The Hokies continue home play this week as they host American in a midweek game, before shipping out to Boston to begin conference play. Tech will kick off ACC action on Saturday, traveling to No. 18/13 Boston College. This is a big week for the Hokies as they look to avenge a tough loss at American last season and fight for their first conference victory on the road.

#### Series Info: American

Tech holds the all-time series edge as it sits at 6-5 against American. The two teams first met in 1995, the Hokies' first season as a varsity program. Tech is 4-1 at home against the Eagles.

The Hokies suffered one of their worst losses of the season in last year's meeting, as Tech fell 18-7 in the Nation's Capital. The loss ended a five-game winning streak for the Hokies against the Eagles.

#### **Scouting Report: American**

American enters the Wednesday game with a 3-1 record, falling only to Richmond, 12-11. Coming off a 16-10 win over Old Dominion, this will be American's first game away from home this year. Emily Burton leads the offense with 13 goals and three assists, while Emily Stankiewicz has tallied six ground balls, six caused turnovers and nine draw controls. In goal for American will be Kaska

Komosinski, who boasts a 3-1 record, having made 26 saves, good for a .448 percentage.

#### Series Info: Boston College

Tech is 4-7 all-time against Boston College, 2-5 since both teams joined the Atlantic Coast Conference. Former conference foes in the BIG EAST, Tech was 2-2 against the Eagles through those four seasons.

The two teams have never matched up outside of conference play and met in the postseason for the first time ever last season. Boston College is the only ACC team the Hokies have ever defeated.

Tech topped the Eagles for the second time since both teams joined the ACC. Boston College clawed its way out of a 9-3 halftime deficit to make it a game again but Tech pulled out the 12-11win.

The Eagles eventually got revenge on the Hokies for the regular season defeat when they dominated Tech, 17-3, in the first round of the 2011 ACC Tournament.

#### Scouting Report: Boston College

Boston College enters the week at 3-1 on the year, but will travel to No. 7/6 Vanderbilt for a midweek game before the Hokies come to town. This will be the ACC opener for both teams.

Mikaela Rix leads the team with 13 goals, while Kristin Igoe has tallied 12 goals and three assists. In goal, Catherine Conway and Emily Mata have split time. Conway boasts a 2-1 record, playing 123 minutes and making three starts. She has made 11 saves and allowed 25 goals. Mata has a 1-0 record in 116 minutes. She has made 19 saves and allowed 24 goals.

# Player Spodight Morgan Widlake • Sr. • Midfield • Catonsville, Md.

Senior Morgan Widlake has come on strong for the Hokies since the first game of the season. After not earning a point in the opener, Widlake has scored at least one goal in the past four games and helped lead the Hokies with four scores against UC Davis.

The middle has sparked the Hokies on both ends of the field as she is third on the squad in scoring (8), while also leading the way with 10 caused turnovers and nine ground balls. Her 17 draw controls is also good for second on the team.

## Tech Against The Best

As a memeber of the Atlantic Coast Conference, the Hokies have the opportunity to face numerous ranked teams every season. In non-conference play, Tech has already taken on then-No. 13 James Madison this season.

This week the Hokies kick off ACC action and will take on back-to-back ranked teams, playing at No. 18/13 Boston College on Saturday and hosting No. 4/3 Duke a week from Wednesday.

Tech is 4-66 all-time against ranked teams, with its last win coming against then No. 16 Boston College last season.

### Leading the Way

Captaining the Hokies in 2012 are seniors Shannon Bone, Jessica Nonn and Julie Wolfinger. The trio earned team captain honors before the year began and will look to lead their team in their final season.

The three players have combined to start 130 games, scoring 130 goals and assisting on 32 more. On the defensive end, they have scooped up 233 ground balls and caused 131 turnovers through their three previous seasons.

#### Nonn Spearheads Veteran Midfield

Senior Jessica Nonn picked up right where she left off last season. As one of the team's most experienced players, Nonn entered her final season ranking in the top 10 all-time at Tech in goals, draw controls, ground balls and caused turnovers. In the first game of the season she also put her name on the all-time career points list. Nonn currently leads the team in scoring, points and draw controls

## Gale in Goal

Junior Alex Gale has returned as the starter in the cage for the Hokies in 2012. This will be her third season as the primary goalkeeper. The Cicero, N.Y., native has made 21 saves so far this season, good for a .350 percentage. Despite the loss, Gale came up big against William & Mary, blocking all four free position attempts in the game.

### Widlake Adds to Powerful Midfield

Senior Morgan Widlake adds greatly to the depth and experience in an already veteran midfield for the Hokies. Widlake has been a staple in the starting line-up since arriving at Tech three seasons ago and has been a force on both end of the field. The Catonsville, Md., native paces the team with 10 caused turnovers and nine ground balls, while also ranking in the top three in scoring (8) and draw controls (17).

#### Heaps Helps out on Offense

Junior Julia Heaps has gotten out to a slow start in 2012 but has still remained a staple in the Hokie attack. After not earning a point in the season opener, Heaps scored two goals against High Point. The Street, Md., native tacked on her third point of the season with an assist against William & Mary.

# Quite the First Impression

Freshmen Megan Will and Jack

Boissonneault have made their names known very early on. Will has started the first three games of her career, while Boissonneault gave the Hokies big minutes off the bench and earned her first start against William & Mary.

Will has scored in all five games, including a five-point performance against High Point. Boissonneault has also excelled on the offensive end, scoring five goals, while also racking up nine ground balls so far this year, Which ties her for team lead.

#### **Back Where They Belong**

Juniors Brooke Martin and Libby Rosebro have both transitioned back to their original positions this season and have proven they are happy to be back. Rosebro contributed greatly on defense last season but has rejoined the midfield this year due to her offensive success in the off-season. The Richmond, Va., native has tallied five points, seven ground balls and five draws on the year. Martin rejoins the attack this season from the midfield last year. In her first five games she has tallied 11 goals and 14 points, inluding an impressive six-goal outing against High Point.

## **Defensive Debuts**

The Tech defense has a much different look in 2012. In the season opener against PC, Taylor Landry made her collegiate debut after missing last season due to injury. Also making her first career start was junior Charlotte Marsh.

At then-No. 13 James Madison, the defense took on a new look as redshirt junior Christina Patten and freshman Ann Wallace Tazewell made their first starts of the season.

#### Fresh Start

All eight of the team's freshmen saw action in the seasonopening win over Presbyterian College, while newcomer Megan Will also started the game. Will led all newcomers with three points in the game as she buried the first three goals of her career. Also earning their first points were Jack Boissonneault (2g), Maddy Hess (1g, 1a), Rachel Skay (1g), Cawley Bromley (1a) and Meg Bartley (1a).

### **Changing Things Around**

Tech will see a number of players switch positions this season or return to positions they previously played. Junior Libby Rosebro spent much of last season on the defensive end but will return to the midfield this year after emerging as an offensive threat in the offseason. Senior leader Shannon Bone, who has served as somewhat of a utility player for the Hokies and also saw a lot of time on the defensive end last year, will also reposition herself into the midfield.

Junior Brooke Martin will move out of the midfield, where she gave the Hokies great minutes off the bench last season and get back to her original position on attack. Also moving out of the midfield will be Taylor Landry. Landry missed last season due to injury and saw some time in the offseason as a middie, but really excelled on the defensive end.

### New Additions for 2012

On top of adding new assistant coach Sarah Jonson to the staff in the offseason, the Virginia Tech lacrosse team has welcomed eight freshmen this season in Maddy Hess, Cawley Bromley, Jack Boissonneault, Ann Wallace Tazewell, Meg Bartley, Rachel Skay, Caroline Boucher and Megan Will. The class represents six different states, with only two players hailing from the same state, as well as Canada.
