Entering Tonight's Game

The Hokies enter tonight's game with a 19-10 overall record and are 9-7 in ACC action ... Georgia Tech is 13-17 on the season and 5-11 in conference action ... The Hokies are the sixth seed in the tournament and the Yellow Jackets are the 11th seed.

Last Time Out: Clemson 69, Virginia Tech 60

The Hokies lost at Clemson, 69-60, in the regular season finale on Saturday afternoon ... Malcolm Delaney led all scorers with 19 points and Terrell Bell recorded his second double-double of the season with 10 points and 11 rebounds ... The rebounds were even at 35-35, as were the turnovers at 18-18, but Tech shot just 30.5 percent from the field.

We Are Honored

Two Virginia Tech players have earned All-ACC honors this season ... Malcolm Delaney was first-team All-ACC selection for the second consecutive season, as selected by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association ... He was a third team selection as a sophomore ... Jeff Allen was named to the league's second-team ... Delaney is the first Hokie to be named to the first team twice.

Ty is also Honored

Tyrone Garland has been named to the 2011 All-ACC Academic team for men's basketball ... The freshman guard from Philadelphia is one of 13 players on the team.

Heading to The Gate City

Virginia Tech will make its seventh appearance in the ACC Tournament this week in Greensboro, N.C. ... Tech finished the regular season 19-10 overall and 9-7 in ACC action ... Tech finished the regular season in a tie for fourth place with Clemson and Boston College and is the sixth seed in this season's tournament ... Tech will play #11 Georgia Tech in the first round on Thursday ... The winner of that game will play Florida State at 9:30 p.m., on Friday night.

The Hokies in Greensboro

Tech has played in the Greensboro Coliseum 12 times over the years, with a 4-8 record ... Tech is 1-8 all-time in the building against teams currently in the ACC ... Tech's last appearance in the building was on Nov. 21, 2010, when the Hokies defeated UNC Greensboro, 92-70 ... Tech is 0-2 in ACC Tournament games in this arena.

The Series vs. Georgia Tech

This is the 16th meeting between the Hokies and the Yellow Jackets ... Virginia Tech leads the all-time series, 11-4 ... Virginia Tech won the last meeting, 102-77 in Cassell Coliseum on Feb. 13 ... Virginia Tech is 0-1 against Georgia Tech in the ACC Tournament and 0-2 on a neutral court ... The Hokies lost to the Jackets, 73-54, in Virginia Tech's firstever ACC Tournament game in Washington, D.C., in 2005.

Virginia Tech in Conference Tournaments

This will be the seventh ACC Tournament for the Hokies and the eighth-straight conference tournament for the Hokies in Seth Greenberg's eight seasons ... Tech is 3-6 in ACC Tournament action ... The Hokies were 1-1 in the 2004 BIG EAST Tournament in Greenberg's first season in Blacksburg ... The Hokies have a combined 27-46 all-time record in postseason conference tournaments ... Tech is 4-13 all-time against current ACC members in post season conference tournaments.

The ACC Tournament

Virginia Tech makes its seventh appearance in the ACC Tournament ... This is the 58th annual ACC Tournament ... This is the Hokies' third trip to the Greensboro Coliseum for an ACC Tournament ... Greensboro has hosted 23 ACC Tournaments ... The next most-common venue is Reynolds Coliseum in Raleigh (13) ... Of the nine other arenas to host the event, three, the Capital Centre in Landover, Maryland, the Charlotte Coliseum and the Omni in Atlanta, are no longer standing.

The Hokies are 1-1 in ACC first round games since joining the league ... Tech won its last first round game, 65-47, in the 2009 ACC Tournament in the Georgia Dome in Atlanta.

VT at the ACC Tournament

Virginia Tech will abide by all media policies of the Atlantic Coast Conference during the 2011 ACC Tournament ... Virginia Tech will practice in the Greensboro Coliseum from 3:00 - 3:55 p.m. on Wednesday, March 9 ... Following the open practice, Hokie players and coaches will be available to the media for 30 minutes in the locker room area of the Coliseum ... Following this media period, Virginia Tech players will be available to the media only under prior arrangement or in a post-game situation ... For more information, contact **Bill Dyer**, Associate Director of Athletics Communications and the primary men's basketball contact for the Hokies ... Seeding the Hokies

The Hokies are competing in their seventh ACC Tournament ... Tech has received a first round bye in four of the seven events ... Tech was the three-seed once, the four-seed threetimes, the six-seed this season, the eight-seed once and the 10th seed once.

Jeff Allen averaged 21.5 points and 12.5 rebounds per game against Georgia Tech this season.

Malcolm Moving Up

Malcolm Delaney enters tonight's game with 2,162 career points, in 21st place on the all-time ACC list ... He passed Sam Perkins of North Carolina, Len Bias of Maryland and Danny Ferry of Duke in the loss at Clemson ... Delaney is second in career scoring among active ACC players, trailing only Kyle Singler of Duke.

A Bunch of Winners

The Virginia Tech senior class of Jeff Allen, Terrell Bell and Malcolm Delaney have achieved an overall record of 84-48 (.636) ... The winningest senior class in school history was the 1985-86 season senior class, which was 87-42 (.674).

Doubling Up His Game

Jeff Allen's now has 15 double doubles this season and 43 for his career following his 18 point, 15 rebound performance in the win over #1 Duke ... He has scored in double figures in 19 of his last 23 games ... He has recorded double doubles in 13 of his last 21 games ... His streak of seven straight doubledoubles earlier this season was the most consecutive double-doubles for a Hokie since at least 1978.

Going Green

Since entering the starting line-up in the win over Penn State, Erick Green has become one of the most improved players in the ACC ... In the 21 games since he stepped into the starting line-up, Green has had a great assist/

turnover ratio ... In that span, he has 67 assists and just 24 turnovers ... He had 31 assists last season ... Green currently leads the ACC in assist/turnover ratio.

Malcolm Makes It

In the loss at North Carolina, Malcolm Delaney tied a career-high with seven made three-point field goals ... The other time he made seven in a game was in the finals of the 76 Classic, when he was 7-for-9 from beyond the arc ... In the UNC game, seven of his eight made field goals were three-pointers ... The team made a season-high 11 three-pointers at Chapel Hill, including 3-of-4 from Manny Atkins ... Delaney made six three-pointers in the loss at Virginia.

On the Injury Front

The Virginia Tech bench got shorter just before the holidays, as senior guard Dorenzo Hudson and sophomore forward Cadarian Raines were both ruled out for the season due to foot injuries ... Hudson originally injured the foot last season and had difficulties with the injury during the summer and into the current season ... He had successful surgery on the foot on Jan. 17 ... Raines originally had surgery on his left foot last season ... He reinjured the foot at the end of last season and had a second surgery in April, which did not heal as expected ... He has undergone a variety of treatments to aid the healing process ... He will continue to be monitored by the Virginia Tech medical staff to determine the best course of action ... Raines saw limited action this season, but Hudson is third on the team in scoring average, at 10.4 points per game ... Both players are eligible for medical redshirts ... Senior forward, JT Thompson, will miss the 2010-11

season following surgery to repair a torn anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee ... The injury occured during the preseason ... Thompson is expected to be ready to return for next season ... Allan Chaney, a redshirt sophomore forward for the Hokies, has yet to be cleared to return to action following a viral inflammation of the heart ... He will continue to be evaluated by medical staff ... New to the list is Prince Parker, who suffered a sprained right big toe in practice on Feb. 28 ... He will miss the remainder of the season.

High Percentage

In the win at Wake Forest, the Hokies were 8-of-12 from three-point territory, good for 66.7 percent ... That is the highest percentage of the season and the highest for Virginia Tech in an ACC game ... The Hokies are shooting 35.7 percent from three-point range in ACC games this season, up from 29.2 percent last season.

Add One for Malcolm

With his 19 points in the loss to Clemson, Malcolm Delaney finished with 1,137 points in ACC regular season action, tops among current ACC players ... Delaney was the 20th player in ACC history to score 1,000 points in ACC regular season games and currently stands in fifth place on the all-time list ... The only four players ahead of Delaney on that list are J.J. Redick of Duke, Tyler Hansbrough of North Carolina, Bryant Stith of Virginia and Matt Harpring of Georgia Tech.

Allen Honored by ACC Again

Jeff Allen was named the ACC Player of the Week for the week ending Feb. 27 ... Allen scored 17 points and had eight rebounds in the win at Wake Forest on Tuesday and scored 18 points and had 15 rebounds in the win over #1 Duke ... This was the third time this season that Allen has earned the award ... He also was honored on Jan. 10 and Feb. 6 ... This was the fifth time this season that a Virginia Tech player has earned this honor, following Malcolm Delaney on Nov. 29, Allen on Jan. 10 and Feb. 6 and Erick Green on Jan. 24 ... This marked the fourth time in Allen's career that he has garnered this award.

Since Expansion (And Beyond)

Since the ACC expanded to include Virginia Tech and Miami in 2004 (and BC in 2005), the Hokies are fourth in the most conference regular season victories ... Tech is 57-55 in that stretch ... Only Duke (83-29), North Carolina (83-29) and Maryland (60-52) have more wins in that span ... Since the start of the 2006-07 season, the Hokies have the fourth-best victory total in ACC regular season games (45-35 in that span) (as the end of the regular season).

ACC Wins

Virginia Tech's senior class enters today's game with 35 ACC wins ... That is the most ACC wins for a Virginia Tech senior class since entering the ACC in 2004.

Coming Next Year

On Nov. 10, the Hokies announced the signing of four players to National Letters of Intent ... C.J. Barksdale, a 6-8 forward from Danville, Va.: Robert Brown, a 6-5 guard from Clermont, Fla.; Dorian Finney-Smith, a 6-7 forward from Portsmouth, Va.; and Marquis Rankin, a 6-1 guard from Charlotte, N.C. will join the program in the fall of 2011 ... This group has been chosen No. 12 nationally by ESPN.com ... Barksdale, Brown and Rankin are playing this season at Hargrave Military Academy in Chatham, Va.



All By Myself

Jeff Allen is the only active ACC player with 1,600 career points, 1,000 career rebounds and 200 career steals ... He is one blocked shot from becoming the first player in ACC history with 1,500 career points, 1,000 career rebounds, 200 career steals and 150 career blocked shots.

500 in the Cassell

The 2010-11 season marks Tech's 50th season in Cassell Coliseum ... The Hokies have a 506-149 overall record in the Cassell, good for a .773 winning percentage ... Tech was 17-2 in Cassell Coliseum last season and is 11-3 this season ... The win over Florida State in 2008 marked the Hokies' 600th game played in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech defeated Rhode Island, 86-63, on Nov. 20, 2002, in its 500th game in the arena ... Tech has had just one break-even home season and one losing season in Cassell Coliseum ... The 17 victories for the Hokies at home last season set a new Cassell Coliseum and school record.

Victor(y)

In the Hokies' win over #1 Duke, **Victor Davila** recorded his first doubledouble of the season and just his second as a Hokie with 12 points and 10 rebounds ... He had 13 points and 10 rebounds in a win over VMI last season

... This marks the second time this season that Davila has recorded double-figures in rebounds, both against ACC teams.

Another Milestone

In Virginia Tech's win over Penn State, **Seth Greenberg** recorded his 350th victory as a collegiate head coach ... His record in 21 years as a head coach is 364-274 (.571).

Going for 100

Seth Greenberg is 99-30 as a head coach in Cassell Coliseum, good for a winning percentage of .767 ... Greenberg is 58-8 (.879) against non-conference competition in Cassell Coliseum.

The Old 97

In the home win over Georgia Tech, the Hokies' starting five scored 97 points, the team's first 97 points of the game ... That is the second largest number of points nationally for a starting line-up in a non-overtime game this season ... The starting five of Brigham Young scored 102 points in a win over Utah on Jan. 11, 2011.

Perfection

Terrell Bell had one of his best games as a Hokie in the home win over Maryland ... The senior made all five of his shots from the field, all coming from three-point territory, setting a new career-high in three-point field goals made ... He also added eight rebounds, three assists and three steals in the win ... The fiveof-five from three-point range is tied for the best three-point percentage in an ACC game this season.

Malcolm Reaches Another Milestone

Malcolm Delaney scored 17 points in the home loss to Boston College and in doing so, passed Dale Solomon into third place in career scoring at Virginia Tech ... He scored 17 points in the win at Wake Forest and, with it, scored his 2,100th career point ... Delaney now has 2,162 points for his career ... Delaney scored his 1,600th career point in the loss to Rhode Island to end the 2009-10 season ... In doing so, he became the first Hokie junior to accomplish that feat since Bimbo Coles, who ended his junior season with 1,699 points ... Delaney scored his 1,000th career point at Tech in the win at Campbell in 2009.

Another Record for Malcolm

When **Malcolm Delaney** made six free throws in the win against Mississippi State in the Bahamas, he set a new Virginia Tech career free throws made record, with 595 ... That breaks Bimbo Coles' old mark of 593 made in a career ... Delaney now has 692 made free throws ... Delaney is also the Hokies' all-time leader in free throw percentage, shooting .847 ... In the home win over Maryland, Delaney grabbed the school record for career free throws attempted ... He now has 817 attempts.

Gimme That

Erick Green leads the Hokies in steals this season with 47 swipes ... He had only 17 total steals all of last season ... He is currently fourth in the ACC in steals and had four steals in the loss at Clemson.

The Hokies vs. No. 1

With the win over #1 Duke this season, Virginia Tech is now 4-7 all-time against the No. 1-ranked team in the AP poll ... Tech is 3-3 in such games since joining the ACC and is 3-1 against top-ranked teams at home and in Cassell Coliseum ... The Hokies have won their last two home game against a No. 1 team ... Tech is 1-1 all-time against Duke when the Blue Devils are No. 1.

That's a High Number

In the win at Wake Forest, the Hokies shot 60.0 percent from the field ... That is the highest field goal percentage for the Hokies in an ACC game ... The former school record for an ACC game was 59.5 percent from the floor, which was set in a 73-65 win at Georgia Tech on Jan. 28, 2007 ... Tech is shooting 44.4 percent from the field in ACC games ... Tech shot 40.9 percent in conference games last season ... Tech entered the Penn State game shooting 43.0 percent from the field, a number that has since risen to 45.6 percent ... The Hokies are currently second in the ACC in field goal percentage in conference games.

Big Points

Virginia Tech scored a total of 193 points in back-to-back wins over Georgia Tech and Maryland in Cassell Coliseum this season ... That is its highest point total in consecutive ACC games since joining the league and the most points by a Virginia Tech team in consecutive, non-overtime games against Division I competition since December of 1994, when Tech defeated VMI, 110-75, on Dec. 7 and TCU, 98-84, on Dec. 10 ... Both games were played in Cassell Coliseum ... The last time a Virginia Tech team scored more points in consecutive, non-overtime conference games was in January of 1986, when the Hokies scored 102 points in consecutitve games against Cincinnati and Southern Miss while a member of the Metro Conference ... Both games were on the road.

Win 10

With Virginia Tech's win over Maryland on Feb. 15, it marks the eighth straight season that the Hokies have won at least 10 home games.

Putting in the Time

In the Hokies' home win over Maryland, **Malcolm Delaney** passed Dell Curry to become the all-time leader in minutes played at Virginia Tech ... Delaney now has 4,497 minutes played.

Closing In on Threes Record

Malcolm Delaney enters tonight's game 252-of-697 from three-point range ... The school record for made three-point field goals in a career is 267 by former teammate A.D. Vassallo ... In the loss at Clemson, he broke the school's career record for attempted three-point field goals, previously held by Wally Lancaster at 694.

All five Virginia Tech starters averaged in double figures against Georgia Tech this season.

Big Day for Jeff

Jeff Allen set a new Virginia Tech school record for rebounds in an ACC game, when he grabbed 19 rebounds to go with his 25 points in the Hokies' loss at Boston College last Saturday ... The previous record was 18 rebounds by Coleman Collins in a 67-65 win over #7 Duke in Cassell Coliseum on Feb. 17, 2005 ... Allen's previous high for rebounds in an ACC game was 15 boards against Maryland on Feb. 27, 2010, in Cassell Coliseum.

Rise and Give Me 20

When Malcolm Delaney scored 22 points in the loss at Virginia, it marked the 43rd time in his Virginia Tech career that he has scored at least 20 points in a game ... He achieved that feat once as a freshman and reached that plateau 12 times as a sophomore, including a 37-point performance against Clemson in Cassell Coliseum ... He had an ACC-leading 19 games of 20-or-more points last season, including 10 of the last 12 games and has scored at least 20 points in 11 games this season ... He also has eight career games of 30-or-more points ... His 43, 20-point games in his career is tops among active ACC players ... Jeff Allen has 12, 20-plus point games at Tech, including a 30-point game in the home win over Boston College as a sophomore, three 20-point games last season and three such games this season ... JT Thompson has one such game, and Dorenzo Hudson recorded his first career 20-plus point game with 24 points in the win over VMI last season... Hudson scored 41 points in the overtime win against Seton Hall in Cancun and had 22 points at Miami as a junior ... His 20-point performance in the win over Cal State Northridge was the ninth 20-plus point game of his career ... Erick Green joined the 20-point club in the win at Maryland, with a career-high 24 points and followed that with 20 points in the home win over the Terps ... He scored 21 points in the home loss to Boston College.

The 50th Year of Cassell Coliseum

This season marks the 50th season of Hokie basketball in Cassell Coliseum ... The

first game played in the arena was on January 3, 1962, as the Hokies routed Alabama, 91-67 ... Tech is 506-149 all-time in the



arena and the venue has twice seen the Hokies knock off the No. 1 ranked team ... An interesting side note about the Alabama game, when the arena opened, the seats had yet to be installed and fans sat on the concrete.

SWAT

Victor Davila blocked four shots in the Hokies' loss at Virginia ... That ties his career high and breaks his season-high of three, set earlier this season in back-to-back games against Purdue and Virginia ... The four blocks are the most this season by a Hokie in an ACC game and ties the overall team high this season ... In the loss at Clemson, he blocked three shots and by doing so, tied Coleman Collins' Virginia Tech mark of 20 blocked shots in an ACC season.

Close Games

With the win over #1 Duke, the Hokies are 46-43 under **Seth Greenberg** in games that have been decided in overtime or by five-or-fewer points ... Tech was 8-3 in such games last season and is 4-4 this season.

Scoring More

Virginia Tech defeated Maryland, 91-83, on Feb. 15 ... That marks the most points that Tech has allowed an opponent in a Hokie win in a non-overtime game since Feb. 16, 2010, when Tech defeated #23 Wake Forest, 87-83 ... The last time a Virginia Tech opponent scored more than 83 points in a Tech non-overtime win was Feb. 23, 2008, when Tech defeated Georgia Tech, 92-84, in Cassell Coliseum.

You Can't Have It

In the win at NC State, the Hokies committed just six turnovers, a new seasonlow ... It was the fewest turnovers for Tech in a game since committing just five turnovers against the same Wolfpack on Jan. 31, 2007, in Cassell Coliseum ... The Hokies matched that total of six turnovers in the loss at Boston College, again in the win over #1 Duke and in the home loss to Boston College.

Big on the Boards

In the win at NC State, the Hokies grabbed a season-high 46 rebounds ... It is the most rebounds in a game for the Hokies since grabbing 52 boards in a double-overtime loss to Maryland in Cassell Coliseum on Feb. 27, 2010 ... It is the most rebounds for the Hokies in a regulation game since pulling down 47 rebounds against Wake Forest in Cassell Coliseum on Feb. 16, 2010.

Lights, Camera, Hokies

Tech is 90-88 on television under **Seth Greenberg** ... The Hokies were 11-9 last season on TV and are 13-9 this season ... The Hokies made a school-record 30 appearances in the 2008-09 season and made a thenschool record 26 television appearances the year before.

A Very Few Points

In Virginia Tech's 71-59 victory over Florida State, the Hokies held the Seminoles to just 19 first half points ... That is the fewest points the Hokies have ever allowed an ACC opponent in a half in a regular season game ... The only other time the Hokies have held an ACC team to fewer than 19 points in a half is the 18 points that Wake Forest scored against the Hokies in the second half of Virginia Tech's 71-52 quarterfinal win in the 2007 ACC Tournament in Tampa, Fla.

Hokies vs. Ranked Teams

With the win over #1 Duke, the Hokies are now 11-30 against nationally ranked teams since joining the ACC for the 2004-05 season and 12-34 against nationally ranked teams under **Seth Greenberg** ... Tech is 28-138 all-time against teams ranked in the AP poll and is 1-2 against ranked teams this season ... These numbers are only for teams ranked in the AP poll.

Allen Starts a New List

With his 12 rebounds in the win over Mount St. Mary's, Jeff Allen became the only Hokie in the top 5 at Virginia Tech in career rebounding, steals and blocked shots ... Allen now has 1,072 career rebounds, fourth on the Virginia Tech all-time list, having passed Allan Bristow in the loss at Boston College ... Allen now has 1,648 career points and passed Chris Smith into 14th place on the career scoring list at Virginia Tech in the home loss to Boston College ... Allen passed former teammate Cheick Diakite in the win over Campbell into fifth place in career blocked shots at Virginia Tech, now with 149 ... Allen also has 225 career steals, in fourth place on the Virginia Tech all-time list, having passed Bimbo Coles in the loss at Boston College ... Allen also has 165 career assists at Virginia Tech.

Double, Double-Doubles

In the win over Penn State, **Terrell Bell** scored 13 points and grabbed 10 rebounds, and **Jeff Allen** scored 11 points and grabbed 13 rebounds ... That marked the first time two Hokies recorded double-doubles in the same game since the same two had doubledoubles in Tech's win at Georgia Tech last year ... Allen and **Victor Davila** each recorded double-doubles in the win over #1 Duke.

He has scored in double figures in five of the six (the last five he played) ... In the six games, Delaney is averaging 17.6 points and 3.2 assists.

Step Away From the Line

In the win over Mount St. Mary's, **Malcolm Delaney** did not attempt a free throw ... It marked the first time since Dec. 30, 2009, when he played just one minute in the win over Longwood due to a sprained ankle, that he did not attempt a free throw ... The last time Delaney had not attempted a free throw in a game that he was healthy was on Jan. 4, 2009, at Duke.



Quite a Margin

Virginia Tech defeated Wake Forest, 94-65, in Cassell Coliseum on Jan. 15 ... The 29-point margin of victory is the largest for the Hokies in an ACC game ... It is the largest margin of victory for the Hokies in a conference game (any conference) since a 109-68 (41-point margin) victory over South Carolina in the Metro Conference on Jan. 12, 1985.

Malcolm in Select Company

With his 22 points in the win at NC State, **Malcolm Delaney** joined Bimbo Coles as the only Hokies to record at least 2,000 points, 500 assists and 100 steals in their careers in Blacksburg.

Delaney on Lists

Virginia Tech senior guard, **Malcolm Delaney**, has been named to the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award candidates list ... Delaney is one of two ACC players on the list ... He was also on the Naismith Award mid-season top 30 list and is also one of the 30 members of the John R. Wooden Award Midseason List.

Off the Court Prowess

Here is a quick note to remember about the Hokies ... Since **Seth Greenberg** came to Virginia Tech in 2003, every Hokie that entered his senior season at Tech has gone on to earn his degree.

Tough at the Line

Malcoim Delaney made 14-of-14 from the free throw line in the home win over Maryland ... That marked the 24th time in his career that he has made 10-or-more free throws in a game ... He now has eight games in his career in which he made 10-or-more free throws and was perfect from the line.

A Night for the Record Books

In Virginia Tech's win at NC State on Feb. 2, several career milestones were reached by a couple of Hokies ... Malcolm Delaney became just the fourth player in school history to record 2,000 career points ... He joins Bimbo Coles, Dell Curry and Dale Solomon on that list ... He also became just the third Hokie ever to register 500 career assists, joining Coles and Jamon Gordon on that exclusive list and is one of two players, along with Coles, to record 2,000 points and 500 assists ... Jeff Allen scored his 1,500th career point in the win over the Wolfpack ... He grabbed his 1,000th career rebound in the loss at Boston College ... This marks the second time in school history that two, active teammates have recorded 2,000 points and 1,500 points in the same season ... Dell Curry and Bobby Beecher acheived the same feat in the 1985-86 season.

Top-Flight New Digs

The dream has become a reality ... In August of 2009, the Hokies moved into perhaps the finest practice facility in all of college basketball ... The \$21 million, 50,652 sq. ft., Hahn Hurst Basketball Practice Facility is now home to Virginia Tech basketball ... The main feature of the building is the two-court, 16,609 sq. ft., practice gym ... Spacious and convenient, the gym is equipped with a soft-wall that can be lowered to divide the courts to allow both the men's and the women's team to be able to practice at the same time ... The courts are exact replicas of the main court in Cassell Coliseum, allowing the team to practice on the same surface on which they will play ... The office suite on the second floor features five large offices for the assistants, a conference room and a huge office for the head coach ... A view of the practice courts is available from the head coaches' office, the large reception area and the connecting balcony ... Behind a secured entrance, the facility offers every imaginable feature needed to build a program ... The spacious weight room has the full range of free weights, machines, treadmills, ellipticals and other equipment ... All with a panoramic view of the practice courts ... Adjacent to the weight room is the modern, fully-equipped training room ... This area features two examination rooms, a taping area and hot and cold immersion tubs. The sports medicine staff can handle all aspects of treatment and rehabilitation of injuries from this room ... Across the hall is the equipment room ... This area also opens out into the parking lot, where the team will begin its travel just steps from the locker room ... Speaking of the locker room, the fully-appointed lounge area is outfitted with a sound system, 62" flat screen television, refrigerator and computer workstations ... The complex also features a classroom with video and dry-erase boards ... The locker room itself is spacious, with video screens and large, individual lockers with extra storage space ... Immediately behind the practice gym is a large patio area ... This area will be used for social events and tailgating functions.

Malcolm Delaney is the leader among active ACC players in career assists, with 525.

Welcoming Back the First

In conjunction with the celebration for the 50th year of Cassell Coliseum, the Virginia Tech athletics department welcomed back members of the 1961-62 Hokies' men's basketball team for the Florida State game ... These men were on the first team to play a game in Cassell Coliseum, a 92-67 victory over Alabama on Jan. 3, 1962 ... The Hokies' win over the Seminoles was the 500th Virginia Tech vicory all-time in Cassell Coliseum.

And That Makes Six

In Virginia Tech's win at home against Wake Forest, six Hokies scored in double figures ... That marks the first time since Nov. 28, 1995, that six Hokies reached double figures ... In that game, a 93-49 victory over Coastal Carolina in Cassell Coliseum, one of the six Hokies to score in double figures was current Hokie Director of Strength and Conditioning for Basketball Programs, **David Jackson** ... Jackson scored 12 points in the game ... An interesting side note, of those six players, three had the surname of Jackson, including Travis and David's twin brother, Jim.

One More From the Line

Virginia Tech made all four of its free throw attempts in the loss to Virginia on Dec. 5 ... That marks the fewest free throws attempted by the Hokies since joining the ACC and the fewest attempted free throws under Seth Greenberg ... The fewest attempted before Dec. 5 was seven attempts, set on Jan. 7, 2008, when the Hokies were six-ofseven from the line in a win over Charleston Southern in Cassell Coliseum ... The fewest made free throws by Tech since joining the ACC was three, on Dec. 19, 2004, when Tech was 3-11 from the line in its very first ACC game, against UNC in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech has made three free throws in a game twice under Greenberg ... The Hokies were five-ofseven from the line in the rematch with the Cavaliers on Feb. 19.

Mid-Week Games

Virginia Tech's home win against Maryland was the Hokies' first mid-week home night game since Dec. 1, when Tech lost to #22 Purdue, 58-55 ... Tech played just two weeknight home ACC games this season.

Pack Mentality

With Tech's win on Feb. 2, **Jeff Allen** has played in five games against NC State ... In those five games, he is averaging 16.6 points and 7.8 rebounds per game ... Tech is 4-1 in those four games ... In Tech's last four games against NC State, all Tech wins, **Malcolm Delaney** is averaging 19.0 points per game.

Assisting the Wins

Virginia Tech set a new school ACC mark with 23 assists in the win over Wake Forest ... Malcolm Delaney's nine assists in the win is a new season high and team season high, surpassing his eight assists in the win over Penn State ... Tech assisted on 23 of the team's 34 made baskets in the game ... The last time the Hokies dished out more than 23 assists in a game was on Jan. 7, 2008, when Tech had 25 assists in a win over Charleston Southern ... Entering the game against Penn State, the Hokies had dished out 15-or-more assists in a game just once in the first eight games of the season ... Since then, Tech has passed out at least 15 assists in eight of the 20 games, including a 20-assist effort in the win over Penn State, 21 assists in the win over Mount St. Mary's and a season-high 23 assists in the win over Wake Forest.

Highs In the 90s

This season, the Hokies have scored 90-ormore-points in a game five times, two more than all of last season ... Last year, two of the three were overtime games, while none of the five this season have been in overtime ... The last time the Hokies had more than four nonovertime 90-plus point games was the 2006-07 season, when Tech recorded five such games (four against Division I competition) ... The last time the Hokies had more than five 90-plus point non-overtime games was the 1988-89 season, when Tech record a total of 14 games with 90-or-more points, including 12 that were not decided in overtime.

Hokies in Overtime

With the overtime victory over St. Bonaventure, the Hokies are now 56-41 all-time in overtime games ... Virginia Tech was 3-1 in overtime games last season, with the three wins all coming away from Cassell Coliseum, and is 1-1 this season in overtime games ... Tech is 25-20 in road overtime games, 25-8 in home overtime games and 6-13 on neutral courts ... Tech is 14-6 in all overtime games under Seth Greenberg and 10-2 in ACC overtime games ... The last time the Hokies lost a true road overtime game was Feb. 11, 2006, when Tech fell to Virginia, 81-77, in University Hall ... Tech is 5-8 in double overtime games and 1-2 in triple overtime games.

Good Shooting Backdrop

Malcolm Delaney has played three games in the Dean E. Smith Center at the University of North Carolina during his career ... In those three games, Delaney averaged 24.7 points and 3.7 assists per game ... He was the Hokies' leading scorer in all three games.

It's Better in the Bahamas

Virginia Tech defeated Mississippi State, 88-57, in the Battle at Atlantis in the Imperial Arena at the Atlantis Resort on Dec. 18 ... A crowd of 3,480 witnessed the Hokies' win, after seeingGeorgia Tech defeat Richmond in the first game ... These were the first basketball games held at the resort, which hopes to begin an eight-team exempt tournament next year ... The NCAA granted their request for an exemption in January.

MD+JA=Points

When the Hokies defeated Connecticut in the NIT last season, **Malcolm Delaney** and **Jeff Allen** combined for 12 points ... The last time the pair combined for fewer points in a game in which both players appeared was on Dec. 9, 2007, when, as freshmen in just the eighth game of their collegiate careers, they combined for 10 points in the Hokies' win over George Washington.

More on the Win over Mount St. Mary's

In Virginia Tech's win over Mount St. Mary's on Jan. 2, the Hokies set a number of impressive marks ... The 65-point margin of victory is the second-largest in school history, trailing only a 105-24 victory over Washington & Lee on Jan. 9, 1959, at War Memorial Gym in Blacksburg ... This is the largest margin of victory for the Hokies in Cassell Coliseum ... (Washington & Lee and Virginia Tech were both members of the Southern Conference in 1959) ... Mount St. Mary's 17.0 percent from the field is a new Virginia Tech record for lowest field goal percentage by an opponent ... The old record was 17.6 percent in the Washington & Lee win ... Virginia Tech's 69.2 percent from the field is a new high since joining the ACC ... The school record is 72.2 percent in a 92-81 win at Syracuse on Feb. 28, 1976 ... The 34 points allowed to Mount St. Mary's is the fewest for a Tech opponent since the Hokies defeated North Carolina Central, 72-30, in Cassell Coliseum on Jan. 18, 2010.

Hokies Hit 1,300

Virginia Tech is now 1325-1089 all-time in collegiate basketball, good for a .549 winning percentage ... This is the Hokies' 102nd season of men's basketball.

One to Go

With the win at Campbell last season, **Seth Greenberg** recorded his 110th career victory at Virginia Tech and passed 2009 Virginia Tech Hall of Fame inductee Chuck Noe into second place in career coaching wins ... He currently has 151 career victories at Virginia Tech ... Charlie Moir is tops on the list with 213 victories.

Hostile Crowds

The announced crowd of 12,528 at Kansas State was the largest crowd to witness a Virginia Tech non-conference away or neutral site game since Dec. 21, 2006, when the Hokies defeated Seton Hall, 80-61, in Madison Square Garden in front of 19,528 ... The last time the Hokies played in front of a larger crowd on a non-conference opponent's home court was Nov. 28, 2005, when the Hokies fell to Ohio State in the Shottenstein Center in front of an announced crowd of 13,218.

From the Line

In the win over Florida State, the Hokies made 34 free throws ... That is a season high and the most for the Hokies in a game since Tech made 38 free throws (on 46 attempts) in the win over Clemson last season ... The Hokies shot 91.9 percent from the line in the win over the Seminoles, the best percentage since Tech shot 93.8 percent from the line at Duke last season ... Virginia Tech was 30-41 from the free throw line in the win at UNCG ... The 41 attempts are a season high and the most by Tech in a game since making 32 of 47 in the home win over #23 Wake Forest last season ... The Hokies and Spartans combined for a total of 70 free throw attempts, the most combined in a Tech game since that same win over Wake Forest, when the teams combined for 74 free throw attempts.

Points to Points

Virginia Tech defeated UNC Greensboro, 92-70, in Greensboro on Nov. 21 ... It was the most points for the Hokies in a true road, nonovertime game since Jan. 28, 1995, when Tech downed Liberty 101-70 in Lynchburg ... When Virginia Tech defeated Mississippi State, 88-57, in the Battle at Atlantis, it marked the first time that the Hokies have defeated a team by more than 30 points away from Cassell Colisem since an 85-51 win over Liberty on Nov. 24, 1998 ... It is the largest margin of victory against an equity conference team since Tech defeated South Carolina, 109-68, on Jan. 12, 1985, in Cassell Coliseum ... It is the largest margin of victory against a current equity conference team away from Cassell Coliseum since Tech defeated Virginia, 92-59, in Charlottesville on Jan. 20, 1962.

Delaney also led the ACC in minutes played in ACC games ... Delaney is currently second in the ACC in scoring.

We Like Threes

The Hokies have hit at least one threepointer in every game since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... The last time that the Hokies did not record a three-point field goal in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003 ... Tech has now hit a three in 266 consecutive games ... Since the three-point arc was added to college basketball for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one three in all but three games ... Tech has had nine games with only one three-pointer under **Seth Greenberg** ... Tech's longest streak of made three-pointers in a game is 277 consecutive games, from 1986-1995.

Virginia Tech is 74-31 all-time in games played in the month of November, for a .705 winning percentage ... Tech finished 4-1 in November last year and was 4-2 this season ... November boasts the best winning percentage of any month for Tech ... The Hokies were 7-0 last December and were 5-3 in January a year ago ... Tech was 5-3 last February, and was 4-2 in March, 2010.

Two New

The Hokies have added two new players to the roster in the past few games ... Andrew Griffin, a 6-6, 220 lbs., senior forward from Lynchburg, Va., and Prince Parker, a 6-6, 260 lbs., senior forward from Norfolk, Va., now dress for the Hokies ... Parker is the roommate of fellow walk-on Paul Debnam and, like Debnam, is a former member of the Virginia Tech football team ... Griffin has appeared in three games for the Hokies, and Parker made his debut in the win over Wake Forest and appeared in the win over Georgia Tech, as well ... The trio have combined for 13 appearances, good for 41 minutes of action ... They have combined for 17 points, 10 rebounds and three assists.

Starting Off Ranked

The Hokies opened the 2010-11 season ranked No. 21 in the AP Top 25 and No. 23 in the ESPN/USA Today coaches poll ... This is the first time since the 1995-96 season that the Hokies have appeared in the AP preseason poll ... The No. 21 ranking is the Hokies' highest preseason ranking since the beginning of the 1984-85 season, when the Hokies were No. 15 ... The last time Tech was ranked in the AP poll was March in 2007, when the Hokies were also No. 21.

JA & MD vs. GT

Malcolm Delaney has played six games against Georgia Tech in his career ... In those games, he is averaging 20.8 points, 4.5 assists and 5.3 rebounds per contest ... He scored 32 points and had nine assists in the win at Georgia Tech last season, a performance that earned him ACC Player of the Week honors and had 33 points in the home win over Georgia Tech this season ... Jeff Allen averaged 16.2 points and 8.8 rebounds per game in his six games against the Yellow Jackets.

A Great Improvement

Virginia Tech sophomore guard **Erick Green** is currently in first place for the largest improvement in scoring from last season to this season among ACC players ... Green averaged 2.6 points per game last season and is averaging 11.4 ppg this season, for an increase of 8.8 ppg ... Gary Clark of Wake Forest is second at a +7.6 ppg this season ... Last season, **Dorenzo Hudson** earned the mantle of most improved in the ACC.

Head Coach Seth Greenberg HOKIE HOOPS



Success is not a given. Only through hard-work and dedication, will success come. Now in his eighth season at Virginia Tech, Seth Greenberg has set the Hokies onto a course of winning and competing at the highest level.

Since joining the Hokies, Greenberg has established himself as not only a builder of programs, but as a coach who has an eye on the ultimate goal.

Greenberg has a career record of 364-274 in 21 seasons as a collegiate head coach and a 151-104 record in his sevenplus seasons at Virginia Tech. His biggest victories as the head coach of the Hokies include a 70-69 win at No. 12 Georgia Tech and a 67-65 victory against No. 7 Duke in Cassell Coliseum in the 2004-05 season.

But in the 2006-07 season, the Hokies engineered a historic sweep over North Carolina, including a 94-88 win over the Tar Heels in Cassell Coliseum when UNC was the top-ranked team in the country. Couple that victory against North Carolina with a 69-67 overtime win at No. 5 Duke the week before, the Hokies spent time atop the ACC standings for the first time ever. During the 2008-09 season, the win at No. 1 Wake Forest and an 80-77 win at No. 12 Clemson were added to the list. This past season, home wins over a pair of No. 23 teams, Miami and Wake Forest, continued the run of top 25 victories.

With Greenberg's win at Campbell on Nov. 23, 2009, he passed Chuck Noe into second place on the all-time wins list at Virginia Tech with 110 victories. Only Charlie Moir, with 213 victories, has more wins at Tech than Greenberg.

In his time at Virginia Tech, Greenberg is 2-3 against top-ranked teams, with all three losses coming on final possessions. Tech has made four consecutive post-season appearances and five in Greenberg's seven years in Blacksburg.

As the 2009-10 school year began, the Hokies moved into the new \$21 million practice facility. This building brings Virginia Tech basketball the "WOW Factor!" that it needs to compete among the elite in college basketball and is the culmination of a vision that Greenberg has for the university and its basketball program.

In the last 18 months, Greenberg has received two awards that not only speak to his success on the court, but his works off the court as well. In September 2009, Greenberg was presented with the inaugural Al LoBalbo Award by his alma mater, Fairleigh Dickinson University. And in April, Greenberg was inducted into The National Jewish Sports Hall of Fame and Museum.

On March 11, 2008, Greenberg added another honor, as he was named the Atlantic Coast Conference's 2008 Coach of the Year. This marked the second time in four years that Greenberg earned the honor.

In the 2006-07 season, the Hokies defeated four nationally ranked teams and had a 3-0 record against teams ranked in the top-five. And as the 2010-11 season unfolds, Greenberg has the Hokies poised for even loftier achievements.

On April 3, 2003, the Hokies introduced Greenberg as their 27th head coach. A proven program builder, an admired and innovative tactician and an experienced recruiter, Greenberg took over the reigns of a Tech program that has made tremendous strides in his first six seasons in Blacksburg.

Greenberg earned his first major honor at Virginia Tech in 2005, being named the ACC Coach of the Year by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association. He was the fourth Hokie honored by the group for the team's play during the Hokies' inaugural ACC season. The *Richmond Times-Dispatch* named Greenberg the Coach of the Year in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

The aggressive, up-tempo style that Greenberg installed in his first season with the Hokies has seen dividends and has brought a renewed sense of excitement to Cassell Coliseum, as well as to the "Hokie Nation."

Perhaps the biggest influences seen in the program have been the work ethic and attention to details that Greenberg and his staff have instilled. And when speaking of hard work, the principle begins at the top, with Greenberg himself. Long hours of watching film, instructing players and developing the program, along with tirelessly working to promote the program and university while being involved in the community, have made Greenberg a popular face on the Blacksburg campus and in the "Hokie Nation."

Greenberg came to Virginia Tech from the University of South Florida, where he served as head coach for seven seasons. At USF, Greenberg had a record of 108-100. Prior to USF, Greenberg was the head coach at Long Beach State University, where his overall record was 105-70.

During his time at Long Beach State and USF, Greenberg's teams posted impressive records against major conference opponents. During his Long Beach State tenure there were wins over four nationally-ranked teams, including a 64-49 victory against then-No. 1 Kansas at Allen Fieldhouse in 1992-93. At South Florida, his teams were 2-0 against Ohio State, had two wins over Texas and won at Pittsburgh during the Panthers' run to the Sweet 16 in the 2001-02 season. The Bulls defeated eventual Final Four team Wisconsin in the 1999-2000 season.

A 1978 graduate of Fairleigh Dickinson, Greenberg was a fouryear letter winner under head coach Al LoBalbo. His father, the late Ralph Greenberg, played at Long Island University under coaching legend Clair Bee, one of college basketball's all-time winningest coaches. Greenberg began his coaching career as an assistant at Columbia in 1978. He moved to Pittsburgh two years later, where he made two trips to the NCAA Tournament in three years with the Panthers. He spent the 1983-84 season at Virginia, helping the Cavs reach the Final Four before moving on to Miami as an assistant under future Virginia Tech head coach Bill Foster. At Miami, he helped revive a program that had been dormant for a number of years.

Greenberg first went to Long Beach State as associate head coach under Joe Harrington. Greenberg replaced him three years later when Harrington accepted the head coaching position at Colorado. In his six seasons at LBSU, Greenberg led the 49ers to two NCAA Tournament appearances and one NIT appearance. He led LBSU to two Big West Conference championships and one Big West regular-season title. While Greenberg was at LBSU, the 49ers defeated four nationally ranked teams. Greenberg also tutored future NBA players Bryon Russell, Lucious Harris and Juaquin Hawkins.

In the summer of 2004, Greenberg received a lofty honor when he was inducted into the Five Star Basketball Camp's Hall of Fame. The honor, shared by some of the greatest coaches like Rick Pitino and Hubie Brown, was bestowed for the many years that Greenberg has been a part of the nation's top summer basketball camp as an instructor and guest speaker.

Greenberg has always been involved in charitable organizations and causes. In September of 2009, he was the winning head coach in the inaugural "Chairmen of the Boards" 3-on-3 charity basketball tournament to benefit Tuesday's Children in New York City. This group is the premiere non-profit organization serving the needs of the 9/11 community, providing a wide-range of programming from mentoring, to advocacy for children, to next-step life skills and leadership training for 9/11 families and rescue and recovery workers.

When confronted by the destruction of Hurricane Katrina, Greenberg knew he had to get involved. He served as the chairman of the organizing committee of AllCoachesCare.com, a major on-line sports auction that raised money for Habitat for Humanity and its efforts in helping to rebuild the Gulf Coast area. Working tirelessly, Greenberg helped the group acquire goods and services for the auction and also spent countless hours speaking on television and radio and to media members getting the word out about the auction.

This season, Greenberg has taken a leadership role with "Shots from the Heart," an event that helps the American Heart Association raise money to fight heart disease. The event will have selected head coaches and assistant coaches in a bracketed free throw shooting contest.

Greenberg and his wife, Karen, are the parents of three daughters: Paige, 22, Ella, 19, and Jacqueline, 15. Paige graduated from Virginia Tech in May, and Ella is a sophomore cheerleader for the Hokies. Greenberg is active in a number of organizations and causes, including the Great American Teach-in, the American Heart Association, Coaches vs. Cancer and the Boys and Girls Club.





Malcolm Delaney scored 20 points and Jeff Allen recorded a double-double as the No. 21-ranked Virginia Tech Hokies got the season started on a good note with a 70-60 non-conference victory over Campbell University at Cassell Coliseum.

Delaney, the ACC's leading scorer a year ago at better than 20 points per game, hit just 3-of-9 from the floor, including 3-of-8 from beyond the 3-point arc against Campbell's zone defense. But he made all 11 of his freethrow attempts.

Terrell Bell scored a career-high 17 points, while Allen recorded his 28th career double-double with 11 points and 14 rebounds.

The Hokies led by just two points, 24-22, after Campbell's Lorne Merthie drained a 3-pointer with 5:17 left in the first half. But Delaney hit two free throws to start a 17-4 run to close the half and that allowed the Hokies to open a 41-26 bulge at the break.

Campbell cut that lead to seven, 52-45, on a basket by Eric Griffin with 11:18 remaining. But the Hokies were too much down the stretch. They scored the next 11 points five by Delaney - to take a 16-point lead and never looked back.

Tech shot 42.3 percent from the floor but won primarily because of its dominance on the boards. Paced by Allen, the Hokies out-rebounded Campbell 41-24.

Virginia Tech took a lead well into the second half, but was unable to hold on and fell at No. 3 Kansas State, 73-57.

The Hokies, now 1-1 on the season and ranked No. 22 in the AP poll and No. 24 in the coaches poll, took a lead on a three-pointer by Malcolm Delaney to open the second half and held a 40-38 lead with 14:05 left on a bucket by Delaney. Kansas State then finished the game on a 35-17 run for the victory.

Kansas State, now 2-0 on the season, was able to get the Tech frontcourt in foul trouble during the game and won the battle of the boards, 46-37. Tech could manage just 34.5 percent from the field, including 33.3 percent in the second half. The Hokies did block seven shots by the taller Wildcats.

Delaney led all scorers with 22 points and Dorenzo Hudson added 12 points. Freshman Jarell Eddie came off the bench with eight points, seven rebounds and three blocked shots. Jacob Pullen, Rodney McGruder and Jamar Samuels each scored 13 points to lead Kansas State.

VIRGINIA TECH 92, UNC GREENSBORO 70 NOV. 21, 2010 • 1 P.M. • GREENSBORO, N.C.

Virginia Tech used solid defense and a balanced scoring attack to defeat UNC Greensboro, 92-70 in non-conference men's basketball action at the Greensboro Coliseum.

The Hokie defense forced UNCG into 29 turnovers, 20 of which went toward Tech steals. Seven different Hokies recorded steals on the day, including a career-high five steals by guard Erick Green. The 20 steals for the Hokies were one shy of the school record of 21 steals.

The host Spartans led by as many as seven points early in the contest, but Tech went on a 21-14 run in the final eight minutes of the first half to take a 43-32 lead into intermission. UNCG was able to keep the Tech lead relatively within reason until the Hokies opened the lead up to as many as 26 points before clearing the bench in the final minutes.

Malcolm Delaney led all scorers with a season-high 23 points, pacing four Hokies in double figures. Jeff Allen, Dorenzo Hudson and Green all recorded season highs, as well, with 17, 17 and 10 points, respectively. Kyle Randall led the three Spartans in double figures with 15 points.

Tech's 92 points are the most this season and the most for the Hokies in a non-overtime game since Dec. 9, 2009. when Tech defeated VMI 98-73 in Cassell Coliseum. It was the most points for the Hokies in a true road, non-overtime game since Jan. 28, 1995, when Tech downed Liberty 101-70 in Lynchburg.

Jeff Allen scored 14 points and Tech's defense held Purdue to just 36.2 percent shooting from the floor, but it wasn't enough to overcome JaJuan Johnson and the Boilermakers, as Tech fell to Purdue 58-55 in overtime in an ACC-Big Ten Challenge game at Cassell Coliseum.

In overtime, Tech led by a point, 55-54, after a Dorenzo Hudson free throw with 1:45 left. But Johnson hit a jumper with 1:27 left that gave the Boilermakers at 56-55 lead.

On the ensuing possession, the Hokies' Jeff Allen turned the ball over, as Purdue's Terone Johnson stole Allen's pass to Dorenzo Hudson. JaJuan Johnson then missed a 3-pointer with 26 seconds left as the shot clock ran down, but the Hokies couldn't corral the rebound and the ball went out of bounds off a Tech player, giving Purdue the ball. Tech then fouled E'Twaun Moore, who sank 1-of-2 from the line with 23.8 seconds left to give Purdue a 57-55 lead.

Tech called a timeout with 16 seconds remaining to set up a play. But Malcolm Delaney stumbled and lost the ball while trying to drive toward the basket with three seconds left to play. A group of players got hands on the ball and the officials called a jump ball. Purdue retained possession, and Tech again fouled Moore, who hit 1-of-2 with 2.6 seconds left to give the Boilermakers a 58-55 lead. Moore missed the second, but Purdue's Lewis Jackson got the rebound and ran out the clock.

Tech appeared to be in good shape in regulation, leading 51-49 after a Terrell Bell free throw with 21.9 seconds remaining, but after a timeout, Purdue went inside to Johnson, who hit a jump hook with 8.8 seconds left to tie the game at 51.

The Hokies pushed the ball up the court and tried to get a good look. But Johnson stepped out on Delaney, forcing Tech's guard to shoot a tough shot along the baseline that bounced off the rim as the horn sounded, sending the game into overtime. Allen paced Tech with the 14 points and had nine

rebounds, as the Hokies out-rebounded Purdue 42-34. Victor Davila played his best game of the season, scoring 12 points, grabbing six rebounds and blocking three shots before fouling out with 1:46 remaining in regulation.

VIRGINIA 57, VIRGINIA TECH 54

DEC. 5, 2010 • 6 P.M. • BLACKSBURG, VA.

Malcolm Delaney scored 26 points, but a slow start to the game hobbled the Hokies and they ended up falling to in-state rival Virginia 57-54 in the ACC opener for both teams at Cassell Coliseum.

The loss marked Tech's third straight and dropped the Hokies to 4-4 overall on the season.

Tech never led in this one, trailing by as many as 16 points in the first half after Virginia shot 55.6 percent from the floor. The Hokies closed the lead to two points twice in the final 2:30 of the game, once when a **Dorenzo Hudson** 3-pointer made it 51-49 with 2:25 remaining and once when Victor Davila scored with 19.4 seconds to go to make it 53-51.

Virginia called a timeout after Davila's basket to set up an inbounds play, and the Cavaliers got Mike Scott running free down the length of the court. Tech's **Jeff Allen** intentionally fouled Scott with 18 seconds left, and Scott hit both free throws to give Virginia a 55-51 bulge. Virginia got to keep the ball as a result of the intentional foul, and Tech fouled Mustapha Farrakhan, who made two free throws with 16 seconds remaining to increase the Cavalier lead to 57-51.

Delaney drilled a 3-pointer with 11 seconds to go to cut the lead to 57-54. Virginia then proceeded to miss the front ends of two one-and-ones – Joe Harris missed the first, but Scott got the rebound and then he missed one - giving the Hokies the ball with a chance to tie. But Joe Harris got a piece of Hudson's 3-point attempt with two seconds left and Jontel Evans got the rebound for the Cavaliers. He ran out the clock to preserve the game.

Delaney, coming off a Purdue game in which he scored nine points and hit just 2-of-18 from the floor, canned 10-of-15 against the Cavaliers, including 4-of-7 from beyond the 3-point arc.

Jeff Allen added 12 points and nine rebounds for the Hokies, who held Virginia to just 21 points and 36.4 percent shooting in the second half. The Cavaliers, behind that big first half, shot 46.9 percent for the game. Virginia got a huge game from Scott, who scored 21

points and grabbed 13 rebounds. Harris finished with 10 points.

Starting in place of an injured Dorenzo Hudson, Erick Green tied his career high with 15 points as the Hokies snapped a three-game losing streak with a 79-69 non-conference victory over Penn State at Cassell Coliseum.

After a week off, the Hokies looked crisp, particularly on offense, as they shot a season-high 54.5 percent from the floor. Tech also dished out 20 assists, just one short of its season high, and finished with four players in double figures, paced by Malcolm Delaney's 18 points.

The Hokies jumped out to an 11-point lead at the break thanks to a Delaney 3-pointer at the buzzer. Penn State went on an 8-0 run to start the second half and cut the lead to 44-41 on two free throws by Talor Battle with 16:15 left in the game.

But Green – who got the start after his collision with Hudson in practice earlier this week resulted in an injured calf for Hudson – hit a 3-pointer 35 seconds later and that started a 10-0 Tech run. Delaney's 3-pointer and a **Tyrone** Garland lay-up with 10:52 left gave the Hokies a 54-41 lead, and Penn State got no closer than nine points the rest of the game.

Green connected on 6-of-11 from the floor, including 2-of-5 from beyond the 3-point arc. He tied his career high for field goals made and set a career high for field-goal attempts. He also dished out two assists and grabbed four rebounds in 27 minutes. Delaney scored 15 of his 18 points in the first half for

Tech. He made 6-of-9 from the floor for the game, including 5-of-7 from beyond the 3-point arc. He also finished with a season-high eight assists.

Jeff Allen and Terrell Bell both recorded doubledoubles for the Hokies. Allen had 11 points and 13 rebounds and he also added a career-high six assists. Bell finished with 13 points and 10 rebounds. It marked the 31st doubledouble of Allen's career and the second of Bell's. Tech also got 15 points off the bench – something

Greenberg had been searching for in previous games. Garland paced Tech's effort off the bench with a career-high nine points, hitting 3-of-4 from the floor and 3-of-4 from the free-throw line

Virginia Tech jumped out to a 17-point halftime lead and never looked back in defeating Mississippi State, 88-57, in the second game of the Battle at Atlantis in the Imperial Arena at the Atlantis Resort in the Bahamas.

MSU scored the game's first two points for its only lead of the contest. Tech's lead swelled to as many as 33 points in the second half. The Bulldogs cut Tech's lead to 49-34 with 18:35 remaining in the game, but Tech pushed the lead back out to 20 points with 13:55 remaining on a lay-up by Jeff Allen and Tech's lead never again fell below 20 points.

Virginia Tech, now 6-4 on the season, placed five players in double figures in the win. Malcolm Delaney led all scorers with 19 points and Dorenzo Hudson came off the bench with 17 points. Allen recorded his second straight double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds, while Erick Green scored 11 points and Manny Atkins came off the bench with a career-high 10 points. Renardo Sidney and Ravern Johnson scored 12 points each for the Bulldogs, now 7-3 on the season.

The Hokies outrebounded the taller Bulldogs, 39-24, including 13 offensive rebounds. Tech forced MSU into 16 turnovers and the Hokies recorded assists on 17 of their 30 made field goals.

The 31-point margin of victory is the largest of the season for Tech and the largest by any Virginia Tech basketball team since a 72-30 win over North Carolina Central last season.

All 11 Hokies that dressed saw action and nine of the 11 players scored in the game.

Virginia Tech made two key defensive stops in the waning moments of the extra period to defeat St. Bonaventure, 76-68, in overtime at the Blue Cross Arena in Rochester, N.Y.

The Hokies, now 7-4 on the season and winners of three straight games, led by as many as 18 points in the first half and took a 41-28 lead into intermission. Delaney led the Hokies with 19 points, while Jeff Allen added 18 points and nine rebounds and Erick Green scored 15 points and tied a career-high with five steals. In his three games as a starter this season. Green has 10 assists and no turnovers. Andrew Nicholson led four Bonnies in double figures with 21 points. Delaney moved past former teammate A.D. Vassallo into fifth place in career scoring at Virginia Tech in the victory.

The Hokies played the game with just eight scholarship players, as starting senior guard Dorenzo Hudson and reserve sophomore forward Cadarian Raines both were announced on Thursday to be out for the rest of the season with foot injuries, joining the sidelined JT Thompson (ACL surgery) and Allan Chaney (viral inflammation of the heart).

Jeff Allen posted his third double-double in four games with 16 points and 15 rebounds and Malcolm Delaney added 17 points and five assists to lead Virginia Tech to its fourth straight

victory, a 64-53 decision over USC Upstate. Trailing by seven with 5:30 left in the first half, the Hokies turned up their defensive pressure, forcing the Spartans into just 2-of-9 shooting from the floor, including 0-for-4 from three, and six turnovers. To that point, USC Upstate had hit 10-of-19 shots, 5-of-8 from three, and committed just three turnovers.

Recapping the five runs by Tech – Delaney scored five of the team's seven points in run number one; Garland capped the second with a pair of lay-ups; the third run was started and ended with a pair of made free throws by Allen; and Green scored five in run four and six in the final one to give the team a 50-11 lead.

Tech missed just nine of its 28 shots, for a 67.9% shooting in the first opposed to the Mountaineers' 4-for-24 (16.7%) shooting. The Hokies also forced 13 turnovers resulting in 22 points and 11 on fast breaks.

Jeff Allen scored 18 of his season-high 24 points in the second half to lift Virginia Tech past Florida State 71-59 in an ACC game played at Cassell Coliseum.

With the victory, the Hokies extended their winning streak to six straight games. They moved to 10-4 overall, 1-1 in the ACC. They also snapped a three-game losing streak to the Seminoles.

The Hokies broke open a close contest in the first half with a 12-0 run to end the half and took a 29-19 lead at halftime. They never trailed again. Florida State went scoreless in the final 6:43, turning the ball over six times and missing six shots on its final 11 possessions of the half.

In the second half, the Seminoles cut Virginia Tech's lead to 46-42 with 7:32 remaining on a 3-pointer by Luke Loucks, but the Hokies scored the next eight points. The Seminoles got no closer than eight points the rest of the game.

Tech, which is now down to eight scholarship players because of injuries, played exclusively a 2-3 zone against the bigger, more athletic Seminoles and held Florida State to just 35.5 percent shooting from the floor (22 of 62). The Hokies also forced 19 FSU turnovers.

Head Coach Seth Greenberg, who usually has his teams play man-to-man defense, said it marked the first time as a coach that he had played 40 minutes of zone.

Allen, who also had 11 rebounds for his seventh double-double of the season, connected on 7-of-12 from the floor and 10-of-12 from the free-throw line. The scoring outburst marked his best game since a 25-point performance in the Hokies' double-overtime loss to Maryland last February.

Tech also made the most of its free-throw opportunities. The Hokies, who were shooting 67.8 percent from the free-throw line coming into the game, made 34 of 37. **Malcolm Delaney** and **Erick Green** combined to make all 15 of their attempts.

The Hokies got 13 points from Delaney and 12 from Green, while Chris Singleton paced Florida State with 22 points.

Virginia Tech's **Malcolm Delaney** made nearly every 3-pointer he took against the North Carolina Tar Heels, but his attempt in the waning moments was just off the mark, and the Tar Heels rallied past the Hokies, 64-61, in an ACC game at the Dean E. Smith Center.

The loss snapped Tech's six-game winning streak and moved the Hokies to 10-5 overall on the season, 1-2 in the ACC. North Carolina is now 12-4, 2-0.

The Hokies trailed 62-58 after UNC's Tyler Zeller connected with 1:01 remaining, but Delaney buried a 3 with 47 seconds left to cut the lead to one, 62-61. Zeller then missed a shot inside for the Tar Heels, giving the Hokies a final chance.

Without any timeouts, Delaney took a 3-pointer with seven seconds left that looked good once it left his hand. But the shot bounced off the rim and the Tar Heels rebounded. Tech then fouled Kendall Marshall with 2.8 seconds to go, and Marshall made both free throws to extend the lead to 64-61. Tech's **Erick Green** tried to throw a halfcourt pass after Marshall's second free throw, but Dexter Strickland stole it to end the game.

Delaney paced the Hokies with 28 points, hitting 8-of-18 from the floor, including 7-of-12 from beyond the 3-point arc. He also finished with five assists and four steals.

Tech controlled much of the game, jumping out to a 12-2 lead and expanding that lead to as many as 16 points in the first half. The Hokies led by 10 with 17:12 remaining in the game, but with players like Green, **Jeff Allen** and **Manny Atkins** suffering from cramps and missing portions of the second half – and the Hokies already down to eight scholarship players – the Tar Heels went on a 14-3 run to claim a 43-42 lead on John Henson's basket with 9:36 remaining.

Henson scored 12 of his 17 points to pace the Tar Heels in the second half, who shot 41.3 percent for the game and out-rebounded Tech 46-33. The Hokies shot 39.6 percent from the floor, but made 11 3-pointers – a season high.

Green was the only other player in double figures for the Hokies, finishing with 10. Zeller added 16 and nine rebounds for the Tar Heels, while Harrison Barnes ended up with 12.

The Virginia Tech Hokies used two big first-half runs and shot a season-high 58.6 percent from the floor to roll past Wake Forest 94-65 in an ACC game played Saturday night at Cassell Coliseum, handing the Demon Deacons their worst loss of the season.

The win marked the seventh in the past eight games for the Hokies, who moved to 11-5 overall on the season, 2-2 in the ACC. Wake Forest, which lost to Tech for the fourth straight time, fell to 7-11, 0-3. The Demon Deacons have lost seven of their past eight.

Wake Forest led 9-6 in the early going, but the Hokies used a 14-2 run – with six players scoring baskets – to take a lead they never would relinquish. Jarell Eddie's 3-pointer with 10:04 remaining in the first half ended the run and gave Tech a 20-11 lead.

Malcolm Delaney scored 23 points to lift the Virginia Tech Hokies past Longwood 70-52 in a non-conference game at Cassell Coliseum on Saturday night.

The win marked the Hokies' ninth in their past 10 games and moved them to 13-5 overall on the season. Longwood fell to 7-15.

The Hokies trailed for most of the first 10 minutes, but they closed the first half with a 19-4 run, erasing a five-point deficit to take a 29-19 lead at halftime. The Lancers missed 10 of their final 11 attempts from the floor in the first half.

Longwood got as close as five in the second half, 38-33, on a basket by Aaron Mitchell with 12:37 remaining. But the Hokies outscored the Lancers 29-9 over the next eight minutes to take control, with Delaney scoring 10 in that stretch.

The game marked the second in a 48-hour span for Virginia Tech, which won at Maryland on Thursday. The Hokies returned home to face the Lancers and came out sluggish.

Delaney led Virginia Tech, connecting on just 6-of-14 from the floor, but hitting 10-of-12 from the free-throw line. He needs just 42 points to eclipse the 2.000-point mark for his career.

Erick Green added 14 points and five assists for Virginia Tech, who shot 44.6 percent from the floor (25of-56). Jeff Allen scored just six points, but grabbed 10 rebounds, as the Hokies out-rebounded Longwood, 36-29.

Mitchell and Antwan Carter paced Longwood with 14 points each. The Lancers shot just 37 percent from the floor (17-of-46).

Erick Green scored five of his 15 points in the final 2:32 and **Malcolm Delaney** hit a clutch 3-pointer in the final two minutes, as the Hokies held on to beat Miami, 72-68.

Tech led the entire second half, but couldn't put the 'Canes away until the waning moments. Garrius Adams' 3-pointer with 2:53 got Miami to within a point, 62-61, but Green answered for Tech. His 3-point play with 2:32 to go built the lead to 65-61.

Durand Scott's basket with 2:21 remaining cut the lead to 65-63. But Tech again had an answer, as Delaney nailed a 3-pointer from the top of the key with 1:58 left that pushed Tech's lead to 68-63. That turned out to be Delaney's only basket in the second half.

Scott's two free throws with 1:47 left trimmed Tech's lead to 68-65. But Green hit two free throws with 1:37 left to push the margin back to five.

Adams' 3-pointer with 1:26 left shaved the lead to two, and Miami actually had a chance to tie or take the lead after Delaney missed a jumper on the Hokies' next possession. But the 'Canes' Adrian Thomas missed two 3-pointers with less than 50 seconds remaining, and Green grabbed the rebound for Tech after the second one.

A Delaney free throw pushed the Hokies' lead to 71-68 with 16 seconds left. Miami tried to tie it, as Adams launched a 3-pointer that came up just short with three seconds to go, and Tech's **Terrell Bell** grabbed the rebound. He made 1 of 2 free throws with under a second left to account for the final margin.

Jeff Allen enabled Tech to keep the lead throughout the second half, scoring 10 of his team-high 18 points in the final 20 minutes. Allen, who made 7-of-12 from the floor, finished with 11 rebounds, notching his ninth doubledouble of the season and the 37th of his career.

Allen needs just two points to reach the 1,500-point plateau for his career.

Green hit 5-of-12 from the floor and all four of his freethrow attempts to finish with 15 points. He also dished out six assists. Delaney scored 14 points and dished out four assists.

Virginia Tech ended the first half of the ACC schedule with a 77-69 victory over NC State at the RBC Center in Raleigh on Wednesday night. With the victory, the Hokies improve to 15-6 overall and 5-3 in ACC action, while NC State falls to 12-10 overall and 2-6 in conference play.

The Hokies jumped out to a 34-18 lead with 3:19 remaining in the first half on a three-pointer by **Malcolm Delaney**. Tech took a 39-26 lead into intermission. The Hokies never trailed in the second half, but NC State was able to cut the lead to single digits several times after the break. State cut the Tech lead to six points with 20 seconds remaining, but Delaney hit a pair of free throws to secure the win.

Delaney reached two major milestones in the contest, as he registered his 2,000th career point and 500th career assist in the game. Teammate **Jeff Allen** recorded his 1,500th career point in the win. Delaney becomes just the fourth person in Virginia Tech history to score 2,000 points.

Delaney led al scorers with 22 points. Allen recorded his third straight double-double with 15 points and 11 rebounds. **Terrell Bell** and **Erick Green** each scored 13 points and **Victor Davila** grabbed a career-high 13 rebounds.

The victory is the fourth straight for the Hokies over the Wolfpack and second straight in the RBC Center. The Hokies dominated the boards, out rebounding the Wolfpack, 46-35, including 19 offensive rebounds for Tech. The Hokies committed a season-low six turnovers on the night and hit 19-of-25 free throw attempts.

Virginia Tech lost to Boston College, 58-56, in the Conte Forum in Chestnut Hill, Mass., on Saturday afternoon, With the loss, the Hokies fall to 15-7 overall and 5-4 in ACC play, while Boston College improves to 15-8 overall and 5-4 in league action.

The Hokies trailed by as many as 10 points in the first half, but battled back to make it a three-point game at intermission. Tech was able to take the lead twice in the second half, but could not hold on. The Hokies took a 49-48 lead with 5:35 remaining on a three-pointer by Malcolm Delaney, but BC hit a number of tough shots down the stretch to claim a 58-56 lead with 56 seconds to play. Tech regained possession with 24 seconds remaining and held on for a final shot, but Erick Green's three-pointer with four seconds remaining was off the mark and BC held on for the victory.

Jeff Allen led all scorers with 25 points and set a Virginia Tech school mark for rebounds in an ACC game with 19 boards. Delaney added 19 points, 17 of which came in the second half. Joe Trapani led the Eagles with 14 points. Allen, who recorded his 11th double-double of the season and fourth consecutive double-double, had 13 points and 11 rebounds at the half. Allen also passed Allan Bristow into fourth place in career rebounding at Virginia Tech as he grabbed his 1,000th career rebound as a Hokie.

The Hokies out rebounded the Eagles, 40-32, and committed just six turnovers in the contest, but made just 34.5 percent of their shots from the field. Tech has now dropped three straight at BC.

Virginia Tech's **Malcolm Delaney** scored 22 of his season-high 33 points in the first half to lead Virginia Tech past Georgia Tech 102-77 in an ACC game played at Cassell Coliseum on Sunday afternoon.

The Hokies (16-7, 6-4 ACC) now have won 12 of their past 15 games and are alone in fourth place in the ACC. They avenged a 72-57 loss to Georgia Tech in Atlanta on Jan. 25 – a game in which Delaney scored eight points and turned the ball over eight times.

Delaney hit 9-of-14 from the floor for the game, including three 3-pointers, and he connected on 12-of14 from the free-throw line. He missed his career high in points by just four.

Behind him, Virginia Tech scored the first nine points of the game and never trailed. He hit the game's opening basket and added a 3-pointer in that run.

Georgia Tech (10-14, 3-8), which has lost five straight, cut the lead to 9-6 on a basket by Iman Shumpert, but the Hokies embarked on a 33-11 run over the next eight minutes to blow open the game. Virginia Tech hit 14 of its first 17 shots from the floor.

Delaney scored 15 of the 33 in that run, including four on free throws after Georgia Tech head coach Paul Hewitt received back-to-back technical fouls from official Roger Ayers with 7:53 remaining and was ejected.

Georgia Tech did not get closer than 13 points in the second half. The Hokies, who looked fresh after an eight-day layoff, led by as many as 30 and shot 55.2 percent from the floor (32-of-58). They established a school record for points in an ACC game.

Virginia Tech's Jeff Allen had 25 points and 14 rebounds for his fifth straight double-double and 12th of the season (and 40th of his career). Erick Green scored 15 points, while Terrell Bell had 13 for the Hokies.

Shumpert paced Georgia Tech with 27 points, including six 3-pointers. His six 3-pointers tied a career high.

The Hokies continued their winning ways, moving to 17-7 overall, 7-4 in the ACC. They won for the 13th time in their past 16 games, and they swept the season series from Maryland, following a 72-57 victory over the Terps on Jan. 20 with this one.

Tech trailed 76-75 after a basket by Maryland's Jordan Williams with 5:21 remaining in the game. But behind Delaney and Green, Tech went on a 9-0 run to take control of the game.

Following two Delaney free throws with 4:54 remaining and then a jumper by Delaney with 4:33 left - his only basket of the second half - Green hit a 3-pointer with 3:22 to go and the shot clock running down. That bucket gave Tech an 82-76 lead. Delaney hit two more free throw with 1:14 left that gave the Hokies an 84-76 lead, their biggest of the half.

Maryland (16-10, 5-6) stopped the run with a 3-pointer by Dino Gregory with 1:09 left. The Terps cut the lead to 87-83 with 33 seconds left on two Terrell Stoglin free throws.

But Delaney hit two free throws with 28 seconds left push the lead back to six, and after Stoglin missed a 3-pointer. Delanev added two more with 14 seconds to go to account for the final margin.

Despite hitting just 3-of-14 from the floor, Delaney canned all 14 of his free-throw attempts, and the Hokies made 9-of-10 from the free-throw line in the final five minutes. Delaney finished with five assists and no turnovers in 40 minutes

But UVa's Joe Harris hit two free throws with 17.5 seconds left, and then Farrakhan hit 3-of-4 from the line in the final 11 seconds to preserve the win for the Cavaliers.

Delaney connected on just 8-of-22 from the floor - as a team. Tech shot just 40.4 percent – but he hit six 3-pointers. Erick Green added 12 points, and Jeff Allen continued his double-double streak for the Hokies. A stick-back with 4.2 seconds to go gave him 11 points and 15 rebounds. That marked his seventh consecutive double-double and 13th of the season.

Farrakhan led Virginia with 16 points, while Harris finished with 15 and Sammy Zeglinski had 10.

Against the Demon Deacons, Tech overcame some early foul trouble, with Jeff Allen picking up his second foul at the 14:01 mark in the first half. He sat for a little over five minutes, and then Greenberg elected to bring him back in.

The move paid dividends. Once Allen returned with 8:59 left, the Hokies outscored Wake Forest 20-9 to end the first half and took a 38-25 lead at halftime.

The second half was much of the same. Tech opened a 21-point lead, 56-35, on a basket by Eddie 13:14 remaining. Eddie drained all six of his shots from the floor, including all three of his 3-pointers, easily surpassing his previous career high of 12 points - which, coincidentally, came against Wake Forest earlier this season.

history – three since joining the ACC. Tech moved to 19-8 overall, 9-5 in the ACC, and the Hokies have now won 15 of their past 19 games. Duke, which saw its seven-game winning streak snapped, fell to 26-3, 12-2.

snapped, fell to 26-3, 12-2. The day may go down as the greatest in Tech basketball history. On Saturday morning, ESPN's College GameDay came to Blacksburg for the first time and broadcast from Cassell Coliseum in front of more than 3,100 students. Then the basketball team polished off the day by rallying in the final seven minutes to beat the Blue Devils. Following the game, Tech fans stormed the floor, much as they did in the 2007 victory over then-No.1 North Carolina Carolina.

Things looked bleak for the Hokies, who scored just two baskets in an eight-minute span in the second half and found themselves trailing 53-47 after two free throws by Duke's Kyle

Singler with 7:44 remaining in the game. But Tech dominated the game the rest of the way. An Allen 3-pointer with 6:30 to go started the Hokies' game-ending run. **Terrell Bell's** 3-pointer with 4:40 remaining tied the game at 55, and his two free throws with 4:19 left gave the Hokies a 57-55 lead. Allen added another basket with 2:39 tot got o give Tech a 59-55 bulge. Singler's basket cut the Tech lead to two with 2:27 left, but

Tech answered when **Malcolm Delaney** connected on arguably the biggest basket of the game. Without a 3-pointer to this point, he buried a 3 from the right wing with 2:01 remaining to push Tech's lead back to five, 62-57.

Tech's lead back to five, 62-57. The Blue Devils then cut the lead to three, 62-59, on a steal and dunk by Mason Plumlee, and sliced it to two on a free throw by Plumlee with 23.2 seconds left. Duke called a timeout with 12.7 seconds left, but the Blue Devils couldn't get a shot off against Tech's defense. Malcolm Delaney scored 19 points, but it wasn't enough as the Virginia Tech Hokies lost back-to-back games for the first time this season, falling to Clemson 69-60 in an ACC game played at Littlejohn Coliseum on Saturday afternoon.

With the loss, the Hokies fell to 19-10 overall, 9-7 in the ACC. Tech finishes in a three-way tie with Clemson and Boston College for fourth but will be seeded sixth in next week's ACC Tournament. Clemson moved to 20-10 overall, 9-7 in the league. The Tigers will be the No. 4 seed in the ACC Tournament and receive a first-round bye.

Tech never led in this one, falling behind 19-6 and making just one basket in the first nine minutes of the game. Despite 14 first-half turnovers, the Hokies scrambled back to cut the lead to four, 34-30, at halftime.

Tech got no closer than four points in the second half, the final time coming on an **Erick Green** jumper with 16:25 remaining. But the Tigers proceeded to go on a 10-0 run, extending their lead to 49-35 on a basket by Jerai Grant with 11:25 left.

The Hokies cut the lead to seven on two free throws by Delaney with 1:28 remaining, but the Tigers drained their free throws down the stretch. Clemson made 4-of-6 from the free-throw line in the final 1:06 to preserve the win.

Delaney hit 5-of-14 from the floor, including 2-of-6 from beyond the 3-point arc, on a day when the Hokies struggled against Clemson's man-to-man defense. Tech shot just 30.5 percent from the floor – its worst shooting performance of the season.

Terrell Bell was the only other Hokie in double figures, adding 10 points to go along with 11 rebounds for his second double-double of the season. Jeff Allen, who scored just one basket, finished with nine points, and Manny Atkins added nine off the bench.
