The seven stars depict the seven conference titles claimed by VT under Beamer.

MORE THAN A COACH

Simply put, Frank Beamer has been the face of Virginia Tech for nearly three decades. In the aftermath of the April 16, 2007 tragedy, Beamer not only met with victims of families, but also helped served as a unifying figure who helped the campus and surrounding community heal and draw closer together. Hokies everywhere will forever remember his lasting contributions to Virginia Tech that went above and beyond the football field.

A LASTING LEGACY

Dating back to 2005, in conjunction with community outreach programs, Beamer has raised over \$365,000 for charitable causes. Beneficiaries have included: Hokie United, United Way, Breast Cancer Awareness, St. Baldrick's Foundation, Sandy Hook and Uplifting Athletes. The Intrepid Heroes Fund has realized \$63,000 from donations at Tech's last three Military Appreciation Games, as well. Perhaps the cause closest to Beamer's heart has been Herma's Readers, named in honor of his late mother, who was a teacher. The program has distributed over 100,000 new and used books across Virginia and has raised \$145,00 for the purchase of additional books.

FLASHBACK TO 1993

To help put Tech's 23-year bowl streak in perspective, Bill Clinton had been in the White House for less than a year in December 1993. Tech alum Bruce Smith and the Buffalo Bills were making their run to a fourth consecutive Super Bowl, while current Tulsa head coach Phillip Montgomery was a junior quarterback/safety at Tartleton State. America was officially introduced to BeamerBall as VT returned a fumble for an 20-yard TD & a blocked FG for an 80-yard TD in the final minute of the first half of a 45-20 win over Indiana in the 1993 Independence Bowl.

Hokies Seek to Send Beamer Out in Style, VT Returns to Site Where 23-Game Bowl Streak Began

- The Camping World Independence Bowl marks the conclusion of Frank Beamer's illustrious coaching career at Virginia Tech. Tech is making its 23rd consecutive bowl appearance, a streak that began with a win vs. Indiana in the 1993 Independence Bowl. The matchup against Tulsa will mark the first time that Beamer has ever led Hokies against the Golden Hurricane.
- Tech has won two of its past three bowls, including last year's 33-17 victory over Cincinnati in the Military Bowl (12/27/14).
- Tulsa leads the all-time series against Virginia Tech by a 3-1 margin, but the two teams haven't met since 1978.
- Tech's lone win came by a 17-14 count in the initial meeting between the squads at Lane Stadium (10/17/70).
- That 1970 Hokies squad included QB Don Strock and TE Mike Burnop. Burnop is in 33rd season as Tech's football radio analyst.
- VT owns six or more wins 25 times in 29 seasons under Beamer. Since 1995, only Ohio State (16) has more 10-win seasons than VT (13).
- Tech has won three of its last four games. VT's last two losses were a 4-OT thriller vs. Duke (10/24) and a one-OT loss vs. UNC (11/21).

Key Stats to Watch in Shreveport as Hokies, Golden Hurricane Square Off

- Consensus All-ACC WR Isaiah Ford led the conference with a Tech-record 10 TD catches in 2015. Ford, TE Bucky Hodges (six TDs) and RB Travon McMillian (6 TDs) have accounted for 59.5% (22 of 37) of Tech's offensive TDs this season.
- Only Clemson (30) and UNC (28) threw more TD passes among ACC clubs than Virginia Tech (23) in 2015.
- McMillian is averaging 105.4 rushing ypg over his last seven games, the third-best among ACC backs down the stretch.
- Tulsa QB Dane Evans averages 329.8 passing ypg, throwing 22 TDs and only eight INTs this season.
- Tulsa's offense averages 35.9 ppg and 502.8 ypg. The Golden Hurricane registered 38 points and 603 yards in a 52-38 loss at Oklahoma (9/19). No team has scored more points or accumulated over 500 yards against the current No. 4 Sooners.
 Tulsa has scored 40+ points in five of its six wins in 2015, averaging 41.8 ppg in its six victories this season.
- Tulsa has allowed 30 points or more in all six of its losses, being outscored by an average margin of 46.5 to 30.0 in those games.
- Dating back to 1999, VT is 138-11 (.926) when holding opponents to 21 or fewer points, including a 5-1 mark in 2015.
- Tulsa has lost 26 straight games when being held to 21 points or fewer dating back to a 27-10 loss at Houston (11/4/06). Dating back to 1996, only Ohio State (16.5) and Alabama (16.6) are allowing fewer ppg than Virginia Tech (17.2).

Tech Typically Thrives When Lunch Pail Defense Generates Turnovers, Sacks - Odds & Ends

- Dating back to 1996, no Power Five program owns more sacks (744.0) or INTs (337) than Virginia Tech under DC Bud Foster.
- Dating back to a win vs. Duke (11/22/08), VT is 30-1 when it forces two or more interceptions.
- Since joining the ACC in 2004, the Hokies are 42-9 (.824) when registering 4.0 or more sacks.
- Over that same span, Tech is 49-2 (.961) when accumulating 200 or more net rushing yards (8-0 since start of 2013 season).
- WR Isaiah Ford (78.1) ranks second in the ACC in receiving yards per game, trailing only Pitt's Tyler Boyd (79.4).
- VT is +6 (25 takes/19 gives) in the turnover column, while Tulsa is +2 (22 takes/20 gives).
- Hokies DB Chuck Clark leads the team with 100 tackles, making him one of nine ACC players with 100+ stops.
- Tech QB Michael Brewer hails from Lake Travis, Texas, approximately 310 miles southwest of Shreveport.
- Incoming Tech head coach Justin Fuente is a Tulsa native. He played QB at Union HS, where his coach was Bill Blankenship, who would later serve as Tulsa's head coach (2011-14). Fuente played two seasons at Oklahoma before transferring to Murray State.

IN-STATE DOMINANCE

No other FBS program has dominated its in-state rival quite like Beamer and the Hokies have piled up wins against Virginia. Beamer won his last 12 meetings with UVA and went 16-1 (.941) in the last 17 games against the Cavaliers. The next-best squads against an in-state rival are Oklahoma and USC. The Sooners and Trojans have gone 13-4 (.765) over the same span against Oklahoma State and UCLA, respectively.

BIG #S FOR INDEPENDENCE BOWL

- TD passes needed by QB Michael Brewer to give him 34 career at VT which would tie Jim Druckenmiller for sixth in school annals.
- Catches needed by WR Isaiah Ford to move into third place on Tech's career list. His 119 receptions are currently tied for sixth.

26 Receiving yards needed by Ford to pass Andre' Davis (962 in 1999) for the best seasonal total in Virginia Tech history.

- 39 Rushing yards needed by RB Travon McMillian to become the first 1,000-yard VT freshman since Ryan Williams (1,655 in 2009).
 - Career games played for DT Luther Maddy will be a VT record.
- 63 Receiving yards needed by Ford for VT's first 1,000-yard season.
- **280** Career coaching victories for Frank Beamer if VT defeats Tulsa.

WHAT THEY ARE SAYING ABOUT RETIRING TECH HEAD COACH FRANK BEAMER

"Frank Beamer has been one of the icons, in my mind, in this era of coaching. He has a fantastic record at Virginia Tech and been there a long, long time. He's one of the great guys in our profession. I've always admired him as a coach, but also the professional character that he always carries himself with and the way he treats other people."

"Happy and sad. Sad because I think college football lost a tremendous coach and a better man. . . . But also extremely happy for him. "There will probably be another -- in this day and age -- it used to it was all about how you finished, and now it's all about how you start, and if you don't start good, they fire you. In the NFL, you've got to change it. Now it's all about how you start. Boy, I'm glad that that wasn't the mentality at Virginia Tech when they hired Frank Beamer, because this game and a lot of players would have missed out on one of the best that's ever walked the sidelines, and that's Coach Beamer. He didn't start well, but boy, what a run he had and a program that he built at Virginia Tech and did it the right way, and thousands of young men's lives have been impacted because of it. And not just those that he coached but those who maybe he coached through players he coached and so forth.

"Nobody has ever done it better, and I have a ton of respect for he and Cheryl. I've known Shane a long time. This is always a tough time when you have to move on from something that you love to do, and he felt like this was the right time, and I'm glad he announced it so they can really celebrate Frank Beamer these last few games and hopefully finish strong and get to a bowl game and all that. You know, I know they probably haven't had the year he wanted to have this year, but man, that doesn't diminish anything Frank Beamer has done because he's done it the right way, he's done it with class, and he's been incredibly loyal and committed to Virginia Tech, and you just, again, don't see many guys like him in this game anymore. So he's been a great mentor to me, one of those guys when I came into this league, I can remember going to my first ACC meetings, and man, I'm looking at Frank Beamer and Bobby Bowden, and I'm just like, wow, how did I get here. A little intimidated.

"He was one of those guys that put me at ease right away. Just always had a great respect for him. I guess now I'm moving up to third in tenure in the ACC. That just shows you how this business is now. Frank Beamer has been there for 29 years, and we've got 14 schools in this league, and I've just been the head coach seven years, and now I'm third in tenure. It's just crazy, behind Paul Johnson and David Cutcliffe. Just honored to know him, and I wish him nothing but the best."

Dating back to 1995, no two Power Five programs own more 10-win seasons than Virginia Tech and Ohio State.

HEAD COACH FRANK BEAMER

Frank Beamer (Virginia Tech '69), whose Virginia Tech teams have posted a 213-81 record over the past 23 seasons and have appeared in bowl games each year in that span, is in his 29th and final year as the head football coach at Tech and his 35th overall. Beamer has guided the Hokies to a 237-121-2 record and sits with an overall record of 279-144-4.

Under Beamer, Tech football enjoyed unprecedented success with 23 consecutive bowl appearances - the longest current bowl streak as recognized by the NCAA - four ACC titles, five ACC Coastal Division crowns, three BIG EAST Conference titles, two "major" bowl victories, six BCS appearances and a trip to the national championship game in 1999.

Tech won the BIG EAST title in 1995 and 1999, and shared it in 1996. Beamer was voted BIG EAST Coach of the Year by the league's coaches each of those seasons and was tabbed the Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year in both 2004 and 2005.

In 1997, he was inducted into the Virginia Tech Sports Hall of Fame, becoming the first active coach at the university to be honored in that fashion. Following the 1999 season, he earned eight national coach of the year honors.

During his undergraduate days at Tech, Beamer started three years as a cornerback and played on the Hokies' 1966 and 1968 Liberty Bowl teams.

The 69-year-old Hillsville, Virginia, product began as an assistant at Radford High School from 1969 through 1971. Then, after one season as a graduate assistant at the University of Maryland, he went to The Citadel where he worked five seasons under Bobby Ross and one year under Art Baker. His last two years at The Citadel, Beamer was the defensive coordinator. In 1979, he went to Murray State as the defensive coordinator under Mike Gottfried. He was named head coach at MSU in 1981 and went on to compile a six-year record of 42-23-2.

He is married to the former Cheryl Oakley of Richmond, Virginia. They have two children, Shane, a former member of his dad's football team at Virginia Tech and now the associate head coach/running backs coach at Tech; and daughter Casey, a 2003 graduate of Tech. He has four grandchildren, Sutton, Olivia and Hunter, children of Shane and his wife, Emily, while Casey, who married former Virginia Tech wrestler Canaan Prater in 2012, had her first son, Hudson, in February.

Beamer was born in Mt. Airy, North Carolina, and grew up in Hillsville, Virginia. At Hillsville High, he earned 11 varsity letters as a three-sport athlete in football, basketball and baseball.

An avid NASCAR fan, Beamer has been the official starter for races at Bristol Motor Speedway, Martinsville Speedway and Richmond International Raceway.

Beamer had his No. 25 jersey retired by Tech in a pregame ceremony before the Marshall game in 2002.

SPRING ROAD ON VIRGINIA TECH CAMPUS RENAMED 'BEAMER WAY'

In appreciation for his many years of service and extraordinary contributions to university life, the Virginia Tech Board of Visitors renamed Spring Road in honor of Frank Beamer on Aug. 6, 2015. Recognizing contributions made both on and off the field by head football coach Beamer and his wife, Cheryl, Spring Road, which runs alongside the west stands and press box of Lane Stadium, is now known as Beamer Way. The official athletics department street address is 25 Beamer Way in recognition of Frank Beamer's jersey number when he played football for Tech from 1966-68. VT President Dr. Timothy Sands and VT Director of Athletics Whit Babcock made the official presentation in front of the football team in a team meeting on the eve of the start of preseason practice.

STABILITY AT THE TOP OF VIRGINIA TECH PROGRAM

Frank Beamer, the first Tech alumnus to guide Virginia Tech's football program since the 1940s, has coached and won more football games at Tech than any other head coach. Not one of the 128 active FBS head football coaches has been at his current school longer than Beamer, who is in his final year of a 29-season career at Tech. He is the longest consecutive tenured coach at the same school by a full 12 years (Oklahoma's Bob Stoops & Iowa's Kirk Ferentz - 17th seasons).

During Beamer's 28 previous years at Tech, 20 different power conference schools had six or more head coaches, including five schools in the ACC: Pittsburgh (8), Boston College (7), Louisville (7), North Carolina (7) and Miami (6). Three schools - Pitt, Stanford and Vanderbilt - hired eight different coaches during the time Beamer has been the head coach at Tech. Since the end of the 2009 season, there had been 140 new head coaches hired to start a season.

LAST GAME VERSUS A NEW OPPONENT

In the Independence Bowl, head coach Frank Beamer will face, for the first time in his career, Tulsa. The Golden Hurricane will mark the 81st different school that Beamer has faced in his 35year head coaching career, while it will be the 68th difference opponent in his 29 years at Tech. Overall, Beamer has beaten 63 of those schools in his career, and 54 while at Tech. Of the 13 schools Beamer has faced at Tech and did not beat, South Carolina is the only one that he has faced at least a second time. He did manage a tie in his third game against Gamecocks, while his overall record against the school is 0-4-1.

Of the other dozen schools that Beamer never beat as a head coach at Tech (all-time he is 0-1 against them), seven of those were match-ups in bowl games (see *left* shaded box) - California (2003), Auburn (2005), Georgia (2006), Kansas (2008), Stanford (2011), Michigan (2012) and UCLA (2013) - while the other five were USC, Oklahoma, Boise State, Kentucky and Miami (OH).

LAST GAME VERSUS A NEW COACH

The match-up of head coaches in the Independence Bowl sees Frank Beamer closing out his 35-year career (29th at Tech) with his 23rd consecutive bowl appearance against Tulsa's Philip Montgomery, who will finish his first season as a head coach with his first bowl appearance. So, it's quite obvious that Beamer will face Montgomery for the first time in his career. The meeting will mark the 153rd different head coach Beamer will face in his career, while he will be looking to defeat the 118th different head coach.

The number of head coaches Beamer faced at Tech and did not beat is just 29 (35 overall) and many of those are considered some of the best coaches in the history of college (and pro) football. Here's the list of coaches Beamer never beat while at Tech (with career record):

In Beamer's overall history, only eight coaches, adding in Al Molde (Central Missouri/Eastern Illinois), who Beamer went 0-2 against while at Murray State, have ever beaten Beamer more than once without him getting at least one win. Also of note, Beamer is 0-0-1 against Memphis' Rey Dempsey, so only 34 coaches have beaten Beamer without him beating them.

AN ARSENAL OF SCORING WEAPONS **RETURN TO TECH FOR 2016 SEASON**

The Hokies have scored 348 points so far during the 2015 season, which is the 14th-most ever in the program's history - with 12 points today, they will move into the top 12 and with 44 points, they would finish 11th.

Of those 348 points, 324 of them have been scored by players who have eligibility remaining. Only tight end Ryan Malleck (12 points), running back J.C. Coleman (6) and guarterback Michael Brewer (6) have scored points for the Hokies and will exhaust their eligibility after the bowl game. Interestingly, Tech returned ALL of their 313 points scored from the 2014 season. In fact, the top six scorers for the Hokies in 2015 return, while the top four have at least two more years of eligibility remaining with sophomore kicker Joey Slye leading the way with 97 points, followed by sophomore wide receiver Isaiah Ford with 60, redshirt-freshman running back Travon McMillian with 38 and redshirt-sophomore tight end Bucky Hodges with 36. Redshirt-

junior quarterback Brenden Motley and junior fullback Sam Rogers both have 18 points scored this year entering the bowl game.

Not only do scorers return, but the Hokies will lose just one of their starting offensive linemen senior tackle Wade Hansen, as the other four all have remaining eligibility.

THAT INCLUDES THREE DEFENSIVE PLAYERS THAT REACHED THE END ZONE

As has been the case for the 29 years head coach Frank Beamer has led the Hokies, scoring from the defense and special teams has always been stressed. And this year, Tech scored four touchdowns via Beamerball - by three players, who all return.

Redshirt-sophomore Andrew Motuapuaka scored twice this season, once on an interception return (vs. Furman, 9/12), the other on a fumble return (at Boston College, 10/31) and actually has three touchdowns in his career. Junior Chuck Clark (fumble return) and redshirt-sophomore Anthony Shegog (blocked punt return) each reached the end zone once in 2015 and actually in the same game (at Purdue, 9/19).

In all, on the defensive side of the ball, Tech will lose just four starters and will return seven, mostly in the secondary. The hit for the Hokies will come up front as three of the four defensive linemen will be lost along with a linebacker.

"Justin Fuente is a great leader. He does an unbelievable job of recruiting, getting kids to play hard, rolling up his sleeves and doing things you need to do to be successful. He's also a great listener and high quality person who cares about kids." - TCU head coach Gary Patterson

"Virginia Tech isn't just getting a great coach. They're getting a guy who is going to make an impact on so many people's lives on and off the field. I am very happy for Coach Fuente and his family. I wish them nothing but the best. I'm now a VT fan." - Cincinnati Bengals Pro Bowl **QB** Andy Dalton

"He's a big part of the reason that I'm the player I am today. ..." Dalton said at his weekly media scrum. "I felt like he was able to teach me a lot of things, just the style of what we were doing. The offense I was in in college was similar to what we've been doing here and stuff. I think he prepared me really well for the next level. So I'm so happy for him. He's one of the most deserving guys. I think he's going to do a great job there. I'm going to be rooting for Virginia Tech now."

"I think what you've got is a very, very bright offensive-minded guy that is smart enough to realize that he has to get somebody on defense because he's just not as well versed on defense as he is on offense. By keeping Foster, I think that's a stroke of genius, is what it is. It's hard to replace Frank Beamer from a standpoint of a people person because he was so well liked and justifiably so. I think Justin will probably bring more offense to Virginia Tech and offense right now, you can't out-defense them, you've got to outscore them. I think that he'll outscore them. What he did at Memphis is off the charts. He took a program that was down-ridden and turned it into a successful program. The culmination was this year when he beat a very good Ole Miss team after he was trailing 14-0." - Gil Brandt, former player personnel executive for the **Dallas Cowboys**

On his penchant for developing QBs

"I think he took Andy Dalton and just developed him with a culmination of when they beat Wisconsin in the Rose Bowl. You saw Dalton do something, there was a third-down situation that two years prior Dalton would've never made the play. You could see how the guy had progressed because of Justin's tutelage. He did a fabulous job with Dalton. Being a guarterback himself. There's not many guys that have played the position that become head coaches. I think he's mechanically sound, he's very innovative and creative, you'll see a lot of things on offense. You have to have quarterbacks being developed in order to do that." - Gil Brandt

About Fuente's personality to follow up Beamer:

"No doubt. I think and it was kind of fun to be a part of some of Justin's conversation as he was thinking through this process. He had really researched coach Beamer and the culture there, the community, the way those guys have been coached. Not that he's trying to be Coach Beamer – that's not it. He wanted to know what he was going into or that there would be a chance there would be a fit. I think that everything that we know from afar about Coach Beamer, I think the same guiding principles, the same integrity, all those kind of things, that's kind of what Justin is. It's just kind of a neat deal to see him recognize he know what he was looking for and he knew it would be a good fit for him and wouldn't be a good fit for him. All along he thought this was something. It was not taken lightly the shadow he was stepping into but he believed that he could embrace it because of what he did know about Coach Beamer." - Bill Blankenship, former Tulsa head coach and Fuente's high school coach

About Fuente's last few years at Memphis:

"It was interesting to see it from a distance. What you said is exactly the 'ok, they're fine, they're getting it together'. It was pretty interesting to watch. Once I saw it in person, everything that I knew about him was just magnified. I know I'm just gushing, but the guy's leadership is well beyond his experiences. He gets it. He's just really, really good. It's just very cool, very, very cool." – Bill Blankenship

MADDY SET TO BREAK GAMES PLAYED RECORD

Former long snapper Collin Carroll played in a school record 55 consecutive games, from Aug. 30, 2008 to Jan. 3, 2012, which was every game of his four-year career. The 55 games played (also a school record) for Carroll has now been tied. Defensive lineman **Luther Maddy** enters the bowl game with 55 career games played over his five-year career. Maddy played in 13 games as a freshman, sophomore and junior, and the first four games last season, his senior year, before suffering a season-ending injury. He was granted a medical hardship waiver and able to play a fifth year.

Maddy will pass Carroll for the most games ever played in a career at Virginia Tech in the Independence Bowl. The redshirt-senior from Delray Beach, Florida, will become the all-time leader in games played as a Hokie with 56.

FRESHMEN GETTING PLENTY OF PLAYING TIME

In all, nine true freshman have seen the field for the Hokies this fall. In alphabetical order, they include: Adonis Alexander, Jahque Alleyne, Xavier Burke, Tremaine Edmunds, Dwayne Lawson, Carson Lydon, Yosuah Nijman, Steven Peoples and Mook Reynolds. Three of them - Alexander (7), Edmunds (1) and Reynolds (2) have combined to make 10 starts.

To put it in perspective below are the numbers for the past two seasons for Hokie freshmen.

In 2014, Tech saw a total of 10 true freshman play with four of them combining for 31 starts. The list of starters include current Hokies: Isaiah Ford (11), Cam Phillips (9), Marshawn Williams (8) and Greg Stroman (1).

In 2013, 11 true freshman played for Tech, the most in head coach Frank Beamer's 29 seasons in Blacksburg, and those players combined for over 50 starts that season. Those include current Hokies in the junior class: Jonathan McLaughlin (13), Kendall Fuller (12), Chuck Clark (2) and Sam Rogers (2); and two more who are currently redshirt-sophomores: Brandon Facyson (9) and Kalvin Cline (7).

DOUBLE DIGITS MAKE FIRST STARTS IN 2015

This season has now seen 13 Hokies make their first collegiate starts with the latest being redshirt-freshman **Vinnie Mihota**, who started the first game of his career at Virginia on Nov. 28. Below is the list of Hokies, who made their first starts in 2015 along with their total for the year.

INJURIES TO STARTERS

The Hokies lost four preseason starters from their original depth chart this season to injury, either for a couple of games or for the season. The four does not include running back **Marshawn Williams**, who was lost to injury before the season began.

Michael Brewer, r-Sr., QB: suffered a broken left collarbone after taking a hit early in the third quarter of the seasonopening game versus Ohio State ... missed six starts.

Kendall Fuller, Jr., DB: suffered a right knee injury during preseason camp ... battled through the first three games, but is out for the rest of the season ... missed nine starts.

Andrew Motuapuaka, r-So., LB: suffered an MCL sprain in his left knee and missed two starts - at Purdue and vs. ECU. Corey Marshall, r-Sr., DL: suffered a hamstring injury and missed three starts and limited in three others - one snap vs. Pittsburgh, eight snaps vs. Duke and six at Georgia Tech.

STABILITY UP FRONT

Through 12 games, Tech's offensive line has certainly become a source of stability for the team. Consider this, only six players have started every game this year on offense and four of them are on the line. In fact, except for the NC State game, the five positions have all featured the same starters (**Wyatt Teller** did not start versus the Wolfpack, but was in for 64 of 68 plays) and they are certainly building for the future. Only right tackle **Wade Hansen** is a senior, and through some realignment, is spelled by true freshman **Yosuah Nijman** (301 snaps this year). The charts below, on page 11 and on page 15 detail the groups stats, starts, and plays.

CONSECUTIVE STARTS STREAK CONTINUES

A couple of Hokies saw their consecutive starts streak end this season - most notably **Michael Brewer**, **Kendall Fuller** and **Dadi Nicolas** - however two members of the defense have pushed their streak into the 20s.

Redshirt-junior **Ken Ekanem** has reached 25 straight starts for the Hokies, while junior **Chuck Clark** started his 22nd straight game at Virginia.

On the offensive side of the ball, senior **Ryan Malleck** holds the longest consecutive start streak, which stands at 21 straight games entering the bowl. Sophomore **Bucky Hodges** is the only other Hokie on either offense or defense, whose consecutive start streak extended from last year, and currently stands at 14.

THERE'S A FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

For the season, Brenden Motley has thrown for 1,155 yards and 11 touchdowns, which led the team before its game at Virginia (11/28). Michael Brewer, who missed six starts due to injury, returned to the starting lineup and enters the bowl game with 1,359 yards passing and 12 touchdowns.

The Tech history books indicate that the closest any two guarterbacks had come to either both throwing for 1,000 yards in the same year or both reaching the 10-TD plateau before this combo did it, was back in 2007. That season, Sean Glennon led the team with 1,796 yards passing and 12 TDs, while Tyrod Taylor threw for 927 yards and five TDs.

THERE'S A FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING, TWO

Glennon and Taylor were the only set of Tech QBs to each have multiple 200-yard passing games in the same season, as Glennon had four during the 2007 season and Taylor had two. Both Brewer and Motley recorded three 200-yard passing games this season as Brewer got his third with a 237-yard effort at Virginia (11/28). So, the 2015 season marks the first time two different Tech QBs each passed for at least 200 yards in three different games in the same year.

THERE'S A FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING, THREE

For the third time in the Beamer era, five Hokies have completed at least one pass during the season. One more player this year, would make it six for the first time ever.

The first time was in 1989, when three QBs each completed passes: Cam Young (62 completions), Will Furrer (45) and Rodd Wooten (28). WR Kevin Bennett went 1 for 2 for 32 yards and a TD, while WR Tony Kennedy was 1 for 6 for six yards. The second time was last year, as QBs Michael Brewer (262), Mark Leal (6) and Brenden Motley (1) all completed passes. The others were WR Isaiah Ford, who was 1 of 1 for 30 yards and P A.J. Hughes, who was 1 for 1 for 10 yards. This season, outside of QBs Brewer (53), Motley (92) and Dwayne Lawson (3), Ford has done it again, going 1 of 2 for 14 yards and FB Sam Rogers in 1 for 1 for 13 yards.

BREWER WITH CHANCE TO ETCH NAME IN RECORD BOOK

Michael Brewer, needs just 149 yards passing in the bowl game to become just the second player in Tech history to average 200 yards passing over a career (min. 20 games). Before the season, only 24 ACC quarterbacks have ever finished with a career 200+ passing yard per game average. Don Strock (1970-72) is the only other Tech quarterback to finish with over 200, as he ended his career at 207.20689 (or rounded to 207.21). That means, Brewer needs a 301-yard passing game to break the Tech school record for average passing yards per game.

Lastly, he currently sits with a 58.9 passing percentage, which is the best at the school (min. 500 attempts). He is ahead of Brvan Randall (2001-04), who finished with a 58.8 percentage. The all-time mark (min. 200 attempts) is held by Marcus Vick at 59.83 percent (2003, 05). To break this mark, Brewer, who averages 31 attempts per game in his career, would need to complete about 80 percent of his attempts.

BREWER MOVING UP THE TOP 10 LISTS AT TECH

Michael Brewer enters the bowl game with 4,051 passing yards, which is 10th all-time at the school (in less than two full seasons). Next on the list is Steve Casey (1978-81) with 4,299 and Jim Druckenmiller (1993-96) with 4,383. Meanwhile, his 30 touchdown passes are seventh all time and he'd need four to tie Druckenmiller.

MCMILLIAN PUSHES PAST 900, EYES 1,000 YARDS

Entering the bowl game, redshirt-freshman Travon McMillian has rushed for 960 yards on the ground, which leads the team. It is the most yards rushed for in a single season by a Hokie over the past four years (Trey Edmunds, 675, 2013), while the last Tech player to rush for more than 1,000 yards was David Wilson (1,709, 2011).

The 960 yards also puts McMillian into the ACC record book. Currently, the conference lists the 35 best single-season rushing-yard performances by freshmen and McMillian sits at No. 13. The list rises all the way up to a pair of Hokie backs, Ryan Williams (1,655, 2009) and Darren Evans (1,265, 2008), who are No. 1 and 2. Only 10 freshmen have ever reached the 1,000-rushing yard plateau in ACC history, McMillian would become the 11th and join Pittsburgh freshman Qadree Ollison, who enters the bowl season with 1,048 yards.

At Tech, 13 have rushed for 1,000+ yards in a single season, and its been done 16 times - Cyrus Lawrence (1980-81), Lee Suggs (2000, 2002) and Roscoe Coles (1975-76) did it twice, while Williams and Evans were the only freshmen to reach it.

MORE ON RUNNING BACK TRAVON MCMILLIAN

McMillian finished games with 98, 96 and 99 rushing yards, before breaking through with the first 100-yard game of his career against Duke (10/24), a 142-vard effort. He then went for 105 at Boston College (10/31) to become the first freshman at Tech with back-to-back 100-yard rushing games since Ryan Williams had five straight to end the 2009 season. His 135 yards on the ground at Georgia Tech made it three in a row, to become the first Tech running back with three straight 100-yard efforts since David Wilson, who went seven straight games with at least 100 yards in the 2011 season.

FORD SETS TWO SCHOOL **RECORDS, EYES A THIRD**

Below (gray box) is a detailed summary of what sophomore Isaiah Ford has done so far in his Tech career through just two full seasons (one game left). But speaking of single seasons records, Ford has already set two school records and is just yards shy of a third.

In the Hokies' win at Virginia, Ford caught six passes for 121 yards and a touchdown to give him a school record 63 receptions this season (passing Jarrett Boykin's mark of 61 in 2011) and a school record 10 touchdown receptions in a single season (passing both Andre' Davis, 1993, and Antonio Freeman, 1999, who both caught nine). His 937 receiving yards is just 26 yards shy of passing Davis' school record for a season (962, 1999) and is just 63 yards of becoming the first Tech receiver to eclipse the 1,000-yard plateau.

His touchdowns and receiving yards leads the conference heading into the bowl season. Tech has never had a player lead the ACC in receiving yardage. He trails Pittsburgh's Tyler Boyd (79.4 to 78.1) in per game average.

FORD SETS AND APPROACHES A COUPLE MORE RECORDS

With six receptions at Virginia, Isaiah Ford extending a streak of catching at least two passes in every game of his career, which now stands at 25 straight games, at Tech record. The previous record (under Beamer) was set by Danny Coale, who ended his career with a 22-game streak from Oct. 16, 2010 to Jan. 3, 2012.

The consecutive games record for at least one catch is 27 games, set by Ernest Wilford (Aug. 25, 2002 to Dec. 26, 2003).

FORD WITH BACK-TO-BACK **100-YARD RECEIVING GAMES**

Back on Nov. 21, Isaiah Ford caught eight passes for 155 yards against North Carolina, the final home game of the 2015 season. He followed that up with a six-catch, 121-vard game at Virginia, marking his first career back-to-back 100yard efforts. With a 100-yard game in the bowl, Ford would match the school record for consecutive 100-yard games currently held by Andre' Davis, who had three that ended the 1999 season - 121 at Temple, 172 vs. Boston College and 108 in the national championship game against Florida State. The 401 yards receiving over that stretch for Davis set the school record for most in a three-game span, but was surpassed by Ernest Wilford, who caught a total of 417 yards over a three-game stretch that included a 279-yard effort at Syracuse (11/9/02). He had 80 the game before vs. Pittsburgh and 58 vs. West Virginia the week after.

HODGES, PHILLIPS CAN ALSO CATCH THE BALL

Below (gray box) is a detailed summary of what Isaiah Ford has done so far in his Tech career. However, fellow classmates Cam Phillips and Bucky Hodges aren't too far behind when it comes to catches and yards receiving.

Phillips has 46 catches for 549 yards this season, both second on the team, and has pushed his career numbers to 86 (T-17th all-time at Tech) for 1,047 career yards (24th). Hodges is third in both receptions (36), yards (492) and touchdown catches (6) and is sitting with 81 career receptions (22nd all-time) for 1,018 career yards (25th). He adds 13 career TD catches, which is tied for eighth all-time at the school and third all-time in the ACC for a tight end. Before this season, no Hokie had ever caught more than 70 career passes before his junior season and only three men had ever gone over 1,000 receiving yards in his first two seasons at Tech. This year, sophomores Ford, Phillips and Hodges have all done that this season.

If Hodges gets to 500 receiving yards (he's eight yards shy), it would mark just the third time in school history three Tech receivers each caught 500 or more yards in the same season - 2013: Willie Byrn (660), Demitri Knowles (641), Joshua Stanford (640); and 2011: Danny Coale (904), Jarrett Boykin (761), Marcus Davis (510).

HODGES NAMED SEMI-FINALIST FOR MACKEY AWARD

Announced on Monday, Nov. 16, sophomore TE Bucky Hodges was named one of eight semi-finalists for the John Mackey Award, given annually to the most outstanding collegiate tight end. Hodges, a Virginia Beach, Virginia, native, was one of two sophomores on the list and one of two tight ends on the list from the ACC.

CHUCK REACHES 100 TOTAL TACKLES

For the first time since the Hokies have been in the ACC. a defensive back has reached the century mark for total tackles. Junior **Chuck Clark**, who clinched the game against Virginia with an interception, recorded 12 tackles in the game - it was his 15th straight game with at least five and his fourth game this year with at least 10 - and put him at exactly 100 total tackles for the season. He becomes the first defensive back to reach 100 since Michael Crawford led the team with 131 during the 2003 season, when the team was in the Big East. Since then only four men - Vince Hall (3x, 2005-07), Jack Tyler (2x, 2012-13), Xavier Adibi (2007) and Cody Grimm (2009) - have reached the century mark and they were all linebackers.

Also, since 2004, only Vince Hall has registered more solo tackles in a single season (61, 2006) than Clark's current 59, which is also sixth in the conference. During that 2003 season, four guys, led by Crawford's 73 solo tackles had at least 63.

ALEXANDER MAKES MARK **IN FIRST YEAR WITH #DBLOCK**

True freshman Adonis Alexander made a name for himself pretty early in the season and continues to be a force in the secondary. In just his second game, he intercepted his first pass against Furman (9/12) and in his first start a week later, snagged his second. He also sealed the win over NC State by ending Wolfpack quarterback Jacoby Brissett's interceptionless streak of 241 straight passes with a pick in the fourth quarter. And at Virginia, he notched INT No. 4 with a thirdquarter interception.

He doesn't hold the record for interceptions by a freshman, and isn't actually second either, that's because teammates Kendall Fuller (6) and Brandon Facyson (5) hold those two spots when they were freshmen in 2013.

FORD CHANGING AND CHASING THE HISTORY BOOKS Ford has now also put up the best numbers Where does Ford stand (under Beamer)

Sophomore Isaiah Ford is guickly moving up many of the career records' list at the school and his numbers even through two seasons are approaching or are already the best at the school.

Consider these:

FASTEST PLAYER TO 10 TD CATCHES

By game is now Ford, 19 games, passing Andre' Davis who did it in 20 games.

FASTEST PLAYER TO 1,000 REC. YARDS

By game is now Ford, 17 games, passing Davis, who did it in 19 games.

FASTEST PLAYER TO 100 RECEPTIONS

Is now Ford, who caught No. 100 in his 22nd game played and did it quicker than former Tech receiver Jarrett Boykin (35 games)

CAREER TOUCHDOWN RECEPTIONS

HUGHES TACKS ON SCHOOL RECORDS FOR PUNTING

Tech punter **A.J. Hughes** entered his senior season as the school's all-time leader in career punts and punting yardage. He currently has 12,801, which is the second-most ever in the history of the ACC. His 306 career punts are also the second most, trailing only current Wake Forest punter Alexander Kinal, who just ended his career with ACC and NCAA records of 337 punts and 14,124 yards.

With three more punts, Hughes will pass Connecticut's Cole Wagner for the second-most ever punts in NCAA history (308, 2010-13), while 15 punting yards will pass Memphis punter Tom Hornsey for the second-most ever for yards in NCAA history (12,815, 2010-13).

Hughes' who is from Terre Haute, Indiana and went to the same high school - Terra Haute North Vigo - as current New York Giant punter Steve Weatherford, has a career punting average of 41.83, which is third all-time at Tech and he will more than likely finish in that spot.

HUGHES TIES SCHOOL RECORD AGAIN AND CAN SET IT

Tech punter **A.J. Hughes** registered a 43.5 punting average at Virginia in the Hokies' final game of the regular season - marking the eighth straight game he's had an average of at least 40.0 yards per punt. That mark tied a school record (under Beamer) for most consecutive games with a 40-yard punting average accomplished by just two Hokies.

Jimmy Kibble, who went for eight straight from Oct. 25, 1997 through Sept. 12, 1998, was the first, and was followed by Hughes, who now has three eight-game streaks. With a 40-yard average in the bowl game, he can end his career with nine straight and the outright record.

Hughes' first streak spanned games from Dec. 28, 2012 through Oct. 12, 2013 and if not for a 36.7-yard average hiccup versus Duke on Oct. 26, he could have the record at 17 straight. That's because his second eight-game streak started Nov. 2, 2013 and ended Sept. 13, 2014. Needless to say, his current eight-game streak, which began on Oct. 3 is the longest streak in a single season.

SLYE KICKS HOKIES INTO 23RD STRAIGHT BOWL GAME

Tech place-kicker **Joey Slye** was a perfect 3 of 3 on his field-goal attempts in the Hokies' 23-20 victory at Virginia, including a game-winning 41-yard attempt with 1:38 left in the fourth quarter that broke the 20-20 tie and made the Hokies bowl eligible for a 23rd straight season.

The kick also marked the first time in Slye's career that he made three field goals of 40 or more yards (as he connected from 48 and 44 earlier in the game). Four prior times, he made field goals of that length in a single game, including in last year's bowl game and three times this season (at Purdue, and versus Pittsburgh and Duke).

Slye, who was one of 20 semi-finalists for the 2015 Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award presented by the Orange Bowl and announced by the Palm Beach County Sports Commission, has made at least two field goals in a game seven times this season and 13 for his career. When it comes to at least three makes, he's done it four times this year, seven times in his career. He's made a career-high four field goals in a game twice and once this year.

SLYE GAME-WINNING FG FIRST OF HIS TECH CAREER

Tech place-kicker **Joey Slye's** 41-yard field goal at Virginia was his first game-winning field goal of his Tech career, however, the pressure situation was not the first for the Stafford, Virginia product. He has once hit a "game-winning" extra point in Tech's 17-16 win at Duke last year - however it was with 12:47 left in the fourth.

Three times, though, Slye has tied games in overtime with field goals and gave the Hokies a lead in overtime in a fourth game. Last season at Wake Forest, he hit a 28 yarder to tie the game in the first overtime and this year, he made two field goals - in the first overtime (37 yards) and third overtime (40 yards) - that tied the game with Duke and then hit a 41 yarder in the first overtime in the Hokies' loss to North Carolina.

SLYE APPROACHES SEASON TECH RECORDS

For the season, Tech place-kicker **Joey Slye** is 21 of 28 on field goal attempts this season, and in his career is 41 of 56. Of note, his career long is 49 yards, and so has never made a kick over 50 yards (missed all seven attempts). So, Slye is 41 of 49 from inside 50 and is 25 of 28 inside of 40.

His 21 makes this season are the fourth most ever made in a single-season at the school and is two shy of tying the school record. Just ahead of him are Chris Kinzer (1986) and Shayne Graham (1998), who both made 22 in a season, while Dustin Keys hit a school record 23 in 2008. The sophomore is more than halfway to Graham's school record 68 makes, as Hughes sits sixth.

The single-season attempts record is 32, set by Graham in 1998.

On the all-time scoring list, Slye is 12th with 190 points and can move into the top 10 with nine points. He'd pass Ryan Williams (2008-10, 192) and Branden Ore (2005-2007, 198) along the way. Slye is eighth among kickers, with Don Wade (1981-84) next on that list with 224 points. He currently leads Tech with 97 points and with three more, would be the first Hokie since Chris Hazley (2010, 116 points) to reach the century mark in a single season.

MOTUAPUAKA SCORING THROUGH BEAMERBALL

With his 34-yard fumble return for a touchdown at Boston College (10/31), redshirt-sophomore **Andrew Motuapuaka** has now scored three TDs in his Tech career, joining a very select company. Only eight other Hokies have scored three or more defensive or special teams TDs (under Beamer).

GREENE KICK RETURNS AMONG BEST EVER

Redshirt-junior **Der'Woun Greene** has returned 14 kickoffs this season for 363 yards and a 25.9 average, including a 41 yarder at Virginia and a team-season long 82 yarder at Purdue. He still has a season left, but among returners with at least 35 career returns, the Portsmouth, Virginia product's career 26.4 average (18 ret., 475 yards) would be the best. Currently, that record is held by Dyrell Roberts (2008-2012) who had a 25.9 average (61 ret., 1,577 yards).

• Bucky Hodges led the team in touchdowns, catching seven touchdown passes in 2014 - a Tech single-season record for tight ends, while also adding a TD on a blocked punt in the end zone against Virginia. He also caught a twopoint conversion attempt to give him 50 points for the year.

• **Ryan Malleck** contributed a pair of TD grabs to give the tight end position a total of nine TD catches for the season.

• Third on the list overall was **Isaiah Ford**, who as a freshman, hauled in six touchdown passes, while classmate **Cam Phillips** snagged three.

• On the ground, **Marshawn Williams** led the way with four touchdown runs, while **Shai McKenzie** (3) and **J.C. Coleman** (2).

• Quarterback **Michael Brewer** had two rushing touchdowns and fullback **Sam Rogers** added one.

• On the defensive side of the ball, and one from special teams, there were an additional four Hokies who scored touchdowns. **Donovan Riley** and **Kendall Fuller** each reached the end zone after an interception, while **Andrew Motuapuaka** (on kickoff coverage) and **Greg Stroman** each hit paydirt on fumble returns.

• Coach Rod Sharpless, then the co-defensive coordinator along with Bud Foster, brought a lunch pail back from New Jersey and they decided that it would become the symbol of the 1995 defense. Sharpless' mother-in-law found the now famous original lunch pail in Mercerville, N.J., where it had belonged to a coal miner.

• The players put the unit goals, weekly goals, the keys to success for the week and a signed mission statement before the season in the Pail ... plus the turf from any road wins. Also included in the Pail is the list of names of the 32 fallen Hokies from the April 16, 2008 tragedy.

EDMUNDS BROTHERS RARE FEAT

Just after Virginia Tech's first touchdown against Ohio State on Sept. 7, the Edmunds brothers - Terrell, Tremaine and Trey - became just the third trio of brothers to take the field together at the same time in the same game for a major college football program dating back to 1970. The first to accomplish this rarest of feats was the Selmon brothers at Oklahoma when Lee Roy, Lucious and Dewey all played for the Sooners' defense during the 1972 and 1973 seasons. They were followed in 2010 and 2011 by the McCray brothers - Cliff, Jordan and Justin - who all played on the offensive line together at UCF. During the 2015 season, the Edmunds are regularly appearing together on the special teams kickoff coverage team.



VIRGINIA TECH'S 268-GAME SCORING STREAK

Virginia Tech's current scoring streak started in 1995 and it currently stands as the 11th-longest streak in FBS history, and the sixth-longest active streak in the FBS. During the run, Tech scored on its first offensive possession 87 times, plus another five occasions* where it scored on returns on its first touch of the game. The Hokies have scored in the first quarter 192 times during the streak, and have extended it by halftime in 255 of the 268 games. During the streak, the Hokies have posted 28 shutouts by their defense.

Virginia Tech has a 196-72 record during the streak, averaging 33.7 points in the wins and 19.9 points in the losses. The Hokies have only on six occasions delayed extending the streak until the fourth quarter or overtime. The last time came in 2014 in an overtime loss at Wake Forest. The latest Tech scored its first points in a game was in overtime in 2014 at Wake Forest (a 0-0 tie after four quarters). The latest in a regulation game was with 1:30 left in Tech's game versus Miami also in 2014. Here's a look at the six occasions. 

MORE ON THE EDMUNDS

LANE STADIUM - HOME OF THE HOKIES

Rising high into the mountainous sky of the New River Valley, Virginia Tech's Lane Stadium enters its 51st year of football competition in 2015. The Tech football team has enjoyed over two decades of success, going to 22 straight bowl games and winning 10 or more games eight straight seasons from 2004-11. A big part of that success is the home-field advantage the Hokies enjoy at Lane Stadium/Worsham Field.

Billed as the toughest place in college football for opponents to play by Rivals.com in 2005 and one of the scariest places to play by ESPN.com in 2007, the Hokies play not only on one of the best playing surfaces in the nation, but with the south end zone and west side additions, the Hokies compete in one of the best stadiums in the nation.

Sitting at roughly 2,057 feet above sea level, the stadium is the second-highest among all FBS schools in the eastern United States, trailing only Appalachian State (3,300). Completed in 1965, Lane Stadium/Worsham Field has gone through numerous changes, renovations and additions. But through it all, it has always been regarded as one of the finest places to watch - and toughest places for opponents to play – a college football game.

A WINNING TRADITION

On Sept. 22, 1994, Tech won its 100th game in Lane Stadium in memorable fashion before a national television audience on ESPN with a 34-6 win over rival West Virginia. On Nov. 1, 2003, Tech upset No. 2 Miami 31-7 to pick up its 150th all-time win at Lane Stadium, marking the highest-ranked opponent the Hokies have ever defeated - home or on the road.

Tech's overall record entering the 2015 season at Lane Stadium was 208 wins, 77 losses and six ties in 50 years of play. The Hokies entered the year 134-40-1 at home during Coach Frank Beamer's tenure at Virginia Tech and more impressively, were 116-26 in Blacksburg during the previous 22 seasons (during its current bowl run).

In terms of conference success, Tech entered the season 32-12 in ACC home games and was 32-9 as a member of the BIG EAST. A large part of that impressive record is the home-field environment created by the fans, as Lane Stadium was sold out for 94 consecutive games, starting with the final game of the 1998 season against Virginia and running through the 2012 season.

THE HOKIE STONE

Before each home football game, Virginia Tech football players and coaching staff enter Lane Stadium through a tunnel. On the stadium-side entrance to Worsham Field, they pass beneath a Hokie Stone, which they touch for good luck and is flanked by these words: "For those who have passed. For those to come ... Reach for Excellence."

ENTER SANDMAN

The history behind Virginia Tech's use of Metallica's "Enter Sandman" started during the 2000 season. That summer Tech added a new scoreboard to Lane Stadium and the athletics marketing team decided to use the scoreboard for an entrance video. The group considered "Welcome to the Jungle" by Guns N' Roses and "Sirius" by the Alan Parsons Project before settling on "Enter Sandman." It has been the entrance song for the Hokies ever since.

THE BATTLE AT BRISTOL VIRGINIA TECH vs. TENNESSEE - SEPT. 10, 2016

On Oct. 14, 2013, Virginia Tech and Tennessee announced plans to play a non-conference football game at the Bristol Motor Speedway in 2016 at a joint news conference held at the speedway – a game that was dubbed as the "Battle at Bristol."

The Bristol Motor Speedway will become a football venue next year when the Hokies take on neighboring Tennessee – the two schools are just 236 miles apart – in a non-conference tilt. Track officials anticipate the Sept. 10, 2016 game will break college football's all-time single-game attendance mark. The current record occurred in 2013 when Michigan and Notre Dame played in front of 115,109 fans at Michigan Stadium. The Bristol Motor Speedway is close to a 160,000-seat venue.

The marketing campaign for the game took another step when track general manager Jerry Caldwell, NASCAR Xfinity Series driver Ty Dillon and Derek Vaughan, an engineer with Richard Childress Racing – and a Virginia Tech graduate (mechanical engineering, class of 1998) – along with other BMS officials came to Blacksburg on Aug. 11 of this year to promote the game. The group toured Tech's facilities, met with athletics department personnel, including AD Whit Babcock and head football coach Frank Beamer, and answered questions from the media. Dillon and Vaughan also caught passes and ran drills with assistant head coach Shane Beamer and some of Tech's players.

JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its named to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today. Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.

WHAT'S A HOKIE?

That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body. Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today.

Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. Following is the "Old Hokie" yell in its original form:

Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy! Tech! Tech! V.P.I.! Sola-Rex Sola-Rah Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!! Rae, Ri, V.P.I.







Motley started in place of injured Michael Brewer, who broke his collarbone in the Hokies' Monday nig loss to No. 1 Ohio State. Brewer underwent surgery on Tuesday and is expected to miss the next 4-6 weel perhaps longer. Enter Motley, a redshirt junior who played his high school ball at nearby Christiansburg His School. He completed 16 of 24 passes for 233 yards, and he also rushed for 38 yards on four carries. Mostly behind Motley, Virginia Tech (1-1) finished with 583 yards of total offense, the Hoki most in a game since 2010 and their most under offensive coordinator Scot Loeffler, who took over in 201 Virginia Tech had a balanced attack, running for 299 yards and throwing for 284. WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. — Tech quarterback Brenden Motley threw two touchdown passes and ran for one and Tech's defense and special teams also scored as the Hokies pulled away from the Boilermakers 51-24 at Ross-Ade Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

With the win, Tech moved to 2-1 on the season. Purdue fell to 1-2.

Motley, making his second straight in place of injured quarterback Michael Brewer, completed 15 of 23 for 220 yards, with the touchdown and no interceptions. Behind Motley, Tech amassed 471 yards of total offense — a balanced 238 rushing and 233 passing — and played the main role in the Hokies scoring 27 straight points to break open a close game.

Defensively, Chuck Clark returned a fumble for a touchdown for the Hokies, and Terrell Edmunds' blocked punt in the third quarter was returned by Anthony Shegog for a touchdown.

This game marked the first time since the Clemson game in 2007 that the Hokies scored in all three phases of the game.

Tech grabbed the lead for good on a 5-yard touchdown run by Motley with 1:08 left in the first half that gave the Hokies a 24-17 edge. The Hokies then put the game away with 17 third-quarter points.

An 82-yard kickoff return by Der'Woun Greene to open the second half led to a 42-yard field goal by Joey Slye that gave the Hokies a 27-17 lead. Then on Tech's next possession, a 42-yard drive ended when J.C. Coleman scored from a yard out. Slye's extra point gave Tech a 34-17 bulge with 5:10 left in the third quarter.

The Hokies closed the quarter with Edmunds' blocked punt. Shegog picked up the loose ball and ran it back 15 yards for a touchdown, and Slye's extra point gave the Hokies a 41-17 advantage with a minute left in the quarter.

Slye added a field goal in the fourth quarter and a 3-yard touchdown pass from Motley to Bucky Hodges – their second hookup of the day – accounted for the final margin.

Tech's defense held the Boilermakers to just 265 yards of offense. Purdue quarterback Austin Appleby completed just 9 of 28 for 110 yards, with two interceptions.

Slye made three field goals for the Hokies, who also got six receptions and 128 yards from Isaiah Ford. Trey Edmunds paced Tech's 238-yard rushing day with 72 yards on nine carries.

GREENVILLE, N.C. — East Carolina quarterback James Summers rushed for 169 yards and threw for 110 yards, helping the Pirates rally from a 14-0 deficit to beat Virginia Tech 35-28 in a non-conference game at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium on Saturday.

The loss marked the Hokies' second straight to the Pirates, who downed the Tech in Blacksburg last year. Tech lost in Greenville, North Carolina, for the first time since 1992.

"The good thing for us is we're getting ready to enter conference play," Tech coach Frank Beamer said. "Everything is still there  $\dots$  the ACC championship, the Orange Bowl  $\dots$  the whole deal is still there. But we've got to become a better football team to enter into that mix. It's vey obvious what we need to do."

East Carolina scored 28 consecutive points at one stretch after the Hokies scored two touchdowns off Pirate turnovers.

Tech trailed 35-21 after a 41-yard touchdown run by Summers with 3:43 left in the third quarter. The Hokies cut into that lead, getting a 5-yard touchdown run by Brenden Motley with 8:18 left in the game. The big play came on a 60-yard completion from Motley to Cam Phillips, and the touchdown capped a 95-yard drive

Tech had two more chances to score in the final five minutes. One drive ended when Bucky Hodges couldn't corral a fourth-down pass from Motley that would have given the Hokies a first down in ECU territory. The final chance came at the end of the game when Tech got the ball to its 41 and tried a "Hail Mary" that fell incomplete.

Motley led the Hokies with 366 of their 439 yards of offense. He completed 20 of 35 for 281 yards, with a touchdown and an interception. He also rushed for 85 yards and a score.

Summers, who went into the game as the backup to Blake Kemp, rushed for his 169 vards on 21 carries, and he completed 5 of 8 for the 110 yards and a score. East Carolina finished 410 yards.

**BLACKSBURG** — Pittsburgh rushed for 166 yards and its defense held the Hokies in check for much of the game, enabling the Panthers to knock off Virginia Tech 17-13 in the ACC opener for both schools. The win marked just Pittsburgh's second in Blacksburg — the other one came in 2002 — and sent the Hokies to their second straight loss. Pittsburgh is now 3-1 overall. 1-0 in the ACC. Tech is 2-3. 0-1.

Tech cut a 17-10 lead to 17-13 on a 48-yard field goal by Joey Slye with 13:20, but the Hokies couldn't get any closer. Their next three drives ended in an interception, a punt and an interception. Tech finished with only 100 yards of total offense, including just nine rushing. Brenden Motley was sacked seven times, and he completed 9 of 20 for 91 yards, with a touchdown and three interceptions.

Pittsburgh finished with 276 yards of offense. Tailback Qadree Ollison rushed for 122 yards on 19 carries and a touchdown. Peterman completed 9 of 15 for 110 yards, with the touchdown and no interceptions. Pittsburgh only turned the ball over once.

Tech trailed the entire game, spotting the Panthers a 10-0 lead in the first quarter, with Pittsburgh getting a 45-yard field goal from Chris Blewitt and a 23-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Nate Peterman to tight end J.P. Holtz.

Off to a slow start, the Hokies finally put together a good drive spanning the first and second quarters. A 12-play, 83-yard drive that took more than six minutes ended when Motley hit Cam Phillips for an 11-yard touchdown play. The big play on the drive, though came two plays earlier when, on third-and-17 from the Pittsburgh 40, Motley completed a 28-yard pass to tight end Bucky Hodges for a first down. Slye's extra point following the touchdown cut the Pittsburgh lead to 10-7 with 11:38 left in the half.

Pittsburgh wasted little time in getting going in the second half. Ollison rumbled 43 yards on the Panthers' first play from scrimmage, giving Pittsburgh a first down at the Tech 25. On the next play, he scored, and Blewitt's extra point gave the Panthers a 17-7 lead.

Tech sliced into that lead midway through the third quarter. Andrew Motuapuaka forced Ollison to fumble, and the Hokies'Terrell Edmunds recovered and returned it to the Pittsburgh 23. The drive stalled, but the Hokies got a 43-yard field goal from Joey Slye to cut the lead to 17-10 with 6:03 left in the third quarter.

That turned out to be their last score. On the final eight plays from scrimmage, Tech's offense turned the ball over twice and gave up three sacks.

**BLACKSBURG** – Virginia Tech quarterback Brenden Motley threw three touchdown passes to Isaiah Ford, and the Hokies rushed for 200 yards, as they notched a much-needed 28-13 victory over ACC foe NC State on Friday night.

For the second straight game, Tech found itself behind 10-0 in the first half. NC State got on the board on its opening drive, getting a 33-yard field goal by Kyle Bambard and an 8-yard scoring pass from quarterback Jacoby Brissett to Jumichael Ramos.

But Tech's defense responded after that, holding the Wolfpack to just a field goal the rest of the game. In fact, the Wolfpack amassed just 125 yards in the final three quarters and finished with just 270 yards for the game.

The Hokies' defense also held NC State quarterback Jacoby Brissett in check. Brissett threw for just 113 yards and his streak of passes without an interception ended at 241 when Adonis Alexander intercepted him in the fourth quarter.

Tech's offense exploded in the second quarter, scoring on three straight possessions – all ending on touchdown passes from Motley to Ford. Motley's 27-yard touchdown pass to Ford with 10:41 left in the first half cut the NC State lead to 10-7 and then his 5-yard touchdown pass to Ford with 5:54 left in the first half gave Tech a lead it would not relinquish.

A 2-yard touchdown pass to Ford with 18 seconds left gave the Hokies a 21-10 lead at halftime. Ford became the first Tech receiver since Ernest Wilford in 2002 (Syracuse) to catch at least three touchdown passes in a game. Wilford caught four in the Hokies' triple overtime loss to the Orangemen.

NC State added a field goal in the third quarter, but the Hokies put the game way midway through the fourth quarter. Leading 21-13 and taking over at their own 12, they drove to their own 41 before Motley handed the ball off to Travon McMillian on a second-down play. McMillian broke down the left sideline, hurdled a tackler and went 59 yards for a touchdown that gave Tech a 28-13 lead with 6:54 left in the game.

NC State tried to respond, driving to the Tech 32. But on fourth down, quarterback Jacoby Brissett's pass in the end zone was broke up by the Hokies' Brandon Facyson, and Tech took over on downs, essentially sealing the game.

Tech finished with 358 yards of offense. Motley completed 14 of 28 for 158 yards, with the three touchdown passes to Ford and no interceptions. McMillian set career highs in yards (96) and carries (11).

A Motley interception with 3:34 left in the third led to a 21-yard field goal by Miami kicker Michael Badgley that gave the 'Canes a 23-13 lead with 58 seconds left in the quarter.

The Hokies managed to slice into Miami's lead on a 33-yard pass from Brewer to Isaiah Ford, and Joey Slye's extra point cut the lead to 23-20 with 7:20 remaining.

But Tech's defense couldn't get a stop. Miami drove 75 yards in nine plays on the ensuing possession and scored on a 2-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Brad Kaaya to Rashawn Scott with 2:44 remaining. Badgley's extra point basically sealed the game.

The Hokies finished the game with 361 yards of offense. Motley completed 14 of 23 for 136 yards, with a touchdown and two interceptions, while Brewer completed 3 of 4 for 65 yards, with a touchdown and an interception. Tailback Travon McMillian led the Hokies' ground game with a career-best 99 yards, and he also caught a touchdown pass from Motley

Kaaya paced Miami's attack. He completed 19 of 30 for 296 yards, with two touchdowns and no interceptions. Miami finished with 395 yards of offense.

Motley's fumble on the second play from scrimmage led to a 3-yard touchdown run by Miami tailback Joe Yearby to give the 'Canes a 7-0 lead. The two teams then swapped field goals before the Hokies tied the game on Motley's 9-yard touchdown pass to McMillian.

Tech appeared to be in great shape heading into halftime, tied with Miami at 13. The 'Canes faced a third-and-20 from their own 11, but quarterback Brad Kaaya completed a 45-yard pass to Herb Waters. Three plays later, a roughing-the-passer penalty on Tech gave the 'Canes 15 more yards.

In the end, Miami took advantage of Tech's mistakes. With 4 seconds left, Kaaya threw a 7-yard touchdown pass to Rashawn Scott, and the extra point gave Miami a 20-13 lead at the break.

**BLACKSBURG** — Virginia Tech tailback Travon McMillian rushed for a career-high 142 yards, but it wasn't enough as the Hokies came up on the losing end of a 45-43 four-overtime affair with the No. 23 Duke Blue Devils on Saturday afternoon at Lane Stadium.

Duke quarterback Thomas Sirk threw a 25-yard touchdown pass to Erich Schneider in the fourth overtime and then ran in the two-point conversion to give the wild win in the first four-overtime game in ACC history.

With the loss, Tech fell to 3-5 overall, 1-3 in the ACC. Duke moved to 6-1 overall, 3-0 in league play. The Hokies had taken a 43-37 lead on a 1-yard touchdown run by McMillian to start the fourth overtime. Tech went for two points, as required by NCAA rules, but quarterback Michael Brewer's pass attempt to Isaiah Ford was broken up by a Duke defender.

Duke immediately went to work. On the Blue Devils' first play, Sirk lofted a strike to Schneider, who scored, and then he ran in the two-point conversion for the win.

Tech lost despite out-gaining Duke 452-449. Led by McMillian, the Hokies rushed for 182 yards. McMillian carried the ball a career-high 29 times and scored twice.

Tech trailed 24-16 after Duke's Ross Martin hit a 41-yard field goal with 11:48 left in regulation. But the Hokies managed to tie the game by going 83 yards in 12 plays. The drive ended when Brewer threw a 23-yard touchdown pass to tight end Bucky Hodges with 2:07 remaining. McMillian's run – after two Duke pass interference penalties – gave the Hokies the two points they needed to tie the game.

Brewer completed 24 of 45 for 270 yards, with three touchdowns. He threw touchdown passes of 16, 23 and 11 yards to Hodges, who finished with five catches for 101 yards. It marked the first 100-yard receiving game of Hodges' career.

Sirk paced Duke's attack, throwing for 270 yards and four touchdowns. He also rushed for 109 yards on 18 carries.

### GAME NINE



CHESTNUT HILL, Mass. - Travon McMillian rushed for 105 yards, Joey Slye booted four field goals and the Hokies defense scored a touchdown, helping Virginia Tech down the Boston College Eagles 26-10 in an ACC game played Saturday at Alumni Stadium. The win snapped the Hokies' two-game losing streak.

The Eagles came into the game ranked in the top 10 nationally in nine defensive categories, but the Hokies got off to a good start, and the Eagles offense, which has struggled much of the season, couldn't make up the difference.

Tech's defense held the Eagles to just 218 yards and forced four turnovers, including three fumbles, and it didn't give up a touchdown until the fourth quarter. Tech's offense finished with 275 yards of offense, led by McMillian's 105 rushing and Michael Brewer's 180 throwing. McMillian, who carried the ball 33 times, rushed for more yards against BC than any tailback this season

The Hokies got on the board first in this one, scoring on their second possession. They went 47 yards in just four plays, with the drive ending on a 27-yard touchdown pass from Brewer to receiver Cam Phillips. Slye's extra point gave Tech a 7-0 lead with 6:44 left in the first quarter.

Tech's third drive ended in points as well. The Hokies marched to the BC 27, but the drive stalled after that and they settled for a 47-yard field goal by Slye. That gave them a 10-0 lead with 1:13 left in the first quarter.

Tech's defense accounted for the Hokies' second touchdown, as mike linebacker Andrew Motuapuaka stripped Jordan Gowins of the ball at the BC 34 and then grabbed it. He returned it 34 yards for a touchdown, and Slye's extra point gave Tech a 17-0 lead with 11:01 left in the first half.

Tech's final score of the first half came on a nice, two-minute drive that was extended when BC roughed punter A.J. Hughes after the Eagles had stopped the Hokies at the Tech 17.

Tech retained possession and marched 55 yards to the BC 20, using big pass plays of 25 and 16 yards to Isaiah Ford and Phillips, respectively. Slye nailed a 38-yard field goal on the final play of the first half to give Tech a 20-0 lead at halftime.

The teams traded field goals in the third quarter, with Slye adding a 32-yarder. That marked the third time this season that he's hit at least three field goals in a game and the sixth time in his career. His four field goals tied a career high which he set in Tech's win over Cincinnati in the Military Bowl last year.

The Eagles finally got on the board toward the end of the third. An 11-play, 59-yard drive ended when Mike Knoll hit a 29-yard field goal that cut the Hokies' lead to 23-3 with 3:26 left in the third. The Eagles added a touchdown on a 3-yard run by Richard Wilson with 8:09 left in the game.

ATLANTA - Virginia Tech used great defense and a timely touchdown in the fourth quarter to rally from a 14-0 deficit and knock off Georgia Tech 23-21 in an ACC game played at Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta on Thursday night.

With the win, the Hokies moved to 5-5 overall, 3-3 in the ACC, and need one more win to become bowl eligible for the 23rd straight season. Georgia Tech fell to 3-7 overall, 1-6 in the ACC.

Georgia Tech's third lost fumble of the game put Virginia Tech in prime scoring position in the fourth quarter. Virginia Tech defensive tackle Woody Baron forced Georgia Tech's Marcus Allen to fumble, and Dadi Nicolas recovered at the Georgia Tech 18 for the Hokies.

Travon McMillian took advantage, scoring a touchdown on a 4-yard run with 6:58 left that gave the Hokies the lead. Joey Slye missed the extra point, but Virginia Tech still led 23-21.

Virginia Tech's defense did the rest. Georgia Tech twice had chances to take the lead, but the Hokies held both times. On the Yellow Jackets final drive, they drove into Virginia Tech territory, but an unsportsmanlike penalty pushed them back and then the Hokies' Ken Ekanem came up with a big thirddown sack of Georgia Tech's Justin Thomas. On fourth-and-27, Thomas' pass fell incomplete, enabling the Hokies to secure the win.

Virginia Tech's defense was outstanding after the first guarter. It gave up 130 yards in the first guarter, but just 128 in the final three guarters. The Hokies forced three turnovers in the win.

In fact, Georgia Tech finished with just 258 yards. That marked the fewest by a Georgia Tech coach Paul Johnson squad against a Virginia Tech defensive coordinator Bud Foster defense.

McMillian paced Virginia Tech's offense with 135 yards rushing and two touchdowns. Quarterback Michael Brewer threw for 178 yards and a score.

The Hokies fell behind 14-0 in the first guarter, but came from behind to tie the game at 14 at halftime following two long second-quarter scoring drives. The first one ended with a McMillian 2-yard touchdown run and the second one ended with a 17-yard touchdown pass from Brewer to Isaiah Ford.

Georgia Tech's lone score in the second half came when Brewer threw a pass that was intercepted on Georgia Tech's Brant Mitchell on third-and-10. Mitchell took it 32 yards to the end zone for a touchdown that gave the Yellow Jackets a 21-14 lead with 14 minutes left in the third quarter.

BLACKSBURG — Virginia Tech rallied from a 14-point deficit in the fourth quarter to tie the game, but the Hokies couldn't quite overcome No. 12 North Carolina, falling 30-27 in overtime to the Tar Heels at Lane Stadium on Saturday in what marked the final home game of Tech head coach Frank Beamer's coaching career.

With the loss, the Hokies fell to 5-6 overall, 3-4 in the ACC, and they now need to beat rival Virginia next Saturday to become bowl eligible for the 23rd consecutive season. North Carolina moved to 10-1 overall, 7-0 in the ACC, and clinched the Coastal Division crown.

There were multiple tributes to Beamer, who, on Nov. 1, announced his plans to retire at the end of the season following 29 seasons as the Hokies' head coach. The Hokies played with emotion for their head coach, but were unable to overcome the Tar Heels.

On the field, North Carolina opened a 24-10 lead in the fourth quarter, taking advantage of a Sam Rogers fumble and a Michael Brewer interception on back-to-back possessions to score two touchdowns – both on Elijah Hood touchdown runs.

But the Tar Heels couldn't salt the game away. Quarterback Marquise Williams fumbled on back-toback possessions in the fourth quarter, with the first one leading to an 8-yard touchdown pass from Brewer to tight end Bucky Hodges and the second one leading to a 4-yard touchdown pass from Brewer to receiver Isaiah Ford.

Ford's touchdown catch came with 1:07 remaining and tied the game at 24. Tech's defense held the Tar Heels on the ensuing possession and forced a punt. The Hokies then ran out the clock, sending the game into overtime.

Tech lost the toss heading into overtime, and North Carolina elected to play defense first. The Hokies went three-and-out and settled for a 41-yard field goal by Joey Slye that gave them a 27-24 lead.

North Carolina then got the ball. The Tar Heels drove to the Tech 3, but a false start pushed them back. A 3-yard run by quarterback Marquise Williams left North Carolina faced a third-and-goal from the 5.

Out of a timeout, Williams threw a 5-yard touchdown pass to Quinshad Davis to end the game. Davis appeared to be juggling the ball, but the officials reviewed the play, and the call stood.

Williams completed 13 of 26 for 205 yards, with a touchdown, and he also rushed for a touchdown. Hood rushed for 115 yards, as the Tar Heels finished with 445 yards of offense.

Brewer paced the Hokies' 403-yard day by completing 20 of 35 for 273 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions, he also rushed for a touchdown. Travon McMillian rushed for 80 yards on 21 carries. Following the game, Beamer did an interview with ESPN and then he addressed the fans, thanking

them for their support. The team then walked out to meet Beamer and carried him off the field.

**CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va.** – Virginia Tech kicker Joey Slye hit a field goal with 1:38 remaining, and safety Chuck Clark sealed the game with an interception in the final minute to lift the Hokies past in-state rival Virginia 23-20 at Scott Stadium in Charlottesville in the regular-season finale for both teams.

The win marked Tech's 12straight over the Cavaliers and also moved the Hokies to 6-6 overall, 4-4 in the ACC. The Hokies extended another streak, becoming bowl eligible for the 23rd consecutive season. Virginia closed its season with a 4-8 record, 3-5 in the ACC.

The game marked the final regular-season game for Tech head coach Frank Beamer, who announced Nov. 1 that he was retiring at the conclusion of this season. For the second straight week, Tech's players carried their head coach off the field, only this time, the ride was much more enjoyable.

Tech trailed by seven on two occasions in the second half, but rallied both times. The final time came midway through the fourth quarter when they trailed 20-13 after Virginia quarterback Matt Johns threw a 27-yard touchdown pass to Canaan Severin with 10:04 remaining.

On the ensuing possession, though, the Hokies quickly went 75 yards in six plays. On third-and-15 from the UVA 27, quarterback Michael Brewer threw a 27-yard touchdown pass to Isaiah **F**ord, and Slye extra point tied the game with 8:40 left.

Tech's defense held UVA on the ensuing possession, and the Hokies took over at their own 20 with 6:38 to go. Tech then drove to the Virginia 23, eating five minutes off the clock. The Hokies settled for a 41yard field goal by Slye that gave them a three-point lead.

Virginia had time for one final drive, taking over at its 20 with 1:38 to go. But on the third play of the drive, Clark intercepted Johns' pass, and the Hokies then ran out the clock, giving Beamer his 20th victory over the Cavaliers.

Tech's offense struggled for much of the afternoon and only finished with 304 yards, but 134 of that came in the fourth quarter when the Hokies amassed 17 points to rally past the Cavaliers.

Brewer paced the Hokies offensively by completing 15 of 29 for 237 yards, with two touchdowns and an interception. Travon McMillian rushed for 81 yards on 18 carries.

Virignia finished with 433 yards of offense, including 262 on the ground. Reid rushed for 103 yards on nine carries.
