Virginia Tech has never played a game in the state of Indiana. Saturday's game will mark Tech's second-ever contest against a foe from that state. Tech defeated Indiana 45-20 in the 1993 Independence Bowl, starting Tech's string of 22 straight bowl berths under Frank Beamer.



PURDUE (1-1, 0-0 B1G) **BOILERMAKERS**

BEAMER CHASING HISTORY

Frank Beamer owns 274 career college victories. His 232 wins at Tech are tied with Alabama's Paul "Bear" Bryant for the seventh-highest total in FBS history by a coach at one school.

@MOTLEYKREWWW

QB Brenden Motley (aka @MotleyKrewww) made his debut as Tech's starter in place of an injured Michael Brewer. Motley completed 16 of 24 (66.7%) of his passes for 233 yards with two TDs in a 42-3 win vs. Furman (9/12). He also rushed for 38 yards with a four-vard TD.

NON-CON, NO PROB

Dating back to 1996, VT is 16-4 (.800) on the road against non-conference foes, including a 13-3 (.813) mark in such games against unranked non-con foes.

DOUBLE-DIGIT WINS

Dating back to 1995, only Ohio State (15) owns more 10-win seasons than Virginia Tech (13). The lone double-digit victory campaign for Purdue was a 10-2 season under head coach Jim Young in 1979.

#LUNCHPAILD

LB Andrew Motuapouaka registered an 18-yard INT return TD vs. Furman (9/12), one of two INTs on the game for Tech. Dating back to 1996 when Bud Foster took over sole possession of the duties for VT, the Hokies are 85-8 (.914) in multi-INT games. Over that span, no Power Five team owns more INTs (330) or INT return TDs (44) than Tech.

SMASH MOUTH HOKIES

Virginia Tech racked up 299 rushing yards vs. Furman (9/12). Dating back to 1996, the Hokies are 102-7 (.936) when rushing for 200+ yards. The Hokies ran for three TDs last week. Tech has now won 36 straight games when rushing for three or more TDs dating back to a 63-0 victory vs. Western Michigan (9/11/04).

PURDUE VS. THE ACC

Purdue's last victory against a full-time member of the ACC was 16-10 win at No. 20 Wake Forest (9/13/03). However, the Boilermakers did register wins against Notre Dame in 2003, 2004 and 2007.

Virginia Tech Seeks to Start Winning Streak at Purdue After Big Win vs. Furman

- Virginia Tech is coming off a 42-3 win vs. Furman (9/12). The Hokies are 2-2 all-time against the "longstanding" 10 members of the Big Ten: 1-1 vs. Ohio State, 1-0 vs. Indiana and 0-1 vs. Michigan. Purdue registered a 38-14 win vs. Indiana St. (9/12).
- The Hokies have gotten off to fast starts, outscoring their first two foes by a 31-14 margin in the first half in 2015, including a 24-0 scoring advantage in the second quarter. Purdue owns a 45-24 first-half scoring edge in its two games.
- Tech racked up 299 rushing yards vs. Furman (9/12), averaging 7.3 yards per carry to mark only the eighth time VT has averaged 7.3 yards per carry over better in a game dating back to 2000.
- QB Brenden Motley made his first career start vs. Furman (9/12), becoming the 12th straight signal caller to win his starting debut under head coach Frank Beamer. WR Isaiah Ford hauled in five passes for 77 yards with two TDs. Motley ranks eighth in the ACC with a 153.0 rating and is 10th in the league, averaging 134.5 passing ypg.
- Ford is tied for seventh in the ACC with three total TDs and is ninth in the conference, averaging 69.0 receiving ypg.
- Purdue racked up 251 rushing yards and 289 passing yards in a 38-14 win vs. Indiana State (9/12).

Scoring Stats to Watch as Hokies Square Off vs. Boilermakers

- Dating back to 1996, VT is 39-3 (.929) on the road when scoring 30+ points, including an 11-0 mark vs. non-conference foes.
- Purdue is 8-24 (.250) at home since the start of the 2000 campaign when allowing 30 points or more.
- VT is 89-1 (.989) when holding foes to 10 points or less dating back to 1996, including last week's 42-3 victory.
- The Boilermakers have lost 26 straight games when being held to 10 points or fewer. Purdue's last win in such a circumstance was a 9-3 win vs. No. 9 Michigan (11/9/96).
- The Hokies are 51-1 when holding non-conference foes to 17 points or less since 1999. That lone loss was a 16-13 setback to No. 3 Auburn in the 2005 Sugar Bowl.
- Purdue has lost 35 straight games when being held to 17 points or less dating back to a 24-7 loss vs. Maryland (12/29/06). Since the start of the 1996 season, Purdue is 35-0 at home when scoring 30 points or more.

Turnover Margin Always Key to Virginia Tech's Success

- The Hokies are +4 (6 takes/2 gives) in the turnover column. Only Miami & Syracuse are better in the ACC at +6.
- Virginia Tech and Purdue are tied for sixth in the FBS with six takeaways apiece.
- Tech didn't commit a turnover last week, a feat the Hokies weren't able to accomplish in any game in 2014.
- Since the start of the 2000 campaign, VT is 33-3 (.917) when it doesn't commit a turnover, including victories in 16 of its last 17 contests when it doesn't lose a fumble or throw an interception.
- Dating back to 1996, only Kansas State (113) has more combined defensive and special teams TDs than VT (107).
- Three Tech RBs combined for five 100-yard games in 2014: J.C. Coleman (2), Marshawn Williams (2) & Shai McKenzie (1).
- Redshirt freshman Travon McMillian racked up a team-high 98 ground yards vs. Furman (9/12). McMillian averaged 16.3 yards per carry, including a 63-yard scamper, the longest by a VT player since RB Chris Mangus had a 76-yard TD in a 45-3 win vs. Western Carolina (9/7/13).

Final Tidbits on Virginia Tech at Purdue, Hokies Back on the Road Next Week at ECU

- The Hokies limited Furman to nine completions last week. Tech held five foes to nine or fewer completions in 2014.
- Virginia Tech averaged 8.1 yards per play vs. Furman (9/12) and limited the Paladins to 3.8 yards per play.
- P A.J. Hughes ranks fifth in the ACC with a 41.9-yard average and is tied for second with six punts inside the 20.
- DT Woody Baron and LB Deon Clarke lead the Hokies and are tied for 12th in the ACC with 2.5 tackles for loss.
- Following the Purdue contest, Tech hits the road for another non-conference contests at East Carolina (9/26).
- Virginia Tech opens ACC play with back-to-back home games vs. Pitt (10/3) and vs. NC State (10/9).



HEAD COACH FRANK BEAMER

Frank Beamer (Virginia Tech '69), whose Virginia Tech teams have posted a 208-76 record over the past 22-plus seasons and have appeared in bowl games each year in that span, is in his 29th year as the head football coach at Tech and 35th overall. Beamer has quided the Hokies to a 232-116-2 record and sits with an overall record of 274-139-4.

Under Beamer, Tech football has enjoyed unprecedented success with 22 consecutive bowl appearances, four ACC titles, five ACC Coastal Division crowns, three BIG EAST Conference titles, two "major" bowl victories, six BCS appearances and a trip to the national championship game.

Tech won the BIG EAST title in 1995 and 1999, and shared it in '96. Beamer was voted BIG EAST Coach of the Year by the league's coaches each of those seasons and was tabbed the Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year in both 2004 and 2005. In 1997, he was inducted into the Virginia Tech Sports Hall of Fame, becoming the first active coach at the university to be honored in that fashion. Following the 1999 season, he earned eight national coach of the year honors.

During his undergraduate days at Tech, Beamer started three years as a cornerback and played on the Hokies' 1966 and 1968 Liberty Bowl teams.

The 68-year-old Hillsville, Virginia, product began as an assistant at Radford High School from 1969 through 1971. Then, after one season as a graduate assistant at the University of Maryland, he went to The Citadel where he worked five seasons under Bobby Ross and one year under Art Baker. His last two years at The Citadel, Beamer was the defensive coordinator. In 1979, he went to Murray State as the defensive coordinator under Mike Gottfried. He was named head coach at MSU in 1981 and went on to compile a six-year record of 42-23-2.

He is married to the former Cheryl Oakley of Richmond, Virginia. They have two children, Shane, a former member of his dad's football team at Virginia Tech and now the associate head coach/running backs coach at Virginia Tech; and daughter Casey, a 2003 graduate of Tech. He has four grandchildren, Sutton, Olivia and Hunter, children of Shane and his wife, Emily. Casey, who married former Virginia Tech wrestler Canaan Prater in 2012, had her first son, Hudson, in February.

Beamer was born in Mt. Airy, North Carolina, and grew up in Hillsville, Virginia. At Hillsville High, he earned 11 varsity letters as a three-sport athlete in football, basketball and baseball.

An avid NASCAR fan, Beamer has been the official starter for races at Bristol Motor Speedway, Martinsville Speedway and Richmond International Raceway.

Beamer had his No. 25 jersey retired by Tech in a pregame ceremony before the Marshall game in 2002.

SPRING ROAD ON VIRGINIA TECH CAMPUS RENAMED 'BEAMER WAY'

In appreciation for his many years of service and extraordinary contributions to university life, the Virginia Tech Board of Visitors renamed Spring Road in honor of Frank Beamer on Aug. 6, 2015. Recognizing contributions made both on and off the field by head football coach Beamer and his wife, Cheryl, Spring Road, which runs alongside the west stands and press box of Lane Stadium, is now known as Beamer Way. The official athletics department street address is 25 Beamer Way in recognition of Frank Beamer's jersey number when he played football for Tech from 1966-68. VT President Dr. Timothy Sands and VT Director of Athletics Whit Babcock made the official presentation in front of the football team in a team meeting on the eve of the start of preseason practice.

STABILITY AT THE TOP OF VIRGINIA TECH PROGRAM

Frank Beamer, the first Tech alumnus to guide Virginia Tech's football program since the 1940s, has coached and won more football games at Tech than any other head coach. Not one of the 128 active FBS head football coaches has been at his current school longer than Beamer, who is in his 29th year at Tech. He is the longest-tenured coach at the same school by a full 12 years (Oklahoma's Bob Stoops & lowa's Kirk Ferentz - 17th seasons).

During Beamer's 28 previous years at Tech, 20 different power conference schools have had six or more head coaches, including five schools in the ACC: Pittsburgh (8), Boston College (7), Louisville (7), North Carolina (7) and Miami (6). Three schools - Pitt, Stanford and Vanderbilt - have had eight different coaches during the time Beamer has been the head coach at Tech.

Since the end of the 2009 season, 98 FBS schools have hired new head coaches.

COLUMBUS, Ohio — Virginia Tech stunned nationally eighth-ranked Ohio State University at Ohio Stadium, 35-21, before a record crowd of 107,517 fans.

The win ended Buckeye streaks of 35 consecutive wins in home openers, which dated back to 1979, and 64 straight wins against unranked, non-conference foes that extended back to

Tech never trailed in the game, building a 21-7 advantage by halftime thanks to touchdowns from Shai McKenzie, Marshawn Williams and fullback Sam Rogers.

Ohio State capitalized on a pair of Hokie turnovers to pull even at 21-all with 11:40 left in the game, but he Hokies met the challenge with a pair of scores of their own over the last nine minutes, assuring their first victory away from home against a team ranked in the top eight.

With the game tied, Tech marched down the field and scored on a Bucky Hodges touchdown catch to take the lead for good.

Tech scored two touchdowns on the ground and two through the air before junior cornerback Donovan Riley clinched the win with a 63-yard interception return for a score with just 46

It was one of three interceptions for the defense, which also contributed seven quarterback sacks.

GAME NOTES

- The Hokies were the first unranked ACC team to beat a top-10 opponent on the road since Sept. 19, 2009 when Florida State defeated seventh-ranked BYU in Provo, Utah, 54-28.
- Senior Kyshoen Jarrett picked off a career-best two passes in the game, giving him four interceptions for his career.
- The Buckeye crowd of 107,517 represented the most people a Tech football team had ever played in front of.
- Cornerback Donovan Riley became the 86th different Tech player to score a touchdown on defense or special teams during Frank Beamer's tenure as head coach. Riley's interception and 63-yard return for a touchdown clinched the Tech win.
- Sophomore fullback Sam Rogers picked up his first collegiate touchdown, grabbing a 10-yard pass from Michael Brewer with 52 seconds remaining in the first half.




EDMUNDS BROTHERS RARE FEAT

Just after Virginia Tech's first touchdown against Ohio State on Sept. 7, the Edmunds brothers - Terrell, Tremaine and Trey - became just the third trio of brothers to take the field together at the same time in the same game for a major college football program dating back to 1970. The first to accomplish this rarest of feats was the Selmon brothers at Oklahoma when Lee Roy, Lucious and Dewey all played for the Sooners' defense during the 1972 and 1973 seasons. They were followed in 2010 and 2011 by the McCray brothers - Cliff, Jordan and Justin - who all played on the offensive line together at UCF. During the 2015 season, the Edmunds are regularly appearing together on the special teams kickoff coverage team

HOKIE QUICK HITS

The Hokies used three quarterbacks in their win over Furman last Saturday - Brenden Motley, Dwayne Lawson and Chris Durkin. It marked the first time since Oct. 25, 2008 when Sean Glennon, Cory Holt and Tyrod Taylor all saw action under center at Florida State.

Isaiah Ford hauled in two touchdown catches last Saturday against Furman, tying his career high, which he last did against East Carolina (9/13) in 2014.

The Hokies' defense picked off two passes against Furman for the first time in 2015. They picked off at least two passes three times during the 2014 season. The most recent was the bowl win over Cincinnati (12/27).

Tech improved to 39-5 overall when the team rushes for at least 200 yards and throws for more than 200 yards in the same game. The Hokies had 299 yards on the ground and 284 yards in the air against Furman last Saturday.

NUMBERS FROM SATURDAY

- 583 Total yards of offense for the Hokies in the win over Furman, the most by the Hokies since they had 605 versus Wake Forest on Oct. 16, 2010. It was the eighth-most total vards of offense ever under Coach Beamer.
- 232 Wins for Coach Beamer as head coach at Virginia Tech win the victory on Saturday, which tied Alabama's Bear Bryant for the seventh-most among NCAA FBS coaches all-time at one school. His next win will tie him with Nevada's Chris Ault, who won 233 games over 28 seasons.
- 58 Interceptions returned for touchdowns for Tech's defense in 29 seasons under Beamer, after Tech's Andrew Motuapuaka scored on an 18-yard return in the first quarter.
- 10 Straight touchbacks for Joey Slye every kickoff he's taken in the 2015 season.
- 2 Andrew Motuapuaka's career touchdown total after his interception return last Saturday. The first came on an 11yard fumble return versus Western Michigan in 2014.

- Under Frank Beamer (350 games), the Hokies are 202-42-2 when outrushing their opponents, 29-74 when being outrushed and 1-0 when the rushing total is even.
- In Tech's current 22-year bowl run (since 1993), Tech is 181-26 when outrushing its opponents, 26-50 when being outrushed and 1-0 when the rushing total is even.
- In its current 22-year bowl run (since 1993), Tech is 116-8 when rushing for 200 yards or more.
- Since the start of the 2000 season, the Hokies are 44-0 when rushing 50 times or more in a game (last loss: 1999 national championship game to FSU; rushed 52 times).
- Since the start of the 1999 season, Tech is 136-20 when outrushing its opponent and 19-37 when being outrushed.

ALL SCORERS RETURNED

- Every single Hokie who scored a point last season for the Virginia Tech Hokies - a total of 313 points - returned in 2015. The list includes 14 players - four of whom were on the defensive side of the ball.
- The Hokies' top scorer is kicker Joey Slye, who connected on 20-of-28 fields goals and converted 33-of-34 on extra points for 93 points.
- Bucky Hodges led the team in touchdowns, catching seven touchdown passes in 2014 - a Tech single-season record for tight ends, while also adding a TD on a blocked punt in the end zone against Virginia. He also caught a twopoint conversion attempt to give him 50 points for the year.
- Ryan Malleck contributed a pair of TD grabs to give the tight end position a total of nine TD catches for the season.
- Third on the list overall was Isaiah Ford, who as a freshman, hauled in six touchdown passes, while classmate Cam Phillips snagged three.
- On the ground, Marshawn Williams led the way with four touchdown runs, while Shai McKenzie (3) and J.C. Coleman (2).
- Quarterback Michael Brewer had two rushing touchdowns and fullback Sam Rogers added one.
- Donovan Riley and Kendall Fuller each reached the end zone after an interception, while Andrew Motuapuaka (on kickoff coverage) and Greg Stroman each hit paydirt on a fumble return.

#LUNCHPAILD

During Bud Foster's 260-game tenure as defensive/co-defensive coordinator, Tech has ...

- had 49 different defensive players score touchdowns.
- scored 75 touchdowns (52 on pass interceptions, 22 on fumble returns and one on a fumble recovery).
- held opponents to an average of 111.1 yards rushing and 17.1 points per game.
- been nationally ranked in the top five of a major defensive category 37 times. Tech finished No. 1 in total defense in 2005 and 2006, second in 2001 and third in 1999.
- pitched 28 shutouts.
- had at least one defensive player earn All-America honors from some publication in 17 of 19 seasons. Four players gained A-A recognition in 1999 and three were honored in 2001.
- produced six first-team All-Americans and 12 others who have earned second- or third-team All-America honors from one of the recognized groups.
 - had 37 players drafted by NFL teams.
- produced its first Lombardi Award winner and its first Nagurski Trophy winner in Corey Moore.
- produced two BIG EAST defensive players of the year Corey Moore (1998, 1999), and Cornell Brown (1995).
- featured 10 players who have recorded nine or more interceptions in their career.

THE STORIED LUNCH PAIL

- Taken with the Hokies wherever they go is the storied lunch pail. The Pail served as the inspiration for Tech's record-setting 1995 defense, symbolizing Tech's blue collar approach to defensive football. Every year since, a member of the defense has been responsible for toting a new Pail.
- Coach Rod Sharpless, then the co-defensive coordinator along with Bud Foster, brought a lunch pail back from New Jersey and they decided that it would become the symbol of the 1995 defense. Sharpless' mother-in-law found the now famous original lunch pail in Mercerville, N.J., where it had belonged to a coal miner.
- The players put the unit goals, weekly goals, the keys to success for the week and a signed mission statement before the season in the Pail ... plus the turf from road wins.

VIRGINIA TECH'S 258-GAME SCORING STREAK

Virginia Tech's current 258-game scoring streak from 1995 to present stands as the 12th-longest in Division I-A college history, and the sixth-longest active streak in the FBS. During the run, Tech scored on its first offensive possession 82 times, plus another five occasions* where it scored on returns on its first touch of the game. The Hokies have scored in the first quarter 186 times during the streak, and have extended it by halftime in 245 of the 258 games. Here's the year-by-year breakdown (* - blocked punt recovery in the end zone against Akron in 1995; an interception return at Clemson in 2007; an interception return against Boston College in 2008; a blocked punt return against Marshall in 2013; and a fumble return on the opening kickoff of the 2014 Western Michigan game):

Virginia Tech has a **191-67** record during the streak, averaging **33.8** points in the wins and **19.5** points in the losses. The Hokies have only on six occasions delayed extending the streak until the fourth quarter or overtime. The last time came in 2014 in an overtime loss at Wake Forest. The latest Tech scored its first points in a game was in overtime in 2014 at Wake Forest (a 0-0 tie after four quarters). The latest in a regulation game was with 1:30 left in Tech's game versus Miami also in 2014. Here's a look at the six occasions.

LANE STADIUM - HOME OF THE HOKIES

Rising high into the mountainous sky of the New River Valley, Virginia Tech's Lane Stadium enters its 51st year of football competition in 2015. The Tech football team has enjoyed over two decades of success, going to 22 straight bowl games and winning 10 or more games eight straight seasons from 2004-11. A big part of that success is the home-field advantage the Hokies enjoy at Lane Stadium/Worsham Field.

Billed as the toughest place in college football for opponents to play by Rivals.com in 2005 and one of the scariest places to play by ESPN.com in 2007, the Hokies play not only on one of the best playing surfaces in the nation, but with the south end zone and west side additions, the Hokies compete in one of the best stadiums in the nation.

Sitting at roughly 2,057 feet above sea level, the stadium is the second-highest among all FBS schools in the eastern United States, trailing only Appalachian State (3,300). Completed in 1965, Lane Stadium/Worsham Field has gone through numerous changes, renovations and additions. But through it all, it has always been regarded as one of the finest places to watch — and toughest places for opponents to play — a college football game.

A WINNING TRADITION

On Sept. 22, 1994, Tech won its 100th game in Lane Stadium in memorable fashion before a national television audience on ESPN with a 34-6 win over rival West Virginia. On Nov. 1, 2003, Tech upset No. 2 Miami 31-7 to pick up its 150th all-time win at Lane Stadium, marking the highest-ranked opponent the Hokies have ever defeated.

Tech's overall record at Lane Stadium is 208 wins, 77 losses and six ties in 51 years of play. The Hokies are 134-40-1 at home during Coach Frank Beamer's tenure at Virginia Tech and more impressively, are 116-26 in Blacksburg during the past 22 seasons. Since joining the ACC prior to the 2004 season, Tech has accumulated a record of 58-15 at home, including a conference mark of 32-12. The Hokies went 32-9 at Lane Stadium/Worsham field while a member of the BIG EAST.

A large part of that impressive record is the home-field environment created by the fans, as Lane Stadium was sold out for 94 consecutive games, starting with the final game of the 1998 season against Virginia and running through the 2012 season.

THE HOKIE STONE

Before each home football game, Virginia Tech football players and coaching staff enter Lane Stadium through a tunnel. On the stadium-side entrance to Worsham Field, they pass beneath a Hokie Stone, which they touch for good luck and is flanked by these words: "For those who have passed. For those to come ... Reach for Excellence."

ENTER SANDMAN

The history behind Virginia Tech's use of Metallica's "Enter Sandman" started during the 2000 season. That summer Tech added a new scoreboard to Lane Stadium and the athletics marketing team decided to use the scoreboard for an entrance video. The group considered "Welcome to the Jungle" by Guns N' Roses and "Sirius" by the Alan Parsons Project before settling on "Enter Sandman." It has been the entrance song for the Hokies ever since.



THE BATTLE AT BRISTOL VIRGINIA TECH vs. TENNESSEE - SEPT. 10, 2016

On Oct. 14, 2013, Virginia Tech and Tennessee announced plans to play a non-conference football game at the Bristol Motor Speedway in 2016 at a joint news conference held at the speedway — a game that was dubbed as the "Battle at Bristol."

The Bristol Motor Speedway will become a football venue next year when the Hokies take on neighboring Tennessee – the two schools are just 236 miles apart – in a non-conference tilt. Track officials anticipate the Sept. 10, 2016 game will break college football's all-time single-game attendance mark. The current record occurred in 2013 when Michigan and Notre Dame played in front of 115,109 fans at Michigan Stadium. The Bristol Motor Speedway is close to a 160,000-seat venue.

The marketing campaign for the game took another step when track general manager Jerry Caldwell, NASCAR Xfinity Series driver Ty Dillon and Derek Vaughan, an engineer with Richard Childress Racing — and a Virginia Tech graduate (mechanical engineering, class of 1998) — along with other BMS officials came to Blacksburg on Aug. 11 of this year to promote the game. The group toured Tech's facilities, met with athletics department personnel, including AD Whit Babcock and head football coach Frank Beamer, and answered questions from the media. Dillon and Vaughan also caught passes and ran drills with assistant head coach Shane Beamer and some of Tech's players.

JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its named to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today. Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.

WHAT'S A HOKIE?

That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body. Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today.

Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. Following is the "Old Hokie" yell in its original form:

Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy! Tech! Tech! V.P.I.! Sola-Rex Sola-Rah Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!! Rae, Ri, V.P.I.

BLACKSBURG, Va. —Ohio State quarterback Cardale Jones threw two touchdown passes and rushed for 99 yards, as the No. 1-ranked Buckeyes rallied from a small halftime deficit to defeat Virginia Tech 42-24 at Lane Stadium on Monday night.

Jones had a touchdown pass and a touchdown run in the second half, helping the Buckeyes avenge last season's 35-21 loss to the Hokies in Columbus, Ohio. Behind Jones, Ohio State amassed 572 yards of total offense.

Worse than the loss, Hokies quarterback Michael Brewer fractured his collarbone in the third quarter. He will undergo surgery on Tuesday and will miss at least 4-8 weeks.

Tech trailed 14-0, but rallied to take a 17-14 lead at halftime, scoring two second-guarter touchdowns. A 51-yard touchdown pass from Brewer to Sam Rogers got the Hokies on the board, and Tech cut the lead to 14-10 on Joey Slye's 46-yard field goal. Tech then took the lead on a 1-yard pass from Brewer to tight end Ryan Malleck with 15 seconds left in the first half.

Ohio State, though, quickly grabbed the lead in the second half, scoring on a 54-yard pass from Jones to Braxton Miller, a quarterback who missed last season because of an injury and was moved to receiver this past spring. On the ensuing possession, Brewer took a shot while attempting a pass and had to be helped from the field.

After Brewer's injury, the Hokies didn't amount much in the way of offense behind untested backup Brenden Motley. Tech amassed just 77 yards of offense after Brewer left the game, though Motley did throw a touchdown pass late in the game to Isaiah Ford.

Miller gave the Buckeyes a 28-17 lead on a 53-yard touchdown run with 2:05 left in the third quarter. Jones' 10-yard touchdown run with 12:26 left in the game essentially put the game

Jones completed 9 of 18 for 186 yards, with two touchdowns and an interception. Ezekiel Elliott rushed for 122 yards on 11 carries, including an 80-yard touchdown run, and Miller rushed for 62 yards on six carries and a touchdown. He also caught two passes for 72 yards and a score. Brewer completed 11 of 16 for 156 yards and two touchdowns for the Hokies. Motley completed 4 of 9 for 36 yards, with a touchdown and an interception.

BLACKSBURG, Va. — Coming off a short week and playing a quarterback who came into the season as the backup left Virginia Tech fans feeling that disaster loomed on the horizon. But Brenden Motley took away those doubts.

Making his first collegiate start, Motley threw two touchdown passes and rushed for a touchdown to lead the Hokies past Furman 42-3 on Saturday afternoon.

Motley started in place of injured Michael Brewer, who broke his collarbone in the Hokies' Monday night loss to No. 1 Ohio State. Brewer underwent surgery on Tuesday and is expected to miss the next 4-6 weeks, perhaps longer.

Enter Motley, a redshirt junior who played his high school ball at nearby Christiansburg High School. He completed 16 of 24 passes for 233 yards, and he also rushed for 38 yards on four

Mostly behind Motley, Virginia Tech (1-1) finished with 583 yards of total offense, the Hokies most in a game since 2010 and their most under offensive coordinator Scot Loeffler, who took over in 2013. Virginia Tech had a balanced attack, running for 299 yards and throwing for 284. Much of that came in the second half. The Hokies had 371 vards in the final 30 minutes, including 200 on the around.

Tech led 14-0 and broke open the game with three third-quarter touchdowns. He threw 1-yard and 32-yard touchdown passes to Isaiah Ford sandwiched around a 1-yard touchdown run by Trey Edmunds — his first touchdown run since November of 2013.

Those touchdowns gave the Hokies a 35-3 advantage going to the fourth guarter. Tech's final score came on a 4-yard run by freshman Dwayne Lawson, arguably the Hokies' top recruit ir the 2015 class.

Andrew Motuapuaka's interception return for a touchdown - his second career touchdown headlined a Tech defense that forced three turnovers and held Furman to 254 yards.

Travon McMillian paced the Hokies' rushing attack with 98 yards on six carries, while Lawson finished with 51 on nine carries. Cam Phillips and Ford each caught five passes for 86 and 77 vards, respectively.
