All Time vs. Liberty: 2-0 · At VT: 1-0 · At Liberty: 1-0 · Neutral: 0-0 Notes: The Hokies have never lost to Liberty and will look to keep the winning streak going in the midweek contest ... Tech defeated the Flames 18-2 in the only meeting thus far in Lynchburg in 2011, and outed them 13-8 a season ago in Blacksburg ... Current volunteer assistant Ryan Rotanz led the Hokies in last year's win with four goals, while 2013 senior captain Brooke Martin added three scores ... The trip to Lynchburg is Tech's shortest of the season.

Scouting Liberty

The Flames have a busy week this week as they already played on Monday, will host the Hokies Wednesday, and return to action Friday. Liberty is coming off an 8-6 win over Big South foe Campbell Monday afternoon to move to 1-1 in conference play. The Flames are the fourth of five Big South teams that Tech has already faced this season, as it has already traveled to High Point, Davidson and Coastal Carolina, and will round out the group welcoming Longwood to Blacksburg next week.

Leading the charge for Liberty this season has been Morgan Becker with 19 goals, while Sam Struss leads the team with 27 points, byway of 17 assists and 10 goals. On the defensive end, Jen Freymond has grabbed 35 ground balls this season and caused 19 turnovers. In cage for the Flames has been Kristen Masullo, who has made 91 saves, good for a .503 percentage while also boasting the team's record.

Last Time Out

The Hokies battled No. 3 North Carolina at Thompson Field last weekend, but the Tar Heels pulled away in the second half and took the conference game, 18-11. The two teams traded goals and leads to begin the game, but back-to-back goals from Brooke Martin sparked a four-goal run for Tech. The run midway through the half put the Hokies up 6-3 and forced a North Carolina timeout.

The Tar Heels responded after the regrouping and scored six straight goals to regain the lead, but Tech only trailed 9-7 at the half. The second half began with a 6-1 North Carolina run to create some distance for the Tar Heels.

The loss halted a three-game winning streak for the Hokies, but the 11 goals Tech put up on the Heels overpowered a strong defense that only allowed just under eight goals entering the game. The total also matched the most goals Carolina has allowed all year.

Up Next

Tech will have the weekend off from games, but it will return to action with a full week of play next week. The Hokies will return home to face Longwood midweek, before their first-ever meeting with Delaware State on Saturday, April 13.

Controlling the Draw

The Hokies as a team have dominated the draw this season, winning 145 so far, while their opponent has only won 119. Sophomore Meg Bartley leads the league averaging 5.00 per game, while the team sits at fourth in the conference with 13.18 per game.

Offensive Charge

The Hokies are among the top teams in the conference in offensive production, trailing only Maryland and Duke averaging 4.82 assists and 16.45 points per game. Tech sits at fourth in the league in scoring, averaging 11.64 goals per game, just behind North Carolina which scores 12.33 goals per outing. The Hokie attacked had a great outing against the No. 3 Tar Heels last weekend, matching the most goals the Heels have allowed this season with 11.

Showing great efficiency, the Hokies have earned their fourthplace ranking while taking the fewest shots per game among league teams.

Veteran Experience

Tech returneds a wealth of experience this season as it welcomes back 12 seniors. As a class, these veterans have been an integral part of the transition the program has recently made. They have helped lead their squad to back-to-back winning seasons for the first time in over 10 years. They have also assisted in taking down ranked conference opponents in back-to-back years, topping then-No. 16 Boston College in 2011 and then-No. 7 Virginia in 2012.

Against The Best

Being in the Atlantic Coast Conference, the Hokies play a plethora of the nation's best teams and players on a weekly basis. Having already taken on No. 7/6 Duke, now ranked James Madison and No. 20 Boston College, Tech hosted No. 3/3 North Carolina last weekend.

Although Tech is just 5-74 against ranked opponents, the Hokies have knocked off two ranked opponents in the last two seasons, earning their first-ever defeat of a top-10 foe when they topped then-No. 7 Virginia last year.

Record Watch

Senior Alex Gale is one of just two current players on Tech's roster to rank amongst the all-time best in career stats, as she sits in fifth place at Tech with 360 career saves.

Sophomore Meg Bartley has already broken into the all-time top 10, sitting in seventh place with 98 career draws. She has also made her second notch on the single-seasons draw list, ranking

sixth with 55 so far this year.

Senior Julia Heaps is on the brim of cracking into the top-10 at Tech as she has 27 career assists, needing just eight more, while sophomore Megan Will is 10 goals away from breaking into the single-season scoring list with 27 goals already.

Strong Conference

The Atlantic Coast Conference has made a name for itself as a strong lacrosse conference. This season, five teams entered the year ranking in the top 20 of both the IWLCA Poll and the deBeer Media Poll. Maryland and North Carolina currently hold the No. 1 and 3 spots in both polls, while Duke and Virginia help round out the top 10 in each.

Will to be the Best

Sophomore Megan Will has scored in seven of the team's nine games so far this season, putting away at least two goals in each of those outings. She leads the team in scoring with 27 goals so far this year, including a six-goal performance at UC Davis and a pair of four-goal outings at Davidson and against Old Dominion. Will was named Virginia Tech Athlete of the Week this week after putting away six goals at Davis and adding three more at Cal.

The Bel Air, Md., native currently ranks eight in the league averaging 3.09 points per game. Her six goals against UC Davis matches the second best total among league players this season.

Gale in Goal

Senior goalie Alex Gale has been the primary starter in cage since her arrival in 2010. Her 348 career saves lands her in fifth place all-time Tech. The Cicero, N.Y., native's 12 saves at No. 7 Duke to begin the season and last weekend against No. 3 North Carolina stand as second-best single-game high througout the ACC this season.

Gale currently ranks second in the league with 6.64 saves per game and seventh with a .422 save percentage.

Right Back to Business

Senior Brooke Martin returns great experience to the Hokie attack and midfield this year. She has played in every game since arriving on campus four years ago and is the only player on the team that has scored in every game this season. The Hunt Valley, Md., native ranks second on the team with 26 goals this year and ninth in the league, averaging 2.36 goals per game.

Bartley, an Unexpected Surprise

Sophomore Meg Bartley walked on to the Tech lacrosse team in the Fall of 2011 and as the 2012 season began she made a quick and

efficient impact. The Lewes, Del., native earned a starting job on attack by the fifth game, after scoring four goals and assisting another against UC Davis at home.

Bartley has been a huge threat for the Hokies on the draw and currently leads the league while also ranking 11th in the nation, averaging 5.00 draws per game. She has also scored a goal in each of the last eight games.

True Team Player

Senior Libby Rosebro has been a team-first player for the Hokies over the years. She has started and played in every game since the beginning of her sophomore outing. The middie made the transition to defense as sophomore to add game-experience but is currently surging on the offensive end. The Richmond, Va., native had scored at least one goal in nine of the last ten games and had an assist in seven of the last nine. She posted a career-best five points against James Madison and ranks third on the team with 27points.

Back in Action

After missing much of last season due to injury, Julia Heaps has returned not only to the field but to her old ways. The Street, Md., native had her coming out at Davidson this season after a 2-goal, 3-assist performance against the Wildcats.

Fresh Meat

Freshman Jessi Thon earend a starting spot to begin her collegiate career and has made an impact for the Hokies early. She is currently fifth amongst league players, averaging 1.82 ground balls per game.

Joining her in the starting line up has been classmate Meghan Macera, who is second on the team, winning 24 draws so far this year.

Determined Defense

The Tech defense has been a strong force this season. Anchored by redshirt senior Christina Patten, seniors Charlotte Marsh and Kristin

Semones and sophomore Ann Wallace Tazewell as well as senior goalie Alex Gale make up the threatening unit. Patten is tied for third among ACC players with 1.27 caused turnovers per game. As a group, they have been a key piece in holding eight of Tech's 11 opponents so far this year to single-digit scoring, while combining to grab 68 ground balls and cause 34 turnovers.

Big off the Bench

Junior attacker Kelly Naslonski earned the first start of her career last weekend and did not disappoint. Naslonski has give Tech great production off the bench this season, putting up at least two points in five of the eight games she has played in, including two 4-point performances. Against No. 3 North Carolina last weekend, the East Setauket, N.Y., native scored two goals and assisted another.

Progressing Program

The Virginia Tech lacrosse team has seen a steady momentum shift over the past few seasons. Since former assistant Megan Burker took over as head coach the Hokies have put together back-to-back 10-win seasons for the first time in program history while also knocking off ranked conference opponenets in back-to-back years. Tech earned its best ACC finish in 2011 when a tiebreak awarded the Hokies the three-seed in the annual ACC Tournament. Tech also set a new program best in 2012 when it finished the year with a 7-2 record at Thompson Field.

Senior Leaders

Captaining the Hokies this season will be seniors Libby Rosebro, Brooke Martin, Julia Heaps and Christina Patten. All four bring a wealth of on-field experience. Entering the season they have combined to play in 190 games and make 137 start, even with Heaps being sidelined for much of last season due to injury and Patten suffering a torn Achilles causing her to miss 2011.
