HOKIES WRAP UP REGULAR SEASON AT PITTSBURGH

The weekend series: A return trip to Durham, N.C. for the 2015 ACC Baseball Championship is well within the Hokies' grasp as they head into the final weekend of the regular season. Tech's "magic" number for the tournament is "2" against Wake Forest, while a number of different scenarios could see the Hokies, who are currently ninth in the ACC standings, climb into the top 6 and earn an automatic spot into the pool play.

Hayden with another walk-off: Against Boston College on May 3, **Brendon Hayden** smacked a two-run home run to give the Hokies a 2-1 walk-off win over the Eagles. It was Hayden's third walk-off RBI of his career, the second walk-off home run of his career and the second walk-off RBI of this season. He also plated the game-winner in the March 13 Virginia win with a bases-loaded walk.

Naughton flirts with perfection: Although he didn't get a decision after tossing more than eight innings against BC on May 3, **Packy Naughton** did retire 22 straight batters over two games and tossed 12.1 consecutive scoreless innings. In his two ACC starts, Naughton has thrown 14.2 innings total, allowed eight hits, one earned run (0.61 ERA) and batters are hitting just .174 against him.

Payne ties 50-year old school record: Versus Appalachian State, **Erik Payne** stepped to the plate five times and after each, trotted down to first base after drawing a walk. The five base on balls tied the school record for most walks in a single game first set by Wayne Taylor on March 24, 1964 versus Michigan State. The NCAA record is seven (Teddy Craig, UALR, May 2, 1992), while 12 other men have drawn six in a single game. The five walks tied the ACC record as well.

Perez is the nation's Ironman: Tech's **Alex Perez** is one of four seniors in DI baseball to have started every one of his team's games since stepping foot on campus and has the longest consecutive streak among those four. Entering games being played this weekend, Perez' 220 consecutive starts is the second longest consecutive streak in the nation behind South Florida's Kyle Teaf, who has started 222 straight games, but not every game he's played. Of Perez starts (longest ever at Tech), 144 have been at second base, 72 have been at shortstop and four have been on the mound.

#22 Patrick Mason

Head Coach

Second Season



On June 27, 2013, Virginia Tech announced the hiring of Patrick Mason as the baseball program's newest head coach. He became the 24th head baseball coach at the school, but just the fifth in the prior 66 years of the program. Mason took over the head coaching reins after spending the previous three seasons under former coach Pete Hughes.

Mason, who enters his 18th season in the coaching profession, was promoted to the position of associate head coach at Tech in the fall of 2012, and had served as the pitching game coordinator and recruiting coordinator in his three years prior to his promotion. The former Northeastern catcher (1994-97) spent the previous five seasons before coming to Tech as an assistant at Northeastern (2005-10).

Before his arrival in Blacksburg, Mason was the recipient of the 2010 Kevin Burr Award given to the top assistant coach in New England as selected by his peers. He also served as assistant coach at Framingham State in 2004 after four years at Boston College, when Hughes was the head coach there. For the summers of 2003-06, he was a coach with the Harwich Mariners of the Cape Cod League.

Mason has a tremendous history of developing catching prospects and in his previous 13 years of coaching before coming to Tech, he served as a mentor for 10 catchers who were selected in the MLB Draft, including Huskies Matt Morizio and Dan Milano at Northeastern. The drafting of Hokies' catcher Mark Zagunis in the third round (78th pick) of the 2014 draft only continued that trend.

Also taken in the 2014 draft was pitcher Brad Markey, which brings the total number of Tech pitchers who signed pro pitching contracts under Mason to 11, which included six off the 2013 roster - his last of three seasons as the Hokies' pitching coach.

In those three years, the Tech pitching staff registered three straight seasons with an ERA lower than the previous year and posted an ERA no higher than 4.57, which hadn't happened since an 18-season streak that ended in 1980. The last time a Tech squad posted back-to-back seasons with an ERA of 4.20 or lower was the 1976 and 1977 teams, something the 2012 and 2013 teams accomplished.

While playing at Northeastern, the Franklin, Massachusetts, native was the team's captain in 1996 and 1997, and helped NU to America East championships in 1994 and 1997. In his four years, he found his way into the record books on both sides of the ball, as his 19 career home runs rank high in Husky history and, defensively, he holds the NU record for errorless chances in a season with 242 (1997).

Helping to Strike Out ALS: Starting in the 2013 season, the Virginia Tech baseball team partnered with Bull & Bones Brewhaus and Grill to help raise awareness and funds for ALS research and the two will do so again during the 2015 season as well.

With every strikeout recorded by Tech's pitching staff during the past two seasons, and now this year, \$5 is donated for every regular-season strikeout, while \$10 is donated for any strikeout during the ACC tournament and \$25 for any K registered in an NCAA Regional.

During that first season, the team helped raise almost \$2,500 for ALS research, and last year they pushed the grand total to more than \$4,000.

Keselica a two-time ACC Pitcher of the Week: Senior **Sean Keselica** became only the third Tech pitcher to be selected as the ACC's Pitcher of the Week and the first since 2010 for his effort against Virginia on March 13 - a complete game, four-hitter with one unearned run in the 2-1 Tech win. It was the first honor since Justin Wright earned the honor back on April 5, 2010.

Wright was actually a three-time honoree (March 29, 2010 and April 27, 2009) during his career in Blacksburg, and Ryan Kennedy (Feb. 21 and May 2, 2005), got it twice - the only other pitchers to earn the honor.

Keselica has now joined the two-time honoree group when he earned the nod again after picking up a win at No. 7 Florida State on March 27. He held the Seminoles to four hits and two runs over seven innings and tied a career-high with nine strikeouts.

Keselica's joined elite company: Versus Clemson, Keselica had a chance to do what no starting pitcher for Tech has ever done as a member of the ACC - earn a win in each of the first three weekends of the season's slate. He held Clemson scoreless over eight frames, but the Hokies could not get a run on their own and lost the contest in extra frames.

The following weekend at No. 7 Florida State, Keselica improved to 3-0

in the ACC and joined only Mathew Price as the only Tech starting pitchers to earn three wins in the first four weekends of the ACC season. Price was 1-0 after the first two weekends and picked up wins the next two to improve to 3-0 after four starts.

Lefty starting pitchers: Against Georgia Tech, the Virginia Tech pitching staff did something it have never done in its previous 10 seasons in the conference - start a lefty in all three games as **Sean Keselica**, **Jon Woodcock** and **Kit Scheetz** all got the call.

In Tech's history in the ACC, only the 2008 and 2014 staffs actually saw three lefties make a start during ACC play. In 2008, Andrew Wells (4), Justin Wright (4) and Sean McDermott (3) all made starts in the ACC, but not during the same weekend. see next note.

Consecutive lefty starts: Last year, Tech saw Keselica (10), Woodcock (5) and Scheetz (3) start ACC games, but again, not during the same weekend. However, in 2014, lefties did make three consecutive ACC starts during the year as Keselica started against Miami on April 5, Woodcock started April 6 and then Keselica made the Friday start on April 11 versus Maryland.

This season, Tech had started six straight lefties in ACC play once, as Woodcock got the start on March 29 at Florida State before the three starts against the Yellow Jackets and the first two at Miami (Keselica, Woodcock).

Entering this weekend against Pittsburgh, Tech has started a lefty on the mound in 14 of its last 15 conference games (Aaron McGarity, RHP, at Miami, April 12) and eight straight, and are scheduled to start a lefty in each game this series.

The pitcher's best friend: Tech has turned 37 double plays this year and one triple play (**Kit Scheetz** was on the mound for that one).

The box to the right breaks down each double play by the type and the pitcher on the mound when it occurred.

Of the 12 pitchers who have thrown innings this season for the Hokies, only one has not seen a double play turned behind them.

Interestingly, though, the Hokies had not turned a double play since April 10 at Miami - a span of 11 games before the BC weekend.

Jenco homers start the game: Redshirt-sophomore **Saige Jenco** opened up the series at No. 7 Florida State by hitting a solo home run over the left field fence. It was the third of four career HRs he has and they've all been solo shots. Ironically, Jenco's first home run was an inside-the-park home run hit at Liberty on April 14, which also led off that game.

With that round tripper, he became just the second Hokie to hit an inside-the-park home run since the team joined the ACC. The only other player was **Tim Smalling**, who hit his at English Field - March 5, 2010 versus Long Island.

Only six Hokies have ever hit a leadoff home run in the first, and only three have done it on the road. Below is a list of those five men. As it turns out, Jenco is the only player in Tech's ACC history to do it twice.

Turning the triple play: Against East Tennessee State University on March 25, **Rahiem Cooper** started what would be Tech's first triple play turned as a member of the ACC (since 2005). Cooper's snag out in right field and the result, a 9463 TP, was caught on video and was ranked as the No. 2 play on SportsCenter that night.

Tech has hit into two double plays since being a member of the ACC, once during the 2006 and the other in 2009.

Payne a pain for pitchers: Redshirt-senior **Erik Payne** sat out 2014 due to the NCAA transfer rule - he previously played three seasons at South Carolina and took just one day to get comfortable to the 2015 season. He went hitless in his first game of the season in four at-bats, but had reached base in 35 consecutive games before failing to do so at Miami on April 12.

That was the longest streak at the school since **Mark Zagunis** reached in 36 straight games during the 2012 season, while his 16-game hitting streak was the longest since the 2010 season when **Steve Domecus** and **Austin Wates** each hit safely in 17 straight. Payne has reached base in all but three games this season.

Now only four Hokies have had a consecutive reached base streak of 35 games or longer (while Tech's been in ACC) and those include **Sean O'Brien** who had two 37 games streaks - one during the 2006 season and the other in 2008, and **Anthony Sosnoskie**, the longest at 41 games in 2009.

Career year for Perez: Senior **Alex Perez** is enjoying his most productive year as a Hokie already passing his previous season highs for runs, hits, triples, home runs, and total bases.

Perez has seven career triples tied for the second-most ever in a single season and if he keeps up his numbers, he would be on pace to produce the second-best season among any on the top five of that list. Only **Kevin Barker's** 1996 season of nine doubles, nine triples and 20 home runs for 160 total bases and a .792 slugging percentage would be better.

He also passed Payne's team-best 16 game hitting streak - going a career-long 18 straight games, the longest at the school since **Domecus** had a 24-game hit streak in 2009.

WHAT'S A HOKIE

That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body. Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today.

Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Following is the "Old Hokie" yell in its original form:

Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy!
Tech! Tech! V.P.I.!
Sola-Rex Sola-Rah
Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!!
Rae, Ri, V.P.I.

JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.

Facing ranked teams: In the column to the left is Tech's baseball record versus ranked opponents as a member of the ACC, which includes a 1-10 mark in 2014. The Hokies improved that record this season by four games, posting a 5-6 mark. There are no teams left on the Tech regular-season schedule who are ranked.

Tech sweeps No. 1 Virginia: For the first time as a member of the ACC, the Hokies swept a series against a nationally-ranked team when they took all three games against the top-ranked Cavaliers in ACC weekend No. 2 in Blacksburg. Entering the weekend, Tech had won just nine series against ranked teams, as a member of the ACC, with seven of those coming at home.

The sweep also gave the Hokies their seventh sweep of an ACC opponent, ironically, one a year for the past seven years and includes sweeping Pittsburgh in last year's home opening ACC weekend. The others are at Maryland (2009, 2011) and at Duke (2013) and home sweeps against Boston College (2010, 2012).

Facing No. 1: In their ACC history, Tech is now 6-20 against No. 1 teams in the country. Of the 26 games, 17 of those have been played in Blacksburg. Tech held a 2-12 home record in those games before its weekend sweep of Virginia in the second ACC weekend.

The other wins over No. 1 programs occurred April 18, 2010, at Virginia, 8-5; May 10, 2008, versus Miami, 7-6 in a DH; and March 18, 2006, versus Florida State, 9-7.

Facing a ranked Florida State team: In its history in the ACC, Tech has faced Florida State in a series 10 times (in 11 years, every year except 2014) and the Seminoles have been ranked every season. The Hokies have won just two of those series and are 8-23 overall, but includes getting one win against Florida State in Tallahassee this season.

Tech in its ACC home-opening weekend: For the first time in its 10 seasons in the conference, Tech finally won its first ACC home opener with its 11-5 win over Pittsburgh last year. The Hokies had been winless in their previous nine tries. They made it two in a row in ACC home openers after beating Virginia, 2-1, on March 15.

Last year, the Hokies then swept Pittsburgh, marking their first ever ACC home-opening sweep and just their second ever home series win in their ACC home opening weekend. Tech repeated the feat, sweeping UVa in this year's ACC home opening weekend. Before those sweeps, Tech held just a 5-19 record after its first home ACC weekend, winning just one series - against Maryland in 2010. After the sweeps to open 2014 and 2015, Tech is now 11-19.

English Field - Home of the Hokies

English Field was officially dedicated during a special ceremony on April 8, 1989 and is named for the late E.R. 'Red' English and his wife, Ruth, who provided financial support for construction of the field.

English, a native of Altavista, Va., played as an offensive and defensive guard on the Tech football teams from 1930-33 and graduated from Tech in 1934. English contributed to Tech athletics for more than 50 years and was one of the founders of The Student Aid Association in 1949. He served as president of that organization two of its first three years. English received the most outstanding alumni award at Tech in 1984.

Through a generous gift from alumnus George Sampson, the home team dugout was named for long-time Tech baseball coach G.F. 'Red' Laird during a ceremony on April 12, 1991. Laird recruited and coached Sampson at Tech.

The Tech athletics department continues to make upgrades to the facility, with its newest completed in the spring of 2012. The natural grass surface was replaced with artificial turf. The \$1 million field enables the Hokies to practice even during inclement weather, as grounds keepers can remove snow off of it quickly.

Plus, it also drains quickly, allowing for a speedy resumption of play following any rain delays. Also, as part of this project, the dugouts were expanded to almost twice the size, and a new batter's eye and a new padded outfield fence were added.

The Hokies opened play at their new home with a 7-2 victory against George Mason on March 22, 1989, and went on to post a 17-7 home record during their first season in the facility. Prior to the 2004 season, a new lighting system was installed and the Hokies played their first baseball game under the lights in Blacksburg on April 28 of that year, defeating VMI, 8-0.

The team's year-by-year overall mark in its 27 seasons at English Field can be seen in the graph on the right. Before English Field, Tech played its home baseball games at Tech Park, where it compiled a 431-122-1 (.779 winning percentage) record over 34 seasons. All-time, Tech is 1,223-530-12 (.696) in games played in Blacksburg.

Tech in ACC opening games: The Hokies won their ACC season-opening game this year, a 12-7 decision at Wake Forest (March 7), in the first of two games that day, to improve to 4-7 in ACC openers (they also won openers in 2007, 2009, and 2012). The 12 runs marked the third time the Hokies scored at least 10 runs in an ACC season opener and they won all three (10-8 at UVa, 2012 & 19-4 at Duke, 2009).

Playing in the DH on that Saturday, Tech had a chance to open 2-0 for the first time ever and win its first ever DH on the road in ACC play, but the Demon Deacons pulled out the win. Tech is now 2-6-8 overall in ACC doubleheader days, 2-3-3 at home.

Tech in ACC opening weekends: In its 11 seasons in the conference, Tech is now 2-9 in opening series weekends in the league (only winning in 2007 and 2010) after the team dropped a 2-1 series at Wake Forest to open the 2015 ACC slate. The series at Wake also marked the ninth time the Hokies opened league play on the road, but it was only the fifth time they did not face a ranked opponent in their opening weekend. All-time, after the opening weekend, Tech is a combined 9-24.

Happy "Opening" Day: For the first time in program history (since 1892), Tech opened a season before Valentine's Day. And for just the third time the Hokies played a baseball game on Valentine's Day (the earliest start prior to this season). In the 2014 and 2003 seasons, Tech opened its season on Feb. 14 and were 1-1.

Adding to that, the Hokies played their first three games opening weekend, marking the most games played before Feb. 16 in their program history with three. The most prior to that was two in 2003 and 1892. According to the history books, Tech played two games back in 1892 (the earliest start ever in its history) against Newports on Feb. 1 and Feb. 2 and its only two games that season, the program's first year of competition.

Experience a key for 2015: Looking back at the 2014 roster, it featured just two seniors (pitchers Brad Markey and Tanner McIntyre) and 17 newcomers. A young squad a year ago, meant that most of the team would be back for 2015. And even though the Hokies lost a key member of the offense, when catcher Mark Zagunis left early after being drafted in the third round by the Cubs, the numbers the Hokies had coming back for 2015 were staggering.

In the field, 424 starts from last year (out of a possible 477) returned as did 88 percent of the at-bats - this from a team that led the ACC in batting, overall and conference-only. Looking at the pitching staff, 40 of the starts on the mound returned (out of 53) and 73 percent of the innings pitched were also back.
