HOKIES HIT THE ROAD AT UNC

• The Hokies are 3-1 under Justin Fuente after a 54-17 win vs. East Carolina (9/24).

• UNC is 4-1 after a 37-35 win at No. 12 FSU (10/1) on a 54-yard FG as time expired. UNC's only loss was a 33-24 decision vs. UGA (9/3).

• UNC also rallied from a 36-23 deficit vs. Pitt (9/24) for a last-second 37-36 victory.

• The last time VT played its first true road game (non-neutral site) at an opponent's home site this late was at Wake Forest (10/9/04).

• The Hokies lost a wild 30-27 OT decision last season vs. No. 12 UNC (11/21/15).

• UNC owns a nine-game home winning streak and hasn't lost at home since a 35-7 loss vs. NC State (11/29/14).

 Tech's defense has forced 30 opponent drives to go three-and-out (or less) this season.

• The Hokies are 9-3 (.750) in ACC play against North Carolina and haven't lost back-to-back games against UNC as a conference foe.

• Tech is 30-3 (.909) when registering 6.0 or more sacks, including last week's win vs. ECU (9/24).

• Since VT joined the ACC in 2004, Tech is 108-15 (.878) when holding foes to 24 points or fewer.

• UNC has lost 10 straight when scoring 24 points or fewer.

• Under Larry Fedora UNC is 22-2 (.917) when scoring 30+ points, including 16 straight wins.

 Since the start of the 2004 season, Tech is 53-4 (.930) when forcing two or more INTs, including a 21-1 (.955) mark on the road.

• The LPD has allowed a mere 45 completions, with only four Power Five teams allowing fewer.

• Tech LB Andrew Motuapuaka (9.2) fourth in the ACC in tackles per game and leads all LBs.

• DE Ken Ekanem is tied for sixth in the ACC with 4.5 sacks. Ekanem was in on a sack/safety vs. ECU (9/24).

KEY RUSHING STATS

• VT is 48-7 in ACC play when rushing for 150+ net yards and 40-7 with two or more rushing TDs.

 During UNC's nine-game home winning streak, it has gained 191.6 rushing ypg, while allowing 210.6 ypg.



HOKIES AMONG THE ACC'S ELITE

 Since the Hokies joined the ACC in 2004, only Florida State (118) owns more overall victories than Virginia Tech (116) and Clemson (114).

 Over that 12-year span, Virginia Tech (4) and Florida State
 (4) are tied for the most ACC titles, while no team can top Tech's 70-27 record in ACC play.

VT's Isaiah Ford (2,249) and UNC's Ryan Switzer (2,382)

- are the ACC's active leaders in rec. yards.

- Ford has caught a pass in a school-record 30 straight games, the longest active streak by any ACC WR.

• UNC is 13-2 at home dating back to 2014, with one of those two losses coming via a 34-17 setback vs. VT (10/4/14).

• UNC has outscored its foes by an average of 48.4 to 20.6 ppg, owning a +10 turnover margin (18 takes/8 gives) during its nine-game home winning streak.

• The only losses for both VT and UNC in 2016 have come at the hands of an SEC East opponent in a neutral-site game.

• UNC leads the FBS, completing 75.8% (138 of 182) of its passes in 2016.

• Justin Fuente threw three TDs for Oklahoma in a 28-24 win at Baylor (10/19/96) while UNC head coach Larry Fedora served as Baylor offensive assistant.

• WR Isaiah Ford owns 12 catches for 224 yards (18.7 avg.) and one TD, including 155 yards in last year's contest.

VORTH CAROLINA TAR HEELS

After a 35-poll absence, Virginia Tech is back in the AP Top 25 at No. 25 this week. The Hokies were last ranked at No. 17 following a 35-21 win at Ohio State (9/6/14).
The last time a ranked VT squad faced a ranked foe was when the No. 17 Hokies faced No. 13 Michigan in the Sugar Bowl (1/3/12).

• Tech is 16-10 as a member of the ACC against ranked ACC foes, including a 10-3 mark on the road.

A ranked UNC squad hasn't hosted a ranked foe at home since No. 21 UNC beat No. 22 GT 28-7 (11/8/08).
UNC is 3-8 against AP Top 25 foes under Larry Fedora.

• Jerod Evans (VT) and Mitch Trubisky (UNC) are the only FBS QBs with at least 13 TDs and fewer than two INTs.

• Evans has thrown 13 TDs in his first four starts, putting him on pace for 39 over 12 games which would easily surpass the Tech single-season mark of 24 set by QB Tyrod Taylor in 2010.

Only two QBs in Tech history have thrown for over 3,000 yards in a season: Don Strock (3,243 in 1972) and Logan Thomas (3,013 in 2011). Evans is on pace for 2,892 yards in the regular season.
Evans is seeking to join Taylor (+19 in 2010) and Maurice DeShazo (+15 in 1993) as the only two Tech QBs with a +15 or better TD-to-INT differential in a single season.

BIG NUMBERS - FOSTER REGISTERS WIN 200, HOKIES SCORE 103 IN LAST TWO GAMES

- The Hokies' 54-17 win vs. ECU (9/24) marked victory 200 for VT since Bud Foster assumed co-DC duties in 1995.
- VT (103 points) is the only FBS team that has scored over 100 points in its last two games against FBS foes.
- The Hokies have outscored their foes 59-0 in the first half of their last two outings. VT owns a 49-6 scoring edge in the first quarter and a 97-37 advantage in the first half in 2016.

• After losing nine fumbles in their first two games, the Hokies haven't committed a fumble in their last two games.

#BEAMERBALL - IT'S BACK!

• Tech special teams coordinator James Shibest was named the National Special Teams Coach of the Week (via CoachingSearch.com) after a 54-17 win vs. ECU (9/24).

• CB Greg Stroman registered an 87-yard punt return TD, marking his second punt return score in his last five games.

• Stroman ranks fourth in the ACC in punt return average (13.8) and fifth in kickoff return average (22.6). He is also tied for fourth in the ACC with two INTs.

VT is tied for seventh in the FBS with two blocked kicks.

• The Hokies blocked a punt, a FG attempt and also forced a sack on a fake punt attempt vs. East Carolina (9/24).



PLAYING HIGHLIGHTS

• Was recruited to the University of Oklahoma by Howard Schnellenberger and played two seasons for the Sooners.

 Saw duty in 20 games at OU and led the Sooners to a 30-27 upset in win overtime against No. 25 Texas in the Red River Shootout (10/12/96) in the inaugural Big 12 contest between the two longtime rivals. Also set an OU freshman record with 11 TD passes that season.

• Transferred to Murray State, the same school that Frank Beamer coached prior accepting the Virginia Tech job in 1987.

• Set 11 schools records during his two-year career at Murray State, completing 458 of 794 passes (57.7%) for 6,372 yards with 50 touchdowns and 20 interceptions, good for a 140.8 rating. Also scored two rushing TDs and had a 15-yard reception.

• Posted a career-high 553 yards at Southern Illinois (9/11/99) and threw for 470 yards and five TDs in his final game against Kentucky Wesleyan (11/20/99), leading the Racers to a 53-0 victory.

• Named the 1999 Ohio Valley Conference Offensive Player of the Year and was a finalist for the Walter Payton Award.

 Played professionally for the Arena Football League's Oklahoma Wranglers before embarking on his coaching career.

PROMINENT QB PUPILS Paxton Lynch (Memphis) D1-2016 (26th overall) – Denver

Completed 555 of 856 (64.8%) of his passes for 6,807 yards with 50 TDs and 13 INTs in 2014-15.

Andy Dalton (TCU) D2-2011 (35th overall) – Cincinnati

Two-time Pro Bowler completed 63.8 percent (408 of 639) of his passes for 5,613 yards with 50 TDs and 14 INTs at TCU (2009-10). In 77 career NFL regular season starts, entering 2016, has thrown for 18,008 yards with 124 TDs and 73 INTs, leading the Bengals to five straight playoff berths.

Casey Pachall (TCU)

Completed 66.5 percent of his throws (228 of 343) with 25 TDs and seven INTs in 2011.



THE MEMPHIS TURNAROUNI

• Compiled a 19-6 record in his final two seasons at Memphis, guiding the Tigers to back-to-back bowl berths after inheriting a program that went 5-31 in three years before his arrival.

• Unanimous selection as 2014 American Athletic Conference Coach of the Year when he led Memphis to its first conference title since 1971.

• Guided Memphis to a 15-game winning streak that included a 37-24 win over No. 13 Ole Miss (10/17/15).

• The Tigers concluded a 10-3 season in 2014 with a 55-48 double-OT triumph over BYU in the Miami Beach Bowl, the first 10win season for the Tigers since 1938. • Memphis posted a 9-3 regular season mark in 2015, capped by a 63-0 win vs. SMU in Fuente's finale as the Tigers' head coach.

• Fuente's final game as Memphis head coach was a 63-0 win vs. SMU (11/28/15). QB Paxton Lynch tied an FBS record with seven touchdown passes in the first half of that game. Lynch threw for a school-record 28 TD passes on the 2015 season.

• Memphis outscored its opponents by an average margin of 20.7 points per game during a run of 15 consecutive wins from 2014-15, scoring 652 points (43.5 ppg), while allowing only 341 (22.7 ppg).

Memphis scored 471 points in 2014,

shattering the old school record of 430 points set in 2004, while allowing a mere 19.5 points per game, a figure that ranked 11th among FBS squads.

• The Tigers went +11 (31 takeaways/20 giveaways) in the turnover column in 2014, finishing the campaign ranked in both the AP Top 25 and in the USA Today/Amway Coaches Polls, a first in school history.

• Fuente's squad led Conference USA in total defense in league games in 2012, giving up just 331.6 ypg.

• The Tigers also excelled on special teams under Fuente as Tom Hornsey won the 2013 Ray Guy Award as the nation's top collegiate punter.

• Tech head coach Justin Fuente is the currently the youngest coach in the ACC by four years over NC State's Dave Doeren and the youngest by 10 years in the Coastal (UVa's Bronco Mendenhall). Below is where he stacks up among Power 5 coaches.

FACING NEW FOES

• Fuente faced 32 head coaches, 27 schools and coached in 13 different states during his four season at Memphis.

 This season, he adds nine new coaches, while facing three old ones. He is 1-0 against Syracuse's Dino Babers (Bowling Green) and Virginia's Bronco Mendenhall (BYU). Duke's David Cutcliffe has beaten Fuente in two prior meetings.

• Fuente adds 10 new schools to the list of programs faced, but will face Duke (0-2) for a third time and East Carolina for the second time. He is now 1-1 against ECU after this year's win (9/24/16). • Fuente adds three new states to those where he's coached a game adding New York (Syracuse) and Indiana (Notre Dame) this year. The season opener against Liberty marked Fuente's first game coached in the state of Virginia.

Hokies' offensive production, 450+ yards in three of four games

• In four games this season, Tech has turned in at least 450 yards of total offense in three of them - 458 vs. Liberty (9/3), 476 vs. Boston College (9/17) and 462 vs. East Carolina (9/24) - and have 1,790 total yards of offense in four games.

• Last year's team, four games in, had three games of at least 425 yards of total offense and a total of 1,813 yards.

• However, the last season in which the Hokies compiled at least 450 yards of total offense in three of the first four games was 2000 - a team that went 10-1. They had 549 vs. Akron (9/2/00), 527 vs. Rutgers (9/16/00) and 481 at Boston College (9/30/00).

Tech's offensive rankings in the ACC

• Five weeks into the season, Tech's offense is ranked in the top five in six categories led by tied for second in Fewest INTs Thrown (1).

• The Hokies are third in Pass Efficiency (169.4), fourth in Scoring (40.8) and Time of Possession (32:41) and fifth in Red Zone Offense (89.5) and 3rd Down Conversions (45.9).

Evans opens season as starting QB, etches name in school record book

• Junior-college transfer QB Jerod Evans started against Liberty (9/3) and became Tech's first known JUCO transfer to start for the Hokies at the position in the modern era.

• Evans led the Hokies to a 36-13 win over Liberty marking the 13th straight Tech starting quarterback to win his debut, with the last 20 combining for a 15-5 mark the last 30 years.

• With his four TD tosses in his Hokie debut, Evans became the first Tech QB to account for at least four scores (rush or pass).

Evans follows up with another school record vs. Boston College

• Evans threw for five TDs against the Eagles (9/17), tying the Tech school record for most TD passes in a single game first set by Bryan Randall at Syracuse (11/9/02).

• He pushed his season total to 10 TD passes, which set the school record for most TD passes in the first three starts previously held by Grant Noel, who had eight to start the 2001 season. It was also the most TDs to start a career without an INT, also previously held by Noel at eight, as Evans threw his first pick of the year in the third quarter of that game.

• Before his first INT, his 80 pass attempts was the second-longest streak to start a career behind Grant Noel (2001), who went 90 straight attempts (in starts) without a pick.

Williams returns to the field

• RB Marshawn Williams, who did not get a carry in the season's first two games, returned to the field for the first time since at Duke (11/15/14) to lead the Hokies in rushing attempts (15) and yards (81) in the victory over Boston College (9/17).

• Tech rushed for 223 yards and had 253 passing yards in that game, to go over 200 in both for the second time this season - Liberty (9/3). It was the 48th time in the last 30 years - and the team is 43-5 in those games and have won 25 straight.

Hodges moving up the charts for tight ends

• TE Bucky Hodges has 97 career receptions, 1,206 receiving yards and 15 touchdowns (all are school records for TEs - see chart on left). He passed Tech Hall of Famer and color analyst for Tech's radio broadcast Mike Burnop for the top spot in receptions and yards.

• For career numbers in the conference, Hodges currently sits in the number three slot for touchdowns (*chart left*). On the ACC top 10 list, Hodges is currently four receptions shy and about 120 receiving yards shy. Ironically, currently No. 10 in career receptions is Maryland's Ferrell Edmunds (1984-87), the father of the Hokies' Edmunds brothers.

Ford sets season records, school records, knocking on career's door

• WR Isaiah Ford did a lot at Tech through his first two seasons. Just a sample, Ford became the fastest player at Tech to reach 10 career TD receptions (19 games), fastest player to 1,000 career receiving yards (17 games) and fastest player to 100 career receptions (22 games).

After setting single-season records last year in receptions (75), yards (1,164) and TDs (11), Ford is quickly climbing the charts on those three career charts (see left).
Ford has caught at least TWO passes in every game of his career (30), which is a school record previously held by Danny Coale (22, from 10/16/10 to 1/3/12). The record for catching at least one pass was held by Ernest Wilford (8/25/02 to 12/26/03) at 27 straight games.
He also holds school records for games with a receiving touchdown (5) and consecutive 100-yard receiving games.

Phillips, Hodges gives Hokies three career 1,000-yard receivers

• WR Cam Phillips and TE Bucky Hodges are also climbing the charts in Tech's history books.

Before last year, no Hokie had ever caught more than 70 career passes before his junior season and only three had ever gone over 1,000 career receiving yards. However, Ford, Phillips and Hodges all eclipsed those milestones during the 2015 season.
The 2016 season marked the first time in

 The 2016 season marked the first time in school history that three players entered the year with more than 1,000 career receiving yards. During the 2007 season a total of four Hokies ended the year with 1,000-plus yards, the only other time Tech had threeplus 1,000-yard receivers on the same field.

Seven Hokies register their first career reception this season

• Coming into the season, not one other WR on Tech's roster - other than Phillips and Ford - had a reception to his name, or even played in a game.

• WRs C.J. Carroll, Henri Murphy and Devin Wilson each notched their first collegiate catches in the game against Liberty, with Carroll getting two, for nine yards, and Murphy (12) and Wilson (8) each catching one. RB Shai McKenzie also had his first two career pass catches in the opener for 11 yards.

• Since the opener, WRs Jaylen Bradshaw and Divine Deablo and TE Chris Cunningham have each notched their first career receptions, with Cunningham's going for a TD vs. Boston College (9/17).

Offensive line brought back quartet with experience

• Not since the Hokies returned 93 starts on the offensive line for the start of the 2011 season has Tech seen so much experience coming back up front.

• Led by RT Jonathan McLaughlin, who had 35 career starts entering the season, the Hokies returned 90 career starts, just one of 19 teams in the NCAA with that many. Only North Carolina (131) had more career starts on the OL than the Hokies among ACC teams.

• McLaughlin has started in every game he has played, while offensive lineman Augie Conte returned with 23 career starts. Offensive linemen Wyatt Teller (18), Eric Gallo (13) and Kyle Chung (1) also all owned starting experience for Tech.

• In 2011, Blake DeChristopher (37), Jaymes Brooks (28), Greg Nosal (14) and Andrew Lanier (14), along with Andrew Miller, helped the Hokies to register 186.9 yards rushing per game, 226.1 yards passing per game and allowed just 17 sacks during an 11-3 season.

Virginia Tech has scored in **273** straight games dating back to the 1995 season.

That is now the 10th-longest streak ever in the history of the NCAA by an FBS school & the sixth-longest active streak.

THE DEFENSE

Sacks pile up against East Carolina

• Through the first three games of the 2016 season, the Tech defense, behind 2.5 sacks by DE Ken Ekanem, had 3.0 sacks for 16 yards.

They doubled that output against ECU (9/24), as seven Hokies combined on six sacks for 40 yards. Ekanem led the way with 2.0, Tremaine Edmunds picked up 1.5 and Andrew Motuapuaka, Anthony Shegog, Cam Phillips, Reggie Floyd and Houshun Gaines all had 0.5.
 It was the most sacks by the team since getting seven at Wake Forest (11/22/14).

Hokies pitch shutout against Boston College

• For the first time since the Hokies' game against Bowling Green (9/22/12), Bud Foster's defense shut out an opponent, when Tech registered the 49-0 victory against Boston College (9/17) in the team's ACC opener at Lane Stadium.

• The shutout, the 31st for Tech in the Foster era, also marked the first blanking of an ACC opponent since the team's 38-0 win at Virginia (11/26/11) and the first home shutout win over an ACC team since a 17-0 win over Virginia (11/25/06).

• The defense helped Tech register a 49-point win, which was the largest by the Hokies in an ACC game since a 45-point win at Duke (45-0, 9/10/05) and a 44-point win at home vs. Georgia Tech (51-7, 9/24/05). It tied the largest ever win in an ACC game at 49 points in the Hokies' 55-6 win over Maryland (11/18/04).

Defense features plenty of experience on the first team

• Led by DE Ken Ekanem (entering season with 26 consecutive starts) and S Chuck Clark (23 straight starts), the defense had a combined 15 Hokies returning that had 142 combined starts under their belts and included 126 for the players listed at first string.

• The Hokies had a total of five players with at least 10-plus starts on the field to start the Liberty game, which included cornerback Brandon Facyson (now 23), linebacker Andrew Motuapuaka (16) and tackle Nigel Williams (11).

• Tech has started the same 11 men through the first four games.

Clark reaches century mark for tackles in a season

• For the first time since the Hokies joined the ACC, a DB reached the century mark for total tackles. In 2015, S Chuck Clark recorded 107, highlighted by his 16 straight games with at least five and his four games a year ago with at least 10 (five for his career).

• He became the first DB to reach 100 since Michael Crawford led the team with 131 during the 2003 season, when the team was in the Big East.

• Since then only four men - Vince Hall (3x, 2005-07), Jack Tyler (2x, 2012-13), Xavier Adibi (2007) and Cody Grimm (2009) - had reached 100 and all were linebackers.

• In the first two games this season, Clark has had seven and nine tackles, extending his streak of at least five tackles in a game to 18 straight games. Against Boston College (9/17), he only had four tackles, ending this streak, but responded with a team-high 11 against East Carolina (9/24), his sixth double-digit effort of his career.

Brothers starting on the same side of the ball in a season opener

• Both ROVER Terrell and LB Tremaine Edmunds started on defense for the Hokies in the season opener against Liberty.

• The Edmunds became the third set of brothers to start on the defensive side of the ball in the team's season opener - the pair made a start last year together at Georgia Tech (11/12/15) - in the last six years.

 It was three years ago when Kyle and Kendall Fuller opened the season on opposite sides of the defense - both starting at CB - against Alabama (8/31/13). Brothers Antoine and Derrick Hopkins both started on the DL against Appalachian State (9/3/11).

Stroman back to defense full time, picks off two in opener

• During the 2014 Military Bowl, DB Greg Stroman worked for the first time on the offensive side of the ball, rushing twice for four yards and catching one pass for six.

• Last season, he was used occasionally on offense and actually started one game - NC State (10/9/15) - as a wide receiver. He rushed seven times last year for 12 yards.

• For the 2016 campaign, Stroman is now solely a DB, making a start in the season opener and doubled his output for career INTs as he entered the game with two picks.

• He became the first Hokie since Brandon Facyson at East Carolina (9/14/13) to pick off two passes in the game with his effort in the season opener.

Alexander makes his mark in first year with #DBU

• In just his second game last year, DB Adonis Alexander intercepted his first career pass against Furman (9/12) and in his first start a week later, snagged his second.

• Alexander also sealed the win over NC State by ending Wolfpack quarterback Jacoby Brissett's streak of 241 straight passes without an interception with a pick in the fourth quarter. And at Virginia, he notched INT No. 4 with a third-quarter interception.

• He didn't set the record for interceptions by a freshman, and wasn't second either. That's because Kendall Fuller (6) and current teammate Brandon Facyson (5) hold those two spots when they were freshmen in 2013.

• He got INT No. 1 for 2016, and five for his career, with a second quarter pick against Boston College (9/18).

Six true freshmen make debuts in opener, four on defense

• In the season opener against Liberty, the defense saw four true freshmen make an appearance on the field, while the offense had two.

• DE Jimmie Taylor recorded a tackle, while LB Tavante Beckett and DBs Reggie Floyd and Jovonn Quillen also all saw action.

• WRs Eric Kumah and Divine Deablo appeared in the game on offense.

Motuapuaka and Stroman are in rare company

• LB Andrew Motuapuaka and CB Greg Stroman have each scored three TDs in their Tech careers either on defense or special teams. Below is where they rank since 1987.

The famed Virginia Tech Lunch Pail has come to symbolize the blue-collar approach of the Hokies' defense under longtime defensive coordinate Bud Foster.

In 1995, Foster served as co-defensive coordinator with Rod Sharpless, whose mother-in-law found the original Lunch Pail in Mercerville, New Jersey. The pail once belonged to a coal miner and after a record-setting defensive season, the Lunch Pail became an iconic part of Hokies' lore.



The Pail travels wherever the Hokies go and its care is only entrusted to a defensive leader.



Before the start of every season, a signed mission statement from the defense is placed in The Pail. Then every week, unit goals, team goals and keys to success are placed in The Pail, plus the turf from any road victories.



Since 2007, The Pail has also contained the names of the 32 fallen Hokies taken in the April 16 tragedy.

Corey Moore – whose jersey No. 56 is retired by Tech – is the only player who has ever earned lifetime possession of an incarnation of The Pail from Foster.

LONGEST TENURED FBS ASSISTANTS ACTIVE and CONTINUOUS

Only nine assistant coaches in the country have been at their schools since 1996, and Virginia Tech has two of them.

• In Tech's win vs. East Carolina (9/24), the Hokies blocked both a FGA and a punt, which had last happened vs. Marshall (9/21/13).

Credited with the block on the FGA was DT Tim Settle, while WR Cam Phillips was the player who blocked the punt.
Phillips, along with Reggie Floyd, also stopped a fake punt attempt with a sack.
Lastly, it was only the second time in the last 30 years that Tech blocked two kicks and returned a punt for a TD, which also happened in that Marshall game.

Stroman takes punt to the house in win over ECU, joins Motuapuaka

• Greg Stroman's 87-yard punt return for a TD vs. East Carolina (9/24) was tied for the third-longest in school history and was the second longest in Lane Stadium. It was his second career punt return for a TD and his third career defensive or special teams TD. He is now one of 10 Hokies (since 1987) to have three or more defensive or special teams TDs in a Tech career (see chart last page).

Slye ties school record for field goals, moving up all-time lists

• Last season, Tech kicker Joey Slye was 23 of 30 on field goal attempts, and in his career is now 47 of 64. His 23 makes in 2015 tied the school record set by Dustin Keys in 2008. The junior is 21 shy of Shayne Graham's school record of 68, and currently ranks T-third.

On the all-time scoring list at Tech, Slye is sixth with 236 points and fifth among kickers.

Slye led Tech with 110 points last year and was the first Hokie since Chris Hazley

(2010, 116 points) to reach the century mark in a single season.

Slye almost automatic inside 40 yards

• In his career, Joey Slye is 30 of 33 (90.9 percent) from inside 40 yards and has made 13 straight dating back to his only miss from that distance last year - a 37-yard attempt at East Carolina (9/26/15). Ironically, his only other misses from inside 40 were two blocked kicks during his freshman year.

• Of note, Slye's career long is 49 yards, and so has never made a kick over 50 (missed all eight attempts). Inside of 50 yards, Slye is 47 of 56 (83.9 percent) from inside 50.

Ludwig takes over punting duties

• Mitchell Ludwig replaced school record holder A.J. Hughes, who was the starting punter for Tech for four seasons and set career records at the school, and finished second in the ACC, in punts (310) and yards punting (12,962). His career average was 41.8 per punt.

Through four games, he's held his own, with a 39.0 average on 22 attempts.

Stroman climbing charts for punt returners

• Stroman is already fourth all-time in the school's record book for career punt returns with 79 and his 656 return yards rank him eighth.

• In Tech's history, only two men have ever returned more than 100 punts, John Ludlow (136, 1979-82) and Eddie Royal (111, 2004-07), while Royal is the only man to go over 900 yards in punt returns.

Stroman takes over kickoff return duties, as well

• In his first two seasons, Greg Stroman returned just one kickoff for 18 yards, but is now the teams' full-time return man. He's returned 11 so far this season for a 22.6 average.

• Among those Hokies in the top 10 of kick returns (34 or more returns), his current season average would rank him sixth in a career.

BLACKSBURG – Virginia Tech rallied from a 14-point deficit in the fourth quarter to tie the game, but the Hokies couldn't quite overcome No. 12 North Carolina, falling 30-27 in overtime to the Tar Heels at Lane Stadium in what marked the final home game of Tech head coach Frank Beamer's coaching career.

There were multiple tributes to Beamer, who, on Nov. 1, announced his plans to retire at the end of the season following 29 seasons as the Hokies' head coach. The Hokies played with emotion for their head coach, but could not pull out a win.

On the field, North Carolina opened a 24-10 lead in the fourth quarter, taking advantage of a Sam Rogers fumble and a Michael Brewer interception on back-toback possessions to score two touchdowns – both on Elijah Hood runs.

But the Tar Heels couldn't salt the game away. Quarterback Marquise Williams fumbled on back-to-back possessions in the fourth quarter, with the first one leading to an 8-yard touchdown pass from Brewer to Bucky Hodges and the second one leading to a 4-yard touchdown pass from Brewer to receiver Isaiah Ford.

Ford's touchdown catch came with 1:07 remaining and tied the game at 24. Tech's defense held the Tar Heels on the ensuing possession and forced a punt. The Hokies then ran out the clock, sending the game into overtime.

Tech lost the toss heading into overtime, and North Carolina elected to play defense first. The Hokies went three-and-out and settled for a 41-yard field goal by Joey Slye that gave them a 27-24 lead.

North Carolina then got the ball. The Tar Heels drove to the Tech 3, but a false start pushed them back. A 3-yard run by quarterback Marquise Williams left North Carolina faced a third-and-goal from the 5. Williams threw a 5-yard touchdown pass to Quinshad Davis to end the game. Davis appeared to be juggling the ball, but the officials reviewed the play, and the call stood.

• During Week 2 of the College Football season, ABC received the top three overnights across all its networks and was led by the Hokies' game against Tennessee with the Battle at Bristol getting a 3.8 overnight rating.

• Meanwhile, ESPN's stream of the Battle at Bristol was the network's moststreamed game of the week (86,000 AMA & 403,000 unique viewers).

• The Hokies have brought ESPN a couple other ratings successes, which includes a pair of Top Opening Weekend games and the Most Watched Regular Season CFB Games on ESPN according to SportsMediaWatch.com.

WHAT'S A HOKIE?

That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body. Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today.

Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. Following is the "Old Hokie" yell in its original form:

Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy! Tech! Tech! V.P.I.! Sola-Rex Sola-Rah Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!! Rae, Ri, V.P.I.

LANE STADIUM - HOME OF THE HOKIES

Rising high into the mountainous sky of the New River Valley, Virginia Tech's Lane Stadium enters its 51st year of football competition in 2015. The Tech football team has enjoyed over two decades of success, going to 23 straight bowl games and winning 10 or more games eight straight seasons from 2004-11. A big part of that success is the home-field advantage the Hokies enjoy at Lane Stadium/Worsham Field.

Sitting at roughly 2,057 feet above sea level, the stadium is the second-highest among all FBS schools in the eastern United States, trailing only Appalachian State (3,300). Completed in 1965, Lane Stadium/Worsham Field has gone through numerous changes, renovations and additions. But through it all, it has always been regarded as one of the finest places to watch – and toughest places for opponents to play – a college football game.

THE HOKIE STONE


Before each home football game, Virginia Tech football players and coaching staff enter Lane Stadium through a tunnel. On the stadium-side entrance to Worsham Field, they pass beneath a Hokie Stone, which they touch for good luck and is flanked by these words: "For those who have passed. For those to come ... Reach for Excellence."

ENTER SANDMAN

The history behind Virginia Tech's use of Metallica's "Enter Sandman" started during the 2000 season. That summer Tech added a new scoreboard to Lane Stadium and the athletics marketing team decided to use the scoreboard for an entrance video. The group considered "Welcome to the Jungle" by Guns N' Roses and "Sirius" by the Alan Parsons Project before settling on "Enter Sandman." It has been the entrance song for the Hokies ever since.

Virginia Tech quarterback Jerod Evans threw for 221 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Hokies to a 36-13 season-opening victory over Liberty on Saturday, handing head coach Justin Fuente his first victory.

Fuente, who spent the previous four seasons at Memphis, took over in January for Frank Beamer, who retired after 29 years as Tech's head coach.

Evans, a junior-college transfer from Texas who enrolled this past January, completed 20 of 32 passes. The Hokies trailed 13-10 in the second quarter before Evans threw touchdown passes to Isaiah Ford and Bucky Hodges on the Hokies' last two possessions of the first half.

Ford caught 11 passes for 117 yards and Hodges caught two touchdown passes. Joey Slye hit two field goals of 34 yards.

Liberty amassed just 160 yards of offense, scoring all of its points off of Tech turnovers. The Hokies lost four fumbles – their only blemishes on the day.

- Tech trailed 13-10 in the second quarter and faced a fourth-and-1 from the Liberty 43. Fuente elected to go for it and Evans went 37 yards on a keeper to the Liberty 6. Two plays later, Evans hit Ford for the go-ahead 5-yard touchdown pass.
- Evans and Hodges connected on a third-down conversion toward the end of the first half. Tech faced third-and-10 from the Liberty 41 and Evans hit Hodges for a 20-yard gain to the Liberty 21. Four plays later, Evans found Hodges for an 18-yard TD that gave the Hokies a 24-13 lead with 24 seconds left in the first half.

• Terrell Edmunds had an interception and He and Johnathan Galante tackled a Liberty punt returner in the end zone for a safety. On the ensuing possession, Evans found Hodges for a 20-yard touchdown play.

FUENTE ON HIS FIRST GAME

"The atmosphere here is fantastic. It's what college football is all about. People at Virginia Tech take a lot of pride in the game-day atmosphere, and they should. It was incredible

"My thought process coming into the game was how would our kids handle this? How do they respond when things don't go well. There were some times when things were kind of ugly looking, but I liked the way our kids dug in there and plowed away. The atmosphere was fantastic and I'm please with the way the kids responded to adversity."

IMPORTANT NOTES

- Fuente became the first Tech coach to win his debut since Jerry Claiborne opened his tenure with a victory over William & Mary in 1961.
- Ford's 117 yards receiving marked the fourth straight game in which he has recorded more than 100 yards receiving – a school record.
- Ford has caught at least two passes in 27 straight games, tying a school record for consecutive games with at least one reception (Ernest Wilford, 2002-03).
- Ford's touchdown reception marked the 18th of his career, tying him for second place on Tech's career touchdown receptions list with Jarrett Boykin (2008-11), Ricky Scales (1972-74) and André Davis (1998-2001).

Greg Stroman's two interceptions gave him four for his career.

Virginia Tech got off to a great start in its game against the No. 17 Tennessee Volunteers, but turnovers and penalties turned out to be its undoing, as the Hokies fell to the Volunteers 45-24 on Saturday night at Bristol Motor Speedway.

The long-anticipated event drew a crowd of 156,990 fans and broke college football's single-game attendance record, surpassing the 115,109 fans who witnessed Michigan and Notre Dame at Michigan Stadium in 2013.

Tennessee quarterback Josh Dobbs threw three touchdown passes and rushed for two more, as the Volunteers rallied from a 14-0 deficit to knock off the Hokies in the first regular-season meeting between the two teams since 1937.

Virginia Tech (1-1) jumped out to a 14-0 lead in the first quarter on a 7-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Jerod Evans to Sam Rogers and a 69-yard touchdown run by tailback Travon McMillian. But an Evans fumble led to a 5-yard touchdown pass from Dobbs to Jauan Jennings early in the second quarter and that started a Volunteers' string of 31 unanswered points.

Dobbs completed 10 of 19 for 91 yards, with three touchdowns and an interception. He also ran for 106 yards.

McMillian paced the Hokies with 127 yards rushing and the score. Evans completed 20 of 28 for 208 yards and a touchdown.

OF NOTE

- Virginia Tech out-gained Tennessee (400-330), ran more plays (73-65) and had the time of possession advantage (31:44-28:16).
- Tech turned the ball over five times in the game and Tennessee scored 21 points off those turnovers. All five were fumbles. The Hokies have now lost nine fumbles on the season.
- The momentum of the game changed when a poor snap from center Kyle Chung threw off the timing of a handoff between Evans and C.J. Carroll early in the second quarter. Tennessee recovered at the Tech 5 and scored on the next play.
- The Hokies cut the Tennessee lead to 31-17 on a field goal by Joey Slye late in the third quarter, but three of their next four possessions ended in fumbles.
- The Hokies were penalized eight times for 101 yards.
- McMillian's touchdown run marked the longest run of his career. His 100-yard performance marked the fourth of his career.
- Shai McKenzie's 2-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter marked the fourth of his career and his first since Sept. 27, 2014 against Western Michigan.

FUENTE QUOTES

"Well, obviously (the turnovers) reared its head in huge ways the first two ball games. We've got to do a better job. We've obviously got to do a better job either teaching or understanding or emphasizing ball security. We're inadequate to say the least right now. We'll look at it and come up with a plan, but what we're doing, what we've done in the past, hasn't been an issue. Obviously, we need to change or modify it in order to give ourselves a chance."

"At times, we lacked discipline out there, which is very disappointing. That falls on me.".

Virginia Tech guarterback Jerod Evans tied a school record with five touchdowns passes and the Hokies' defense recorded the team's first shutout since 2012, as the Hokies blanked Boston College 49-0 on Saturday in Tech's ACC opener.

Tech moved to 2-1 overall on the season and 1-0 in the ACC. The win marked the second consecutive for the Hokies over BC (1-2, 0-2 ACC) and the seventh in the past nine meetings. The shutout marked the first by Tech since it beat Bowling Green 37-0 in 2012. It marked the Hokies' first shutout of an ACC foe since 2011 when they won 38-0 at Virginia. The shutout marked Tech's first ACC shutout at home since it won 17-0 over UVA in 2006.

Virginia Tech's defense put forth a dominating effort, holding the Eagles to 124 yards. The Hokies forced a three-and-out on 10 BC possessions.

Evans' five scoring tosses tied the mark held by former quarterback Bryan Randall, who threw five touchdown passes in Tech's 50-42 triple overtime loss at Syracuse in 2002. Offensively, the Hokies amassed 476 yards, including 223 on the ground. Marshawn Williams, playing in his first game since tearing his ACL in 2014, led the way with 81 yards.

Evans threw a 15-yard scoring pass to Travon McMillian on the Hokies' second possession to open the scoring and then added touchdown passes of 8 and 30 yards to Isaiah Ford. The latter came with 1:42 left in the first half and gave the Hokies a 21-0 lead, which they took into the locker room.

BIG PLAYS

- · Greg Stroman's 29-yard punt return set up Ford's 30-yard touchdown reception. It marked Stroman's longest punt return of the season and the seventh of his career of 20 vards or more.
- Bucky Hodges hauled in two 17-yard receptions on the same possession in the second quarter and that led to the 8-yard touchdown pass to Ford.
- Evans' 36-yard pass to Cam Phillips on the Hokies' first possession of the second half led to the 7-yard touchdown pass from Evans to Cunningham.
- Leading 28-0 and facing a fourth-and-1 from the BC 20, Tech went for it and Evans gained 12 yards on a keeper leading to his TD pass to Sam Rogers for a 35-0 lead.
- · Evans' 47-yard pass to Ford on Tech's final possession of the third quarter led to McMillian's 7-yard touchdown run and gave the Hokies a 42-0 lead.

FUENTE QUOTES

- "I don't pay too much attention to (Evans') numbers. I pay more attention to the grade sheet in terms of our decisions on a play-by-play basis. He certainly made some good plays out there and missed a few. I will say this, the last three weeks, he has approached it with a great mindset. It is obviously important for him to play well. You can see that by his preparation. He is a good listener and tries to do what we ask him to do and sometimes he does it on a consistent basis."
- "If we eliminate mistakes and stay healthy and do a great job of preparing and doing the things that good teams do, then we'll have that opportunity. My caution to our kids is that you have to do this every day. Do we have a chance to play well on Saturdays regardless of the opponent? Absolutely. That doesn't mean we'll win every game. But it's up to us to give ourselves that opportunity and we gave ourselves that opportunity this week, and in turn, we got some good results."

Virginia Tech guarterback Jerod Evans threw three touchdown passes and ran for a score, and the Hokies made three big plays on special teams, as they scuttled the East Carolina Pirates 54-17 in a non-conference game Saturday afternoon.

The Hokies (3-1) scored on their final five possessions of the first half, including all four of their second-quarter possessions. They jumped out to a 38-0 halftime lead, overwhelming East Carolina (2-2) and snapping a two-game losing streak to the Pirates.

Evans completed 13 of 20 passes for a career-high 282 yards and rushed for a career-high 97 more. He entered the game having thrown an ACC-best 10 touchdown passes and has thrown just one interception on the season. He threw touchdown passes of 24 yards to Isaiah Ford, 13 yards to Travon McMillian and 45 yards to Cam Phillips.

Three of the big special teams plays came in the first half. Greg Stroman scored the Hokies' first touchdown on an 87-yard punt return in the first quarter, and a blocked field goal led to a touchdown pass from Evans to Ford. Phillips blocked a punt by East Carolina punter Worth Gregory in the second quarter, and the Hokies took advantage, scoring on a 13-yard pass from Evans to McMillian.

ECU quarterback Philip Nelson had 362 yards passing and two touchdown tosses to Jimmy Williams. The Pirates had 443 yards of offense, but committed the three special teams mistakes, fumbled once and were sacked six times.

OF NOTE

- · Stroman's punt returned tied for the third-longest punt return in the modern era (post-1950) and the second career punt return for a touchdown.
- Stroman became just one of 10 Hokies since 1987 to score three or more touchdowns on defense or special teams in his career.
- Ford caught four passes for 117 yards and a TD. The touchdown reception marked the 21st of his career, leaving him one shy of Antonio Freeman's school record.
- Tech's two blocks marked the first time the Hokies had blocked two kicks in the same game since a win over Marshall on Sept. 21, 2013.
- The Hokies scored at least 49 points in back-to-back games for the first time since 1999 when they scored 58 against Rutgers and 62 against Syracuse.

FUENTE QUOTES

- "I think our guys are learning how we want them to prepare. That doesn't guarantee that we'll jump out on everyone like that. I do think we have a good mindset and have a good plan. We've got intelligent players who can make adjustments when we need to. I see our team continuing to understand what we're shooting for, so to speak and how we want to play and how we want to prepare.'
- "I think he's pretty good. He's been judicious with the ball and he's going to the right place most of the time. He had a couple of balls that I wish he had given us a little better chance to catch today, but he made some plays. He made a big play with his feet in the second half. He's been pretty efficient.



Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its named to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

VIRGINIA TECH FOOTBALL

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today. Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech." Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.
