This will be the 15th meeting on the gridiron between @RFootball and @VT\_Football, with the Hokies leading 11-3. #RUTGvsVT

Virginia Tech and Rutgers played 12 times as members of the Big East with the #Hokies winning the last 11 contests.

This will be the #Hokies' 20th straight bowl but its first in the @RussellAthBowl.

Tight end Ryan Malleck is the lone player for @VT\_Football who is from the state of New Jersey.



# THE SERIES

• Virginia Tech and Rutgers University will be meeting for the 15th time in football when they meet in the Russell Athletic Bowl.

• The Hokies lead the series, which began in 1920, 11-3 but the two haven't met since 2003 - Tech's last season in the Big East.

• Rutgers won the first three games in the series, coming in 1920, 1953 and 1992, but the Hokies have won the last 11 games between the two. From 1992-2003, the two were members of the Big East Conference together with the Hokies winning 11 of 12 conference games.

• In 12 conference games, Tech averaged 46.7 points against the Scarlet Knights while, giving up an average of just 19.9 points per game.

# BOWL BITS

• Thirteen players who started against Michigan last season in the Sugar Bowl are on this year's roster with 10 of them projected to

or who could start against Rutgers. Five players who started against Stanford two seasons ago in the Orange Bowl are still on the roster with four of them projected to or who could start against Rutgers. Only one player (Dyrell Roberts) who started against Tennessee three seasons ago in the Chick-fil-A Bowl is on this year's roster.

• If either start, it will be the third bowl start for junior linebacker Jack Tyler and/or senior receiver Marcus Davis.

• Tech is 1-1 all-time in games played at the Citrus Bowl Stadium, losing to Florida State 33-20 in 1991 and beating UCF 44-21 in 2000 ... Tech is 149-128-19 all-time in neutral site games ... Tech is 10-12 all-time in games played in December and 18-14-1 in games played on a Friday ... Tech is 18-33 all-time in football games played in the state of Florida ... Tech has never played a football game on Dec. 28.

# COUNTDOWN TO KICKOFF

- 10 Virginia Tech will be making its **10th** visit to the state of Florida for a bowl game (5 Gator Bowls; 4 Orange Bowls).
- 9 Nine defensive starters from Tech's 2012 Sugar Bowl game are on the Hokies' roster for the Russell Athletic Bowl.
- 8 The Hokies rank **eighth** nationally in third-down efficiency defense at 29.8 percent (54-181).
- 7 Tech averages 7.25 tackles for loss per game, which ranks 14th nationally among FBS teams.
- 6 Sophomore Kyshoen Jarrett is **sixth** nationally in punt returns with an average of 13.89 yards per return.
- 5 Quarterback Logan Thomas currently stands fifth all-time in passing yards at Tech with 5,903.

# COACH FRANK BEAMER

**Frank Beamer** (Virginia Tech '69), whose Virginia Tech teams have posted a 191-64 record over the past 20 seasons and have appeared in bowl games each year in that span, is in his 26<sup>th</sup> year as the head football coach at Tech and 32<sup>nd</sup> overall. Beamer has guided the Hokies to a 215-104-2 record and sits with an overall record of 257-127-4.

Under Beamer, Tech football has enjoyed unprecedented success with 20 consecutive bowl appearances, four ACC titles, five ACC Coastal Division crowns, three BIG EAST Conference titles, two "major" bowl victories, six BCS appearances and a trip to the national championship game.

Tech won the BIG EAST title in 1995 and 1999, and shared it in '96. Beamer was voted BIG EAST Coach of the Year by the league's coaches each of those seasons and was tabbed the ACC Coach of the Year in both 2004 and 2005.

In 1997, he was inducted into the Virginia Tech Sports Hall of Fame and following the 1999 season, he earned eight national coach of the year honors. Beamer returned to his alma mater in December of 1986 after a six-year stint as the head coach at Murray State University, where he compiled a 42-23-2 mark.

During his undergraduate days at Tech, Beamer started three years as a cornerback and played on the Hokies' 1966 and 1968 Liberty Bowl teams. The 66-year-old Hillsville, Va., native began his collegiate coaching career as a graduate assistant at Maryland in 1972. He held assistant coaching positions at The Citadel and Murray State before being named MSU's head coach in 1981.

He is married to the former Cheryl Oakley of Richmond, Va. They have two children, Shane, a former member of his dad's football team at Virginia Tech and now the associate head coach/running backs coach at Virginia Tech; and daughter Casey, a 2003 graduate of Tech. He has two grandchildren, Sutton and Olivia, daughters of Shane and his wife, Emily.

Beamer was born in Mt. Airy, N.C., and grew up in Hillsville, Va. At Hillsville High, he earned 11 varsity letters as a three-sport athlete in football, basketball and baseball.

Beamer, who is the winningest active coach in the Football Bowl Subdivision with 257 victories, had his No. 25 jersey retired by Tech in a pregame ceremony before the Marshall game in 2002. He is tied for sixth alltime among FBS coaches (min. 10 seasons at FBS school) in terms of all-time victories.

## **STABILITY AT THE TOP**

• Frank Beamer, the first Tech alumnus to guide Virginia Tech's football program since the 1940s, has coached and won more football games at Tech than any other head coach.

• Not one of the 124 active Division I-A (FBS) head football coaches has been at his current school *consecutively* longer than Beamer (Nevada's Chris Ault is in his 28th season, but not consecutively).

# WHAT'S A HOKIE?

That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body. Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today.

Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Following is the "Old Hokie" yell in its original form:

# JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its named to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.



### THOMAS THE TANK

• Quarterback **Logan Thomas** may be the tallest starting signal caller in school history, but he certainly had some shoes to fill in replacing four-year starter and 2010 ACC Player of the Year Tyrod Taylor last season. All Taylor did in four years was lead Tech to three ACC titles, set a school record for wins by a quarterback (34), as well as marks in total offense, passing yards and many more.

• Thomas showed last year he was more than up for the task, breaking Taylor's school record for total offense in a season with 3,482 yards. He also became just the second quarterback in school history to pass for over 3,000 yards in a season and tied the school mark for rushing touchdowns in a season by a quarterback with 11. He has followed that up with nine more rushing scores this year.

• He needs 217 yards passing against Rutgers to to become the first Hokie to register two 3,000-yard passing seasons. • The redshirt junior, who earned secondteam All-ACC honors last year, was recruited as a tight end, but was moved to quarterback just before his first preseason camp and began the process of being groomed for the position.

• Thomas was a standout basketball player at Brookville High and received scholarship offers to play basketball at JMU, Duquesne, Liberty, Akron, Richmond and Tulane but he decided to focus on football. He's also an avid golfer who likes to hit the links whenever he has free time.

• He completed 23 of 25 passes for 310 yards and three scores along with two rushing scores to lead the Hokies back to the win over Miami last year. His completion percentage of 92 percent in that game is a single-game record under head coach Frank Beamer (min. 20 attempts).

• Thomas also ran 29 times in Tech's win over Virginia this year, tying the school record for rushing attempts in a game by a quarterback

which was set by Bob Schweickert against Richmond in 1963.

• For his career, he has thrown for 5,903 yards and 36 touchdowns, completing 55.9 percent of his passes, and has rushed for 20 more touchdowns. He graduated in December with a degree in human development.

## NEW FACES IN THE BACKFIELD

• While the Tech offense lost Ryan Williams and Darren Evans (2010) and David Wilson (2011) to the NFL over the past two years, the Hokies still boast a talented arsenal under running backs coach **Shane Beamer**.

• True freshman J.C. Coleman, at only 5-8, entered Tech in January after graduating early and reaped the benefits of a spring practice. He took over as Tech's starting tailback midway through the season and leads the tailbacks with 486 yards rushing and has two rushing scores. He also has 16 receptions for 93 yards and a score and averages 21.8 yards per kick return.

• **Tony Gregory** is perhaps the fastest of all the backs when heatlhy, but he is returning after having a second surgery to repair an ACL injury. He has 62 carries for 298 yards and a touchdown this year, but has seen his role increase of late, leading Tech in rushing at Boston College with a career-high 69 yards on 14 carries.

• Martin Scales, who can play tailback or fullback, brings a bruising running style to the position and could see action in short-yardage situations. He came up big late in the game and in overtime in Tech's win at Boston College, picking up several tough yards to help propel Tech to the victory.

• Michael Holmes is a redshirt freshman who coaches believe has a bright future for the Hokies. After redshirting last year, the Harrisonburg, Va., product put together a good spring session and preseason to earn the starting nod early on. He has 69 carries for 282 yards and four touchdowns this year.

• The Tech football team eats its meals in order of grade-point average range. ## THE LEADER OF THE D-LINE

• Junior defensive end **James Gayle** had a breakout season at his defensive end position last year, earning All-ACC honors. He had 38 tackles, including 12.5 tackles for loss and seven sacks, along with 20 quarterback hurries last year. This year, he has 40 tackles, including 10.0 for loss and five sacks, earning secondteam All-ACC honors for the second year in a row.

• A physical monster, the 260-pound Hampton, Va., product posted a position-

record 39.5-inch vertical and a 4.44 40-time this past offseason.

• Gayle didn't seriously take up the sport of football until his sophomore year at Bethel High in Hampton. And he didn't play that season because of a hamstring injury.

• But his late start hasn't hurt because of the good genes passed down to him. Gayle's dad, Jimmy, played running back at Ohio State from 1979-82, and was named the 1981 Liberty Bowl most outstanding player.

• His uncle, Shaun Gayle, played 12 seasons in the NFL (1984-95) and was a member of the Chicago Bears squad that won Super Bowl XX in 1985. He also owns the distinction of returning the shortest punt for a touchdown in NFL history, when he returned a punt 5 yards for a touchdown against the New York Giants in a 1985 divisional playoff victory.

## A FAMILY ATMOSPHERE

• Defensive tackles **Antoine** and **Derrick Hopkins** are just two of numerous Hokies on the roster to have family ties to the Tech football program.

• Redshirt seniors **Vinston Painter** and **Randall Dunn** are cousins as are redshirt junior **Logan Thomas** and redshirt sophomore **Zack McCray**.

• Linebacker **Tariq Edwards** is the son of former Hokie football player Bo Campbell, who lettered from 1989-92. **George George III** is a walk-on whose father, George, was on the Tech team in the 1970s.

• Freshman **Alston Smith** is the son of former Hokie and NFL Hall of Famer Bruce Smith, while **Martin Scales** is the cousin of former Hokies Orion and Cam Martin.

• There are seven players on the team with brothers who either are playing or did play at Virginia Tech. The **Hopkins Brothers** (Antoine and Derrick) started up front along the defensive line the first five games last year until Antoine was hurt. David Wang is the younger brother of former offensive tackle Ed Wang and redshirt sophomore lineman Mark Shuman is the younger brother of former starting center and current weight room assistant director Ryan Shuman. Additionally, redshirt freshman Ronny Vandyke is joined on the team this year by his brother, Devin Vandyke.

• Kyle Fuller is a junior defensive back who started last year for the Hokies. He is joined on the team by his brother, Corey Fuller, who ran track at Kansas for two seasons before transferring to Tech in 2010. Both are younger brothers of former Hokie Vincent Fuller, who played six seasons with the Tennessee Titans.

• True freshman **Zach Snell** is the son of former Hokie wide receiver Donald Wayne Snell (1984-86) and the nephew of former Hokie receiver Sidney Snell (1977-80). He is

also the cousin of Tech freshman quarterback **Brendan Motley**. Freshman punter **Hunter Windmuller** is the nephew of the late Denny Windmuller, a defensive back for the Hokies who lettered in 1978 and 1979.

# TECH'S KICKING TRADITION

• Junior **Cody Journell** is back after a solid 2011 campaign, one in which he bucked the recent Tech tradition of relying on senior walkon kickers. Last season was the first time in five seasons, Tech didn't rely on a senior walkon for the kicking duties. In 2006, Brandon Pace went 18-for-19 on field goals en route to second-team All-ACC honors. In 2007, it was Jud Dunlevy, who went 21-for-26 on the season. In 2008, Dustin Keys set a school record with 23 made field goals. In 2009, it was Matt Waldron's turn and he responded by making 20-of-23 field goals and scoring 108 points en route to first-team All-ACC honors.

• And in 2010, Chris Hazley picked up where the others left off, hitting 21-of-22 field goals, including a school-record (for a single season) 21 in a row.

• The last four were one-year wonders, each winning the job in their final season, and each going on to score over 100 points.

• Over the last seven seasons, Tech's starting field goal kickers have combined to make 136 of 158 field-goal attempts (86 percent) and produce 686 points with three earning All-ACC honors.

• This year, **Cody Journell** holds down the job once again. He took a different route as he was a scholarship signee in February of 2009 and redshirted before serving as a backup in 2010.

• He is a local product who hails from Ripplemead, about 30 minutes from campus. He came in with impressive credentials after earning prep All-America honors coming out of nearby Giles High School. After redshirting as a freshman in 2009, Journell was slowed by a hip flexor in the 2010 spring drills and never could make a serious run for the job. But after a strong spring, he earned the job last year and didn't look back en route to honorable mention All-ACC honors.

• He started this season with a bang, hitting a 41-yard field goal as time expired in regulation against Georgia Tech and then hit the game-winner in overtime.

• Journell is the first Tech principal place-kicker to sign an NLI and come in on scholarship since Shayne Graham signed with the Hokies in 1996 and went on to earn firstteam All-Big East Conference honors in all four seasons as Tech's kicker before going on to a standout NFL career (now with Houston).

• Journell was 14-for-17 last season on field goals (making his last 10 attempts) and 43-for-44 on extra points. He has made 18 of 22 field goals this season, earning honorable mention All-America honors from SI.com. He is also 5-for-5 on game-tying, lead-changing or gamewinning field goals in the last three minutes of the fourth quarter or in overtime for his career.

#### TAKING CARE OF WALK-ONS

• Former walk-on John Engelberger was a starter for the San Francisco 49ers and Denver Broncos, and John Burke played in the Super Bowl with the New England Patriots in 1987. Cody Grimm went from a walk-on, to a starter, to an All-American, and finally to an NFL Draft pick of Tampa Bay in 2009.

• Current Tech walk-ons who have earned scholarships include Michael Branthover, Jack Tyler, Joey Phillips, Martin Scales, Trey Gresh and Corey Fuller.

• Will Montgomery (C, Washington Redskins) is former Hokie walk-on who has started started the past two seasons in the NFL.

# **BY THE NUMBERS**

**5,903** ... career yards passing by Logan Thomas currently place him fifth among Tech players. Thomas needs just 13 yards to pass Will Furrer (5,915) for fourth place and 107 yards to take over third place from Don Strock (6,009).

**528** ... rushing yards by quarterback Logan Thomas currently make him the Hokies' leading rusher. The last time a quarterback led Tech in rushing for a season was 1965 when Bobby Owens ran for a team-high 526 yards. True freshman tailback J.C. Coleman is currently second on the team in rushing with 486 yards. The last time a true freshman topped the Hokies in rushing for a season was 2001 when Kevin Jones ran for 957 yards.

**217** ... passing yards needed during his last game for Logan Thomas to become the first Hokie to register two 3,000-yard passing seasons.

**109** ... yards receiving would make Tech senior Marcus Davis the first Hokie to post 1,000 yards receiving in a single season. Davis needs 72 yards to break the Tech season record for receiving yards currently held by André Davis who had 962 in 1999. Davis enters the bowl with 891 yards.

**32** ... of the 44 active players on the Hokies' two-deep bowl roster still have eligibility remaining, including 19 with two or more years.

**29** ... rushing carries by Logan Thomas against Virginia were the most for a Tech QB since Bob Schweickert ran for 204 yards on 29 carries against Richmond in 1963.

**19** ... passes defended by Tech cornerback Antone Exum top the ACC.

**18.96** ... yards per catch average for Marcus Davis is the fourth best among the top 100 FBS players ranked in pass receiving yards. Teammate Corey Fuller has the fifth-best mark at 18.76 yards per reception.

**13** ... national ranking for Demitri Knowles in kickoff returns (28.33 ypr).

**9.3** ... tackles per game by Tech's Jack Tyler ranks fourth among ACC players.

**6** ... programs in college football history have now gone to a bowl game in 20 or more consecutive seasons. They are Nebraska (35), Michigan (33), Florida State (30, active) Alabama (25), Florida (22, active) and Virginia Tech (20, active).

**6** ... Tech players have contributed touchdowns of 60 yards or more this season.

**1** ... win needed by Frank Beamer to pass LaVell Edwards for sixth place in all-time victories among NCAA FBS football coaches. The two coaches are currently tied with 257 career wins apiece.

# HOP AND SKIP

• Defensive tackles **Antoine Hopkins** and **Derrick Hopkins** started beside each other on the defensive line last year for the first five games before Antoine tore his ACL in the loss to Clemson. He's back and the two are reunited on the line.

• Antoine, known as "Hop," switched from No. 98 to No. 56 in 2010, a number he wore in high school. Derrick, the sophomore known as "Skip," will again be wearing Antoine's old No. 98. The two have a younger brother nicknamed "Jump" to complete the trio.

• Both brothers were named honorable mention All-ACC this year. Derrick has 47 tackles, including 8.5 for loss and 2.5 sacks, while Antoine has 13 tackles, including 3.5 for loss.

• The last brothers to play side-by-side for the Hokies were Blake and Brett Warren at linebacker in the mid 2000s.

• Other notable brother combinations starting together on the same side of the ball were Orion and Cam Martin (defensive end and whip linebacker, respectively) in the late 2000s; Kevin and Jonathan Lewis, starting defensive tackles side-by-side in 2002, and offensive linemen T.J. (RT) and Todd (LG) Washington in 1996.

• Virginia Tech football has always prided itself on taking care of its players before, during and after their times in Blacksburg. A testament to the family atmosphere created is the roster of former Hokie players serving in some sort of capacity with the football team in the athletic department.

# THE FREAK

• Senior wide receiver **Marcus Davis** is having a major impact on the offense this year after finally settling in at the position.

• At 6-foot-4 and 230 pounds, the freakishly athletic Davis runs a 4.37-second 40-yard dash and set a Tech program record with a 44-inch vertical jump in the spring, making him a big target for **Logan Thomas** to find anywhere, but particularly on jump ball situations in the end zone.

• In the summer of 2010, Davis worked on his catching skills by catching 100 balls a day. Many of those balls were caught with tennis balls taped to the palms of his hands to make him catch the ball with his fingertips.

• Davis came to Tech as a quarterback, but quickly switched to wide receiver. He hurt his right shoulder just four practices into the 2008 preseason camp and underwent surgery.

• After taking a redshirt year, he was moved back to quarterback the next spring, but was moved back out wide with just a week left in the spring and has been a permanent resident of the receiving corps since.

• His first college reception was an 80-yard touchdown catch in 2009 against Boston College. He took a short pass at Pittsburgh, broke a tackle and raced for an 85-yard score, finishing his day with 129 yards receiving.

• For his career, he has caught 101 passes for 1,765 yards and 13 touchdowns. He leads the team this year with 47 receptions for 891 yards and five touchdowns. He needs 72 yards

receiving to break the school's single-season mark of 962, set by André Davis in 1999 and 109 yards to become the first Tech player in school history to reach 1,000 yards in school history.

• Tech is one of six FBS programs without a 1,000-yard receiver for a season. The other five are Nebraska, Temple, USF, Army and Navy.

### ONE MORE GO AT IT

 Senior wide receiver Dyrell Roberts has returned to form this fall after having seasonending injuries each of the past two seasons.

· Roberts, a speedster who was one of the top kickoff return men in 2009, was hit on the thigh on a return in the Georgia Tech game in 2010. After the game, it was bruised, but nothing out of the ordinary. As the night went on and the pain increased, he was finally rushed to Montgomery Regional Hospital and had a series of surgeries over the next week to relieve pressure in his thigh from compartment syndrome. Without the surgeries, he could've suffered permanent muscle damage.

RUNNERS

· Roberts missed the rest of the season and practiced sparingly in the spring, but returned last fall and broke the school record for career kickoff return yards with a 25-yarder against Appalachian State.

• But against Arkansas State last year, he suffered another tough injury on a kickoff return when he broke his left arm on the opening return. He missed the rest of the season, but because he hadn't redshirted yet, he was eligible for a medical hardship waiver and returns this season.

• For his career, he has caught 95 passes for 1,331 yards and six touchdowns. His biggest is a sliding catch in the back of the end zone in 2009 against Nebraska with 21 seconds left to help clinch a big comeback victory.

# BACK FROM LISFRANC SPRAINS

• Virginia Tech lost two starting linebackers last year to the rare Lisfranc foot sprains, but both are back this fall after recovering from surgeries. Outside linebacker Jeron Gouveia-Winslow hurt his foot against Miami and

• Taylor, a senior, was thrust into the starting lineup last year after 2009's starter, Barquell Rivers, tore a quad tendon while lifting in spring of 2010. In 2010, Taylor led the team with 91 tackles, including 15.5 for loss, and was leading the team again last year before suffering the injury. Taylor has 65 tackles this year, including 9.0 tackles for loss and 5.5 sacks, helping him earn honorable mention All-ACC honors.

• While productive on the field, Taylor also helps out with the Special Olympics of Southwest Virginia off the field.

• After a tough season in 2010 in his first year as a starter, Gouveia-Winslow seemed to turn the corner last year before his injury. Gouveia-Winslow had nine tackles, including one for a loss and five quarterback hurries early on and recorded an interception.

• The biological son of former Redskin great Kurt Gouveia, Gouveia-Winslow had two interceptions in 2010, including one that he returned for the opening score in the ACC Championship Game win over Florida State.

#### MAKING THE MOVE

• Junior **Antone Exum** moved back and forth between rover and free safety last season, two positions similar enough that a move could be made seemlessly.

• But this past spring, Exum made a move to cornerback in an experiment to try and get the best players in the secondary and he flourished. He played so well in his first ever action at corner that defensive secondary coach Torrian Gray plans on making the move permanent.

• Exum is a big proponent of hot yoga and takes classes either in Blacksburg or back home in the Richmond area. He credits the classes with helping with his cardio, flexibility, loosening his hips and his core strength – all things vital to a successful cornerback.

• He is tied for the ACC lead with 15 pass break ups and also leads the team with four interceptions, including one late in the game against Virginia that set up the game-winning field goal as time expired. He earned secondteam All-ACC honors and honorable mention All-America honors from SI.com for his play this year.

# THE BIG MAN IN THE MIDDLE

• Junior Andrew Miller took over as the center last season and is the lone returning starter on this year's line. The Bassett, Va., native was a standout wrestler in high school and has competed for the Hokies' nationally ranked wrestling squad. Miller was a two-time Virginia Group AA state champion and was the No. 3-ranked heavyweight by *W.I.N. Magazine* following his senior year. He was also a first-team all-state selection in football.

• The Rimington Award candidate started all 14 games for the Hokies last year, playing over 900 snaps. He will miss the remainder of the season after fracturing his left ankle in the Duke game and having surgery the next day. His loss means Tech lost 21 starts and over 1,400 offensive snaps in the middle of its line.

#### PLAYING THROUGH THE PAIN

• Junior linebacker **Tariq Edwards** played through immense pain most of the second half of last season. The Cheraw, S.C., native underwent surgery after the season to put a rod in his left tibia to relieve pain from a stress fracture in his shin and missed spring practice.

• Even in pain, Edwards made a careerbest 71 tackles last season, including 11.5

tackles for a loss and 3.5 sacks, along with two interceptions as he started all 14 games at linebacker to help hold together a front seven riddled by injuries. He suffered the stress fracture late in the season and played through it in the Sugar Bowl. He had another procedure done in the preseason, which set him back, but he made his first appearance in the fourth game of the season and has played sparingly, most on kickoff coverage.

• Edwards is the son of former Hokie receiver and punt returner Bo Campbell, who played for the Hokies from 1989-92. Campbell received the Long Distance AT&T Award for leading the nation in average punt return yards (18.2 yds) in 1991, the fall after Tariq was born.

# **READY FOR ACTION**

• Redshirt sophomore **Brent Benedict** is seeing plenty of action at offensive guard this year and the Jacksonville, Fla., native is ready to roll after two long seasons.

• A highly ranked offensive line product at The Bolles School, Benedict was a *SuperPrep* All-American and was rated as the No. 76 player in the country and the No. 12 offensive tackle in the country by Rivals. He missed some of his senior season with a knee injury, but still signed with the University of Georgia.

• He redshirted as a true freshman, while undergoing rehabilitation for a knee injury suffered in high school, but was still a recipient of the Walter C. Troutman Football Scholarship Endowment that year. He decided to transfer to Virginia Tech last summer and sat out last year due to NCAA transfer rules.

• Now three years removed from high school and a tough road to recovery from a knee injury, Benedict has seen his first game action since 2009, picking up his first start against Duke and four more since then.

• Every time he takes the field, Benedict says he is playing for his brother, Heath, who died unexpectedly of an enlarged heart in March of 2008, just weeks before the NFL Draft.

• The older Benedict, also an offensive lineman, originally signed with the University of Tennessee, but transferred to Newberry (S.C.) College, where he was a two-time Little All-American. He was projected as a midrounder in the NFL Draft and was the first Division II player since 2004 to take part in the Senior Bowl.

# IMPRESSIVE GENES

• Offensive guard **David Wang** comes from athletic parents, both of whom were members of the Chinese Olympic team.

• David had surgery on his shoulder during preseason and redshirted in 2009 before seeing the field in five games in 2010 as the top backup at left guard. He was the top backup at right guard last year before fracturing his right foot against East Carolina, causing him to miss the rest of the season. While laid up with the foot injury, the avid video gamer ascended to No. 35 in the world rankings for Call of Duty on the Xbox 360 console, playing 6-8 hours a day. He would only take breaks for schoolwork and "because I was hungry."

• After working hard in the offseason, the junior now took over at left guard on an inexperienced offensive line.

• He is the brother of former Hokie Ed Wang, who made history in April of 2010 by becoming the first Chinese American to be drafted by an NFL team when Buffalo took him in the fourth round. Ed and David were

featured on NFL China in 2010 as a crew came over from Beijing to do a story on American football.

• Tech also holds the distinction of having the first Korean American drafted by an NFL team as Eugene Chung was taken by New England in the first round of the 1992 Draft.

# THE COMPUTER GUY

• At 6-1, 300 pounds, senior defensive tackle **Antoine Hopkins** may be the biggest, yet athletic, computer guy out there. He's also proud of the fact and recently even started his own computer business, taking infected computers and cleaning off viruses, as well as performing other routine maintenance items on computers. Hopkins suffered a torn ACL last year early on and missed the rest of the season, but spent part of the fall working with the I.T. staff in the athletics department in his spare time, learning more about the industry.

• With his return to full speed this fall, he provides yet another big body in a deep defensive line that has been a major force this season (24 sacks in last six games by the defense).

the NFL Draft by Tennessee and spent eight years in the league. He played at Tech from 201-04, recording eight career interceptions.

• In 2010, Kyle signed with the Hokies and has had a big impact on the program. As a true freshman, he started six games - mostly in the nickel spot - and recorded 32 tackles, including 4.0 for loss, with six pass break ups and a forced fumble.

• Last year, he flourished in the role of nickel back as he led the team in tackles for loss last season with 14.5. He had 65 tackles, including 4.5 sacks, two interceptions, seven pass break ups, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. He also pounced on a blocked punt in the end zone for a touchdown against Appalachian State. He was a second-team All-ACC selection at corner last season and intercepted a pass in overtime to set up the Hokies' winning points against Georgia Tech in the season opener. He earned honorable mention all-conference honors this year.

• The second-oldest Fuller, Corey, took a different route to Blacksburg. He signed to run track at Kansas and competed for two years in Lawrence. He decided to give football a try and transfered to Tech in 2010, sitting out a year as required by the NCAA.

• Corey claims to be the fastest of all the brothers and is the only offensive player of the four. He's had had a big year at receiver for the Hokies, catching 41 passes for 769 yards and is tied for the team-high with five touchdowns as he's seen his NFL stock rise with each game.

### JACK IN THE BOX

• Linebacker **Jack Tyler** has proven to be quite the find for defensive coordinator Bud Foster, who had a heavy hand in recruiting Tyler as a recruited walk-on. Tyler has been invaluable for the Hokies, coming up big in several key games. In the 2010 ACC Championship game, he filled in for an injured Bruce Taylor in the second half against Florida game and contributed seven tackles – three of which went for losses.

• Last year, he racked up 12 tackles in the win at Georgia Tech and topped that this season with a career-high 17 tackles against the Yellow Jackets in the Hokies' overtime win to earn ACC Linebacker of the Week honors. The 17 total stops are the most by a Tech defender since Michael Crawford had 18 against Texas A&M in 2003.

• Through the regular season, the redshirt junior has a team-high 112 tackles, including 11.0 for loss and 2.5 sacks with two pass break ups and 13 quarterback hurries. He is third in the ACC in total tackles and fourth in tackles per game and earned first-team All-ACC honors from the coaches for his play this season. HOKIESPORTS.COM



# REPLACING BOYKIN AND COALE

• Virginia Tech is replacing wide receivers Jarrett Boykin and Danny Coale, the most productive duo in terms of receptions in ACC history. Boykin left Tech with a school-record 184 catches for a record 2,844 yards, while Coale was second in both categories with 165 catches for 2,658 yards. Together, they caught 349 passes for 5,502 yards and 26 touchdowns.

• After suffering a loss in game one, replacing them is a trio of seniors in **Dyrell Roberts**, **Marcus Davis** and **Corey Fuller**, along with a gaggle of freshmen and sophomores.

• Roberts has had two season-ending injuries the past two seasons, both coming on kickoff returns, but is best remembered for his sliding, 11-yard touchdown catch in the back of the end zone with 21 seconds left to help Tech rally and beat Nebraska 16-15 in 2009.

• Fuller ran track at the University of Kansas, competing in the triple jump, before transfering to Tech to play football. After sitting out a year due to transfer rules, he earned a scholarship after last season. That decision proved to be the right one after in the season-opening win against Georgia Tech as he caught five passes for a career-high 82 yards, including a big 4th-down grab on the final drive that sent the game to overtime.

• Davis, who came to Tech as a quarterback, averaged a team-best 17 yards per catch last year. He is a big threat who leads the team with 952 all-purpose yards through 12 games.

• Senior **D.J. Coles** had a personal-best 36 catches for 480 yards and three touchdowns in 2011, but had offseason knee surgery which slowed him down. He tried to come back, but re-injured the knee in the first game against Georgia Tech and will apply for a medical hardship waiver to return next year.

#### DOING GOOD DEEDS

• Head coach **Frank Beamer** is a strong believer in giving back to the community. He founded Herma's Readers in 2008 and this year, the team will help raise money for the Wounded Warrior Project. Additionally, the team has raised money in the past to help support Breast Cancer Awareness and Ewing's sarcoma cancer.

• Herma's Readers is a non-profit organization that promotes the power of reading and literacy to youngsters during their formative years, grades K-3. The organization was formed as a tribute to Tech head football coach Frank Beamer's late mother, Herma, a teacher for over 30 years in the Commonwealth of Virginia. Herma's Readers has delivered over 21,000 new and used books collected at Virginia Tech football games to youngsters throughout the Commonwealth. Currently, Coach Beamer's program has also dispersed

more than \$80,000 for new book purchases for children. That is a total of more than 53,000 new and used books.

• The Virginia Tech football team also raised money to support Wounded Warrior Project through the sale of camouflage Virginia Tech hats and wristbands. Wounded Warrior Project was created to raise awareness and enlist the public's aid as well as provide direct programs for the needs of injured service members.

• Coach Beamer invited Ben Kiernan, through the Wounded Warrior Project, to join the Virginia Tech Football team at spring football practice March 30, showing the team a mock-up of the camo helmet to be worn for the Sept. 22 game against Bowling Green. Kiernan was a 1371 Combat Engineer for the Marines when he was injured on Sept. 16, 2010 in Afghanistan as part of an ambush during Operation Enduring Freedom. Kiernan is a graduate of Virginia Tech, receiving a B.A. in Urban Affairs in 2008.

### MORE IMPORTANT THINGS THAN FOOTBALL

• Sophomore **Kyshoen Jarrett** may have the starting rover position locked down with his impressive play early on, but he knows there are way more important things in life than football.

• Jarrett's older brother, Daishawn Capers, has cerebral palsy and is legally blind. He is wheelchair-bound and needs help doing almost everything, relying on his brother and mother, Vinise Capers. In high school, Jarrett would often take care of Daishawn, either getting him ready for school in the morning or by watching him during the evenings or part of a weekend when their mother was away.

• Though from Tannersville, Pa., Jarrett's mother and brother now live in North Carolina and come to almost every home game. Daishawn sits there waiting to hear his brother's name over the public address system, ready to cheer for his brother every time he makes a play.

• Jarrett is a converted cornerback who moved to the rover position in the spring and now starts there while also seeing time as a punt returner. At Pittsburgh, he broke off a 94-yard punt return for a touchdown, the second-longest return in school history and the longest under head coach Frank Beamer. He is averaging 13.9 yards per punt return this season.

• Nine-time Virginia Sportscaster of the Year Bill Roth (play-by-play), Hokies' Hall of Famer Mike Burnop (analyst) and Adam Witten (scoreboard anchor) comprise Virginia Tech football's on-air broadcast crew.

• The 2012 season marks Roth and Burnop's 25th season together in the Virginia Tech radio booth, making them one of the longest-tenured active duos in the FBS.

• Coverage begins 90 minutes prior to kickoff with the Hardees Chicken Tenders Tailgate Show and the NTELOS Wireless Pre-Game Report. The game broadcast, presented by The Virginia Lottery is followed by the Kroger Point After, a fast-paced, 90-minute post-game scoreboard and interview program.

#### BEAMERBALL

• During the **Frank Beamer** era at Tech, putting points on the scoreboard has always been a team effort — the offense, the defense and the special teams. It's called BeamerBall, and what sets it apart are the contributions of the defense and special teams.

• During Beamer's time, a player at every position on the defensive unit has produced at least one touchdown, and 37 different players have scored touchdowns while playing on Tech's special teams.

• Altogether, the defense and special teams have combined for 132 TDs since Beamer arrived in 1987, including 115 in Tech's past 244 games.

• Under Beamer, Tech's defense has scored 82 TDs, with 54 coming on pass interceptions, 26 on fumble returns and two on fumble recoveries. The special teams have added 50 TDs, including 17 on blocked punts, 19 on punt returns, nine on kickoff returns, four on blocked field goals and one on a fumble recovery.

• Fittingly, the trend started in Beamer's first game as Tech's head coach when true freshman Jon Jeffries returned a kickoff 92 yards for a touchdown against Clemson. It was the Hokies' first TD under Beamer, and it was the first of many scored by the special teams.

• Under Beamer, 83 different players on defense and special teams have scored TDs. Twenty-three of those players scored twice while Eddie Royal,

Xavier Adibi, Jason Lallis, Ike Charlton and Ricky Hall each had three scores, André Davis had four, Victor Harris had five and DeAngelo Hall had seven.

• Tech's tradition for blocking kicks is another part of BeamerBall. It was carried to new heights in 1998 with 10 blocks during the regular season and two more in the Hokies' Music City Bowl game against Alabama.

• Tech now has 129 blocks in **Frank Beamer**'s 321 games as the head coach. The Hokies have blocked 64 punts (17 returned or recovered for TDs), 38 field goals and 27 extra points.

• The most prolific kick blockers under Beamer have been defensive lineman Bernard Basham (7 kicks) and safety Keion Carpenter (6 kicks). Basham blocked three field goals and four PATs, while Carpenter blocked six punts.

• During the Beamer era, Tech has blocked two kicks in a game 22 times, winning 16 of those games. Tech blocked two kicks against four different teams in 1998.
