TECH TRAVELS TO TOP-RANKED VIRGINIA FOR ACC SERIES

The weekend series: Tech continues its 121st season of baseball by taking a short trip north to Charlottesville, Va., to take on the No. 1-ranked Virginia Cavaliers. For the first time since April 19, 2000, the Hokies will enter a game versus Virginia with a three-game winning streak against them. The Hokies won that meeting back in 2000, 7-6 in 10 frames, to push their streak to four straight (which hadn't been done since the late 1980s). A snapshot of the Hokies' history versus Virginia is located to the right.

Winning five games in six tries in the ACC: At least one time each of the past six seasons, Tech has registered at least five wins in a six-game span in conference play. The most ever in a six-game span was the six wins by the 2009 squad, while the 2010 squad won five in a row, the second-longest streak ever for the Hokies in ACC play.

However, those two years and the 2011, 2012 & 2013 seasons, the Hokies never won five games in a six-game stretch before April 1, which the 2014 Hokies have now done.

Which means?: The 2014 Hokies are now tied for the best start to ACC play after nine games, in their 10-year history in the league, as they have matched last year's squad that also started 5-4. Prior to the past two seasons, the best start in ACC play was back in 2010 when the Hokies started 4-5. Both the 2010 and 2013 Hokies advanced to the ACC and NCAA Baseball Championships.

Moving forward, the 2010 Hokies posted six wins after 12 games in the ACC, the most wins before the 2013 squad topped them again with a 7-5 mark after its fourth conference weekend.

Bullpen saving (and winning) the day: Over the past two weekends, the Hokies bullpen has stepped up their efforts. Prior to the Pittsburgh series, which started on March 14, Tech's relievers had combined to throw 72.2 innings and had allowed 52 earned runs for a 6.19 ERA.

Since the bullpen has been quite reliable, combining to throw 31.0 innings and had allowed just one earned run for a 0.29 ERA. They are also 5-0 with four saves over the last seven games.

Interestingly, their counterparts in the other dugout have not been as reliable, as the Hokies torched opponent bullpens for 21 runs over 27 innings pitched for a 5.33 ERA over the past seven games. But that's about the norm for the season for Tech's opponent's bullpen (5.28 ERA).

#22 Patrick Mason

Head Coach

First Season



On June 27, 2013, Virginia Tech announced the hiring of Patrick Mason as the baseball program's newest head coach. He became the 24th head baseball coach at the school, but just the fifth in the last 66 years of the program. Mason took over the head coaching reins after spending the previous three seasons under former coach Pete Hughes.

Mason, who enters his 17th season in the coaching profession, was promoted to the position of associate head coach at Tech in the fall of 2012, and had served as the pitching game coordinator and recruiting coordinator in his three years prior to his promotion. The former Northeastern catcher (1994-97) spent the previous five seasons before coming to Tech as an assistant at Northeastern (2005-10).

In just three seasons with Tech, Mason has seen 10 of his Hokie pitchers sign pro pitching contracts, including six off this past season's roster. He has also guided the staff to register three straight seasons with an ERA lower than the previous year.

In those three consecutive seasons, the Tech pitching staff has posted an ERA no higher than 4.57, which hasn't happened since an 18-season streak that ended in 1980. The last time a Tech squad posted back-to-back seasons with an ERA of 4.20 or lower was the 1976-1977 teams, something the 2012-2013 teams just did.

Before his arrival in Blacksburg, Mason was the recipient of the 2010 Kevin Burr Award given to the top assistant coach in New England as selected by his peers. He also served as assistant coach at Framingham State in 2004 after four years at Boston College, when Hughes was the head coach there. For the summers of 2003-06, he was a coach with the Harwich Mariners of the Cape Cod League.

Mason has a tremendous history of developing catching prospects, and in his previous 13 years of coaching before coming to Tech, he served as a mentor for 10 catchers who were selected in the MLB Draft, including Huskies Matt Morizio and Dan Milano in his first two seasons at Northeastern.

While playing at Northeastern, the Franklin, Mass., native was captain in 1996 and 1997, and helped NU to America East championships in 1994 and 1997. In his four years, he found his way into the record books on both sides of the ball, as his 19 career home runs rank high in Husky history and, defensively, he holds the NU record for errorless chances in a season with 242 (1997).

He and his wife, Leigh, reside in Christiansburg.

Facing ranked teams: In the column to the left is the record for Tech baseball versus ranked opponents all-time, which includes an 0-4 record in 2014 - as the Hokies dropped a game at No. 2 LSU in weekend No. 2 and were swept at No. 15 Clemson in their first ACC weekend.

At this point, Tech is scheduled to play at least 17 more games against ranked foes this year, including No. 1 Virginia this weekend, with three other teams currently receiving votes in polls (also column left).

Facing No. 1: In their history, Tech is just 3-17 against No. 1 teams in the country, which includes facing No. 1 North Carolina last year, and the Hokies were swept by the Tar Heels in Blacksburg. Of the 20 games, all have been as a member of the ACC against ACC teams, while just six have been played on the road. Tech has a 1-5 record in those road games, but did win its last road game against a No. 1 team - Virginia, April 18, 2010, 8-5.

Weekend wins: Dating back to last season AND including the postseason (ACC Championship and NCAA Blacksburg Regional), Tech has had just one losing weekend since April 12-14, 2013 - a span of 13 straight weekends. That lone losing weekend was at No. 15 Clemson this year (March 7-9).

Those weekends included winning their final four ACC series of 2013, which was something the Hokies had never done before in league play. Their longest stretch was a three-weekend winning streak back in the 2010 season.

Tech in its ACC home-opening weekend: In its 10th season in the conference, Tech finally won its first ever ACC home opener with its 11-5 win over Pittsburgh two Fridays ago.

Overall, before its three-game sweep of the Panthers, the Hokies held just a 5-19 record in their first home conference weekend, winning just one series - against Maryland in 2010. The sweep over Pittsburgh was the first for the Hokies in an ACC home-opening weekend and marked the sixth straight season they have swept at least one ACC series. It was just the third ever ACC home sweep with the other two coming against Boston College (2010 & 2012).

Hokies opened with a new skipper: For just the second time since 1980, Tech opened a season with a new head coach. Back in 1979, Chuck Hartman coached his first game at Tech on March 10 and would go on to coach the Hokies for the next 28 years. In 2007, Pete Hughes took over the program and bridged the gap to Mason. On Feb. 14, 2014, Mason coached his first game as Tech head coach, and his first overall. Tech has had just six head coaches since 1945 - a span of 70 seasons - with G.F. (Red) Laird leading the second-most at 26 seasons.

English Field - Home of the Hokies

English Field was officially dedicated during a special ceremony on April 8, 1989 and is named for the late E.R. 'Red' English and his wife, Ruth, who provided financial support for construction of the field.

English, a native of Altavista, Va., played as an offensive and defensive guard on the Tech football teams from 1930-33 and graduated from Tech in 1934. English contributed to Tech athletics for more than 50 years and was one of the founders of The Student Aid Association in 1949. He served as president of that organization two of its first three years. English received the most outstanding alumni award at Tech in 1984.

Through a generous gift from alumnus George Sampson, the home team dugout was named for long-time Tech baseball coach G.F. 'Red' Laird during a ceremony on April 12, 1991. Laird recruited and coached Sampson at Tech.

The Tech athletics department continues to make upgrades to the facility, with its newest completed in the spring of 2012. The natural grass surface was replaced with artificial turf. The \$1 million field enables the Hokies to practice even during inclement weather, as grounds keepers can remove snow off of it quickly.

Plus, it also drains quickly, allowing for a speedy resumption of play following any rain delays. Also, as part of this project, the dugouts were expanded to almost twice the size, and a new batter's eye and a new padded outfield fence were added.

The Hokies opened play at their new home with a 7-2 victory against George Mason on March 22, 1989, and went on to post a 17-7 home record during their first season in the facility. Prior to the 2004 season, a new lighting system was installed and the Hokies played their first baseball game under the lights in Blacksburg on April 28 of that year, defeating VMI, 8-0.

The team's year-by-year overall mark in its 26 seasons at English Field can be seen in the graph on the right. Before English Field, Tech played its home baseball games at Tech Park, where it compiled a 431-122-1 record over 34 seasons. All-time, Tech is 1,200-510-12 in games played in Blacksburg.

Helping to Strike Out ALS: Last year, the Hokies partnered with Bull & Bones Brewhaus and Grill to help raise awareness and funds for ALS research. With every strikeout recorded by Tech's pitching staff during the 2013 season - \$5 for every regular season strikeout, \$10 for any strikeout in the ACC tournament and \$25 for any K registered in an NCAA Regional - money began accumulating for a final donation. The results after the season, showed a total of almost \$2,500 raised for ALS research (see totals in chart on right).

The two groups are proud to announce the partnership continuing for the 2014 season and the funds growing even more.

At least taking a split: Last season, Tech played seven doubleheaders (or two games in the same day), which was the most since the 2004 season when the Hokies played 11 - when doubleheaders were the norm in Big East Conference play. The most Tech played since the team started playing in the ACC, before last year, was six, during the 2011 season.

The seven doubleheaders resulted in the Hokies sweeping three and splitting the other four - which included their final day of the 2013 season. On June 2, they beat Connecticut, 3-1, but then lost the Blacksburg Regional to Oklahoma, 10-4, that evening.

Still, the Hokies have not lost both ends of a DH (or two games in a single day, both games starting on the same day) since May 14, 2011, versus Clemson. In those 14 doubleheaders, the Hokies have won seven and have split seven, including a 1-0-1 mark in 2014.

Taking care of nonconference business: Tech has certainly taken care of business when it comes to its nonconference slate over the previous five seasons. They had won at least 20 games in four of the past five seasons (last time before 2009 was 1999) and have only lost more than five regular-season games in nonconference action just once (2011). Below is Tech's record in nonconference games, with a breakdown of home, road and neutral sites and include a 4-3 mark in 2010 and 5-3 mark in 2013 for postseason play.

Zagunis earning some preseason accolades: Tech junior catcher **Mark Zagunis** received a pair of preseason honors heading into the 2014 baseball season and has since added a third.

First, he was first tabbed a National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association second team All-American catcher on Dec. 18 and followed that up with a Louisville Slugger second team All-American catcher nod announced by Collegiate Baseball newspaper on Dec. 23.

On March 7, he was one of six catchers in the ACC to be named to the official watch list for the 2014 Johnny Bench Award, announced by the Greater Wichita Area Sports Commission. It marks the second consecutive year Zagunis has made the watch list.

He and Hayden pick up weekly honors: With such an offensive week (56 runs over a five-game stretch from March 11-15) and an ACC series sweep against Pittsburgh, a pair of Hokies each picked up a weekly honor.

On March 17, **Zagunis** earned Tech's eighth ever ACC Player of the Week selection, while College Sports Madness announced March 18 that **Brendon Hayden** was named "Madness ACC Player of the Week."

Perez stays in line-up: Junior second baseman **Alex Perez** made his 118th consecutive start in the season opener at The Citadel and has started every game this season to push his personal streak to 139 - every game since stepping foot on campus and the most of any player on the current roster. Of the 139 starts for Perez, 91 have come at second, 48 at shortstop. His streak began Feb. 17, 2012.

It's the longest streak at the school since *Michael Seaborn* started 146 consecutive games - his were all at second base. His streak started on March 24, 2009 and ended May 21, 2011.

So does Zagunis: According to research done by the nation's SIDs, and entering the week of March 24th, **Perez'** streak was currently the 13th longest in the NCAA. However, right on his heels is Zagunis, who has started 130 straight games for the Hokies, which was the 19th longest streak in the nation. Tech is one of two teams on the list that has more than one player, but is the only school with two juniors (ETSU has one senior and one junior).

That list also shows that Perez is just one of five juniors in the country to start every game since his freshman year and he has the second-longest streak behind Florida's Casey Turgeon (147).

Earning the free pass: In the Hokies' loss to VCU on March 12, the team drew 14 walks, a single game record for the team since becoming a member of the ACC. Their previous high of 13 walks was set back in 2006 versus Marshall. The team came up three base-on-balls shy of tying the overall school record of 17 done twice - last versus Howard on April 1, 1990.

Piling up the runs: In the sweep of the Pittsburgh Panthers (March 14-15), the Hokies scored 11 runs in each of the games, marking the first time they scored at least 10 runs in all three games of an ACC series. Just once before had Tech scored at least 10 runs in three straight ACC games and that was back in 2010 (May 2, 10 vs. BC & May 14-15, 11 & 18 vs. Duke).

It had been almost 20 years since the Hokies scored at least 10 runs in a league series (win or lose). Back in 1994, Tech swept Louisville in a three-game Metro Conference series by scores of 15-4, 25-4 and 14-8.

Adding one more nugget to the offensive outburst the Hokies enjoyed during the week of March 11-15 - they scored at least 10 runs in all five games - the stretch marked the first time since the 2008 season that the team had reached double figures in runs scored in five straight games (Feb. 29 - March 2).

That's correct we had a tie: It hadn't happen in 13 years, but as Tech and Richmond battled back-and-forth and into extra innings on March 11 - and with the game time pushing to almost four hours (3:57) - it was necessary to call the contest a tie due to darkness because Pitt Field, located on the Richmond campus, does not have lights.

The Hokies had not registered a tie on their slate since April 14, 2001 when they played at Carroll Field in South Orange, N.J. After 12 innings in that contest, the game with Seton Hall finished in a 7-7 tie. Interestingly, it was the second game of a doubleheader against the Pirates that saw Tech drop the first game 13-1 (in seven innings, which was the norm back then on DH days).

This year's game marked the 26th tie in program history - the sixth that finished in extra frames.

Tech going the extra inning: The Hokies went to extra innings seven times last year, a new single-season record, passing the 2006 squad that played five.

With their 5-2 mark in extras, the wins were the most extra-inning victories in a single season ever, passing both the 2007 squad (3-1 in four games) and the 2006 team (3-2 in five extra-inning games).

This season, the Hokies have gone to extras three times already and have posted a 2-0-1 mark, which includes their last game - a 5-4 win in 12 frames at Notre Dame (March 23). That victory improved Tech's record to 8-1-1 in its extra-inning games on the road since the start of the 2009 season.

More on extra-inning games: In its last 25 extra-inning games, Tech is now 16-8-1 and, interestingly, of those 25 games, they are 6-8 against opponents from either North or South Carolina.

The last time Tech lost in extras to a team not from North or South Carolina was also the last time the team played back-to-back extra-inning games - at Boston College (March 25-26, 2006).

Walk-off wins: Tech has already registered three walk-off victories this season, which ties the number of walk-offs the team had last year. The Hokies had a season-high seven in 2012 (since joining the ACC).

The first was by **Alex Perez**, who notched his second career walk-off RBI when he hit a bases loaded single to score **Kyle Wernicki** in a 4-3 win in 11 frames against UMass Lowell. He previously drew a bases loaded walk on April 14, 2012 to force home the winning run in a 5-4 victory over Miami. He joins **Mark Zagunis** (three) as the only two active players with more than one career walk-off RBIs.

The second was by **Brendon Hayden**, who became the sixth Tech player since 2007 to hit a walk-off home run, as his three-run ninth-inning shot gave Tech a 9-6 win over Cincinnati.

The last one was off the bat of **Sean Keselica**, who single home Perez in the ninth for an 11-10 victory over Pittsburgh last week. He joins Hayden, Zagunis, Perez and Wernicki (1) as the other current Hokies with walk-off RBIs.

Stealing some bases: Freshman outfielder **Saige Jenco** stole three bases in a midweek home game against Radford, the most since *Tony Balisteri* stole three at Boston College on March 27, 2011. It's one shy of Tech's single-game record of four and tied for the most in a single game in the ACC this season.

WHAT'S A HOKIE

That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body. Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today.

Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Following is the "Old Hokie" yell in its original form:

Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy!
Tech! Tech! V.P.I.!
Sola-Rex Sola-Rah
Polytech-Vir-gin-i-ah!
Rae, Ri, V.P.I.

JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.
