NOTING THE HOKIES

About This Evening's Game

Virginia Tech is 11-7 on the season and 0-4 in ACC play. Virginia is 15-2 overall and 2-1 in conference action. Virginia is ranked 15th in the AP poll and 17th in the coaches poll.

The Loss to #8/8 North Carolina

The Hokies lost to #8/8 North Carolina, 82-68, in Cassell Coliseum on Thursday night.

Erick Green returned from a knee injury to lead the Hokies with 17 points, five assists and three steals. **Dorenzo Hudson** came off the bench with 16 points, **Jarell Eddie** added 15 points and **Robert Brown** scored 12 points in his first collegiate start.

Green Injured

Erick Green sprained the LCL in his left knee on Jan. 12 and missed the Boston College game. He returned to action in the North Carolina game.

Green Notes

Erick Green's streak of 19 straight games with double-figures scoring is currently the longest among ACC players.

Green's 24 points off the bench in the win at Rhode Island is the second-most points by an ACC substitute this season. **Robert Brown**'s 19 points off the bench against Monmouth is tops among ACC freshmen.

Greenberg Facts

Seth Greenberg is 165-113 (.594) at Virginia Tech and 378-283 (.572) in his 22nd season as a collegiate head coach. Greenberg is 108-34 (.761) as a head coach in Cassell Coliseum.

Interesting Side Notes

- Jarell Eddle's 50.8 percent three-point field goal percentage would break the school's single season mark.
- Of Virginia Tech's 10 active scholarship players, only three had seen meaningful action in previous seasons and five players are true freshmen.
- **Dorenzo Hudson** (12-for-12 against FIU) and **Erick Green** (10-for-10 against FSU) are the only teammates in the ACC this season with perfect free throw precentages in a game, while making at least 10 free throws.

DFS Shines

Dorian Finney-Smith leads ACC freshmen in rebounding and is tied in double-doubles. DFS is the only ACC freshman with five double-figure rebounding games this season.

Last Time Out: #8/8 UNC 82, VT 68

The Hokies lost to #8/8 North Carolina, 82-68, in Cassell Coliseum on Thursday night ... The Hokies jumped out to a 39-34 lead at the intermission, but UNC opened the second half with a 21-5 run and never looked back ... **Erick Green**, who missed the Boston College game with a knee injury, returned to the line-up and led the Hokies with 17 points, five assists and three steals ... **Dorenzo Hudson** came off the bench with 16 points, **Jarell Eddie** added 15 points and **Robert Brown** scored 12 points in his first collegiate start.

The Series vs. Virginia

Virginia leads the all-time series, 81-52 ... Tech has lost the last two meetings with the Cavaliers, most recently a 61-54 loss in JPJA last February ... The Hokies are 12-32 in road games against the Cavaliers and 2-3 in games played in JPJA ... Tech is 7-7 against UVa in regular season ACC games and 2-5 in regular season ACC road games.

More on the Hokies-Hoos Rivalry

Besides Charlottesville and Blacksburg, these two schools have met in seven other cities ... Roanoke, Richmond, Hampton, Norfolk, Lynchburg, Salem and Greensboro, N.C., have all hosted games in this series ... The two teams have played eight overtime games, with the Hokies winning the last three OT games ... This is the second time the two teams have met on ESPNU ... Tech won the previous ESPNU meeting, 70-69, in overtime in JPJA on Jan. 16, 2008 ... Head coach **Seth Greenberg** was an assistant at Virginia during the 1983-84 season.

Building Makes it Better?

A case can be made that the Hokies have shown marked improvement in many areas of their game since moving into the Hahn Hurst Basketball practice facility in August 2009 ... One such improvement comes to the forefront ... In the six years before the opening of the practice facility, the Hokies shot a combined 66.2 percent from the free throw line ... Since the opening of the facility, the Hokies are shooting 72.1 percent from the free throw line.

13 Threes

Virginia Tech made a season-high 13 threepointers in the loss to #8/8 North Carolina on Jan. 19 ... It is the second time this season that Tech has reached double-figures in threepoint field goals in a game, surpassing the 10 made threes in the season-opening win over ETSU ... It is also the most three-pointers made by the Hokies since joining the ACC and the most since Tech hit a school-record 16 three-pointers in a home loss to Marquette on Jan. 7, 1989.

Green Returns

Virginia Tech's leading scorer, **Erick Green**, missed the Hokies' game at Boston College on Jan. 14 after suffering a sprained lateral collateral ligament in his left knee ... Green suffered the injury in practice on Jan. 12 ... He returned to

action in the loss to #8/8 North Carolina and led the Hokies with 17 points.

Hokies vs. Ranked Teams

With the loss to #8/8 North Carolina, the Hokies are 11-33 against nationally ranked teams since joining the ACC for the 2004-05 season and 12-37 against nationally ranked teams under Seth Greenberg ... Tech is 28-141 all-time against teams ranked in the AP poll and is 0-2 this season against ranked teams ... Virginia Tech is 1-5 all-time against teams ranked #15 in the AP poll ... The last time Tech played a 15th-ranked team was Feb. 4, 2006, when #15 Boston College defeated the Hokies, 74-73, in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech's only win against a 15th-ranked team was a 59-53 win over Virginia in the Richmond Coliseum on Jan. 30, 1993 ... These numbers are only for teams ranked in the AP poll.

Back-to-Back Ranked Teams

Virginia Tech played #8/8 UNC on Thursday night and will play #15/17 UVa this evening ... This is the first time since the 2009-10 season that Tech has played consecutive games against ranked teams ... On Jan. 10, 13 and 16 of 2010, Tech played three straight games against #9 UNC (78-64 road loss), #23 Miami (81-66 home win) and #25 Florida State (63-58 road loss).

Green on the Rise

Last season, after **Erick Green** took over the starting point guard duties for the Hokies in the ninth game of the season, he recorded three games of 20-or-more-points ... He has already matched that total in just the first 16 games of this season ... Last year, he averaged 11.6 points per game; this season his average is now at 16.1 ppg ... He also is shooting better from the field, the three-point arc and the free throw line this season, along with averaging 50 percent more rebounds and a half more assists ... Green is the only player in the ACC in the top 10 in scoring and assists.

Close Games

The Hokies are 48-48 under **Seth Greenberg** in games that have been decided in overtime or by five-or-fewer points ... Tech is 1-4 in such games this season.

Hudson Reaches 1,000 Points

In the Hokies' win at Oklahoma State on New Year's Eve, redshirt senior guard

Dorenzo Hudson became

the 42nd player in Virginia Tech history to score 1,000 points in his career ... Hudson hit a three-pointer with 8:34 remaining in the game to give Tech a three-point lead, for his 1,000th point ... Hudson joins former teammates

Malcolm Delaney, Jeff Allen, A.D. Vassallo and Deron Washington on the list ... Hudson currently has 1,051 career points, 39th on the Virginia Tech all-time scoring list ... He passed Chris Ellis into 39th place on Thursday against North Carolina.

Green Extends His Streak

With his 17 points in the loss to #8/8 North Carolina, **Erick Green** currently has scored in double-figures in all 16 games that he has played this season and in 19 consecutive games over the last two seasons ... That is the longest active streak of double-figure games among ACC players ... Green missed the season-opening win over East Tennessee State this year with a strained achilles tendon and did not play at Boston College due to a knee injury.

The State We're In

Virginia Tech is 419-304 (.580) all-time against schools from Virginia ...Tech is 1-0 against state schools this year and was 1-2 against state schools last season ... The Hokies have played 14 schools from the state ... With the win over Norfolk State on Dec. 11, the only state Division I school that Tech has not played is Hampton ... Tech holds winning records against 10 of the schools and even records against two others ... Tech is 24-14 against schools from Virginia under **Seth Greenberg**.

Green at the Line

Erick Green is currently shooting 88.5 percent from the free throw line this season ... That is the third-highest percentage for a single season in Virginia Tech history ... Only Phil Thieneman (91.6 percent in the 1976-77 season) and Bobby Beecher (91.3 percent in the 1982-83 season) have had better seasons at the line for the Hokies ... Malcolm Delaney's 86.9 percent from the line in the 2008-09 season is the Hokies' top free throw percentage season since joining the ACC ... Teammates **Dorenzo Hudson** (87.9 percent) and **Jarell Eddie** (87/2 percent) are not too far behind Green.

Lots of Youth

Among Virginia Tech's 10 active scholarship players, the Hokies have two seniors, one junior, two sophomores and five freshmen ... The two sophomores had seen a combined 481 minutes of playing time up until this season ... Neither had ever started a game or played many minutes of meaningful ACC action ... Add to the fact that Dorenzo Hudson had missed the majority of last season and this team becomes an extremely inexperienced total group.

Zo From the Line

Dorenzo Hudson began the season as a 74.6 percent career free throw shooter ... So far this season, Hudson is 58-66 from the line, good for 87.9 percent ... He has raised his career percentage to 77.6 percent from the line ... Hudson is currently 31st nationally in free throw percentage ... His teammate, Erick Green, is 27th.

Hot at the Charity Stripe

The Hokies are shooting 75.4 percent from the free throw line ... The Hokies set the school record for free throw percentage in the 1980-81 season, at 75.0 percent from the line ... Tech has made 143 of its last 179 free throw attempts, good for 79.9 percent.

More on Free Throws

The Hokies have four players that have played 450 or more minutes this season ... Three of those players, Erick Green, Dorenzo Hudson and Jarell Eddie, are shooting .872 from the line or better ... Green is shooting .885 from the line.

Seth Loves the Cassell Seth Greenberg is

108-34 as a head coach in Cassell Coliseum, good for a winning percentage of .761 ... His record in 22 years as a head coach is 378-283 (.572) ... Greenberg is 67-10 (.870) against nonconference competition in Cassell Coliseum.

We Like Threes

The Hokies have hit at least one threepointer in every game since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... Tech has now hit a three in 288 consecutive games, the most in school history ... Since the three-point arc was added to college basketball for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one three in all but three games ... The last time that the Hokies did not record a three-point field goal in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003 ... Tech has had nine games with only one threepointer under Seth Greenberg.

What Brown Can Do For Us

Robert Brown came out of the blocks fast for the Hokies ... In his first two collegiate

games, Brown scored 12 points in the win over ETSU and 19 points to lead the Hokies in scoring in the win over Monmouth ... He is currently fourth on the team in scoring after a 13 point performance at Minnesota and leading the team with 15 points against Kansas State ... He had 14

points in the win over North Florida ... Brown earned his first career start in the loss to #8/8 North Carolina and scored 12 points for the Hokies.

Win 10

With Virginia Tech's win over Maryland on Feb. 15, 2011, it marked the eighth straight season that the Hokies have won at least 10 home games ... Tech has won eight home games so far this season.

Thompson to Miss 2011-12 Season

Senior forward JT Thompson, who missed the entire 2010-11 season following surgery

to repair a torn anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee, will miss the 2011-12 season with the same injury to his right knee ... The injury occured during practice on Nov. 2.

JT Makes the Walk

Across the stage, that is ...

On Dec. 16, just hours before the Hokies defeated Campbell, JT Thompson walked a across the stage right here in Cassell Coliseum to accept his diploma in sociology ... Congratulations to JT on this acheivement.

They're Free, Aren't They

In the win over FIU, Dorenzo Hudson hit all 12 of his free throw attempts ... That is a new career high for perfect free throw shooting in a game for Hudson and is the first game that a Hokie made at least 10 free throws in a game and shot 1.000 since Malcolm Delaney hit 14 of 14 from the line against Maryland on Feb. 15, 2011 ... This is the first time that Hudson has ever made all of his free throw attempts in a game and made 10-or-more free throws ... Hudson made 20-of-21 free throws in the win against Seton Hall on Jan. 2, 2010 in Cancun, Mexico, a game in which Hudson scored a career-high 41 points.

Allen was the first since Dale Solomon accomplished that feat with 23 points and 11 rebounds in a win over Buffalo State in 1978 ... The last time a Virginia Tech freshman had at least 16 rebounds in any game was Ace Custis, who grabbed 16 rebounds against VMI on Dec. 9, 1993 ... Finney-Smith added his second career double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds in the win over FIU and recorded No. 3 with 10 points and 14 rebounds in the win over Oklahoma State in Madison Square Garden.

DFS on the Boards

When comparing freshman year rebounding numbers, the most appropriate person to compare Dorian Finney-Smith with is Jeff Allen ... Allen's 7.6 rebounds per game as a freshman in the 2007-08 season is the highest average for a Hokie frosh since the 2000-2001 season ... This season, DFS is averaging 7.8 rebounds per game ... Allen had 11 games of 10-or-more rebounds as a freshman, while DFS has five such games already ... Finney-Smith leads ACC freshmen in rebounding this season and is seventh overall in the conference in rebounding ... The Virginia Tech record for rebounds per game as a freshman is 11.7 rpg by Chris Smith in the 1957-58 season.

Green on Cousy List

Virginia Tech guard Erick Green was named as a candidate for the 2012 Bob Cousy Award ... The award recognizes the top point guards in college basketball and is presented by The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts.

Hokies Pass 1,300

Virginia Tech is now 1339-1098 all-time in collegiate basketball, good for a .549 winning percentage ... This is the Hokies' 103rd season of men's basketball.

Hokies in NCAA Stats

In the current NCAA statistics, Virginia Tech is fourth in the nation in three-point field goal % defense, 15th in free throw percentage and 43rd in scoring defense ... Individually, **Erick Green** is 24th and **Dorenzo Hudson** is 29th in free throw percentage. (*As of 1-15-12*).

500 and Counting in the Cassell

The Hokies have a 515-153 overall record in the Cassell, good for a .771 winning percentage ... Tech is 8-3 this season and was 12-4 in Cassell last season, the 50th year for the arena ... The win over Florida State on Jan. 8, 2011, was the 500th victory in the building ... The win over FSU in 2008 marked the Hokies' 600th game played in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech defeated Rhode Island, 86-63, on Nov. 20, 2002, in its 500th game in the arena ... Tech has had just one break-even home season and one losing season in Cassell Coliseum ... The 17 victories for the Hokies at home in the 2009-10 season set a new Cassell Coliseum and school record.

Versus the Best

Seth Greenberg entered this season with four career wins against No. 1-ranked teams and three of those have come since Virginia Tech joined the ACC in 2004 ... The three ACC wins against No. 1-ranked teams (all three opponents were ACC foes) ranks Greenberg tied for sixth among all-time ACC coaches ... The three victories are tied for third (with Florida State's Leonard Hamilton) among current ACC coaches.

What is a Hokie?

That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics ... The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute ... With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body ... Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today ... Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention ... Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

The Hokies vs. No. 1

With the win over #1 Duke last season, Virginia Tech is now 4-7 all-time against the No. 1-ranked team in the AP poll ... Tech is 3-3 in such games since joining the ACC and is 3-1 against top-ranked teams at home and in Cassell Coliseum ... The Hokies have won their last two home games against a No. 1 team ... Tech is 1-1 all-time against Duke when the Blue Devils are No. 1.

Notes From the Win Over EMU

In the Hokies' win over Eastern Michigan, Tech held the Eagles to just nine points in the first half ... That is the fewest points allowed in a half by the Hokies since at least 2000 ... It also marked the second-fewest points allowed by a team in a Division I game this season ... Wisconsin allowed Kennesaw State just eight points in the first half of their game on Nov. 12 in Madison ... Tech held the Eagles to just 28.1 percent from the field, including 14.3 percent in the first half ... That marks the third time this season that the Hokies have held an opponent under 30 percent from the field this season.

A Good Five Years

In the previous five seasons plus two games this season, Tech is 45-39 in ACC action, fourth best in the ACC ... Only Duke (62-22), UNC (60-24) and Maryland (48-36) have better records. (as of 1-20-12).

Coming Next Year

On Nov. 9, the Hokies announced the signing of two players to National Letters of Intent ... Montrezl Harrell, a 6-7 forward from Tarboro, N.C., and Marshall Wood, a 6-7 forward from Rustburg, Va., will join the program in the fall of 2012 ... Harrell is playing this season at Hargrave Military Academy in Chatham, Va., and Wood is playing at Rustburg H.S. near Lynchburg, Va.

To take the previous note a step further, since the ACC expanded to include Virginia Tech and Miami in 2004 (and BC in 2005), the Hokies are fourth in most conference regular season victories ... Tech is 57-59 in that stretch ... Only Duke (87-29), North Carolina (86-30) and Maryland (63-53) have more wins in that span (as of 1-20-11).

Hudson Topped the List

Dorenzo Hudson scored 31 points in the win over FIU on Nov. 15 ... That marked the first time this season that an ACC player scored 30-or-more-points in a game ... It also marked the first time since Malcolm Delaney scored 33 points in the home win over Georgia Tech on Feb. 13, 2011, that a Hokie scored 30-or-more points in a game

... The 31 points is the second-highest point total for Hudson in a game ... His career high in scoring is 41 points in an overtime win over Seton Hall in Cancun, Mexico on Jan. 2, 2010 ... Hudson currently ranks tied for fourth in single game scoring by an ACC player this season.

Oh, What a Week!

Jarell Eddie had a very productive week for the Hokies for the week that ended Dec. 11 ... Eddie opened the week with 15 points in the win at Rhode Island ... He made five of six field goal attempts, including all three threepoint attempts ... He also made both free throw attempts and grabbed six rebounds ... In the win over Norfolk State, he scored a career-hgh 24 points ... He was six of nine from the field, including five of six from threepoint territory and was seven of seven from the line ... He also grabbed seven rebounds in the win ... For the week, Eddie missed a grand total of four shots, none from the line and just one from three-point range ... In the win over Campbell, Eddie was five of seven from the field, including one of two from three-point range.

With ESPN3.com's broadcast of the Hokies' season-opening wins over ETSU and Monmouth and the win over St. Bonaventure, Tech is 7-2 in internet streamed games.

Hostile Crowds

The announced crowd of 12,528 at Kansas State last season was the largest crowd to witness a Virginia Tech non-conference away or neutral site game since Dec. 21, 2006, when the Hokies defeated Seton Hall, 80-61, in Madison Square Garden in front of 19,528 The last time the Hokies played in front of a larger crowd on a non-conference opponent's home court was Nov. 28, 2005, when the Hokies fell to Ohio State in the Shottenstein Center in front of an announced crowd of 13,218 ... Tech's 67-61 victory at Oklahoma State on Dec. 31, 2011 was in front of a crowd of 12,500.

Johnston Joins Hokies

Virginia Tech has added walk-on guard **Will Johnston** to the active roster ... Johnston, a 6-3 freshman guard, had been practicing with the team for a week prior to being added to the active roster.

Hot Shooting

In the win over Monmouth, the Hokies shot 62.5 percent from the field ... That is the highest single-game percentage for the Hokies since a 69.2 percent performance in the win over Mount St. Mary's last season ... Tech was 66.7 percent from three-point range ... That is the highest single-game percentage since shooting 66.7 percent from three-point range in the win at Wake Forest last season ... The last time the Hokies shot better than 66.7 percent from three-point territory was 68.8 percent against Wisconsin on Dec. 1, 2008 ... Tech followed that with a 51.9 percent shooting night in the win over FIU ... That marks the first time since the wins over Wake Forest and Maryland (on Jan. 15 and 20, 2011) that the Hokies have recorded back-to-back games of better than 50 percent shooting from the field ... Tech has shot better than 50 percent from the field in five of its 16 games this season.

Tech Loves the Garden

Madison Square Garden has always been special to the Hokies ... Since **Seth Greenberg** took over as the Hokies' head coach in 2003, Tech has played nine games in "The World's Most Famous Arena" and has a 7-2 record in those games ... Tech has also won two Holiday Festivals in this building ... All in all, the Hokies are 14-5 in MSG and won two NIT post-season titles, in 1973 and 1995.

Van Zegeren Out

The Hokies are planning on seeking a medical redshirt on freshman forward **Joey van Zegeren** ... He suffered a concussion earlier this season and has had other concussion-like issues.



Success is not a given. Only through hard-work and dedication, will success come. In his eighth season at Virginia Tech, Seth Greenberg has set the Hokies onto a course of winning and competing at the highest level.

Since joining the Hokies, Greenberg has established himself as not only a builder of programs, but as a coach who has an eye on the ultimate goal.

Greenberg has a career record of 378-283, now in his 22nd season as a collegiate head coach and a 165-113 record in his ninth season at Virginia Tech. Since coming to Blacksburg, Greenberg's Hokies have three wins over No. 1 ranked teams, including, most recently, a 64-60 vicory over topranked Duke on Feb. 26, 2011 in Cassell Coliseum.

In the 2006-07 season, the Hokies engineered a historic sweep over North Carolina, including a 94-88 win over the Tar Heels in Cassell Coliseum when UNC was the top-ranked team in the country. Couple that victory against North Carolina with a 69-67 overtime win at No. 5 Duke the week before, the Hokies spent time atop the ACC standings for the first time ever. During the 2008-09 season, the win at No. 1 Wake Forest and an 80-77 win at No. 12 Clemson were added to the list. This past season, home wins over a pair of No. 23 teams, Miami and Wake Forest, continued the run of top 25 victories.

With Greenberg's win at Campbell on Nov. 23, 2009, he passed Chuck Noe into second place on the all-time wins list at Virginia Tech with 110 victories. Only Charlie Moir, with 213 victories, has more wins at Tech than Greenberg.

In his time at Virginia Tech, Greenberg is 3-3 against top-ranked teams, with all three losses coming on final possessions. Tech has made five consecutive post-season appearances and six in Greenberg's eight years in Blacksburg.

The Hokies moved into the new \$21 million practice facility in August 2009. This building brings Virginia Tech basketball the "WOW Factor!" that it needs to compete among the elite in college basketball and is the culmination of a vision that Greenberg has for the university and its basketball program.

In the past few years, Greenberg has received two awards that not only speak to his success on the court, but his works off the court as well. In September 2009, Greenberg was presented with the inaugural AI LoBalbo Award by his alma mater, Fairleigh Dickinson University. And in April, Greenberg was inducted into The National Jewish Sports Hall of Fame and Museum.

On March 11, 2008, Greenberg added another honor, as he was named the Atlantic Coast Conference's 2008 Coach of the Year. This marked the second time in four years that Greenberg earned the honor.

In the 2006-07 season, the Hokies defeated four nationally ranked teams and had a 3-0 record against teams ranked in the top-five. And as the 2010-11 season unfolds, Greenberg has the Hokies poised for even loftier achievements.

On April 3, 2003, the Hokies introduced Greenberg as their 27th head coach. A proven program builder, an admired and innovative tactician and an experienced recruiter, Greenberg took over the reigns of a Tech program that has made tremendous strides in his first six seasons in Blacksburg.

Greenberg earned his first major honor at Virginia Tech in 2005, being named the ACC Coach of the Year by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association. He was the fourth Hokie honored by the group for the team's play during

the Hokies' inaugural ACC season. The **Richmond Times-Dispatch named** Greenberg the Coach of the Year in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

The aggressive, up-tempo style that Greenberg installed in his first season with the Hokies has seen dividends and has brought a renewed sense of excitement to Cassell Coliseum, as well as to the "Hokie Nation." Perhaps the biggest influences seen in the program have been the work ethic and attention to details that Greenberg and his staff have instilled. And when speaking of hard work, the principle begins at the top, with Greenberg himself. Long hours of watching film, instructing players and developing the program, along with tirelessly working to promote the program and university while being involved in the community, have made Greenberg a popular face on the Blacksburg campus and in the "Hokie Nation."

Greenberg came to Virginia Tech from the University of South Florida, where he served as head coach for seven seasons. At USF, Greenberg had a record of 108-100. Prior to USF, Greenberg was the head coach at Long Beach State University, where his overall record was 105-70.

During his time at Long Beach State and USF, Greenberg's teams posted impressive records against major conference opponents. During his Long Beach State tenure there were wins over four nationally-ranked teams, including a 64-49 victory against then-No. 1 Kansas at Allen Fieldhouse in 1992-93. At South Florida, his teams were 2-0 against Ohio State, had two wins over Texas and won at Pittsburgh during the Panthers' run to the Sweet 16 in the 2001-02 season. The Bulls defeated eventual Final Four team Wisconsin in the 1999-2000 season.

A 1978 graduate of Fairleigh Dickinson, Greenberg was a fouryear letter winner under head coach Al LoBalbo. His father, the late Ralph Greenberg, played at Long Island University under coaching legend Clair Bee, one of college basketball's all-time winningest coaches.

Greenberg began his coaching career as an assistant at Columbia in 1978. He moved to Pittsburgh two years later,


where he made two trips to the NCAA Tournament in three years with the Panthers. He spent the 1983-84 season at Virginia, helping the Cavs reach the Final Four before moving on to Miami as an assistant under future Virginia Tech head coach Bill Foster. At Miami, he helped revive a program that had been dormant for a number of years.

Greenberg first went to Long Beach State as associate head coach under Joe Harrington. Greenberg replaced him three years later when Harrington accepted the head coaching position at Colorado. In his six seasons at LBSU, Greenberg led the 49ers to two NCAA Tournament appearances and one NIT appearance. He led LBSU to two Big West Conference championships and one Big West regular-season title. While Greenberg was at LBSU, the 49ers defeated four nationally ranked teams. Greenberg also tutored future NBA players Bryon Russell, Lucious Harris and Juaquin Hawkins.

In the summer of 2004, Greenberg received a lofty honor when he was inducted into the Five Star Basketball Camp's Hall of Fame. The honor, shared by some of the greatest coaches like Rick Pitino and Hubie Brown, was bestowed for the many years that Greenberg has been a part of the nation's top summer basketball camp as an instructor and quest speaker.

Greenberg has always been involved in charitable organizations and causes. In September of 2009, he was the winning head coach in the inaugural "Chairmen of the Boards" 3-on-3 charity basketball tournament to benefit Tuesday's Children in New York City. This group is the premiere non-profit organization serving the needs of the 9/11 community, providing a wide-range of programming from mentoring, to advocacy for children, to next-step life skills and leadership training for 9/11 families and rescue and recovery workers.

When confronted by the destruction of Hurricane Katrina, Greenberg knew he had to get involved. He served as the chairman of the organizing committee of AllCoachesCare.com, a major on-line sports auction that raised money for Habitat for Humanity and its efforts in helping to rebuild the Gulf Coast area. Working tirelessly, Greenberg helped the

group acquire goods and services for the auction and also spent countless hours speaking on television and radio and to media members getting the word out about the auction.

This past season, Greenberg took on a leadership role with "Shots from the Heart," an event that helped the American Heart Association raise money to fight heart disease. The event featured selected head coaches and assistant coaches in a bracketed free throw shooting contest.

Greenberg and his wife, Karen, are the parents of three daughters: Paige, 22, Ella, 19, and Jacqueline, 16. Paige graduated from Virginia Tech in May 2010 and Ella will be a junior cheerleader for the Hokies in the fall of 2011. Greenberg is active in a number of organizations and causes, including the Great American Teach-in, the American Heart Association, Coaches vs. Cancer and the Boys and Girls Club.



In a day of impressive debuts, Tech began the 2011-12 season with a 64-53 win over East Tennessee State, moving to 9-0 in home openers under head coach Seth Greenberg. Dorian Finney-Smith highlighted the season-opening victory as he became the first freshman since Jeff Allen in 2007 to notch a double-double in his first game. Finney-Smith began his collegiate career with 10 points and 16 rebounds against the Bucs, while his classmate Robert Brown came off the bench for Tech and dropped 12 points in the outing.

Without point guard Erick Green (strained Achilles) the Hokies did see the return of Dorenzo Hudson, who missed most of the 2010-11 season with a foot injury. Green's replacement in the starting line-up, sophomore Tyrone Garland, did not diappoint in his first career start. Garland scored 13 points, while going 7-of-8 from the line.

Punching its ticket to New York City, Virginia Tech earned a spot in the NIT Season Tip-Off Semifinals with a 78-63 win over Florida International in the second round of the touranament at Cassell Coliseum. Senior Dorenzo Hudson speadheaded the Tech offense with 31 points, marking the most by him since his 41-point outburst against Seton Hall on Jan. 2, 2010, in Mexico.

The Hokies led by as many as 13 in the first half against the Panthers, but saw FIU cut the lead to 39-34 on a basket by Dominique Ferguson with 14:28 remaining. Tech answered by going on a 16-7 run, scoring on seven straight possessions. Freshman Dorian Finney-Smith's three-point play with 10:21 remaining ended the run, giving the Hokies a 55-41 cushion. Tech went on to lead by as many as 19, cruising to the victory.

Virginia Tech fell to Minnesota, 58-55, in the Big Ten/ ACC Challenge in Williams Arena on Wednesday night. Tech is now 5-2 on the season, while Minnesota improves to 7-1 overall.

Tech fell behind early, but fought back and took a 28-25 lead into intermission. The Hokies and Golden Gophers battled back and forth throughout the second half, before Minnesota took a 56-55 lead with 18 seconds remaining on a pair of free throws by Julian Welch. Welch made two more free throws with 6.4 seconds remaining to give the Golden Gophers the lead, 58-56. **Erick Green**, who had been knocked off the elevated court in William Arena in the final half minute of action, attempted to hit a game tying three-pointer at the buzzer, but the ball spun off the rim and Minnesota claimed the victory.

Green scored a career-high 25 points to lead all scorers. Robert Brown added 13 points and **Victor Davila** scored 10 points and grabbed seven rebounds. Welch led the Golden Gophers with 15 points. Green made four of eight from three-point range and handed-out a team-high four assists without committing a turnover. He suffered a bruised shoulder on the fall, but was able to return in the final seconds of play.

Tech out rebounded Minnesota, 32-30, but shot just 37.7 percent from the floor. The Hokies made all seven free throw attempts, but just two came in the second half.

Jarell Eddie scored a career-high 24 points and grabbed seven rebounds to lift Virginia Tech past Norfolk State, 73-60. Eddie made 6-of-9 from the floor and hit a career-high five 3-pointers. He also connected on all seven of his free-throw attempts. His previous career high came last season against Wake Forest when he scored 17 in a win in Winston-Salem, N.C.

The Hokies trailed for much of the first half, but Eddie scored six points in a 10-0 Tech run late in the first half that gave the Hokies the lead for good.

The Spartans, who have quality victories over Drexel and TCU and lost to nationally ranked Marquette by just two points, kept the game close throughout and cut the lead to 65-59 on Chris McEachin's 3-pointer with 2:58 left in the game. Norfolk State shot 48.9 percent from the floor (22-of-45). But the Spartans hurt themselves with nine second-half turnovers.

McEachin led NSU with 18 points, hitting 6-of-12 from the floor, including two 3-pointers. Kyle O'Quinn and Pendarvis Williams scored 14 each. O'Quinn, NSU's leading scorer, scored 12 of his 14 in the first half, but spent most of the second half on the bench in foul trouble before fouling out with 4:11 left.

Virginia Tech opened the second half with a 15-0 run to

break open a close game and roll past Campbell 85-60 in a non-conference game at Cassell Coliseum.

The Hokies led just 32-29 at halftime after shooting only 37 percent from the floor. But Tech opened the second half by hitting six of its first seven shots, as **Jarell Eddie** heated up following a scoreless first half. Eddie scored seven of Tech's 15 points in that run, and his basket with 15:19 left in the game capped the run, giving the Hokies a 47-29 lead.

Tech continued its hot shooting throughout the second half. The Hokies shot 73.1 percent in the final 20 minutes and 54.7 percent for the game – its second-best shooting performance of the season.

In contrast, Campbell struggled from the floor in the first five minutes of the second half. The Fighting Camels missed three shots and turned the ball over four times on their first seven possessions of the second half. Their first basket in the final 20 minutes came at the 14:46 mark, and Campbell shot just 41.9 percent in the second half (44.1 for the game).

Dorenzo Hudson and **Victor Davila** both snapped shooting slumps for Tech, leading the Hokies in scoring with 15 points each. Hudson hit 5-of-11 from the floor, including 2-of-4 from beyond the 3-point arc.

Dorenzo Hudson scored 16 points to help Virginia Tech win its fourth straight game in an 84-55 decision over North Florida in non-conference action.

The Hokies broke open a close contest with an 8-0 run to close the first half. **Jarell Eddie**'s 3-pointer with 3 seconds left – his only points of the half – gave Tech a 40-31 halftime lead.

Tech used a 19-5 run over a 7-minute stretch in the second half to put the game away. **Erick Green** and **Robert Brown** combined to score 13 of the 19 points in that run for the Hokies. Tech went on to lead by as many as 29 points in the game and shot 61.3 percent in the final 20 minutes (19 of 31).

North Florida, which has played a brutal schedule that includes Alabama, Florida, Miami, Ohio State and Kansas State, struggled to take care of the ball against Tech's manto-man defense. The Ospreys committed 16 turnovers, and they shot just 37.5 percent from the floor in the second half.

Hudson, who snapped out of a shooting slump in the Hokies' previous game against Campbell, connected on 6 of 10 from the floor to pace a Tech team that shot 55.2 percent for the game (32 of 58). It marked the fifth time this season that the Hokies have shot better than 50 percent.

Brown added 14 points for the Hokies, hitting 6 of 10 from the floor, including 2 of 4 from beyond the 3-point arc. **Dorian Finney-Smith** also had 14 and hit two 3-pointers, as the Hokies made seven treys for the game. Green finished with 12.

Florida State's Okaro White sank two free throws with 5.5 seconds left, and that propelled the Seminoles past **Erick Green** and the Virginia Tech Hokies 63-59 in an ACC game played Tuesday night at Cassell Coliseum.

With the loss, the Hokies fell to 11-5 overall on the season, 0-2 in ACC play. Tech also lost to Florida State for the fourth time in the past six meetings between the two schools. The Seminoles moved to 10-6, 1-1 in league action.

FSU finished with a season-high 15 blocked shots, tying for the most blocked shots ever by a Tech opponent against the Hokies – the Georgetown Hoyas, featuring then sophomore Dikembe Mutombo and freshman Alonzo Mourning, blocked 15 in a win over the Hokies in 1988. The Seminoles also held the Hokies to a season-low 30.5 percent from the floor.

Virginia Tech's late rally fell short and the Hokies lost to Boston College, 61-59, in the Conte Forum on Saturday afternoon. The loss drops Tech to 11-6 overall and 0-3 in the ACC, while Boston College improves to 7-10 overall and 2-1 in league play.

The Hokies played the game without leading scorer **Erick Green**, who sprained the lateral collateral ligament in his left knee in practice on Thursday afternoon and was not able to play. Green leads the Hokies in scoring, assists, steals and minutes played this season. Freshman **Marquis Rankin** got the start in place of Green.

The game was close throughout the first half, and BC took a 29-27 lead into intermission. Virginia Tech's two seniors led the way for Tech, as **Victor Davila** scored 14 points and **Dorenzo Hudson** added 13 points in the loss. Dennis Clifford led BC with 15 points. Tech won the battle on the boards, out rebounding BC, 30-28, but shot 36.2 percent from the field.

Virginia Tech made eight 3-pointers in the first half and led at halftime, but the Hokies couldn't continue the

hot shooting, and North Carolina ran away to an 82-68 ACC victory over Tech at Cassell Coliseum on Thursday night. The loss marked Tech's fourth straight, as the Hokies

fell to 11-7, 0-4 in the league. North Carolina, ranked No. 8 in both major polls, moved to 16-3, 3-1 in the ACC.

Behind **Dorenzo Hudson**, Tech drilled eight 3-pointers in the first half, with the senior guard canning four of them. As a result, the Hokies were able to take a 39-34 lead at halftime.

But the Tar Heels took control early in the second half. Trailing 44-36, North Carolina went on a 19-0 run and never looked back. **Dorian Finney-Smith** ended the run with two free throws at the 13:08 mark, but the Hokies didn't score again until **Robert Brown** drained a 3-pointer with 9:25 remaining. By then, Tech trailed by 13, 62-49.

North Carolina went on to lead by as many as 21, thanks largely to the play of Harrison Barnes. The sophomore scored a game-high 27 points, with 21 of those coming in the second half. John Henson and Tyler Zeller finished with double-doubles, as Henson scored 16 points and grabbed 16 rebounds and Zeller added 14 points and grabbed 11 boards.

The Tar Heels shot 51.7 percent in the second half and finished at 45.5. In contrast, the Hokies shot 33.3 percent in the second half and finished at 36.8 percent for the game.

Erick Green led the Hokies with 17 points, while Hudson – who did not start for the first time this season – came off the bench to score 16. **Jarell Eddie** added 15 and Brown, who started in Hudson's place, had 12.
