HOKIES VISIT ECU FOR FIRST ROAD CONTEST

Virginia Tech (2-0) is preparing for its first road test of 2017 as the Hokies visit East Carolina (0-2) on Saturday.
The Hokies are coming off a 27-0 win vs. Delaware (9/9),

while the Pirates are seeking their initial win of the year after a 34-14 loss vs. James Madison (9/2) and a 56-20 setback at West Virginia (9/9).

 Tech head coach Justin Fuente is no stranger to facing East Carolina. During his first season as HC at Memphis, the Tigers suffered a 41-7 loss at ECU (10/13/12).

• ECU is also a familiar foe for the Hokies. Tech handed ECU a 54-17 loss at Lane Stadium (9/24/16), but lost a 35-28 decision in its most recent trek to ECU (9/26/15).

QB JOSH JACKSON OFF TO A HOT START

 Named the ACC Rookie of the Week & Athlon's National Rookie of the Week after guiding Tech to a 31-24 win over West Virginia (9/3), OB Josh Jackson led Tech to a 27-0 win vs. Delaware (9/9).

Jackson has completed 31 of 54 (57.4%) passes for 457 yards with three TDs and no INTs. He's also VT's leading rusher with 19 carries for 120 yards with one TD.
Jackson is seeking to become the first VT signal caller to win his first three starts since QB Logan Thomas won his first four starts in 2011.

TECH ON THE ROAD, OTHER TIDBITS VS. ECU

• Tech was 4-1 on the road under Justin Fuente in 2016. Three of those wins were all decided by three points.

 ECU QB Thomas Sirk is a transfer from Duke. Sirk completed 19 of 39 passes for 270 yards with four TDs and no INTs, along with 109 rushing yards as Duke registered a 45-43 win in a 4-OT thriller at Lane Stadium (10/24/15).

 Beamer Ball was in full effect in last year's contest vs. ECU. Wearing the Beamer No. 25 jersey, CB Greg Stroman registered an 87-yard punt return TD. VT also blocked both a FG and a punt in the 54-17 win.

• Stroman enters this week's game after registering a 61-yard punt return TD in a 27-0 win vs. Delaware (9/9).

TYROD'S TARGETS INCLUDE HOKIE, PIRATE

Buffalo Bills QB Tyrod Taylor wil have both a fellow Tech alum and an ECU receiver as potential targets this season.
Former VT QB Logan Thomas has made the move to tight end with the Bills, but previously caught a TD from Thomas in a 52-21 Tech win vs. Wake Forest (10/16/10).

• Former ECU WR Zay Jones was a second-round pick of the Bills in 2017 after a prolific career with the Pirates.

KEY STATS TO WATCH ON HOKIES, PIRATES

• Dating back to 2000, the Hokies are 12-3 (.800) on the road against unranked non-conference foes.

• Over that same span Tech is 38-2 (.950) on the road when holding foes to 17 points or less.

• East Carolina has lost 19 straight games when being held to 17 points or less dating back to 2009. That streak includes four losses to Tech (2009, 2011, 2013 and 2016).

• ECU is 0-4 under head coach Scottie Montgomery when being held to 17 points or less.

• Dating back to 2003, Tech is 27-1 on the road when scoring 30 points or more, including a streak of eight straight wins. That lone loss was a 48-34 setback at UNC (10/6/12).

• ECU is 1-15 in their last 16 games when permitting 30 points or more. That lone win was a 33-30 decision vs. NC State (9/10/16).

• Tech is 7-3 in 10 meetings with ECU dating back to 2000. In those seven wins, the Hokies have outscored the Pirates by an average margin of 30.4-14.6 and have held ECU to 10 points or fewer in four of those games.

• The Pirates are 3-11 under Montgomery. After opening the 2016 campaign with back-to-back wins, ECU has lost 11 of its last 12 contests.

Under Montgomery, East Carolina owns a -20 turnover margin (10 takes/30 gives).

 Dating back to 2010, ECU is 1-5 against ranked foes, with that lone win coming vs. Tech (9/13/14).

WHAT A SAVAGE!

 LB Tremaine Edmunds (aka @Maine_Savage23) is off to an outstanding start to the 2017 season.

• Edmunds leads Tech with 21 tackles (11 solo), 4.0 TFLs (-26.0 yds) and 1.5 sacks (-19.0 yds). He also owns a FF and a QB hurry.

 The Darville, Virginia native led all players in last week's 27-0 shutout of Delaware (9/9), posting 14 tackles (six solo), including those 4.0 TFLs and 1.5 sacks.

PHILLIPS ON RECORD-SETTING PACE

 WR Cam Phillips is on pace to break a pair of Tech receiving records established by WR Isaiah Ford. Here's a look at where Phillips stands and his projected career stats based on his production over the first two games of 2017 and 12 regular season games in 2016.

TECH SEEKS BACK-TO-BACK 10-WIN SEASONS

 Dating back to 1999, Oklahoma (14) is the only Power Five team to boast more 10-win seasons than Virginia Tech (12).

 The Hokies are seeking to produce consecutive 10-win seasons for the first time since accomplishing that feat eight straight years (2004-11) under Frank Beamer.

POLL POSITION

 Tech is ranked in The AP Top 25 for the season's first three games for the first time since 2011. The Hokies are currently No.
 16 in both The AP Top 25 and the USA Today Coaches Poll.

• Tech was ranked in The AP Top 25 for six of the final seven polls of 2016. The 2011 season marked the most recent time that the Hokies spent the entire season in The AP Top 25.

THE #LPD LIVES HERE!

 Last week, Virginia Tech's famed Lunch Pail Defense registered its 32nd shutout since DC Bud Foster arrived in Blacksburg.

• Since 1996, no team can top Virginia Tech's 787.0 sacks. The Hokies registered 4.0 sacks vs. Delaware (9/9).

 The #LPD had three games with 6.0 or more sacks in 2016, including 6.0 in a 54-17 win vs. ECU (9/24/16).

• VT is 32-3 (.914) since 1996 when posting 6.0 or more sacks.

• The Hokies have registered 30.0 sacks in their last 10 meetings with East Carolina, including 25.0 in their seven wins.

HOKIES DOMINATE MULTIPLE STATES

 Tech's most recent contest in North Carolina was a 35-24 win vs. Arkansas (12/29/16) in the Belk Bowl played in Charlotte. The Hokies trailed 24-0 at halftime before orchestrating the largest comeback in school history.

• Virginia Tech went 3-0 in the state of North Carolina in 2016. In addition to the Belk Bowl triumph, VT registered a 34-3 win at UNC (10/8) and a 24-21 win at Duke (11/5).

• Tech is 20-2 all-time in ACC games in North Carolina.

 The Hokies own the longest active FBS winning streak against its biggest in-state rival, owning 13 straight wins over Virginia, having controlled The Commonwealth Cup since 2004. Tech is 17-1 in its last 18 meetings with UVA.

• Tech has also held The Black Diamond Trophy since 2004 in their border rivalry with West Virginia. The schools renewed their series after a 12-year hiatus with the Hokies claiming a 31-24 win at FedExField (9/3).

FOOTBALL IS FAMILY AT VIRGINIA TECH

During Frank Beamer's 29-year tenure at Virginia Tech, 25
different sets of siblings played for the Hokies.

 That illustrious group of Hokies is headlined by The Fullers - the only quartet of brothers in NFL history to all attend the same school and all be selected in the NFL Draft. CBs Kendall (Washington) and Kyle (Chicago) are both active, while WR Corey (New Orleans) is beginning the season on IR. S Vinnie enjoyed a six-year NFL career with Tennessee and Detroit.

 The final family recruited by Beamer was The Edmunds. Eldest brother Trey is on the active roster of New Orleans as a RB.
 Younger brothers Terrell and Tremaine are both standouts on Tech's defense. The Edmunds' parents were standout athletes in their own right - Felecia was a track standout, while Ferrell entered the NFL as third-round pick of Miami in 1988.

VIRGINIA TECH VS. EAST CAROLINA: INSIDE THE SERIES

• Tech's 37-point victory over East Carolina last season was the largest margin of victory for either team in the all-time series.

• The win also ended East Carolina's six-game winning streak against ACC opponents.

• The Hokies are 6-2 when ranked vs. East Carolina but have lost two of the last three meetings with the Pirates when slotted in the top 25 entering the game.

• Three of the Hokies' seven losses in the series with East Carolina have come either on the road at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium or at a neutral site (Bank of America Stadium, Charlotte, N.C., 8/30/08). • The Hokies' last defeat in the state of North Carolina came against East Carolina in Greenville on 9/26/15.

• In Frank Beamer's first season as the head coach at Virginia Tech in 1987, the Pirates defeated the Hokies in Blacksburg, 32-23 (10/17/87).

• ECU's nine-point win over the Hokies that day is still their largest margin of victory in the all-time series. • The Hokies have won four of the last five and are 18-5 overall in road contests vs. non-conference opponents since 1996.

In 1983, Charles brought in former Virginia Tech TE Mike Burnop to serve as an analyst. Burnop is still an analyst on Hokie football and men's basketball radio broadcasts to this day.

- East Carolina has five Virginia players on their roster, including starters Travis Phillips (Montpelier), Bobby Fulp (Midlothian) and Davon Grayson (Suffolk).

The Hokies feature 10 North Carolina natives: Hendon Hooker (Greensboro), Caleb Farley (Hickory), Austin Reeves (Hunters-

ville), Jimmie Taylor (Jacksonville), Houshun Gaines (Rocky Mount), Zion Debose (Salisbury), Mook Reynolds (Greensboro), Adonis Alexander (Charlotte), Divine Deablo (Winston-Salem), Drake Deluliis (Charlotte).

• Fuente and his entire staff return for their second season at Virginia Tech after a remarkable debut campaign in Blacksburg.

 The consensus 2016 ACC Coach of the Year, Fuente was also named the top first-year FBS head coach in the nation by the Football Writers Assocation of America, sharing that honor with USC's Clay Helton.

• Tech finished the 2016 season ranked No. 16 in both the AP Poll and the Coaches Poll, marking the highest final mark for the Hokies since 2010 (No. 16 AP, No. 15 Coaches).

• Virginia Tech, Penn State, Colorado, West Virginia and Western Michigan all finished in the AP Top 25 after getting zero votes in the AP Preseason Poll.

• Tech's 10 wins were the team's most since 2011 and the most ever by a first-year Virginia Tech head coach, surpassing the previous mark of nine wins by C.P. Miles in 1905.

• Fuente led Tech to its sixth ACC Coastal Division Title and its first since 2010, sending the Hokies to the ACC Championship Game where Tech lost a narrow 42-35 decision to eventual national champion Clemson.

• The Hokies did not lose consecutive games under Fuente in 2016 as the Hokies extended the nation's longest active bowl streak with their 24th straight appearance.

Under Fuente, the Hokies also extending their winning streak against Virginia to 13 straight games.

• Virginia Tech's 35-24 victory over Arkansas in the Belk Bowl marked the largest comeback in school history. The Hokies were down 24-0 at halftime before scoring 35 unanswered points en route to victory, making Fuente the initial coach to guide the Hokies to a bowl victory in his debut season.

• The Hokies broke 10 offensive single-season records in 2016, most notably registering school marks for points (490), total first downs (330), TD passes (31), passing yards (3,660) and yards of total offense (6,223).

• Among ACC squads, only Clemson (26.9) averaged more first downs per game than Virginia Tech (23.6) in 2016.

• The Hokies also returned to their dominant defensive ways in Fuente's debut campaign as Tech ranked second in the nation in third-down defense (27.5%), while ranking fourth among Power Five squads in tackles for loss (113.0) and fifth in opponent completion percentage (50.1).

• Virginia Tech also experienced a special teams' resurgence as the Hokies returned to its Beamer Ball roots, blocking four kicks (three FGs, one punt), while registering TDs on a punt return and a blocked FG return.

PROMINENT QB PUPILS

Paxton Lynch (Memphis): D1-2016 (26th overall), Denver – Completed 555 of 856 (64.8%) of his passes for 6,807 yards with 50 TDs and 13 INTs in 2014-15.

Andy Dalton (TCU): D2-2011 (35th overall), Cincinnati – Two-time Pro Bowler completed 63.8 percent (408 of 639) of his passes for 5,613 yards with 50 TDs and 14 INTs at TCU (2009-10). In 93 career regular season starts, has thrown for 22,214 yards with 142 TDs and 81 INTs, leading the Bengals to five playoff berths.

Casey Pachall (TCU) – Completed 66.5 percent of his throws (228 of 343) with 25 TDs and seven INTs in 2011

OFFENSE

JACKSON THROUGH HIS FIRST TWO CAREER STARTS

• R-freshman QB Josh Jackson continued his strong start vs. Delaware (9/9) as he threw for 222 yards on 16 of 28 passing with TD throwing TDs.

• With the win, Jackson became the first Tech QB since Brenden Motley (2015) to win his first two career starts.

• He also became the first Hokie signal caller to throw for 222+ yards since in his first two career starts since 1987.

Jackson's 577 total yards of offense in his first two career starts are also the most since at least 1987.

• The Ann Arbor, Mich., native is seeking to become the first Tech QB since Logan Thomas in 2011 to win his first three career starts.

TECH QBS IN THIRD CAREER STARTS VS. EAST CAROLINA

• After helping lead Tech to a 27-0 win over Delaware, QB Josh Jackson became the first Virginia Tech signal caller to win his first two career starts since Brenden Motley (2015).

• Motley's third career start was a 35-28 loss at East Carolina. Motley's predecessor, Michael Brewer, also lost his third career start to East Carolina.

• Hopefully Jackson's third start career is better than his predecessors vs. ECU.

CAM CLIMBS UP THE RECEIVING CHARTS

• Senior WR Cam Phillips caught six passes for 90 yards with a 28-yard TD catch vs. Delaware (9/9) to solidfy himself in the top 10 of all three triple crown categories for a receiver at Virginia Tech.

• His TD catch against the Blue Hens moved him into a tie for 10th with Eddie Royal on Tech's career receiving touchdowns list.

• Phillips is one of only three players in program history with 150+ receptions, 10+ touchdowns and 2,000+ receiving yards in a career.

• Phillips picked right up where he left off at the end of his junior campaign as he set a new career-high with 138 receiving yards on seven catches vs. West Virginia (9/3) in the season opener.

SAVOY'S SIZZLING START

Freshman WR Sean Savoy has come in and made an immediate impact in the Virginia Tech receiving corps as he's hauled in eight passes for 105 yards, good enough for a 13.1 yards per catch average.
Two of the longest catches he's caught this season have led to two Virginia Tech touchdowns - a 22-yard grab that set up a rushing TD for Travon McMillian vs. West Virginia (9/3) and a 38-yard reception that led to a receiving TD for McMillian vs. Delaware (9/9).

McMILLIAN AMONG THE ACC'S TOP RETURNING RUSHERS

 Redshirt junior RB Travon McMillian boasts rushing numbers that rank among the best in the ACC entering the 2017 season.

In 2016, McMillian matched his rushing TD total of seven from his freshman campaign while also racking up three TD catches. McMillian set career-highs with 114 receiving yards and 10.4 YPC as a sophomore.
With his four-yard touchdown catch vs. Delaware (9/9), McMillian became only the 18th player in school history to register 20 career TDs.

• The Hokies running game churned out 246 yards on the ground in the win over West Virginia and

accounted for three of Tech's four total touchdowns.

• Tech out-rushed the Mountaineers, 246-234.

 Three different players scored TDs – QB Josh Jackson on a five-yard run, RB Deshawn McClease on a 12-yard run and Travon McMillian on a three-yard run.

• QB Josh Jackson led all Hokies with 101 rushing yards, the most for a Virginia Tech QB since Logan Thomas also ran for 101 yards vs. Duke (10/26/13).

Along with that trio, RB Steven Peoples rushed for 39 yards on 13 carries and had a career-long run of

11 yards.

Head coach Justin Fuente improved to 11-2 at Tech when the Hokies rush for 150+ yards.

JACKSON SHINES IN TECH DEBUT

 Making his collegiate debut in a nationally televised primetime matchup against a ranked opponent in an NFL stadium, redshirt freshman QB Josh Jackson helped Virginia Tech retain the Black Diamond Trophy after accounting for 336 yards of total offense and two total TDs.

- Jackson, who threw for 253 yards and rushed for 101 yards, became the first Hokies QB since Logan Thomas in 2013 to pass for 200+ yards and rush for 100+ yards.

Jackson's rushing total was the most for a Tech QB making his debut since 1987.

• It was the second-most rushing yards for a Hokie QB making his first career start since Al Clark rushed for 119 yards at Rutgers (8/30/97).

Edmunds' second career forced fumble came at 10:18 in the fourth quarter and led to a 24-yard field by

Joey Slye that made it 27-0. • After leading the team with four interceptions in 2016, r-junior S Terrell Edmunds notched his first pick

of 2017 vs. Delaware (9/9) and returned it 55 yards. • Edmunds also posted his first career sack against the Blue Hens.

• Tech's special teams and tight ends coach James Shibest, Bradburn's primary recruiter, is no stranger to working with Australian punters. While serving as special teams coach under Justin Fuente at Memphis, Shibest coached 2013 Ray Guy Award winner and Geelong, Australia native Tom Hornsey.

BEAMER'S RETIRED NO. 25 MAKES A RETURN TO THE FIELD

• Senior PR Greg Stroman will wear Frank Beamer's No. 25 at East Carolina after returning a 61-yard punt for a TD vs. Delaware (9/9).

• Stroman is tied for fourth in program history with three career punt return TDs, ranks third with 95 punt returns and seventh with 774 punt return yards.

• Head coach Justin Fuente and the Hokies paid homage to Frank Beamer and Virginia Tech's legacy of excellence on special teams last season by selecting a special teams player of the week who will wear No. 25.

• With Coach Beamer's blessing, his retired No. 25 was worn by a player who exemplified the role special teams played during Virginia Tech's rise to national prominence.

BLACKSBURG – Virginia Tech quarterback Jerod Evans threw three touchdown passes and ran for a score, and the Hokies made three big plays on special teams, as they scuttled the East Carolina Pirates 54-17 in a non-conference game Saturday afternoon at Lane Stadium.

The Hokies (3-1) scored on their final five possessions of the first half, including all four of their second-quarter possessions. They jumped out to a 38-0 halftime lead, overwhelming East Carolina (2-2) and snapping a two-game losing streak to the Pirates.

Evans completed 13 of 20 passes for a career-high 282 yards and rushed for a career-high 97 more. He entered the game having thrown an ACC-best 10 touchdown passes and has thrown just one interception on the season. He threw touchdown passes of 24 yards to Isaiah Ford, 13 yards to Travon McMillian and 45 yards to Cam Phillips.

Three of the big special teams plays came in the first half. Greg Stroman scored the Hokies' first touchdown on an 87-yard punt return in the first quarter, and a blocked field goal led to a touchdown pass from Evans to Ford. Phillips blocked a punt by East Carolina punter Worth Gregory in the second quarter, and the Hokies took advantage, scoring on a 13-yard pass from Evans to McMillian.

The other big special teams play came in the second half with the game already decided. ECU attempted a fake punt that the Hokies snuffed out and that led to a 1-yard run by Brenden Motley.

ECU quarterback Philip Nelson had 362 yards passing and two touchdown tosses to Jimmy Williams. The Pirates had 443 yards of offense, but committed the three special teams mistakes, fumbled once and were sacked six times.



LANE STADIUM - HOME OF THE HOKIES

Rising high into the mountainous sky of the New River Valley, Virginia Tech's Lane Stadium enters its 53rd year of football competition in 2017. The Tech football team has enjoyed over two decades of success, going to 24 straight bowl games and winning 10 or more games eight straight seasons from 2004-11. A big part of that success is the home-field advantage the Hokies enjoy at Lane Stadium/Worsham Field.

Sitting at roughly 2,057 feet above sea level, the stadium is the second-highest among all FBS schools in the eastern United States, trailing only Appalachian State (3,300). Completed in 1965, Lane Stadium/Worsham Field has gone through numerous changes, renovations and additions. But through it all, it has always been regarded as one of the finest places to watch – and toughest places for opponents to play – a college football game.

THE HOKIE STONE


Before each home football game, Virginia Tech football players and coaching staff enter Lane Stadium through a tunnel. On the stadium-side entrance to Worsham Field, they pass beneath a Hokie Stone, which they touch for good luck and is flanked by these words: "For those who have passed. For those to come ... Reach for Excellence.


ENTER SANDMAN

The history behind Virginia Tech's use of Metallica's "Enter Sandman" started during the 2000 season. That summer, Tech added a new scoreboard to Lane Stadium and the athletics marketing team decided to use the song for an entrance video. The group considered "Welcome to the Jungle" by Guns N' Roses and "Sirius" by the Alan Parsons Project before settling on "Enter Sandman." As the song played on one chilly evening prior to team's entrance, members of the Marching Virginians began to jump up and down in rhythm in an effort to stay warm. The Lane Stadium crowd followed suit and the jumping hasn't stopped since.



• Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its named to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

• Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

• The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."
Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.

WHAT IS A HOKIE?

• That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

• With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body. Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today.

• Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention.

 Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Following is the "Old Hokie" yell in its original form:

Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy! Tech! Tech! V.P.I.! Sola-Rex Sola-Rah Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!! Rae, Ri, V.P.I.
