

Scouting Longwood

Longwood enters the midweek game sitting at 8-5 on the year, 3-2 in the Big South. Most recently, the Lancers claimed a 21-8 win over Coastal Carolina last Friday. Lauren Prasnicki leads the team in points and assists with 55 and 34, respectively. Jamie Brentlinger has led the attack this year and has scored 34 goals on the season.

Kathleen Battle has spearheaded the defensive unit this season scopping up 30 ground balls and causing 20 turnovers. In cage for the Lancers has been Christian Acker, who boasts a 6-5 record and a .410 save percentage.

Scouting Delaware State

The Hornets enter the weekend at 0-10 on the year, coming off of a 14-2 loss at home to Colgate on Sunday. Leading the offensive charge has been Emily Peets with eight goals this year, while also pacing the squad winning 19 draws. Kirkland Lewis leads the team with 22 ground balls while she has also caused eight turnovers.

Splitting time in cage this season has been Lewis as well as Rhian Sellers, both hold an 0-5 record.

Up Next

The Hokies will wrap up the regular season next week, as well as conference play. Tech will head to in-state rival Virginia on Wednesday for a 7 p.m. game. The Hokies will return home for Senior Day, honoring the team's 12 seniors before facing No. 1 Maryland.

Controlling the Draw

The Hokies as a team have dominated the draw this season, winning 154 so far, while their opponent has only won 133. Sophomore Meg Bartley leads the league averaging 5.00 per game, while the team is tied for fourth in the conference with 12.83 per game.

Running with the Best

The Hokies are among the top teams in the conference in offensive production, trailing only Maryland and Duke averaging 4.83 assists and 16.75 points per game. Tech sits at fourth in the league in scoring, averaging 11.92 goals per game, just behind North Carolina.

On the defensive end, the Hokies lead the league averaging 15.25 ground balls per game. Tech is tied for fourth in the ACC winning 12.83 draws per game, and two Hokies lead the league in their respective categories as Meg Bartley averages 5.00 draws per game and Christina Patten causes 1.42 turnovers per game.

Veteran Experience

Tech returneds a wealth of experience this season as it welcomes back 12 seniors. As a class, these veterans have been an integral part of the transition the program has recently made. They have helped lead their squad to back-to-back winning seasons for the first time in over 10 years. They have also assisted in taking down ranked conference opponents in back-to-back years, topping then-No. 16 Boston College in 2011 and then-No. 7 Virginia in 2012.

Against The Best

Being in the Atlantic Coast Conference, the Hokies play a plethora of the nation's best teams and players on a weekly basis. Having already taken on No. 7/6 Duke, No. 20 Boston College and No. 3/3 North Carolina. Next week Tech will close out the regular season with top-20 Virginia and No. 1 Maryland.

Although Tech is just 5-74 against ranked opponents, the Hokies have knocked off two ranked opponents in the last two seasons, earning their first-ever defeat of a top-10 foe when they topped then-No. 7 Virginia last year.

Record Watch

Senior Alex Gale is one of just two current players on Tech's roster to rank amongst the all-time best in career stats, as she sits in fifth place at Tech with 360 career saves.

Sophomore Meg Bartley has already broken into the all-time top 10, sitting in seventh place with 103 career draws. She has also made her second notch on the single-seasons draw list, ranking sixth with 60 so far this year.

Senior Julia Heaps is on the brim of cracking into the top-10 at Tech as she has 29 career assists, needing just six more, while sophomore Megan Will is five goals away from breaking into the single-season scoring list with 32 goals already.

Strong Conference

The Atlantic Coast Conference has made a name for itself as a strong lacrosse conference. This season, five teams entered the year ranking in the top 20 of both the IWLCA Poll and the deBeer Media Poll. Maryland has held the top spot in both polls all season, while North Carolina currently holds the No. 2 spot in the coaches' poll and No. 3 in the media poll. Virginia and Duke help round out the top 11 in the IWLCA Coache's poll while also ranking in the media poll, and Boston College has rejoined the ranks after upsetting the Blue Devils last week, holding the No. 19 spot in the coaches' poll and No. 17 spot in the media poll.

Will to be the Best

Sophomore Megan Will has scored in nine of the team's 12 games so far this season, putting away at least two goals in each of those outings. She leads the team in scoring with 32 goals so far this year, including a six-goal performance at UC Davis and a pair of four-goal outings at Davidson and against Old Dominion. Last week Will talied her second, six-point game of the year when she scored five goals and assisted another at Liberty. Will was named Virginia Tech Athlete of the Week this week after putting away six goals at Davis and adding three more at Cal.

The Bel Air, Md., native is currently seventh in the league averaging 3.33 points per game, while she is also tied for sixth with 2.67 goals per game. Her six goals against UC Davis matches the second best total among league players this season.

Gale in Goal

Senior goalie Alex Gale has been the primary starter in cage since her arrival in 2010. Her 348 career saves lands her in fifth place all-time Tech. The Cicero, N.Y., native's 12 saves at No. 7 Duke to begin the season and last weekend against No. 3 North Carolina stand as second-best single-game high througout the ACC this season.

Gale currently ranks third in the league with 6.08 saves per game.

Right Back to Business

Senior Brooke Martin returns great experience to the Hokie attack and midfield this year. She has played in every game since arriving on campus four years ago and is the only player on the team that has scored in every game this season. The Hunt Valley,

Md., native ranks second on the team with 26 goals this year and ninth in the league, averaging 2.36 goals per game.

Bartley, an Unexpected Surprise

Sophomore Meg Bartley walked on to the Tech lacrosse team in the Fall of 2011 and as the 2012 season began she made a quick and efficient impact. The Lewes, Del., native earned a starting job on attack by the fifth game, after scoring four goals and assisting another against UC Davis at home.

Bartley has been a huge threat for the Hokies on the draw and currently leads the league while also ranking 12th in the nation, averaging 5.00 draws per game.

True Team Player

Senior Libby Rosebro has been a team-first player for the Hokies over the years. She has started and played in every game since the beginning of her sophomore outing. The middie made the transition to defense as sophomore to add game-experience but is currently surging on the offensive end. The Richmond, Va., native had scored at least one goal in ten of the last 11 games. She posted a career-best five points against James Madison and ranks third on the team with 27points.

Back in Action

After missing much of last season due to injury, Julia Heaps has returned not only to the field but to her old ways. The Street, Md., native had her coming out at Davidson this season after a 2-goal, 3-assist performance against the Wildcats.

Fresh Meat

Freshman Jessi Thon earend a starting spot to begin her collegiate career and has made an impact for the Hokies early. She is currently fourth amongst league players, averaging 1.83 ground balls per game.

Joining her in the starting line up has been classmate Meghan Macera, who is second on the team, winning 24 draws so far this year.

Determined Defense

The Tech defense has been a strong force this season. Anchored by redshirt senior Christina Patten, seniors Charlotte Marsh and Kristin Semones and sophomore Ann Wallace Tazewell as well as senior goalie Alex Gale make up the threatening unit. Patten leads the conference with 1.42 caused turnovers per game. As a group, they have been a key piece in holding nine of Tech's 12 opponents so far this year to single-digit scoring, while combining to grab 69 ground balls and cause 39 turnovers.

Big off the Bench

Junior attacker Kelly Naslonski earned the first start of her career against North Carolina and did not disappoint. Naslonski has given Tech great production off the bench this season, putting up at least two points in five of the nine games she has played in, including two 4-point performances. Against No. 3 North Carolina last weekend, the East Setauket, N.Y., native scored two goals and assisted another.

Progressing Program

The Virginia Tech lacrosse team has seen a steady momentum shift over the past few seasons. Since former assistant Megan Burker took over as head coach the Hokies have put together back-to-back 10-win seasons for the first time in program history while also knocking off ranked conference opponenets in back-to-back years. Tech earned its best ACC finish in 2011 when a tiebreak awarded the Hokies the three-seed in the annual ACC Tournament. Tech also set a new program best in 2012 when it finished the year with a 7-2 record at Thompson Field.
