Last Time Out: Minnesota 58, VT 55

The Hokies dropped a heart-breaker at Minnesota on Wednesday night, 58-55 ... The Hokies fell behind early, but took a 28-25 lead into intermission ... The game was close throughout the second half and the Gophers held a 58-55 lead in the final seconds ... **Erick Green**, who had been injured when knocked off the elevated playing court, returned, but his game-tying shot at the buzzer spun off the rim ... Green led all scorers with a career-high 25 points ... **Robert Brown** came off the bench to score 11 points and **Victor Davila** added 10 points and seven rebounds.

The Series vs. Kansas State

This is the second meeting between the two schools ... No. 3 Kansas State won the first meeting, 73-57, in Manhattan, Kans., last season ... Tech is 1-0 against Big 12 opponents this season and the Hokies are 6-8 all-time against schools currently in the Big 12.

Lots of Youth

Among the Hokies' 11 active scholarship players (10 plus **Marquis Rankin**, who should return to action in the next few games), the Hokies have two seniors, one junior, three sophomores and five freshmen ... The three sophomores had seen a combined 678 minutes of playing time up until this season ... None of the three had ever started a game and the trio had played a very few minutes of meaningful ACC action ... Add to the fact that redshirt senior **Dorenzo Hudson** had missed the majority of last season before gaining a medical redshirt and this team becomes an extremely inexperienced total group.

Bruised, Sore, But Okay

In the loss at Minnesota, **Erick Green** was knocked off the elevated playing surface at Williams Arena inside the final 30 seconds of action and had to be helped to the Virginia Tech bench, holding his shoulder ... Green returned to the game and his game-tying attempt at the buzzer spun off the rim ... Green suffered a bruised shoulder, but will play in today's game against Kansas State.

Green is Good

Erick Green was named to the 2011 NIT Season Tip-Off All-Tournament team ... Green scored 14 points in the loss to #5/5 Syracuse and led the Hokies with 18 points in the win over Oklahoma State.

Key to the Victor(y)

In the win over St. Bonaventure, **Victor Davila** was given the responsibility of stopping Andrew Nicholson, the Bonnies' star post player ... Davila held Nicholson to just nine points and seven rebounds, forcing him into a team-high four turnovers ... Davila added extra dividends, as he scored a season-high 13 points and hit all three of his free throw attempts ... Davila followed that performance with 10 points and seven rebounds in the loss at Minnesota.

Hudson Honored by ACC

Virginia Tech guard **Dorenzo Hudson** was named the Atlantic Coast Conference Co-Player of the Week for the week ending Nov. 20, 2011 ... Hudson, a redshirt senior from Charlotte, N.C., averaged 24.5 points and 2.5 assists in wins over Monmouth and FIU ... In the 78-63 win over FIU, he was eight-of-13 from the floor and a perfect 12-of-12 from the free throw line en route to scoring an ACC season-high 31 points in a victory that advanced the Hokies to the semifinals of the NIT Season Tip-Off.

Seth Greenberg is 104-31 as a head coach in Cassell Coliseum, good for a winning percentage of .770 ... Greenberg is 63-9 (.875) against non-conference competition in Cassell Coliseum.

They're Free, Aren't They

In the Virginia Tech win over FIU, **Dorenzo Hudson** hit all 12 of his free throw attempts ... That is a new career high for perfect free throw shooting in a game for Hudson and is the first game that a Hokie made at least 10 free throws in a game and shot 1.000 since Malcolm Delaney hit 14 of 14 from the line against Maryland on Feb. 15, 2011 ... In all, Delaney had nine career games of making at least 10 free throws in a game and shooting 1.000 ... This is the first time that Hudson has ever made all of his free throw attempts in a game and made 10-or-more free throws ... Hudson made 20-of-21 free throws in the win against Seton Hall on Jan. 2, 2010 in Cancun, Mexico, a game in which Hudson scored a career-high 41 points.

Perfect From the Line

In the loss at Minnesota, the Hokies made all seven of their free throw attempts in the game ... Tech was 5-5 in the first half and 2-2 in the second half.

More on Hudson's Free Throws

With his last two free throws in the win over Monmouth, his six for six performance in the loss to #5/5 Syracuse and making his first attempt in the win over Oklahoma State, **Dorenzo Hudson** made 21 consecutive free throw attempts ... He is 27 of 31 from the line so far this season, good for 87.1 percent.

Another Milestone

In Virginia Tech's win over Penn State last season, **Seth Greenberg** recorded his 350th victory as a collegiate head coach ... His record in 22 years as a head coach is 372-278 (.572).

The First Freshman

Dorian Finney-Smith accomplished something in the win over ETSU that has not happened in Blacksburg for quite some time ... His double-double of 10 points and 16 rebounds is the first time a Hokie freshman has accomplished that feat in their collegiate debut since Nov. 9, 2007, when Jeff Allen scored 19 points and had 10 rebounds against Elon ... Allen was the first since Dale Solomon accomplished that feat with 23 points and 11 rebounds in a win over Buffalo State in 1978 ... The last time a Virginia Tech freshman had at least 16 rebounds in any game was Ace Custis, who grabbed 16 rebounds against VMI on Dec. 9, 1993 ... Finney-Smith added his second career double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds in the win over FIU and recorded No. 3 with 10 points and 14 rebounds in the win over Oklahoma State.

Dorian Finney-Smith is the only player in the ACC in the top 10 in rebounding, assists and assist/turnover ratio.

What Brown Can Do For Us

Robert Brown came out of the blocks fast for the Hokies ... In his first two collegiate games, Brown scored 12 points in the win over ETSU and 19 points to lead the Hokies in scoring in the win over Monmouth ... He is currently third on the team in scoring.

The Big Ten/ACC Challenge

After the loss at Minnesota, the Hokies are now 2-5 in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge ... The ACC leads the series, 10-3, but the Big Ten has won the last three Challenges.

Close Games

The Hokies are 48-45 under **Seth Greenberg** in games that have been decided in overtime or by five-or-fewer points ... Tech is 1-1 in such games this season.

Hudson Tops the List

Dorenzo Hudson scored 31 points in the win over FIU on Nov. 15 ... That marked the first time this season that an ACC player scored 30-or-more-points in a game ... It also marked the first time since Malcolm Delaney scored 33 points in the home win over Georgia Tech on Feb. 13, 2011, that a Hokie scored 30-or-more points in a game ... The 31 points is the second-highest point total for Hudson in a game ... His career high in scoring is 41 points in an overtime win over Seton Hall in Cancun, Mexico on Jan. 2, 2010.

Green Returns

Erick Green strained his right achilles tendon in practice on Nov. 4 and missed the season-opening win over ETSU ... He returned to action in the win over Monmouth, scoring 11 points and leading the team with five assists in 23 minutes of action and had 12 points in 25 minutes of action in the win over FIU ... In the loss to #5/5 Syracuse, Green played a season-high 36 minutes and scored 14 points and he scored 18 points in 39 minutes in the win over Oklahoma State ... Green scored a team-high 19 points in the win over St. Bonaventure and a career-high 25 points in the loss at Minnesota ... He has increased his scoring production in each game this season.

Raines Makes the Most of His Time

Cadarian Raines was limited to just 12 minutes of action in the win over Oklahoma State, but the sophomore post made the most of his minutes ... Raines grabbed a career-high nine rebounds in that time and also blocked three Cowboy shots ... In the win over St. Bonaventure, Raines grabbed four rebounds in just eight minutes of action.

Virginia Tech has added walk-on guard **Will Johnston** to the active roster ... Johnston, a 6-3 freshman guard, has been practicing with the team for the past week.

We'll See You Soon

Prior to Thanksgiving of 2010, the Hokies and Cowboys had never met in basketball ... Tech defeated OSU in Anaheim last year and in Madison Square Garden on Nov. 25 ... Tech will also travel to Stillwater on New Years Eve to face the Cowboys and the two teams will meet in Blacksburg next season.

Tech Loves the Garden

Madison Square Garden has always been special to the Hokies ... Since **Seth Greenberg** took over as the Hokies' head coach in 2003, Tech has played nine games in "The World's Most Famous Arena" and has a 7-2 record in those games ... Tech has also won two Holiday Festivals in this building ... All in all, the Hokies are 14-5 in MSG and won two NIT post-season titles, in 1973 and 1995.

Chaney Out

Virginia Tech forward **Allan Chaney** has been denied medical clearance to return to practice and competition by the Virginia Tech Sports Medicine Department due to continued complications from a cardiac condition ... Since his first diagnosis, Chaney underwent a thorough and exhaustive course of evaluation and treatment ... As a result of his medical condition, the Virginia Tech medical staff has determined that in order to minimize his risk for further complications from his condition, Chaney will not be cleared to return to basketball.

Rankin Nears Return

Freshman point guard **Marquis Rankin** will miss the first few games of the season following knee surgery on Oct. 6 ... Rankin injured the knee during preseason drills ... The surgery was performed by team orthopaedic surgeon Dr. Marc Siegel at Lewis Gale Hospital at Montgomery in Blacksburg, Va. ... The surgery was to clean up cartilage in the knee ... He has returned to practice and is being continuously evaluated by the Virginia Tech Sports Medicine staff.

A Good Five Years

In the previous five seasons, Tech is 45-35 in ACC action, tied for third best in the ACC ... Only Duke (58-22) and UNC (57-23) have better records ... Tech is tied with Maryland at 45-35.

Since Expansion (And Beyond)

To take the previous note a step further, since the ACC expanded to include Virginia Tech and Miami in 2004 (and BC in 2005), the Hokies are fourth in most conference regular season victories ... Tech is 57-55 in that stretch ... Only Duke (83-29), North Carolina (83-29) and Maryland (60-52) have more wins in that span ... Since the start of the 2006-07 season, the Hokies have the fourth-best victory total in ACC regular season games (45-35 in that span) (as the end of the 2010-11 regular season).

Hudson Back on Track

Dorenzo Hudson returned to action for the Hokies in the win over ETSU ... The redshirt senior missed most of last season with a foot injury and gained a medical redshirt ... Even in a hobbled state, Hudson averaged 10.4 points per game in the 2010-11 season before being shutdown ... As a healthy junior in the 2009-10 season, Hudson earned third team All-ACC honors, while averaging 15.2 points per game ... Statistically in that season, he was the most improved player in the ACC and his 41 points in the Hokies' win against Seton Hall in Cancun was tied for the most points by an ACC player that season ... Hudson scored nine points in the season opening win over ETSU and doubled that with 18 points in the win over Monmouth ... In the win over FIU, Hudson scored a game-high 31 points and had 13 points in the loss to #5/5 Syracuse.

We Like Threes

The Hokies have hit at least one three-pointer in every game since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... Tech has now hit a three in 277 consecutive games, tying the streak of 277 consecutive games, from 1986-1995 ... Since the three-point arc was added to college basketball for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one three in all but three games ... The last time that the Hokies did not record a three-point field goal in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003 ... Tech has had nine games with only one three-pointer under **Seth Greenberg**.

Versus the Best

Seth Greenberg entered this season with four career wins against No. 1-ranked teams and three of those have come since Virginia Tech joined the ACC in 2004 ... The three ACC wins against No. 1-ranked teams (all three opponents were ACC foes) ranks Greenberg tied for sixth among all-time ACC coaches ... The three victories are tied for third (with Florida State's Leonard Hamilton) among current ACC coaches.

Hot Shooting

In the win over Monmouth, the Hokies shot 62.5 percent from the field ... That is the highest single-game percentage for the Hokies since a 69.2 percent performance in the win over Mount St. Mary's last season ... Tech was 66.7 percent from three-point range ... That is the highest single-game percentage since shooting 66.7 percent from three-point range in the win at Wake Forest last season ... The last time the Hokies shot better than 66.7 percent from three-point territory was 68.8 percent against Wisconsin on Dec. 1, 2008 ... Tech followed that with a 51.9 percent shooting night in the win over FIU ... That marks the first time since the wins over Wake Forest and Maryland (on Jan. 15 and 20, 2011) that the Hokies have recorded back-to-back games of better than 50 percent shooting from the field.

Lights, Camera, Hokies

Tech is 96-92 on television under **Seth Greenberg** ... The Hokies were 16-11 last season and are 2-2 this season ... The Hokies made a school-record 30 appearances in the 2008-09 season and made a then-school record 26 television appearances the year before ... With ESPN3.com's broadcast of the Hokies' season-opening wins over ETSU and Monmouth and the win over St. Bonaventure, Tech is 3-2 in internet streamed games.

Coming Next Year

On Nov. 9, the Hokies announced the signing of two players to National Letters of Intent ... **Montrezl Harrell**, a 6-7 forward from Tarboro, N.C., and **Marshall Wood**, a 6-7 forward from Rustburg, Va., will join the program in the fall of 2012 ... Harrell is playing this season at Hargrave Military Academy in Chatham, Va., and Wood is playing at Rustburg H.S. near Lynchburg, Va.

What is a Hokie?

That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics ... The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute ... With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body ... Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today ... Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention ... Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Seth Greenberg is 102-31 all-time coaching in Cassell Coliseum ... Here is a year-by-year breakdown.

Graduation cost the Hokies two of the most prolific players in school history, plus a two-year starter, Malcolm Delaney, Jeff Allen and Terrell Bell ... Tech lost 63.3 percent of its scoring from last season, along with 63.8 percent of its assists, 61.9 percent of its rebounds and 58.4 percent of its minutes played.

The Hokies vs. No. 1

With the win over #1 Duke last season, Virginia Tech is now 4-7 all-time against the No. 1-ranked team in the AP poll ... Tech is 3-3 in such games since joining the ACC and is 3-1 against top-ranked teams at home and in Cassell Coliseum ... The Hokies have won their last two home games against a No. 1 team ... Tech is 1-1 all-time against Duke when the Blue Devils are No. 1.

500 in the Cassell

The Hokies have a 511-150 overall record in the Cassell, good for a .773 winning percentage ... Tech is 4-0 this season and was 12-4 in Cassell last season, the 50th year for the arena ... The win over Florida State on Jan. 8, 2011, was the 500th victory in the building ... The win over FSU in 2008 marked the Hokies' 600th game played in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech defeated Rhode Island, 86-63, on Nov. 20, 2002, in its 500th game in the arena ... Tech has had just one break-even home season and one losing season in Cassell Coliseum ... The 17 victories for the Hokies at home in the 2009-10 season set a new Cassell Coliseum and school record.

New Faces

There are a few new faces gracing the Virginia Tech men's basketball program this season ... Freshmen **C.J. Barksdale, Robert Brown, Dorian Finney-Smith, Marquis Rankin** and **Joey van Zegeren** have joined the team, along with walk-on **Joey Racer** ... **James Johnson** has been promoted to associate head coach and **Rob Ehsan** has joined the staff as an assistant coach ... **Jeff Wolbrun** joins the staff as Director of Men's Basketball Operations and **John Janovsky** is the new Video Coordinator.

Hokies vs. Ranked Teams

With the loss to #5/5 Syracuse in the semifinals of the NIT Season Tip-Off, the Hokies are 11-32 against nationally ranked teams since joining the ACC for the 2004-05 season and 12-36 against nationally ranked teams under **Seth Greenberg** ... Tech is 28-140 all-time against teams ranked in the AP poll ... These numbers are only for teams ranked in the AP poll.

Hokies in Overtime

The Hokies are now 56-42 all-time in overtime games ... Virginia Tech was 1-2 last season in overtime games ... Tech is 25-20 in road overtime games, 25-9 in home overtime games and 6-13 on neutral courts ... Tech is 14-7 in all overtime games under **Seth Greenberg** and 10-2 in ACC overtime games ... The last time the Hokies lost a true road overtime game was Feb. 11, 2006, when Tech fell to Virginia, 81-77, in University Hall ... Tech is 5-8 in double overtime games and 1-2 in triple overtime games.

Hostile Crowds

The announced crowd of 12,528 at Kansas State last season was the largest crowd to witness a Virginia Tech non-conference away or neutral site game since Dec. 21, 2006, when the Hokies defeated Seton Hall, 80-61, in Madison Square Garden in front of 19,528 ... The last time the Hokies played in front of a larger crowd on a non-conference opponent's home court was Nov. 28, 2005, when the Hokies fell to Ohio State in the Shottenstein Center in front of an announced crowd of 13,218.

Ty is Honored

Tyrone Garland was named to the 2011 All-ACC Academic team for men's basketball ... The guard from Philadelphia was one of 13 players on the team.

Hokies Pass 1,300

Virginia Tech is now 1333-1093 all-time in collegiate basketball, good for a .549 winning percentage ... This is the Hokies' 103rd season of men's basketball.

Head Coach Seth Greenberg



Success is not a given. Only through hard-work and dedication, will success come. In his eighth season at Virginia Tech, Seth Greenberg has set the Hokies onto a course of winning and competing at the highest level.

Since joining the Hokies, Greenberg has established himself as not only a builder of programs, but as a coach who has an eye on the ultimate goal.

Greenberg has a career record of 372-278, now in his 22nd season as a collegiate head coach and a 159-108 record in his ninth season at Virginia Tech. Since coming to Blacksburg, Greenberg's Hokies have three wins over No. 1 ranked teams, including, most recently, a 64-60 victory over top-ranked Duke on Feb. 26, 2011 in Cassell Coliseum.

In the 2006-07 season, the Hokies engineered a historic sweep over North Carolina, including a 94-88 win over the Tar Heels in Cassell Coliseum when UNC was the top-ranked team in the country. Couple that victory against North Carolina with a 69-67 overtime win at No. 5 Duke the week before, the Hokies spent time atop the ACC standings for the first time ever. During the 2008-09 season, the win at No. 1 Wake Forest and an 80-77 win at No. 12 Clemson were added to the list. This past season, home wins over a pair of No. 23 teams, Miami and Wake Forest, continued the run of

top 25 victories.

With Greenberg's win at Campbell on Nov. 23, 2009, he passed Chuck Noe into second place on the all-time wins list at Virginia Tech with 110 victories. Only Charlie Moir, with 213 victories, has more wins at Tech than Greenberg.

In his time at Virginia Tech, Greenberg is 3-3 against top-ranked teams, with all three losses coming on final possessions. Tech has made five consecutive post-season appearances and six in Greenberg's eight years in Blacksburg.

The Hokies moved into the new \$21 million practice facility in August 2009. This building brings Virginia Tech basketball the "WOW Factor!" that it needs to compete among the elite in college basketball and is the culmination of a vision that Greenberg has for the university and its basketball program.

In the past few years, Greenberg has received two awards that not only speak to his success on the court, but his works off the court as well. In September 2009, Greenberg was presented with the inaugural Al LoBalbo Award by his alma mater, Fairleigh Dickinson University. And in April, Greenberg was inducted into The National Jewish Sports Hall of Fame and Museum.

On March 11, 2008, Greenberg added another honor, as he was named the Atlantic Coast Conference's 2008 Coach of the Year. This marked the second time in four years that Greenberg earned the honor.

In the 2006-07 season, the Hokies defeated four nationally ranked teams and had a 3-0 record against teams ranked in the top-five. And as the 2010-11 season unfolds, Greenberg has the Hokies poised for even loftier achievements.

On April 3, 2003, the Hokies introduced Greenberg as their 27th head coach. A proven program builder, an admired and innovative tactician and an experienced recruiter, Greenberg took over the reigns of a Tech program that has made tremendous strides in his first six seasons in Blacksburg.

Greenberg earned his first major honor at Virginia Tech in 2005, being named the ACC Coach of the Year by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association. He was the fourth Hokie honored by

the group for the team's play during the Hokies' inaugural ACC season. The Richmond Times-Dispatch named Greenberg the Coach of the Year in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

The aggressive, up-tempo style that Greenberg installed in his first season with the Hokies has seen dividends and has brought a renewed sense of excitement to Cassell Coliseum, as well as to the "Hokie Nation." Perhaps the biggest influences seen in the program have been the work ethic and attention to details that Greenberg and his staff have instilled. And when speaking of hard work, the principle begins at the top, with Greenberg himself. Long hours of watching film, instructing players and developing the program, along with tirelessly working to promote the program and university while being involved in the community, have made Greenberg a popular face on the Blacksburg campus and in the "Hokie Nation."

Greenberg came to Virginia Tech from the University of South Florida, where he served as head coach for seven seasons. At USF, Greenberg had a record of 108-100. Prior to USF, Greenberg was the head coach at Long Beach State University, where his overall record was 105-70.

During his time at Long Beach State and USF, Greenberg's teams posted impressive records against major conference opponents. During his Long Beach State tenure there were wins over four nationally-ranked teams, including a 64-49 victory against then-No. 1 Kansas at Allen Fieldhouse in 1992-93. At South Florida, his teams were 2-0 against Ohio State, had two wins over Texas and won at Pittsburgh during the Panthers' run to the Sweet 16 in the 2001-02 season. The Bulls defeated eventual Final Four team Wisconsin in the 1999-2000 season.

A 1978 graduate of Fairleigh Dickinson, Greenberg was a four-year letter winner under head coach Al LoBalbo. His father, the late Ralph Greenberg, played at Long Island University under coaching legend Clair Bee, one of college basketball's all-time winningest coaches.

Greenberg began his coaching career as an assistant at Columbia in 1978. He

moved to Pittsburgh two years later, where he made two trips to the NCAA Tournament in three years with the Panthers. He spent the 1983-84 season at Virginia, helping the Cavs reach the Final Four before moving on to Miami as an assistant under future Virginia Tech head coach Bill Foster. At Miami, he helped revive a program that had been dormant for a number of years.

Greenberg first went to Long Beach State as associate head coach under Joe Harrington. Greenberg replaced him three years later when Harrington accepted the head coaching position at Colorado. In his six seasons at LBSU, Greenberg led the 49ers to two NCAA Tournament appearances and one NIT appearance. He led LBSU to two Big West Conference championships and one Big West regular-season title. While Greenberg was at LBSU, the 49ers defeated four nationally ranked teams. Greenberg also tutored future NBA players Bryon Russell, Lucious Harris and Juaquin Hawkins.

In the summer of 2004, Greenberg received a lofty honor when he was inducted into the Five Star Basketball Camp's Hall of Fame. The honor, shared by some of the greatest coaches like Rick

Pitino and Hubie Brown, was bestowed for the many years that Greenberg has been a part of the nation's top summer basketball camp as an instructor and guest speaker.

Greenberg has always been involved in charitable organizations and causes. In September of 2009, he was the winning head coach in the inaugural "Chairmen of the Boards" 3-on-3 charity basketball tournament to benefit Tuesday's Children in New York City. This group is the premiere non-profit organization serving the needs of the 9/11 community, providing a wide-range of programming from mentoring, to advocacy for children, to next-step life skills and leadership training for 9/11 families and rescue and recovery workers.

When confronted by the destruction of Hurricane Katrina, Greenberg knew he had to get involved. He served as the chairman of the organizing committee of AllCoachesCare.com, a major on-line sports auction that raised money for Habitat for Humanity and its efforts in helping to rebuild the Gulf Coast area. Working tirelessly, Greenberg helped the group acquire goods and services for the auction and also spent countless hours speaking on television and radio and to

media members getting the word out about the auction.

This past season, Greenberg took on a leadership role with "Shots from the Heart," an event that helped the American Heart Association raise money to fight heart disease. The event featured selected head coaches and assistant coaches in a bracketed free throw shooting contest.

Greenberg and his wife, Karen, are the parents of three daughters: Paige, 22, Ella, 19, and Jacqueline, 16. Paige graduated from Virginia Tech in May 2010 and Ella will be a junior cheerleader for the Hokies in the fall of 2011. Greenberg is active in a number of organizations and causes, including the Great American Teach-in, the American Heart Association, Coaches vs. Cancer and the Boys and Girls Club.

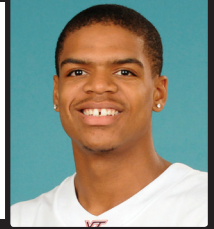

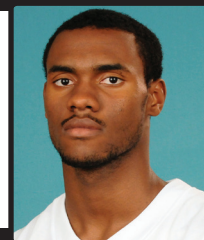

In a day of impressive debuts, Tech began the 2011-12 season with a 64-53 win over East Tennessee State, moving to 9-0 in home openers under head coach Seth Greenberg. **Dorian Finney-Smith** highlighted the season-opening victory as he became the first freshman since Jeff Allen in 2007 to notch a double-double in his first game. Finney-Smith began his collegiate career with 10 points and 16 rebounds against the Bucs, while his classmate **Robert Brown** came off the bench for Tech and dropped 12 points in the outing.

Without point guard **Erick Green** (strained Achilles) the Hokies did see the return of **Dorengo Hudson**, who missed most of the 2010-11 season with a foot injury. Green's replacement in the starting line-up, sophomore **Tyrone Garland**, did not disappoint in his first career start. Garland scored 13 points, while going 7-of-8 from the line.

Finney-Smith added an impressive five assists for the Hokies in his debut, while **Victor Davila** began his senior season with seven points and six boards. Adam Sollazzo led ETSU with 13 points.

Punching its ticket to New York City, Virginia Tech earned a spot in the NIT Season Tip-Off Semifinals with a 78-63 win over Florida International in the second round of the tournament at Cassell Coliseum. Senior **Dorengo Hudson** spearheaded the Tech offense with 31 points, marking the most by him since his 41-point outburst against Seton Hall on Jan. 2, 2010, in Mexico.

Virginia Tech fell to Minnesota, 58-55, in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge in Williams Arena on Wednesday night. Tech is now 5-2 on the season, while Minnesota improves to 7-1 overall.

Tech fell behind early, but fought back and took a 28-25 lead into intermission. The Hokies and Golden Gophers battled back and forth throughout the second half, before Minnesota took a 56-55 lead with 18 seconds remaining on a pair of free throws by Julian Welch. Welch made two more free throws with 6.4 seconds remaining to give the Golden Gophers the lead, 58-56. **Erick Green**, who had been knocked off the elevated court in William Arena in the final half minute of action, attempted to hit a game tying three-pointer at the buzzer, but the ball spun off the rim and Minnesota claimed the victory.

Green scored a career-high 25 points to lead all scorers. Robert Brown added 13 points and **Victor Davila** scored 10 points and grabbed seven rebounds. Welch led the Golden Gophers with 15 points. Green made four of eight from three-point range and handed-out a team-high four assists without committing a turnover. He suffered a bruised shoulder on the fall, but was able to return in the final seconds of play.

Tech out rebounded Minnesota, 32-30, but shot just 37.7 percent from the floor. The Hokies made all seven free throw attempts, but just two came in the second half.
