HOKIES FACE NO. 1 VIRGINIA IN ACC HOME OPENER AT ENGLISH FIELD

The weekend series: Tech will host No. 1 Virginia for its ACC home-opening weekend. The series starts a 10-game homestand for the Hokies, their longest since a 10-gamer back in 2012. The series is also presented by Virginia529, the official college savings plan of Virginia Tech Athletics. It is also a potential point in the Virginia529 Commonwealth Clash, the new point rivalry series between Virginia and Virginia Tech. Currently the score for the Clash is Virginia 7.5 and Virginia Tech 5.5. Learn more about Virginia529 and this new competition at thecommonwealthclash.com.

Perez is the nation's Ironman: Entering the weekend, Tech's Alex Perez is just one of five seniors in Division I baseball to have started in every one of his team's games since stepping foot on campus. Perez' 186 consecutive starts is currently the longest streak in the nation and is the longest streak to ever start a career at Tech. Of his 186 starts at Tech, 134 have been at second base, 49 have been at shortstop and three have been on the mound.

Checking the national rankings: Some Hokies are currently ranked in the top 50 in the nation in several categories. Perez is 7th in runs (22) and 11th in per game average (1.38), 12th in triples (3) and 33rd in per game (0.19), and 22nd in walks (15) and 49th in per game (0.94). Perez is also second among active career leaders in walks (119) behind Central Michigan's Pat MacKenzie.

Also at the plate, **Brendon Hayden** is 13th in home runs and 32nd in per game average (0.31), 37th in doubles (7) and 44th in total bases (40). **Ricky Surum** is 12th in sacrifice bunts (5) and 35th in per game average (0.31), while **Mac Caples** is 46th in HBP (3) and 48th in per game (0.42).

On the mound, **Jon Woodcock** is 27th in hits allowed per nine innings (4.13) and 39th in strikeouts (29), and his WHIP (0.83) is just outside the top 50.

More on the national numbers: Just four weeks into the 2015 season and the Hokies have already eclipsed last year's home run total. In 2014, Tech hit just 12 during the entire season, with Hayden leading the team with seven. Tech's 13 home runs - they Hokies are still led by Hayden, who has five already - currently rank them 25th in the nation in long balls. They are on pace to hit 44 home runs this season, which would more than triple last year's output.

#22 Patrick Mason

Head Coach

Second Season



On June 27, 2013, Virginia Tech announced the hiring of Patrick Mason as the baseball program's newest head coach. He became the 24th head baseball coach at the school, but just the fifth in the prior 66 years of the program. Mason took over the head coaching reins after spending the previous three seasons under former coach Pete Hughes.

Mason, who enters his 18th season in the coaching profession, was promoted to the position of associate head coach at Tech in the fall of 2012, and had served as the pitching game coordinator and recruiting coordinator in his three years prior to his promotion. The former Northeastern catcher (1994-97) spent the previous five seasons before coming to Tech as an assistant at Northeastern (2005-10).

Before his arrival in Blacksburg, Mason was the recipient of the 2010 Kevin Burr Award given to the top assistant coach in New England as selected by his peers. He also served as assistant coach at Framingham State in 2004 after four years at Boston College, when Hughes was the head coach there. For the summers of 2003-06, he was a coach with the Harwich Mariners of the Cape Cod League.

Mason has a tremendous history of developing catching prospects and in his previous 13 years of coaching before coming to Tech, he served as a mentor for 10 catchers who were selected in the MLB Draft, including Huskies Matt Morizio and Dan Milano at Northeastern. The drafting of Hokies' catcher Mark Zagunis in the third round (78th pick) of the 2014 draft only continued that trend.

Also taken in the 2014 draft was pitcher Brad Markey, which brings the total number of Tech pitchers who signed pro pitching contracts under Mason to 11, which included six off the 2013 roster - his last of three seasons as the Hokies' pitching coach.

In those three years, the Tech pitching staff registered three straight seasons with an ERA lower than the previous year and posted an ERA no higher than 4.57, which hadn't happened since an 18-season streak that ended in 1980. The last time a Tech squad posted back-to-back seasons with an ERA of 4.20 or lower was the 1976 and 1977 teams, something the 2012 and 2013 teams accomplished.

While playing at Northeastern, the Franklin, Massachusetts, native was the team's captain in 1996 and 1997, and helped NU to America East championships in 1994 and 1997. In his four years, he found his way into the record books on both sides of the ball, as his 19 career home runs rank high in Husky history and, defensively, he holds the NU record for errorless chances in a season with 242 (1997).

WHAT'S A HOKIE

That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body. Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today.

Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Following is the "Old Hokie" yell in its original form:

Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy!
 Tech! Tech! V.P.I.!
 Sola-Rex Sola-Rah
 Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!!
 Rae, Ri, V.P.I.

JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.

The 12 runs marked the third time Tech scored at least 10 runs in an ACC opener and won all three (10-8 at UVa, 2012 & 19-4 at Duke, 2009).

Playing in the DH on that Saturday, Tech had a chance to open 2-0 for the first time ever and win its first ever DH on the road in the ACC, but the Demon Deacons pulled out the win. Tech is 2-6-7 overall in ACC doubleheader games, 2-3-3 at home.

Tech in ACC opening weekends: In its 11 seasons in the conference, Tech is now 2-9 in opening series weekends in the league (only winning in 2007 and 2010) after the team dropped a 2-1 series at Wake Forest last weekend. The series at Wake also marked the ninth time the Hokies opened league play on the road, but it was only the fifth time they did not face a ranked opponent in their opener. All-time, after the opening weekend, Tech is a combined 9-24.

Tech in its ACC home-opening weekend: For the first time in its 10 seasons in the conference, Tech finally won its first ever ACC home opener with its 11-5 win over Pittsburgh last year. The Hokies had been winless in their previous nine tries.

The Hokies then swept Pittsburgh, marking their first ever ACC home-opening sweep and just their second ever home series win in their ACC home opener. Before the sweep, Tech held just a 5-19 record in its first home ACC weekend, winning just one series - against Maryland in 2010. The sweep also marked the sixth straight season Tech had swept at least one ACC series and it was the third at home - the other two against Boston College (2010 & 2012).

Facing ranked teams: In the column to the left is the record for Tech baseball versus ranked opponents all-time, which includes a 1-10 record in 2014. This weekend's games marks the first ranked team the Hokies will face this season, but they could possibly face a ranked opponent for the next six straight weekends or more.

Facing No. 1: In their history, Tech is just 3-20 against No. 1 teams in the country, which includes facing No. 1 Virginia last year, and the Hokies were swept by the Cavaliers in Charlottesville. Of the 23 games, all have been as a member of the ACC against ACC teams, with 14 of those games being played in Blacksburg - Tech has a 2-12 record in those games.

The last time Tech beat a No. 1 was April 18, 2010, at Virginia, 8-5, while its other two wins were over Miami (May 10, 2008, 7-6 in a DH) and Florida State (March 18, 2006, 9-7).

English Field - Home of the Hokies

English Field was officially dedicated during a special ceremony on April 8, 1989 and is named for the late E.R. 'Red' English and his wife, Ruth, who provided financial support for construction of the field.

English, a native of Altavista, Va., played as an offensive and defensive guard on the Tech football teams from 1930-33 and graduated from Tech in 1934. English contributed to Tech athletics for more than 50 years and was one of the founders of The Student Aid Association in 1949. He served as president of that organization two of its first three years. English received the most outstanding alumni award at Tech in 1984.

Through a generous gift from alumnus George Sampson, the home team dugout was named for long-time Tech baseball coach G.F. 'Red' Laird during a ceremony on April 12, 1991. Laird recruited and coached Sampson at Tech.

The Tech athletics department continues to make upgrades to the facility, with its newest completed in the spring of 2012. The natural grass surface was replaced with artificial turf. The \$1 million field enables the Hokies to practice even during inclement weather, as grounds keepers can remove snow off of it quickly.

Plus, it also drains quickly, allowing for a speedy resumption of play following any rain delays. Also, as part of this project, the dugouts were expanded to almost twice the size, and a new batter's eye and a new padded outfield fence were added.

The Hokies opened play at their new home with a 7-2 victory against George Mason on March 22, 1989, and went on to post a 17-7 home record during their first season in the facility. Prior to the 2004 season, a new lighting system was installed and the Hokies played their first baseball game under the lights in Blacksburg on April 28 of that year, defeating VMI, 8-0.

The team's year-by-year overall mark in its 27 seasons at English Field can be seen in the graph on the right. Before English Field, Tech played its home baseball games at Tech Park, where it compiled a 431-122-1 (.779 winning percentage) record over 34 seasons. All-time, Tech is 1,207-523-12 (.696) in games played in Blacksburg.

Helping to Strike Out ALS: Starting in the 2013 season, the Virginia Tech baseball team partnered with Bull & Bones Brewhaus and Grill to help raise awareness and funds for ALS research and the two will do so again during the 2015 season as well.

With every strikeout recorded by Tech's pitching staff during the past two seasons, and now this year, \$5 is donated for every regular-season strikeout, while \$10 is donated for any strikeout during the ACC tournament and \$25 for any K registered in an NCAA Regional.

During that first season, the team helped raise almost \$2,500 for ALS research, and last year they pushed the grand total to more than \$4,000 (see chart on right).

Experience a key for 2015: Looking back at the 2014 roster, it featured just two seniors (pitchers **Brad Markey** and **Tanner McIntyre**) and 17 newcomers. A young team a year ago, meant that most of the team would be back for 2015. And even though the Hokies lost a key member of the offense, when catcher **Mark Zagunis** left early after being drafted in the third round, the numbers the Hokies have coming back for 2015 are ridiculous.

In the field, 424 starts from last year (out of a possible 477) return and 88 percent of the at-bats are back as well. This from a team that led the ACC in batting, overall and conference-only. Looking at the pitching staff, 40 of the starts on the mound returned (out of 53) and 73 percent of the innings pitched are also back.

Happy "Opening" Day: For the first time in program history (since 1892), Tech opened a season before Valentine's Day. And for just the third time the Hokies played a baseball game on Valentine's Day (the earliest start prior to this season). In the 2014 and 2003 seasons, Tech played on Feb. 14 and were 1-1.

Adding to that, the Hokies played those first three games opening weekend, marking the most games played before Feb. 16 in their program history with three. The most prior to that was two in 2003 and 1892. According to the history books, Tech played two games back in 1892 against Newports on Feb. 1 and Feb. 2 - the earliest ever start - and their only two games that season, the program's first year of competition.
