The Hokies will hit the road for the first time this season as they face their biggest challenge yet. Tech will take on No. 13 James Madison on the road in a midweek game, before returning home to host UC Davis on Saturday.

Tech is coming off it's first loss of the year to perennial top-25 team William & Mary. The Hokies will look to bounce back on the road against a JMU team that halted their 4-0 start last season.

### Series Info: James Madison

The Hokies have never beaten the Dukes, falling to the nearby school nine times since their first meeting in 2001. Tech battled but fell to the then-No. 9 Dukes, 11-9, in 2011 at home. The Hokies were ranked for the first time in program history at No. 20 in the daBeer/Inside Lacrosse poll, for that week of play. The Dukes made the tournament in 2011, but fell in the first round.

### Scouting Report: James Madison

James Madison enters the midweek game ranked No. 13 in the IWLCA/ Under Armour poll, sitting at 1-1 on the year. The Dukes opened the season with a 13-9 win over Cal on the road and fell just short to then-No. 6 Stanford, 14-13, two days later.

Ariel Lane leads the JMU offense with six goals, while Caitlin McHugh has scored five goals on the season and assisted another. Alex Menghetti has manned the cage for the Dukes and boasts a 1-1 record. She has made 15 saves, good for a .417 save percentage.

### Series Info: UC Davis

This will be the first ever meeting between Tech and the Aggies. The Hokies are 6-4 all-time against teams currently in the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation (MPSF).

### Scouting Report: UC Davis

UC Davis will travel to High Point and Davidson for back-to-back games before arriving in Blacksburg on Saturday. The Aggies are 2-0 entering the week of play, topping conference foes San Diego St. and St. Mary's, 18-7 and 16-13, respectively.

Elizabeth Datino leads the offense with 10 goals and seven assists so far, while Vanessa Jamison has won 10 draws and caused five turnovers. Jordan Majka has seen the bulk of the time in goal and has made 15 saves, good for a .469 save percentage.

## Player Spotlight

### Megan Will • Fr. • Attack • Bel Air, Md.

Freshman Megan Will has wasted no time to make herself known early in her career. The Bel Air, Md., native has started the first three games of her career and scored at least one goal in each of those games. Will began her collegiate career scoring three goals against Presbyterian College. She followed up her debut with an impressive five-point performance (4g, 1a) against High Point. Will also tacked on another goal against William & Mary last weekend.

#### Keep it Rolling

The Hokies are coming off their most successful season since 1999. Tech's 10-8 record in 2011 was its winningest in over 10 years and marked the first winning season since 2000.

After starting the season 4-0, the Hokies tacked on a close, one-goal game against nationally ranked James Madison, a last-second win at Lehigh and their second-ever ACC victory when they topped then-No. 16 Boston College 12-11 at home.

Tech will look to build off this success and string together another impressive season in 2012.

#### Leading the Way

Captaining the Hokies in 2012 will be seniors Shannon Bone, Jessica Nonn and Julie Wolfinger. The trio earned team captain honors before the year began and will look to lead their team in their final season.

The three players have combined to start 130 games, scoring 130 goals and assisting on 32 more. On the defensive end, they have scooped up 233 ground balls and caused 131 turnovers through their three previous seasons.

#### Nonn Spearheads Veteran Midfield

Senior Jessica Nonn picked up right where she left off last season. As one of the team's most experienced players, Nonn entered her final season ranking in the top 10 all-time at Tech in goals, draw controls, ground balls and caused turnovers. In the

first game of the season she also put her name on the all-time career points list.

Nonn currently leads the team in scoring and points, while also ranking fourth in the conference averaging 3.00 goals per game. The Catonsville, Md., native also leads the league, averaging 4.33 points per game.

#### Gale in Goal

Junior Alex Gale has returned as the starter in the cage for the Hokies in 2012. This will be her third season as the primary goalkeeper. The Cicero, N.Y., native has made 11 saves so far this season, good for a .379 percentage. Despite the loss, Gale came up big against William & Mary, blocking all four free position attempts in the game. Gale has allowed 18 goals this year, good for a 6.63 GAA, and also helped her team to a 7.00 GAA, good for second in the conference.

#### Widlake Adds to Powerful Midfield

Senior Morgan Widlake adds greatly to the depth and experience in an already veteran midfield for the Hokies. Widlake has been a staple in the starting line-up since arriving at Tech three seasons ago and has been a force on both end of the field. The Catonsville, Md., native paces the team with 11 draw controls, seven ground balls and six caused turnovers this season. She also leads the conference, averaging 2.00 caused turnovers per game.

#### Heaps Helps out on Offense

Junior Julia Heaps has gotten out to a

slow start in 2012 but has still remained a staple in the Hokie attack. After not earning a point in the season opener, Heaps scored two goals against High Point. The Street, Md., native tacked on her third point of the season with an assist against William & Mary.

#### Quite the First Impression

Freshmen Megan Will and Jack Boissonneault have made their names known very early on. Will has started the first three games of her career, while Boissonneault gave the Hokies big minutes off the bench and finally earned her first start against William & Mary.

Will has scored in all three games, including a five-point performance against High Point. Boissonneault has also excelled on the offensive end, scoring two goals in two of the first three games, while also racking up six ground balls for far this year, good for second on the team.

#### Back Where They Belong

Juniors Brooke Martin and Libby Rosebro have both transitioned back to their original positions this season and have proven they are happy to be back. Rosebro contributed greatly on defense last season but has rejoined the midfield this year due to her offensive success in the off-season. The Richmond, Va., native has tallied four points, six ground balls and five draws on the year. Martin rejoins the attack this season from the midfield last year. In her first three games she has tallied eight

goals and 10 points, including an impressive six-goal outing against High Point. Martin has also won five draws.

### Defensive Debuts

The Tech defense has a much different look in 2012. In the season opener against PC, Taylor Landry made her collegiate debut after missing last season due to injury. Also making her first career start was junior Charlotte Marsh.

### Fresh Start

All eight of the team's freshmen saw action in the season-opening win over Presbyterian College, while newcomer Megan Will also started the game. Will led all newcomers with three points in the game as she buried the first three goals of her career. Also earning their first points were Jack Boissonneault (2g), Maddy Hess (1g, 1a), Rachel Skay (1g), Cawley Bromley (1a) and Meg Bartley (1a).

### Changing Things Around

Tech will see a number of players switch positions this season or return to positions they previously played. Junior Libby Rosebro spent much of last season on the defensive end but will return to the midfield this year after emerging as an offensive threat in the offseason. Senior leader Shannon Bone, who has served as somewhat of a utility player for the Hokies and also saw a lot of time on the defensive end last year, will also reposition herself into the midfield.

Junior Brooke Martin will move out of the midfield, where she gave the Hokies great minutes off the bench last season and get back to her original position on attack. Also moving out of the midfield will be Taylor Landry. Landry missed last season due to injury and saw some time in the offseason as a middle, but really excelled on the defensive end.

### New Additions for 2012

On top of adding new assistant coach Sarah Jonson to the staff in the offseason, the Virginia Tech lacrosse team has welcomed eight freshmen this season in Maddy Hess, Cawley Bromley, Jack Boissonneault, Ann Wallace Tazewell, Meg Bartley, Rachel Skay, Caroline Boucher and Megan Will. The class represents six different states, with only two players hailing from the same state, as well as Canada.
