- The Hokies are 22-9 (.710) on Thursday night, including last week's 37-16 win vs. Miami (10/20).
- This week's game will mark VT's 32nd appearance on ESPN's Thursday night package. Since it's inception 1991, only GT (32) as many appearances.
- Tech owns an 137-50 scoring edge in four ACC games.

#### **VT SEEKS TO EXORCISE PITT DEMONS**

- Tech has lost three of its last four games vs. Pitt with the Panthers owning back-to-back wins vs. VT.
- The Hokies are 0-4 at Heinz Field with Tech's last win at Pitt coming by a 30-17 margin at Pitt Stadium (10/30/99) as QB Michael Vick led VT to an 11-0 regular season mark en route.
- VT's last two losses against the Panthers have been decided by a combined nine points (38-29).
- Pitt is 8-14 (.364) against ranked foes at Heinz Field
- last win 28-21 vs. No. 24 Notre Dame (11/9/13).
- Pitt is 8-3 in ACC play under Pat Narduzzi.

#### SHOWDOWN OF TWO TOP RUSH DEFENSES

- Pitt leads the ACC and ranks fourth among Power Five squads, while VT is fourth among P5 squads.
- VT has held four of its last five foes to less than 100 net rush yards, allowing 79.2 ypg over that span.
- Pitt allowed a season-high 241 net rushing yards vs. GT (10/8), but has permitted 72.5 ypg against its other five opponents.
- VT racked up a season-high 251 rushing yards and 5.7 ypc vs. Miami (10/20), as RB Travon McMillian registered a season-best 131 yards (7.3 avg).
- Pitt ranks second in the ACC and 11th in the P5, averaging 239.1 rushing ypg.

#### **KEY SCORING STATS ON HOKIES, PANTHERS**

- The Hokies are 38-3 (.927) in ACC play when scoring 30+points, including a 19-1 (.950) mark on the road.
- VT has averaged 42.0 ppg in its five wins in 2016, putting up 37 points last week on a Miami defense that hadn't allowed more than 20 points prior to playing the Hokies.
- Pitt has permitted 30+ points in five of its six games against P5 foes, but ranks second in the ACC in scoring (38.4 ppg).
- VT is outscoring opponents 61-16 in the first quarter while
   Pitt owns a 70-14 scoring edge in the opening quarter.
- VT is outscoring opponents 122-59 in the second half, while Pitt has been outscored 111-101 in the second half.

#### HOKIES, PANTHERS PRIMED FOR COASTAL DIVISION SHOWDOWN ON ESPN

- VT is coming off an 8.0-sack performance vs. Miami (10/20). The only FBS team with more sacks in a game this season was Utah, who produced 10.0 vs. San Jose State (9/17).
- Pitt owns a +20.0 sack differential as the Panthers lead the ACC in both most sacks recorded (25.0) and fewest sacks allowed (5.0). Baylor (4.0) is the only Power Five squad that has given up fewer sacks this season.
- Arizona St. (386.1), Oklahoma (342.6) and Texas Tech (313.0) are the only P5 teams that have allowed more pass ypg. than Pitt (298.9).
- CB Greg Stroman is the only FBS player with 350 KO return yards, 175 punt return yards and multiple INTs Stroman's nine passes defensed are tied for second in the ACC. Stroman and Terrell Edmunds are tied for second in the ACC with three INTs.
- Pitt's Quadree Henderson leads the FBS with two KO return TDs and a 35.9-yard KO return average. His 687 combined punt and KO return yards are third in the P5, while Stroman's 548 combined return yards are sixth.
- LB Andrew Motuapuaka leads VT with 59 total tackles (28 solo). LB Tremaine Edmunds has a team-high 11.0 TFLs to tie for fourth in the ACC, while his 54 stops (28 solo) are second on the squad.
- Clemson (11) is the only ACC squad that owns more INTs than VT (9). The Hokies are 30-4 (.882) in ACC play when forcing two or more INTs, including a 19-1 (.950) mark on the road.

#### PLAYING HIGHLIGHTS

- Was recruited to the University of Oklahoma by Howard Schnellenberger and played two seasons for the Sooners.
- Saw duty in 20 games at OU and led the Sooners to a 30-27 upset in win overtime against No. 25 Texas in the Red River Shootout (10/12/96) in the inaugural Big 12 contest between the two longtime rivals. Also set an OU freshman record with 11 TD passes that season.
- Transferred to Murray State, the same school that Frank Beamer coached prior accepting the Virginia Tech job in 1987.
- Set 11 schools records during his two-year career at Murray State, completing 458 of 794 passes (57.7%) for 6,372 yards with 50 touchdowns and 20 interceptions, good for a 140.8 rating. Also scored two rushing TDs and had a 15-yard reception.
- Posted a career-high 553 yards at Southern Illinois (9/11/99) and threw for 470 yards and five TDs in his final game against Kentucky Wesleyan (11/20/99), leading the Racers to a 53-0 victory.
- Named the 1999 Ohio Valley Conference Offensive Player of the Year and was a finalist for the Walter Payton Award.
- Played professionally for the Arena Football League's Oklahoma Wranglers before embarking on his coaching career.

#### **Casey Pachall (TCU)**

Completed 66.5 percent of his throws (228 of 343) with 25 TDs and seven INTs in 2011.



## THE MEMPHIS TURNARNUND

- Compiled a 19-6 record in his final two seasons at Memphis, guiding the Tigers to back-to-back bowl berths after inheriting a program that went 5-31 in three years before his arrival.
- Unanimous selection as 2014 American Athletic Conference Coach of the Year when he led Memphis to its first conference title since 1971.
- Guided Memphis to a 15-game winning streak that included a 37-24 win over No. 13 Ole Miss (10/17/15).
- The Tigers concluded a 10-3 season in 2014 with a 55-48 double-OT triumph over BYU in the Miami Beach Bowl, the first 10-win season for the Tigers since 1938.

- Memphis posted a 9-3 regular season mark in 2015, capped by a 63-0 win vs. SMU in Fuente's finale as the Tigers' head coach.
- Fuente's final game as Memphis head coach was a 63-0 win vs. SMU (11/28/15). QB Paxton Lynch tied an FBS record with seven touchdown passes in the first half of that game. Lynch threw for a school-record 28 TD passes on the 2015 season.
- Memphis outscored its opponents by an average margin of 20.7 points per game during a run of 15 consecutive wins from 2014-15, scoring 652 points (43.5 ppg), while allowing only 341 (22.7 ppg).
- Memphis scored 471 points in 2014,

- shattering the old school record of 430 points set in 2004, while allowing a mere 19.5 points per game, a figure that ranked 11th among FBS squads.
- The Tigers went +11 (31 takeaways/20 giveaways) in the turnover column in 2014, finishing the campaign ranked in both the AP Top 25 and in the USA Today/Amway Coaches Polls, a first in school history.
- Fuente's squad led Conference USA in total defense in league games in 2012, giving up just 331.6 ypg.
- The Tigers also excelled on special teams under Fuente as Tom Hornsey won the 2013 Ray Guy Award as the nation's top collegiate punter.

- Tech head coach Justin Fuente is the currently the youngest coach in the ACC by four years over NC State's Dave Doeren and the youngest by 10 years in the Coastal (UVa's Bronco Mendenhall).

#### FACING NEW FOES

- Fuente faced 32 head coaches, 27 schools and coached in 13 different states during his four season at Memphis.
- This season, he adds nine new coaches, while facing three old ones. Entering the year, he was 1-0 against Syracuse's Dino Babers (Bowling Green) and Virginia's Bronco Mendenhall (BYU). Duke's David Cutcliffe had beaten Fuente in two prior meetings. He is now 1-1 versus Babers after the loss at Syracuse (10/15).
- Fuente adds 10 new schools to the list of programs faced, but will face Duke (0-2) for a third time and East Carolina for the second time. He is now 1-1 against ECU after this year's win (9/24).
- Fuente adds three new states to those where he's coached a game adding New York (Syracuse) and Indiana (Notre Dame) this year. The season opener against Liberty marked Fuente's first game coached in the state of Virginia.

## THE OFFENSE

#### Hokies' offensive production, 450+ yards in five of first seven games

- In seven games this season, Tech has turned in at least 450 yards of total offense in five of them 458 vs. Liberty (9/3), 476 vs. Boston College (9/17), 462 vs. East Carolina (9/24), 468 at Syracuse (10/15) and a season-high 523 vs. Miami (10/20/16) and has 3,045 total yards of offense.
- The last season Tech compiled at least 450 yards of total offense in five of the first seven games was 1993. They had 485 vs. Bowling Green (9/4), 675 at Pittsburgh (9/11), 641 vs. Maryland (9/25), 552 vs. Temple (10/16) and 505 vs. Rutgers (10/23).
- That was also the last squad to top 3,000 total yards through the first seven games with 3,348, while the team that set the school record for total offense for a season was the 2011 program and had 2,934 through six games.
- Currently, Tech is averaging 435.0 yards per game, and only three times did a team average 425.0 ypg or better 1999 (451.8), 1993 (444.1) and 2000 (426.4) due to the fact that there was no conference title game and bowl game stats did not count.

#### Tech rushes and passes its way to win over Miami

- The season-high 523 total yards of offense vs. Miami (10/20) included 251 yards on the ground the ninth-best rushing attack for the Hokies in an ACC game. The last time they had more than 250 on the ground vs. an ACC team was 269 against Duke (10/13/12).
  - Tech improved to 50-8 since joining the ACC when rushing for 150 or more net yards.
- The offense also had 272 passing yards, marking the 49th time in the last 30 years, and the third time this season, the team has had at least 200 yards of both rushing and passing. The Hokies are 44-5 in such games and have won 26 straight.

#### Tech used running game in rain for victory at UNC

- The Hokies rushed for 189 yards in the 34-3 win at UNC (10/8) on 66 rushing attempts. That was the third-most rushing attempts by the team in the past 30 years. The most was 72 at Pittsburgh (9/11/93) followed by 71 at Cincinnati (10/15/88) which were both victories.
- Ironically, over the past 10 seasons, the most rushing attempts was 57, done twice, in wins at North Carolina (10/4/14) and vs. Virginia (11/24/12).
- Since 1987, the Hokies have had more than 60 rushing attempts just 15 times and are 14-1 in those games.
- The 66 rushes also helped Tech control the clock, holding the ball for 39:59 in the game, the third best mark over the past 30 seasons 41:26 vs. Wake Forest (10/16/10) and 41:03 at North Carolina (10/4/14).

#### Hokies won three straight games by more than 30 points

- In a three-game stretch, the Hokies won each by more than 30 points 49 vs. Boston College (9/17), 37 vs. East Carolina (9/24) and 31 at North Carolina (10/8).
- It had been more than a decade since the Hokies last did that, which was back in 2005. Tech won by 45 at both Duke (9/10/05) and Ohio (9/17/05) by identical 45-0 scores and followed that with a 51-7 win vs. Georgia Tech (9/24/05).

#### Hodges moving up the charts for tight ends

- TE Bucky Hodges has 110 career receptions, 1,379 receiving yards and 18 TDs (all are school records for TEs see chart on left). This season, he passed Tech Hall of Famer and color analyst for Tech's radio broadcast Mike Burnop for the top spot in receptions and yards, while reaching the TD mark early last season.
- For career numbers in the conference, Hodges currently sits in the number two slot for touchdowns (*chart left*) and has started moving up the top 10 in receptions and yards.
- He is currently seventh on the receptions list, with UNC's Eric Ebron, 112 (2011-13) and FSU's Nick O'Leary, 114 (2011-14) within reach this Thursday.
- He is currently eighth on the receiving yards list, with NC State's Jimmy Grissett over 100 yards ahead for the next spot (1,504 from 1993-96).

## Ford sets season records, school records, knocking on career's door

- WR Isaiah Ford did a lot at Tech through his first two seasons. Just a sample, Ford became the fastest player at Tech to reach 10 career TD receptions (19 games), fastest player to 1,000 career receiving yards (17 games) and fastest player to 100 career receptions (22 games).
- After setting single-season records last year in receptions (75), yards (1,164) and TDs (11), Ford is quickly climbing the charts on those three career charts (see left).
- Ford had caught at least TWO passes in every game of his career (30), which was a school record previously held by Danny Coale (22, from 10/16/10 to 1/3/12). The record for catching at least one pass was held by Ernest Wilford (8/25/02 to 12/26/03) at 27 straight games, before Ford broke that record as well.
- However, his streak ended when he was held without a catch at UNC (10/8), the first time in his career.
- Ford also holds school records for consecutive games with a receiving touchdown (5) and consecutive 100-yard receiving games.

## Phillips, Hodges gives Hokies three career 1,000-yard receivers

- WR Cam Phillips and TE Bucky Hodges are also climbing in Tech's history books.
- Before last year, no Hokie had ever caught more than 70 career passes before his junior season and only three had ever gone over 1,000 career receiving yards. However, Ford, Phillips and Hodges all eclipsed those milestones during the 2015 season.
- The 2016 season marked the first time in school history that three players entered the year with more than 1,000 career receiving

yards. During the 2007 season a total of four Hokies ended the year with 1,000-plus yards, the only other time Tech had three-plus 1,000-yard receivers on the same field.

#### Seven Hokies register their first career reception this season

- Coming into the season, not one other WR on Tech's roster other than Phillips and Ford had a reception to his name, or even played in a game.
- WRs C.J. Carroll, Henri Murphy and Devin Wilson each notched their first collegiate catches in the game against Liberty, with Carroll getting two. RB Shai McKenzie also had his first two career pass catches in the opener for 11 yards.
- Since the opener, WRs Jaylen Bradshaw and Divine Deablo, RB Steven Peoples and TE Chris Cunningham have each notched their first career receptions as well.

#### Offensive line brought back quartet with experience

- Not since the Hokies returned 93 starts on the offensive line for the start of the 2011 season has Tech seen so much experience coming back up front.
- Led by RT Jonathan McLaughlin, who had 35 career starts entering the season, the Hokies returned 90 career starts, just one of 19 teams in the NCAA with that many. Only North Carolina (131) had more career starts on the OL than the Hokies among ACC teams.
- McLaughlin had started in every game he has played, while offensive lineman Augie Conte returned with 23 career starts. Offensive linemen Wyatt Teller (18), Eric Gallo (13) and Kyle Chung (1) also all owned starting experience for Tech.
- In 2011, Blake DeChristopher (37), Jaymes Brooks (28), Greg Nosal (14) and Andrew Lanier (14), along with Andrew Miller, helped the Hokies to register 186.9 yards rushing per game, 226.1 yards passing per game and allowed just 17 sacks during an 11-3 season.
- Last week, the Foundation for Teamwork announced its midseason Joe Moore Award Honor Roll, which identifies notable performances by offensive line units in games played through October 8 and the Hokies' line was one of 17 recognized.

## THE DEFENSE

#### The Return of #Sacksburg - they pile up against Miami and in Lane

- For the first time in three years and for just the ninth time in the past 30 seasons, the Tech defense produced at least 8.0 sacks in a game in the win over Miami (10/20).
- It was also just the third time in an ACC contest they had 8.0 sacks in a game, with the other two times vs. Pittsburgh (10/12/13) and vs. Duke (9/16/06).
- Ironically, the most sacks the team has notched in a single game over the last 30 seasons was at Pittsburgh (10/30/99), Tech's last win (30-17) in the Steel City.
- Adding that effort to a 6.0-sack effort against East Carolina (9/24), Tech has recorded 15.0 of its 20.0 sacks this season in Lane Stadium.

#### Two Hokies get first starts, Baron steps up for injured starters

- For the first time this year in the Miami win (10/20), the Hokies needed to use a different starting 11 due to injuries to DE Ken Ekanem and DT Nigel Williams. RDE Trevon Hill and NT Ricky Walker notched their first career starts for Tech while NT Woody Baron moved over to the DT position for the first time this season and all turned in career performances.
  - Hill had five tackles including 1.5 sacks and Walker added three tackles and a half sack.
- It was the senior Baron, though, that turned a historic performance up front, tying for the most tackles-for-loss (4.5) for a single Hokie player in a single game in the last 30 years with Barry Booker at Virginia (11/24/07).
- He set a career high with six total tackles, while his 24 TFL yards was the sixth most for a player in a single game in the same span.

#### **Defense stingy in first two ACC games**

- In Tech's first two ACC games this season, the Hokies' defense turned in four straight halves in ACC play where its opponents had not reached 100 yards of total offense. Against Boston College (9/17), they held the Eagles to 92 yards in the first half and 32 in the second. At UNC (10/8), the Tar Heels had 80 yards in the first half and 51 in the second.
- Tech also picked off two passes and recovered two fumbles in its win at UNC (10/8), and had one of each in the win vs. Boston College (9/17).
- The Hokies had allowed just three points in its first two ACC games and had not allowed a first-half touchdown in ACC play in three straight games.

#### **Hokies pitch shutout against Boston College**

- For the first time since the Hokies' game against Bowling Green (9/22/12), Bud Foster's defense shut out an opponent, when Tech registered the 49-0 victory against Boston College (9/17) in the team's ACC opener at Lane Stadium.
- The shutout, the 31st for Tech in the Foster era, also marked the first blanking of an ACC opponent since the team's 38-0 win at Virginia (11/26/11) and the first home shutout win over an ACC team since a 17-0 win over Virginia (11/25/06).
- The defense helped Tech register a 49-point win, which was the largest by the Hokies in an ACC game since a 45-point win at Duke (45-0, 9/10/05) and a 44-point win at home vs. Georgia Tech (51-7, 9/24/05). It tied the largest ever win in an ACC game at 49 points in the Hokies' 55-6 win over Maryland (11/18/04).

#### Defense features plenty of experience on the first team

- Led by DE Ken Ekanem (entering season with 26 consecutive starts) and S Chuck Clark (23 straight starts), the defense had a combined 15 Hokies returning that had 142 combined starts under their belts and included 126 for the players listed at first string.
- The Hokies had a total of five players with at least 10-plus starts on the field to start the Liberty game, which included cornerback Brandon Facyson (now 23), linebacker Andrew Motuapuaka (16) and tackle Nigel Williams (11).
  - Tech started the same 11 men through the first six games until the Miami game (10/20).

#### Stroman back to defense full time, picks off two in opener

- During the 2014 Military Bowl, DB Greg Stroman worked for the first time on the offensive side of the ball, rushing twice for four yards and catching one pass for six.
- Last season, he was used occasionally on offense and actually started one game NC State (10/9/15) - as a wide receiver. He rushed seven times last year for 12 yards.
- For the 2016 campaign, Stroman is now solely a DB, making a start in the season opener and doubled his output for career INTs as he entered the game with two picks.
- He became the first Hokie since Brandon Facyson at East Carolina (9/14/13) to pick off two passes in the game with his effort in the season opener.

#### Stroman and Alexander are individual streak stoppers

- Stroman has a total of three INTs this season, five in his career, getting the third at UNC (10/8) while also ending UNC's Mitch Trubisky's streak of 243 straight pass attempts without a pick and UNC's interception streak for the season, which reached 185 pass attempts.
- DB Adonis Alexander, who had four INTs last year as a freshman and has one this year a second quarter pick against Boston College (9/18) sealed Tech's win over NC State last season (10/9/15) by ending Wolfpack quarterback Jacoby Brissett's streak of 241 straight passes without an interception with a pick in the fourth quarter.

#### Clark and Edmunds are tackling machines

- For the first time since the Hokies joined the ACC, a DB reached the century mark for total tackles. In 2015, S Chuck Clark recorded 107, highlighted by his 16 straight games with at least five and his four games a year ago with at least 10 (five for his career).
- In the last 33 games, Clark has notched at least five tackles 25 times, at least seven 19 times and has six games with at least 10, including a season-high 11 against ECU (9/24).
- LB Tremaine Edmunds has notched five straight games with at least seven tackles and has led the team in the last two contests at Syracuse (10/15) with 16, and vs. Miami (10/20) wit 10. He also leads the Hokies with 11.0 TFLs.
- In fact, his 16.0 tackles against the Orange is tied for the second-most ever in an ACC game behind Jack Tyler (9/3/12) and Chase Williams (9/20/14), who ironically each had 17 against Georgia Tech in Lane Stadium.

#### Motuapuaka and Stroman are in rare company

The famed Virginia Tech Lunch Pail has come to symbolize the blue-collar approach of the Hokies' defense under longtime defensive coordinate Bud Foster.



In 1995, Foster served as co-defensive coordinator with Rod Sharpless, whose mother-in-law found the original Lunch Pail in Mercerville, New Jersey. The pail once belonged to a coal miner and after a record-setting defensive season, the Lunch Pail became an iconic part of Hokies' lore.



The Pail travels wherever the Hokies go and its care is only entrusted to a defensive leader.



Before the start of every season, a signed mission statement from the defense is placed in The Pail. Then every week, unit goals, team goals and keys to success are placed in The Pail, plus the turf from any road victories.



Since 2007, The Pail has also contained the names of the 32 fallen Hokies taken in the April 16 tragedy.



Corey Moore – whose jersey No. 56 is retired by Tech – is the only player who has ever earned lifetime possession of an incarnation of The Pail from Foster.

## **BLOCK PARTY**

- Over the past 30 seasons, Tech special teams have blocked 68 punts, 43 field goal attempts and 28 point-after attempts for a total of 139 in 367 games - approx. 1 every 2.64 games.
- In Tech's win vs. East Carolina (9/24), the Hokies blocked both a FGA and a punt, which had last happened vs. Marshall (9/21/13).
- Credited with the block on the FGA was DT Tim Settle, while WR Cam Phillips was the player who blocked the punt.
   Phillips, along with Reggie Floyd, also stopped a fake punt attempt with a sack.
- Lastly, it was only the second time in the last 30 years that Tech blocked two kicks and returned a punt for a TD, which also happened in that Marshall game.

#### Beamer's retired No. 25 makes a return to the field

- Head coach Justin Fuente and the Hokies will pay homage to Frank Beamer and Virginia Tech's legacy of excellence on special teams this season by selecting a special teams player of the week who will wear No. 25.
- With Coach Beamer's blessing, his retired No. 25 will be worn by a player who exemplifies the role special teams played during Virginia Tech's rise to national prominence.
- "I'm so very humbled by this thoughtful gesture by Coach Fuente," Beamer said. "I'm grateful that he reached out for my blessing to use the number 25 in this way.
- "I'm really honored that a member of the special teams will get to wear my old number every week. Of course, it's not just a recognition of me, it's about all those coaches and kids who made special teams part of our identity at Virginia Tech."

#### Stroman takes punt to the house in win over ECU, joins Motuapuaka

• Greg Stroman's 87-yard punt return for a TD vs. East Carolina (9/24) was tied for the third-longest in school history and was the second longest in Lane Stadium. It was his second career punt return for a TD and his third career defensive or special teams TD. He is now one of 10 Hokies (since 1987) to have three or more defensive or special teams TDs in a Tech career (see chart last page).

#### Stroman 1 of 2 players nationally with 175+ punt, 350+ kickoff return yards

- Greg Stroman has 183 punt return yards and 365 kick return yards, making him just one of two players in the country with over 175 punt return yards and 350 kickoff return yards.
- Joining him on that list is Iowa's Desmond King (184 punt; 371 kick), however Stroman does have a TD return, which King does not.

#### Stroman climbing charts for punt returners

- Stroman is already fourth all-time in the school's record book for career punt returns with 85 and his 673 return yards rank him eighth.
- In Tech's history, only two men have ever returned more than 100 punts, John Ludlow (136, 1979-82) and Eddie Royal (111, 2004-07), while Royal is the only man to go over 900 yards in punt return finishing his career with 1,296 punt return yards.

#### Slye moving up all-time lists in field goals made and scoring

- Last season, Tech kicker Joey Slye was 23 of 30 on field goal attempts, and in his career is now 53 of 72. His 23 makes in 2015 tied the school record set by Dustin Keys in 2008. The junior is 15 shy of Shayne Graham's school record of 68, and currently ranks third.
  - On Tech's all-time scoring list, Slye is fifth with 262 points and fourth among kickers.
- In the Hokies' win over Miami (11/20), Slye connected on three field goal attempts, marking the 17th time in his career and third time this season he's made at least two.
- It was the eighth time in his career and first time this season he's made three in a game.

#### Slye almost automatic inside 40 yards

- In his career, Joey Slye is 35 of 38 (92.1 percent) from inside 40 yards and has made 18 straight dating back to his only miss from that distance last year a 37-yard attempt at East Carolina (9/26/15). Ironically, his only other misses from inside 40 were two blocked kicks during his freshman year. He is a perfect 16 for 16 in his career from inside of 30.
- Of note, Slye's career long is 49 yards, and so has never made a kick over 50 (missed all eight attempts). Inside of 50 yards, Slye is 53 of 64 (82.8 percent) from inside 50.

#### Ludwig takes over punting duties

- Mitchell Ludwig replaced school record holder A.J. Hughes, who was the starting punter for Tech for four seasons and set career records at the school, and finished second in the ACC in punts (310) and yards punting (12,962). His career average was 41.8 per punt.
- Through seven games, he's held his own, with a 40.4 average on 35 attempts, but just had his best game of the year in the win over Miami (11/20).
- His 61-yard punt was the longest punt for a Hokie since Hughes connected on a 64-yarder vs. Maryland (11/16/13) and he finished with a season-best 47.6 yards per punt on five punts, four of which were inside the 20.

BLACKSBURG – Pittsburgh rushed for 166 yards and its defense held the Hokies in check for much of the game, enabling the Panthers to knock off Virginia Tech 17-13 in the ACC opener for both schools.

The win marked just Pittsburgh's second in Blacksburg – the other one came in 2002 – and sent the Hokies to their second straight loss. Pittsburgh is now 3-1 overall, 1-0 in the ACC. Tech is 2-3, 0-1.

Tech cut a 17-10 lead to 17-13 on a 48-yard field goal by Joey Slye with 13:20, but the Hokies couldn't get any closer. Their next three drives ended in an interception, a punt and an interception.

Tech finished with only 100 yards of total offense, including just nine rushing. Brenden Motley was sacked seven times, and he completed 9 of 20 for 91 yards, with a touchdown and three interceptions.

Off to a slow start, the Hokies finally put together a good drive spanning the first and second quarters. A 12-play, 83-yard drive that took more than six minutes ended when Motley hit Cam Phillips for an 11-yard touchdown play. The big play on the drive, though came two plays earlier when, on third-and-17 from the Pittsburgh 40, Motley completed a 28-yard pass to tight end Bucky Hodges for a first down. Slye's extra point following the touchdown cut the Pittsburgh lead to 10-7 with 11:38 left in the half.

Pittsburgh wasted little time in getting going in the second half. Ollison rumbled 43 yards on the Panthers' first play from scrimmage, giving Pittsburgh a first down at the Tech 25. On the next play, he scored, and Blewitt's extra point gave the Panthers a 17-7 lead.

Tech sliced into that lead midway through the third quarter. Andrew Motuapuaka forced Ollison to fumble, and the Hokies' Terrell Edmunds recovered and returned it to the Pittsburgh 23. The drive stalled, but the Hokies got a 43-yard field goal from Joey Slye to cut the lead to 17-10 with 6:03 left in the third quarter.

That turned out to be their last score. On the final eight plays from scrimmage, Tech's offense turned the ball over twice and gave up three sacks.

#### WHAT'S A HOKIE?

That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body. Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today.

Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. Following is the "Old Hokie" yell in its original form:

Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy! Tech! Tech! V.P.I.! Sola-Rex Sola-Rah Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!! Rae, Ri, V.P.I.

### LANE STADIUM - HOME OF THE HOKIES

Rising high into the mountainous sky of the New River Valley, Virginia Tech's Lane Stadium enters its 51st year of football competition in 2015. The Tech football team has enjoyed over two decades of success, going to 23 straight bowl games and winning 10 or more games eight straight seasons from 2004-11. A big part of that success is the home-field advantage the Hokies enjoy at Lane Stadium/Worsham Field.

Sitting at roughly 2,057 feet above sea level, the stadium is the second-highest among all FBS schools in the eastern United States, trailing only Appalachian State (3,300). Completed in 1965, Lane Stadium/Worsham Field has gone through numerous changes, renovations and additions. But through it all, it has always been regarded as one of the finest places to watch – and toughest places for opponents to play – a college football game.

### THE HOKIE STONE

Before each home football game, Virginia Tech football players and coaching staff enter Lane Stadium through a tunnel. On the stadium-side entrance to Worsham Field, they pass beneath a Hokie Stone, which they touch for good luck and is flanked by these words: "For those who have passed. For those to come .. Reach for Excellence."

## **ENTER SANDMAN**


The history behind Virginia Tech's use of Metallica's "Enter Sandman" started during the 2000 season. That summer Tech added a new scoreboard to Lane Stadium and the athletics marketing team decided to use the scoreboard for an entrance video. The group considered "Welcome to the Jungle" by Guns N' Roses and "Sirius" by the Alan Parsons Project before settling on "Enter Sandman." It has been the entrance song for the Hokies ever since.

Virginia Tech quarterback Jerod Evans threw for 221 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Hokies to a 36-13 season-opening victory over Liberty on Saturday, handing head coach Justin Fuente his first victory.

Fuente, who spent the previous four seasons at Memphis, took over in January for Frank Beamer, who retired after 29 years as Tech's head coach.

Evans, a junior-college transfer from Texas who enrolled this past January, completed 20 of 32 passes. The Hokies trailed 13-10 in the second quarter before Evans threw touchdown passes to Isaiah Ford and Bucky Hodges on the Hokies' last two possessions of the first half.

Ford caught 11 passes for 117 yards and Hodges caught two touchdown passes. Joey Slye hit two field goals of 34 yards.

Liberty amassed just 160 yards of offense, scoring all of its points off of Tech turnovers. The Hokies lost four fumbles – their only blemishes on the day.

BIGGEST PLAYS

- Tech trailed 13-10 in the second quarter and faced a fourth-and-1 from the Liberty
   43. Fuente elected to go for it and Evans went 37 yards on a keeper to the Liberty 6.
   Two plays later, Evans hit Ford for the go-ahead 5-yard touchdown pass.
- Evans and Hodges connected on a third-down conversion toward the end of the first half. Tech faced third-and-10 from the Liberty 41 and Evans hit Hodges for a 20-yard gain to the Liberty 21. Four plays later, Evans found Hodges for an 18-yard TD that gave the Hokies a 24-13 lead with 24 seconds left in the first half.
- Terrell Edmunds had an interception and He and Johnathan Galante tackled a Liberty punt returner in the end zone for a safety. On the ensuing possession, Evans found Hodges for a 20-yard touchdown play.

#### **FUENTE ON HIS FIRST GAME**

- "The atmosphere here is fantastic. It's what college football is all about. People at Virginia Tech take a lot of pride in the game-day atmosphere, and they should. It was incredible
- "My thought process coming into the game was how would our kids handle this? How do they respond when things don't go well. There were some times when things were kind of ugly looking, but I liked the way our kids dug in there and plowed away. The atmosphere was fantastic and I'm please with the way the kids responded to adversity."

#### **IMPORTANT NOTES**

- Fuente became the first Tech coach to win his debut since Jerry Claiborne opened his tenure with a victory over William & Mary in 1961.
- Ford's 117 yards receiving marked the fourth straight game in which he has recorded more than 100 yards receiving – a school record.
- Ford has caught at least two passes in 27 straight games, tying a school record for consecutive games with at least one reception (Ernest Wilford, 2002-03).
- Ford's touchdown reception marked the 18th of his career, tying him for second place on Tech's career touchdown receptions list with Jarrett Boykin (2008-11), Ricky Scales (1972-74) and André Davis (1998-2001).
- Greg Stroman's two interceptions gave him four for his career.

Virginia Tech got off to a great start in its game against the No. 17 Tennessee Volunteers, but turnovers and penalties turned out to be its undoing, as the Hokies fell to the Volunteers 45-24 on Saturday night at Bristol Motor Speedway.

The long-anticipated event drew a crowd of 156,990 fans and broke college football's single-game attendance record, surpassing the 115,109 fans who witnessed Michigan and Notre Dame at Michigan Stadium in 2013.

Tennessee quarterback Josh Dobbs threw three touchdown passes and rushed for two more, as the Volunteers rallied from a 14-0 deficit to knock off the Hokies in the first regular-season meeting between the two teams since 1937.

Virginia Tech (1-1) jumped out to a 14-0 lead in the first quarter on a 7-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Jerod Evans to Sam Rogers and a 69-yard touchdown run by tailback Travon McMillian. But an Evans fumble led to a 5-yard touchdown pass from Dobbs to Jauan Jennings early in the second quarter and that started a Volunteers' string of 31 unanswered points.

Dobbs completed 10 of 19 for 91 yards, with three touchdowns and an interception. He also ran for 106 yards.

McMillian paced the  $\acute{Ho}$  disc with 127 yards rushing and the score. Evans completed 20 of 28 for 208 yards and a touchdown.

#### OF NOT

- Virginia Tech out-gained Tennessee (400-330), ran more plays (73-65) and had the time of possession advantage (31:44-28:16).
- Tech turned the ball over five times in the game and Tennessee scored 21 points off those turnovers. All five were fumbles. The Hokies have now lost nine fumbles on the season
- The momentum of the game changed when a poor snap from center Kyle Chung threw off the timing of a handoff between Evans and C.J. Carroll early in the second quarter. Tennessee recovered at the Tech 5 and scored on the next play.
- The Hokies cut the Tennessee lead to 31-17 on a field goal by Joey Siye late in the third quarter, but three of their next four possessions ended in fumbles.
- The Hokies were penalized eight times for 101 yards.
- McMillian's touchdown run marked the longest run of his career. His 100-yard performance marked the fourth of his career.
- Shai McKenzie's 2-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter marked the fourth of his career and his first since Sept. 27, 2014 against Western Michigan.

#### **FUENTE QUOTES**

"Well, obviously (the turnovers) reared its head in huge ways the first two ball games. We've got to do a better job. We've obviously got to do a better job either teaching or understanding or emphasizing ball security. We're inadequate to say the least right now. We'll look at it and come up with a plan, but what we're doing, what we've done in the past, hasn't been an issue. Obviously, we need to change or modify it in order to give ourselves a chance."

"At times, we lacked discipline out there, which is very disappointing. That falls on me.".

Virginia Tech quarterback Jerod Evans tied a school record with five touchdowns passes and the Hokies' defense recorded the team's first shutout since 2012, as the Hokies blanked Boston College 49-0 on Saturday in Tech's ACC opener.

Tech moved to 2-1 overall on the season and 1-0 in the ACC. The win marked the second consecutive for the Hokies over BC (1-2, 0-2 ACC) and the seventh in the past nine meetings. The shutout marked the first by Tech since it beat Bowling Green 37-0 in 2012. It marked the Hokies' first shutout of an ACC foe since 2011 when they won 38-0 at Virginia. The shutout marked Tech's first ACC shutout at home since it won 17-0 over UVA in 2006.

Virginia Tech's defense put forth a dominating effort, holding the Eagles to 124 yards. The Hokies forced a three-and-out on 10 BC possessions.

Evans' five scoring tosses tied the mark held by former quarterback Bryan Randall, who threw five touchdown passes in Tech's 50-42 triple overtime loss at Syracuse in 2002. Offensively, the Hokies amassed 476 yards, including 223 on the ground. Marshawn Williams, playing in his first game since tearing his ACL in 2014, led the way with 81 yards.

Evans threw a 15-yard scoring pass to Travon McMillian on the Hokies' second possession to open the scoring and then added touchdown passes of 8 and 30 yards to Isaiah Ford. The latter came with 1:42 left in the first half and gave the Hokies a 21-0 lead, which they took into the locker room.

#### DIG DI AVE

- Greg Stroman's 29-yard punt return set up Ford's 30-yard touchdown reception. It
  marked Stroman's longest punt return of the season and the seventh of his career
  of 20 yards or more.
- Bucky Hodges hauled in two 17-yard receptions on the same possession in the second quarter and that led to the 8-yard touchdown pass to Ford.
- Evans' 36-yard pass to Cam Phillips on the Hokies' first possession of the second half led to the 7-yard touchdown pass from Evans to Cunningham.
- Leading 28-0 and facing a fourth-and-1 from the BC 20, Tech went for it and Evans gained 12 yards on a keeper leading to his TD pass to Sam Rogers for a 35-0 lead.
- Evans' 47-yard pass to Ford on Tech's final possession of the third quarter led to McMillian's 7-yard touchdown run and gave the Hokies a 42-0 lead.

#### FUENTE QUOTES

"I don't pay too much attention to (Evans') numbers. I pay more attention to the grade sheet in terms of our decisions on a play-by-play basis. He certainly made some good plays out there and missed a few. I will say this, the last three weeks, he has approached it with a great mindset. It is obviously important for him to play well. You can see that by his preparation. He is a good listener and tries to do what we ask him to do and sometimes he does it on a consistent basis."

"If we eliminate mistakes and stay healthy and do a great job of preparing and doing the things that good teams do, then we'll have that opportunity. My caution to our kids is that you have to do this every day. Do we have a chance to play well on Saturdays regardless of the opponent? Absolutely. That doesn't mean we'll win every game. But it's up to us to give ourselves that opportunity and we gave ourselves that opportunity this week, and in turn, we got some good results."

Virginia Tech quarterback Jerod Evans threw three touchdown passes and ran for a score, and the Hokies made three big plays on special teams, as they scuttled the East Carolina Pirates 54-17 in a non-conference game Saturday afternoon.

The Hokies (3-1) scored on their final five possessions of the first half, including all four of their second-quarter possessions. They jumped out to a 38-0 halftime lead, overwhelming East Carolina (2-2) and snapping a two-game losing streak to the Pirates

Evans completed 13 of 20 passes for a career-high 282 yards and rushed for a career-high 97 more. He entered the game having thrown an ACC-best 10 touchdown passes and has thrown just one interception on the season. He threw touchdown passes of 24 yards to Isaiah Ford, 13 yards to Travon McMillian and 45 yards to Cam Phillips.

Three of the big special teams plays came in the first half. Greg Stroman scored the Hokies' first touchdown on an 87-yard punt return in the first quarter, and a blocked field goal led to a touchdown pass from Evans to Ford. Phillips blocked a punt by East Carolina punter Worth Gregory in the second quarter, and the Hokies took advantage, scoring on a 13-yard pass from Evans to McMillian.

ECU quarterback Philip Nelson had 362 yards passing and two touchdown tosses to Jimmy Williams. The Pirates had 443 yards of offense, but committed the three special teams mistakes, fumbled once and were sacked six times...

#### **OF NOTI**

- Stroman's punt returned tied for the third-longest punt return in the modern era (post-1950) and the second career punt return for a touchdown.
- Stroman became just one of 10 Hokies since 1987 to score three or more touchdowns on defense or special teams in his career.
- Ford caught four passes for 117 yards and a TD. The touchdown reception marked the 21st of his career, leaving him one shy of Antonio Freeman's school record.
- Tech's two blocks marked the first time the Hokies had blocked two kicks in the same game since a win over Marshall on Sept. 21, 2013.
- The Hokies scored at least 49 points in back-to-back games for the first time since 1999 when they scored 58 against Rutgers and 62 against Syracuse.

"I think our guys are learning how we want them to prepare. That doesn't guarantee that we'll jump out on everyone like that. I do think we have a good mindset and have a good plan. We've got intelligent players who can make adjustments when we need to. Playing in a downpour courtesy of Hurricane Matthew, Jerod Evans threw two touchdown passes and rushed for a score, and Virginia Tech's defense forced four turnovers, as the No. 25 Hokies rolled to a 34-3 victory over No. 17 North Carolina on Saturday in an ACC game played at Kenan Stadium.

The win marked Tech's first as a ranked team since 2014 when the Hokies beat Duke in Durham, North Carolina. Tech moved to 4-1 overall on the season, 2-0 in the ACC, and the Hokies also moved to 6-1 against the Tar Heels in games in Chapel Hill since they joined the ACC for the 2004-05 season.

North Carolina had its nine-game home winning streak snapped and fell to 4-2, 2-1 ACC. The Tar Heels failed to score a touchdown in a game for the first time since a 13-0 loss to NC State in Raleigh, North Carolina in 2011.

The four North Carolina turnovers led to 20 Virginia Tech points, and a dropped snap by North Carolina punter Tom Sheldon also led to a Tech touchdown.

North Carolina's first two turnovers led to field goals by Hokies' kicker Joey Slye. Arguably the biggest play in the game came on the Tar Heels' first possession of the second half when quarterback Mitch Trubisky fumbled, and Tech's Woody Baron recovered. That turnover led to a 22-yard touchdown pass from Evans to Sam Rogers that gave the Hokies a 20-3 lead.

Trubisky, who came into the game leading the nation in completion percentage (76.0) and ninth in passing yards per game (342.2), completed just 13 of 33 for 58 yards, with two interceptions.

Evans completed 7 of 17 for 75 yards. He also rushed for 49 yards on a careerhigh 21 carries. Tailback Travon McMillian rushed for 76 yards, as the Hokies amassed 189 of their 264 total yards on the ground.

- Andrew Motuapuaka's second career INT led to the Hokies' final TD, which came on a 4-yard run by McMillian, his third of the season and the 10th of his career.
- Sheldon dropped a snap early in the third quarter, and Tech's Cam Phillips tackled him at the UNC 4. Tech later went for it on fourth down, and Evans scored on a 1-yard run - his second rushing touchdown of the season.
- Greg Stroman's third interception of the season came in the first quarter at the North Carolina 20 and led to a 35-yard field goal by Joey Slye for the Hokies' first score. The interception marked the fifth of Stroman's career.
- · Slye's second FG also came about because of a North Carolina turnover. Tech's Brandon Facyson stripped Khris Francis of the ball, and the Hokies' Terrell Edmunds recovered at the North Carolina 39. That turnover led to a 28-yard field goal by Slye.
- Tech led 6-3 late in the first half before Evans found Bucky Hodges for a 28-yard gain to the North Carolina 1. That marked Hodges' first - and only - reception of the game and led to Evans' touchdown pass to Cunningham.

"I'm awfully proud of our guys in all phases of the game to come in here and pull off the victory. Obviously, it wasn't perfect, but it was a great team effort. We beat a very talented, very well coached, very tough North Carolina team that we have a tremendous amount of respect for. The on thing I will say about the weather is at least you knew that it was going to be something like this leading up to it. I don't know if there is anything schematically that you can do, but at least emotionally we were prepared for whatever Mother Nature threw at us."

Virginia Tech quarterback Jerod Evans threw for a career-best 307 yards, but it wasn't enough as the No. 17 Hokies fell 31-17 to Syracuse in an ACC game.

With the loss, the Hokies fell to 4-2 overall, 2-1 in the ACC. Tech is now 2-7 at the Carrier Dome. Syracuse moved to 3-4 overall, 1-2 in the ACC.

"First of all, congratulations to Coach [Dino] Babers and his kids," Virginia Tech coach Justin Fuente said. "They played really, really well today. They beat us in all three phases of the game. That falls on me, and we obviously didn't play as well as we should have. That's obviously my responsibility."

The Hokies trailed for much of the game, but tied it early in the fourth quarter on a 10-yard touchdown pass from Evans to receiver Bucky Hodges. The touchdown cut the lead to 17-15, but the Hokies went for two points and converted when Evans found Chris Cunningham for the two, tying the game at 17 with 13:53 remaining.

But Syracuse scored touchdowns on back-to-back possessions to seal the win. Quarterback Eric Dungey's 1-yard run with 7:56 remaining gave the Orangemen a 24-17 lead, and less than three minutes later, Deontae Strickland's 16-yard touchdown run pushed the lead to 31-17.

The game featured more than 1,000 yards of total offense. Unfortunately for the Hokies, Syracuse racked up 561 yards, with Dungey throwing for 311 yards and running for 106. He also threw for a touchdown and ran for one.

Evans completed 20 of 33, with two touchdown passes and one interception, as the Hokies finished with 468 total yards.

#### **BIG PLAYS**

- Virginia Tech appeared to cut the game to 14-10 following a 17-yard TD run by Jerod Evans on fourth-and-1 from the Syracuse 17. The officials, though, called a holding penalty on the play, negating the TD, and Slye missed a 45-yard FGA.
- Tech's impressive drive to start the second half was highlighted by a 21-yard pass from Evans to receiver Cam Phillips that gave the Hokies a first down at the Syracuse 12. On the next play, Evans found Ford for the score.
- Evans threw a ball short of Hodges on the first play of the fourth quarter, but Hodges adjusted on it and came up with it for a 27-yard gain to the Syracuse 25. That ultimately led to Evans' 10-yard touchdown pass to Hodges.
- On Syracuse's next drive, it marched into Tech territory and faced a fourth-and-2 from the Tech 37. The Orangemen went for it, and Dungey found Ervin Phillips for a 5-yard gain that gave them the first down. Syracuse went on to score what would be the winning touchdown moments later on Dungey's 1-yard run with 7:56 left.
- Evans tied his career high for completions and set a career high for attempts.
- Ford recorded his 22nd career touchdown reception when he hauled in the 12yard score from Evans. With that reception, he tied former Tech receiver Antonio Freeman for the school record in career touchdown receptions.
- Hodges' touchdown reception marked the 16th of his career. He is now tied for sixth on the all-time list with former receiver Josh Morgan (2004-07).
- Right tackle Jonathan McLaughlin started his 41st career game.
- Defensive end Ken Ekanem started his 32nd consecutive game the longest such streak on the squad.

Paced by quarterback Jerod Evans' 259 yards passing, Travon McMillian's 131 yards rushing and a defense that recorded a season-high eight sacks, Virginia Tech rolled to a 37-16 victory over Miami in an ACC game played Thursday night.

Joey Slye added three field goals for the Hokies, who moved to 5-2 overall, 3-1 in the ACC. Tech snapped a two-game losing streak to Miami, which fell to 4-3 overall, 1-3 in league action.

Despite playing without starting defensive linemen Ken Ekanem and Nigel Williams, the Hokies' defense played one of its most productive games of the season, holding Miami to 42 yards rushing in addition to getting the eight sacks. Miami guarterback Brad Kaaya threw for 323 yards, but was sacked the eight times.

The Hokies led 16-9 at halftime thanks to three field goals from Slye and a touchdown pass from Evans to Bucky Hodges. Tech then broke things open with two touchdowns in the third quarter, scoring on a 12-yard pass from Evans to Hodges and a 13-yard touchdown strike from running back Sam Rogers to fullback Steven Peoples. The latter gave the Hokies a 30-16 lead with 4:01 left in the third.

McMillian rushed a season-high 18 times and finished with the second-most rushing yards in his career. The game marked his second 100-yard performance of the season (Tennessee) and was the biggest chunk of an evening in which Tech rushed for a season-high 251 yards.

Evans, who sealed the game with a 34-yard, fourth-quarter touchdown run, completed 21 of 33, with two touchdowns and no interceptions, and he also rushed for 98 yards. The Hokies finished with 523 yards of offense.

#### **BIG PLAYS**

- Sam Rogers' career-long 52-yard reception in the second quarter set up Hodges'
   7-yard touchdown reception. The touchdown was the only one of the half for the Hokies, and Rogers' reception broke his previous career long of 51 yards, which came last season against Ohio State.
- Tech faced third-and-7 from the Miami 38 late in the first half when Evans found Isaiah Ford for a 9-yard gain to the Miami 29. The drive stalled after that, but the play led to a 38-yard field goal by Slye to give the Hokies a 16-3 lead.
- Miami cut the Tech lead to 23-16 midway through the third quarter, but the Hokies answered with a 75-yard drive. An 11-yard pass from Evans to Hodges on thirdand-9 kept the drive going and ultimately led to a 13-yard touchdown pass from Sam Rogers to Steven Peoples that gave the Hokies a 30-16 lead.
- Miami's best chance in the fourth ended at the Tech 25. The Canes faced a thirdand-14, and Tech's Trevon Hill sacked Kaaya on the play for a 6-yard loss. Kaaya's pass on fourth down fell incomplete, giving the Hokies the ball with 5:51 to go.
