PREVIEWING THE MEET...

• The Virginia Tech cross country team hosts the Hokie Open Race on Friday afternoon in its final tune-up prior to the NCAA Southeast Regional on Nov. 12. This is the third and final home meet of the season for Tech. The men are on the course first, running a 6k at 4:30 p.m. The women follow with a three mile race at 5:15 p.m. Both races will take place at the Tech Cross Country Course on campus in Blacksburg. Georgia Southern's women will also be competing.

LAST TIME OUT...

• The Virginia Tech men's and women's cross country teams last raced on Saturday at the ACC Championships. The men had their second-highest team finish since joining the ACC in 2004 as they placed tied for fourth with Duke with 116 points. The women had 180 points and placed eighth. Will Mulherin and Michael Hammond each were in the top-10 overall and earned All-ACC (top-14) honors. Mulherin was seventh and Hammond was 10th individually in the men's 8k. Taylor Crosson was the women's top finisher in 26th for the women's 6k.

MORE ON MULHERIN...

• Will Mulherin finished seventh overall out of 110 total runners in a time of 23:19.3 for the eight kilometer course at Saturday's ACC Championship. He joins Devin Cornwall as the only Hokie men to become two-time All-ACC runners in cross country. Mulherin also finished seventh as a sophomore in 2009. For his efforts, Mulherin was named the Virginia Tech Athletics Hardee's Star of the Week.

CHAMPIONSHIP COURSES...

- This season, Virginia Tech had the opportunity to preview two championship courses in tune-ups before the big races.
- On Sept. 16, the Hokies traveled to Clemson, S.C. and Musser Farms, site of this year's ACC Championships last Saturday, for the Clemson Invitational.
- On Oct. 16, Tech got a look at the NCAA National Meet course when they visited Terre Haute, Ind. for the Indiana State Pre-National Invite. The NCAA Championship Meet is Nov. 21.

REGIONAL RANKINGS...

• In the latest United States Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association's (USTFCCCA) NCAA Regional Cross Country rankings, the Hokie men are each ranked fifth, while the women are tabbed eighth in the Southeast Region.

STELLAR SOPHOMORES...

• Last season, Head Coach Ben Thomas' women's regional line-up of seven consisted of five freshmen. This year, Taylor Crosson, Courtney Dobbs, Paige Kvartunas, Madalyn Nuckols and Alex Watt are back with a year of college racing experience. Thomas also returns senior Sammy Dow from last year's fifth place regional team, giving him all of his top six runners back.

HEAD CROSS COUNTRY/DISTANCE COACH BEN THOMAS

Ben Thomas has been Virginia Tech's head cross country coach and distance coach since 2001 and now has 16 years of collegiate coaching experience. During 10 seasons coaching at Tech, the Hokies have emerged as contenders in not only the Atlantic Coast Conference and the NCAA Southeast Region, but the entire nation. Thomas is extremely familiar with the Hokie program, having competed in cross country and middle distance for Tech from 1987 to 1992.



On the track, Thomas has coached a distance crew that has broken school track records in the outdoor 800m, 1,500m, 3,000m steeplechase, indoor 1,000m, mile, 3000m and 5,000m as well as the outdoor 4x800m, the 4x1,500m and the distance medley relays. Last season alone, Thomas' distance unit broke six Tech records. Michael Hammond won his second straight ACC title and earned All-American honors in the indoor mile and also garnered All-America accolades in the outdoor 1,500-meter run. Hammond then went on to finish 13th in the 1,500-meter at the USA Outdoor Track & Field Championships in Eugene, Ore. Sammy Dow and Jason Cusack each broke school-records in the 3,000-meter steeplechase. In 2010, Will Mulherin earned All-America honors at the NCAA Outdoor Championships and set the school record in the 5,000-meter event at 13:50.76.

In cross country, Paige Kvartunas capped her 2010 season by earning NCAA All-Region honors for the first time in her career leading the women to a fifth place team finish. Kvartunas became the first Tech woman to earn All-Region honors since 2008 and the Hokie's fifth place at Regionals was their highest since 2007. In addition, the 2010 women's team earned USTFCCCA All-Academic accolades with a 3.19 team grade point average. Devin Cornwall achieved all-region status for the first time in his cross country career in 2009. In 2008, Tasmin Fanning placed ninth at the U.S. Olympic Trials in the 5000-meter event, setting a new school record of 15:37.73. Thomas also guided Fanning to two All-America performances at the NCAA Cross Country Championships. She placed third in 2008, the highest finish ever by a Virginia Tech athlete, and 12th out of 255 runners in 2007. Thomas led the women's squad to the best season in program history in 2006 by posting an 18th-place finish in their first-ever appearance at the NCAA Championships. The Hokie women reached the national meet following a third-place effort at the NCAA Southeast Regional behind an unprecedented five all-region performers. The men captured their best-ever point total at the ACC Outdoor Championships and had their best performance in the NCAA Southeast Regional since 1995. Paul LaPenna became the first Hokie to earn all-region honors since 2003, while Cornwall was named the ACC Freshman of the Year.

Thomas served as the men's and women's distance coach at the University of Georgia for six months before arriving in Blacksburg, and prior to that he was the head track and field and cross country coach at Brevard College. At Brevard, Thomas was named 1999 NAIA Region XII Coach of the Year after leading the men's cross country team to the NAIA Region XII title. Before Brevard, Thomas was the women's cross country coach and assistant track coach at Appalachian State University from 1995-1999.

A native of Lynchburg, Va., Thomas earned a B.A. in English from Virginia Tech in 1992 before completing coursework for an M.A. in education from Lynchburg College in 1999. Thomas began his coaching career with the track & field team at E.C. Glass High School (1992-94) in Lynchburg and coaching cross country at Blacksburg High School (1994-95).

Thomas, his wife, Ann McGranahan, and their daughter, Reily Kathleen Thomas, reside in Blacksburg.

DIRECTOR OF TRACK & FIELD and CROSS COUNTRY DAVE CIANELLI

Entering his 11th year as Director of Virginia Tech Track & Field and Cross Country, Dave Cianelli has built the Hokie program into one of the elite programs in the Atlantic Coast Conference and the nation. Since Cianelli's arrival in the fall of 2001, Virginia Tech athletes have produced 10 NCAA individual titles, 100 NCAA All-America performances and 89 conference titles. In addition, Hokie teams have finished in the national top-10 five times and the national top-20 17 times since 2005.

weight throw. In all, 14 different Hokies earned a total of 20 All-American performances.

NCAA, REGIONAL AND ACC SUCCESS

The 2011 Hokies continued to demonstrate why they are one of the nation's elite track & field programs. The men's team fifth-place finish at the NCAA Outdoor Championships was the highest in program history and matched the finish of the 2010 women's outdoor squad. The men also placed 15th at the NCAA Indoor Championships, won their first-ever ACC Indoor crown and placed second in the conference outdoors. The women finished 20th at the NCAA Outdoor Championships and were third at the indoor conference championship. Alexander Ziegler and Dorotea Habazin each won national titles in the hammer throw and Marcel Lomnicky (hammer) and Matthias Treff (javelin) both earned national runner-up finishes. Ziegler also placed second nationally in the indoor

USA AND INTERNATIONAL SUCCESS

In the summer of 2011, the Hokies were well represented at the United States Senior and Junior Outdoor Track & Field National Championships. Michael Hammond qualified for the final of the senior 1,500-meter run and finished 13th, while teammates Taylor Crosson and Courtney Dobbs finished second and third, respectively in the 5,000-meters at the USA Junior Outdoor Track & Field Championships. In 2010, Jared Berman placed second in the 3,000-meter steeplechase at the USA Junior Championships and advanced to the IAAF World Junior Championships and where he made the final, placing ninth.

In 2008, Queen Harrison made history when she earned a spot on the U.S. Olympic team, by finishing second in the 400-meter hurdles at the U.S. Olympic Trials to qualify in the event. Harrison was the first Tech track and field athlete to represent any country in the Olympics and only the second Hokie to become an American Olympian in any sport, following Bimbo Coles who represented the United States in basketball in 1988.

COACH OF THE YEAR HONORS

Cianelli's illustrious career is proven by the awards he has collected throughout his career. This past season, he was awarded both the Men's Indoor and Outdoor Southeast Region Coach of the Year award by the USTFCCCA. Cianelli was also named the Men's ACC Indoor Coach of the Year for leading the Hokies to their first-ever ACC Indoor title.

Last year, he was named the 2010 ACC Men's Outdoor Coach of the Year. In 2008, he won the ACC Women's Indoor, ACC Women's Outdoor and East Region Women's Coach of the Year honors for the second straight year. Cianelli also won his second consecutive USTFCCCA Women's Indoor Southeast Region Coach of the Year honor in 2008.

Cianelli has assembled one of the most accomplished coaching staffs in America. Associate head men's and women's track & field coach Greg Jack was named the USTFCCCA's Men's Outdoor Regional Coach of the Year for the second year in a row in 2011. Jack was also named Men's Indoor Regional Coach of the Year in 2010 and National Throws Coach of the Year in 2006. Former Hokie and NAIA Region XII Coach of the Year Ben Thomas is the cross country coach and distance coach and has produced 10 All-Americans in cross country and track during his tenure at Tech. Thomas is assisted by former All-SEC runner Jen McGranahan. Long-time assistant Bob Phillips, a former All-American for the Hokies, coaches the pole vaulters. Phillips earned recognition in 2011 as the USTFCCCA's Men's Indoor Regional Assistant Coach of the Year. Tech introduced Charles Foster as the sprints, hurdles and jumps coach in the fall of 2009. Foster quickly made a reputation for himself, earning USTFCCCA Regional Coach of the Year honors for the women's sprints and hurdles. Foster is a former world record holder in the 110-meter hurdles and a U.S. Olympian in 1976. Under Foster's coaching, Queen Harrison won three NCAA national titles in the hurdles in 2010 and was selected by Track and Field News as the collegiate athlete of the year and received the 2010 Bowerman Award as the most outstanding female collegiate track and field athlete. Foster was honored in 2008 by the USTFCCCA as Men's National Coach of the Year for sprints and hurdles.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

The Virginia Tech track & field and cross country programs continue to achieve at a high level in the classroom. Kelly Phillips became a two-time Capital One Academic All-American in 2011 with her selection to the first team. She also won the NCAA Elite 88 Award, which recognizes the true essence of the student-athlete by honoring the individual who has reached the pinnacle of competition at the national championship level in his or her sport, while also achieving the highest academic standard among his or her peers. For the 2011 track season, 16 total individuals were named to the All-ACC Academic team. In addition, the women's cross country team earned USTFCCCA All-Academic accolades for the seventh season in a row. In 2010, both Matej Muza and Kristi Castlin were honored as the ACC scholar-athletes of the year for track and field.

PREVIOUS COACHING EXPERIENCE

Prior to Tech, Cianelli gained plenty of experience in 13 seasons as an assistant coach at Southern Methodist University in Dallas, Texas. With the Mustangs, Cianelli worked with 19 Olympic and World Championship competitors, 27 NCAA individual champions, 123 All-Americans and 95 individual conference champions. Cameron Taylor of New Zealand was a quarterfinalist in the 200m at the 1992 Olympics, and Tytti Reho won the 2000 NCAA championship in the 800m. In cross country, both the men's and women's teams captured the 1995 Southwest Conference titles and earned a spot in the NCAA Championships. During 13 years at SMU, the track & field teams finished in the top-10 nationally 15 separate

Cianelli served as the assistant women's track & field and cross country coach at Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo from 1985-88, where he helped the cross country team to the NCAA Division II National Championship three consecutive seasons; and the outdoor track & field teams finished as the runner-up at the NCAA Division II Championships three years in a row. Individual honors during his four years included 13 All-Americans and one NCAA champion.

Cianelli started his coaching career at San Marcos High School in Santa Barbara, Calif., as the head track & field coach from 1982-84. In three seasons, he coached seven junior national qualifiers in the heptathlon and decathlon.

Meet Recaps

Meet #1 | The VT Alumni Invite | Sept. 2 | No Team Score

BLACKSBURG, Va. -- The Virginia Tech men's and women's cross country teams opened their 2011 seasons on Sept. 2 at the VT Alumni Invitational at the Tech Cross Country Course. The meet was not scored as it was utilized as a tune-up for many Tech competitors who ran unattached. Liberty University 's men and women joined the Hokies and several Tech alumni.

Both the men (six kilometers) and women (four kilometers) raced distances shorter than the traditional college lengths of eight kilometers and six kilometers, respectively.

Leading the way for the Tech men were four freshmen who all competed as unattached runners. Ryan Kuhns led the way as he was fourth in 19:51.14 and Brayden Burleigh was fifth in 19:57.00. They were followed by classmates George Carter in sixth (20:04.86) and Pat Woodford in seventh (20:07.88). Liberty's Josh MacDonald won the men's race in 19:26.94.

For the women, sophomore Mary Catherine Sowder ran for Tech and finished third overall in 15:27.98. Freshman Ginny Jones ran unattached and registered a fifth place finish (15:43.41). Sophomore Erika Weidman also ran for the Hokies and was eighth, coming in at 16:27.21. Natalie Hall won the race in 14:52.72 running unattached.

60 total runners competed between the two races, including 28 women and 32 men.

Meet #2 | at Clemson Invite | Sept. 16 | Men 2nd, Women 4th

SENECA, S.C. -- The Virginia Tech men's cross country team placed second out of 12 teams and the women finished fourth of 12 teams at the Clemson Invitational at Musser Farms. The meet gave the Hokies a chance to preview this year's ACC Championship course, as the conference meet is back at Clemson on Oct. 29.

The men tallied 75 points while the women finished with 120 points. Host Clemson won the women's team race with 45 points and Florida State took the men's title with 28 points.

The first six Hokie men to finish all crossed the line within one second of each other, occupying places 14 through 19 overall. Junior Ryan Hagen lead the way with a time of 24:46.39 for the eight kilometer course. He was followed by junior Jason Cusack (24:46.39), redshirt sophomore Jared Berman (24:46.50), redshirt junior Will Mulherin (24:46.58), sophomore Grant Pollock (24:46.60) and redshirt junior Michael Hammond (24:47.17).

The women also finished as a strong pack, taking places 22 through 27 individually. Sophomore Taylor Crosson finished first for Tech in 21:50.32 over the six kilometer Musser Farms course. Crosson was then followed by freshman Sarah Rapp and sophomore Courtney Dobbs, who each clocked the same time of 21:50.42. Senior Sammy Dow (21:50.59), sophomore Alex Watt (21:50.61), sophomore Madalyn Nuckols (21:51.04) and sophomore Paige Kvartunas (32nd, 22:09.72) rounded-out Tech's top-seven finishers.

South Carolina Upstate's Jemeli Sang won the women's race in 20:42.88, while Ty McCormack of Clemson won the men's individual title in 23:56.72. The field included 114 women and 132 men.

Meet #3/4 | at Charlotte Invite/VT Open | Sept. 30 | Men 1st, Women 1st/No Team Score

CHARLOTTE, N.C. -- The Virginia Tech men's and women's cross country teams each won team titles at the Charlotte Invitational at McAlpine Park as the Hokie men scored 35 points topping a field of 34 teams, while the women scored 84 points to place first out of 36 teams competing.

The Tech men took four out of the top eight places and five out of the top-12, including spots four through six, en route to the team title

Leading the way for the men was redshirt-junior Michael Hammond, who placed fourth individually out of 258 finishers in a time of 24:28.0 on the 8,000-meter McAlpine Park layout. Hammond was followed closely by redshirt-junior Will Mulherin in fifth (24:32.6) and junior Jason Cusack in sixth (24:33.6).

The women also ran well together, finishing with a seven-runner spread of only 15 seconds. Freshman Sarah Rapp returned to her home state and led the Hokies with a 16th-place overall finish in a time of 17:41.3 for the five kilometer race. Sophomore Courtney Dobbs finished in 18th (17:45.0) while classmate Madalyn Nuckols was 19th (17:45.1).

In addition, Tech also hosted the VT Open, a non-scoring intrasquad race at the Tech Cross Country Course on campus this evening. In the women's 6k, a group of three runners raced to the line as sophomore Erika Weidman ran for Tech and won in a time of 24:11.57.

In the men's 8k, freshmen Ryan Kuhns (3rd, 26:19.90), George Carter (4th, 26:27.91) and Pat Woodford (5th, 27:05.57) all competed unattached. Eddie Judge, also competing unattached, won the men's race in 26:11.76.

Meet #5 | at Appalachian State Invite | Oct. 14 | Men NTS, Women 7th

BOONE, N.C. -- The Virginia Tech women's cross country team placed seventh out of 21 teams while three runners also competed for the men's squad at the Appalachian State Blue Ridge Open at State Farm Fields.

The Tech women scored 230 points as Furman won the team race. George Mason won the men's team title, bettering 23 teams with 40 points.

Leading the way for the Hokie women was sophomore Stephanie Cario, who covered the five kilometer course in 18:58.6, good for 25th place. Freshman Ginny Jones was close behind in 30th, finishing in 19:02.3. Freshman Camille Bouvet (65th, 19:36.8) was third on the team, while sophomore Erika Weidman (68th) and senior Lauren Pinkston (69th) rounded out the team scoring as they both finished with the same time of 19:38.2.

Sophomore Mary Catherine Sowder (107th, 20:20.2), freshman Katarina Smiljanec (108th, 20:21.1) and freshman Amanda Smith (114th, 20:29.1) also competed for Tech.

For the men, freshman Thomas Curtin turned in a top-10 overall finish, crossing the line eighth in 25:18.5 for the eight kilometer race. Junior Tihut Degfae followed in 12th in a time of 25:28.1, while senior Chris Walizer finished 39th in 25:59.5. Both Degfae and Walizer bettered their times from last year's Blue Ridge Open.

Tech was without their top-eight runners on both men's and women's sides for this meet as those student-athletes competed at the Indiana State Pre-National Invitational in Terre Haute, Ind., on Oct. 16

Cameron Bean of Zap Fitness won the men's race in 24:25.1 and Nicole Irving of Wake Forest won the women's race in 17:43.4. The fields consisted of 201 men and 177 women.



Meet Recaps

Meet #6 | at Indiana State Pre-National Invite | Oct. 16 | Men 9th, Women 11th

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. -- The Virginia Tech men's cross country team placed ninth out of 35 teams and the women finished 11th of 37 teams at the Indiana State Pre-National Invitational on the LaVerne Gibson Championship Cross Country Course at the Wabash Valley Family Sports Center. Redshirt junior Will Mulherin posted a strong finish of 16th overall in the men's race for Tech.

The Hokie men scored 322 points as Colorado won the team title with 82 points. The women had 384 points as Florida State won the women's team race with 46 points.

Leading the way for the men was Mulherin, who finished 16th overall out of 296 total runners in a time of 24:32 for the eight kilometer course. He was followed by redshirt junior Michael Hammond in 50th (25:11) and freshman Brayden Burleigh in 62nd (25:19). Junior Jason Cusack (95th, 25:41) and redshirt sophomore Jared Berman (106th, 25:47) rounded out Tech's top-five.

Freshman Sarah Rapp crossed the line first for the women as she was 42nd overall in a time of 21:47 for the six kilometer race. Sophomore Madalyn Nuckols was second to finish for Tech, placing 74th in 22:12. Sophomores Paige Kvartunas (91st, 22:26) and Alex Watt (95th, 22:29) finished close together while classmates Courtney Dobbs (101st) and Taylor Crosson (102nd) each finished with the same time of 22:33. Senior Sammy Dow was Tech's seventh finisher and 160th overall in 23:20. 303 runners competed in the women's race.

The Pre-National field included 10 ranked teams according to the United States Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) top-30 national poll (six men's, four women's).

Meet #7 | at ACC Championships | Oct. 29 | Men Tied for 4th, Women 8th

CLEMSON, S.C. -- The Virginia Tech men's cross country team placed tied for fourth and the women finished eighth at the 2011 Atlantic Coast Conference Championships hosted by Clemson at Musser Farms. Redshirt junior Will Mulherin finished seventh overall to earn his second career All-ACC honor while fellow redshirt junior Michael Hammond was 10th to earn his first career all-conference honor in cross country.


The Hokie men scored 116 points to finish in a tie with Duke for fourth place in the team race. The men's fourth place team finish was their second highest since joining the ACC in 2004, eclipsed only in 2008 when they finished third. The women had 180 points.

Leading the way for the men was Mulherin, who finished seventh overall out of 110 total runners in a time of 23:19.3 for the eight kilometer course. He joins Devin Cornwall as the only Hokie men to become two-time All-ACC runners in cross country. Mulherin also finished seventh as a sophomore in 2009. Hammond followed in 10th with a time of 23:45.0 and earned All-ACC honors (top-14) for the first time in cross country.

Freshman Thomas Curtin was third to cross the line for the Hokies as he was 30th in 24:20.3. Junior Jason Cusack (24:23.8) and sophomore Leoule Degfae (24:24.3) finished back-to-back in 34th and 35th to round out Tech's top-five.

Sophomore Taylor Crosson crossed the line first for the Virginia Tech women as she was 26th overall out of 104 total runners in a time of 21:10.5 for the six kilometer race. Senior Sammy Dow was second to finish for Tech, placing 34th in 21:16.8. Sophomore Courtney Dobbs was close behind in 37th (21:19.8), while freshman Sarah Rapp (41st, 21:33.8) and sophomore Madalyn Nuckols (44th, 21:39.9) rounded out the Tech scoring.

The Tech Cross Country Course



During the past 18 years, Virginia Tech's cross country course has provided many benefits to the program and has paid dividends for the Tech cross country team. The course has attracted several of the nation's top programs and been the site of some of the state's largest high school meets.

"In conjunction with our indoor and outdoor track facilities, the cross country course makes Virginia Tech unsurpassed in the quality of facilities," said Director of Track & Field and Cross Country Dave Cianelli. "The training aspect of the course is also great."

Tech has the luxury of competing and training on a course designed solely for cross country competition, affording the team an opportunity to have exclusive rights to the use of the facility.

Over the years, the all-grass course has provided an ideal surface for racing and training. Located on the southwest end of campus near the corner of Southgate Drive and Route 460, the terrain gently rolls through the cornfields and wooded locations typical of the Tech surroundings.

Opened for racing in 1993, the course now starts and finishes behind the Virginia-Maryland Regional College of Veterinary Medicine. It covers a total of 3.1 miles, passes historical Smithfield Plantation and crosses Stroubles Creek. There is also a five-mile version of the course for the men.

"I think it's one of the nicest settings for a cross country course I have ever seen," Cianelli said. "The fact that it is on campus makes it ideal for our teams to train and compete."

Another key trait of the course is its proximity to campus facilities. Rector Field House allows athletes to warm up in perfect conditions.

The Hokies will host three meets on their home course this year, starting with the Virginia Tech Alumni Invitational on Sept. 2.

"There are very few schools with a cross country course and two tracks so close together," cross country coach Ben Thomas said. "The competition facilities here are unbeatable."
