- Georgia Tech (4-4, 3-3 ACC) will look to kickstart a late-season surge for the second-straight year with a win over nationally ranked Virginia Tech (7-2, 3-2 ACC) on Saturday at Bobby Dodd Stadium.
- Last season, Georgia Tech was 5-4 and coming off its most disheartening loss of the season (a 48-20 defeat at North Carolina) when it went into Blacksburg, Va. and dominated from the outset in a 30-20 win over No. 18 Virginia Tech. The victory spearheaded a four-game winning streak to close the season, which included a 28-27 triumph at Georgia and a 33-18 win over Kentucky in the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Standing at 4-4 and likely needing two wins in its final three regular-season games to become bowl eligible for the 20th time in the last 21 seasons, the Yellow Jackets once again face a ranked Hokies squad, which goes into Saturday's game at No. 17 in the Associated Press Top 25 poll.
- While an ACC Coastal Division title and berth in the ACC Championship Game is no longer a possibility, Georgia Tech is still in strong position for a second-place finish in the Coastal Division, as it enters Saturday's game just a half-game behind VIrginia Tech and Virginia (6-3, 3-2 ACC) in the Coastal standings. The Yellow Jackets have finished in first or second place in the Coastal Division six times in head coach Paul Johnson's nine seasons at the helm.
- Georgia Tech rides a seven-game winning streak at Bobby Dodd Stadium into Saturday's game, which is the Jackets' longest home winning streak since it also won seven in a row on The Flats from Nov. 1, 2008-Nov. 9, 2009. GEORGIA TECH FOOTBALL BY THE NUMBERS

In three of Georgia Tech's four losses this season, the opponent has scored the winning points in the final 1:22 of regulation or in overtime.

Despite throwing its first two interceptions of the season last Saturday against Virginia, Georgia Tech is still tied with Alabama, UAB and San Diego State for the fewest interceptions thrown by an NCAA Division I FBS team this season.

Georgia Tech ranks No. 3 nationally in three different offensive categories — rushing offense (331.9 yards per game), passing yards per completion (18.53) and time of possession (34:39 per game).

TaQuon Marshall's 870 rushing yards this season are already the fourth-most by a quarterback in Georgia Tech single-

5-for-5

True freshman **Brenton King** is a perfect 5-for-5 on field-goal attempts this season. He is the only kicker in the ACC with at least three field-goal attempts and a perfect 1.000 percentage.

A junior with only eight career starts under his belt, Marshall's 884 career rushing yards are already the eighth-most all-time by a Georgia Tech quarterback.

Marshall's 14 rushing touchdowns this season are tied for the third-most by a QB in Georgia Tech single-season history.

Georgia Tech's 2017 opponents are a combined 44-30 this season (.595), which gives the Yellow Jackets the 12th-most difficult schedule in the nation.

The three opponents left on Georgia Tech's regular-season schedule have a combined .708 winning percentage (17-7), giving the Yellow Jackets' the nation's 11th-toughest remaining schedule.

A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...

- up it to 5-4 overall this season;
- · pull it to within one game of becoming bowl eligible for the 20th time in the last 21 seasons;
- up its ACC record to 4-3, clinching a .500 mark or better in league play for the 22nd time in the last 23 seasons;
- be its ninth in its last 13 games and 11th in its past 16 contests:
- be its eight-straight home win, which would be its longest home winning streak since it also won eight in a row at Bobby Dodd Stadium from Nov. 21, 1998-Sept. 2, 2000.
- be its first of the season over a nationally ranked team;
- be its first home win over a nationally ranked opponent since its "Miracle on Techwood Drive" 22-16 victory over No. 9 Florida State on Oct. 24, 2015;
- be its 12th win over a nationally ranked opponent in Paul Johnson's 10 seasons as head coach;
- be its third in the last four seasons over Virginia Tech;
- be its first home win over Virginia Tech since 2009 (snapping a three-game skid against the Hokies at Bobby Dodd Stadium):
- up it to 6-9 all-time against VT (4-6 under Johnson).

A GEORGIA TECH LOSS WOULD ...

- drop it to 4-5 overall and 3-4 in ACC play;
- give it three-straight defeats for the first time since Sept. 22-Oct. 8 of last season (Clemson, Miami, at Pittsburgh);
- be its first at Bobby Dodd Stadium since a 35-21 loss to No. 14 Miami on Oct. 1, 2016, snapping its longest home winning streak since 2008-09 at seven games;
- extend its home losing streak against VT to four games.

NOTING LAST WEEK'S LOSS AT VIRGINIA

- Virginia scored the go-ahead touchdown with 1:22 to go in a 40-36 win over Georgia Tech last Saturday at Scott Stadium in Charlottesville, Va.
- The heartbreaking loss marked the third time in Georgia Tech's four defeats this season that the opponent scored the winning points with 82 seconds or less to go in regulation or in overtime.
- The wild game featured four lead changes, including three in the fourth quarter and two in the final 3:10 of the contest.
- Trailing 33-28 with just over seven minutes to play, Georgia Tech marched 90 yards in nine plays and took a 36-33 lead on a 33-yard touchdown pass from TaQuon Marshall to Ricky Jeune.
- However, on its subsequent possession, Virginia drove 64 yards in just five plays, capped by a 27-yard touchdown pass from Kurt Benkert to Andre Levrone that gave the Cavs a 40-36 lead with 1:22 to go.
- Highlighted by a 35-yard catch by Jeune on fourthand-16, the Yellow Jackets drove all the way to the UVA 32 yard line on their final possession but turned the ball over on downs with 15 seconds remaining.
- Marshall accounted for 322 yards (143 rushing, 179 passing) and three touchdowns (two rushing, one passing).
- Making his first-career start, true freshman MLB **Bruce Jordan-Swilling** recorded his first forced fumble, fumble recovery, interception and defensive touchdown. He forced and recovered a fumble on the same play in the second quarter, which led to a Georgia Tech touchdown. On Virginia's first offensive play of the second half, he returned an interception 27 yards for a touchdown.
- Georgia Tech threw its first two interceptions of the season. The Yellow Jackets were the only team in the nation that hadn't thrown an interception this season going into last week.
- Georgia Tech lost for the third time this season after leading at halftime. Prior to this year, Georgia Tech was 54-8 in nine seasons under **Paul Johnson** when leading at halftime.

NOTING VIRGINIA TECH

- Virginia Tech enters Saturday's game at 7-2 overall and 3-2 in ACC play. The second-place Hokies are tied with Virginia and a half-game ahead of third-place Georgia Tech in the ACC Coastal Division standings.
- Both of VT's losses this season have come at the hands of teams ranked in the top 10 nationally a 31-17 loss to then-No. 2 Clemson on Sept. 30 and last Saturday's 28-10 defeat at then-No. 9 Miami (Fla.).
- Virginia Tech boasts the unequivocally best defense in the ACC, as it leads the league in scoring defense (13.3 ppg fourth nationally), total defense (300.6 ypg 11th nationally), passing defense (178.8 ypg 16th nationally) and rushing defense (121.8 ypg 17th nationally).
- The Hokies' defense also tops the ACC first downs allowed (132 sixth nationally) and ranks second in the league in third-down defense (.248 fourth nationally).
- Linebacker Tremaine Edmunds is the Hokies' top defender, leading the team with 77 total tackles. He has also stuffed the stat sheet with 7.5 tackles for loss, 2.5 sacks and three forced fumbles (tied for first in the ACC).
- Offensively, Virginia Tech ranks third in the ACC in scoring (32.6 ppg) but is just sixth in the league in passing (258.8 yppp), seventh in rushing (171.3 ppg) and seventh in total offense (430.1 ypg).
- Freshman quarterback Josh Jackson has thrown for 2,229 yards and 17 touchdowns this season.
- Jackson's top target is senior wideout Cam Phillips. The NFL prospect has caught 58 passes for 793 yards and six scores this season.
- VT has utilized a running game by committee, with six different Hokies having 38 carries or more this season, led by junior Travon McMillian's team-high 91 carries and 405 vards

GEORGIA TECH-VIRGINIA TECH SERIES HISTORY

- Virginia Tech leads the all-time series with Georgia Tech,
 9-5, including a 5-2 advantage in games played at Bobby Dodd Stadium.
- Despite Georgia Tech's 3-6 record against Virginia Tech under head coach Paul Johnson, nailbiters have been a staple of the GT-VT series during Johnson's tenure. Each of the nine matchups since Johnson's arrival in 2008 have been decided by 10 points or less, eight of the nine have been decided by single-digits, seven of the nine have been decided by seven points or less and three of the last five have been decided by three points or less.
- Last year, Georgia Tech jumped out to a 20-0 halftime lead at VT's Lane Stadium and cruised to a 30-20 victory over the 18th-ranked Hokies. The Yellow Jackets' 10-point triumph was the largest margin of victory for either team in the series since 2007.
- Virginia Tech is one of only three ACC opponents that Johnson has a sub.-500 record against at Georgia Tech (Clemson 4-6, Miami 2-8).
- All but one of the 14 previous GT-VT matchups have come since Virginia Tech joined the ACC in 2004. In the only nonconference game in series history, Georgia Tech topped the Hokies, 6-3, during its national-championship run in 1990 (Nov. 10, 1990).

NOTING LAST YEAR'S WIN OVER VT

- Despite missing five offensive starters, Georgia Tech jumped out to a 20-0 halftime lead and cruised to a 30-20 win over No. 18/22 Virginia Tech at sold-out Lane Stadium in Blacksburg, Va. on Nov. 12, 2016.
- Georgia Tech was without starting QB Justin Thomas, AB J.J. Green, C Freddie Burden and RT Andrew Marshall due to injuries, as well as BB Dedrick Mills, who was serving the first game of a two-game suspension.
- Sophomore QB Matthew Jordan and true freshman C Kenny Cooper made their first-career starts in place of Thomas and Burden.
- Jordan was particularly impressive in the first start of his career, leading Georgia Tech to scores in 6-of-13 possessions (not including a kneel-down on the final play of the game). He finished with 121 rushing yards and two touchdowns on 32 carries (all career highs prev.: 72 yds. vs. Tulane, Sept. 12, 2015; 28 carries at Miami, Nov. 21, 2015; 2 TD vs. Mercer, Sept. 10, 2016).
- Jordan only completed 2-of-7 passes for 34 yards but both completions (a 10-yarder to **Brad Stewart** in the first quarter and a 24-yarder to **Ricky Jeune** in the third quarter) came on third down and helped extend Georgia Tech scoring drives.
- Georgia Tech had two 100-yard rushers in the same game (Marcus Marshall -- 143 yds.; Jordan -- 142 yds.) for the first time since its 49-34 win over No. 8 Mississippi State in the 2014 Orange Bowl (Synjyn Days -- 171, Thomas -- 121).
- After allowing 1,195 yards and 83 points over its previous two games (597.5 yards and 41.5 points per game), Georgia Tech limited Virginia Tech to 437 yards and 20 points. 182 of Virginia Tech's yards and 13 of its points came on its final two possessions, after Georgia Tech had jumped out to a 30-7 lead.
- Junior nickel back Lawrence Austin had a hand in three of Georgia Tech's four takeaways. He also forced a fumble in the fourth quarter, which was recovered by his twin brother, CB Lance Austin.
- Lawrence Austin became the first Georgia Tech player with multiple interceptions in a game since Jemea Thomas had two in a 31-17 win at No. 6 Clemson on Oct. 29, 2011.
- Place kicker Harrison Butker (now a member of the Kansas City Chiefs) kicked a then-career-high-tying three field goals (40, 39 and 35 yards).

- Georgia Tech ranks 28th nationally in offensive efficiency with a 68.3 efficiency rating, according to ESPN.com (ESPN's efficiency ratings are based on the point contributions of the unit to the team's scoring margin, on a per-play basis. The values are adjusted for strength of schedule and down-weighted for "garbage time." The scale goes from 0 to 100; the average is roughly 50).
- Once again, Georgia Tech's explosive offense ranks among the ACC and national leaders in big plays, ranking second in the conference and tied for 17th nationally with six plays from scrimmage that have gained 60 yards or more this season. Last season, the Yellow Jackets ranked second in the ACC and tied for 13th nationally with eight plays from scrimmage of 60 yards or longer.
- The Jackets big-play ability was on full display last Saturday at Virginia, when it had a season-high six offensive plays of 20 yards or more. 229 of Tech's 399 total yards against UVA came on just five plays - a 78-yard run by QB TaQuon Marshall, a 49-yard pass from Marshall to WR Jalen Camp, 35- and 33-yard passes from Marshall to WR Ricky Jeune and a 34-yard pass from Marshall to AB Qua Searcy.
- . Georgia Tech has scored at least 24 points in 11 of its last 12 games.
- The Yellow Jackets had a streak of 10-consecutive games with at least 24 points snapped in a rain-soaked 24-10 loss at No. 7 Clemson on Oct. 28. It was the fifth-longest active streak in the nation (long: 21 - USF) and the secondlongest active streak in the ACC (long: 12 — Miami).
- Tech's string of 10-straight games with 24 or more points was also tied for the fourth-longest streak in program history.

- The Yellow Jackets' 230 total yards against Clemson were tied for their sixth-fewest in 10 seasons under head coach Paul Johnson, while their 32 passing yards were their eighth-fewest and their 198 rushing yards were their 19thfewest under Johnson.
- . Georgia Tech's offense burst out of the gates with one of the best offensive performances in program history versus Tennessee in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game on Sept. 4.

- Broke school record of 27 (2014 at Georgia) ^ Tied school record of 86 (1976 at Virginia)
- The Yellow Jackets' 535 rushing vards were the most ever surrendered by a Tennessee defense (prev.: 457 by Alabama in 1986).
- The Jackets' six rushing touchdowns against Tennessee were tied for the most ever surrendered by the Volunteers (happened four times previously, first time since Nebraska accomplished the feat in 1997).
- On Sept. 9 versus Jacksonville State, the passing game took center stage. Georgia Tech completed 5-of-7 passes for 112 yards and three touchdowns in the 37-10 win over JSU, good for a lofty 347.26 pass-efficiency rating.
- · Georgia Tech's three touchdown passes against Jacksonville State were the Yellow Jackets' most in a game since a 35-10 win over Virginia on Nov. 1, 2014.
- The Yellow Jackets' 436 rushing yards against Pitt (Sept. 23) were their most in an ACC game since they ran for 479 yards in a 56-23 win over NC State on Oct. 18, 2014.
- . The Yellow Jackets' ability to control the ball was on full display when they put together scoring drives of 18 (touchdown) and 17 (field goal) plays in the first half of their 33-7 win over North Carolina on Sept. 30.
- The 18- and 17-play drives against North Carolina marked the first time in Johnson's seasons as head coach that Georgia Tech put together multiple scoring drives of 17 plays or more.
- · Georgia Tech's 18-play touchdown drive in the first quarter against UNC is tied for the ninth-longest scoring drive in school history in terms of plays. It was the longest drive by the Yellow Jackets in terms of plays since an 18-yard series resulted in a touchdown in a 42-24 win over Duke on Nov. 17, 2012.
- · Georgia Tech's current 331.9-yard rushing average is barely 10 yards shy of the school record of 342.1 rushing yards per game, set in 2014.
- The running game is always the backbone of Johnson's high-powered spread option offense. Since Johnson's arrival on The Flats in 2008, no team has rushed for more yards then Georgia Tech's 38,126. Johnson's former squad, Navy, is a close second with 37,856 yards.

- When Clemson outrushed Georgia Tech, 221-198, on Oct. 28, it marked only the 16th time in Johnson's 10 seasons as head coach that the Yellow Jackets were outgained on the ground.
- Only three times in Johnson's 10 seasons at the helm have the Yellow Jackets won a game in which they have been outrushed — two of those came last season (outrushed 176-119 in 17-14 win over Boston College on Sept. 3 and 263-226 in 28-27 win at Georgia on Nov. 26).
- In Johnson's 10 seasons at the helm, Georgia Tech has produced 15 rushers that have eclipsed the 1,000-yard plateau for their careers. That is 31.9 percent of the 47 Yellow Jackets that have amassed 1,000 career rushing yards in the 125-season history of Georgia Tech football.

- Junior AB Clinton Lynch became Johnson's 15th 1,000vard rusher at Georgia Tech when he eclipsed the 1.000yard mark for his career with a team-high 71 rushing yards at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14. In less than three full seasons with the Yellow Jackets, Lynch has rushed for 1,021 yards on just 105 career carries (9.7 avg.).
- . Georgia Tech is the only team in the nation with two student-athletes averaging 100 rushing yards per game this season — Marshall (108.8 ypg - 20th nationally) and **KirVonte Benson** (105.5 ypg - t-21st nationally).
- Despite Georgia Tech's unprecedented rushing success under Johnson, only two players averaged 100 rushing yards per game in a game in a season during Johnson's first nine years as head coach — Dwyer (107.3 ypg - 2008) and Anthony Allen (101.2 ypg - 2010).
- Benson and Marshall rank second and third in the ACC in rushing this season (behind Louisville QB Lamar Jackson -114.3 ypg). Benson and Marshall are both vying to become the first Yellow Jacket to lead the ACC in rushing since Jonathan Dwyer in 2008 (107.3 ypg).
- Four times in eight games this season, Marshall and Benson have both rushed for 100 yards in the same game.

- Georgia Tech has had multiple 100-yard rushers five times in its last 12 games overall. In addition to Marshall and Benson accomplishing the feat four times this season, QB **Matthew Jordan** (121 yards) and former BB Marcus Marshall (143) both surpassed the century mark in last season's 30-20 win at No. 18 Virginia Tech (Nov. 12, 2016).
- Prior to having two 100-yard rushers five times in the last 12 games, Georgia Tech had two different players gain 100 yards on the ground in the same game only 29 times in school history.
- After turning the ball over eight times in its first 284 offensive plays of the season (one turnover every 35.5 snaps), Georgia Tech has committed only three turnovers in its last 286 plays (one turnover every 95.3 snaps).
- The Yellow Jackets went 160 offensive plays and 26 offensive possessions without a turnover from Sept. 30-Oct. 28. The 160-play streak without a turnover spanned from a fumble in the third quarter of the Jackets' 33-7 win over North Carolina on Sept. 30 to a fumble on the opening drive of their 24-10 loss at No. 7 Clemson on Oct. 28.
- Prior to throwing its first two interceptions of the season last Saturday at Virginia, Georgia Tech was the only FBS team that had not thrown an interception this season.
- Even with last Saturday's two interceptions at UVA, the Yellow Jackets are still tied for the fewest INTs thrown by an FBS squad this season (Alabama, San Diego State and UAB have also thrown only two INTs in 2017).
- Over its past 16 games (beginning with the sixth game of last season), Georgia Tech has thrown only three interceptions in 173 pass attempts.
- Despite losing only one fumble over its last 55 offensive possessions, Georgia Tech's 1.25 fumbles lost per game (10 in eight contests) are still the seventh-most in the nation this season.
- Against Pitt (Sept. 23), Georgia Tech lost four fumbles, tied for the sixth-most in a single game in school history and the most by the Yellow Jackets since they also lost four fumbles in a 27-25 win over North Carolina on Nov. 17, 2007.
- Lost fumbles played a big part in the Yellow Jackets' 42-41, double-overtime loss to Tennessee on Sept. 4. The Jackets turned the ball over twice against the Volunteers, leading directly to 14 UT points.
- Tech's final turnover against the Vols was particularly costly a fumble that was recovered by Tennessee at its own seven yard line with 4:50 remaining in the game and the Yellow Jackets holding a 28-21 lead. If the Jackets scored, they likely would've put the game out of reach. Instead, UT drove 93 yards in seven plays to tie the game with 1:29 to go.
- Protecting the ball is traditionally a big part of Georgia
 Tech's offensive success. Last season, the Yellow Jackets'
 15 turnovers were tied for the 17th-fewest nationally and
 their four interceptions were tied for the fewest in the nation.
- Georgia Tech has played 258-consecutive games without being shut out, good for the fifth-longest active streak in NCAA Division I FBS.
- The Yellow Jackets have not been held scoreless since a 38-0 loss at No. 3 Florida State on Oct. 18, 1997.
- Even more impressively, Georgia Tech has not been

blanked at home since a 7-0 loss to Georgia on Nov. 30, 1957 — good for a streak of 374-straight games played at Bobby Dodd Stadium without being shut out.

- Despite having only eight career starts under his belt, junior **TaQuon Marshall** has emerged as one of college football's most dyamic quarterbacks this season.
- With 1,537 yards of total offense (870 rushing, 667 passing) and 20 touchdowns responsible for (14 rushing, six passing) through eight games, Marshall ranks among the top 25 nationally in six different statistical categories.
- Most notably, Marshall leads the ACC in scoring (10.5 ppg), rushing touchdowns (14) and total touchdowns (14) and ranks second in the conference in rushing (108.8 ypg).

- Marshall and Louisville's Lamar Jackson (114.3 ypg) are both vying to become the first quarterback in the 64-year history of the ACC to lead the league in rushing.
- Marshall's 103.9 rushing yards per game ranks fifth nationally among quarterbacks (behind Arizona's Khalil Tate 155.3 ypg, Navy's Zach Abey 150.3 ypg, Army West Point's 125.8 ypg and Jackson 114.3 ypg).

- Marshall's 249 rushing yards against Tennessee were also the third-most in Georgia Tech history, regardless of position (behind only 356 by Eddie Lee Ivery vs. Air Force - Nov. 11, 1978 and 307 by P.J. Daniels vs. Tulsa, Humanitarian Bowl - Jan. 4, 2004).
- Marshall became the second-straight Georgia Tech quarterback to rush for 100 yards in his first-career start (**Matthew Jordan** rushed for 121 yards on 32 carries in his first-career start at Virginia Tech on Nov. 12, 2016).
- Marshall's 249 rushing yards against Tennessee are the third-most by an FBS quarterback and tied for the 12th-most by any FBS student-athlete in a game this season.
- Marshall's five rushing touchdowns against UT remain tied for the most in the nation by any student-athlete in a single game this season.
- Marshall was bottled up on the ground against Jacksonville State on Sept. 9 (25 yards on 13 carries) but turned in one of the most efficient passing performances in the nation this season against the Gamecocks, completing 5-of-7 passes for 112 yards and three touchdowns in the Yellow Jackets' 37-10 win on Sept. 9.
- Had he attempted enough passes to qualify for the national rankings (min. 15), Marshall's 347.26 pass-efficiency rating against JSU would be the second-best single-game rating in the nation this season (Appalachian State's Taylor Lamb compiled a 373.12 pass-efficiency rating against Savannah State on Sept. 9).
- Marshall's 163 rushing yards against Wake Forest on Oct. 21 were the sixth-most by a quarterback in school history.

- Marshall threw for a career-high 179 yards on just six completions (29.8 avg.) in last Saturday's 40-36 loss at Virginia.
- Additionally, Marshall's' 78-yard touchdown run on the first snap of the second half against Virginia was the longest play of his career, Georgia Tech's longest play from scrimmage since an 83-yard pass from Justin Thomas to **Clinton Lynch** on Nov. 5, 2016 versus North Carolina and the Yellow Jackets' longest run since an 82-yard touchdown run by Thomas on Oct. 29, 2016 against Duke.
- Despite Marshall's early-season heroics, Tech still has one of the nation's most inexperienced guarterback groups,

- as the signal-callers on the Yellow Jackets' roster have combined for just nine career starts (coming into the season, Tech's quarterbacks had combined for just one start).
- Georgia Tech was one of only 12 teams in the nation whose quarterbacks had combined for one career start or less coming into 2017 (research courtesy of Temple University).
- The Yellow Jackets were the only team in the ACC whose quarterbacks had combined for less than three career starts coming into the season.
- The Jackets' 45 combined career appearances by their signal-callers are a bit misleading, as only 10 of Marshall's 19 career games have come at quarterback (he played in nine games as an A-back in 2015 before making two appearances as a QB last season) and five of redshirt freshman **Lucas Johnson's** six career appearances have come strictly as a holder on place kicks.
- The most experienced quarterback on Tech's roster is Jordan, a junior who has appeared in 19 career games, primarily as three-year starter Justin Thomas' top backup the past two seasons.
- Jordan's only start came on Nov. 12 of last season at Virginia Tech. He led Georgia Tech to scores in 6-of-13 possessions (not including a kneel-down on the final play of the game) and an impressive 30-20 win over the 18th-ranked Hokies.
- Jordan ran for 121 yards and two touchdowns on 32 carries in the win at Virginia Tech (all career highs prev.: 72 yds. vs. Tulane, Sept. 12, 2015; 28 carries at Miami, Nov. 21, 2015; 2 TD vs. Mercer, Sept. 10, 2016).
- Despite only seeing limited action aside from the winning effort at Virginia Tech, Jordan has accounted for 11 touchdowns (nine rushing, two passing) in 19 career games.
- Jordan's six rushing touchdowns as a sophomore last season were tied for 16th in the ACC and were the most by any returner to Georgia Tech's roster in 2017.
- Johnson made his collegiate debut in the fourth quarter of Georgia Tech's 37-10 win over Jacksonville State on Sept. 9.
 He did not record any statistics.
- Another talented redshirt freshman, Jay Jones, made his collegiate debut in the fourth quarter of Tech's 35-17 win over Pittsburgh (Sept. 23). He ran twice for nine yards.

RUNNING BACKS

- In addition to Marshall at quarterback, Georgia Tech has another entry among the ACC and national rushing leaders in B-back **KirVonte Benson**.
- Benson ranks third in the ACC and 21st nationally with 105.5 rushing yards per game this season.
- In addition to ranking third in the ACC in rushing yards per game, Benson is fourth in the conference with a 5.63 yards-per-carry average.
- Like Marshall, Benson has made the first eight starts of his career this season. He did not have a collegiate carry prior to the 2017 campaign.

- Benson was one of the Yellow Jackets' few bright spots in a 24-10 loss at No. 7 Clemson on Oct. 28, as he ran for a game-high 129 yards on just 16 carries (8.1 avg.) and became the only player to rush for 100 yards against Clemson this season.
- In fact, only three other *teams* have rushed for as many yards against Clemson this season as Benson did alone (Syracuse 162, Wake Forest 133, NC State 153).
- Benson's 65-yard run that set up a Georgia Tech field goal in the first quarter at Clemson was the longest of his career (prev.: 63 vs. North Carolina, Sept. 30, 2017) and the longest allowed by Clemson this season (prev.: 45 by Syracuse's Eric Dungey, Oct. 13).
- Over the past five games, with Georgia Tech facing three
 of the nation's top six teams in terms of tackles for loss
 (Miami first; Wake Forest third; Clemson sixth), Benson
 has had just two negative carries (for minus-three yards
 total) in 66 attempts.
- Benson rushed for 196 yards and two touchdowns on 29 carries (all career highs) in Georgia Tech's 35-17 win over Pittsburgh (Sept. 23).
- Benson's 196 rushing yards against Pitt are tied for the 16th-most in Georgia Tech single-game history and are the most by a B-back in head coach **Paul Johnson's** 10 seasons as head coach (prev.: 195 - Anthony Allen vs. Virginia, Oct. 9, 2010).
- Benson torched Tennessee for 124 yards on 26 carries in the season opener, becoming the first Georgia Tech running back to rush for 100 yards in his first-career start since Marcus Marshall versus Pitt on Oct. 17, 2015 (159 yards on 10 carries).

- Against Jacksonville State (Sept. 9), Georgia Tech's leading rusher was true freshman B-back **Jerry Howard**, who ran for 82 yards on just six carries (13.7 avg.) in his collegiate debut.
- Howard's 65-yard touchdown run in the third quarter of the win over JSU (which came on the second carry of his career) was the longest by a Georgia Tech true freshman since Jonathan Dwyer also had a 65-yard touchdown run vs. Samford on Sept. 8, 2007.
- Howard is fourth on the team with 175 rushing yards this season and his 8.0 yards per carry lead the team among runners with more than one attempt.
- Coming into the season, the B-backs on the Yellow Jackets' roster had combined for just one career carry (a zero-yard tote by **Quaide Weimerskirch** on Sept. 10 of last season vs. Mercer).



- Weimerskirch's 19-yard touchdown run in the third quarter of Georgia Tech's win over Pitt (Sept. 23) was the longest rush of his career and his first-career touchdown.
- Weimerskirch had a career-high six carries at Miami (Oct. 14) after Benson left the game due to a lower-body injury.
- Conversely, A-back was the most experienced offensive position on Georgia Tech's roster coming into the season, as the Yellow Jackets' returned their top three performers from a year ago — senior J.J. Green and juniors Clinton Lynch and Qua Searcy.
- Searcy leads Georgia Tech's A-backs in rushing (194 yards) and receiving (95 yards) this season.
- Searcy's 7.2 yards per rush are good for third among all Yellow Jackets with at least two carries and his 31.7 yards per reception are tops on the team among players with at least one catch.
- Searcy's 289 all-purpose yards this season have come on just just 30 touches (27 carries, three receptions), good for 9.6 yards per touch.
- Searcy racked up 76 yards on just seven touches, including a career-best 42-yard reception that set up a touchdown and a 5.7-yard rushing average, in the season opener against Tennessee (Sept. 4).
- Against Wake Forest (Oct. 21), Searcy ran for a seasonhigh 57 yards on five carries, including his first touchdown of the season on a 42-yard run. His 11.4 yards-per-rush average was also a season high.
- Last Saturday at Virginia, Searcy hauled in the longest reception by a Georgia Tech A-back this season, a 34-yarder.
- Searcy's 91 rushing yards against Mercer on Sept. 10 of last season remain the most by a Georgia Tech A-back since Robert Godhigh ran for 126 yards in a 55-31 defeat at Clemson on Nov. 14, 2013.
- A threat to go the distance every time he touches the ball, Lynch ranks second on the team in yards per rush (7.8) and third on the squad in yards per reception (21.5) this season, good for an average of 8.3 yards per offensive touch (149 rushing yards on 20 carries, 43 receiving yards on three receptions).
- On Oct. 14 at Miami (Fla.), Lynch led Georgia Tech with 71 rushing yards on just five carries (14.2 avg.). In the process, he became the 47th student-athlete in program history and the 15th under head coach **Paul Johnson** to eclipse the 1,000-yard mark in career rushing.
- Lynch's 1,021 career rushing yards have come on just 105 carries, good for a gaudy 9.7-yard career average.
- Last season, Lynch led the Yellow Jackets in all-purpose yards (905) and receiving yards (490), ranked second on the team in touchdowns (8) and was the team's fourth-leading rusher (415 yards). His 905 all-purpose yards came on just 53 touches (37 carries, 16 receptions), good for a spectacular 17.1 yards per touch. He averaged 11.2 yards per rush and 30.6 yards per reception, both team highs (min. three rushes/receptions).
- Lynch led the ACC in both yards per rush (11.2) and yards of total offense per play (11.2) in 2016.
- Since the beginning of last season, 20 of Lynch's 76 touches have gone for 20 yards or more (10 rushes, 10

- receptions 27.0 percent) and eight of his 74 touches have gone for 40 yards or more (three rushes, five receptions 10.8 percent).
- Six of Lynch's eight touchdowns last season covered 40 yards or more.
- Lynch's' 83-yard touchdown reception at North Carolina on Nov. 5 of last season remains Georgia Tech's longest play from scrimmage since a 95-yard touchdown run by Orwin Smith vs. Kansas on Sept. 17, 2011, the sixth-longest reception in Georgia Tech history and the longest reception by a Yellow Jacket since Embry Peeples' 87-yard catch from Joshua Nesbitt at Vanderbilt on Oct. 31, 2009.
- Green has made the most of his 22 touches this season, averaging 7.6 yards per touch with three touchdowns (two receiving, one rushing).
- Green scored both of Georgia Tech's offensive touchdowns on Oct. 14 at Miami (Fla.) on a five-yard run and a threeyard reception.
- With two rushing touchdowns, two receiving touchdowns and a kickoff-return touchdown in his two seasons as a Yellow Jacket, Green is the first Georgia Tech student-athlete to score touchdowns via rush, reception and kickoff return since Drew Hill accomplished the feat from 1975-78 (two rushing TDs, eight receiving TDs, two kickoff return TDs).
- Rounding out the Yellow Jackets' four-man rotation at A-back is sophomore **Nathan Cottrell**. Cottrell has rushed 23 times for 145 yards (6.3 avg.) this season.
- In all, three of the Yellow Jackets' four primary A-backs are averaging at least 7.5 yards per offensive touch this season and all four are averaging at least six yards per offensive touch (Searcy 9.6, Lynch 8.3, Green 7.6 and Cottrell 6.3).

WIDE RECEIVERS

- Georgia Tech boasts a pair of veteran starting wide receivers in senior **Ricky Jeune** and junior **Brad Stewart**.
- Jeune, a fifth-year senior, has started 33-straight games for the Yellow Jackets, dating back to the beginning of the 2015 season.
- Jeune has been held without a catch only three times in his 33 career starts.
- Jeune's senior season is off to a stellar start, as he has caught 20 passes for 380 yards and four touchdowns through eight games.
- Jeune ranks second in the ACC and 21st nationally with 19.0 yards per reception this season.
- With four touchdowns this season, Jeune has matched his single-season career high of four, set as a sophomore in 2015.
- Jeune recorded the first multi-touchdown game of his career with touchdown receptions of 27 and 23 yards versus Jacksonville State on Sept. 9.
- Jeune's two-touchdown game versus Jacksonville State was the first by a Georgia Tech wide receiver in more than three years (DeAndre Smelter vs. Wofford, Aug. 30, 2014).
- Jeune's senior campaign got off to a strong start with two catches for 55 yards in the season opener against Tennessee (Sept. 4), including a 44-yarder that helped set up

- Georgia Tech's first touchdown of the season. The 44-yard catch was the third-longest of his career.
- Jeune picked up 30 rushing yards on the second carry of his career (a reverse) on Oct. 21 versus Wake Forest.
- The 30-yard rush actually lowered Jeune's career yardsper-rush average to 35.5. His first rush was a 40-yard gain at North Carolina on Nov. 5, 2016.
- Stewart has caught three passes for 39 yards over the first eight games of his junior campaign. Two of the three receptions came in the Sept. 4 season opener against Tennessee.
- Stewart was named to the 2016 College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-District Team for District 4, which consists of all Division I programs in Alabama, Florida, Georgia and South Carolina. In addition to his exploits on the field, Stewart boasts a 3.58 cumulative grade point average in mechanical engineering.
- Between them, Jeune and Stewart have accounted for 98 of the 114 receptions, 1,841 of the 2,134 receiving yards and 10 of the 12 touchdown catches amassed by Georgia Tech wide receivers since the beginning of the 2015 season.
- Redshirt freshman Jalen Camp, Georgia Tech's top reserve at wide receiver hauled in a 49-yard reception last Saturday at Virginia. Not only was it the first catch of Camp's career, it was also the longest reception by a Georgia Tech wideout since Stewart hauled in a 64-yard pass at Georgia on Nov. 26 of last season.

• Seven different offensive linemen boast starting experience for Georgia Tech. Those seven have combined for a total of 94 starts over 176 career games.

- Behind its offensive line, Georgia Tech leads the ACC and ranks third nationally in rushing offense this season (331.9 ypg).
- A Yellow Jacket has been named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week following three of Georgia Tech's last six games sophomore left guard **Parker Braun** (Sept. 23 vs. Pittsburgh), sophomore center **Kenny Cooper** (Sept. 30 vs. North Carolina) and senior right guard **Shamire Devine** (Oct. 21 vs. Wake Forest).
- Braun took 22 Pitt defenders to the ground and was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the second time in his first 11 career starts. Braun helped pave the way for the Yellow Jackets to run for 436 yards in the 35-17 win over Pitt, its most in an ACC game since it amassed 479 yards on the ground in a 56-23 win over NC State on Oct. 18, 2014.
- Cooper was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week one week after Braun claimed the award by taking 10 defenders to the ground and helping Georgia Tech run for 403 yards in its 33-7 win over North Carolina. The award came in Cooper's fifth-career start.



- Devine earned the first conference honor of his career after recording 10 knockdowns, most at the point of attack, while helping the Jackets rush for 427 yards in their 38-24 win over Wake Forest.
- Braun became the first Georgia Tech freshman to ever be named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week after compiling 10 knockdowns and paving the way for Tech's 309 rushing yards in the Yellow Jackets' 30-20 win at No. 18 Virginia Tech on Nov. 12 of last season.
- Braun established himself as one of the nation's top young linemen in 2016, which was validated by him being named to ESPN.com's true freshman all-America team.
- The Yellow Jackets benefit from the fact that three true freshmen were a part of the starting lineup at some point of last season. In addition to Braun starting the final eight games of the 2016 season at left guard, **Jahaziel Lee** made three starts at left tackle (Oct. 15 vs. GS, Oct. 29 vs. Duke, Nov. 12 at Virginia Tech) and Cooper started at center on Nov. 12 at Virginia Tech.
- Georgia Tech's offensive line paved the way for the Yellow Jackets to lead the ACC and finish ninth nationally in rushing offense last season. The Jackets' offensive front also ranked second in the ACC and 17th nationally in fewest sacks allowed (1.23 per game) in 2016.

DEFENSE

- Georgia Tech ranks third in the ACC and 28th nationally in total defense, allowing 333.5 yards per game.
- In all, the Yellow Jackets rank among the nation's top 30 in four different defensive statistical categories.

- Aided by an offense that ranks third nationally in time
 of possession and its own prowess in getting off the field,
 Georgia Tech's defense has limited opponents to an average
 of just 66.0 offensive plays per game this season, the 17thfewest faced by any defensive unit in the nation.
- Over the course of its last 12 games (the final four games of last season and their first eight games of this season), Georgia Tech has forced 20 turnovers that have led directly to 85 points (1.7 turnovers, 7.1 points off turnovers per game).
- By contrast, over the first nine games of last season, the Yellow Jackets forced nine turnovers that led to just 14 points (1.0 turnovers, 1.5 points off turnovers per game).
- Georgia Tech's defense has also put more pressure on the quarterback over the course of the last 12 games. During the past 12 contests, the Yellow Jackets have recorded 24 sacks (2.0 per game), including five against Jacksonville State on Sept. 9 and three versus Pittsburgh on Sept. 23 and at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14. Over the first nine games of last season, the Yellow Jackets had a total of just eight sacks (.89 per game) and did not record more than two in any game.

- Pittsburgh's 235 total yards on Sept. 23 were the fewest that Georgia Tech has allowed in an ACC game since Clemson managed just 190 yards in the Yellow Jackets' 28-6 victory on Nov. 15, 2014.
- Pitt's 37 rushing yards were the fewest surrendered by Tech in any game since Virginia ran for only 22 yards in the Jackets' 35-10 triumph on Nov. 1, 2014.

- Jacksonville State's 189 yards on Sept. 9 were the fewest that Georgia Tech has surrendered in a game since it limited North Carolina to just 154 yards in a 24-7 victory on Sept. 26, 2009.
- JSU's 73 passing yards were the fewest that Tech has allowed since Clemson threw for just 59 yards in the Jackets' 28-6 victory on Nov. 15, 2014.
- During its four wins this season, Georgia Tech's defense has been especially stout as it settles into the game.
 - Sept. 9 vs. Jacksonville State: JSU registered 90 yards over its first two possessions but recorded just 99 yards the rest of the game.
 - **Sept. 23 vs. Pittsburgh:** Pitt drove 78 yards for a touchdown on its opening series but managed just 157 yards the rest of the game.
 - **Sept. 30 vs. North Carolina:** UNC managed just 38 yards and committed two turnovers over its first five possessions of the second half.
 - Oct. 21 vs. Wake Forest: After rushing for 93 yards and scoring touchdowns on its final three possessions of the first half, Wake managed just 17 rushing yards and three points after the break.
- Conversely, Georgia Tech's defense started red-hot against Tennessee on Sept. 4, Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14 and Virginia last Saturday, but struggled down the stretch of each game.

DEFENSIVE LINE

- Despite losing a total of 60 career starts with the graduation of tackles Patrick Gamble and Francis Kallon and end Rod Rook-Chungong following the conclusion of last season, Georgia Tech still boasts a combined 79 career starts along its defensive line, thanks in large part to senior end KeShun Freeman (44 career starts).
- While Freeman draws a lot of attention at one defensive end position, the most production has been coming from the other end position, where junior **Anree Saint-Amour** and senior **Antonio Simmons** split snaps. The duo has combined for seven sacks, 11.5 tackles for loss and eight quarterback hurries through eight games.
- Simmons ranks seventh in the ACC and is tied for 59th nationally with .56 sacks per game (4.5 total) while Saint-Amour is tied for 32nd in the conference with .31 sacks per game (2.5 total).



DEFENSE

- Simmons is also tied for 34th in the ACC with .81 tackles for loss per game (6.5 total) while Saint-Amour ranks 49th in the ACC with .63 TFL/game (5.0 total).
- Simmons ranks third in the ACC and 45th nationally with .25 forced fumbles per game (two total).

- Between them, Georgia Tech's top three defensive ends have combined for 21 career sacks Saint-Amour 7.5; Freeman 7.0; Simmons 6.5.
- A four-year starter with 44 starts and 47 appearances under his belt, Freeman leads all Yellow Jackets with 19.5 career tackles for loss to go along with his seven career sacks.
- One of the team's unquestioned leaders, Freeman received one of college football's highest honors last year when he was one of 25 football student-athletes across the nation named to the 2016 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team in recognition of his exemplary service to the community.

LINEBACKERS

- Junior outside linebacker **Victor Alexander** leads Georgia Tech with 48 tackles this season.
- Alexander has started each of the last seven games (the first starts of his career) and has responded with seven tackles against Jacksonville State (Sept. 9), five against North Carolina (Sept. 30), five at Miami (Oct. 14), a teamhigh-tying six against Wake Forest (Oct. 21), 10 at Clemson (Oct. 28) and a team-high-tying and career-high 11 last Saturday at Virginia.
- Alexander recorded the first sack of his career against Wake Forest on Oct. 21 and it was a big one it came on fourth-and-four at the GT 34 yard line with the Yellow Jackets clinging to a 25-24 lead late in the third quarter.
- The biggest story as of late among the Yellow Jackets' linebacking crew has been true freshman middle linebacker **Bruce Jordan-Swilling**. Despite only having one start under his belt, Jordan-Swilling ranks fifth on the team with 30 tackles
- In his first-career start last Saturday at Virginia, Jordan-Swilling stuffed the stat sheet with a career-high and team-high-tying 11 tackles while achieving the "superfecta" of turnovers with the first forced fumble, fumble recovery, interception and defensive touchdown of his career.
- In the second quarter, Jordan-Swilling forced a fumble by Virginia's Olamide Zaccheaus then recovered it himself at UVA's 14 yard line, which set up a short touchdown drive that gave Georgia Tech a 14-6 lead.
- On Virginia's first offensive play of the second half, Jordan-Swilling intercepted a pass by UVA's Kurt Benkert and returned 27 yards for a touchdown that gave the Jackets a 28-13 lead.

- With an interception and touchdown in his first-career start, Jordan-Swilling earned bragging rights in his own home. His father, College Football Hall of Famer Pat Swilling, did not record an interception or a touchdown during his prolific four-year career at Georgia Tech from 1982-85.
- After starting MLB **Brant Mitchell** sustained a lowerbody injury at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14, Jordan-Swilling saw the most playing time of his career at middle linebacker. He responded with a team-high-tying seven tackles.
- Against Wake Forest on Oct. 21, Jordan-Swilling made perhaps the biggest tackle of the game, a fourth-and-one stop at the GT 21 yard line that preserved the Yellow Jackets' 31-24 lead with 3:44 remaining in the contest.
- Despite missing the vast majority of the last four games due to a lower-body injury sustained at Miami (Fla.) on Oct.
 14, Mitchell still ranks 10th on the team with 23 tackles.
- In his second year as a starter, Mitchell, a junior, is the Yellow Jackets' most experienced linebacker. He recorded 33 tackles and two interceptions over the final four games of the 2016 campaign (all Georgia Tech wins), giving him 56 stops over his past 10 contests (including his six games this season).
- Mitchell missed a game for the first time in his career when he sat out of the Jackets' win over Wake Forest (Oct. 21) due to a lower-body injury. He started but was re-injured in Tech's loss at Clemson (Oct. 28) and missed last Saturday's game at Virginia.
- **Terrell Lewis**, the only senior among Tech's linebacking corps, ranks 11th on the team with 19 tackles this season.
- Lewis led all tacklers with five in Georgia Tech's 35-17 victory over Pittsburgh (Sept. 23).
- Like Mitchell, Lewis missed last Saturday's game at Virginia due to injury.
- Linebacker is one of two positions where the Yellow Jackets have two true freshmen listed on the two-deep Jordan-Swilling and **T.D. Roof** (listed as top backups to Mitchell and Alexander, respectively).
- On Sept. 9 against Jacksonville State, Roof (the son of Georgia Tech defensive coordinator **Ted Roof**) notched the first two sacks of his career in the second half of the Yellow Jackets' 37-10 victory.
- With his two sacks against JSU, Roof remains third on the team and tied for 35th in the ACC at .29 sacks per game.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

- On defense, Georgia Tech's most experienced position group is in the secondary, where the Jackets returned all five starters from last season Sr. SS Corey Griffin, Jr. FS A.J. Gray, Sr. CB Lance Austin, Sr. CB Step Durham and Sr. NIC Lawrence Austin.
- The five starters in the secondary have combined for 112 career starts.
- Through eight games this season, the group has combined for 156 tackles, five interceptions and 19 pass breakups.
- All five rank among Georgia Tech's top eight tacklers this season — Lawrence Austin (t-second - 36), Griffin (t-second - 36), Gray (fourth - 35), Durham (seventh - 25) and Lan.
 Austin (eighth - 24).

- Gray set a career high with 10 tackles in Georgia Tech's 24-10 loss at No. 7 Clemson on Oct. 28 (prev.: 9 twice) but missed last Saturday's game at Virginia due to a lower-body injury.
- Gray became the latest Yellow Jacket to be honored as ACC Defensive Back of the Week when he received the award following Georgia Tech's 33-7 win over North Carolina (Sept. 30). Gray, who had one career interception going into the game, picked off two passes en route to earning the recognition.
- Yellow Jackets have been named the ACC Defensive Back of the Week following four of Georgia Tech's last 10 regular-season games.

- Tech picked up its first blocked kick of the season last Saturday when senior defensive end **Antonio Simmons** blocked a punt in the second quarter of an eventual 40-36 loss to Virginia.
- The Yellow Jackets blocked four kicks last season, which was tied for 13th nationally.
- Georgia Tech is one of only six FBS programs without anyone on their roster who attempted a field goal or a punt at the collegiate level prior to this season, joining Arizona State, Hawaii, Troy, UAB and Virginia (research courtesy of the University of Virginia).
- In the punting game, Georgia Tech's inexperience has not been evident, as true freshman and Ray Guy Award candidate **Pressley Harvin III** has compiled a 43.7-yard average over the first eight games of his career.
- Harvin's 43.7-yard average is good for 26th overall and is tops among all FBS true freshmen.
- Harvin's 43.7-yard average currently ranks sixth in Georgia Tech single season history.
- Harvin is also challenging the Yellow Jackets' freshman record of 43.8 yards per punt (Dan Dyke, 1999).

- 0f Harvin's 39 punts, 11 have traveled 50-plus yards (28.2 percent), 15 have been downed inside the 20 yard line (38.5 pct.), 13 have been fair-caught (33.3 pct.) and 25 have not been returned (64.1 pct.).
- Making Harvin's freshman campaign even more impressive is that two of his best performances have come in less-than-ideal conditions for punting he recorded career-bests with a 62-yard punt and four kicks downed inside the 20 yard line at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14 and had five punts that traveled 50 yards or more and three downed inside the 20

- at Clemson on Oct. 28. The majority of both games were played during heavy rain storms.
- Harvin boomed a 56-yard punt on his first collegiate kick versus Tennessee on Sept. 4.
- Harvin was added to the official watch list for the 2017 Ray Guy Award (presented to the nation's top punter) on Oct. 30.
- Georgia Tech's place-kicking duties are also being handled by a true freshman, as **Brenton King** has become Tech's starting place kicker following a season-ending knee injury sustained by sophomore **Shawn Davis** on a kickoff at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14.
- King is a perfect 5-for-5 on field-goal attempts in his short career, including 8-for-8 on PATs in three-and-a-half games since Davis' season-ending injury.
- Davis had rebounded from a pair of misses in the season opener against Tennessee to split the uprights on the last two attempts of his injury-shortened campaign a 34-yarder versus Jacksonville State (Sept. 9) and a 21-yarder against North Carolina (Sept. 30).
- Georgia Tech scored its first special-teams touchdown
 of the season at Miami (Fla.) on Oct. 14 when Lamont
 Simmons returned Miami's botched onside-kick attempt to
 open the second half 42 yards for a score.
- Simmons' kick return touchdown at Miami was Georgia Tech's second in just over a calendar year. On Oct. 8 of last season at Pittsburgh, **J.J. Green** returned a kickoff 96 yards for a touchdown. It was Georgia Tech's first kickoff return for a touchdown since Jamal Golden's 100-yarder versus North Carolina on Nov. 10, 2012 and was the eighthlongest kick return in program history.

- Overall, Georgia Tech's 2017 schedule is the 12th-toughest in the nation based on its full slate of opponents' cumulative record (44-30 .595).
- Of the three teams remaining on Georgia Tech's regularseason schedule, two are ranked among the nation's top 20 in this week's Associated Press poll — No. 2 Georgia (Nov. 25) and No. 17 Virginia Tech (Saturday).
- Additionally, the Yellow Jackets have squared off with teams currently ranked in the AP top 10 twice in their past four games — No. 9 Miami (Oct. 14) and No. 6 Clemson (Oct. 28).
- Georgia Tech is one of only 28 FBS programs with nine opponents on its 2017 schedule that played in a bowl game in 2016 (research courtesy of Utah State University).
- In all, 10 of the Yellow Jackets' 12 opponents in 2017 advanced to the postseason in 2016. In addition to the nine 2016 bowl teams on the Jackets' '17 schedule (Tennessee, UCF, Pitt, North Carolina, Miami, Wake Forest, Clemson, Virginia Tech and Georgia), Jacksonville State advanced to the 2016 NCAA Division I FCS playoffs and finished 10-2.
- Georgia Tech leads the nation in fewest penalties (3.67) and fewest penalty yards per game (30.67) this season.
- Tech was also one of the nation's least-penalized teams in 2016, finishing 11th nationally in both fewest penalties per game (4.38) and fewest penalty yards per game (38.62).
- Of the 480 minutes that Georgia Tech has played in regulation this season, it has only trailed for 113:31, including just 44:01 of the 240 minutes played after halftime.
