Under new direction in 2012, the squad returns much of its top talent from last season. Kristin Stenolen led the team in scoring last season with 29 goals and 35 points on the year. On the defensive end, Melida Vasconcellos, who tallied 35 ground balls and 25 caused turnovers, and Laura Meade, who totaled 16 caused turnovers and 28 ground balls, last year both return to the field as well. Susan Englad will likely mind the goal for the Blue Hose. She finished her first season as the full-time starter in goal with a 5-13 record, making 195 saves on the year.

Wolfinger enters her senior season as the most experienced defender on the squad. The senior started all 18 games last season in her third year as a full-time starter. She finished the season with 24 ground balls, while also causing six turnovers and winning six draw crontrols. Wolfinger was named a senior captain heading into her final season at Tech and will look to help her squad get out to a great start and continue success throughout the 2012 season.

Keep it Rolling

The Hokies are coming off their most successful season since 1999. Tech's 10-8 record in 2011 was its winningest in over 10 years and marked the first winning season since 2000.

After starting the season 4-0, the Hokies tacked on a close, one-goal game against nationally ranked James Madison, a last-second win at Lehigh and their second-ever ACC victory when they topped then-No. 16 Boston College 12-11 at home.

Tech will look to build off this success and string together another impressive season in 2012.

Leading the Way

Captaining the Hokies in 2012 will be seniors Shannon Bone, Jessica Nonn and Julie Wolfinger. The trio earned team captain honors before the year began and will look to lead their team in their final season.

The three players have combined to start 130 games, scoring 130 goals and assisting on 32 more. On the defensive end, they have scooped up 233 ground balls and caused 131 turnovers through their three previous seasons.

Nonn Spearheads Veteran Midfield

Senior Jessica Nonn enters the season as the team's most experienced player. The three-year starter has not missed a single game or start in her career, and is the only current player on the squad to rank among the all-time bests in Tech history. While the middle is just four points away from breaking into that list, she already holds top-ten rankings with 107 career goals, 109 draw controls, 82 caused turnovers and 131 ground balls. She ranks seventh, fifth, tied for second and third in each respectively category.

Gale in Goal

Junior Alex Gale will return as the starter in the cage for the Hokies in 2012. This will be her third season as the primary goalkeeper. The Cicero, N.Y., native finished last season with a 9-7 record and made 115 saves, good for a .387 save percentage. Gale spent time over the summer trying out for the US national team and will look to use that experience to help her be a leader and involve herself more with the defensive unit.

Arguably her best performance last season was when the Hokies topped then-No. 16 Boston College 12-11 at home during the regular season. She assisted her team in earning just its second ever ACC victory, while also making a thenseason best 12 saves. She also denied all eight Boston College free position attempts in the game. Gale earned Virginia Tech Athlete of the Week honors for her performance.

Widlake Adds to Powerful Midfield

Senior Morgan Widlake adds greatly to the depth and experience in an already veteran midfield for the Hokies. Widlake has been a staple in the starting line-up since arriving at Tech three seasons ago and has been a force on both end of the field. The Catonsville, Md., native finished her junior season with 31 goals, 36 points, 19 draws, 29 ground balls and 17 caused turnovers.

Widlake wowed the crowd in last year's home opener against George Mason. She scored a career-high seven goals in the game, including the team's first four scores.

Heaps Helps out on Offense

Junior Julia Heaps rose to the occasion last season in her first year as a full-time starter. Heaps totaled 20 goals and 16 assists on the offensive end, good for 36 total points, while also winning 18 draw controls in her second season. The Street, Md., native provides great options on offense for the Hokies as she excels at attacking the goal and can dominate the set-up game from behind the cage as well.

Determined Defense

Tech's defensive unit has seen a lot of changes over the past few seasons but returns much of its experience and talent in 2012. Senior captain Julie Wolfinger emerged as a leader last season on the defensive end, and junior Kristin Semones rose to the occasion in her first year as a full-time starter. The veteran pair will be joined again by former defensive starter Christina Patten, who missed last season due to a torn Achilles tendon. Vying for big minutes on the defensive end will be Taylor

Senior eader Shannon Bone, who has served as somewhat of a utility player for the Hokies and also saw a lot of time on the lefensive end last year, will also reposition herself into the midfield.

Junior Brooke Martin will move out of the midfield, where the gave the Hokies great minutes off the bench last seasor and get back to her original position on attack. Also moving but of the midfield will be Taylor Landry. Landry missed las season due to injury and saw some time in the offseason as a middie, but really excelled on the defensive end.

New Additions for 2012

On top of adding new assistant coach Sarah Jonson to the staff in the offseason, the Virginia Tech lacrosse team has welcomed eight freshmen this season in Maddy Hess, Cawley Bromley, Jack Boissonneault, Ann Wallace Tazewel Meg Bartley, Rachel Skay, Caroline Boucher and Megan Will. The class represents six different states, with only two players hailing from the same state, as well as Canada. Here

s a closer look as this season's newcomers:

Hess, a native of Lancaster, Pa., comes to Tech after serving as a starting midfielder for three easons at Penn Manor High School. As a senior captain, Hess was named an All-American. She telped her team to a LL League championship in 2009, also earning All-Section and All-League tonors in 2010 and 2011. Hess played club lacrosse for X-treme for two years.

Bromley was a four-year starter on attack at Apex High school, while helping her team to hree state championships. She was named State Championship MVP twice in her career and also earned 2010 Conference Player of the Year accolades as a junior. A four-time First Team All-Conference and two-time All-State honoree, the Cary, N.C., native also garnered Honorable Mention All-America accolades as a senior. Bromley was also a four-year member of the Carolina Fever club team.

Boissonneault arrives at Tech from Ajax, Ontario, Canada. She played midfield for her high school, Donald A. Wilson, where she was named Athlete of the Year in 2008 as well as 2011. Boissonneault also played for the Oshawa Lady Blue Knights, a team that she helped to six provincial championships.

Tazewell, a Richmond, Va., native, was a three-year starter on defense at Collegiate High School. ne won the Sportsmanship Award, while also being named to the All-LIS team. Tazewell was also defender for the Geromino Lacrosse club team.

Bartley was a four-year starter at Cape Henlopen and captained the team as a senior. She was named team MVP in 2010 and 2011. Bartley earned All-State first team honors in 2010 and 2011 and garnered US Lacrosse All-America honors as a junior and senior. The attacker was named Delaware Lacrosse Player of the Year after her final season. She played club ball for Greene Turtle Lax, while also participating in the 2011 US Lacrosse All-American Showcase for Team Freedom.

Skay hails from North Bethesda, Md., and played four years of varsity lacrosse at Walter Johnson High School. As a midfielder, Skay earned First Team All-Division and All-County honors three times throughout her career and was named team MVP twice. She was a four-year Scholar Athlete, while also serving as team captain as a senior. Skay played her club ball for Capital Lacrosse Club.

Boucher joins the Hokies after playing three years of varsity lacrosse at Torrey Pines High School. A two-time First Team All-CIF and All-League honoree, Boucher served as team captain in her senior season. The San Diego, Calif., native was unable to finish her senior season due to injury but led her high school two Section CIF championships as a member of the midfield. Boucher played club ball for the West Coast Starz.

Will joins the Hokies after playing four years on attack at C. Milton Wright High School. Will helped her team to two regional championships, as well as the state finals her junior year. The Bel Air, Md., native was a two-time First Team All-County honoree, while earning C. Milton Wright High School Athlete of the Year honors as a senior. Will spent four years as a member of the NEMS club squad.
