TECH TRAVELS TO NORTH CAROLINA FOR CAMPBELL INVITATIONAL

The weekend series: Tech continues season No. 122 of baseball at the school by taking part in the Campbell Invitational in Buies Creek, N.C. The Hokies will face both Rider and the host Camels in a pair of games this weekend. A snapshot of the Hokies' history versus each team is located to the right.

Facing the Big South: The Camels are members of the Big South Conference and all-time, the Hokies are 138-56-1 for a .710 winning percentage. A majority of those wins have come against Radford (40), Liberty (38) and High Point (22). Tech was 4-1 against the Big South last year - losing only to Campbell (14-9) in extra innings in Blacksburg.

Facing the MAAC: The Broncs are from the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference and Tech has played just 12 games in its history against current members of the league. The Hokies all-time are 9-3 (.750) - facing four (Canisius, 1-0; Marist, 3-0; Niagara, 3-1; and Rider) of the 11 conference teams.

Perez is the nation's Ironman: Entering the weekend, senior Alex Perez is just one of five players in Division I baseball to have started in every one of his team's games since stepping foot on campus. Perez' 173 consecutive starts is currently the longest streak in the nation and is the longest streak to start a career at Tech. Of his 173 starts at Tech, 120 have been at second base, 48 have been at shortstop and two have been on the mound.

Nice start to Hokie career: Redshirt-senior Erik Payne sat out last year due to the NCAA transfer rule - he previously played three seasons at South Carolina. Payne opened his Tech career in fine fashion as he helped the Hokies to a weekend series win at Mercer. After dropping the first game, Payne had three hits, scored three times and drove in four runs in the Saturday's win, then blasted a three-run home run in Sunday's victory to give him an ACC-high seven RBIs for the weekend.

#22 Patrick Mason

Head Coach

Second Season



On June 27, 2013, Virginia Tech announced the hiring of Patrick Mason as the baseball program's newest head coach. He became the 24th head baseball coach at the school, but just the fifth in the prior 66 years of the program. Mason took over the head coaching reins after spending the previous three seasons under former coach Pete Hughes.

Mason, who enters his 18th season in the coaching profession, was promoted to the position of associate head coach at Tech in the fall of 2012, and had served as the pitching game coordinator and recruiting coordinator in his three years prior to his promotion. The former Northeastern catcher (1994-97) spent the previous five seasons before coming to Tech as an assistant at Northeastern (2005-10).

Before his arrival in Blacksburg, Mason was the recipient of the 2010 Kevin Burr Award given to the top assistant coach in New England as selected by his peers. He also served as assistant coach at Framingham State in 2004 after four years at Boston College, when Hughes was the head coach there. For the summers of 2003-06, he was a coach with the Harwich Mariners of the Cape Cod League.

Mason has a tremendous history of developing catching prospects and in his previous 13 years of coaching before coming to Tech, he served as a mentor for 10 catchers who were selected in the MLB Draft, including Huskies Matt Morizio and Dan Milano at Northeastern. The drafting of Hokies' catcher Mark Zagunis in the third round (78th pick) of the 2014 draft only continued that trend.

Also taken in the 2014 draft was pitcher Brad Markey, which brings the total number of Tech pitchers who signed pro pitching contracts under Mason to 11, which included six off the 2013 roster - his last of three seasons as the Hokies' pitching coach.

In those three years, the Tech pitching staff registered three straight seasons with an ERA lower than the previous year and posted an ERA no higher than 4.57, which hadn't happened since an 18-season streak that ended in 1980. The last time a Tech squad posted back-to-back seasons with an ERA of 4.20 or lower was the 1976 and 1977 teams, something the 2012 and 2013 teams accomplished.

While playing at Northeastern, the Franklin, Massachusetts, native was the team's captain in 1996 and 1997, and helped NU to America East championships in 1994 and 1997. In his four years, he found his way into the record books on both sides of the ball, as his 19 career home runs rank high in Husky history and, defensively, he holds the NU record for errorless chances in a season with 242 (1997).

McGarity wins first game at Tech: Sophomore pitcher **Aaron McGarity** finally picked up his first win in a Tech uniform after a number of hard-luck losses and no-decisions in seven starts during his freshman campaign.

The Hokies made sure he would pick up that first one this time as the team put 11 runs on the board against Mercer in the second game of the weekend series with the Bears. McGarity, who was cruising through the first four innings with a 3-0 lead - he retired 12 of 13 straight after a leadoff walk in the first frame - ran into trouble in the fifth when he surrendered a grand slam - Mercer's first hit of the afternoon.

The Hokies responded in the top of the sixth with five runs and **Luke Scherzer** earned his fifth save of the season after pitching the final three innings scoreless in the 11-4 Tech win.

Woodcock career-high gives Hokies series win: Redshirt-junior pitcher **Jon Woodcock** made the most of his first outing of the 2015 season. Woodcock tossed six solid innings for the Hokies, allowing two runs on two hits and struck out seven batters in the team's Sunday victory over Mercer, which secured the series win over the Bears. His six innings were a Tech career-high and he also struck out a Tech career-high seven batters in the 5-4 victory.

His previous Tech highs were 5.1 innings at Notre Dame (3/23/14) and versus Duke (4/20/14) and six strikeouts in the game against Notre Dame.

Jenco enjoys first weekend in Georgia: Tech's leadoff man **Saige Jenco** did exactly what a leadoff man should do, get on base. In all three games at Mercer, Jenco singled to start the game and continued to reach base the entire weekend.

Jenco, a redshirt-sophomore, finished the weekend with multi-hit games in all three contests and reached base eight times for a .533 on-base percentage. He also had an extra-base hit in each game - notching a pair of doubles and hitting his second career home run - the first out of the park.

Jenco finished third on the team last year in multi-hit games with 17 and had five games with at least three hits - he already has two this season with his pair at Mercer.

Kennedy earns third career save: Junior pitcher **Sean Kennedy** was called upon in to get the final two outs of the game against Mercer on Sunday - a 5-4 contest with a runner on third and one out. Kennedy got the two Bears he faced to ground to third, which gave him his first save of the year and first since March 23 of last season. In that one, ironically, Kennedy was called in to save a 5-4 game as well, but in the 12th inning in a game played at Notre Dame.

English Field - Home of the Hokies

English Field was officially dedicated during a special ceremony on April 8, 1989 and is named for the late E.R. 'Red' English and his wife, Ruth, who provided financial support for construction of the field.

English, a native of Altavista, Va., played as an offensive and defensive guard on the Tech football teams from 1930-33 and graduated from Tech in 1934. English contributed to Tech athletics for more than 50 years and was one of the founders of The Student Aid Association in 1949. He served as president of that organization two of its first three years. English received the most outstanding alumni award at Tech in 1984.

Through a generous gift from alumnus George Sampson, the home team dugout was named for long-time Tech baseball coach G.F. 'Red' Laird during a ceremony on April 12, 1991. Laird recruited and coached Sampson at Tech.

The Tech athletics department continues to make upgrades to the facility, with its newest completed in the spring of 2012. The natural grass surface was replaced with artificial turf. The \$1 million field enables the Hokies to practice even during inclement weather, as grounds keepers can remove snow off of it quickly.

Plus, it also drains quickly, allowing for a speedy resumption of play following any rain delays. Also, as part of this project, the dugouts were expanded to almost twice the size, and a new batter's eye and a new padded outfield fence were added.

The Hokies opened play at their new home with a 7-2 victory against George Mason on March 22, 1989, and went on to post a 17-7 home record during their first season in the facility. Prior to the 2004 season, a new lighting system was installed and the Hokies played their first baseball game under the lights in Blacksburg on April 28 of that year, defeating VMI, 8-0.

The team's year-by-year overall mark in its 27 seasons at English Field can be seen in the graph on the right. Before English Field, Tech played its home baseball games at Tech Park, where it compiled a 431-122-1 (.779 winning percentage) record over 34 seasons All-time, Tech is 1,207-522-12 (.697) in games played in Blacksburg.

Tech in season openers: The Hokies have posted a 62-58-2 record in 122 season openers. The last time a Tech season opener was played at home was in 1995, and in the 20 years since, the Hokies have recorded an 11-9 mark - which includes losses in its last two.

In that 20-year span, Tech had opened the season in the state of Georgia twice, before - in 2012 and 2005 before this season. The previous weekend trips were successful, as the Hokies went 3-1 at the Kennesaw State Tournament in 2012, defeating Bradley twice (6-4, Feb. 17; & 11-1, Feb. 18) and splitting games with the host Owls (3-2, Feb. 17; & losing 6-3, Feb. 19).

At the Savannah State Invitational in 2005, Tech lost its opener to Villanova (5-3, Feb. 18), but rebounded with wins over Navy (9-0, Feb. 19) and the host Tigers (11-7, Feb. 21).

Ironically, the 2015 weekend opened like the 2005 opening weekend, as the Hokies lost their first game to Mercer, 9-1, but responded with back-to-back wins over the Bears on Saturday and Sunday (11-4 and 5-4).

Happy "Opening" Day: For the first time in program history (since 1892), Tech opened a season before Valentine's Day. And for just the third time the Hokies played a baseball game on Valentine's Day (the earliest start prior to this season). In the 2014 and 2003 seasons, Tech played on Feb. 14 and were 1-1.

Adding to that, the Hokies played the first three games as scheduled last week and marked the most games played before Feb. 16 in their program history with three. The most prior to that was two in 2003 and 1892.

According to the history books, Tech played two games back in 1892 against Newports on Feb. 1 and Feb. 2 - the earliest ever start - and their only two games that season, the program's first year of competition.

At least taking a split: With Monday's game scheduled for a doubleheader (or two games in the same day), it will mark Tech's first one of the 2015 season. Last year, the team played just three, however in 2013, the Hokies played seven, which was the most since the 2004 season when the Hokies played 11 - when DHs were the norm in Big East Conference play. The most Tech played since the team started playing in the ACC, before 2013, was six, during 2011.

Since Clemson beat the Hokies in a pair of games at English Field on May 14, 2011, the team had played 14 DH and were never swept. They won seven and split seven. However, Tech lost a DH at the end of last season to NC State at English Field ending the overall streak

Ironically, though, Tech has not lost a DH on the road since falling at Clemson on March 20, 2010 in a pair of games. Since, the team has played seven and is 3-0-4 in them - including two sweeps (in 2013) and two splits (both at Wake Forest) in the state of North Carolina.

WHAT'S A HOKIE

That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body. Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today.

Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Following is the "Old Hokie" yell in its original form:

Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy!
Tech! Tech! V.P.I.!
Sola-Rex Sola-Rah
Polytech-Virgin-ia!!
Rae, Ri, V.P.I.

JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.
