GAME PREVIEW

Carolina plays its second ACC road game of 2017 Saturday when the Tar Heels visit Lane Stadium to take on No. 14 Virginia Tech at 3:30 p.m. on ESPN2.

UNC fell to 1-6 on the year with a 20-14 loss to Virginia last weekend in Chapel Hill. Michael Carter rushed for a career-best 157 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Tar Heels, who had their seven-game winning streak against Virginia snapped in the loss.

Virginia Tech was off last weekend, but the Hokies have risen to No. 14 in both national polls. In its last on-field action, VT beat Boston College 23-10 in Chestnut Hill to improve to 5-1 and 1-1 in league play. Freshman quarterback Josh Jackson threw for 322 yards and a score against the Eagles.

CAROLINA-VIRGINIA TECH SERIES NOTES

- Carolina and Virginia Tech are meeting for the 40th time overall and 14th straight season since the Hokies joined the ACC. Virginia Tech leads the overall series, 21-12-6. Five of the six ties were scoreless. The last tie was a 14-14 score in 1946.
- Four of the last nine meetings have been decided by a field goal. Five of the last 10 have been decided by a touchdown or less.
- Last season in Chapel Hill, Jarod Evans threw for two touchdowns and ran for a third as Virginia Tech won a top-25 showdown 34-3.
- In the last meeting in Blacksburg, Carolina won 30-27 in overtime to clinch the ACC Coastal Division. The Tar Heels led 24-10 in the fourth quarter before Virginia Tech mounted a tremendous comeback to tie it in Frank Beamer's last home game. After a Virginia Tech field goal in overtime, quarterback Marquise Williams found Quinshad Davis in the corner of the end zone for the winning score.
- Carolina has not won consecutive games over Virginia Tech since winning five straight from 1929 to 1945.
- Carolina and Virginia Tech met at least twice in every decade from the 1890s to the 1940s. The teams met 25 times from 1890-1946 and 14 of those times at least one team did not score.
- Tar Heel great and College Football Hall of Fame member Charlie "Choo-Choo" Justice made his collegiate debut against Virginia Tech in a 14-14 tie on September 28, 1946, in Kenan Stadium.
- Eight current Tar Heels are from Virginia: defensive end Malik Carney (Alexandria), defensive tackle Jeremiah Clarke (Alexandria), defensive tackle Aaron Crawford (Ashburn), offensive lineman Jay-Jay McCargo (Alexandria), wide receiver Dazz Newsome (Hampton), defensive end Tyler Powell (Midlothian), cornerback Patrice Rene (Alexandria) and cornerback M.J. Stewart (Arlington).

QUICK HITS

- 🏈 Carolina has won 10 of its last 12 true road games dating to 2014 - wins at Georgia Tech, Pittsburgh, Virginia Tech, Florida State, NC State, Illinois, Florida State, Miami, Virginia and Old Dominion.
- 🏈 UNC scored six rushing touchdowns against ODU, matching the most rushing scores for the Tar Heels under Larry Fedora. Sophomore TB Jordan Brown had a career-high 123 rushing yards and two TDs to lead the attack.
- 🏈 Sophomore Anthony Ratliff-Williams set a school record with 199 kickoff return yards on five returns against Louisville. The previous record was 184 yards (eight returns) by Marcus Wall vs. Clemson in 1994. Ratliff-Williams had a 94-yard kickoff return for a touchdown, his first career touchdown, in the third quarter. He was named ACC Specialist of the Week for his efforts.
- 🏈 Chazz Surratt completed 12 of 14 passes for 168 yards and two touchdowns against Louisville to earn ACC Rookie of the Week honors. Making his third straight start against Duke, Surratt finished 17 of 32 for 259 yards and a touchdown. He also ran for a 56-yard touchdown, the longest by a Carolina QB in 14 years. The redshirt freshman is third nationally among first-year players in both passing and total offense and is responsible for 10 touchdowns through six games.
- 🏈 Tom Sheldon averaged 53.5 yards on four punts against Louisville. He hit a career-long 66-yarder in the second quarter and three of his four punts were downed inside the UL 20. He was named Ray Guy Award National Punter of the week for his efforts. Sheldon ranks sixth nationally in punt average (46.4 yards per punt).
- 🏈 Senior Austin Proehl set career highs with eight catches and 120 receiving yards against Louisville. His previous highs were seven catches vs. Stanford in the 2016 Sun Bowl and seven vs. Pitt last year. His previous high in receiving yards was 99 vs. Pitt.
- 🏈 Carolina has averaged more than 170 rushing yards per game over the last five seasons. That is the highest five-year average since the Mack Brown era in the 1990s. The Tar Heels rushed for 219 yards in the opener against Cal, 252 in the win at ODU and 211 against Virginia.
- 🏈 Fedora guided the Tar Heels to 40 wins in his first five seasons at the helm. Only Dick Crum won more games (42) in his first five seasons in Chapel Hill since the ACC began in 1953.
- 🏈 Fedora sports a 25-13 mark at Kenan Stadium during his career in Chapel Hill. His 25 home wins in his first five seasons were the most by any UNC coach in his first five seasons.
- 🏈 Fedora-coached teams have been responsible for five of the top 10 offensive seasons in UNC history.
- 🏈 Carolina has established more than 100 school single-season and career offensive records since 2012. In 2016, the Tar Heels established 36 individual records and six team records.
- 🏈 UNC ranked second in the ACC and eighth in the country with six players selected in the 2017 NFL Draft, led by No. 2 overall pick Mitch Trubisky. Trubisky is the fourth first-round pick under Fedora at UNC.

VIRGINIA POSTGAME NOTES

- Freshman TB Michael Carter rushed for a career-high 157 yards on 13 carries and scored two touchdowns. Carter is the first UNC freshman to rush for over 100 yards since T.J. Logan gained 137 vs. Old Dominion in 2013.
- Carter's 157 yards are the most rushing yards by a Tar Heel since Elijah Hood had 168 vs. Georgia Tech in 2016. It's the most rushing yards by a UNC freshman since Gio Bernard gained 165 vs. Duke in 2011.
- Carter's 56-yard run early in the third quarter equaled the longest run by a Tar Heel in 2017, matching quarterback Chazz Surratt's touchdown run against Duke.
- Carter leads the team in rushing touchdowns (7) and scoring (42).
- CB M.J. Stewart made his seventh and eighth pass breakups of the season. The senior has 37 career PBUs to move past Michael Waddell (2000-04) for sole possession of second place in school history. Stewart is three shy of the school record of 40 by Robert Williams (1995-97).
- DE Tomon Fox is the first Tar Heel to register two sacks in a game since Mikey Bart finished with 2.5 sacks against Virginia Tech in 2015.
- LB Cole Holcomb made a career-high 14 tackles, giving him double figures in tackles for the fourth game in a row. He had 13 stops against Duke, 12 at Georgia Tech and 11 vs. Notre Dame. Holcomb leads the team with 68 tackles through seven games.
- LB Cayson Collins had 12 tackles, his third-straight game in double figures. Collins has 39 tackles over the last three weeks.
- Carolina passed for 46 yards, its fewest since throwing for 42 yards against Maryland in 2000.
- The Tar Heels rushed for 211 yards, the third time this year UNC has gained at least 200 yards on the ground (252 vs. ODU and 219 vs. Cal).
- Carolina is now 64-54-4 against Virginia. This was UVA's first win in the series since 2009.

NOTRE DAME POSTGAME NOTES

- S Myles Dorn hauled in his first career interception late in the second quarter. Four different Tar Heels - Dorn, Donnie Miles, Andre Smith and Myles Wolfolk - have picked off a pass this season.
- Dorn also had a second INT in the third quarter, marking the first time Notre Dame failed to score inside the red zone this season. The Irish had been a perfect 24-for-24 before the interception.
- Dorn is the first Tar Heel to record two interceptions in the same game since Malik Simmons against Virginia in 2015.
- WR Anthony Ratliff-Williams hauled in his second TD reception of the season with 1:50 remaining in the second half. The sophomore wide receiver finished the game with a team-high 55 yards and five receptions.
- LB Cole Holcomb finished with 11 tackles, giving him double figures in tackles for the third game in a row. He had 13 stops against Duke and 12 last week at Georgia Tech. Holcomb leads the team with 54 tackles through six games.
- LB Cayson Collins established a new career high with 15 tackles, breaking his personal best set last week with 12 stops (all solo) at Georgia Tech.
- Tom Sheldon had three punts for a sparkling 53.0-yard average, before leaving the game with an injury. Hunter Lent took over and averaged 46.2 yards on six punts, including a long of 60 midway through the third quarter.
- CB M.J. Stewart made his sixth pass breakup of the season.
- QB Chazz Surratt completed 19 of 42 passes for 179 yards and a touchdown. The 42 pass attempts are a season high for Surratt.

GEORGIA TECH POSTGAME NOTES

- The loss was just the second for Carolina in its last 12 true road games.
- The Tar Heels were held scoreless in the first half for the first time since the 2014 Quick Lane Bowl against Rutgers.
- TB Jordan Brown led the Tar Heels in both rushing and receiving on the day. The sophomore rushed for 41 yards and a touchdown and added nine catches for a career-best 57 receiving yards.

- LB Cayson Collins established a new career high with 12 tackles, all of which were solo stops. He also added his first career solo sack. In the last three meetings with Georgia Tech, Collins has 31 total tackles.
- LB Cole Holcomb finished with 12 tackles (nine solo) as well as a tackle for loss and a fumble recovery. He leads the team with 43 stops through five games.
- The Tar Heels matched their season high with three sacks on the day, including the first career sack for redshirt freshman DE Tyrone Hopper.
- M.J. Stewart had his fifth pass breakup of the season in the first half.

DUKE POSTGAME NOTES

- Chazz Surratt passed for 259 yards for the second consecutive week and added a season-high 77 yards on the ground. He rushed a season-high 17 times (three were sacks). He was 17 of 32 passing – the 32 attempts are a season high.
- Surratt’s 56-yard touchdown run in the third quarter is the longest by a Tar Heel quarterback since Darian Durant had a 63-yard TD run at Clemson on Oct. 25, 2003.
- Surratt gained 204 of his 336 total yards in the second half.
- Austin Proehl hauled in a 47-yard reception in the first quarter, his longest catch since going for 61 yards against Wake Forest as a sophomore in 2015. Proehl was injured during the game and did not play in the second half.
- Wide receiver Anthony Ratliff-Williams had 212 all-purpose yards, including a career-high 125 receiving yards on five catches, also a career high (he had five catches in the first three games and eight career receptions entering today). He also returned four kickoffs for 87 yards.
- Ratliff-Williams made two catches totaling 80 yards in the final drive of the first half that resulted in the sophomore grabbing his first career touchdown reception, a 45-yarder from Surratt with nine seconds to play before halftime.
- Carolina blocked a field goal for the second consecutive game. Last week, Tyler Powell blocked one at Old Dominion. Saturday, it was Jason Strowbridge with the block.
- Carolina rushed for 118 yards. The Blue Devils entered the game leading the country allowing 47.7 rushing yards per game.
- Cole Holcomb tied his career high with a game-high 13 tackles. He also had 13 at Florida State in 2016.
- Myles Dorn had a career-high 11 tackles.
- M.J. Stewart had a sack (his second of the season), a hurry and three pass breakups.

ODU POSTGAME NOTES

- Carolina picked up its first win of season on the road at Old Dominion. The Tar Heels have won their last three road openers (vs. Georgia Tech in 2015, vs. Illinois in 2016).
- The Tar Heels have now won 10 of their last 11 true road games dating back to the 2014 season.
- UNC has scored 30 or more points in 46 of Larry Fedora’s 68 games as head coach and 40 or more in 27 of those games. Saturday was the 11th time under Fedora that Carolina has reached the 50-point mark.
- TB Jordon Brown rushed 18 times for 123 yards and two touchdowns in Saturday’s win. The 123 yards was a career high for Brown, who also had his first career multi-touchdown performance.
- TB Michael Carter had 67 rushing yards on 13 carries and two scores. In three career games, the true freshman has five rushing TDs.
- QB Chazz Surratt made his second career start and completed 16 of 24 passes for 257 yards and a touchdown. The redshirt freshman also rushed for a pair of touchdowns. For the season, Surratt is responsible for seven touchdowns (four passing, three rushing).
- As a team, Carolina rushed for six touchdowns, the most since scoring six times on the ground against Miami in 2015. The six rushing scores tie the most for Carolina under Larry Fedora.
- QB/H Manny Miles scored on a two-point conversion in the second quarter.

- TE Carl Tucker caught three balls for a career-high 79 yards.
- WR Jordan Cunningham had four catches for 77 yards, his top totals in two years at UNC.
- The Carolina defense had eight tackles for loss, two sacks and eight QB hurries on the night. For the season, UNC has 21 TFLs and 18 hurries.
- DB Myles Wolfolk, playing in his first career game, recorded his first career interception.

RECORD-SETTING DAY FOR RATLIFF-WILLIAMS

- Sophomore WR/KR Anthony Ratliff-Williams set a school record vs. Louisville with 199 kickoff return yards on five returns.
- The previous record was 184 yards (eight returns) by Marcus Wall vs. Clemson in 1994.
- Ratliff-Williams had a 94-yard kickoff return for a touchdown, his first career touchdown, in the third quarter. He also had returns of 39 yards, 18 yards, 24 yards and 24 yards on the day.
- Ratliff-Williams finished the game with 240 all-purpose yards (199 KOR, 41 receiving), the most by a Tar Heel since T.J. Logan had 253 (80 rush, 3 receiving, 170 KOR) last year against Georgia.

LOUISVILLE POSTGAME NOTES

- Carolina quarterbacks Chazz Surratt and Brandon Harris combined to complete 29 of 38 passes for 384 yards and one touchdown. Harris’s first TD pass as a Tar Heel was a 22-yard strike to Thomas Jackson at 3:41 of the third quarter.
- Surratt was 12 of 14 for 168 yards and two scores; Harris was 17 of 23 for 216 yards and his first passing touchdown as a Tar Heel.
- The teams combined for 54 completions in 77 pass attempts (70.1 percent). The teams passed for 777 yards and six touchdowns.
- Ratliff-Williams’ 94-yard kickoff return was Carolina’s first for a touchdown since T.J. Logan had a 100-yard return against The Citadel in 2016.
- Freshman WR Dazz Newsome had a 54-yard catch on his first collegiate snap. Carolina scored three plays later on a 1-yard touchdown pass from Surratt to TE Brandon Fritts.
- Fritts caught two touchdown passes in the first half. This was the second multiple TD game of his career, the first since the North Carolina A&T game in 2015 when he grabbed one each from high school teammate Mitch Trubisky and Marquis Williams.

- An eight-yard punt return by Louisville early in the third quarter was the longest allowed by Carolina in the last two seasons. Last season, the longest given up the Tar Heels was three yards.
- Carolina had two quarterbacks throw for a touchdown in the same game for the first time since Mitch Trubisky and Marquise Williams tossed scores in a 45-34 win at NC State in 2015.
- Senior WR Austin Proehl set career highs with eight catches and 120 receiving yards. His previous highs were seven catches vs. Stanford in the 2016 Sun Bowl and seven vs. Pitt last year. His previous high in receiving yards was 99 vs. Pitt.
- Punter Tom Sheldon averaged 53.5 yards on four punts. He hit a career-long 66-yarder in the second quarter.
- Louisville quarterback Lamar Jackson accounted for 525 total yards of offense, the most ever against North Carolina. The previous mark was 479 by Andrew Walter of Arizona State in 2002.

CAL POSTGAME NOTES

- North Carolina started graduate transfer Brandon Harris at quarterback. The former LSU signal caller led the first two drives before redshirt freshman Chazz Surratt made his Tar Heel debut on the third drive of the game.
- Surratt completed 18 of 28 passes for 161 yards and one score and rushed 16 times for 66 yards and a touchdown. Surratt’s 161 passing yards are the most by a player in his first game as a Tar Heel since T.J. Yates threw for 218 yards against James Madison in his college debut in 2007.
- True freshman tailback Michael Carter scored Carolina’s first touchdown of the season, a 2-yard plunge with 3:33 remaining in the first quarter. He gained 57 yards on three carries on the drive, including a 47-yard scamper down the sidelines.
- Carter finished with two touchdowns and ran for 94 yards on 11 carries in his collegiate debut.
- Place-kicker Freeman Jones converted his first career field goal attempt, a 39-yarder, with 8:21 left in the second quarter.
- Senior safety Donnie Miles made his first career interception midway through the second quarter. It took until week 11 of last season for the Tar Heels to register an interception that came against The Citadel on Nov. 19, 2016.
- Andre Smith’s 73-yard interception in the third quarter was the second of his career for the junior linebacker. Carolina had two INTs Saturday, doubling last year’s season total.
- The following players saw action in their first college games or first games as a Tar Heel –quarterback Brandon Harris (transfer from LSU), center Cam Dillard (transfer from Florida), OL Khaliel Rodgers (transfer from USC), redshirt freshmen QB Chazz Surratt and WR Roscoe Johnson, and true freshmen LB Malik Robinson, RB Michael Carter and CB Tre Shaw.

RECORD-BREAKING OFFENSE

- Head coach Larry Fedora has coached the two most prolific offenses in UNC history. The 2015 team set school marks for most points (570), points per game (40.7) and touchdowns (73). The previous highs of 487 points and 62 touchdowns were set in 2012, Fedora’s first season in Chapel Hill.
- Carolina averaged a school-record 486.9 yards on offense in 2015, which topped the 2012 mark of 485.6. Last season, UNC averaged more than 425 yards per game for the fifth straight season under Fedora. This marks the

first time Carolina has averaged more than 400 yards per game in five straight years.

- Carolina has posted more than 500 yards of total offense 19 times in 68 games under Larry Fedora, including a school-record 721 yards vs. ODU in 2013 and 704 (third-best at UNC) vs. Duke in 2015. UNC has gained at least 400 yards in 52 of Fedora’s 68 games as head coach.

JORDAN BRAND EXTENDS

PARTNERSHIP TO FOOTBALL

Jordan Brand and the University of North Carolina, two brands with a history of greatness, agreed to expand their partnership to make UNC the second collegiate football program to represent the Jumpman on the gridiron.

The Tar Heels’ successful and storied basketball history spans generations and includes numerous memorable moments like Michael Jordan hitting the game-winning shot for UNC in the 1982 National Championship game.

Now a new chapter in this celebrated partnership begins, as Jordan joined UNC head football coach Larry Fedora at halftime of the Carolina-Duke men’s basketball game on March 4 to officially announce plans to bring the Jumpman to Kenan Memorial Stadium this fall.

“I’m happy to extend the Jordan Brand relationship not only for the game of basketball but for the game of football,” says Jordan. “I am extremely proud in terms of what Coach Fedora has done for the football team and I think bigger and better things are about to happen.”

“We’re excited to partner with Michael Jordan – the greatest athlete of all-time – to bring the Jumpman into the Carolina football program,” says Fedora. “Michael’s impact on the University of North Carolina and the sports landscape in this state is incredible. Our partnership will bring us a greater association with MJ and his brand on the football field moving forward.”

The new look was officially unveiled at Meet The Heels on Aug. 5 and debuted on Sept. 2.
