Scouting Virginia

The Cavaliers enter the midweek game at 7-8 on the year, 0-4 in the ACC, while boasting the No. 16 ranking in the country. They are coming off of back-to-back losses at home last week, falling most recently to Johns Hopkins, 9-8. Wednesday will be Senior Night for the Cavaliers, who are just 2-5 this year at home.

Casey Bocklet leads the Virginia attack this year with 31 goals and 17 assists, while Ashlee Warner isn't far behind with 29 goals and 16 assists. On the defensive end, Courtney Swan has grabbed 20 ground balls and caused 12 turnovers, while also winning 56 draws.

In cage for the Cavaliers has been Liz Colgan, who has started the last seven games and holds a 3-4 record as well as a .458 save percentage.

Scouting Maryland

Maryland will arrive in Blacksburg looking to finish the regular season without a loss, sitting at 16-0 on the year and 4-0 in conference play. The Terps last played on Sunday and topped Dartmouth, 17-8 on the Senior Day.

Alex Aust, this week's ACC Offensive Player of the Week, leads the Terps with 53 goals and 43 assists this year, while also adding 20 ground balls and 14 caused turnovers. Katie Schwarzmann has also helped lead the charge for Maryland, putting away 46 goals, assisting 18 more, also causing 14 turnovers. Taylor Cummings has dominated the draw for the Terps, winning 73.

In goal for Maryland will be this week's ACC Defensive Player of the Week Kasey Howard. Howard boasts an 8.48 GAA as well as a .443 save percentage, making 98 stops.

ACC Tournament

This week will conclude league play around the Atlantic Coast Conference. The conference tournament will be held at North Carolina in Chapel Hill and begin on Thursday, April 25 with two quarterfinal games at 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. Play will continue Friday, April 26 with semifinal games at 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. The tournament will conclude Sunday, April 28 with the championship game at 5 p.m. The men's tournament will also be hosted by the Tar Heels the same weekend.

Seeding for the tournament will be released following the Tech-Maryland game Saturday afternoon.

Running with the Best

The Hokies are among the top teams in the conference in offensive production, trailing only Maryland and Duke averaging 17.15 points per game.

On the defensive end, the Hokies are second in the league averaging 15.69 ground balls per game. Two Hokies lead the league in their respective categories as Meg Bartley averages 4.92 draws per game and Christina Patten causes 1.62 turnovers per game. Bartley is the only Hokie to rank nationally as her draws average puts her at 12th in the country.

Veteran Experience

Tech returned a wealth of experience this season as it welcomes back 12 seniors. As a class, these veterans have been an integral part of the transition the program has recently made. They have helped lead their squad to back-to-back winning seasons for the first time in over 10 years. They have also assisted in taking down ranked conference opponents in back-to-back years, topping then-No. 16 Boston College in 2011 and then-No. 7 Virginia in 2012.

Against The Best

Being in the Atlantic Coast Conference, the Hokies play a plethora of the nation's best teams and players on a weekly basis. Having already taken on No. 7/6 Duke, No. 20 Boston College and No. 3/3 North Carolina. Tech wraps up the regular season this week traveling to No. 16 Virginia and later hosting No. 1 Maryland.

Although Tech is just 5-74 against ranked opponents, the Hokies have knocked off two ranked opponents in the last two seasons, earning their first-ever defeat of a top-10 foe when they topped then-No. 7 Virginia last year.

Record Watch

Senior Alex Gale is one of just two current players on Tech's roster to rank amongst the all-time best in career stats, as she sits in fifth place at Tech with 360 career saves.

Sophomore Meg Bartley has already broken into the all-time top 10, and is tied for sixth place with 107 career draws. She has also made her second notch on the single-seasons draw list, ranking second with 64 so far this year.

Redshirt junior Julia Heaps is on the brim of cracking into the top-10 at Tech as she has 30 career assists, needing just five more, while senior Brooke Martin needs just six goals to join the single-season scoring list and redshirt senior Christina Patten needs to cause just three turnovers to join the single-season ranks.

Sophomore Megan Will's 38 goals so far has already tied her for ninth on Tech's single-season list.

Strong Conference

The Atlantic Coast Conference has made a name for itself as a strong lacrosse conference. This season, five teams entered the year ranking in the top 20 of both the IWCA Poll and the deBeer Media Poll. Maryland is still holding down the top spot in both polls, while North Carolina second in the coaches' poll and third in the media. Duke rounds out the top 10, ranking ninth in both polls, while Boston College and Virginia still remain in the top 20.

Will to be the Best

Sophomore Megan Will has scored in ten of the team's 13 games so far this season, putting away at least two goals in each of those outings. She leads the team in scoring with 38 goals so far this year, including a pair of six-goal performances, at UC Davis and against Longwood. Last week Will set a new career high when she put away six goals and added two assists against the Lancers. Will was named Virginia Tech Athlete of the Week this week after putting away six goals at Davis and adding three more at Cal.

The Bel Air, Md., native is currently third in the ACC averaging 2.92 goals per game and 3.69 points per game.

Gale in Goal

Senior goalie Alex Gale has been the primary starter in cage since her arrival in 2010. Her 360 career saves lands her in fifth place all-time Tech. The Cicero, N.Y., native has notched a pair of 12-save games this season, at No. 7 Duke and against No. 3 North Carolina.

Gale currently ranks third in the league with 6.08 saves per game, 9.96 goals against and a .403 save percentage.

Right Back to Business

Senior Brooke Martin returns great experience to the Hokie attack and midfield this year. She has played in every game since arriving on campus four years ago and is the only player on the team that has scored in every game this season. The Hunt Valley,

Md., native ranks second on the team with 31 goals this year and eighth in the league, averaging 2.38 goals per game.

Bartley, an Unexpected Surprise

Sophomore Meg Bartley walked on to the Tech lacrosse team in the Fall of 2011 and as the 2012 season began she made a quick and efficient impact. The Lewes, Del., native earned a starting job on attack by the fifth game, after scoring four goals and assisting another against UC Davis at home.

Bartley has been a huge threat for the Hokies on the draw and currently leads the league while also ranking 12th in the nation, averaging 4.92 draws per game.

True Team Player

Senior Libby Rosebro has been a team-first player for the Hokies over the years. She has started and played in every game since the beginning of her sophomore outing. The middle made the transition to defense as sophomore to add game-experience but is currently surging on the offensive end. The Richmond, Va., native had scored at least one goal in ten of the last 12 games. She posted a career-best five points against James Madison and ranks third on the team with 27 points.

Back in Action

After missing much of last season due to injury, Julia Heaps has returned not only to the field but to her old ways. The Street, Md., native had her coming out at Davidson this season after a 2-goal, 3-assist performance against the Wildcats.

Fresh Meat

Freshman Jessi Thon earned a starting spot to begin her collegiate career and has made an impact for the Hokies early. She is currently third amongst league players, averaging 1.69 ground balls per game.

Joining her in the starting line up for much of the year has been classmate Meghan Macera, who ranks eighth in the league, winning 2.08

draws per game.

Determined Defense

The Tech defense has been a strong force this season. Anchored by redshirt senior Christina Patten, seniors Charlotte Marsh and Kristin Semones and sophomore Ann Wallace Tazewell as well as senior goalie Alex Gale make up the threatening unit. Patten leads the conference with 1.62 caused turnovers per game and was named Tech's Hardee's Star of the Week this week after causing four turnovers against Longwood and adding an assist.

As a group, they have been a key piece in holding ten of Tech's 13 opponents so far this year to single-digit scoring, while combining to grab 80 ground balls and cause 48 turnovers.

Big off the Bench

Junior attacker Kelly Naslonski earned the first start of her career against North Carolina and did not disappoint. Naslonski has given Tech great production off the bench this season, putting up at least two points in six of the last seven games, including two 4-point performances. Against No. 3 North Carolina the East Setauket, N.Y., native scored two goals and assisted another.

Progressing Program

The Virginia Tech lacrosse team has seen a steady momentum shift over the past few seasons. Since former assistant Megan Burkner took over as head coach the Hokies have put together back-to-back 10-win seasons for the first time in program history while also knocking off ranked conference opponenets in back-to-back years. Tech earned its best ACC finish in 2011 when a tiebreak awarded the Hokies the three-seed in the annual ACC Tournament. Tech also set a new program best in 2012 when it finished the year with a 7-2 record at Thompson Field.

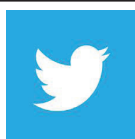
