## NOTING THE HOKIES

#### **Entering This Evening's Game**

Virginia Tech is 5-3 on the season.

Rhode Island is 1-7 on the season.

Tonight's game is televised, but only in Rhode Island.

#### The Loss to Kansas State

The Hokies lost to Kansas State, 69-61, in Cassell Coliseum on Sunday.

Robert Brown led the Hokies with 15 points.

Erick Green scored 14 points in the loss and grabbed a career-high seven rebounds.

#### **Greenberg Facts**

**Seth Greenberg** is 159-109 (.593) at Virginia Tech and 372-279 (.571) in his 22nd season as a collegiate head coach.

Greenberg is 104-32 (.765) as a head coach in Cassell Coliseum.

#### **Interesting Side Notes**

Virginia Tech has led at the half in every game this season.

**Dorenzo Hudson** leads all active ACC players in career minutes played (2,720).

Virginia Tech's 45-point victory over Monmouth is the largest margin of victory by an ACC team this season.

#### **Rankin Returns**

**Marquis Rankin**, who had knee surgery on Oct. 6, returned to action in the Hokies' loss to Kansas State.

Rankin scored two points and had one assist in seven minutes of action.

#### DFS Shines in the Early Going

**Dorian Finney-Smith** leads ACC freshmen in rebounding, assists and double-doubles.

Finney-Smith's three double-doubles are tied for second in the ACC this season.

DFS has three of the top five rebounding performances by and ACC freshman this season. He also has two of the three five-assist games by an ACC freshman this season.

#### **Thompson Out for the Season**

Redshirt senior forward, **JT Thompson**, will miss the 2011-12 season after suffering a tear to the ACL in his right knee on Nov. 2. He missed the entire 2010-11 season with the same injury to his left knee.

#### Last Time Out: Kansas State 69, VT 61

The Hokies lost their first home game of the season, 69-61, to Kansas State on Sunday evening ... Tech led 28-22 at the intermission, but the Wildcats opened the second half on a 12-2 run and never trailed after that ... Robert Brown came off the bench to lead the Hokies with 15 points and Erick Green added 14 points and a career-high seven rebounds in the loss.

#### The Series vs. Rhode Island

This is the 11th meeting between the two schools ... URI won the last meeting, 79-72, in the quarterfinals of the 2010 NIT in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech is 2-1 in road games in the series and this is Tech's first trip to the Ryan Center ... Tech and Rhode Island were both members of the Atlantic 10 from 1996-2000 and Tech was 2-3 in A-10 conference games ... Tech is 1-0 against A-10 teams so far this season, after a 73-64 win over St. Bonaventure on Nov. 27 ... Tech is 175-133 in games against schools currently in the Atlantic 10.

#### Lots of Youth

Among the Hokies' 11 active scholarship players (10 plus Marquis Rankin, who returned to action on Sunday), the Hokies have two seniors, one junior, three sophomores and five freshmen ... The three sophomores had seen a combined 678 minutes of playing time up until this season ... None of the three had ever started a game and the trio had played a very few minutes of meaningful ACC action ... Add to the fact that redshirt senior **Dorenzo Hudson** had missed the majority of last season before gaining a medical redshirt and this team becomes an extremely inexperienced total group.

#### **Rankin Returns**

Freshman point quard Marquis Rankin returned to action in the loss to Kansas State

... He had missed the team's first seven games following knee surgery on Oct. 6 ... Rankin injured the knee during preseason drills ... The surgery was performed by team orthopaedic surgeon Dr. Marc Siegel at Lewis Gale Hospital at Montgomery in Blacksburg,

Va. ... The surgery was to clean up cartilage in the knee ... He scored two points and had an assist in seven minutes of action.

#### **Moving Past 100**

**Seth Greenberg** is 104-32 as a head coach in Cassell Coliseum, good for a winning percentage of .765 ... Greenberg is 63-10 (.863) against non-conference competition in Cassell Coliseum.

#### We Like Threes

The Hokies have hit at least one threepointer in every game since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... Tech has now hit a three in 278 consecutive games, passing the streak of 277 consecutive games, from 1986-1995 ... Since the three-point arc was added to college basketball for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one three in all but three games ... The last time that the Hokies did not record a three-point field goal in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003 ... Tech has had nine games with only one threepointer under Seth Greenberg.

#### Bruised, Sore, But Okay

In the loss at Minnesota, Erick Green was knocked off the elevated playing surface at

Williams Arena inside the final 30 seconds of action and had to be helped to the Virginia Tech bench, holding his shoulder ... Green returned to the game and his game-tying attempt at the buzzer spun off the rim ... Green suffered a bruised shoulder, but started against Kansas State,

scoring 14 points and grabbing a career-high seven rebounds.

#### **Green is Good**

Erick Green was named to the 2011 NIT Season Tip-Off All-Tournament team ... Green scored 14 points in the loss to #5/5 Syracuse and led the Hokies with 18 points in the win over Oklahoma State.

#### They're Free, Aren't They

In the Virginia Tech win over FIU, **Dorenzo Hudson** hit all 12 of his free throw attempts ... That is a new career high for perfect free throw shooting in a game for Hudson and

is the first game that a Hokie made at least 10 free throws in a game and shot 1.000 since Malcolm Delaney hit 14 of 14 from the line against Maryland on Feb. 15, 2011 ... In all, Delaney had nine career games of making at least 10 free throws in a game and shooting 1.000 ... This is the

first time that Hudson has ever made all of his free throw attempts in a game and made 10-or-more free throws ... Hudson made 20of-21 free throws in the win against Seton Hall on Jan. 2, 2010 in Cancun, Mexico, a game in which Hudson scored a career-high 41 points.

#### **Perfect From the Line**

In the loss at Minnesota, the Hokies made all seven of their free throw attempts in the game ... Tech was 5-5 in the first half and 2-2 in the second half.

#### More on Free Throws

The Hokies have four players that have played 200 or more minutes this season ... Three of those players, Erick Green, Dorenzo Hudson and Jarell Eddie, are shooting .800 from the line or better ... Eddie is shooting .895 from the line.

#### More on Hudson's Free Throws

With his last two free throws in the win over Monmouth, his six for six performance in the loss to #5/5 Syracuse and making his first attempt in the win over Oklahoma State, **Dorenzo Hudson** made 21 consecutive free throw attempts ... He is 28 of 33 from the line so far this season, good for 84.8 percent.

#### **Another Milestone**

In Virginia Tech's win over Penn State last season, Seth Greenberg recorded his 350th victory as a collegiate head coach ... His record in 22 years as a head coach is 372-279 (.571).



#### The First Freshman

**Dorian Finney-Smith** accomplished something in the win over ETSU that has not happened in Blacksburg for quite some time ... His double-double of 10 points and 16 rebounds is the first time a Hokie freshman has accomplished that feat in their collegiate

debut since Nov. 9, 2007, when Jeff Allen scored 19 points and had 10 rebounds against Elon ... Allen was the first since Dale Solomon accomplished that feat with 23 points and 11 rebounds in a win over Buffalo State in 1978 ... The last time a Virginia Tech freshman had at least 16

rebounds in any game was Ace Custis, who grabbed 16 rebounds against VMI on Dec. 9, 1993 ... Finney-Smith added his second career double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds in the win over FIU and recorded No. 3 with 10 points and 14 rebounds in the win over Oklahoma State.



#### More on DFS

**Dorian Finney-Smith** is the only player in the ACC in the top 10 in rebounding and assists ... He leads the Hokies in rebounds, blocked shots and total assists.

#### What Brown Can Do For Us

Robert Brown came out of the blocks

fast for the Hokies ... In his first two collegiate games, Brown scored 12 points in the win over ETSU and 19 points to lead the Hokies in scoring in the win over Monmouth ... He is currently third on the team in scoring after a 13 point performance at Minnesota and leading the team with 15 points against Kansas State.

#### **Raines Makes the Most of His Time**

**Cadarian Raines** was limited to just 12 minutes of action in the win over Oklahoma

State, but the sophomore post made the most of his minutes ... Raines grabbed a career-high nine rebounds in that time and also blocked three Cowboy shots ... In the win over St. Bonaventure, Raines grabbed four rebounds in just eight minutes of action

... In the loss to Kansas State, Raines had five rebounds and six points in 15 minutes of action.

#### **Hudson Topped the List**

Dorenzo Hudson scored 31 points in the win over FIU on Nov. 15 ... That marked the first time this season that an ACC player scored 30-or-more-points in a game ... It also marked the first time since Malcolm Delaney scored 33 points in the home win over Georgia Tech on Feb. 13, 2011, that a Hokie scored 30-or-more points in a game ... The 31 points is the second-highest point total for Hudson in a game ... His career high in scoring is 41 points in an overtime win over Seton Hall in Cancun, Mexico on Jan. 2, 2010 ... Hudson currently ranks tied for third in single game scoring by an ACC player this season.

#### We'll See You Soon

Prior to Thanksgiving of 2010, the Hokies and Oklahoma State had never met in basketball ... Tech defeated OSU in Anaheim last year and in Madison Square Garden on Nov. 25 ... Tech will also travel to Stillwater on New Years Eve to face the Cowboys and the two teams will meet in Blacksburg next season.

#### **Green Returns**

Erick Green strained his right achilles tendon in practice on Nov. 4 and missed the season-opening win over ETSU ... He returned to action in the win over Monmouth, scoring 11 points and leading the team with five assists in 23 minutes of action and had 12 points in 25 minutes of action in the win over FIU ... In the loss to #5/5 Syracuse, Green played a season-high 36 minutes and scored 14 points and he scored 18 points in 39 minutes in the win over Oklahoma State ... Green scored a team-high 19 points in the win over St. Bonaventure and a career-high 25 points in the loss at Minnesota ... In the loss to Kansas State, Green scored 14 points and grabbed a career-high seven rebounds.

#### **Close Games**

The Hokies are 48-45 under **Seth Greenberg** in games that have been decided in overtime or by five-or-fewer points ... Tech is 1-1 in such games this season.

#### **Tech Loves the Garden**

Madison Square Garden has always been special to the Hokies ... Since **Seth Greenberg** took over as the Hokies' head coach in 2003, Tech has played nine games in "The World's Most Famous Arena" and has a 7-2 record in those games ... Tech has also won two Holiday Festivals in this building ... All in all, the Hokies are 14-5 in MSG and won two NIT post-season titles, in 1973 and 1995.

#### **Chaney Out**

Virginia Tech forward

from a cardiac condition ... Since his first diagnosis, Chaney underwent a thorough and exhaustive course of evaluation and treatment ... As a result of his medical condition, the Virginia Tech medical staff has determined that in order to minimize his risk for further complications from his condition, Chaney will not be cleared to return to basketball.

#### A Good Five Years

In the previous five seasons, Tech is 45-35 in ACC action, tied for third best in the ACC ... Only Duke (58-22) and UNC (57-23) have better records ... Tech is tied with Maryland at 45-35.

#### Since Expansion (And Beyond)

To take the previous note a step further, since the ACC expanded to include Virginia Tech and Miami in 2004 (and BC in 2005), the Hokies are fourth in most conference regular season victories ... Tech is 57-55 in that stretch ... Only Duke (83-29), North Carolina (83-29) and Maryland (60-52) have more wins in that span ... Since the start of the 2006-07 season, the Hokies have the fourth-best victory total in ACC regular season games (45-35 in that span) (as the end of the 2010-11 regular season).

#### **Hudson Back on Track**

**Dorenzo Hudson** returned to action for the Hokies in the win over ETSU ... The redshirt senior missed most of last season with a foot injury and gained a medical redshirt ... Even in a hobbled state, Hudson averaged 10.4 points per game in the 2010-11 season before being shutdown ... As a healthy junior in the 2009-10 season, Hudson earned third team All-ACC honors, while averaging 15.2 points per game ... Statistically in that season, he was the most improved player in the ACC and his 41 points in the Hokies' win against Seton Hall in Cancun was tied for the most points by an ACC player that season ... Hudson scored nine points in the season opening win over ETSU and doubled that with 18 points in the win over Monmouth ... In the win over FIU, Hudson scored a game-high 31 points and had 13 points in the loss to #5/5 Syracuse.

#### **Hudson Honored by ACC**

Virginia Tech guard **Dorenzo Hudson** was named the Atlantic Coast Conference Co-Player of the Week for the week ending Nov. 20, 2011 ... Hudson, a redshirt senior from Charlotte, N.C., averaged 24.5 points and 2.5 assists in wins over Monmouth and FIU ... In the 78-63 win over FIU, he was eight-of-13 from the floor and a perfect 12-of-12 from the free throw line en route to scoring an ACC season-high 31 points in a victory that advanced the Hokies to the semifinals of the NIT Season Tip-Off.

#### **Versus the Best**

**Seth Greenberg** entered this season with four career wins against No. 1-ranked teams and three of those have come since Virginia Tech joined the ACC in 2004 ... The three ACC wins against No. 1-ranked teams (all three opponents were ACC foes) ranks Greenberg tied for sixth among all-time ACC coaches ... The three victories are tied for third (with Florida State's Leonard Hamilton) among current ACC coaches.

#### **Hot Shooting**

In the win over Monmouth, the Hokies shot 62.5 percent from the field ... That is the highest single-game percentage for the Hokies since a 69.2 percent performance in the win over Mount St. Mary's last season ... Tech was 66.7 percent from three-point range ... That is the highest single-game percentage since shooting 66.7 percent from three-point range in the win at Wake Forest last season ... The last time the Hokies shot better than 66.7 percent from three-point territory was 68.8 percent against Wisconsin on Dec. 1, 2008 ... Tech followed that with a 51.9 percent shooting night in the win over FIU ... That marks the first time since the wins over Wake Forest and Maryland (on Jan. 15 and 20, 2011) that the Hokies have recorded back-to-back games of better than 50 percent shooting from the field.

#### A Lot to Lose

Graduation cost the Hokies two of the most prolific players in school history, plus a two-year starter, Malcolm Delaney, Jeff Allen and Terrell Bell ... Tech lost 63.3 percent of its scoring from last season, along with 63.8 percent of its assists, 61.9 percent of its rebounds and 58.4 percent of its minutes played.

#### **Coming Next Year**

On Nov. 9, the Hokies announced the signing of two players to National Letters of Intent ... **Montrezl Harrell**, a 6-7 forward from Tarboro, N.C., and **Marshall Wood**, a 6-7 forward from Rustburg, Va., will join the program in the fall of 2012 ... Harrell is playing this season at Hargrave Military Academy in Chatham, Va., and Wood is playing at Rustburg H.S. near Lynchburg, Va.

#### What is a Hokie?

That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics ... The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute ... With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body ... Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today ... Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention ... Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

## Head Coach Seth Greenberg



Success is not a given. Only through hard-work and dedication, will success come. In his eighth season at Virginia Tech, Seth Greenberg has set the Hokies onto a course of winning and competing at the highest level.

Since joining the Hokies, Greenberg has established himself as not only a builder of programs, but as a coach who has an eye on the ultimate goal.

Greenberg has a career record of 372-279, now in his 22nd season as a collegiate head coach and a 159-109 record in his ninth season at Virginia Tech. Since coming to Blacksburg, Greenberg's Hokies have three wins over No. 1 ranked teams, including, most recently, a 64-60 vicory over topranked Duke on Feb. 26, 2011 in Cassell Coliseum.

In the 2006-07 season, the Hokies engineered a historic sweep over North Carolina, including a 94-88 win over the Tar Heels in Cassell Coliseum when UNC was the top-ranked team in the country. Couple that victory against North Carolina with a 69-67 overtime win at No. 5 Duke the week before, the Hokies spent time atop the ACC standings for the first time ever. During the 2008-09 season, the win at No. 1 Wake Forest and an 80-77 win at No. 12 Clemson were added to the list. This past season, home wins over a pair of No. 23 teams, Miami and Wake Forest, continued the run of top 25 victories.

With Greenberg's win at Campbell on Nov. 23, 2009, he passed Chuck Noe into second place on the all-time wins list at Virginia Tech with 110 victories. Only Charlie Moir, with 213 victories, has more wins at Tech than Greenberg.

In his time at Virginia Tech, Greenberg is 3-3 against top-ranked teams, with all three losses coming on final possessions. Tech has made five consecutive post-season appearances and six in Greenberg's eight years in Blacksburg.

The Hokies moved into the new \$21 million practice facility in August 2009. This building brings Virginia Tech basketball the "WOW Factor!" that it needs to compete among the elite in college basketball and is the culmination of a vision that Greenberg has for the university and its basketball program.

In the past few years, Greenberg has received two awards that not only speak to his success on the court, but his works off the court as well. In September 2009, Greenberg was presented with the inaugural Al LoBalbo Award by his alma mater, Fairleigh Dickinson University. And in April, Greenberg was inducted into The National Jewish Sports Hall of Fame and Museum.

On March 11, 2008, Greenberg added another honor, as he was named the Atlantic Coast Conference's 2008 Coach of the Year. This marked the second time in four years that Greenberg earned the honor.

In the 2006-07 season, the Hokies defeated four nationally ranked teams and had a 3-0 record against teams ranked in the top-five. And as the 2010-11 season unfolds, Greenberg has the Hokies poised for even loftier achievements.

On April 3, 2003, the Hokies introduced Greenberg as their 27th head coach. A proven program builder, an admired and innovative tactician and an experienced recruiter, Greenberg took over the reigns of a Tech program that has made tremendous strides in his first six seasons in Blacksburg.

Greenberg earned his first major honor at Virginia Tech in 2005, being named the ACC Coach of the Year by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association. He was the fourth Hokie honored by the group for the team's play during the Hokies' inaugural ACC season. The Richmond Times-Dispatch named Greenberg the Coach of the Year in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

The aggressive, up-tempo style that Greenberg installed in his first season with the Hokies has seen dividends and has brought a renewed sense of excitement to Cassell Coliseum, as well as to the "Hokie Nation." Perhaps the biggest influences seen in the program have been the work ethic and attention to details that Greenberg and his staff have instilled. And when speaking of hard work, the principle begins at the top, with Greenberg himself. Long hours of watching film, instructing players and developing the program, along with tirelessly working to promote the program and university while being involved in the community, have made Greenberg a popular face on the Blacksburg campus and in the "Hokie

Greenberg came to Virginia Tech from the University of South Florida, where he served as head coach for seven seasons. At USF, Greenberg had a record of 108-100. Prior to USF, Greenberg was the head coach at Long Beach State University, where his overall record was 105-70.

During his time at Long Beach State and USF, Greenberg's teams posted impressive records against major conference opponents. During his Long Beach State tenure there were wins over four nationally-ranked teams, including a 64-49 victory against then-No. 1 Kansas at Allen Fieldhouse in 1992-93. At South Florida, his teams were 2-0 against Ohio State, had two wins over Texas and won at Pittsburgh during the Panthers' run to the Sweet 16 in the 2001-02 season. The Bulls defeated eventual Final Four team Wisconsin in the 1999-2000 season.

A 1978 graduate of Fairleigh Dickinson, Greenberg was a fouryear letter winner under head coach Al LoBalbo. His father, the late Ralph Greenberg, played at Long Island University under coaching legend Clair Bee, one of college basketball's all-time winningest coaches.

Greenberg began his coaching career as an assistant at Columbia in 1978. He moved to Pittsburgh two years later,

where he made two trips to the NCAA Tournament in three years with the Panthers. He spent the 1983-84 season at Virginia, helping the Cavs reach the Final Four before moving on to Miami as an assistant under future Virginia Tech head coach Bill Foster. At Miami, he helped revive a program that had been dormant for a number of years.

Greenberg first went to Long Beach State as associate head coach under Joe Harrington. Greenberg replaced him three years later when Harrington accepted the head coaching position at Colorado. In his six seasons at LBSU, Greenberg led the 49ers to two NCAA Tournament appearances and one NIT appearance. He led LBSU to two Big West Conference championships and one Big West regular-season title. While Greenberg was at LBSU, the 49ers defeated four nationally ranked teams. Greenberg also tutored future NBA players Bryon Russell, Lucious Harris and Juaquin Hawkins.

In the summer of 2004, Greenberg received a lofty honor when he was inducted into the Five Star Basketball Camp's Hall of Fame. The honor, shared

by some of the greatest coaches like Rick Pitino and Hubie Brown, was bestowed for the many years that Greenberg has been a part of the nation's top summer basketball camp as an instructor and quest speaker.

Greenberg has always been involved in charitable organizations and causes. In September of 2009, he was the winning head coach in the inaugural "Chairmen of the Boards" 3-on-3 charity basketball tournament to benefit Tuesday's Children in New York City. This group is the premiere non-profit organization serving the needs of the 9/11 community, providing a wide-range of programming from mentoring, to advocacy for children, to next-step life skills and leadership training for 9/11 families and rescue and recovery workers.

When confronted by the destruction of Hurricane Katrina, Greenberg knew he had to get involved. He served as the chairman of the organizing committee of AllCoachesCare.com, a major on-line sports auction that raised money for Habitat for Humanity and its efforts in helping to rebuild the Gulf Coast area. Working tirelessly, Greenberg helped the

group acquire goods and services for the auction and also spent countless hours speaking on television and radio and to media members getting the word out about the auction.

This past season, Greenberg took on a leadership role with "Shots from the Heart," an event that helped the American Heart Association raise money to fight heart disease. The event featured selected head coaches and assistant coaches in a bracketed free throw shooting contest.

Greenberg and his wife, Karen, are the parents of three daughters: Paige, 22, Ella, 19, and Jacqueline, 16. Paige graduated from Virginia Tech in May 2010 and Ella will be a junior cheerleader for the Hokies in the fall of 2011. Greenberg is active in a number of organizations and causes, including the Great American Teach-in, the American Heart Association, Coaches vs. Cancer and the Boys and Girls Club.



In a day of impressive debuts, Tech began the 2011-12 season with a 64-53 win over East Tennessee State, moving to 9-0 in home openers under head coach Seth Greenberg. **Dorian Finney-Smith** highlighted the season-opening victory as he became the first freshman since Jeff Allen in 2007 to notch a double-double in his first game. Finney-Smith began his collegiate career with 10 points and 16 rebounds against the Bucs, while his classmate **Robert Brown** came off the bench for Tech and dropped 12 points in the outling.

Punching its ticket to New York City, Virginia Tech earned a spot in the NIT Season Tip-Off Semifinals with a 78-63 win over Florida International in the second round of the touranament at Cassell Coliseum. Senior **Dorenzo Hudson** speadheaded the Tech offense with 31 points, marking the most by him since his 41-point outburst against Seton Hall on Jan. 2, 2010, in Mexico.

The Hokies led by as many as 13 in the first half against the Panthers, but saw FIU cut the lead to 39-34 on a basket by Dominique Ferguson with 14:28 remaining. Virginia Tech held off a strong Oklahoma State rally and defeated the Cowboys, 59-57, to claim third place in the NIT Season Tip-Off at Madison Square Garden. With the victory, the Hokies improve to 4-1 on the season, while OSU falls to 3-2.

Tech fell behind 8-0 before the first media timeout, but ran out to a 30-19 lead with 2:31 remaining in the first half on a lay-up and free throw by **C.J. Barksdale**. The Hokies took a 32-23 lead into intermission.

In the second half, Tech held a 53-44 lead with 5:27 remaining, but OSU made a run in the final minutes to close the lead to a single possession. **Jarell Eddie** and **Dorenzo Hudson** each made two free throws in the final 17 seconds to help secure the win for Tech.

**Erick Green** led the Hokies with 18 points and **Dorian Finney-Smith** recorded his third double-double of the season with 10 points and 14 rebounds. Cadarian Raines grabbed a career-high nine rebounds in just 12 minutes of action. Markel Brown led all scorers with 19 points for the Cowboys.

Tech shot just 25 percent from the floor in the second half, but out rebounded OSU, 45-37, including a 21-14 advantage on the offensive boards. Tech's bench outscored OSU's reserves, 18-7.

Virginia Tech fell to Minnesota, 58-55, in the Big Ten/ ACC Challenge in Williams Arena on Wednesday night. Tech is now 5-2 on the season, while Minnesota improves to 7-1 overall.

Tech fell behind early, but fought back and took a 28-25 lead into intermission. The Hokies and Golden Gophers battled back and forth throughout the second half, before Minnesota took a 56-55 lead with 18 seconds remaining on a pair of free throws by Julian Welch.
