VT, BEAMER OWN THURSDAY

Since the package's inception in 1991, only Georgia Tech (31st game on Thursday) owns more ESPN Thursday night appearances than Virginia Tech (30). Frank Beamer has led the Hokies to a 20-9 record in those previous 29 games, meaning Georgia Tech is the only other team that has even played as many Thursday night games as VT has won!

VT 5-0 VS. GT ON THURSDAYS

VT owns a 5-0 record in Thursday games vs. GT with the last such meeting resulting in a 17-10 win at GT (9/26/13). VT is 20-9 (.690) in regular season Thursday contests under Frank Beamer, including 11 straight wins from 1998-2005. VT has outscored GT by an average of 12.6 ppg, own a +6 turnover edge and have thrown nine more TD passes and nine fewer INTs in those five victories against the Yellow Jackets.

Beamer Embarks on Farewell Tour, Winningest Active FBS Coach Seeks to Extend VT Bowl Streak

Frank Beamer announced his intention to retire at the conclusion of the 2015 season. VT is seeking a 23rd straight bowl berth. No two current ACC programs own more all-time victories than Virginia Tech (715) and Georgia Tech (714).

- Virginia Tech is coming off a 26-10 win at Boston College (10/31) and is seeking back-to-back ACC wins for the first time in 2015.
- GT halted a five-game losing skid with with a 22-16 win vs. then-No. 9 FSU (10/14), but suffered a 27-21 loss at UVA (10/31). Since joining the ACC in 2004, Virginia Tech (8-3) has the most wins against Georgia Tech of any conference team.
- Dating back to 2004, Miami (6-5) is the only other ACC squad to post a winning record against Georgia Tech.
 - The Yellow Jackets are 22-9 (.710) in home ACC games under Paul Johnson.
- VT ranks third in the ACC in TD passes (18), while Georgia Tech has permitted 10 TD throws this season.
- Virginia Tech is 28-6 (.824) in ACC play when racking up 400+ total net yards, including a 3-1 mark against Georgia Tech. VT is 25-1 (.962) in ACC action with 200+ rushing yards, including a 37-26 win at GT (11/10/11) when VT had 267 ground yards.

17 Points is the Magic Number vs. Yellow Jackets

- VT is 51-6 (.895) all-time in ACC games when holding foes to 17 points or less, including a 25-2 (.926) mark on the road. Georgia Tech is 0-17 vs. FBS foes under Johnson when being held to 17 points or fewer, including three losses vs. VT. Dating back to 2007, GT has lost 10 straight ACC games when scoring 17 points or fewer with four of those losses vs. VT. Virginia Tech is 91-1 (.989) when allowing 10 points or fewer since 1996, including three victories against Georgia Tech. VT is 5-2 against GT since Paul Johnson's arrival in 2008. VT has held the Yellow Jackets to 28 points or fewer in those seven games.
- Georgia Tech is 47-9 (.810) overall and 25-6 (.806) in ACC play under Johnson when scoring 30 points or more.
- In seven contests vs. Power Five foes in 2015, Georgia Tech has been outscored by a 219-168 margin.

Georgia Tech has scored 20 points or more in 23 straight games after suffering a 25-17 loss vs. Ole Miss (12/30/13).

Stopping the Triple Option, Forcing Turnovers Are Keys vs. Georgia Tech VT will seek to contain GT's triple-option offense that ranks fourth among Power Five teams in rushing (267.9 ypg). Only Air Force (5,862 carries - 59.2 per game) has run the ball more than GT (5,651 - 54.9 per game) since 2008. Since the start of the 2008 season, no FBS team has averaged more rushing ypg than Georgia Tech (305.4). Virginia Tech has held Georgia Tech to 249.6 rushing ypg in their seven meetings since Johnson's arrival in 2008. Over that same timeframe, Oregon (323) and Georgia Tech (321) lead all FBS programs in rushing TDs. GT has lost 13 straight when being held under 200 net rush yards. VT and Miami have held GT under 200 twice during that streak. In VT's four wins in 2015, the Hokies are +8 (11 takes/3 gives). In Tech's five losses, the club is -4 (6 takes/10 gives). The Hokies registered four takeaways at BC, including a 34-yard fumble return TD by LB Andrew Motuapokua. GT has thrown six INTs in its past seven games after being picked off six times during the entire 2014 season. Georgia Tech is 5-14 (.263) under Johnson when it doesn't force a turnover, going 0-3 in such games vs. Virginia Tech. VT is 86-8 (.915) in multi-INT games dating back to 1996. No Power Five team owns more INTs (335) or INT return TDs (44) over that span. The Hokies rank second in the ACC with six opponent fumble recoveries and are tied for fifth with seven INTs. Virginia Tech is 19-3 (.864) all-time in ACC play when it doesn't commit a turnover. Georgia Tech has lost seven of its last eight games when attempting 15 or more passes.

Final Takeaways on Hokies, Yellow Jackets

- VT has prevented GT from throwing multiple TDs in eight straight meetings (last time 2 GT TD passes on 9/30/06). Virginia Tech WR Isaiah Ford ranks third in the ACC in rec. ypg (70.5) and fifth in receptions per game (5.1).
- Virginia Tech DB Chuck Clark (73) is tied for seventh in the ACC in tackles.

#TRAVONTIME

RB Travon McMillian is averaging 110.5 rushing ypg the past four games, including back-to-back 100-yard games. His 5.5 yards per carry average ranks third among Power Flve freshmen with a minimum of 120 carries. Dating back to his 96-yard effort vs. NCSU (10/9), only three ACC rushers have a better ypg average.



HEAD COACH FRANK BEAMER

Frank Beamer (Virginia Tech '69), whose Virginia Tech teams have posted a 211-80 record over the past 22-plus seasons and have appeared in bowl games each year in that span, is in his 29th year as the head football coach at Tech and 35th overall. Beamer has guided the Hokies to a 235-120-2 record and sits with an overall record of 277-143-4.

Under Beamer, Tech football has enjoyed unprecedented success with 22 consecutive bowl appearances, four ACC titles, five ACC Coastal Division crowns, three BIG EAST Conference titles, two "major" bowl victories, six BCS appearances and a trip to the national championship game.

Tech won the BIG EAST title in 1995 and 1999, and shared it in '96. Beamer was voted BIG EAST Coach of the Year by the league's coaches each of those seasons and was tabbed the Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year in both 2004 and 2005.

In 1997, he was inducted into the Virginia Tech Sports Hall of Fame, becoming the first active coach at the university to be honored in that fashion. Following the 1999 season, he earned eight national coach of the year honors.

During his undergraduate days at Tech, Beamer started three years as a cornerback and played on the Hokies' 1966 and 1968 Liberty Bowl teams.

The 69-year-old Hillsville, Virginia, product began as an assistant at Radford High School from 1969 through 1971. Then, after one season as a graduate assistant at the University of Maryland, he went to The Citadel where he worked five seasons under Bobby Ross and one year under Art Baker. His last two years at The Citadel, Beamer was the defensive coordinator. In 1979, he went to Murray State as the defensive coordinator under Mike Gottfried. He was named head coach at MSU in 1981 and went on to compile a six-year record of 42-23-2.

He is married to the former Cheryl Oakley of Richmond, Virginia. They have two children, Shane, a former member of his dad's football team at Virginia Tech and now the associate head coach/running backs coach at Virginia Tech; and daughter Casey, a 2003 graduate of Tech. He has four grandchildren, Sutton, Olivia and Hunter, children of Shane and his wife, Emily. Casey, who married former Virginia Tech wrestler Canaan Prater in 2012, had her first son, Hudson, in February.

Beamer was born in Mt. Airy, North Carolina, and grew up in Hillsville, Virginia. At Hillsville High, he earned 11 varsity letters as a three-sport athlete in football, basketball and baseball.

An avid NASCAR fan, Beamer has been the official starter for races at Bristol Motor Speedway, Martinsville Speedway and Richmond International Raceway.

Beamer had his No. 25 jersey retired by Tech in a pregame ceremony before the Marshall game in 2002.

SPRING ROAD ON VIRGINIA TECH CAMPUS RENAMED 'BEAMER WAY'

In appreciation for his many years of service and extraordinary contributions to university life, the Virginia Tech Board of Visitors renamed Spring Road in honor of Frank Beamer on Aug. 6, 2015. Recognizing contributions made both on and off the field by head football coach Beamer and his wife, Cheryl, Spring Road, which runs alongside the west stands and press box of Lane Stadium, is now known as Beamer Way. The official athletics department street address is 25 Beamer Way in recognition of Frank Beamer's jersey number when he played football for Tech from 1966-68. VT President Dr. Timothy Sands and VT Director of Athletics Whit Babcock made the official presentation in front of the football team in a team meeting on the eve of the start of preseason practice.

STABILITY AT THE TOP OF VIRGINIA TECH PROGRAM

Frank Beamer, the first Tech alumnus to guide Virginia Tech's football program since the 1940s, has coached and won more football games at Tech than any other head coach. Not one of the 128 active FBS head football coaches has been at his current school longer than Beamer, who is in his 29th year at Tech. He is the longest consecutive tenured coach at the same school by a full 12 years (Oklahoma's Bob Stoops & Iowa's Kirk Ferentz - 17th seasons).

During Beamer's 28 previous years at Tech, 20 different power conference schools have had six or more head coaches, including five schools in the ACC: Pittsburgh (8), Boston College (7), Louisville (7), North Carolina (7) and Miami (6). Three schools - Pitt, Stanford and Vanderbilt - have had eight different coaches during the time Beamer has been the head coach at Tech. Since the end of the 2009 season, there have been 140 new head coaches hired to start a season.

BLACKSBURG – For the second straight week, Virginia Tech suffered a last-minute loss at Lane Stadium/Worsham Field. This time it came when Georgia Tech's Harrison Butker booted a 24-yard field goal as time expired to give the Yellow Jackets a 27-24 Atlantic Coast Conference road win in the league opener for both teams. Georgia Tech turned three pass interceptions into 17 points with the final pick at the Hokies' 40-yard-line setting up the winning drive with 1:58 remaining. The Jackets' second pick of the game was returned for a touchdown, giving the visitors a 17-16 lead with 11:22 left in the game.

Virginia Tech put together a seven-play, 75-yard drive to take back the lead, 24-17, with 8:03 remaining. The Hokies halted Georgia Tech on its next possession but were unable to capitalize. The Yellow Jackets went on to tie the game with a nine play, 67-yard drive that was kept alive by a clutch 19-yard pass by quarterback Justin Thomas on a 4th-and-15 play.

Georgia Tech won despite converting on just four of 12 third-down situations. The Yellow Jackets rushed for 250 yards in the game and finished with 375 yards of total offense. Despite the interceptions, the Hokies finished with 297 yards passing and 424 yards overall. Freshman wide receiver Isaiah Ford had career highs of eight catches and 114 yards receiving.

GAME NOTES

- Virginia Tech has lost home games on consecutive weeks for the first time since opening the 1995 season with back-to-back losses to Boston College and Cincinnati.
- Hokie linebacker Chase Williams posted a career-high 17 tackles against the Yellow Jackets.

•Truefreshmen receivers Cam Phillips and Isaiah Ford both got starts in the game, making them the first two true freshmen wide receivers to start in a game since 2008, when Jarrett Boykin and Dyrell Roberts both drew starts against North Carolina.

• The Georgia Tech game marked the Hokies' 1,200th football game. •Sophomore defensive tackle Woody Baron and junior defensive back Donovan Riley made their first starts for the Hokies against the Yellow Jackets.

MADDY APPROACHES GAMES PLAYED RECORD

Former long snapper Collin Carroll played in a school record 55 consecutive games, from Aug. 30, 2008 to Jan. 3, 2012, which was every game of his four-year career. That 55 games played school record for Carroll is in jeopardy. Defensive lineman Luther Maddy enters the Georgia Tech game with 52 career games played, over his five-year career. Maddy played in 13 games as a freshman, sophomore and junior, and the first four games last season, his senior year, before suffering a season-ending injury. He was granted a medical hardship waiver and able to play a fifth year. With three more scheduled games remaining, Maddy has a chance to tie Carroll for the most games ever played in a career at Virginia Tech. With the bowl berth on the line, the redshirt-senior from Delray Beach, Florida, could become the all-time leader in games played as a Hokie with 56.

FRESHMEN ANSWERING THE CALL TO START

In all, nine true freshman have seen the field for the Hokies this fall. In alphabetical order, they include: Adonis Alexander, Jahque Alleyne, Xavier Burke, Tremaine Edmunds, Dwayne Lawson, Carson Lydon, Yosuah Nijman, Steven Peoples and Mook Reynolds. Two of them - Alexander (6) and Reynolds (2) have combined to make eight starts.

To put it in perspective over the past few seasons, in 2014, a total of 10 true freshman played for the Hokies with four of them combining for 31 starts. The list of starters include current Hokies: Isaiah Ford (11), Cam Phillips (9), Marshawn Williams (8) and Greg Stroman (1).

In 2013, 11 true freshman played for Tech, the most in head coach Frank Beamer's 29 seasons in Blacksburg, and those players combined for over 50 starts that season. Those include current Hokies in the junior class: Jonathan McLaughlin (13), Kendall Fuller (12), Chuck Clark (2) and Sam Rogers (2), and those who are redshirt-sophomores: Brandon Facyson (9) and Kalvin Cline (7).

DOUBLE DIGITS MAKE FIRST STARTS IN 2015

This season has now seen 11 Hokies make their first collegiate starts during the 2015, with the latest being redshirt-sophomore Anthony Shegog, who started his first game of his career at Boston College on Oct. 31. Below is the list of Hokies, who made their first starts in 2015.

INJURIES TO STARTERS

The Hokies have lost four preseason starters from their original depth chart this season to injury, either for a couple of games or for the season. The four does not include running backs Marshawn Williams and Shai McKenzie, who were lost to injury before the season began.

Michael Brewer, r-Sr., QB: suffered a broken left collarbone after taking a hit early in the third quarter of the seasonopening game versus Ohio State ... missed six starts. Kyle Fuller, Jr., DB: suffered a right knee injury during preseason camp ... battled through the first three games, but is out for the rest of the season ... missed six starts.

Andrew Motuapuaka, r-So., LB: suffered an MCL sprain in his left knee and missed two starts - at Purdue and vs. ECU.

Corey Marshall, r-Sr., DL: suffered a hamstring injury and has missed three of the last four games and played just one snap versus Pittsburgh and eight snaps versus Duke.

STABILITY UP FRONT

Through nine games, Tech's offensive line has certainly become a source of stability for the team. Consider this, only six players have started every game this year on offense and four of them are on the line. In fact, except for the NC State game, the five positions have all featured the same starters (Wyatt Teller did not start versus the Wolfpack, but did play 64 of 68 plays) and they are certainly building for the future Only right tackle Wade Hansen is a senior, and through some realignment is spelled by true freshman Yosuah Nijman, for almost 200 plays this year. The chart on the left, below and on page 10 detail the offensive line starts, stats and plays.

CONSECUTIVE STARTS STREAK CONTINUES

A couple of Hokies saw their consecutive starts streak end this season - most notably Michael Brewer and Kendall Fuller, however three members of the defense have pushed their streak into the 20s.

Seniors Deon Clarke and Dadi Nicolas along with redshirtjunior Ken Ekanem all have reached 22 straight starts for the Hokies, while junior Chuck Clark will look to start his 20th straight game on Thursday at Georgia Tech.

On the offensive side of the ball, senior Ryan Malleck holds the longest consecutive start streak, which stands at 18 straight games entering Thursday. Sophomore Bucky Hodges is the only other Hokie on either offense or defense with a streak in double figures with 11.

HUGHES TACKS ON SCHOOL RECORDS FOR PUNTING

Tech punter A.J. Hughes entered his senior season as the school's all-time leader in career punts and punting yardage. Recently, he passed the 12,000-yard milestone for punting yards and now has 12,026, which is also the second-most ever in the history of the ACC. His 288 career punts are also the second most, trailing only current Wake Forest punter Alexander Kinal, who is more than 30 punts and 1,000 yards better than Hughes.

However, Hughes' 41.76 career punting average is a shade better than Kinal's and is 28th all-time in the ACC record books. In Tech's history, the mark is currently tied for third.

MCMILLIAN PUSHES TOWARDS 700 YARDS

Entering the Georgia Tech game, redshirt-freshman Travon McMillian has rushed for 665 yards on the ground, which currently leads the team. With just 11 yards, he will surpass the most yards rushed in a single season by a Hokie over the past four years, as David Wilson had 1,709 yards in 2011 and the most since then was Trey Edmunds' 675 in 2013. If McMillian nets more than 35 yards on the ground, he will push past 700 rushing yards for the season and will jump into the ACC record book section. Currently, the conference lists the 35 best single season rushing yard performances by freshman and at No. 35 is Virginia's Billy Copeland, who had 700 on the nose back in 1973. The list rises all the way up to a pair of Hokie backs, Ryan Williams (1,655, 2009) and Darren Evans (1,265) who are No. 1 and 2 on the list. Only nine freshmen have ever reached the 1,000 rushing yard plateau.

MORE ON MCMILLIAN

McMillian, who had games with 98, 96 and 99 rushing yards, finally broke through with his first 100-yard game of his career against Duke (10/24) with a 142-yard effort. He then went for 105 at Boston College (10/31) to become the first freshman to register back-to-back 100-yard rushing games since Ryan Williams had five straight to end the 2009 season. With another 100-yard performance in tonight's game at Georgia Tech, McMillian would become the first Tech running back with three straight since David Wilson, who went seven straight games with a 100-yard performance in 2011.

THERE'S A FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

For the season, Brenden Motley has thrown for 1,155 yards and 11 touchdowns, which currently leads the team. Michael Brewer, who missed six starts due to injury, returned to the starting lineup and enters this week's game with 671 yards passing and seven touchdowns.

A quick glance at the Tech history books indicates that the closest any two quarterbacks have come to either both throwing for 1,000 yards in the same season or both reaching the 10 TDs thrown plateau was back in 2007. That season, Sean Glennon led the team with 1,796 yards passing and 12 TDs, while Tyrod Taylor threw for 927 yards and five TDs.

THERE'S A FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING, TOO

Glennon and Taylor are the only set of Tech QBs to each have multiple 200-yard passing games in the same season, as Glennon had four during the 2007 season and Taylor had two. Currently, Motley leads the team with three 200-yard passing games this season and, against Duke (10/24), Brewer notched his first. Brewer had five last season, including 297 versus Georgia Tech and 235 versus Virginia (two opponents the Hokies will still face this season). If he gets to three, the 2015 season will mark the first time two different QBs each passed for at least 200 yards in three different games.

THERE'S A FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING, THREE

For the third time in the Beamer era, five Hokies have completed at least one pass during the season. One more player this year, would make it six for the first time. The first time was in 1989, when three QBs each completed passes: Cam Young (62 completions), Will Furrer (45) and Rodd Wooten (28). WR Kevin Bennett went 1 for 2 for 32 yards and a TD, while WR Tony Kennedy was 1 for 6 for six yards. The second time was last year, with QBs Michael Brewer (262), Mark Leal (6) and Brenden Motley (1) all completing passes. The other two were WR Isaiah Ford, who was 1 of 1 for 30 yards and P A.J. Hughes, who was also 1 for 1 for 10 yards. This season, outside of QBs Brewer (53), Motley (92) and Dwayne Lawson (3), Ford has done it again, going 1 of 2 for 14 yards and FB Sam Rogers in 1 for 1 for 13 yards.

BREWER MOVING INTO THE TOP 10 AT TECH

Speaking of Michael Brewer, he enters Thursday's game with 3,363 passing yards, which is less than 200 yards shy of reaching the top 10 in passing yards at Tech (in less than two full seasons). With 184 yards, he would pass Mark Cox (1981-85) for 10th on the list.

Meanwhile, his 25 touchdown passes are already 10th on the career list at Tech and with three more, he would tie Sean Glennon (2004-08) for the ninth-most at the school.

MOTUAPUAKA SCORING THROUGH BEAMERBALL

With his 34-yard fumble return for a touchdown at Boston College (10/31), redshirt-sophomore Andrew Motuapuaka has now scored three TDs in his Tech career, joining a very select company. Only eight other Hokies have scored three or more defensive or special teams TDs (under Beamer).

HODGES, PHILLIPS CAN ALSO CATCH THE BALL

Below, is a detailed summary of what sophomore Isaiah Ford has done so far in his Tech career. However, fellow classmates Bucky Hodges and Cam Phillips aren't too far behind when it comes to catches and yards receiving.

Thanks to a six-catch, 87 yard game in his last outing at Boston College (10/31), Phillips has now caught 74 career catches (22nd all-time at Tech) for 908 career yards (26th). Hodges, who enjoyed a five-catch, career-high 101-yard effort versus Duke (10/24), is sitting with 69 career receptions (23rd all-time) for 909 career yards (25th). He adds 12 TD catches, which is tied for ninth all-time.

Each has a shot at the 1,000-yardage milestone this season, only four Hokies have reached it as sophomores.

FORD CHANGING AND CHASING THE HISTORY BOOKS

Sophomore Isaiah Ford is quickly moving up many of the career records' list at the school and his numbers even through two seasons are approaching or are already the best at the school.

Consider these:

FASTEST PLAYER TO 10 TD CATCHES By game is now Ford, 19 games, passing

Andre' Davis who did it in 20 games.

FASTEST PLAYER TO 1,000 REC. YARDS By game is now Ford, 17 games, passing Davis, who did it in 19 games.

FASTEST PLAYER TO 100 RECEPTIONS

Is now Ford, who caught No. 100 in his 22nd game played and passed former Tech receiver Jarrett Boykin, who took 35 games. Ford has now also put up the best numbers by a Tech wide receiver through a sophomore season at the school (under Beamer). Consider these:

MOST TOUCHDOWN CATCHES

Ford tops the list with 13, but is being chased by Bucky Hodges, who has 12. The previous high was nine by Andre' Davis.

MOST RECEPTIONS

Ford tops this list as well, with his 100 catches, passing Boykin, who caught 70 through his sophomore season. Cam Phillips is now second with 74, while Hodges has 69.

MOST RECEIVING YARDS

Ford again at the top of the list with 1,324 yards, besting Boykin's 1,276 yards.

SLYE SCORING POINTS NAMED SEMINFINALIST

The Palm Beach County Sports Commission released its 20 semifinalists for the 2015 Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award presented by the Orange Bowl. The 20 kickers, which included Virginia Tech sophomore Joey Slye.

Slye has made 15 of 20 field goals this season, 15 of 17 inside of 50 yards, and is 35 of 41 from that distance in his career at Tech. He has also converted on all 27 extra-point attempts this season and has made 46 straight. The Stafford, Virginia, native booted four field goals at Boston College last Saturday, which tied his career high for makes (vs. Cincinnati, 12/27/14), and five times this season has made at least two field goals in a game. He currently

leads the Hokies with 72 points. He's already moved up to 15th place on the school's all-time scoring list with 165 points, 11 shy of Roscoe Coles (1974-77). Slye is eighth among kickers, with Don Wade (1981-84) next on that list with 224 points.

NICOLAS, MADDY ON ACC ACTIVE CAREER LISTS

Speaking of the ACC record books, both Dadi Nicolas and Luther Maddy are currently in the top five for active leaders in both tackles for loss and quarterback sacks.

• Since the start of the 2000 season, the Hokies are 45-0 when rushing 50 times or more in a non-OT game (last loss: 1999 national championship game to FSU; rushed 52 times).

ALL SCORERS RETURNED

• Every single Hokie who scored a point last season for the Virginia Tech Hokies - a total of 313 points - returned in 2015. The list includes 14 players - three who were on defense and another on special teams.

• The Hokies' top scorer was kicker **Joey Slye**, who connected on 20-of-28 fields goals and converted 33-of-34 on extra points for 93 points.

• Bucky Hodges led the team in touchdowns, catching seven touchdown passes in 2014 - a Tech single-season record for tight ends, while also adding a TD on a blocked punt in the end zone against Virginia. He also caught a two-point conversion attempt to give him 50 points for the year.

• **Ryan Malleck** contributed a pair of TD grabs to give the tight end position a total of nine TD catches for the season.

• Third on the list overall was **Isaiah Ford**, who as a freshman, hauled in six touchdown passes, while classmate **Cam Phillips** snagged three.

• On the ground, Marshawn Williams led the way with four touchdown runs, while Shai McKenzie (3) and J.C. Coleman (2).

• Quarterback **Michael Brewer** had two rushing touchdowns and fullback **Sam Rogers** added one.

• On the defensive side of the ball, and one from special teams, there were an additional four Hokies who scored touchdowns. **Donovan Riley** and **Kendall Fuller** each reached the end zone after an interception, while **Andrew Motuapuaka** (on kickoff coverage) and **Greg Stroman** each hit paydirt on fumble returns.

THE STORIED LUNCH PAIL

• Taken with the Hokies wherever they go is the storied lunch pail. The Pail served as the inspiration for Tech's record-setting 1995 defense, symbolizing Tech's blue collar approach to defensive football. Every year since, a member of the defense has been responsible for toting a new Pail.

• Coach Rod Sharpless, then the co-defensive coordinator along with Bud Foster, brought a lunch pail back from New Jersey and they decided that it would become the symbol of the 1995 defense. Sharpless' mother-in-law found the now famous original lunch pail in Mercerville, N.J., where it had belonged to a coal miner.

• The players put the unit goals, weekly goals, the keys to success for the week and a signed mission statement before the season in the Pail ... plus the turf from any road wins. Also included in the Pail is the list of names of the 32 fallen Hokies from the April 16, 2008 tragedy.

EDMUNDS BROTHERS RARE FEAT

Just after Virginia Tech's first touchdown against Ohio State on Sept. 7, the Edmunds brothers - Terrell, Tremaine and Trey - became just the third trio of brothers to take the field together at the same time in the same game for a major college football program dating back to 1970. The first to accomplish this rarest of feats was the Selmon brothers at Oklahoma when Lee Roy, Lucious and Dewey all played for the Sooners' defense during the 1972 and 1973 seasons. They were followed in 2010 and 2011 by the McCray brothers - Cliff, Jordan and Justin - who all played on the offensive line together at UCF. During the 2015 season, the Edmunds are regularly appearing together on the special teams kickoff coverage team.



VIRGINIA TECH'S 265-GAME SCORING STREAK

Virginia Tech's current scoring streak started in 1995 and currently stands as the 12th-longest streak in FBS history, and the sixth-longest active streak in the FBS. During the run, Tech scored on its first offensive possession 86 times, plus another five occasions* where it scored on returns on its first touch of the game. The Hokies have scored in the first quarter 191 times during the streak, and have extended it by halftime in 252 of the 265 games. During the streak, the Hokies have posted 28 shutouts by their defense.

Here's the year-by-year breakdown (* - blocked punt recovery in the end zone against Akron in 1995; an interception return at Clemson in 2007; an interception return against Boston College in 2008; a blocked punt return against Marshall in 2013; and a fumble return on the opening kickoff of the 2014 Western Michigan game):

Virginia Tech has a 194-71 record during the streak, averaging 33.8 points in the wins and 19.8 points in the losses. The Hokies have only on six occasions delayed extending the streak until the fourth quarter or overtime. The last time came in 2014 in an overtime loss at Wake Forest. The latest Tech scored its first points in a game was in overtime in 2014 at Wake Forest (a 0-0 tie after four quarters). Rising high into the mountainous sky of the New River Valley, Virginia Tech's Lane Stadium enters its 51st year of football competition in 2015. The Tech football team has enjoyed over two decades of success, going to 22 straight bowl games and winning 10 or more games eight straight seasons from 2004-11. A big part of that success is the home-field advantage the Hokies enjoy at Lane Stadium/Worsham Field.

Billed as the toughest place in college football for opponents to play by Rivals.com in 2005 and one of the scariest places to play by ESPN.com in 2007, the Hokies play not only on one of the best playing surfaces in the nation, but with the south end zone and west side additions, the Hokies compete in one of the best stadiums in the nation.

Sitting at roughly 2,057 feet above sea level, the stadium is the second-highest among all FBS schools in the eastern United States, trailing only Appalachian State (3,300). Completed in 1965, Lane Stadium/Worsham Field has gone through numerous changes, renovations and additions. But through it all, it has always been regarded as one of the finest places to watch - and toughest places for opponents to play - a college football game.

A WINNING TRADITION

On Sept. 22, 1994, Tech won its 100th game in Lane Stadium in memorable fashion before a national television audience on ESPN with a 34-6 win over rival West Virginia. On Nov. 1, 2003, Tech upset No. 2 Miami 31-7 to pick up its 150th all-time win at Lane Stadium, marking the highest-ranked opponent the Hokies have ever defeated - home or on the road.

Tech's overall record entering the 2015 season at Lane Stadium was 208 wins, 77 losses and six ties in 50 years of play. The Hokies entered the year 134-40-1 at home during Coach Frank Beamer's tenure at Virginia Tech and more impressively, were 116-26 in Blacksburg during the previous 22 seasons (during its current bowl run).

In terms of conference success, Tech entered the season 32-12 in ACC home games and was 32-9 as a member of the BIG EAST. A large part of that impressive record is the home-field environment created by the fans, as Lane Stadium was sold out for 94 consecutive games, starting with the final game of the 1998 season against Virginia and running through the 2012 season.

THE HOKIE STONE

Before each home football game, Virginia Tech football players and coaching staff enter Lane Stadium through a tunnel. On the stadium-side entrance to Worsham Field, they pass beneath a Hokie Stone, which they touch for good luck and is flanked by these words: "For those who have passed. For those to come ... Reach for Excellence."

ENTER SANDMAN

The history behind Virginia Tech's use of Metallica's "Enter Sandman" started during the 2000 season. That summer Tech added a new scoreboard to Lane Stadium and the athletics marketing team decided to use the scoreboard for an entrance video. The group considered "Welcome to the Jungle" by Guns N' Roses and "Sirius" by the Alan Parsons Project before settling on "Enter Sandman." It has been the entrance song for the Hokies ever since.

THE BATTLE AT BRISTOL VIRGINIA TECH vs. TENNESSEE - SEPT. 10, 2016

On Oct. 14, 2013, Virginia Tech and Tennessee announced plans to play a non-conference football game at the Bristol Motor Speedway in 2016 at a joint news conference held at the speedway – a game that was dubbed as the "Battle at Bristol."

The Bristol Motor Speedway will become a football venue next year when the Hokies take on neighboring Tennessee – the two schools are just 236 miles apart – in a non-conference tilt. Track officials anticipate the Sept. 10, 2016 game will break college football's all-time single-game attendance mark. The current record occurred in 2013 when Michigan and Notre Dame played in front of 115,109 fans at Michigan Stadium. The Bristol Motor Speedway is close to a 160,000-seat venue.

The marketing campaign for the game took another step when track general manager Jerry Caldwell, NASCAR Xfinity Series driver Ty Dillon and Derek Vaughan, an engineer with Richard Childress Racing — and a Virginia Tech graduate (mechanical engineering, class of 1998) — along with other BMS officials came to Blacksburg on Aug. 11 of this year to promote the game. The group toured Tech's facilities, met with athletics department personnel, including AD Whit Babcock and head football coach Frank Beamer, and answered questions from the media. Dillon and Vaughan also caught passes and ran drills with assistant head coach Shane Beamer and some of Tech's players.

JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its named to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today. Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.


WHAT'S A HOKIE?


That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body. Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today.

Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. Following is the "Old Hokie" yell in its original form:



WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. — Tech quarterback Brenden Motley threw two touchdown passes and ran for one, and Tech's defense and special teams also scored as the Hokies pulled away from the Boilermakers 51-24 at Ross-Ade Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

With the win, Tech moved to 2-1 on the season. Purdue fell to 1-2.

Motley, making his second straight in place of injured quarterback Michael Brewer, completed 15 of 23 for 220 yards, with the touchdown and no interceptions. Behind Motley, Tech amassed 471 yards of total offense – a balanced 238 rushing and 233 passing – and played the main role in the Hokies scoring 27 straight points to break open a close game.

Defensively, Chuck Clark returned a fumble for a touchdown for the Hokies, and Terrell Edmunds' blocked punt in the third quarter was returned by Anthony Shegog for a touchdown.

This game marked the first time since the Clemson game in 2007 that the Hokies scored in all three phases of the game.

Tech grabbed the lead for good on a 5-yard touchdown run by Motley with 1:08 left in the first half that gave the Hokies a 24-17 edge. The Hokies then put the game away with 17 third-quarter points.

An 82-yard kickoff return by Der'Woun Greene to open the second half led to a 42-yard field goal by Joey Slye that gave the Hokies a 27-17 lead. Then on Tech's next possession, a 42-yard drive ended when J.C. Coleman scored from a yard out. Slye's extra point gave Tech a 34-17 bulge with 5:10 left in the third quarter.

The Hokies closed the quarter with Edmunds' blocked punt. Shegog picked up the loose ball and ran it back 15 yards for a touchdown, and Slye's extra point gave the Hokies a 41-17 advantage with a minute left in the quarter.

Slye added a field goal in the fourth quarter and a 3-yard touchdown pass from Motley to Bucky Hodges – their second hookup of the day – accounted for the final margin.

Tech's defense held the Boilermakers to just 265 yards of offense. Purdue quarterback Austin Appleby completed just 9 of 28 for 110 yards, with two interceptions.

Slye made three field goals for the Hokies, who also got six receptions and 128 yards from Isaiah Ford. Trey Edmunds paced Tech's 238-yard rushing day with 72 yards on nine carries.

GAME FOUR VIRGINIA TECH 28 EAST CAROLINA 35 Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium • Greenville, N.C. • September 26, 2015 • Attendance: 50,514

GREENVILLE, N.C. — East Carolina quarterback James Summers rushed for 169 yards and threw for 110 yards, helping the Pirates rally from a 14-0 deficit to beat Virginia Tech 35-28 in a non-conference game at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium on Saturday.

The loss marked the Hokies' second straight to the Pirates, who downed the Tech in Blacksburg last year. Tech lost in Greenville, North Carolina, for the first time since 1992.

"The good thing for us is we're getting ready to enter conference play," Tech coach Frank Beamer said. "Everything is still there ... the ACC championship, the Orange Bowl ... the whole deal is still there. But we've got to become a better football team to enter into that mix. It's vey obvious what we need to do."

East Carolina scored 28 consecutive points at one stretch after the Hokies scored two touchdowns off Pirate turnovers.

Tech trailed 35-21 after a 41-yard touchdown run by Summers with 3:43 left in the third quarter. The Hokies cut into that lead, getting a 5-yard touchdown run by Brenden Motley with 8:18 left in the game. The big play came on a 60-yard completion from Motley to Cam Phillips, and the touchdown capped a 95-yard drive.

Tech had two more chances to score in the final five minutes. One drive ended when Bucky Hodges couldn't corral a fourth-down pass from Motley that would have given the Hokies a first down in ECU territory. The final chance came at the end of the game when Tech got the ball to its 41 and tried a "Hail Mary" that fell incomplete.

Motley led the Hokies with 366 of their 439 yards of offense. He completed 20 of 35 for 281 yards, with a touchdown and an interception. He also rushed for 85 yards and a score.

Summers, who went into the game as the backup to Blake Kemp, rushed for his 169 yards on 21 carries, and he completed 5 of 8 for the 110 yards and a score. East Carolina finished 410 yards.

BLACKSBURG — Pittsburgh rushed for 166 yards and its defense held the Hokies in check for much of the game, enabling the Panthers to knock off Virginia Tech 17-13 in the ACC opener for both schools. The win marked just Pittsburgh's second in Blacksburg — the other one came in 2002 — and sent the Hokies to their second straight loss. Pittsburgh is now 3-1 overall. 1-0 in the ACC. Tech is 2-3. 0-1.

Tech cut a 17-10 lead to 17-13 on a 48-yard field goal by Joey Slye with 13:20, but the Hokies couldn't get any closer. Their next three drives ended in an interception, a punt and an interception. Tech finished with only 100 yards of total offense, including just nine rushing. Brenden Motley was sacked seven times, and he completed 9 of 20 for 91 yards, with a touchdown and three interceptions.

Pittsburgh finished with 276 yards of offense. Tailback Qadree Ollison rushed for 122 yards on 19 carries and a touchdown. Peterman completed 9 of 15 for 110 yards, with the touchdown and no interceptions. Pittsburgh only turned the ball over once.

Tech trailed the entire game, spotting the Panthers a 10-0 lead in the first quarter, with Pittsburgh getting a 45-yard field goal from Chris Blewitt and a 23-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Nate Peterman to tight end J.P. Holtz.

Off to a slow start, the Hokies finally put together a good drive spanning the first and second quarters. A 12-play, 83-yard drive that took more than six minutes ended when Motley hit Cam Phillips for an 11-yard touchdown play. The big play on the drive, though came two plays earlier when, on third-and-17 from the Pittsburgh 40, Motley completed a 28-yard pass to tight end Bucky Hodges for a first down. Slye's extra point following the touchdown cut the Pittsburgh lead to 10-7 with 11:38 left in the half.

Pittsburgh wasted little time in getting going in the second half. Ollison rumbled 43 yards on the Panthers' first play from scrimmage, giving Pittsburgh a first down at the Tech 25. On the next play, he scored, and Blewitt's extra point gave the Panthers a 17-7 lead.

Tech sliced into that lead midway through the third quarter. Andrew Motuapuaka forced Ollison to fumble, and the Hokies' Terrell Edmunds recovered and returned it to the Pittsburgh 23. The drive stalled, but the Hokies got a 43-yard field goal from Joey Slye to cut the lead to 17-10 with 6:03 left in the third quarter.

That turned out to be their last score. On the final eight plays from scrimmage, Tech's offense turned the ball over twice and gave up three sacks.

GAME SIX NC STATE 12 VIRGINIA TECH

Lane Stadium • Blacksburg, Va. • October 9, 2015 • Attendance: 61,183

BLACKSBURG – Virginia Tech quarterback Brenden Motley threw three touchdown passes to Isaiah Ford, and the Hokies rushed for 200 yards, as they notched a much-needed 28-13 victory over ACC foe NC State on Friday night.

For the second straight game, Tech found itself behind 10-0 in the first half. NC State got on the board on its opening drive, getting a 33-yard field goal by Kyle Bambard and an 8-yard scoring pass from quarterback Jacoby Brissett to Jumichael Ramos.

But Tech's defense responded after that, holding the Wolfpack to just a field goal the rest of the game. In fact, the Wolfpack amassed just 125 yards in the final three quarters and finished with just 270 yards for the game.

The Hokies' defense also held NC State quarterback Jacoby Brissett in check. Brissett threw for just 113 yards and his streak of passes without an interception ended at 241 when Adonis Alexander intercepted him in the fourth quarter.

Tech's offense exploded in the second quarter, scoring on three straight possessions – all ending on touchdown passes from Motley to Ford. Motley's 27-yard touchdown pass to Ford with 10:41 left in the first half cut the NC State lead to 10-7 and then his 5-yard touchdown pass to Ford with 5:54 left in the first half gave Tech a lead it would not relinquish.

A 2-yard touchdown pass to Ford with 18 seconds left gave the Hokies a 21-10 lead at halftime. Ford became the first Tech receiver since Ernest Wilford in 2002 (Syracuse) to catch at least three touchdown passes in a game. Wilford caught four in the Hokies' triple overtime loss to the Orangemen.

NC State added a field goal in the third quarter, but the Hokies put the game way midway through the fourth quarter. Leading 21-13 and taking over at their own 12, they drove to their own 41 before Motley handed the ball off to Travon McMillian on a second-down play. McMillian broke down the left sideline, hurdled a tackler and went 59 yards for a touchdown that gave Tech a 28-13 lead with 6:54 left in the game.

NC State tried to respond, driving to the Tech 32. But on fourth down, quarterback Jacoby Brissett's pass in the end zone was broke up by the Hokies' Brandon Facyson, and Tech took over on downs, essentially sealing the game.

Tech finished with 358 yards of offense. Motley completed 14 of 28 for 158 yards, with the three touchdown passes to Ford and no interceptions. McMillian set career highs in yards (96) and carries (11).

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. — Virginia Tech turned the ball over four times, and that turned out to be the difference in the game, as Miami converted those turnovers into 10 points and knocked off the Hokies 30-20 in an ACC game played Saturday at Sun Life Stadium.

With the loss, the Hokies fell to 3-4 on the season, 1-2 in ACC play. Miami moved to 4-2 overall, 1-1 in the league.

Michael Brewer, who hadn't played since fracturing his clavicle in the season opener against Ohio State, came into this game toward the end of the third quarter after starter Brenden Motley had committed his third turnover. A Motley interception with 3:34 left in the third led to a 21-yard field goal by Miami kicker Michael Badgley that gave the 'Canes a 23-13 lead with 58 seconds left in the quarter.

The Hokies managed to slice into Miami's lead on a 33-yard pass from Brewer to Isaiah Ford, and Joey Slye's extra point cut the lead to 23-20 with 7:20 remaining.

But Tech's defense couldn't get a stop. Miami drove 75 yards in nine plays on the ensuing possession and scored on a 2-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Brad Kaaya to Rashawn Scott with 2:44 remaining. Badgley's extra point basically sealed the game.

The Hokies finished the game with 361 yards of offense. Motley completed 14 of 23 for 136 yards, with a touchdown and two interceptions, while Brewer completed 3 of 4 for 65 yards, with a touchdown and an interception. Tailback Travon McMillian led the Hokies' ground game with a career-best 99 yards, and he also caught a touchdown pass from Motley

Kaaya paced Miami's attack. He completed 19 of 30 for 296 yards, with two touchdowns and no interceptions. Miami finished with 395 yards of offense.

Motley's fumble on the second play from scrimmage led to a 3-yard touchdown run by Miami tailback Joe Yearby to give the 'Canes a 7-0 lead. The two teams then swapped field goals before the Hokies tied the game on Motley's 9-yard touchdown pass to McMillian.

Tech appeared to be in great shape heading into halftime, tied with Miami at 13. The 'Canes faced a third-and-20 from their own 11, but quarterback Brad Kaaya completed a 45-yard pass to Herb Waters. Three plays later, a roughing-the-passer penalty on Tech gave the 'Canes 15 more yards.

In the end, Miami took advantage of Tech's mistakes. With 4 seconds left, Kaaya threw a 7-yard touchdown pass to Rashawn Scott, and the extra point gave Miami a 20-13 lead at the break.

GAME EIGHT No. 23 DUKE **VIRGINIA TECH**

Lane Stadium • Blacksburg, Va. • October 24, 2015 • Attendance: 63,257

BLACKSBURG — Virginia Tech tailback Travon McMillian rushed for a career-high 142 yards, but it wasn't enough as the Hokies came up on the losing end of a 45-43 four-overtime affair with the No. 23 Duke Blue Devils on Saturday afternoon at Lane Stadium.

Duke quarterback Thomas Sirk threw a 25-yard touchdown pass to Erich Schneider in the fourth overtime and then ran in the two-point conversion to give the wild win in the first four-overtime game in ACC history.

With the loss, Tech fell to 3-5 overall, 1-3 in the ACC. Duke moved to 6-1 overall, 3-0 in league play. The Hokies had taken a 43-37 lead on a 1-yard touchdown run by McMillian to start the fourth overtime. Tech went for two points, as required by NCAA rules, but quarterback Michael Brewer's pass attempt to Isaiah Ford was broken up by a Duke defender.

Duke immediately went to work. On the Blue Devils' first play, Sirk lofted a strike to Schneider, who scored, and then he ran in the two-point conversion for the win.

Tech lost despite out-gaining Duke 452-449. Led by McMillian, the Hokies rushed for 182 yards. McMillian carried the ball a career-high 29 times and scored twice.

Tech trailed 24-16 after Duke's Ross Martin hit a 41-yard field goal with 11:48 left in regulation. But the Hokies managed to tie the game by going 83 yards in 12 plays. The drive ended when Brewer threw a 23-yard touchdown pass to tight end Bucky Hodges with 2:07 remaining. McMillian's run – after two Duke pass interference penalties – gave the Hokies the two points they needed to tie the game.

Brewer completed 24 of 45 for 270 yards, with three touchdowns. He threw touchdown passes of 16, 23 and 11 yards to Hodges, who finished with five catches for 101 yards. It marked the first 100-yard receiving game of Hodges' career.

Sirk paced Duke's attack, throwing for 270 yards and four touchdowns. He also rushed for 109 yards on 18 carries.

CHESTNUT HILL, Mass. - Travon McMillian rushed for 105 yards, Joey Slye booted four field goals and the Hokies defense scored a touchdown, helping Virginia Tech down the Boston College Eagles 26-10 in an ACC game played Saturday at Alumni Stadium. The win snapped the Hokies' two-game losing streak.

The Eagles came into the game ranked in the top 10 nationally in nine defensive categories, but the Hokies got off to a good start, and the Eagles offense, which has struggled much of the season, couldn't make up the difference.

Tech's defense held the Eagles to just 218 yards and forced four turnovers, including three fumbles, and it didn't give up a touchdown until the fourth quarter. Tech's offense finished with 275 yards of offense, led by McMillian's 105 rushing and Michael Brewer's 180 throwing. McMillian, who carried the ball 33 times, rushed for more yards against BC than any tailback this season

The Hokies got on the board first in this one, scoring on their second possession. They went 47 yards in just four plays, with the drive ending on a 27-yard touchdown pass from Brewer to receiver Cam Phillips. Slye's extra point gave Tech a 7-0 lead with 6:44 left in the first quarter.

Tech's third drive ended in points as well. The Hokies marched to the BC 27, but the drive stalled after that and they settled for a 47-yard field goal by Slye. That gave them a 10-0 lead with 1:13 left in the first quarter.

Tech's defense accounted for the Hokies' second touchdown, as mike linebacker Andrew Motuapuaka stripped Jordan Gowins of the ball at the BC 34 and then grabbed it. He returned it 34 yards for a touchdown, and Slye's extra point gave Tech a 17-0 lead with 11:01 left in the first half.

Tech's final score of the first half came on a nice, two-minute drive that was extended when BC roughed punter A.J. Hughes after the Eagles had stopped the Hokies at the Tech 17.

Tech retained possession and marched 55 yards to the BC 20, using big pass plays of 25 and 16 yards to Isaiah Ford and Phillips, respectively. Slye nailed a 38-yard field goal on the final play of the first half to give Tech a 20-0 lead at halftime.

The teams traded field goals in the third quarter, with Slye adding a 32-yarder. That marked the third time this season that he's hit at least three field goals in a game and the sixth time in his career. His four field goals tied a career high which he set in Tech's win over Cincinnati in the Military Bowl last year.

The Eagles finally got on the board toward the end of the third. An 11-play, 59-yard drive ended when Mike Knoll hit a 29-yard field goal that cut the Hokies' lead to 23-3 with 3:26 left in the third. The Eagles added a touchdown on a 3-yard n by Richard Wilson with 8.09 left in the game


