The 2006 Season Outlook

A Quick Glance

Virginia Tech returns just nine starters — five on defense and four on offense — from a team that finished 11-2, ranked No. 7 in both national polls, earned the ACC Coastal Division championship and won the Gator Bowl in the program's 13th-straight bowl appearance.

Gone from last year's team are a number of key figures, including first-team All-ACC picks Jimmy Williams (cb), Darryl Tapp (de), Marcus Vick (qb), Will Montgomery (c) and Jason Murphy (og). Second-team all-conference picks Jonathan Lewis (dt), Jeff King (te) and Jimmy Martin (ot) are also gone, along with linebacker James Anderson, safety Justin Hamilton, defensive tackle Tim Sandidge and tailback Cedric Humes. All 12 of those players began the summer in NFL camps.

Work To Be Done

When preseason practice opens, the key goals for head coach Frank Beamer and his staff will include naming a starting quarterback as quickly as possible, settling on a tight end and developing depth along the offensive and defensive lines and at linebacker.

There are still some decisions to be made on the offensive line, where plenty of attention will be paid to the progress of true freshmen Sergio Render and Aaron Brown, redshirt sophomore Nick Marshman, redshirt junior Matt Welsh and senior Brandon Gore. Gore suffered a broken ankle in the Florida State game and missed spring practice.

Key names in the efforts to add depth up front on defense will be redshirt freshman tackles Cordarrow Thompson and Hivera Green, and redshirt freshman end William Wall. It is quite possible that an incoming freshman could end up in the mix, especially at end.

The youngest position on the young offense is tight end. The loss of veteran John Kinzer to medical issues left the Hokies without a single down of experience. Redshirt freshmen Sam Wheeler, Ed Wang and Greg Boone will be battling for the top spot during the preseason, with at least one incoming freshman likely to join in.

Tech's linebacker corps has been ranked the third best in the nation by *Lindy's* on the strength of returning starters **Vince Hall** and **Xavier Adibi**. To live up to that billing, however, the Hokies are also going to need continued progress from junior **Brett Warren** and redshirt sophomore **Purnell Sturdivant**.


The QB Plan

Coming out of spring practice, redshirt sophomore Sean Glennon is No. 1 on the depth chart at quarterback, followed by redshirt sophomore Cory Holt at No. 2 and redshirt freshmen Ike Whitaker and Greg Boone at No. 3 and No. 4, respectively.

"Now we need to see what happens over the summer," says head coach Frank Beamer. "That is probably going to affect our thinking going into the fall. Then, very quickly, I'd like to name a starting quarterback so we have a direction. That's our plan right now."

The quarterback position might lack experience, but not ability.

"I thought we made tremendous improvement over the course of the spring," says new quarterbacks coach Mike O'Cain. "I was particularly pleased with Sean and Cory. I think both of them



can lead this football team and I think we can win with both of

them.'

Whitaker, who missed valuable learning time in the spring due to a suspension, has ground to make up, but will be given a shot to show what he can do. Boone, for the time being, will move to tight end, where he could contribute this fall.

Catching Up

The Hokies' receiving corps has been ranked the eighth-best in the D-IA ranks by *Lindy's*, which bases the rating on Tech's quality depth at the position. Five experienced receivers return in senior **David Clowney** and juniors **Eddie Royal**, **Josh Morgan**, **Justin Harper** and **Josh Hyman**.

Over the past two seasons, those five receivers have combined for 213 catches for 3,551 yards and 24 touchdowns. Their combined yards per catch average is 16.7 yards.

Tough Act To Follow

Virginia Tech's 2005 defensive unit finished No. 1 in the nation in total defense and was ranked among the top three teams in three other categories. All six senior starters who departed began the summer in NFL camps, leaving some big shoes to fill.

Can the 2006 unit hope to fill them?

"I really feel like we have a chance to be a very competitive defense, similar to what we were last year," says veteran defensive coordinator Bud Foster. "I think we will have a talented, athletic group on the field ... a fast group. We have a little mix of experience, as well as youth, but I'm optimistic about this group because there are some playmakers in there and its their turn to shine."

Too Young?

When it comes to the offense, Frank Beamer feels the Hokies are going to have to grow as the season goes along.

"We've got to develop,"
Beamer says. "We've got too much youth in some key positions, but yet, we've got some good players. We've got to be really good about how we use players. We are going to have to take care of the football, and we have to score when we get an opportunity. That's the kind of football team we are."

Summertime


One of the determining factors for a successful season will occur before the Hokies strap on the pads again. A good summer preparation is always important, but never any more than this year when youth and depth are key issues.

"I think Coach (Mike)
Gentry's program during the
summer is essential for us
... essential to our physical
toughness, essential to our mental
toughness," Beamer says. "You
see bodies change around after
a good summer. Some change
from a strength standpoint,
others change from a loss or
redistribution of weight. When
we get back together in August, I
expect to see a different football
team than left here in the spring."

- Three full-time starters and another part-time starter along the line all departed due to graduation, so a new nucleus of linemen must be
- Duane Brown returns at right tackle after moving over from tight end last preseason. He ended up starting all 13 games for the Hokies at his new position.
- Senior Danny McGrath, who started seven games last year at center, returns after missing all of spring ball (surgery on his shoulder following the season).
- A new coach has taken over the line duties this year as Bryan Stinespring has moved over to coach the tight ends, while still serving as the coordinator. Tech has welcomed new line coach Curt Newsome, who served the last five years at James Madison University.


Coach Newsome On the Line


MASON BAGGETT - Coaches call him "a terrific man and a good

"We have five guys who are very experienced and have paid their dues. I think we can make it through the season with them. But if any injury pops up, we'd take a look at one of the young guys."



"I think there are two variables that you look at: are they physically and mentally ready and then is there a need? In both of these situations, I think the answer is yes, already, so we're going to work hard to get them on the field."



RUNNING BACKS & QUARTERBACKS

Headlines

- The top priority on offense is solidifying the starting quarterback. Two players with game experience Sean Glennon and Cory Holt will have a slight lead going into fall, but will have to hold off redshirt freshman Ike Whitaker.
- The Hokies will also have to find a new tailback with the loss of Cedric Humes and Mike Imoh to graduation. **Branden Ore** has the most experience of any returnee, but was not enrolled in the spring semester as he was home rehabbing his shoulder after off-season surgery.
- George Bell and Kenny Lewis, Jr., will also get looks at tailback as both are coming off solid springs.
- The fullback spot is in good hands as **Jesse Allen** returns as the starter, but will be faced by pressure from several talented players, including **Carlton Weatherford**.
- Tech has welcomed a new addition in quarterbacks coach **Mike O'Cain**, who has a wealth of experience both at the position and within the ACC.

Tailback

GEORGE BELL – Had an outstanding spring ... Is a powerful back in the same speed category as Cedric Humes ... Has waited a long time for his knee to be healthy.

BRANDEN ORE – Missed the spring while rehabbing from shoulder surgery ... Knows what he has to do to get himself ready to play ... Has great ability and outstanding speed and vision.





Coach Hite on the Running Backs

"In the 28 years that I've been here, the running backs have been a great tradition. These guys have to follow those footsteps. From a character and want-to standpoint, I believe these guys can get the job done for us. We have some quality players at both the fullback and tailback spots. It's up to them to get the job done and I expect them to carry on the great tradition of 'The Stallions'."

Coach O'Cain on the Quarterbacks

"Consistent poise and performance is what we're looking for. We want our quarterbacks to be able to get the football to the right person at the right time, with the right kind of pass, to where they win the games for us with their athleticism. Now, that doesn't mean we won't ask our guarterbacks to run the football some, or have to have them help win the game with their legs. They've got to be able to make good decisions, get us in and out of the huddle, get us in the proper play, out of a bad play, and then distribute the ball at the right time to the right person on a consistent basis."

Headlines

- Junior end Chris Ellis is the lone returning starter. Senior end Noland Burchette and junior tackle Carlton Powell are the only other returning players along the defensive line who have started games.
- Young players are going to have to step up and fill some spots at both end and tackle. William Wall will be a player to watch at end, while Cordarrow Thompson and Hivera Green will be candidates at tackle. The coaches have not ruled out incoming freshmen joining

NOLAND BURCHETTE — An experienced senior who the

experienced senior who the coaches are leaning on for leadership ... Plays hard non-stop and has a knack for making plays ... Needs to stay healthy and have an outstanding season.

"We want to find five tackles and five ends, and it's probably going to include a freshman at the end position. It's not out of the question for one of those guys to step in and be the fourth or fifth end."

On the Line

"I think we have a chance to be solid up front. Of course, we're banking on a couple of young redshirt freshmen guys continuing to get better. We have a really healthy competition at tackle. Carlton Powell is a steady presence there, and I think Kory Robertson and Barry Booker are two real key guys for our success. They have to stay healthy and be productive.

"At end, we are real solid with Chris (Ellis) and Noland (Burchette), and then, I've been pleased with the progress of Orion Martin. He had a great winter and a great spring practice. So now, we are in a similar position as tackle. Will William Wall be the fourth guy or can one of the incoming freshmen be a factor this fall as an end?"


On the ILBs



Headlines

- Place-kicker Brandon Pace has finished as the second-leading scorer in the ACC each of the past two seasons. Pace has been ranked the 10th-best place-kicker in the nation by *Lindy's* and the 13th-best kicker by *The Sporting News*.
- At 6-2, 273 pounds, senior **Nic Schmitt** rates as one of the biggest punters in the nation. He also ranks as one of the best. Schmitt, who has been ranked the No. 5 punter in the country by *Lindy's*, was named to the 2006 *Playboy* All-America team.
- Virginia Tech's reputation for blocking kicks has taken a hit lately, with just 11 combined blocks over the past three seasons. This year's roster includes just one player with a block to their credit. Sophomore Victor Harris was credited with a block on a punt by North Carolina in the Hokies' final regular season game of 2005.

BRANDON PACE — Set a school single-season record for points by a kicker last year with 108 ... Is currently seventh all-time in scoring at Tech ... A two-time Lou Groza Award semifinalist ... Is 40-for-49 on field goals during his career (81.6 percent) ... May also get a look on kickoffs.

JUD DUNLEVY — Has been a backup for placements and kickoffs the last two seasons ... Has a strong leg ... Hit a 51-yard field goal as time expired to lift the Tech jayvee team to a win over Hargrave last fall ... Handled 21 kickoffs in 2005 ... Will battle for those duties again when practice resumes.

JARED DEVELLI —

Another strong-legged kicker ... Has handled the bulk of Tech's kickoffs the past two seasons ... Kicked off 64 times last year with 29 touchbacks ... Is being challenged for the starting duties for the third-straight year.

JOHN HEDGE — An accurate kicker ... Has seen all his action in jayvee games ... Has served as both a place-kicker and a punter ... Will help provide depth behind Brandon Pace.

Punters

NIC SCHMITT — Has a strong left leg ... Averaged 43.2 yards on 62 punts last season, the second-best single-season average for a Tech punter ... A real weapon in the battle for field position ... Excels in the weight room ... Also serves as the holder for placements.

BRENT BOWDEN — Dressed for all the games last year as the backup for Schmitt but did not see action and was redshirted ... Has good ability ... Needs to stay sharp in case he is needed.

Snappers

NICK LEESON — Served as Tech's snapper on punts last season ... Didn't have a bad snap in 52 attempts ... Will also challenge for the vacated PAT/field goal

Returns

EDDIE ROYAL — An exceptional talent who has led the team in both kickoff and punt returns each of the last two seasons ... Was fifth in the ACC in punt returns a year ago ... Is also a two-year starter as a receiver for the Hokies.

JOSH MORGAN — Is likely to see some action as a punt and kickoff returner ... Showed good ability in limited return duty last season ... A physical player who is hard to bring down ... Is one of the Hokies' top receivers on offense.

Coach Beamer On Special Teams

"We did replace a few people on our punt protection team during the spring and we need to make sure we have that squared away. But, we should be very good on special teams. I think we have really good kickers. If they perform up to their capabilities, our kicking game will be a strong point.

"I would like to see our guys blocking more kicks and returning more kicks. We were in position to block several kicks last year, but could never get them blocked. The more we can block them, the more we can return them. This is something we plan to concentrate on."
