Hokies head to Durham for ACC Championship

The weekend: Tech continues its 120th season of baseball with its third trip to the ACC Baseball Championship - the first since the 2010 season, being held in Durham, N.C.

History in the ACC Championship: Tech is 2-2 all-time in the championship, losing 5-4 to Maryland in its only game in the 2005 postseason as the No. 9 seed. In 2010, the Hokies were also seeded No. 6 and went 2-1 with wins over Georgia Tech, 6-2, and Clemson, 9-8, before falling to NC State, 10-9, in 10 innings.

Doing it first: The Hokies became the first (and are still the only) team in the country to face three top five opponents (ranked top five in three of four major polls - see page 4). Only 14 teams have faced top five teams twice (seven are in the SEC) - Alabama, Arizona St., Auburn, Florida, Georgia Tech, Kentucky, Long Beach St., Maryland, Mississippi St., Missouri, Ole Miss. South Carolina, Oregon, Washington.

Knocking off a top five team: Tech had won a series against a top five opponent just twice in its history before this year, and both were on the road in 2010 - at No. 4 Florida State and at No. 3 Georgia Tech. The Hokies matched that feat this year, knocking off two top five teams, but both were at English Field, as they beat both No. 4 Florida State and No. 5 Virginia.

Doing it first, again: By beating No. 5 Virginia, Tech became the only team in the nation to defeat two top five teams. Only six schools can claim a series win (or two wins in one weekend) over one top five school (same criteria as above) - South Carolina over LSU, San Diego and Washington over Oregon State, Arizona State over Arkansas and Georgia Tech and Virginia over UNC.

Joe Mantipty is the only starting pitcher in the nation with wins over two top five teams, while Max MacNabb of San Diego also has two, but both were in relief outings versus Oregon State.

Coming in hot: Virginia Tech enters the 2013 ACC Baseball Championship winners of five in a row and are 10-1 in its last 11 games and are 13-2 in its last 15. With their two-game sweep of Wake Forest last week, the Hokies are the only ACC team that can claim four ACC series wins coming into the ACC Championship.

Ironically, only Virginia and Florida State - Tech's first two opponents this week - can claim three ACC series wins in the team's last four conference weekends, with the Seminoles winning three straight - their only loss a sweep at Virginia in week seven of the ACC schedule - while the Cavaliers have two in a row and three of four - their only loss was to the Hokies in week eight of the ACC slate.

Lastly, only Virginia can claim more wins over the last four weeks - nine - than the eight that Tech has won (also had one game cancelled). The eight wins match the number won by NC State over the past four weeks, while FSU's seven league wins is the fourth most.

Four straight ACC series wins: As just stated, the Hokies won its fourth straight ACC series with their two-game sweep of Wake Forest in the league's final weekend. It marked the first time in their history in the ACC that they won four straight. During the 2010 season, Tech won three series in a row two times, the most ever before this year's streak.

Also, as just started, the Hokies have won eight games over the past four weeks, tying the most wins ever during ACC play in a four-week span. They also did that twice during the 2010 season and once during the 2011 season. They had a chance to go for nine, but game three of the Wake Forest series was cancelled due to rain.

A best in the ACC final standings: During the 2010 season, the Hokies earned the No. 6 seed in the ACC Baseball Championship after a 16-14 mark in conference, while they finished fourth in the Coastal Division. And although, the 15-14 final league record in the 2013 season is one less win from matching its best mark ever in conference play and earned the team the No. 6 seed again, Tech's third-place finish in the Coastal Division is its best finish as a member of the ACC.

Reaching the 35-win plateau: With its win over Wake Forest on Friday, the Hokies reached the 35-win plateau for only the second time since the 1999 season, when the team won 42 games. The other season was 2010, when the Hokies won 40.

In fact, since 1986 (the last of three straight seasons the team won at least 38 games), only four seasons has the team won more than 35 games, adding in the 36 won in 1990 and the 40 in 1988.

Regular season not a true indicator: Since the Hokies are making just their third trip to the ACC Championship, there isn't too much history to see any trends showing up. However, below is all three seasons regular season results and the prior two postseasons results.

Championship experience: The Hokies have five players on its roster this year listed as a senior or redshirt-senior. Of those five, just two have any ACC Championship experience - pitcher **Joe Mantiply** and outfielder **Andrew Rash**, while **Jake Joyce** did not see any action, **Clark Labitan** was redshirting the season due to injury and **Tanner McIntyre** was at a junior college.

Mantiply's experience includes just 1.1 innings of work - with a full inning against NC State. He has allowed two hits, one earned run, one walk and struck out two of the six batters he has faced.

Rash started in all three games of the 2010 championship getting 12 at-bats. His numbers include five hits - including a double and two home runs - three runs and five RBI. His biggest hit was his three-run home run against NC State.

Hokies have pair named All-ACC: In a vote conducted by the league's 12 coaches and announced by the ACC on Monday, juniors **Tyler Horan** and **Chad Pinder** have been named to the 2013 All-ACC Baseball First Team. It marked the first time that Tech had two players honored with first team selections by the ACC, as the Hokies have had just two players prior to this year (see column right).

Horan was one of three outfielders named to the first team and put up impressive numbers overall and in the league. In games overall, he was 13th in the league in batting average (.344), led the conference in doubles (22), was second in total bases (140), third in slugging (.625), fourth in hits (77), home runs (11) and tied for fourth in triples (4) and 10th in RBI (50).

In conference-only games, his .347 batting average was the ninth-best in the league, while he was second in runs (31) and tied for second in doubles (12), fourth in hits (42), tied for third in triples (3), tied for fifth in total bases (69) and eighth in slugging (.570).

Pinder was named the top third baseman by the coaches and posted a .322 batting average during the regular season - good for 24th-best in the league overall. His numbers also include 44 runs, 67 hits - 12 doubles, one triple, four home runs - 40 RBI and 93 total bases for a .447 slugging percentage and has a .408 on-base percentage.

English Field - Home of the Hokies

English Field was officially dedicated during a special ceremony on April 8, 1989 and is named for the late E.R. 'Red' English and his wife, Ruth, who provided financial support for construction of the field.

English, a native of Altavista, Va., played as an offensive and defensive guard on the Tech football teams from 1930-33 and graduated from Tech in 1934. English contributed to Tech athletics for more than 50 years and was one of the founders of The Student Aid Association in 1949. He served as president of that organization two of its first three years. English received the most outstanding alumni award at Tech in 1984.

Through a generous gift from alumnus George Sampson, the home team dugout was named for long-time Tech baseball coach G.F. 'Red' Laird during a ceremony on April 12, 1991. Laird recruited and coached Sampson at Tech.

The Tech athletics department continues to make upgrades to the facility, with its newest completed in the spring of 2012. The natural grass surface was replaced with artificial turf. The \$1 million field enables the Hokies to practice even during inclement weather, as grounds keepers can remove snow off of it quickly.

Plus, it also drains quickly, allowing for a speedy resumption of play following any rain delays. Also, as part of this project, the dugouts were expanded to almost twice the size, and a new batter's eye and a new padded outfield fence were added.

The Hokies opened play at their new home with a 7-2 victory against George Mason on March 22, 1989, and went on to post a 17-7 home record during their first season in the facility. The team's year-by-year and overall mark in its 25 seasons at English Field can be seen in the graph on the right.

Prior to the 2004 season, a new lighting system was installed and the Hokies played their first baseball game under the lights in Blacksburg on April 28 of that year, defeating VMI, 8-0.

Before English Field, Tech played its home baseball games at Tech Park, where it compiled a 431-122-1 record over 34 seasons.

The yo-yo that is the Tech ranking: With its success the first weekend of the season, Tech found itself ranked in the Top 25 in the first in-season Baseball America poll, entering at No. 24. It marked the first time the Hokies had been ranked since the end of the 2010 season, when they were 16th in the BA poll heading into the NCAA Baseball Championship.

The Hokies have been on a yo-yo since, entering and dropping out practically every other weekend. After dropping a pair to No. 14 Georgia Tech, the Hokies fell out of the top 25, but returned to the No. 24 position after a 5-1 week and an ACC sweep at Duke. They fell out of the rankings after a 2-2 week that included a pair of losses at Miami, but found themselves back in the poll at No. 22 after a series win over No. 4 Florida State.

They fell out after being swept at No. 25 NC State and did not return until the end of April after taking a series from then No. 5 Virginia and are currently No. 22 this week.

Facing ranked teams: In the column to the left is the record of Tech baseball versus ranked opponents all-time, as well as a detailed breakdown under head coach Pete Hughes.

Overall in Blacksburg, Tech now holds a 26-53 record all-time against ranked opponents after defeating the Cavaliers in two of three meetings a month ago.

The Hokies are 5-11 this year against ranked teams - vs. No. 1 UNC (0-3), vs. No. 4 FSU (2-1), vs. No. 5 UVa (2-1), vs. No. 14 GT (1-2), vs. No. 22 Notre Dame (0-1) and at No. 25 NC State (0-3).

As a ranked team: Under Coach Hughes, the Hokies have been ranked during just two seasons, this year and back in 2010. Below is a chart that breaks down all the scenarios for the Hokies as a ranked team.

Helping to Strike Out ALS: The Virginia Tech baseball team is partnering with Bull & Bones Brewhaus and Grill to help raise awareness and funds for ALS research. With every strikeout recorded by Tech's pitching staff this season, \$5 will be donated to The Angel Fund in the name of Pete Frates - a former Hughes player (at Boston College) who was diagnosed with the disease just last year. The amount now goes up to \$10 for strikeouts recorded in the ACC tournament and will go up to \$25 for any strikeout in an NCAA Regional or Super Regional game.

Comeback wins: Certainly, it's up for debate what is truly a comeback win, but last year Tech pulled out wins in 25 games in which they trailed. However there should be no debate to the 19 times they came back when trailing as late as entering their at-bats in the fifth and that included four games entering their at-bats in the ninth.

Frontrunners this year, Tech has just 15 overall comeback victories and eight wins when trailing as late as their half of the fifth frame.

Comeback win - not necessary - especially in first weekend: In twenty-five of Tech's 34 wins (73.5 percent) last year, the team trailed at least once during the contest. This season, it's been just 15 of 35 (42.9 percent).

One reason is because Tech did not trail at any point during its first weekend and, excluding its first at-bats of those games, they came to the plate just four times in 30 innings with the game tied. That was mostly due to the team scoring in the first frame three times.

So far this year, the Hokies have scored 54 first-inning runs (compared to allowing just 29). They are 17-6 when scoring in the first inning and 25-8 when scoring first.

Still haven't trailed too often: Going into the ACC Championship, the Hokies have come to the plate just 147 times in 481 innings (30.6 percent of the time) trailing in the contest. That includes 97 times in ACC games (266 innings, 36.5 percent).

The number of innings trailing in ACC games include Georgia Tech (18 frames), Duke (7), Miami (10), Florida State (9), NC State (11), UNC (19), Maryland (5), Virginia (10), Boston College (2) and Wake Forest (6 - in a two-game series).

At least taking a split: After sweeping a doubleheader versus Virginia (the Cavaliers first time swept in a DH since 2008), the Hokies have not lost both ends of a doubleheader (or two games in a single day, with both games starting on the same day) since May 14, 2011, versus Clemson. In those 11 doubleheaders, the Hokies have won six and have split the other five in that span and includes going 3-0-3 this season.

The six doubleheaders tie the 2011 squad, who also played six, for the most since Tech played 11 doubleheaders back in the 2004 season.

Hokies walk-off two times: Under Hughes, Tech has registered 14 walk-off victories in seven years, which included seven last season. The team has two this year - April 9 versus Longwood, **Tyler Horan** smacked a two-run home run in the 10th frame for a 7-5 victory and May 12 versus Marist, **Mark Zagunis** hit a solo home run in the 10th inning for a 7-6 win.

Horan and Zagunis join **Andrew Rash** and **Austin Wates** as the only four players under Hughes to hit a walk-off home run. Rash hit a solo home run in game 1 of a doubleheader against Yale (3/4/12) in a 6-5 win. Wates did the same - a solo home run - in the 10th of a 5-4 win over No. 10 Virginia (5/14/09). Of the 14 walk-off wins, five have been in extras.

Speaking of extra innings: The Hokies have now gone extra innings seven times this year, a new single-season record, passing the 2006 squad that played five.

With their 5-2 mark in extras, the wins are now the most extra-inning victories in a single season, which passed both the 2007 squad (3-1 in four games) and the 2006 team (3-2 in five extra-inning games).

When the Hokies defeated Miami, 8-5 in 10 frames, it marked the sixth straight victory in extra innings on the road for the team. Their last extra-inning road loss was at North Carolina on March 15, 2008 before losing to NC State in 14 frames on April 5 of this year.

The 14 frames matched the longest games ever played (by inning) in the program's history - March 30, 1995, a 6-5 loss at James Madison, and April 9, 1990, a 5-4 win over Liberty.

More on extra innings: In its last 22 extra-inning games, Tech is 14-8 and, interestingly, of those 22 games, they are 6-8 against opponents from either North or South Carolina.

Three of the losses are to the Wolfpack, 8-7 in 14 innings (April 5), 4-2 in 11 innings May 11, 2012 at English Field and a 10-9 in 10 frames May 29, 2010, at the ACC Championship tournament in Greensboro, N.C. Two losses are to UNC, 9-8 (April 13), and 6-5 in 11 frames March 15 2008. The Hokies have also lost once each to Wake Forest (15-14 in 10 on April 4, 2009), Coastal Carolina (4-3 in 10 on February 25, 2008) and Clemson (5-2 in 10 on April 8, 2007).

The last time Tech lost in extras to a team not from a Carolina state was also the last time they played back-to-back extra-inning games, at Boston College (March 25-26).

After 500 came 200?: Pete Hughes notched his 500th career win as a baseball coach with the Hokies' victory at Duke on March 17. With the Hokies' win at Miami a week later (March 24), Hughes picked up career win number 200 as Tech's head coach. (Hughes' year-by-year can be seen on page 3)

Helping Hughes to 200: Andrew Rash has played in 116 of Hughes' victories (217) as his record stands at 116-76 (a 60.4 winning percentage). Only one man has helped Hughes to more wins at Tech than Rash - Ronnie Shaban (2009-12), who compiled a 123-80 (60.6%) mark, while Rash is currently tied with Michael Seaborn (2008-11), who was 116-97 (54.5%) with Hughes.

More on Rash: In his four-year career at Tech, Rash is now among the top five in many offensive categories since the team has been playing in the ACC. He is first in home runs (40, 11 more than the closest player) and total bases (396, 19 up), second in RBI (159, 19 behind first) and doubles (54, 11 back). He is third in hit-by-pitch (29, two back of first) and slugging percentage (.586), fourth in runs (139) and hits (214), fifth in at-bats (676) and games started (173) and played (192).

In an overall Tech career, he is two doubles and three homers back of tying for the top five. With his last home run (May 17), he became the first Hokie to reach the 40 home run milestone since Mike Conte, who hit his 40th during the 1989 season and finished with 43 career long balls.

Burke was in rare company: Devin Burke improved to 5-0 on the season with his win over Duke on March 16 to become the first Tech pitcher, as a member of the ACC, to win his first five starts in a season and with it, he joined Rhet Ballard (2007) as the only pitchers to earn wins in the first two ACC weekends.

Josh Biber was the last Hokie starter to post a 5-0 mark, but that was after six starts of the 2003 season (as a member of the Big East). Joe Saunders was the last Hokie to post a 6-0 mark, but that was after nine starts during the 2002 season. Brad Clontz was Tech's last pitcher to win his first five starts, and actually won his first seven starts to the 1992 season.

Burke was on the losing end of a 2-0 loss at Miami, ending his bid to make it six for six.

Burke is even rarer: Burke improved to 8-3 overall on the season with his win at Boston College on May 4. With it, he became just the third Hokie starter to earn wins in three straight ACC series (as he also beat Virginia and Maryland the prior two weeks) and joined Joe Parsons (2011) and Justin Wright (2009), who won four straight, as the only other two. With the win, he improved to 5-3 in the ACC, joining Wright (2009) and Mathew Price (2010) as the only pitchers to win five ACC games in a season.

With his win versus Marist on May 11, he then won his ninth of the year, the most by a Hokie pitcher since Joe Saunders (2002, 2001, 2000) and Jason Bush (2000), who also won nine games in a single season. Bush was the last pitcher to post double figures in wins in a season, winning 11 in 1999.

Mantiply returned to form: Joe Mantiply, who missed three starts due to forearm stiffness, improved to 5-0 on the season (all ACC wins) after his outing versus Wake Forest on May 16. He also has a win in starts at Duke, versus Florida State - his second career regular season win over Florida State, he also beat the Seminoles 2-1 back in 2011 - at Maryland and versus Virginia.

Earlier, he became the first Hokie starting pitcher to ever post a 4-0 record in the ACC passing Mathew Price, who was 3-0 as a starter during the 2010 season. Only two other pitchers had 3-0 marks for the Hokies in the ACC, but they weren't strictly as starting pitchers. Justin Wright was 3-0 in 2008 (one win was out of the pen) and Tanner McIntyre was 3-0 last year (all out of the pen).

With the win over Wake, Mantiply then joined Price, Wright and Burke as the only Hokies to win five games during a single ACC season, as the first two were 5-2 in 2010 and Burke finished 5-3 this season.

More on Mantiply: In his four-year career at Tech, Mantiply is now among the top two in a number of categories since the team has been playing in the ACC. He ranks first in career starts (45, 11 better), innings pitched (287.0, 12.1 up), ground outs (340, 72 up) and is tied for first in wins (19). He is second in combined shutouts (5, one back), strikeouts (223, 40 back) and batters faced (1,259, 15 back).

With his victory over the Demon Deacons, it marked his 11th career win in the ACC, becoming just the second Hokie pitcher to win at least 10 ACC games joining Wright (12) as the only two.

Lastly, with three more innings pitched, Mantiply will be the first pitcher since Joe Saunders and Jason Bush to throw more than 290 innings in a career at Tech. Those two men went over that milestone back in the 2002 season.

Labitan saving games: When Clark Labitan picked up his seventh save of the year in a 4-3 win at Radford on April 30, he became the first Tech closer as a member of the ACC to save more than six games in a single season. The most prior was six by Ben Rowen during the 2010 season. With his save versus Wake Forest on May 17, Labitan has now pushed his season total to nine, the most since Matt Dalton saved a school record-tying 14 during the 2003 season.

Labitan's career total is 12, just one shy of tying for the fifth-most ever in a career at the school.

Making his own history at Duke: In the March 16 game at Duke, Tyler Horan recorded a pair of triples, tying both a Tech and ACC record for most triples in a game. He became the 13th Hokie to do it, the last was Alex Perez, last year against Boston College (April 6). He became the 57th ACC player to accomplish the feat.

Another rare feat: Sean Keselica won his second game of the season on the mound after throwing six frames in a start against Liberty on March 19. He also hit a two-run home run in the game, becoming the first Hokie to hit a home run and pick up a win as the starting pitcher since Larry Bowles accomplished the feat on May 1, 1999 at Duquesne.

Home (state) away from home: During the 2013 season, Tech was scheduled to play 28 games at English Field, a good sign, because entering the season the team had a .659 winning percentage in its 24-year history and have had just two losing seasons at their home.

Of their 28 games away from Blacksburg, the Hokies played in the state of North Carolina 16 times, which got them used to the I-81 to I-77 road trip. The results - 4-0 start to open the season, a 3-1 mark the third weekend, a 4-1 stretch during the fifth weekend that included a three-game sweep at Duke, and an 0-3 record in an ACC weekend at NC State that concluded the regular season 11-5 in the state.

Other locations Tech traveled to included three games in the state of Florida (1-2 at Miami), Maryland (2-1 versus the Terrapins) and Massachusetts (2-1 versus Boston College) and one in Tennessee (0-1 against the Vols). They also had an in-state trip to Radford on April 30 (a win).

The 16 games in North Carolina does not include the games they will now play in the 2013 ACC Baseball Championship, which is being played in Durham at the DBAP. Interestingly, with its three-game sweep earlier at Duke, Tech has now won five straight games at DBAP.

Hosting the top teams: For the first time in its history, Tech hosted three top five teams in the same season. However, three times before they had hosted a pair of top five teams at English Field. Below are all four years and the results.

A long non-conference win streak comes to an end: The Hokies ended the 2012 season on an 18-game non-conference winning streak, the longest streak at the school since 1982, when Tech posted 20 straight in a single season. There has been just three streaks longer than the 2012 Hokies' streak in a single season.

Tech then extended its non-conference winning streak to 22 straight, before losing to Temple (2/23). That streak was the third longest ever in the program's history (spanning more than one season and excluding postseason).

Before the loss to the Owls, the Hokies were just three wins shy of matching the streak that set the standard almost a century ago.

More non-conference win streaks end: With the Hokies' 4-3 loss to Elon Wednesday, March 13, a pair of Hokie win streaks were snapped by the Phoenix.

First, a 21-game midweek non-conference win streak came to an end - the last loss was on March 29, 2011 versus Radford (7-5). The other was a 14-game midweek non-conference road win streak - the last loss was on April 22, 2009 at Liberty (ironically also a 4-3 loss).

With the Hokies' loss to VMI on Tuesday, March 26, it ended a 14-game winning streak on Tuesdays, the last loss being the Radford defeat.

Here is Tech's record over the past five seasons in regular season non-conference games, with a breakdown of home, road and neutral sites (does not include 4-3 mark in 2010 postseason).

Four games versus 2012 conference champs: In the opening weekend of 2013, Tech was the only team in the country to face two conference tournament champions (who were also picked to repeat), and went 4-0 over the weekend.

Tech was one of just four teams in the nation that started the year with a total of four games against a team (or teams) that won a 2012 conference tournament title. The others:

- Portland (0-4) at Mississippi State (SEC)
- Miss. Valley St. (1-3) vs. Prairie View A&M (SWAC)
- West Michigan (0-4) at Pepperdine (West Coast)

20 wins, no fooling: The Hokies said farewell to March with a 20-9 record, thanks to a series win over FSU. Only twice in their history before this year had the Hokies reached the 20-win mark before April 1 - 1985 (March 30) and 1992 (March 29). They won game 20 this year on March 30.

Also, now only 18 times in their history had they reached 20 wins before its 30th game, the last time 2010 (20-9), while in 2003 it took just 28 games and 1993 it took 27 games.

WHAT'S A HOKIE

That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body. Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today.

Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Following is the "Old Hokie" yell in its original form:

Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy!
Tech! Tech! V.P.I.!
Sola-Rex Sola-Rah
Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!!
Rae, Ri, V.P.I.

JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.

Rash became the first Tech field player to be named ACC Player of the Week twice, as he also earned the honor back on April 25, 2011.

He joins Justin Wright, who was named ACC Pitcher of the Week three times, as the only two Hokies with multiple ACC weekly honors.

The Hokies two field winners this year marks just the second time in their history as well, as Austin Wates (April 5) and Steve Domecuz (May 17) were both honored during the 2010 season.

ACC game three success: The Hokies won more game threes (6) during an ACC season than ever before, passing the 2010 squad that won five.

In their history in the ACC, the Hokies had never won four straight games (in terms of game 1s, game 2s or game 3s) until this year when they won their first four game threes of the season. Prior, Tech's longest streak before was three in a row, done seven times.

They also tied the 2010 squad for most games won, in terms of series games, with the six game three wins. In the 2010 season, the team posted six game one victories.

Pounding out some offense at Duke: Tech registered (at the time) a season-high 16 hits in a 14-7 win at Duke, which was the most by the team in an ACC game since 2011, when the team had 18 against Florida State (4/16). The 14 runs scored were the most scored in an ACC game by Tech since May 15, 2010 when the Hokies beat Duke at English Field, 18-8. The last time they scored 14 or more on the road in the ACC was a 19-18 loss at NC State on March 29, 2009.

A road sweep and ACC win streaks: Tech swept its first ever road ACC series outside of Maryland (2009 and 2011) with its sweep at Duke. The three wins also extended the Hokies' ACC win streak to four games for just the third time in their history (2010 - five and 2009 - six). Tech has only swept two home ACC weekends (three games), both against Boston College, in 2010 and 2012.

Two weeks ago when Tech won the first two games at Boston College, it gave them another four-game winning streak in the ACC, matching the streak they had earlier in the season. It also gave them eight road wins in conference for only the second time as an ACC member (2011).

The road wins also extended the Hokies' road win streak in the ACC to four games, the longest ever as a member of the ACC. The last time they won four straight on the road in conference was during the 2002 season, when the Hokies won at St. John's before sweeping a three-game series at Georgetown.

A note on the 1-0 BC win: Tech played its 46th game that was decided by a 1-0 score when they beat Boston College in 12 frames on May 3. They are now 23-23 in such games, last winning a 1-0 game on May 12, 2004 versus Campbell. Their last 1-0 loss was versus Miami on March 9, 1999.

More on the 1-0 BC win - in extras: In its 120 seasons of baseball and almost 3,500 games played, Tech has only played two games that ended 1-0 in extra innings. Three weeks ago at Boston College, a win in 12, and at Richmond on April 28, 1975, a loss in 10 frames.

More on the BC games - shutouts and scoreless streaks: With the 1-0 shutout at BC, Tech notched just its sixth shutout ever in the ACC and second this season (11-0 at Maryland, April 20-G2). The other four were at Duke (2011), versus Wake Forest (2010), at Maryland (2009) and at Duke (2005).

The next day, May 4, Tech pitchers held BC scoreless for eight frames pushing the scoreless streak to an ACC high of 20 straight innings, easily passing the longest prior of 14 frames from 2009. The 13 scoreless frames that accompanied the Maryland shutout this year marks the third longest streak as a member of the ACC.

Tech had never shutout an ACC opponent in back-to-back games and only twice in their conference history have they had at least two shutouts in a three-game series - versus Seton Hall in 2004 and against Villanova in 2002 - the only back-to-back shutouts ever tossed in conference play.

Lastly, it was the longest conference scoreless streak since the team held Seton Hall and Georgetown scoreless for 19 frames in 2003. They also had an 18-inning stretch in 2002 - included Villanova games.

Non-league, the Hokies held Bryant scoreless for 27 straight frames back on March 4-5, 2011.

Home run notes (see next page for more info): The Hokies hit a season-high five home runs against Marist on May 12 with **Tyler Horan** and **Mark Zagunis** each hitting two. The five long balls were the most hit by the team since February 25, 2011 when they hit seven versus Niagara, which was also the last time two players each hit two home runs in a single game - **Tim Smalling** and **Andrew Rash**.

Horan's two pushed his season total to 10, as he became the first Hokie to hit 10 home runs in back-to-back seasons since **Brad Bauder** did it in 2002 and 2003.

Zagunis' two gave the Hokies four players (done five times) with multi-homer games this season. Two years ago, Tech had three players hit a pair of home runs in a game six times, with Rash doing it three times. Horan has done it twice this year, while **Chad Pinder** and Rash have also done it once.

The senior class: Tech's senior class this year was honored on Saturday before the Wake Forest cancelled game. Four-year seniors **Jake Joyce**, **Clark Labitan**, **Joe Mantiply** and **Andrew Rash** enter this weekend with 139 career wins over the past four seasons. That total ties the 1999 class and is more than any other four-year total since the 1990 class won 142. Only Rash was born (Nov. 11, 1989) when the 1990 class won its last game (May 19). After the 1990 win-total comes the 160 posted by the senior class that graduated in 1988.

The senior class - part two: With an NCAA postseason appearance on the horizon, it would mark just the ninth time that a senior class would be involved in two NCAA tournaments at the school. The following classes all played in at least two NCAA tournaments - 1977, 1978, 1979, 1997, 1999, 2000 (3), 2001, 2002, and 2013 if advance.
