HOKIES HIT THE ROAD FOR ACC WEEKEND AT NO. 7 FLORIDA STATE

The weekend series: Virginia Tech heads out on the road this weekend to face nationally-ranked Florida State. The Hokies have not seen the Seminoles since 2013, when Tech won a series against FSU in Blacksburg, then walked-off on them in the ACC Tournament in Durham, N.C. - a *Mark Zagunis* solo home run in the ninth in the 3-2 victory. Tech has lost four straight in Tallahassee - being swept in 2012 - but won its only series at Florida State during the 2010 campaign.

Perez is the nation's Ironman: Entering the weekend, Tech's Alex Perez is one of four seniors in DI baseball to have started every one of his team's games since stepping foot on campus. Perez' 196 consecutive starts is currently the longest streak in the nation and the longest to start a career at Tech.

#22 Patrick Mason Head Coach Second Season

On June 27, 2013, Virginia Tech announced the hiring of Patrick Mason as the baseball program's newest head coach. He became the 24th head baseball coach at the school, but just the fifth in the prior 66 years of the program. Mason took over the head coaching reigns after spending the previous three seasons under former coach Pete Hughes.

Mason, who enters his 18th season in the coaching profession, was promoted to the position of associate head coach at Tech in the fall of 2012, and had served as the pitching game coordinator and recruiting coordinator in his three years prior to his promotion. The former Northeastern catcher (1994-97) spent the previous five seasons before coming to Tech as an assistant at Northeastern (2005-10).

Before his arrival in Blacksburg, Mason was the recipient of the 2010 Kevin Burr Award given to the top assistant coach in New England as selected by his peers. He also served as assistant coach at Framingham State in 2004 after four years at Boston College, when Hughes was the head coach there. For the summers of 2003-06, he was a coach with the Harwich Mariners of the Cape Cod League.

Mason has a tremendous history of developing catching prospects and in his previous 13 years of coaching before coming to Tech, he served as a mentor for 10 catchers who were selected in the MLB Draft, including Huskies Matt Morizio and Dan Milano at Northeastern. The drafting of Hokies' catcher Mark Zagunis in the third round (78th pick) of the 2014 draft only continued that trend.

Also taken in the 2014 draft was pitcher Brad Markey, which brings the total number of Tech pitchers who signed pro pitching contracts under Mason to 11, which included six off the 2013 roster – his last of three seasons as the Hokies' pitching coach.

In those three years, the Tech pitching staff registered three straight seasons with an ERA lower than the previous year and posted an ERA no higher than 4.57, which hadn't happened since an 18-season streak that ended in 1980. The last time a Tech squad posted back-to-back seasons with an ERA of 4.20 or lower was the 1976 and 1977 teams, something the 2012 and 2013 teams accomplished.

While playing at Northeastern, the Franklin, Massachusetts, native was the team's captain in 1996 and 1997, and helped NU to America East championships in 1994 and 1997. In his four years, he found his way into the record books on both

sides of the ball, as his 19 career home runs rank high in Husky history and, defensively, he holds the NU record for errorless chances in a season with 242 (1997).

Keselica named ACC Pitcher of the Week: Senior **Sean Keselica** became just the third Tech pitcher to be selected as the ACC's Pitcher of the Week and the first since 2010 for his effort against Virginia two weekends ago - a complete game, four-hitter with one unearned run in the 2-1 Tech win.

He joined former Tech pitcher Justin Wright, who earned three (March 29 and April 5, 2010 and April 27, 2009) during his career in Blacksburg and Ryan Kennedy (Feb. 21 and May 2, 2005), who got it twice in his time at Tech.

McGarity wins first game at Tech: Sophomore pitcher **Aaron McGarity** finally picked up his first win in a Tech uniform after a number of hard-luck losses and no-decisions in seven starts during his freshman campaign.

The Hokies made sure he would pick up that first one this time as the team put 11 runs on the board against Mercer in the second game of the weekend series with the Bears. McGarity, who was cruising through the first four innings with a 3-0 lead - he retired 12 of 13 straight after a leadoff walk in the first frame - ran into trouble in the fifth when he surrendered a grand slam - Mercer's first hit of the afternoon.

The Hokies responded in the top of the sixth with five runs and **Luke Scherzer** earned his first save of the season after pitching the final three innings scoreless in the 11-4 Tech win.

Keselica's chance to join elite company: Last weekend, Keselica had a chance to do what no starting pitcher for Tech has ever done as a member of the ACC - earn a win in each of the first three weekends of the season's slate. He held Clemson scoreless over eight frames, but the Hokies could not get a run on their own and lost in extra frames.

With a win this weekend, he could join Mathew Price as the only Tech starting pitchers to earn three wins in the first four weekends of the ACC season. Price was 1-1 after the first two weekends and picked up wins the next to to improve to 3-1 after four starts. No Tech starting pitcher has ever been 3-0 after the first four ACC weekends.

Helping to Strike Out ALS: Starting in the 2013 season, the Virginia Tech baseball team partnered with Bull & Bones Brewhaus and Grill to help raise awareness and funds for ALS research and the two will do so again during the 2015 season as well.

With every strikeout recorded by Tech's pitching staff during the past two season, and now this year, \$5 is donated for every regular-season strikeout, while \$10 is donated for any strikeout during the ACC tournament and \$25 for any K registered in an NCAA Regional.

During that first season, the team helped raise almost \$2,500 for ALS research, and last year they pushed the grand total to more than \$4,000.

Checking the national rankings: Some Hokies are currently ranked in the top 50 in the nation in several categories. **Alex Perez** is second in triples (5), 11th in runs (30) and 30th in total bases (59).

Brendon Hayden is 24th in doubles (10), 26th in home runs (6) and 30th in RBIs (26).

Ricky Surum is 25th in sacrifice bunts (6). **Erik Payne** is 46th in sacrifice flies (3).

On to the team numbers: The Hokies are in the top 50 as a team in four offensive categories - 39th in walks (107), 44th in triples (8), 48th in sacrifice flies (12) and 49th in home runs (17).

Just halfway through the season, Tech has already hit more home runs this season than all of last year (12).

Hokies dimbing the charts in ACC action: Since Tech joined the ACC (11 seasons now), Perez and Hayden are closing in on some of the top numbers over the past decade produce by Hokies.

Perez is already No. 1 at the school in most sacrifice hits (26) and double plays turned (118) as a player in the ACC and is just three walks shy of topping the base on balls category (123, Sean O'Brien, 2005-08). He also tops the most assists by a player at 624 and is closing in on the school record of 647 set by Spencer Harris from 2000-03. Also, Perez is also tied for fourth all-time at the school in triples with 12.

Hayden is just one intentional walk shy of matching the eight Mark Zagunis (2012-14) was issued in his time at the school and is three sacrifice flies of tying Michael Seaborn (14) for the most as an Tech ACC player.

Payne a pain for pitchers: After sitting out the 2014 season due to NCAA transfer rules, it took Payne just one day to get comfortable to the 2015 season. He went hitless in his first game of the season, but has reached base in every game since, pushing his streak to 25 consecutive games. That is the longest streak at the school since Mark Zagunis reached in 36 straight games during the 2012 season.

Turning the triple play: On Wednesday evening, **Rahiem Cooper** started what would be Tech's first triple play turned as a member of the ACC (since 2005). Cooper's snag out in right field and the result, a 9463 TP, was caught on video and was ranked as the No. 2 play on SportsCenter that night.

Tech has hit into two double plays in that time, once during the 2006 and the other in 2009.

Facing ranked teams: In the column to the left is the record for Tech baseball versus ranked opponents as a member of the ACC, which includes a 1-10 record in 2014. The Hokies already have more wins over ranked teams this year than last, as they are 3-0. Starting this weekend, Tech could possibly face a ranked opponent for the next five straight weekends.

Facing a ranked Florida State team: In its history in the ACC, Tech has faced Florida State nine times (in 10 years, every year except 2014) in a series and the Seminoles have been ranked every season. The Hokies have won just two of those series and are just 7-21 overall. Tech has been ranked in just one of those games - the 2013 ACC Tournament game.

Facing No. 1: In their history, Tech is now 6-20 against No. 1 teams in the country. Of the 26 games 17 of those games have been played in Blacksburg. Tech held a 2-12 record in those games before the weekend sweep of Virginia two weeks ago.

The other wins over No. 1 programs occurred April 18, 2010, at Virginia, 8-5; May 10, 2008, versus Miami, 7-6 in a DH; and March 18, 2006, versus Florida State, 9-7.

Tech sweeps No. 1 Virginia: For the first time as a member of the ACC, the Hokies sweept a series against a nationally-ranked team when they took all three games against the top-ranked Cavaliers two weekends ago in Blacksburg. Entering the weekend, Tech had won just nine series against ranked teams, as a member of the ACC, with seven of those coming at home.

The sweep also gave the Hokies their seventh sweep of an ACC opponent, ironically, one a year for the past seven years and includes sweeping Pittsburgh in last year's home opening ACC weekend. The others are at Maryland (2009, 2011) and at Duke (2013) and home sweeps against Boston College (2010, 2012).

Tech in its ACC home-opening weekend: For the first time in its 10 seasons in the conference, Tech finally won its first ever ACC home opener with its 11-5 win over Pittsburgh last year. The Hokies had been winless in their previous nine tries. They made it two in a row in ACC home openers after beating Virginia, 2-1, two Fridays ago.

Ironically, the Hokies also then swept Pittsburgh last year as well, which marked their first ever ACC home-opening sweep and just their second ever home series win in their ACC home opening weekend. Before last year's sweep, Tech held just a 5-19 record in its first home ACC weekend, winning just one series - against Maryland in 2010. After the sweeps to open 2014 and 2015, Tech is now 11-19 after its ACC home opening weekend.

English Field - Home of the Hokies

English Field was officially dedicated during a special ceremony on April 8 1989 and is named for the late E.R. 'Red' English and his wife, Ruth, who pro vided financial support for construction of the field.

English, a native of Altavista, Va., played as an offensive and defensive guard on the Tech football teams from 1930-33 and graduated from Tech in 1934 English contributed to Tech athletics for more than 50 years and was one of the founders of The Student Aid Association in 1949. He served as president of that organization two of its first three years. English received the most outstanding alumni award at Tech in 1984.

Through a generous gift from alumnus George Sampson, the home team dugout was named for long-time Tech baseball coach G.F. 'Red' Laird during a ceremony on April 12, 1991. Laird recruited and coached Sampson at Tech.

The Tech athletics department continues to make upgrades to the facility, with its newest completed in the spring of 2012. The natural grass surface was replaced with artificial turf. The \$1 million field enables the Hokies to practice even during inclement weather, as grounds keepers can remove snow off of it quickly.

Plus, it also drains quickly, allowing for a speedy resumption of play following any rain delays. Also, as part of this project, the dugouts were expanded to almost twice the size, and a new batter's eye and a new padded outfield fence were added.

The Hokies opened play at their new home with a 7-2 victory against George Mason on March 22, 1989, and went on to post a 17-7 home record during their first season in the facility. Prior to the 2004 season, a new lighting system was installed and the Hokies played their first baseball game under the lights in Blacksburg on April 28 of that year, defeating VMI, 8-0.

The team's year-by-year overall mark in its 27 seasons at English Field can be seen in the graph on the right. Before English Field, Tech played its home baseball games at Tech Park, where it compiled a 431-122-1 (.779 winning percentage) record over 34 seasons. All-time, Tech is 1,214-526-12 (.696) in games played in Blacksburg.

Tech in ACC opening games: The Hokies won their ACC season-opening game, a 12-7 decision at Wake Forest (March 7), in the first of two games that day, to improve to 4-7 in ACC openers, also winning in 2007, 2009, and 2012. The 12 runs marked the third time Tech scored at least 10 runs in an ACC season opener and they won all three (10-8 at UVa, 2012 & 19-4 at Duke, 2009).

Playing in the DH on that Saturday, Tech had a chance to open 2-0 for the first time ever and win its first ever DH on the road in the ACC, but the Demon Deacons pulled out the win. Tech is 2-6-8 overall in ACC doubleheader games, 2-3-3 at home.

Tech in ACC opening weekends: In its 11 seasons in the conference, Tech is now 2-9 in opening series weekends in the league (only winning in 2007 and 2010) after the team dropped a 2-1 series at Wake Forest to open the 2015 ACC slate. The series at Wake also marked the ninth time the Hokies opened league play on the road, but it was only the fifth time they did not face a ranked opponent in their opening weekend. All-time, after the opening weekend, Tech is a combined 9-24.

Happy "Opening" Day: For the first time in program history (since 1892), Tech opened a season before Valentine's Day. And for just the third time the Hokies played a baseball game on Valentine's Day (the earliest start prior to this season). In the 2014 and 2003 seasons, Tech played on Feb. 14 and were 1-1.

Adding to that, the Hokies played those first three games opening weekend, marking the most games played before Feb. 16 in their program history with three. The most prior to that was two in 2003 and 1892. According to the history books, Tech played two games back in 1892 against Newports on Feb. 1 and Feb. 2 - the earliest ever start - and their only two games that season, the program's first year of competition.

Experience a key for 2015: Looking back at the 2014 roster, it featured just two seniors (pitchers **Brad Markey** and **Tanner Mointyre**) and 17 newcomers. A young team a year ago, meant that most of the team would be back for 2015. And even though the Hokies lost a key member of the offense, when catcher **Mark Zagunis** left early after being drafted in the third round, the numbers the Hokies have coming back for 2015 are ridiculous.

In the field, 424 starts from last year (out of a possible 477) return and 88 percent of the at-bats are back as well. This from a team that led the ACC in batting, overall and conference-only. Looking at the pitching staff, 40 of the starts on the mound returned (out of 53) and 73 percent of the innings pitched are also back.

WHAT'S A HOKIE

That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body. Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today.

Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Following is the "Old Hokie" yell in its original form:

Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy! Tech! Tech! V.P.I.! Sola-Rex Sola-Rah Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!! Rae, Ri, V.P.I.

JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its named to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.
