The Hokies continue conference play this week as they host No. 4 Duke in a midweek game before heading to Emmitsburg, Md., to face Mount St. Mary's. This will be the first time this season that Tech faces back-to-back ranked teams, as it is coming off a 17-10 loss at No. 18 Boston College last Saturday.

Series Info: Duke

The Hokies have never topped the Blue Devils in all 14 meetings since 1997. Most recently, Tech fell, 18-8, to Duke in Durham, N.C., as the Hokies hung with the Blue Devils in the opening minutes but allowed them to get out to a 13-5 halftime lead and sit comfortably from there. Duke went on to lose to Maryland in the NCAA semi-finals.

The two teams met once on a neutral field, in 2008 for the first round of the ACC Tournament.

Scouting Report: Duke

Duke enters the midweek game with a 7-2 record, 1-0 in conference. The Blue Devils are in the midst of a four-game winning streak that most recently saw them top nationally ranked Georgetown, 14-7.

Kerrin Maurer leads the team with 16 goals and five assists on the season, while five other players have also tallied 13-plus goals thus far. Emma Hamm leads the defensive effort with 13 ground balls and 13 caused turnovers. She has also won 42 draws.

In cage for the Blue Devils will be Mollie Mackler, who has allowed 77 goals this season and made 71 saves, good for a .480 percentage.

Series Info: Mout St. Mary's

The Hokies face off against the Mount St. Mary's for the first time since 2007, when the Hokies won 20-9 in Blacksburg. The Hokies have never lost to the Mount, holding a 3-0 series

Scouting Report: Mount St. Mary's

Mount St. Mary's has yet to earn a victory this season as it enters the weekend at 0-6 on the year. The squad is coming off an 18-8 loss to Longwood.

Leading the charge for the Mount is Kaitlyn Larrimore with seven goals, while Jen Semler has also tallied seven points, by way of five goals and two assists.

Brigid Mctavish will be in goal for Mount St. Mary's and has made 46 saves on they year.

Player Spotlight Meg Bartley • Fr. • Attack • Lewes, Del.

Freshman Meg Bartley has risen to a new level in the past three games. Bartley kicked things off with a five-point performance against UC Davis, including four goals. Entering the game Bartley had just one point to her name. Earning a spot in the starting lineup, Bartley has continued to impress as she has tallied five points in the past two games. She put away two goals against American before helping lead the Hokies with two scores at No. 18 Boston College last weekend.

Tech Against The Best

As a memeber of the Atlantic Coast Conference, the Hokies have the opportunity to face numerous ranked teams every season. In non-conference play, Tech has already taken on then-No. 13 James Madison this season.

The Hokies will make it back-to-back ranked opponents this week as they host No. 4 Duke after falling at No. 18 Boston College last weekend.

Tech is 4-67 all-time against ranked teams, with its last win coming against then No. 16 Boston College last season.

Leading the Way

Captaining the Hokies in 2012 are seniors Shannon Bone, Jessica Nonn and Julie Wolfinger. The trio earned team captain honors before the year began and will look to lead their team in their final season.

The three players have combined to start 130 games, scoring 130 goals and assisting on 32 more. On the defensive end, they have scooped up 233 ground balls and caused 131 turnovers through their three previous seasons.

Nonn Spearheads Veteran Midfield

Senior Jessica Nonn picked up right where she left off last season. As one of the team's most experienced players, Nonn entered her final season ranking in the top 10 all-time at Tech in goals, draw controls, ground balls and caused turnovers. In the first game of the season she also put her name on the all-time career points list.

The Catonsville, Md., native is the only player on the team to score a goal in every game this season, as she currently leads the squad with 17 goals and 23 points.

Gale in Goal

Junior Alex Gale has returned as the starter in the cage for the Hokies in 2012. This will be her third season as the primary goalkeeper. The Cicero, N.Y., native has made 28 saves so far this season, good for a .301 percentage. Despite the loss, Gale came up big against William & Mary, blocking all four free position attempts in the game.

Widlake Adds to Powerful Midfield

Senior Morgan Widlake adds greatly to the depth and experience in an already veteran midfield for the Hokies. Widlake has been a staple in the starting line-up since arriving at Tech three seasons ago and has been a force on both end of the field. The Catonsville, Md., native paces the team with 12 caused turnovers and ranks second with 11 ground balls, while also ranking in the top three in scoring (9) and draw controls (21).

Future Production

Freshmen Megan Will, Jack Boissonneault and Meg Bartley have come on strong early in their collegiate premieres. The trio of newcomers have combined to score 30 goals, assist five more and scoop up 20 ground balls through seven games.

Will has missed just one start in her career, while Boissonneault leads the team with 12 ground balls and Bartley ranks third on the squad with nine goals, all of which have come in the past three games.

Back Where They Belong

Juniors Brooke Martin and Libby Rosebro have both transitioned back to their original positions this season and have proven they are happy to be back. Rosebro contributed greatly on defense last season but has rejoined the midfield this year due to her offensive success in the off-season. The Richmond, Va., native has tallied five points, eight ground balls and five draws on the year. Martin rejoins the attack this season from the midfield last year. In her first seven games she has tallied 13 goals and 16 points, inluding an impressive six-goal outing against High Point.

Protecting the Cage

The Tech defense has a much different look in 2012. Senior captain Julie Wolfinger speadheads the newly constructed unit and she is joined by junior Charlotte Marsh, redshirt freshman Taylor Landry and redshirt junior Chirstina Patten, who both missed last season due to injury. Relieving the starting crew has been freshman Ann Wallace Tazewell.

Seven games into the season, the unit has hit its stride, tallying 20 ground balls and 12 caused turnovers collectively.

Heaps Helps out on Offense

Junior Julia Heaps got out to a slow start in 2012 but has still remained a staple in the

Hokie attack. After not earning a point in the season opener, Heaps scored two goals against High Point. The Street, Md., native tacked on her third point of the season with an assist against William & Marv.

Fresh Start

All eight of the team's freshmen saw action in the seasonopening win over Presbyterian College, while newcomer Megan Will also started the game. Will led all newcomers with three points in the game as she buried the first three goals of her career. Also earning their first points were Jack Boissonneault (2g), Maddy Hess (1g, 1a), Rachel Skay (1g), Cawley Bromley (1a) and Meg Bartley (1a).

Changing Things Around

Tech will see a number of players switch positions this season or return to positions they previously played. Junior Libby Rosebro spent much of last season on the defensive end but will return to the midfield this year after emerging as an offensive threat in the offseason. Senior leader Shannon Bone, who has served as somewhat of a utility player for the Hokies and also saw a lot of time on the defensive end last year, will also reposition herself into the midfield.

Junior Brooke Martin will move out of the midfield, where she gave the Hokies great minutes off the bench last season and get back to her original position on attack. Also moving out of the midfield will be Taylor Landry. Landry missed last season due to injury and saw some time in the offseason as a middie, but really excelled on the defensive end.

New Additions for 2012

On top of adding new assistant coach Sarah Jonson to the staff in the offseason, the Virginia Tech lacrosse team has welcomed eight freshmen this season in Maddy Hess, Cawley Bromley, Jack Boissonneault, Ann Wallace Tazewell, Meg Bartley, Rachel Skay, Caroline Boucher and Megan Will. The class represents six different states, with only two players hailing from the same state, as well as Canada.
