

The rest of the way for the 2010 Tech team included posting its only winning record in the ACC (16-14) and advancing to both the ACC and NCAA Tournaments.

Knocking off a top five team: Tech has only won a series against a top five opponent three times in its history, and two of them have been against No. 4 Florida State. Tech's only other series win over a top five program was at No. 3 Georgia Tech, also in 2010. Hence, the Hokies won their first ever series over a top five opponent at English Field with their win over the Seminoles.

At least taking a split: After splitting the doubleheader with Florida State last Saturday, the Hokies have not lost both ends of a doubleheader (or two games in a single day, with both games starting on the same day) since May 14, 2011 (versus Clemson). They have won five of those scenarios and have split the other four in that span.

WHAT'S A HOKIE

That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body. Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today.

Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Following is the "Old Hokie" yell in its original form:

Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy!
Tech! Tech! V.P.I.
Sola-Rex Sola-Rah
Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!!

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.
