Entering Today's Game

This is the regular season opener for both teams.
Virginia Tech is 8-0 in season openers and home openers under **Seth Greenberg**.
The Hokies are 38-10 in season openers since the opening of Cassell Coliseum.
The Hokies are 47-2 all-time in home openers in Cassell Coliseum.
The Hokies are 13-3 all-time against ETSU and 9-1 in Cassell Coliseum against the Bucs.

Five Good Years

In the previous five seasons, Tech is 45-35 in ACC action, tied for 3rd best in the ACC.
Only Duke (58-22) and UNC (57-23) are better. Tech is tied with Maryland at 45-35.

Davila Has the Most

With his 77 starts, **Victor Davila** has the most career starts among active ACC players.
Dorenzo Hudson is tied for 4th on the list with 67 career starts.
Virginia Tech is the only ACC team with two players in the top five in active career starts.

Greenberg Facts

Seth Greenberg is 154-106 (.592) at Virginia Tech and 367-276 (.571) in 21 seasons as a collegiate head coach.
Greenberg is 100-31 as a head coach in Cassell Coliseum.

Two Return...

Three Tech players, **Dorenzo Hudson** and **Cadarian Raines**, return to active duty tonight, after missing last seasons with injuries. Both received medical redshirts.

...Two Out

Redshirt senior forward, **JT Thompson**, will miss the 2011-12 after suffering a tear to the ACL in his right knee on Nov. 2. He missed the entire 2010-11 season with the same injury to his left knee.

Freshman guard **Marquis Rankin** will miss tonight's game following knee surgery on Oct. 6. He is expected to return in the next two weeks.

Thompson to Miss 2011-12 Season

Senior forward **JT Thompson**, who missed the entire 2010-11 season following surgery to repair a torn anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee, will miss the 2011-12 season with the same injury to his right knee ... The injury occurred during practice on Nov. 2.

Hitting 100

Seth Greenberg enters this season 100-31 as a head coach in Cassell Coliseum, good for a winning percentage of .763 ... Greenberg is 59-9 (.868) against non-conference competition in Cassell Coliseum.

The Series vs. East Tennessee State

The Hokies are 13-3 all-time against ETSU ... Tech won the last meeting between the two schools, 81-75 in overtime on Dec. 18, 2000 in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech is 9-1 in Cassell Coliseum against the Bucs.

Versus the Best

Seth Greenberg enters this season with four career wins against No. 1-ranked teams and three of those have come since Virginia Tech joined the ACC in 2004 ... The three ACC wins against No. 1-ranked teams (all three opponents were ACC foes) ranks Greenberg tied for sixth among all-time ACC coaches ... The three victories are tied for third (with Florida State's Leonard Hamilton) among current ACC coaches.

Hokies in Season and Home Openers

Virginia Tech is 8-0 in season openers under **Seth Greenberg** and the same 8-0 in home openers under Greenberg ... The Hokies opened last season with a 70-60 victory over Campbell in Cassell Coliseum ... The Hokies are 38-10 in season openers since the opening of Cassell Coliseum (this does not include the season opener of the 1961-62 season, since Cassell opened in January of that season, nor does it include the season opener in the 2002-03 season that the Hokies lost to St. Bonaventure in the Paradise Jam, that was later vacated by St. Bonaventure due to an ineligible player) ... The Hokies are 48-2 all-time in home openers in Cassell Coliseum and won their first 25 home openers in the arena before losing to James Madison, 70-67, in the home opener in 1986.

Hudson Back on Track

Dorenzo Hudson returns to action for the Hokies tonight ... The redshirt senior missed most of last season with a foot injury and gained a medical redshirt ... Even in a hobbled state, Hudson averaged 10.4 points per game in the 2010-11 season before being shutdown ... As a healthy junior in the 2009-10 season, Hudson earned third team All-ACC honors, while averaging 15.2 points per game ... Statistically in that season, he was the most improved player in the ACC and his 41 points in the Hokies' win against Seton Hall in Cancun was tied for the most points by an ACC player that season.

Going Green

Erick Green was one of the most improved players in the ACC last season ... In the 26 games since he stepped into the starting line-up, Green has had a great assist/turnover ratio ... In that span, he has 82 assists and just 35 turnovers ... He had 31 assists as a freshman in the 2009-10 season ... After entering the starting line-up in the win over Penn State, Green had eight games in which he did not commit a turnover, including the entire month of December (six games in which he had 15 assists and 0 turnovers).

Hudson and Raines Return

Last season, the Hokies played the second semester without three prominent players out with injuries ... Senior guard **Dorenzo Hudson** and sophomore forward **Cadarian Raines** were both ruled out for the season due to foot injuries just before the holiday break... Hudson originally injured the foot in the 2009-10 season and had difficulties with the injury during the summer and into last season ... He had successful surgery on the foot on Jan. 17, 2011 ... Raines originally had surgery on his left foot in the 2009-10 season ... He reinjured the foot and had a second surgery in April 2010, which did not heal as expected ... He underwent a variety of treatments to aid the healing process ... Both Hudson and Raines saw limited action last season, but Hudson was third on the team in scoring average, at 10.4 points per game.

Rankin Out

Freshman point guard **Marquis Rankin** will miss the first few games of the season following knee surgery on Oct. 6 ... Rankin injured the knee during preseason drills ... The surgery was performed by team orthopaedic surgeon Dr. Marc Siegel at Lewis Gale Hospital at Montgomery in Blacksburg, Va. ... The surgery was to clean up cartilage in the knee ... He is being continuously evaluated by the Virginia Tech Sports Medicine staff.

A Good Five Years

In the previous five seasons, Tech is 45-35 in ACC action, tied for 3rd best in the ACC ... Only Duke (58-22) and UNC (57-23) have better records ... Tech is tied with Maryland at 45-35.

Since Expansion (And Beyond)

To take the previous note a step further, since the ACC expanded to include Virginia Tech and Miami in 2004 (and BC in 2005), the Hokies are fourth in the most conference regular season victories ... Tech is 57-55 in that stretch ... Only Duke (83-29), North Carolina (83-29) and Maryland (60-52) have more wins in that span ... Since the start of the 2006-07 season, the Hokies have the fourth-best victory total in ACC regular season games (45-35 in that span) (as the end of the 2010-11 regular season).

A Lot to Lose

Graduation cost the Hokies two of the most prolific players in school history, plus a two-year starter ... Tech lost 63.3 percent of its scoring from last season, along with 63.8 percent of its assists, 61.9 percent of its rebounds and 58.4 percent of its minutes played.

500 in the Cassell

The Hokies have a 507-150 overall record in the Cassell, good for a .772 winning percentage ... Tech was 12-4 in Cassell last season, the 50th year for the arena ... The win over Florida State in 2008 marked the Hokies' 600th game played in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech defeated Rhode Island, 86-63, on Nov. 20, 2002, in its 500th game in the arena ... Tech has had just one break-even home season and one losing season in Cassell Coliseum ... The 17 victories for the Hokies at home in the 2009-10 season set a new Cassell Coliseum and school record.



Another Milestone

In Virginia Tech's win over Penn State last season, **Seth Greenberg** recorded his 350th victory as a collegiate head coach ... His record in 21 years as a head coach is 367-276 (.571).

An Experienced Group

The Hokies have a combined 188 career starts among players on the roster entering the 2011-12 season ... That is third-best in the ACC, trailing only Virginia (255) and Miami (249).

The Hokies vs. No. 1

With the win over #1 Duke last season, Virginia Tech is now 4-7 all-time against the No. 1-ranked team in the AP poll ... Tech is 3-3 in such games since joining the ACC and is 3-1 against top-ranked teams at home and in Cassell Coliseum ... The Hokies have won their last two home game against a No. 1 team ... Tech is 1-1 all-time against Duke when the Blue Devils are No. 1.

Chaney Out

Virginia Tech forward **Allan Chaney** has been denied medical clearance to return to practice and competition by the Virginia Tech Sports Medicine Department due to continued complications from a cardiac condition ... Since his first diagnosis, Chaney underwent a thorough and exhaustive course of evaluation and treatment ... As a result of his medical condition, the Virginia Tech medical staff has determined that in order to minimize his risk for further complications from his condition, Chaney will not be cleared to return to basketball.

New Faces

There are a few new faces gracing the Virginia Tech men's basketball program this season ... Freshmen **C.J. Barksdale**, **Robert Brown**, **Dorian Finnney-Smith**, **Marquis Rankin** and **Joey van Zegeren** have joined the team, along with walk-on **Joey Racer** ... **James Johnson** has been promoted to associate head coach and **Rob Ehsan** has joined the staff as an assistant coach ... **Jeff Wulbrun** joins the staff as Director of Men's Basketball Operations and **John Janovsky** is the new Video Coordinator.

Win 10

With Virginia Tech's win over Maryland on Feb. 15, 2011, it marks the eighth straight season that the Hokies have won at least 10 home games.

We Challenge You

On Nov. 30, the Hokies will travel to Minneapolis to face the University of Minnesota in the 2011 Dick's Sporting Goods Big Ten/ACC Challenge ... This will be the Hokies' first-ever meeting with the Golden Gophers ... Tech is 2-4 all-time in the Challenge and is 1-2 in road Challenge games ... The ACC has won 10 of the 12 Challenges to date and 72 of the 119 overall games in the event (.605) ... The Big Ten has won the last two events, 6-5 ... This season, with the addition of Nebraska to the Big 10, all 12 teams in the ACC will compete in the event ... Virginia Tech has competed in all six seasons since joining the ACC.

Close Games

The Hokies are 47-44 under **Seth Greenberg** in games that have been decided in overtime or by five-or-fewer points.

Lights, Camera, Hokies

Tech is 93-90 on television under **Seth Greenberg** ... The Hokies were 16-11 last season ... The Hokies made a school-record 30 appearances in the 2008-09 season and made a then-school record 26 television appearances the year before.

Hokies vs. Ranked Teams

With the loss to #5/5 Duke in the ACC Tournament last season, the Hokies are 11-31 against nationally ranked teams since joining the ACC for the 2004-05 season and 12-35 against nationally ranked teams under **Seth Greenberg** ... Tech is 28-139 all-time against teams ranked in the AP poll ... These numbers are only for teams ranked in the AP poll.

Ty is Honored

Tyrone Garland was named to the 2011 All-ACC Academic team for men's basketball ... The guard from Philadelphia was one of 13 players on the team.

Hokies in Overtime

The Hokies are now 56-42 all-time in overtime games ... Virginia Tech was 1-2 last season in overtime games ... Tech is 25-20 in road overtime games, 25-9 in home overtime games and 6-13 on neutral courts ... Tech is 14-7 in all overtime games under **Seth Greenberg** and 10-2 in ACC overtime games ... The last time the Hokies lost a true road overtime game was Feb. 11, 2006, when Tech fell to Virginia, 81-77, in University Hall ... Tech is 5-8 in double overtime games and 1-2 in triple overtime games.

Hostile Crowds

The announced crowd of 12,528 at Kansas State last season was the largest crowd to witness a Virginia Tech non-conference away or neutral site game since Dec. 21, 2006, when the Hokies defeated Seton Hall, 80-61, in Madison Square Garden in front of 19,528 ... The last time the Hokies played in front of a larger crowd on a non-conference opponent's home court was Nov. 28, 2005, when the Hokies fell to Ohio State in the Shottenstein Center in front of an announced crowd of 13,218.

Hokies Hit 1,300

Virginia Tech is now 1328-1091 all-time in collegiate basketball, good for a .549 winning percentage ... This is the Hokies' 103rd season of men's basketball.

One to Go

With the win at Campbell last season, **Seth Greenberg** recorded his 110th career victory at Virginia Tech and passed Chuck Noe into second place in career coaching wins ... He currently has 154 career victories at Virginia Tech ... Charlie Moir is tops on the list with 213 victories.

Family Tradition

Two Hokie players didn't need any introduction when they arrived on campus five years ago ... **JT Thompson** was joined on the Tech team in December 2007 by his cousin, **Dorenzo Hudson**.

We Like Threes

The Hokies have hit at least one three-pointer in every game since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... The last time that the Hokies did not record a three-point field goal in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003 ... Tech has now hit a three in 270 consecutive games ... Since the three-point arc was added to college basketball for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one three in all but three games ... Tech has had nine games with only one three-pointer under **Seth Greenberg** ... Tech's longest streak of made three-pointers in a game is 277 consecutive games, from 1986-1995.

The State We're In

Virginia Tech is 418-304 (.579) all-time against schools from Virginia ... Tech was 1-2 against state schools last season ... The Hokies have played 13 schools from the state ... The only state Division I schools that Tech has not played are Norfolk State and Hampton ... The Hokies will play Norfolk State on Dec. 11 in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech holds winning records against 10 of the schools and even records against two others ... Tech is 23-14 against schools from Virginia under **Seth Greenberg**.

Coming Next Year

On Nov. 9, the Hokies announced the signing of two players to National Letters of Intent ... **Montrezl Harrell**, a 6-7 forward from Tarboro, N.C. and **Marshall Wood**, a 6-7 forward from Rustburg, Va. will join the program in the fall of 2012 ... Harrell is playing this season at Hargrave Military Academy in Chatham, Va. and Wood is playing at Rustburg H.S. near Lynchburg, Va.

What is a Hokie?

That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics ... The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute ... With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body ... Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today ... Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention ... Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Success is not a given. Only through hard-work and dedication, will success come. In his eighth season at Virginia Tech, Seth Greenberg has set the Hokies onto a course of winning and competing at the highest level.

Since joining the Hokies, Greenberg has established himself as not only a builder of programs, but as a coach who has an eye on the ultimate goal.

Greenberg has a career record of 367-276 in 21 seasons as a collegiate head coach and a 154-106 record in his eight seasons at Virginia Tech. Since coming to Blacksburg, Greenberg's Hokies have three wins over No. 1 ranked teams, including, most recently, a 64-60 victory over top-ranked Duke on Feb. 26, 2011 in Cassell Coliseum.

In the 2006-07 season, the Hokies engineered a historic sweep over North Carolina, including a 94-88 win over the Tar Heels in Cassell Coliseum when UNC was the top-ranked team in the country. Couple that victory against North Carolina with a 69-67 overtime win at No. 5 Duke the week before, the Hokies spent time atop the ACC standings for the first time ever. During the 2008-09 season, the win at No. 1 Wake Forest and an 80-77 win at No. 12 Clemson were added to the list. This past season, home wins over a pair of No. 23 teams, Miami and Wake Forest, continued the run of top 25 victories.

With Greenberg's win at Campbell on Nov. 23, 2009, he passed Chuck Noe into second place on the all-time wins list at Virginia Tech with 110 victories. Only Charlie Moir, with 213 victories, has more wins at Tech than Greenberg.

In his time at Virginia Tech, Greenberg is 3-3 against top-ranked teams, with all three losses coming on final possessions. Tech has made five consecutive post-season appearances and six in Greenberg's eight years in Blacksburg.

The Hokies moved into the new \$21 million practice facility in August 2009. This building brings Virginia Tech basketball the "WOW Factor!" that it needs to compete among the elite in college basketball and is the culmination of a vision that Greenberg has for the university and its basketball program.

In the past few years, Greenberg has received two awards that not only speak to his success on the court, but his works off the court as well. In September 2009, Greenberg was presented with the inaugural Al LoBalbo Award by his alma mater, Fairleigh Dickinson University. And in April, Greenberg was inducted into The National Jewish Sports Hall of Fame and Museum.

On March 11, 2008, Greenberg added another honor, as he was named the Atlantic Coast Conference's 2008 Coach of the Year. This marked the second time in four years that Greenberg earned the honor.

In the 2006-07 season, the Hokies defeated four nationally ranked teams and had a 3-0 record against teams ranked in the top-five. And as the 2010-11 season unfolds, Greenberg has the Hokies poised for even loftier achievements.

On April 3, 2003, the Hokies introduced Greenberg as their 27th head coach. A proven program builder, an admired and innovative tactician and an experienced recruiter, Greenberg took over the reigns of a Tech program that has made tremendous strides in his first six seasons in Blacksburg.

Greenberg earned his first major honor at Virginia Tech in 2005, being named the ACC Coach of the Year by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association. He was the fourth Hokie honored by the group for the team's play during the Hokies' inaugural ACC season. The Richmond

Times-Dispatch named Greenberg the Coach of the Year in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

The aggressive, up-tempo style that Greenberg installed in his first season with the Hokies has seen dividends and has brought a renewed sense of excitement to Cassell Coliseum, as well as to the "Hokie Nation." Perhaps the biggest influences seen in the program have been the work ethic and attention to details that Greenberg and his staff have instilled. And when speaking of hard work, the principle begins at the top, with Greenberg himself. Long hours of watching film, instructing players and developing the program, along with tirelessly working to promote the program and university while being involved in the community, have made Greenberg a popular face on the Blacksburg campus and in the "Hokie Nation."

Greenberg came to Virginia Tech from the University of South Florida, where he served as head coach for seven seasons. At USF, Greenberg had a record of 108-100. Prior to USF, Greenberg was the head coach at Long Beach State University, where his overall record was 105-70.

During his time at Long Beach State and USF, Greenberg's teams posted impressive records against major conference opponents. During his Long Beach State tenure there were wins over four nationally-ranked teams, including a 64-49 victory against then-No. 1 Kansas at Allen Fieldhouse in 1992-93. At South Florida, his teams were 2-0 against Ohio State, had two wins over Texas and won at Pittsburgh during the Panthers' run to the Sweet 16 in the 2001-02 season. The Bulls defeated eventual Final Four team Wisconsin in the 1999-2000 season.

A 1978 graduate of Fairleigh Dickinson, Greenberg was a four-year letter winner under head coach Al LoBalbo. His father, the late Ralph Greenberg, played at Long Island University under coaching legend Clair Bee, one of college basketball's all-time winningest coaches.

Greenberg began his coaching career as an assistant at Columbia in 1978. He moved to Pittsburgh two years later, where he made two trips to the NCAA Tournament in three years with the Panthers. He spent the 1983-84 season at Virginia, helping the Cavs reach the Final



Four before moving on to Miami as an assistant under future Virginia Tech head coach Bill Foster. At Miami, he helped revive a program that had been dormant for a number of years.

Greenberg first went to Long Beach State as associate head coach under Joe Harrington. Greenberg replaced him three years later when Harrington accepted the head coaching position at Colorado. In his six seasons at LBSU, Greenberg led the 49ers to two NCAA Tournament appearances and one NIT appearance. He led LBSU to two Big West Conference championships and one Big West regular-season title. While Greenberg was at LBSU, the 49ers defeated four nationally ranked teams. Greenberg also tutored future NBA players Bryon Russell, Lucious Harris and Juaquin Hawkins.

In the summer of 2004, Greenberg received a lofty honor when he was inducted into the Five Star Basketball Camp's Hall of Fame. The honor, shared by some of the greatest coaches like Rick Pitino and Hubie Brown, was bestowed for the many years that Greenberg has

been a part of the nation's top summer basketball camp as an instructor and guest speaker.

Greenberg has always been involved in charitable organizations and causes. In September of 2009, he was the winning head coach in the inaugural "Chairmen of the Boards" 3-on-3 charity basketball tournament to benefit Tuesday's Children in New York City. This group is the premiere non-profit organization serving the needs of the 9/11 community, providing a wide-range of programming from mentoring, to advocacy for children, to next-step life skills and leadership training for 9/11 families and rescue and recovery workers.

When confronted by the destruction of Hurricane Katrina, Greenberg knew he had to get involved. He served as the chairman of the organizing committee of AllCoachesCare.com, a major on-line sports auction that raised money for Habitat for Humanity and its efforts in helping to rebuild the Gulf Coast area. Working tirelessly, Greenberg helped the group acquire goods and services for the auction and also spent countless hours

speaking on television and radio and to media members getting the word out about the auction.

This past season, Greenberg took on a leadership role with "Shots from the Heart," an event that helped the American Heart Association raise money to fight heart disease. The event featured selected head coaches and assistant coaches in a bracketed free throw shooting contest.

Greenberg and his wife, Karen, are the parents of three daughters: Paige, 22, Ella, 19, and Jacqueline, 16. Paige graduated from Virginia Tech in May 2010 and Ella will be a junior cheerleader for the Hokies in the fall of 2011. Greenberg is active in a number of organizations and causes, including the Great American Teach-in, the American Heart Association, Coaches vs. Cancer and the Boys and Girls Club.
