#### **About Tonight's Game**

Virginia Tech is 9-3 on the season.

Eastern Michigan is 5-6 on the season.

This is the first-ever meeting between the two schools.

This is the Hokies' final home game of 2011.

#### The Victory over North Florida

The Hokies defeated North Florida, 85-60, on Monday night in Cassell Coliseum.

**Dorenzo Hudson** scored 16 points to lead four Hokies in double figures.

**Dorian Finney-Smith** and **Robert Brown** each scored 14 points and **Erick Green** had 12 points in the win.

#### **Green on Cousy List**

**Erick Green** has been named to the 2012 Bob Cousy Award Candidates' List.

#### Greenberg Facts

**Seth Greenberg** is 163-109 (.599) at Virginia Tech and 376-279 (.574) in his 22nd season as a collegiate head coach. Greenberg is 107-32 (.770) as a head coach in Cassell Coliseum.

#### **Interesting Side Notes**

Virginia Tech has led at the half in every game this season.

The Hokies have won 20 of thier last 25 December basketball games.

Six different players have led the Hokies in scoring in the first 12 games of the season.

The Hokies are outscoring their opponents in the second half of the last four games by an average of 15.0 points.

#### **DFS Shines in the Early Going**

Dorian Finney-Smith leads ACC freshmen in rebounding, assists and double-doubles.

DFS has three of the top five rebounding performances by an ACC freshman this season. He also has two of the three five-assist games by an ACC freshman this season.

#### **Thompson Graduates**

**JT Thompson** graduated on Friday. He will miss the 2011-12 season after suffering a tear to the ACL in his right knee. He missed the entire 2010-11 season with the same injury to his left knee.

#### Last Time Out: VT 84, UNF 55

The Hokies defeated North Florida, 84-55, on Monday night in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech outscored the Ospreys, 44-24 in the second half, while shooting 61.3 percent from the floor after intermission ... **Dorenzo Hudson** led four Hokies in double figures with 16 points ... **Dorian Finney-Smith** and **Robert Brown** each scored 14 points and **Erick Green** added 12 points in the win ... **Cadarian Raines** grabbed a career-high 11 rebounds in the game.

#### The Series vs. Eastern Michigan

This is the first-ever meeting between the Hokies and Eastern Michigan ... Tech is 20-24 all-time against schools from the Mid-American Conference.

#### **Green on Cousy List**

Virginia Tech guard

Erick Green was named as a candidate for the 2012

Bob Cousy Award ... The award recognizes the top point guards in college basketball and is presented by The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts.

#### 80 Plus

Virginia Tech has scored more than 80 points in each of the last two games ... The last time that occurred was on Feb. 13 and Feb. 15 of last year, when Tech defeated Georgia Tech, 102-77 and Maryland, 91-83, in Cassell Coliseum ... This is the third time this season that the Hokies have scored at least 80 points in a game ... Tech has not scored 80 or more points in three consecutive games since early December of 1994.

#### **Hot at the Charity Stripe**

The Hokies are shooting 74.1 percent from the free throw line entering tonight's game ... The last time the Hokies shot that well from the line in a season was the 1980-81 season, when Tech shot a school-record 75.0 percent from the line ... Tech has made 62 of its last 76 free throw attempts, good for 81.6 percent.



#### **Senior Day**

In the win over Campbell on Saturday, Virginia Tech seniors **Dorenzo Hudson** and **Victor Davila** each scored 15 points to lead the Hokies in scoring ... They were a combined 11 for 20 from the field ... Davila's 15 points was a season high for

him and it marked the first time since the win over FIU in the third game of the season that both players scored in double figures in the same game ... The duo combined for 24 points in the win over UNF on Monday night.

#### Lots of Youth

Among the Hokies' 10 active scholarship players, the Hokies have two seniors, one junior, two sophomores and five freshmen ... The two sophomores had seen a combined 678 minutes of playing time up until this season ... Neither had ever started a game or played a very few minutes of meaningful ACC action ... Add to the fact that **Dorenzo Hudson** had missed the majority of last season before gaining a medical redshirt and this team becomes an extremely inexperienced total group.

#### Rankin Returns

Freshman point guard Marquis Rankin returned to action in the loss to Kansas State ... He had missed the team's first seven games following knee surgery on Oct. 6 ... The surgery, to clean up cartilage in the knee, was

performed by team orthopaedic surgeon Dr. Marc Siegel at Lewis Gale Hospital at Montgomery in Blacksburg, Va. ... He scored two points and had an assist in seven minutes of action ... In the win at Rhode Island, Rankin made his first career start, playing 12 minutes.

#### They're Free, Aren't They

In the win over FIU, **Dorenzo Hudson** hit all 12 of his free throw attempts ... That is a new career high for perfect free throw shooting in a game for Hudson and is the first game that a Hokie made at least 10 free throws in a game and shot 1.000 since Malcolm Delaney hit 14 of 14 from the line against Maryland on Feb. 15, 2011 ... This is the first time that Hudson has ever made all of his free throw attempts in a game and made 10-or-more free throws ... Hudson made 20-of-21 free throws in the win against Seton Hall on Jan. 2, 2010 in Cancun, Mexico, a game in which Hudson scored a career-high 41 points.

#### Raines Makes the Most of His Time

Cadarian Raines was limited to just 12 minutes of action in the win over Oklahoma State, but the sophomore post made the most of his minutes ... Raines grabbed a career-high nine rebounds

in that time and also blocked three Cowboy shots ... In the win over St. Bonaventure, Raines grabbed four rebounds in just eight minutes of action ... In the loss to Kansas State, Raines had five rebounds and six points in 15 minutes of action ... In the

Hokies win at Rhode Island on Wednesday night, Raines recorded a new career-high, as he scored 12 points in the win ... He also had a career-high with three steals ... He was six of eight from the field and grabbed four rebounds ... In the win over Norfolk State, Raines scored 10 points and grabbed seven rebounds, six on the offensive glass and he grabbed a career-high 11 rebounds in the win over North Florida, while also adding three blocked shots.

#### Staying Hot From the Line

In the loss at Minnesota, the Hokies made all seven of their free throw attempts in the game ... Tech was 5-5 in the first half and 2-2 in the second half ... Tech made 11 of 13 free throws in the win at Rhode Island, 16 of 20 free throws in the win over Norfolk State and 22 of 27 free throws in the win over Campbell.

#### More on Free Throws

The Hokies have four players that have played 300 or more minutes this season ... Three of those players, **Erick Green**, **Dorenzo Hudson** and **Jarell Eddie**, are shooting .800 from the line or better ... Eddie is shooting .929 from

the line and has made his last 14 free throw attempts.

#### More on Hudson's Free Throws

With his last two free throws in the win over Monmouth, his six for six performance in the loss to #5/5 Syracuse and making his first attempt in the win over Oklahoma State, **Dorenzo Hudson** made 21 consecutive free throw attempts ... He is 39 of 46 from the line so far this season, good for 84.8 percent.

#### **Hokies Pass 1,300**

Virginia Tech is now 1337-1094 all-time in collegiate basketball, good for a .550 winning percentage ... This is the Hokies' 103rd season of men's basketball.

#### JT Makes the Walk

Across the stage, that is ... On Dec. 16, just hours before the Hokies defeated Campbell, **JT Thompson** walked a across the stage right here in Cassell Coliseum to accept his diploma in sociology ... Congratulations to JT on this acheivement.

#### Seth Loves the Cassell Seth Greenberg is

107-32 as a head coach in Cassell Coliseum, good for a winning percentage of .770 ... Greenberg is 66-10 (.868) against non-conference competition in Cassell Coliseum.

#### **Another Milestone**

In Virginia Tech's win over Penn State last season, **Seth Greenberg** recorded his 350th victory as a collegiate head coach ... His record in 22 years as a head coach is 376-279 (.574).

#### Oh, What a Week!

Jarell Eddie had a very productive week for he Hokies for the week that ended Dec. 11 ... Eddie opened the week with 15 points in the win at Rhode Island ... He made five of six field goal attempts, including all three threepoint attempts ... He also made both free throw attempts and grabbed six rebounds ... In the win over Norfolk State, he scored a career-hgh 24 points ... He was six of nine from the field, including five of six from threepoint territory and was seven of seven from the line ... He also grabbed seven rebounds in the win ... For the week, Eddie missed a grand total of four shots, none from the line and just one from three-point range ... In the win over Campbell on Saturday, Eddie was five of seven from the field, including one of two from three-point range.

#### **A Good Five Years**

In the previous five seasons, Tech is 45-35 in ACC action, tied for third best in the ACC ... Only Duke (58-22) and UNC (57-23) have better records ... Tech is tied with Maryland at 45-35.

#### **Since Expansion (And Beyond)**

To take the previous note a step further, since the ACC expanded to include Virginia Tech and Miami in 2004 (and BC in 2005), the Hokies are fourth in most conference regular season victories ... Tech is 57-55 in that stretch ... Only Duke (83-29), North Carolina (83-29) and Maryland (60-52) have more wins in that span ... Since the start of the 2006-07 season, the Hokies have the fourth-best victory total in ACC regular season games (45-35 in that span).

#### We'll See You Soon

Prior to Thanksgiving of 2010, the Hokies and Oklahoma State had never met in basketball ... Tech defeated OSU in Anaheim last year and in Madison Square Garden on Nov. 25 ... Tech will also travel to Stillwater on New Years Eve to face the Cowboys and the two teams will meet in Blacksburg next season.

#### We Like Threes

The Hokies have hit at least one three-pointer in every game since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... Tech has now hit a three in 282 consecutive games, passing the streak of 277 consecutive games, from 1986-1995 ... Since the three-point arc was added to college basketball for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one three in all but three games ... The last time that the Hokies did not record a three-point field goal in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003 ... Tech has had nine games with only one three-pointer under **Seth Greenberg**.

#### The State We're In

Virginia Tech is 419-304 (.580) all-time against schools from Virginia ...Tech is 1-0 against state schools this year and was 1-2 against state schools last season ... The Hokies have played 14 schools from the state ... With the win over Norfolk State on Dec. 11, the only state Division I school that Tech has not played is Hampton ... Tech holds winning records against 10 of the schools and even records against two others ... Tech is 24-14 against schools from Virginia under **Seth Greenberg**.

#### Versus the Best

**Seth Greenberg** entered this season with four career wins against No. 1-ranked teams and three of those have come since Virginia Tech joined the ACC in 2004 ... The three ACC wins against No. 1-ranked teams (all three opponents were ACC foes) ranks Greenberg tied for sixth among all-time ACC coaches ... The three victories are tied for third (with Florida State's Leonard Hamilton) among current ACC coaches.

#### **Hot Shooting**

In the win over Monmouth, the Hokies shot 62.5 percent from the field ... That is the highest single-game percentage for the Hokies since a 69.2 percent performance in the win over Mount St. Mary's last season ... Tech was 66.7 percent from three-point range ... That is the highest single-game percentage since shooting 66.7 percent from three-point range in the win at Wake Forest last season ... The last time the Hokies shot better than 66.7 percent from three-point territory was 68.8 percent against Wisconsin on Dec. 1, 2008 ... Tech followed that with a 51.9 percent shooting night in the win over FIU ... That marks the first time since the wins over Wake Forest and Maryland (on Jan. 15 and 20, 2011) that the Hokies have recorded back-to-back games of better than 50 percent shooting from the field ... Tech has shot better than 50 percent from the field in five of its 12 games this season.

#### The Hokies vs. No. 1

With the win over #1 Duke last season, Virginia Tech is now 4-7 all-time against the No. 1-ranked team in the AP poll ... Tech is 3-3 in such games since joining the ACC and is 3-1 against top-ranked teams at home and in Cassell Coliseum ... The Hokies have won their last two home games against a No. 1 team ... Tech is 1-1 all-time against Duke when the Blue Devils are No. 1.

## The First Freshman Dorian Finney-Smith

accomplished something in the win over ETSU that has not happened in Blacksburg for quite some time ... His double-double of 10 points and 16 rebounds is the first time a Hokie freshman has accomplished

that feat in their collegiate debut since Nov. 9, 2007, when Jeff Allen scored 19 points and had 10 rebounds against Elon ... Allen was the first since Dale Solomon accomplished that feat with 23 points and 11 rebounds in a win over Buffalo State in 1978 ... The last time a Virginia Tech freshman had at least 16 rebounds in any game was Ace Custis, who grabbed 16 rebounds against VMI on Dec. 9, 1993 ... Finney-Smith added his second career double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds in the win over FIU and recorded No. 3 with 10 points and 14 rebounds in the win over Oklahoma State.

#### More on DFS

**Dorian Finney-Smith** is the only player in the ACC in the top 10 in rebounding and assists ... He leads the Hokies in rebounds, blocked shots and total assists.

#### What Brown Can Do For Us

Robert Brown came out of the blocks

fast for the Hokies ... In his first two collegiate games, Brown scored 12 points in the win over ETSU and 19 points to lead the Hokies in scoring in the win over Monmouth ... He is currently fourth on the team in scoring after a 13 point performance at Minnesota and leading the

team with 15 points against Kansas State ... He had 14 points in the win over North Florida.

#### **Green Returns**

Erick Green strained his right achilles tendon in practice on Nov. 4 and missed the season-opening win over ETSU ... He returned to action in the win over Monmouth, scoring 11 points and leading the team with five assists in 23 minutes of action and had 12 points in 25 minutes of action in the win over FIU ... In the loss to #5/5 Syracuse, Green scored 14 points and he scored 18 points in 39 minutes in the win over Oklahoma State ... Green scored a team-high 19 points in the win over St. Bonaventure and a career-high 25 points in the loss at Minnesota ... In the loss to Kansas State, Green scored 14 points and grabbed a career-high seven rebounds ... He scored 24 points in the Hokies' win at Rhode Island and 12 points in the win over Norfolk State.

#### **Green is Good**

**Erick Green** was named to the 2011 NIT Season Tip-Off All-Tournament team ... Green scored 14 points in the loss to #5/5 Syracuse and led the Hokies with 18 points in the win over Oklahoma State.

#### What is a Hokie?

That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics ... The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute ... With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body ... Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today ... Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention ... Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Hudson, a redshirt senior from Charlotte, N.C., averaged 24.5 points and 2.5 assists in wins over Monmouth and FIU ... In the 78-63 win over FIU, he was eight-of-13 from the floor and a perfect 12-of-12 from the free throw line en route to scoring an ACC season-high 31 points in a victory that advanced the Hokies to the semifinals of the NIT Season Tip-Off.

## Head Coach Seth Greenberg



Success is not a given. Only through hard-work and dedication, will success come. In his eighth season at Virginia Tech, Seth Greenberg has set the Hokies onto a course of winning and competing at the highest level.

Since joining the Hokies, Greenberg has established himself as not only a builder of programs, but as a coach who has an eye on the ultimate goal.

Greenberg has a career record of 376-279, now in his 22nd season as a collegiate head coach and a 163-109 record in his ninth season at Virginia Tech. Since coming to Blacksburg, Greenberg's Hokies have three wins over No. 1 ranked teams, including, most recently, a 64-60 vicory over topranked Duke on Feb. 26, 2011 in Cassell Coliseum.

In the 2006-07 season, the Hokies engineered a historic sweep over North Carolina, including a 94-88 win over the Tar Heels in Cassell Coliseum when UNC was the top-ranked team in the country. Couple that victory against North Carolina with a 69-67 overtime win at No. 5 Duke the week before, the Hokies spent time atop the ACC standings for the first time ever. During the 2008-09 season, the win at No. 1 Wake Forest and an 80-77 win at No. 12 Clemson were added to the list. This past season, home wins over a pair of No. 23 teams, Miami and Wake Forest, continued the run of top 25 victories.

With Greenberg's win at Campbell on Nov. 23, 2009, he passed Chuck Noe into second place on the all-time wins list at Virginia Tech with 110 victories. Only Charlie Moir, with 213 victories, has more wins at Tech than Greenberg.

In his time at Virginia Tech, Greenberg is 3-3 against top-ranked teams, with all three losses coming on final possessions. Tech has made five consecutive post-season appearances and six in Greenberg's eight years in Blacksburg.

The Hokies moved into the new \$21 million practice facility in August 2009. This building brings Virginia Tech basketball the "WOW Factor!" that it needs to compete among the elite in college basketball and is the culmination of a vision that Greenberg has for the university and its basketball program.

In the past few years, Greenberg has received two awards that not only speak to his success on the court, but his works off the court as well. In September 2009, Greenberg was presented with the inaugural Al LoBalbo Award by his alma mater, Fairleigh Dickinson University. And in April, Greenberg was inducted into The National Jewish Sports Hall of Fame and Museum.

On March 11, 2008, Greenberg added another honor, as he was named the Atlantic Coast Conference's 2008 Coach of the Year. This marked the second time in four years that Greenberg earned the honor.

In the 2006-07 season, the Hokies defeated four nationally ranked teams and had a 3-0 record against teams ranked in the top-five. And as the 2010-11 season unfolds, Greenberg has the Hokies poised for even loftier achievements.

On April 3, 2003, the Hokies introduced Greenberg as their 27th head coach. A proven program builder, an admired and innovative tactician and an experienced recruiter, Greenberg took over the reigns of a Tech program that has made tremendous strides in his first six seasons in Blacksburg.

Greenberg earned his first major honor at Virginia Tech in 2005, being named the ACC Coach of the Year by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association. He was the fourth Hokie honored by the group for the team's play during the Hokies' inaugural ACC season. The Richmond Times-Dispatch named Greenberg the Coach of the Year in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

The aggressive, up-tempo style that Greenberg installed in his first season with the Hokies has seen dividends and has brought a renewed sense of excitement to Cassell Coliseum, as well as to the "Hokie Nation." Perhaps the biggest influences seen in the program have been the work ethic and attention to details that Greenberg and his staff have instilled. And when speaking of hard work, the principle begins at the top, with Greenberg himself. Long hours of watching film, instructing players and developing the program, along with tirelessly working to promote the program and university while being involved in the community, have made Greenberg a popular face on the Blacksburg campus and in the "Hokie

Greenberg came to Virginia Tech from the University of South Florida, where he served as head coach for seven seasons. At USF, Greenberg had a record of 108-100. Prior to USF, Greenberg was the head coach at Long Beach State University, where his overall record was 105-70.

During his time at Long Beach State and USF, Greenberg's teams posted impressive records against major conference opponents. During his Long Beach State tenure there were wins over four nationally-ranked teams, including a 64-49 victory against then-No. 1 Kansas at Allen Fieldhouse in 1992-93. At South Florida, his teams were 2-0 against Ohio State, had two wins over Texas and won at Pittsburgh during the Panthers' run to the Sweet 16 in the 2001-02 season. The Bulls defeated eventual Final Four team Wisconsin in the 1999-2000 season.

A 1978 graduate of Fairleigh Dickinson, Greenberg was a four-year letter winner under head coach Al LoBalbo. His father, the late Ralph Greenberg, played at Long Island University under coaching legend Clair Bee, one of college basketball's all-time winningest coaches.

Greenberg began his coaching career as an assistant at Columbia in 1978. He moved to Pittsburgh two years later,

where he made two trips to the NCAA Tournament in three years with the Panthers. He spent the 1983-84 season at Virginia, helping the Cavs reach the Final Four before moving on to Miami as an assistant under future Virginia Tech head coach Bill Foster. At Miami, he helped revive a program that had been dormant for a number of years.

Greenberg first went to Long Beach State as associate head coach under Joe Harrington. Greenberg replaced him three years later when Harrington accepted the head coaching position at Colorado. In his six seasons at LBSU, Greenberg led the 49ers to two NCAA Tournament appearances and one NIT appearance. He led LBSU to two Big West Conference championships and one Big West regular-season title. While Greenberg was at LBSU, the 49ers defeated four nationally ranked teams. Greenberg also tutored future NBA players Bryon Russell, Lucious Harris and Juaquin Hawkins.

In the summer of 2004, Greenberg received a lofty honor when he was inducted into the Five Star Basketball Camp's Hall of Fame. The honor, shared

by some of the greatest coaches like Rick Pitino and Hubie Brown, was bestowed for the many years that Greenberg has been a part of the nation's top summer basketball camp as an instructor and quest speaker.

Greenberg has always been involved in charitable organizations and causes. In September of 2009, he was the winning head coach in the inaugural "Chairmen of the Boards" 3-on-3 charity basketball tournament to benefit Tuesday's Children in New York City. This group is the premiere non-profit organization serving the needs of the 9/11 community, providing a wide-range of programming from mentoring, to advocacy for children, to next-step life skills and leadership training for 9/11 families and rescue and recovery workers.

When confronted by the destruction of Hurricane Katrina, Greenberg knew he had to get involved. He served as the chairman of the organizing committee of AllCoachesCare.com, a major on-line sports auction that raised money for Habitat for Humanity and its efforts in helping to rebuild the Gulf Coast area. Working tirelessly, Greenberg helped the

group acquire goods and services for the auction and also spent countless hours speaking on television and radio and to media members getting the word out about the auction.

This past season, Greenberg took on a leadership role with "Shots from the Heart," an event that helped the American Heart Association raise money to fight heart disease. The event featured selected head coaches and assistant coaches in a bracketed free throw shooting contest.

Greenberg and his wife, Karen, are the parents of three daughters: Paige, 22, Ella, 19, and Jacqueline, 16. Paige graduated from Virginia Tech in May 2010 and Ella will be a junior cheerleader for the Hokies in the fall of 2011. Greenberg is active in a number of organizations and causes, including the Great American Teach-in, the American Heart Association, Coaches vs. Cancer and the Boys and Girls Club.



In a day of impressive debuts, Tech began the 2011-12 season with a 64-53 win over East Tennessee State, moving to 9-0 in home openers under head coach Seth Greenberg. **Dorian Finney-Smith** highlighted the season-opening victory as he became the first freshman since Jeff Allen in 2007 to notch a double-double in his first game. Finney-Smith began his collegiate career with 10 points and 16 rebounds against the Bucs, while his classmate **Robert Brown** came off the bench for Tech and dropped 12 points in the outring.

Punching its ticket to New York City, Virginia Tech earned a spot in the NIT Season Tip-Off Semifinals with a 78-63 win over Florida International in the second round of the touranament at Cassell Coliseum. Senior **Dorenzo Hudson** speadheaded the Tech offense with 31 points, marking the most by him since his 41-point outburst against Seton Hall on Jan. 2, 2010, in Mexico.

The Hokies led by as many as 13 in the first half against the Panthers, but saw FIU cut the lead to 39-34 on a basket by Dominique Ferguson with 14:28 remaining. Tech answered by going on a 16-7 run, scoring on seven straight possessions. Freshman **Dorian Finney-Smith**'s three-point play with 10:21 remaining ended the run, giving the Hokies a 55-41 cushion. Hudson hit 8-of-13 from the floor, including 3-of-5 from beyond the 3-point arc. He connected on all 12 of his free-throw attempts, and he added five rebounds and two assists.

#### **VIRGINIA TECH 73, NORFOLK STATE 60**

DEC. 11, 2011 • 2 P.M. • BLACKSBURG, VA.

Jarell Eddie scored a career-high 24 points and grabbed seven rebounds to lift Virginia Tech past Norfolk State, 73-60. Eddie made 6-of-9 from the floor and hit a career-high five 3-pointers. He also connected on all seven of his free-throw attempts. His previous career high came last season against Wake Forest when he scored 17 in a win in Winston-Salem, N.C.

The Hokies trailed for much of the first half, but Eddie scored six points in a 10-0 Tech run late in the first half that gave the Hokies the lead for good.

The Spartans, who have quality victories over Drexel and TCU and lost to nationally ranked Marquette by just two points, kept the game close throughout and cut the lead to 65-59 on Chris McEachin's 3-pointer with 2:58 left in the game. But Tech's **Dorenzo Hudson** hit a free throw with 2:05 left to make it 66-59. After McEachin missed a 3-pointer for NSU with 1:40 to go, Eddie put the game away, draining his final 3-pointer with 1:07 remaining to push the Hokies' lead back to 10.

**Erick Green** finished with 12, while **Cadarian Raines** came off the bench to score 10 points and grab seven rebounds for Tech.

Norfolk State shot 48.9 percent from the floor (22-of-45). But the Spartans hurt themselves with nine second-half turnovers.

McEachin led NSU with 18 points, hitting 6-of-12 from the floor, including two 3-pointers. Kyle O'Quinn and Pendarvis Williams scored 14 each. O'Quinn, NSU's leading scorer, scored 12 of his 14 in the first half, but spent most of the second half on the bench in foul trouble before fouling out with 4:11 left.

Virginia Tech opened the second half with a 15-0 run to break open a close game and roll past Campbell 85-60 in a non-conference game at Cassell Coliseum.

The Hokies led just 32-29 at halftime after shooting only 37 percent from the floor. But Tech opened the second half by hitting six of its first seven shots, as **Jarell Eddie** heated up following a scoreless first half. Eddie scored seven of Tech's 15 points in that run, and his basket with 15:19 left in the game capped the run, giving the Hokies a 47-29 lead.

Tech continued its hot shooting throughout the second half. The Hokies shot 73.1 percent in the final 20 minutes and 54.7 percent for the game – its second-best shooting performance of the season.

In contrast, Campbell struggled from the floor in the first five minutes of the second half. The Fighting Camels missed three shots and turned the ball over four times on their first seven possessions of the second half. #### **VIRGINIA TECH 84, NORTH FLORIDA 55**

DEC. 19, 2011 • 7 P.M. • BLACKSBURG, VA.

**Dorenzo Hudson** scored 16 points to help Virginia Tech win its fourth straight game in an 84-55 decision over North Florida in non-conference action.

The Hokies broke open a close contest with an 8-0 run to close the first half. **Jarell Eddie**'s 3-pointer with 3 seconds left – his only points of the half – gave Tech a 40-31 halftime lead.

Tech used a 19-5 run over a 7-minute stretch in the second half to put the game away. **Erick Green** and **Robert Brown** combined to score 13 of the 19 points in that run for the Hokies. Tech went on to lead by as many as 29 points in the game and shot 61.3 percent in the final 20 minutes (19 of 31).

North Florida, which has played a brutal schedule that includes Alabama, Florida, Miami, Ohio State and Kansas State, struggled to take care of the ball against Tech's man-to-man defense. The Ospreys committed 16 turnovers, and they shot just 37.5 percent from the floor in the second half.

Hudson, who snapped out of a shooting slump in the Hokies' previous game against Campbell, connected on 6 of 10 from the floor to pace a Tech team that shot 55.2 percent for the game (32 of 58). It marked the fifth time this season that the Hokies have shot better than 50 percent.

Brown added 14 points for the Hokies, hitting 6 of 10 from the floor, including 2 of 4 from beyond the 3-point arc. **Dorian Finney-Smith** also had 14 and hit two 3-pointers, as the Hokies made seven treys for the game. Green finished with 12.
