#### TECH OPENS ACC CHAMPIONSHIP WITH NORTH CAROLINA

**Today's Game:** The Hokies face the North Carolina Tar Heels in the second game of the play-in portion of the ACC Baseball Championship. The winner of the 3 p.m. contest will move on into pool play and face Louisville, Florida State and Clemson over the next three days.

Same place, same team, different year: The last time the Virginia Tech baseball team played a game in Durham Bulls Athletic Park, the Hokies were facing the Tar Heels in the 2013 ACC Baseball Championship Game. Tech swept through Pool B - beating Virginia (10-1), Florida State (3-2) and Georgia Tech (3-2), before falling to North Carolina, 4-1 in that year's title game.

**History in the ACC Championship:** This will be the Hokies' fourth time in the ACC postseason tournament, as they previously made it after the 2005, 2010 and 2013 regular seasons. Tech's combined record in the tournament is 5-3 and the team has only lost its first game in its first appearance back in 2005, when they lost to Maryland, 5-4, in the opener.

**Regular season an indicator?:** Since the Hokies are making just their fourth trip to the ACC Championship, there isn't too much history to see any trends showing up. However, below is all four year's regular season results and the prior three postseason's results.

Some old veterans: This will be the second ACC Championship appearance for five members of the Hokies' roster. Seniors Sean Keselica (.308, 4 hits, 1 double, 2 runs, 1 RBI, 3 BBs), Alex Perez (.308, 4 hits, 1 double, 1 run, 1 RBI, 3 BBs), Kyle Wernicki (.250, 3 hits, 2 runs) and Brendon Hayden (.200, 3 hits, 2 doubles, 2 runs, 1 RBI) all started four games in the 2013 tournament. Junior Matt Dauby appeared in two games off the bench and got just one at bat. No one of the current roster saw action on the mound, as Tech used just six pitchers during that week.

Two Hokies earn All-ACC honors: Announced Monday by the ACC and selected by the league's 14 head coaches, two Virginia Tech Hokies were named to the All-ACC team.

**Brendon Hayden** became just the fifth Hokie to be named ACC First Team as he got the nod at first base. The senior from Twin Lakes, Wisconsin, had his best season of his four-year career at Tech as he posted a .314 batting average and slugged a career-high .556.

His 65 hits, 17 doubles, 11 home runs, 40 runs scored, 51 RBIs and 115 total bases were all also career bests. Hayden collected five game-winning RBIs this season, which included two walk-off wins – over Virginia and Boston College.

**Saige Jenco** earned a spot on the ACC Third Team as an outfielder. The redshirt-sophomore from State College, Pennsylvania recorded a second straight season of batting .323 while increasing his power numbers. His 65 hits included 12 doubles, three triples and three home runs for 92 total bases – all better than his first season at Tech.

**Hayden with another walk-off:** Against Boston College on May 3, **Brendon Hayden** smacked a two-run home run to give the Hokies a 2-1 walk-off win over the Eagles. It was Hayden's third walk-off RBI of his career, the second walk-off home run of his career and the second walk-off RBI of this season. He also plated the game-winner in the March 13 Virginia win with a bases-loaded walk.

Payne ties 50-year old school record: Versus Appalachian State, Erik Payne stepped to the plate five times and after each, trotted down to first base after drawing a walk. The five base on balls tied the school record for most walks in a single game first set by Wayne Taylor on March 24, 1964 versus Michigan State. The NCAA record is seven (Teddy Craig, UALR, May 2, 1992), while 12 other men have drawn six in a single game. The five walks tied the ACC record as well.

**Jenco leads off on the road:** In 20 games this season on the road (or neutral site where Tech was the visiting team), **Saige Jenco** has reached base to start the game 11 times. He is 9-for-18 with seven singles, a double and a home run, and has also walked two times. However, against Pittsburgh on May 16, he drew a walk to start the game and crossed the plate for only the third time in the first inning of those 20 contests.

In fact, it actually marked the first time Tech scored a run in the first inning of an ACC contest without the aid of a home run. Tech had only scored five times in its 15 road league games this season and the other four were courtesy of a home run (Brendon Hayden had two and Alex Perez the other). Tech was 2-3 in those games, 2-8 when not scoring in the first frame.

**Perez is the nation's Ironman:** Tech's **Alex Perez** is one of four seniors in DI baseball to have started every one of his team's games since stepping foot on campus and has the longest consecutive streak among those four. Entering games being played this weekend, Perez' 223 consecutive starts is the second longest consecutive streak in the nation behind South Florida's Kyle Teaf, who has started 224 straight games, but not every game he's played. Of Perez starts (longest ever at Tech), 144 have been at second base, 75 have been at shortstop and four have been on the mound.

More on Perez' streuk: With a start today, he will tie former Tech player Spencer Harris (2000-03) for the most consecutive starts in program history (224). Harris started 228 games in his Tech career, but just four of his first six games as a freshman. He then did not miss a start after that and played in a school record tying 230 games (John West, 1999-02).

Also with a start today, Perez will continue to match former Tech softball player Charisse Mariconda as the only two Virginia Tech student-athletes to start in every one of their team's game since their freshman season (with more than 200 games). Mariconda started in 249 games for the softball team.

**Start solid to reach ACCs:** In its history in the ACC, Tech has started a season 5-4 just three times and 4-5 twice. Weekend No. 4 has seemed to determine the team's fate the rest of the way. Below is how those teams fared during that weekend and then beyond. The 2010, 2013 and 2015 teams are the three best seasons when it comes to ACC win totals and winning percentage.
