## HOKIES ENTER STRETCH RUN WITH ACC POSTSEASON ON THE LINE

**The weekend series:** Tech enters the stretch run after just completing a gauntlet of six-week period when the team faced the last 13 ACC Baseball Championship teams. The Hokies went 7-10 in that span, the best winning percentage ever against those six teams in its ACC history. Only the 2010 squad had as many wins (when playing all six of those teams in an ACC season) as they went 7-11, while the 2013 squad was 6-9, but did not play Clemson. Of note, both the 2010 and 2013 teams made the ACC postseason tournament.

**Perez is the nation's Ironman:** Tech's Alex Perez is one of four seniors in DI baseball to have started every one of his team's games since stepping foot on campus. Entering games being played this weekend, Perez' 211 consecutive starts is the longest consecutive streak in the nation and the longest ever to start a Tech career. Of his starts, 144 have been at second base, 63 have been at shortstop and four have been on the mound.

**Hokies winning the close ones:** With three weekends left, Tech has almost doubled its one-run wins from a year ago, 9-6 this season opposed to 5-10 during the 2014 season. When it comes to ACC games, they were 3-10 last year and are 4-3 so far in 2015. Another trend for Tech is its success on Friday nights/Game 1s of the ACC series. The Hokies are 4-3 after going 2-8 all of last year.

**Another solid start to the ACC:** Tech has started the past three seasons with a 5-4 record in conference - the best start ever to an ACC season. Twice the Hokies started 4-5 and in those prior four seasons, weekend No. 4 was a precursor to the rest of the year as Florida State and Virginia provided the opponents those weekends. This season, it was Florida State, who took 2-of-3, but the 6-6 mark was only bettered by the 2013 Hokies who started 7-5. Below is where each stood at this point.

# #22 Patrick Mason

## Head Coach

### Second Season



On June 27, 2013, Virginia Tech announced the hiring of Patrick Mason as the baseball program's newest head coach. He became the 24th head baseball coach at the school, but just the fifth in the prior 66 years of the program. Mason took over the head coaching reins after spending the previous three seasons under former coach Pete Hughes.

Mason, who enters his 18th season in the coaching profession, was promoted to the position of associate head coach at Tech in the fall of 2012, and had served as the pitching game coordinator and recruiting coordinator in his three years prior to his promotion. The former Northeastern catcher (1994-97) spent the previous five seasons before coming to Tech as an assistant at Northeastern (2005-10).

Before his arrival in Blacksburg, Mason was the recipient of the 2010 Kevin Burr Award given to the top assistant coach in New England as selected by his peers. He also served as assistant coach at Framingham State in 2004 after four years at Boston College, when Hughes was the head coach there. For the summers of 2003-06, he was a coach with the Harwich Mariners of the Cape Cod League.

Mason has a tremendous history of developing catching prospects and in his previous 13 years of coaching before coming to Tech, he served as a mentor for 10 catchers who were selected in the MLB Draft, including Huskies Matt Morizio and Dan Milano at Northeastern. The drafting of Hokies' catcher Mark Zagunis in the third round (78th pick) of the 2014 draft only continued that trend.

Also taken in the 2014 draft was pitcher Brad Markey, which brings the total number of Tech pitchers who signed pro pitching contracts under Mason to 11, which included six off the 2013 roster - his last of three seasons as the Hokies' pitching coach.

In those three years, the Tech pitching staff registered three straight seasons with an ERA lower than the previous year and posted an ERA no higher than 4.57, which hadn't happened since an 18-season streak that ended in 1980. The last time a Tech squad posted back-to-back seasons with an ERA of 4.20 or lower was the 1976 and 1977 teams, something the 2012 and 2013 teams accomplished.

While playing at Northeastern, the Franklin, Massachusetts, native was the team's captain in 1996 and 1997, and helped NU to America East championships in 1994 and 1997. In his four years, he found his way into the record books on both sides of the ball, as his 19 career home runs rank high in Husky history and, defensively, he holds the NU record for errorless chances in a season with 242 (1997).

**Helping to Strike Out ALS:** Starting in the 2013 season, the Virginia Tech baseball team partnered with Bull & Bones Brewhaus and Grill to help raise awareness and funds for ALS research and the two will do so again during the 2015 season as well.

With every strikeout recorded by Tech's pitching staff during the past two seasons, and now this year, \$5 is donated for every regular-season strikeout, while \$10 is donated for any strikeout during the ACC tournament and \$25 for any K registered in an NCAA Regional.

During that first season, the team helped raise almost \$2,500 for ALS research, and last year they pushed the grand total to more than \$4,000.

**Keselica a two-time ACC Pitcher of the Week:** Senior **Sean Keselica** became only the third Tech pitcher to be selected as the ACC's Pitcher of the Week and the first since 2010 for his effort against Virginia on March 13 - a complete game, four-hitter with one unearned run in the 2-1 Tech win. It was the first honor since Justin Wright earned the honor back on April 5, 2010.

Wright was actually a three-time honoree (March 29, 2010 and April 27, 2009) during his career in Blacksburg, and Ryan Kennedy (Feb. 21 and May 2, 2005), got it twice - the only other pitchers to earn the honor.

Keselica has now joined the two-time honoree group when he earned the nod again after picking up a win at No. 7 Florida State on March 27. He held the Seminoles to four hits and two runs over seven innings and tied a career-high with nine strikeouts.

**Keselica's joined elite company:** Versus Clemson, Keselica had a chance to do what no starting pitcher for Tech has ever done as a member of the ACC - earn a win in each of the first three weekends of the season's slate. He held Clemson scoreless over eight frames, but the Hokies could not get a run on their own and lost the contest in extra frames.

The following weekend at No. 7 Florida State, Keselica improved to 3-0

in the ACC and joined only Mathew Price as the only Tech starting pitchers to earn three wins in the first four weekends of the ACC season. Price was 1-0 after the first two weekends and picked up wins the next two to improve to 3-0 after four starts.

**Lefty starting pitchers:** Against Georgia Tech, the Virginia Tech pitching staff did something it have never done in its previous 10 seasons in the conference - start a lefty in all three games as **Sean Keselica**, **Jon Woodcock** and **Kit Scheetz** all got the call.

In Tech's history in the ACC, only the 2008 and 2014 staffs actually saw three lefties make a start during ACC play. In 2008, Andrew Wells (4), Justin Wright (4) and Sean McDermott (3) all made starts in the ACC, but not during the same weekend.

**Consecutive lefty starts:** Last year, Tech saw Keselica (10), Woodcock (5) and Scheetz (3) make starts at least three starts each, but again, not all three during the same weekend. However, in 2014, lefties did make three consecutive starts during the season as Keselica started against Miami on Saturday, April 5, Woodcock started Sunday, April 6 and then Keselica made the Friday start on April 11 versus Maryland.

This season, Tech started six straight lefties in ACC play, as Woodcock got the start on Sunday, March 29 at Florida State before the three starts against the Yellow Jackets and then the first two at Miami (Keselica, Woodcock).

Entering this weekend, Tech has started a lefty on the mound in eight of the last nine conference games (Aaron McGarity at Miami, April 12).

**The pitcher's best friend:** Tech has turned 32 double plays this year and one triple play (**Kit Scheetz** was on the mound for that one). The box to the right breaks down each double play by the type and the pitcher on the mound when it occurred. Of the 12 pitchers who have thrown innings this season for the Hokies, only two have not seen a double play turned behind them.

**Jenco homers start the game:** Redshirt-sophomore **Saige Jenco** opened up the series at No. 7 Florida State by hitting a solo home run over the left field fence. It was just the third round tripper of his career, and all three have been solo shots. Ironically, Jenco's first home run was an inside-the-park home run hit at Liberty on April 14, which also led off that game.

With that round tripper, he became just the second Hokie to hit an inside-the-park home run since the team joined the ACC. The only other player was **Tim Smalling**, who hit his at English Field - March 5, 2010 versus Long Island.

Only six Hokies have ever hit a leadoff home run in the first, and only three have done it on the road. Below is a list of those five men. As it turns out, Jenco is the only player in Tech's ACC history to do it twice.

**Turning the triple play:** Against East Tennessee State University on March 25, **Rahiem Cooper** started what would be Tech's first triple play turned as a member of the ACC (since 2005). Cooper's snag out in right field and the result, a 9463 TP, was caught on video and was ranked as the No. 2 play on SportsCenter that night.

Tech has hit into two double plays since being a member of the ACC, once during the 2006 and the other in 2009.

**Payne a pain for pitchers:** Redshirt-senior **Erik Payne** sat out 2014 due to the NCAA transfer rule - he previously played three seasons at South Carolina and took just one day to get comfortable to the 2015 season. He went hitless in his first game of the season in four at-bats, but had reached base in 35 consecutive games before failing to do so at Miami on April 12.

That was the longest streak at the school since **Mark Zagunis** reached in 36 straight games during the 2012 season, while his 16-game hitting streak was the longest since the 2010 season when **Steve Domecus** and **Austin Wates** each hit safely in 17 straight.

Now only four Hokies have had a consecutive reached base streak of 35 games or longer (while Tech's been in ACC) and those include **Sean O'Brien** who had two 37 games streaks - one during the 2006 season and the other in 2008, and **Anthony Sosnoskie**, the longest at 41 games in 2009.

**Career year for Perez:** Senior **Alex Perez** is enjoying his most productive year as a Hokie already passing his previous season highs for runs, hits, triples, home runs, and total bases.

Perez has seven career triples tied for the second-most ever in a single season and if he keeps up his numbers, he would be on pace to produce the second-best season among any on the top five of that list. Only **Kevin Barker's** 1996 season of nine doubles, nine triples and 20 home runs for 160 total bases and a .792 slugging percentage would be better.

He also passed Payne's team-best 16 game hitting streak - going a career-long 19 straight games, the longest at the school since **Domecus** had a 24-game hit streak in 2009.

### WHAT'S A HOKIE

That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body. Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today.

Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Following is the "Old Hokie" yell in its original form:

Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy!  
 Tech! Tech! V.P.I.!  
 Sola-Rex Sola-Rah  
 Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!!  
 Rae, Ri, V.P.I.

### JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.

Facing ranked teams: In the column to the left is Tech's baseball record versus ranked opponents as a member of the ACC, which includes a 1-10 mark in 2014.

Facing a ranked Florida State team: In its history in the ACC, Tech has faced Florida State 10 times (in 11 years, every year except 2014) in a series and the Seminoles have been ranked every season.

Facing No. 1: In their ACC history, Tech is now 6-20 against No. 1 teams in the country. Of the 26 games, 17 of those have been played in Blacksburg.

The other wins over No. 1 programs occurred April 18, 2010, at Virginia, 8-5; May 10, 2008, versus Miami, 7-6 in a DH; and March 18, 2006, versus Florida State, 9-7.

Tech sweeps No. 1 Virginia: For the first time as a member of the ACC, the Hokies swept a series against a nationally-ranked team when they took all three games against the top-ranked Cavaliers in ACC weekend No. 2 in Blacksburg.

The sweep also gave the Hokies their seventh sweep of an ACC opponent, ironically, one a year for the past seven years and includes sweeping Pittsburgh in last year's home opening ACC weekend.

Tech in its ACC home-opening weekend: For the first time in its 10 seasons in the conference, Tech finally won its first ever ACC home opener with its 11-5 win over Pittsburgh last year.

Last year, the Hokies then swept Pittsburgh, marking their first ever ACC home-opening sweep and just their second ever home series win in their ACC home opening weekend - Tech swept UVa in this year's ACC home opening weekend as well.

English Field - Home of the Hokies

English Field was officially dedicated during a special ceremony on April 8, 1989 and is named for the late E.R. 'Red' English and his wife, Ruth, who provided financial support for construction of the field.

English, a native of Altavista, Va., played as an offensive and defensive guard on the Tech football teams from 1930-33 and graduated from Tech in 1934. English contributed to Tech athletics for more than 50 years and was one of the founders of The Student Aid Association in 1949.

Through a generous gift from alumnus George Sampson, the home team dugout was named for long-time Tech baseball coach G.F. 'Red' Laird during a ceremony on April 12, 1991. Laird recruited and coached Sampson at Tech.

The Tech athletics department continues to make upgrades to the facility, with its newest completed in the spring of 2012. The natural grass surface was replaced with artificial turf. The \$1 million field enables the Hokies to practice even during inclement weather, as grounds keepers can remove snow off of it quickly.

Plus, it also drains quickly, allowing for a speedy resumption of play following any rain delays. Also, as part of this project, the dugouts were expanded to almost twice the size, and a new batter's eye and a new padded outfield fence were added.

The Hokies opened play at their new home with a 7-2 victory against George Mason on March 22, 1989, and went on to post a 17-7 home record during their first season in the facility. Prior to the 2004 season, a new lighting system was installed and the Hokies played their first baseball game under the lights in Blacksburg on April 28 of that year, defeating VMI, 8-0.

The team's year-by-year overall mark in its 27 seasons at English Field can be seen in the graph on the right. Before English Field, Tech played its home baseball games at Tech Park, where it compiled a 431-122-1 (.779 winning percentage) record over 34 seasons. All-time, Tech is 1,217-530-12 (.695) in games played in Blacksburg.

**Tech in ACC opening games:** The Hokies won their ACC season-opening game this year, with a 12-7 decision at Wake Forest (March 7), in the first of two games that day, to improve to 4-7 in ACC openers (they also won openers in 2007, 2009, and 2012). The 12 runs marked the third time the Hokies scored at least 10 runs in an ACC season opener and they won all three (10-8 at UVa, 2012 & 19-4 at Duke, 2009).

Playing in the DH on that Saturday, Tech had a chance to open 2-0 for the first time ever and win its first ever DH on the road in ACC play, but the Demon Deacons pulled out the win. Tech is now 2-6-8 overall in ACC doubleheader days, 2-3-3 at home.

**Tech in ACC opening weekends:** In its 11 seasons in the conference, Tech is now 2-9 in opening series weekends in the league (only winning in 2007 and 2010) after the team dropped a 2-1 series at Wake Forest to open the 2015 ACC slate. The series at Wake also marked the ninth time the Hokies opened league play on the road, but it was only the fifth time they did not face a ranked opponent in their opening weekend. All-time, after the opening weekend, Tech is a combined 9-24.

**Happy "Opening" Day:** For the first time in program history (since 1892), Tech opened a season before Valentine's Day. And for just the third time the Hokies played a baseball game on Valentine's Day (the earliest start prior to this season). In the 2014 and 2003 seasons, Tech opened its season on Feb. 14 and were 1-1.

Adding to that, the Hokies played their first three games opening weekend, marking the most games played before Feb. 16 in their program history with three. The most prior to that was two in 2003 and 1892. According to the history books, Tech played two games back in 1892 (the earliest start ever in its history) against Newport on Feb. 1 and Feb. 2 and its only two games that season, the program's first year of competition.

**Experience a key for 2015:** Looking back at the 2014 roster, it featured just two seniors (pitchers Brad Markey and Tanner McIntyre) and 17 newcomers. A young squad a year ago, meant that most of the team would be back for 2015. And even though the Hokies lost a key member of the offense, when catcher Mark Zagunis left early after being drafted in the third round, the numbers the Hokies had coming back for 2015 were staggering.

In the field, 424 starts from last year (out of a possible 477) returned as did 88 percent of the at-bats - this from a team that led the ACC in batting, overall and conference-only. Looking at the pitching staff, 40 of the starts on the mound returned (out of 53) and 73 percent of the innings pitched were also back.
