After a historic win over No. 7 Virginia over the weekend, the Hokies will look to keep things rolling this week as they hit the road for their final two games before the conference tournament. Tech travels to Longwood for its second night game of the year, before wrapping up conference play at No. 4 Maryland.

Series Info: Longwood

Tech is 5-2 all-time against the Lancers and 2-2 in Farmville since the two teams first met in 2004. The Hokies topped Longwood 12-9 at home last season and have won the last five meetings.

Scouting Report: Longwood

The Lancers enter the midweek game on more than a week's rest and sit at 1-8 on the season. They are in the midst of a five game losing streak that most recently saw them fall 21-17 to Detroit Mercy.

Jessica Rudloff and Jamie Brentlinger have paced the offense this season for Longwood as each has scored 16 goals and assisted two more. Kathleen Battle has led the defensive efforts, tallying 29 ground balls and 13 caused turnovers thus far. Boasting the team's record, Mollie Zimmerman has manned the goal and made 84 saves, good for a .357 percentage.

Series Info: Maryland

The Hokies have never beaten Maryland in eight attempts. The two teams first met in 2003, which was the only time they battled at non-conference opponents. Tech fell to the Terps last season, 16-8, in a game that was played in Rector Fieldhouse due to weather.

Scouting Report: Maryland

The Terps will play at Princeton on Wednesday before hosting the Hokies, but enter the week at 11-3 on the year, 2-2 in the ACC. They recently ended a six-game winning streak with a loss at No. 4 North Carolina, 14-11, this past weekend. Maryland's only other losses this season have come to nationally-ranked Duke and Syracuse.

Katie Schwarzmann has led the Terps this season with 44 goals and eight assists, while Alex Aust is close behind with 27 goals and 25 assists. Iliana Sanza has paced the defense with 26 ground balls and 21 caused turnovers. In goal for the Terps has been Brittany Dipper, who has made 92 stops, good for a .495 percentage.

Player Spotlight

Jessica Nonn • Sr. • Midfield • Catonsville, Md.

Senior leader Jessica Nonn had arguably the best game of her career last weekend as Tech took down No. 7 Virginia 10-9 in overtime. Nonn tied the game at 8-8 with 5:48 left in regulation and put away the go-ahead goal inside two minutes remaining. Despite Virginia tying the game with 30 second left, Nonn didn't let her team get down and continued to fight. With 2:11 remaining in overtime Nonn worked her way through the Virginia defense for an open look, and snuck the eventual game-winner into the cage.

The middle was awarded numerous weekly honors for her outstanding performance, including her first ever ACC Offensive Player of the Week accolade.

History Made Topping No. 7 'Hoos

The Hokies downed their in-state rival No. 7 Virginia last weekend, 10-9 in overtime for the first time in program history. The win gives Tech its first win over a top-10 team, while it also marks the second straight season the Hokies have knocked off a ranked conference opponent.

Even play and long possessions themed regulation, as neither team led by more than two goals at any point. It was the late heroics of senior middle Jessica Nonn that kept Tech alive. She scored the final three goals of the game for Tech, including the overtime game-winner.

This was Tech's first overtime game since the 2009 season and its third straight win in extra time.

Nonn Honored for Top Performance

Senior leader Jessica Nonn was honored for her performance against No. 7 Virginia. After scoring the eventual game-winning goal, as well as the final two Tech goals of regulation, Nonn earned various weekly honors. She was named ACC Offensive Player of the Week as well as Synapse Sports Offensive Player of the Week, WomensLax.com Player of the Week and Virginia Tech Hardees Star of the Week.

Tech Against The Best

As a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference, the Hokies have the opportunity to face numerous ranked teams every season.

Tech is 5-68 all-time against ranked

teams, as it recently upped that record with a historic, 10-9 overtime win over in-state rival Virginia. The Cavaliers were ranked seventh in the country last week. The win was Tech's first ever over a top-10 team.

The Hokies faced back-to-back ranked conference opponents last week for the second time in the season and faced then-No. 13 James Madison in non-conference play. This week, Tech wraps up conference play by traveling to No. 4 Maryland.

Leading the Way

Captaining the Hokies in 2012 are seniors Shannon Bone, Jessica Nonn and Julie Wolfinger. The trio earned team captain honors before the year began and will look to lead their team in their final season.

The three players have combined to start 130 games, scoring 130 goals and assisting on 32 more. On the defensive end, they have scooped up 233 ground balls and caused 131 turnovers through their three previous seasons.

Nonn Spearheads Veteran Midfield

Already a dominant player on the field, senior Jessica Nonn has extended her takeover this season to Tech's record books. While the Catonsville, Md., leads the team in every statistical category, she also ranks among the all-time best at Tech in all categories except assists.

Nonn holds the No. 2 spot in caused turnovers and a third-place ranking in ground balls, draw controls and goals. She also sits at fifth in points.

The senior has scored in 12 of the 13 games so far this season. She ranks second in the ACC causing 1.31 turnovers per game and averaging 3.38 draws.

Gale in Goal

Junior Alex Gale remains as the starter in the cage for the Hokies, which makes it her third season as the primary goalkeeper. The Cicero, N.Y., native has made 63 saves so far this season, including at least six in each of the last three games.

Despite the loss, Gale came up big against William & Mary, blocking all four free position attempts in the game. More recently, Gale allowed just one goal in the first half at Mt. St. Mary's and came up big for her team, especially in the closing minutes to help seal a 13-12 win at Old Dominion.

Widlake Adds to Powerful Midfield

Senior Morgan Widlake adds greatly to the depth and experience in an already veteran midfield for the Hokies. Widlake has been a staple in the starting line-up since arriving at Tech three seasons ago and has been a force on both end of the field.

The Catonsville, Md., native ranks fifth in the conference as she averages 1.08 caused turnovers per game. Widlake is also second on the team with 14 caused turnovers, as well as third with 17 ground balls and 30 draws.

Freshmen Megan Will, Jack Boissonneault and Meg Bartley have come on strong early in their collegiate careers. The trio of newcomers have combined to score 48 goals, assist 14 more and scoop up 30 ground balls through 13 games.

Will has missed just two starts in her career and is second on the team with 23 goals this season. Boissonneault has grabbed 14 ground balls and has tallied 13 points. Bartley has earned at least one point in six of Tech's last eight games, while also dominating the draw.

Back Where They Belong

Juniors Brooke Martin and Libby Rosebro have both transitioned back to their original positions this season and have proven they are happy to be back. Rosebro contributed greatly on defense last season but has rejoined the midfield this year due to her offensive success in the off-season. The Richmond, Va., native has tallied 14 points, 13 ground balls and eight caused turnovers on the year. Martin rejoins the attack this season from the midfield last year. Through ten games, she has tallied 19 goals and 24 points, including an impressive six-goal outing against High Point.

Protecting the Cage

The Tech defense has a much different look in 2012. Senior captain Julie Wolfinger spearheads the newly constructed unit and she is joined by junior Charlotte Marsh, redshirt freshman Taylor Landry and redshirt junior Chirstina Patten, who both missed last season due to injury. Relieving the starting crew has been freshman Ann Wallace Tazewell.

Thirteen games into the season, the unit is stronger than ever, tallying 35 ground balls and 26 caused turnovers collectively.

Fresh Start

All eight of the team's freshmen saw action in the season-opening win over Presbyterian College, while newcomer Megan Will also started the game. Will led all newcomers with three points in the game as she buried the first three goals of her career. Also earning their first points were Jack Boissonneault (2g), Maddy Hess (1g, 1a), Rachel Skay (1g), Cawley Bromley (1a) and Meg Bartley (1a).

Changing Things Around

Tech will see a number of players switch positions this season or return to positions they previously played. Junior Libby Rosebro spent much of last season on the defensive end but will return to the midfield this year after emerging as an offensive threat in the offseason. Senior leader Shannon Bone, who has served as somewhat of a utility player for the Hokies and also saw a lot of time on the defensive end last year, will also reposition herself into the midfield.

Junior Brooke Martin will move out of the midfield, where she gave the Hokies great minutes off the bench last season and get back to her original position on attack. Also moving out of the midfield will be Taylor Landry. Landry missed last season due to injury and saw some time in the offseason as a middle, but really excelled on the defensive end.

New Additions for 2012

On top of adding new assistant coach Sarah Jonson to the staff in the offseason, the Virginia Tech lacrosse team has welcomed eight freshmen this season in Maddy Hess, Cawley Bromley, Jack Boissonneault, Ann Wallace Tazewell, Meg Bartley, Rachel Skay, Caroline Boucher and Megan Will. The class represents six different states, with only two players hailing from the same state, as well as Canada.
