About Today's Game

The Hokies are 11-9 on the season and 2-5 in ACC play after losing to No. 14/15 Miami on Wednesday night.

North Carolina is 14-6 overall and 4-3 in ACC action after an 82-70 win at Boston College on Tuesday night.

No. 14/15 Miami 73, Virginia Tech 64

Erick Green scored 30 points and the Hokies led by as many as 12 points in the first half, but could not hold on and lost 73-64, to No. 14/15 Miami in Cassell Coliseum on Wednesday night. Jarell Eddie scored 14 points and Cadarian Raines added 10 points and eight rebounds off the bech for the Hokies.

Green Notes

Erick Green leads the ACC and the nation in scoring. Green has scored 20-or-more points in 19 games of the 20 games this season.

Ace Custis has been named to the 2013 ACC Men's Basketball Legends Class.

Honors for Green

Erick Green has been named a watch list finalist for the Bob Cousey Award, given annually to the top point guard in the nation. Green has also been named to the John R. Wooden Award's Midseason Top 25. Wooden Award given to nation's best player.

Odds & Ends

Erick Green's 35 points in the loss to Virginia marks the most points by an ACC player in a game this season. Green has three of the ACC's seven 30-plus point games this season.

The Hokies' two largest comeback victories this season have come in their two overtime games, both victories. Tech was down 13 points against Bradley and 11 points at Georgia Tech.

The Hokies have played in two of the four overtime games played this season by ACC teams. Tech defeated Georgia Tech in the only ACC conference overtime game this season.

Last Time Out: #14/15 Miami 73, VT 64

The Hokies dropped another tough one, 73-64, to No. 14/15 Miami in Cassell Coliseum on Wednesday night ... The Hokies jumped out to a 12-point lead in first half and led by three points at the intermission, but Miami fought back and held off a late Tech run ... Erick Green led all scorers with 30 points ... Jarell Eddie added 14 points and Cadarian Raines scored 10 points and grabbed eight rebounds off the bench for the Hokies.

35 for Green

Erick Green scored 35 points in the loss to Virginia, setting a new career-high for the senior ... His previous high was 31 points in the overtime win over Bradley earlier this season in Las Vegas ... The 35 points marks the most points scored

by an ACC player this season ... With his 30 points in the loss to Miami, Green now has three of the six 30-plus point games in the ACC this season, the only player with more than one such game ... The 35 points is the most points by a Virginia Tech player since Dorenzo Hudson scored 41 points in a 103-94 overtime win over Seton Hall in Cancun, Mexico on Jan. 2, 2010 ... It is the most points by a Hokie in an ACC game since Malcolm Delaney scored 37 points in an 86-82 home loss to No. 12 Clemson on Jan. 29, 2009 ... In the loss to Virginia, Green also set a new career-high with nine rebounds.

Leading the Way

Erick Green enters today's game leading the nation in scoring, averaging 25.5 points per game ... Only one other ACC player has led the nation in scoring, South Carolina's Grady Wallace led the nation in scoring (31.2 ppg) in the 1956-57 season ... Green is also leading the ACC in scoring ... Only one Hokie, Malcolm Delaney, has ever led the ACC in scoring ... Delaney averaged 20.2 ppg in the 2010 season ... The last ACC player to average more than 25 points per game in a season was J.J. Redick of Duke, who averaged 26.8 ppg as a senior in 2006 ... Green is the leading active scorer in the ACC at this point.

500 So Far

Erick Green scored his 500th point of the season in the loss to No. 14/15 Miami ... That is the most points he has scored in a season ... The last Hokie to score 500 points in a season was Malcolm Delaney in the 2010-11 season ... Delaney scored his 500th point in the 27th game of that season.

1,400 and Climbing

Erick Green scored 23 points in the win over VMI and in doing so, he became the 43rd player in Virginia Tech history to reach the 1,000 career point plateau ... Green now has 1,450 career points ... In the loss to No. 14/15 Miami, Green passed Shawn Smith and Howard Pardue into 17th place on the Tech all-time scoring list ... He is one of 20 players to score at least 1,400 points for the Hokies.

Wood Returns

Freshman forward

Marshall Wood returned
to action in the Hokies'
loss to Virginia on Jan. 24,
playing seven minutes ...
He increased that to 13
minutes at Clemson ... He
had fractured the third

metatarsal in his left foot on Dec. 15 ... The injury, which did not require surgery, was suffered in the loss to Georgia Southern on Dec. 15 ... He dressed in the game against Wake Forest, but was not cleared to play against the Demon Deacons.

Better After the Break

Erick Green leads the nation and the ACC in scoring ... In ACC games this season, Green has scored 192 points, for an average of 27.4 points per game ... In those seven games, he has scored 74 first half points and 118 second half points ... 61.5 percent of his total ACC points have come in the second half (and the overtime session in the win at Georgia Tech).

Low Board Totals

In the Hokies' loss to Virginia on Thursday night, Tech out rebounded the Cavaliers, 32-24 ... The 56 total rebounds is a season low ... The 24 total rebounds by UVa are the fewest rebounds allowed by the Hokies since Tech allowed the Cavaliers 24 rebounds in the Hokies' home loss to UVa last season ... The last time Tech allowed less than 24 rebounds in a game was on Feb. 12, 2012, when the Hokies allowed Boston College 19 rebounds in a home win over the Eagles.

The Series vs. North Carolina

The Tar Heels hold a 62-13 advantage against the Hokies in the all-time series ... The Hokies have lost the last two meetings, including an 82-68 loss in Cassell Coliseum last season ... Tech is 5-28 in road games in the series and has lost the last three in Chapel Hill ... The Hokies are 3-9 against UNC since joining the ACC ... Along with Chapel Hill and Blacksburg, games in this series have also been played in Roanoke, Atlanta, Charlotte, Greensboro, Winston-Salem, Durham, Raleigh and Columbia. S.C.

This Year vs. Last Year

Erick Green has scored 509 points so far in 20 games this season ... Last season, when he led the team in scoring as a junior, Green totaled 483 points ... He has also made and attempted more free throws than last year.

Farther Away Than the Rest

Erick Green is the only player in the top 10 in field goal percentage in the ACC that primarily plays guard ... He is shooting 49.8 percent from the floor this season ... He is shooting 43.6 percent from the field for his career.

Hokies vs. Ranked Teams

With the loss to No. 14/15 Miami, the Hokies are 13-40 against nationally ranked teams since joining the ACC for the 2004-05 season ... Tech is 30-148 all-time against teams ranked in the AP poll ... The win over Oklahoma State was the first time this season the Hokies had faced a ranked opponent ... Tech is 1-1 against ranked teams this season ... These numbers are only for teams ranked in the AP poll.

Scoring Combos

The Virginia Tech combo of **Erick Green** and **Jarell Eddie** are averaging 39.9 points per game ... They are the highest-scoring set of teammates in the ACC this season ... The duo of Mason Plumlee and Seth Curry of

Duke are averaging 34.1 ppg ... Green leads the ACC and Eddie is 10th in scoring ... The duo also has combined for 23, 20-or-more point games ... That leads the ACC, eight ahead of the 15 by Curry and Plumlee.

Improving on Good

Entering today's game, **Erick Green** is, statistically by scoring, the most improved player in the ACC ... Green averaged 15.6 points per game last season and has improved that to 25.5 ppg this season ... That is an increase of 9.9 ppg ... James Michael McAdoo of North Carolina has increased his scoring average this season, going from 6.1 ppg to 14.7 ppg, an increase of 8.6 ppg.

Getting There is Half the Battle

Erick Green is averaging 8.7 free throw attempts per game this season, best in the ACC ... Mason Plumlee of Duke gets to the charity stripe the second-most in the league, at 7.5 ftpg ... Green is shooting 81.6 percent from the line this season, while Plumlee is shooting 64.0 percent from the line.

Finally a Two

Sophomore walk-on **Will Johnston** has earned significant playing time this season and a lot has been his three-point shooting ... In Johnston's career, he has made 14 field goals and all but one of them have been three-pointers ... He

hit a career-high three, three-pointers in the win over VMI, for a career-high nine points in a career-high 19 minutes of action ... He equalled the number of threes in the next game, as he hit three, three-pointers in the first half of the win at UNCG ... In the loss to Boston College, Johnston attempted his first two-pointer of the season and later in the game, made his first two-point field goal of the season.

2x5 is Rare

In the loss at Clemson on Sunday, both **Cadarian Raines** and **Joey van Zegeren** fouled out of the game ... It marked the first time that two Hokies had fouled out of the same game since Terrell Bell and



game since Terrell Bell and Joey van Zegeren Jeff Allen fouled out of a 73-57 loss at No. Kansas State on Nov. 16, 2010 ... The last time two Hokies had fouled out of an ACC game was on Feb. 8, 2009, when Jeff Allen and Cheick Diakite fouled out of a 91-87 home win over NC State.

Tying a Long-Held Mark

To open the 2012-13 season, Erick Green scored 20-or-more points in the first 12 games ... That tied the school record for games with consecutive 20-or-more points, set by Bob Ayersman in the 1958-59 season ... That was also the school record for most consecutive 20-plus point games at any time in a season at Virginia Tech ... In the win over Bradley in the semifinal of the Continental Tire Las Vegas Classic, Green scored a careerhigh 31 points, the first time in his career that he had scored 30-or-more-points in a game ... He set a new career high with 35 points in the loss to Virginia ... After snapping the streak in the loss at BYU, Green has scored 20-ormore points in each of the last six games, all ACC league games ... The Miami game, in which Green scored 30 points, was the third career game with 30-or-more points ... The Miami game was the 26th career game of 20-or-more points and the 76th time in his collegiate career that he has scored in double figures.

Four Doubles is Rare

When **C.J. Barksdale** recorded his first career double-double in the overtime win at Georgia Tech, he became the fourth Hokie to record a double-double this season (and the third to record his first

career double-double this season) ... This is the first season since the 2007-08 season that four different Hokies have recorded a double-double (J.T. Thompson, Jeff Allen, A.D. Vassallo and Deron Washington) ... That season was the third consecutive year that the Hokies had four players record double-doubles.

Johnson's Debut

The season-opening victory against ETSU was the debut of **James Johnson** as the head coach of the Hokies ... Johnson, a former assistant and associate head coach with the Hokies, was named to the position on May 2, 2012

... Johnson is now 11-9 as the coach of the Hokies and 1-1 against nationally-ranked teams ... He earned his first ACC victory in the overtime win at Georgia Tech and his first ACC home win over Wake Forest ... He brings with him 19 years experience as an assistant coach ... He is the only new coach in the ACC this season ... For a full bio on Johnson, please see page 10 of this release.

Hokies' All-Time Record

Virginia Tech is now 1355-1117 all-time in collegiate basketball, good for a .548 winning percentage ... This is the Hokies' 104th season of men's basketball.

Their Time to Shine

Head coach **James Johnson** repeatedly tells his players that at some time this season, every one of them will be called upon to help this team win a basketball game ... In the win over Mississippi Valley State, it was **Christian**

Beyer and Marcus Patrick's turn ... The duo of walk-ons came off the bench in the first half to provide a spark for the Hokies ... Patrick played a career-high 10 minutes in the game and grabbed a pair of rebounds, while Beyer, who also played a then-career-high 10 minutes, scored two points, blocked a shot and grabbed five rebounds, third-most on the team.

More on Beyer

To take that one step further, **Christian Beyer** had the best game of his short Virginia Tech (to date) career, as he scored three points and grabbed nine rebounds in 27 minutes of action in the overtime win

over Bradley ... He also led the Hokies with two steals ... Beyer had played a combined 15 minutes in the first 10 games of the season ... Add in the 25 minutes he played in the loss to Colorado State and Beyer averaged 26.0 minutes and 6.5 rebounds per game in Las Vegas ... In the loss at BYU, Beyer scored a career-high nine points and grabbed a career-high 11 rebounds ... He had six points and seven rebounds in the loss at Maryland and six points and eight rebounds in the loss to Boston College ... He has grabbed 55 of his 57 rebounds in his last 10 appearances.

Hot Shooting, Wrong Outcome

Virginia Tech shot 51.8 percent from the field in the loss to Boston College, including 64.3 percent in the second half ... That is the first time the Hokies shot at least 50 percent from the field in a game and lost since Jan. 29, 2009, when the Hokies shot 50.8 percent from the field in an 86-82 loss in Cassell Coliseum to No. 12 Clemson ... The last time the Hokies shot better than 51.8 percent from the field in a game in which they lost was on Feb. 9, 2008, a 74-71 loss to Miami.

Not Many at All

When the Hokies defeated Bradley, 66-65, in overtime in the Las Vegas Classic, it marked the fewest points Tech had scored in an overtime victory since defeating Marquette, 65-64, in overtime in the finals of the 1995 NIT in Madison Square Garden ... Both of Virginia Tech's NIT championships were won in overtime ... The last time Tech won any game scoring 66-or-fewer points was a 66-65 win over Boston College in Blacksburg last season.

Hokies in Overtime

With the win at Georgia Tech, the Hokies are now 59-43 all-time in overtime games ... Tech is 26-21 in road overtime games, 26-9 in home overtime games and 7-13 on neutral courts ... Tech is 12-3 in ACC overtime games ... Prior to the loss at No. 5 Duke last season, the last time the Hokies had lost a true road overtime game was Feb. 11, 2006, when Tech fell to Virginia, 81-77, in University Hall ... Tech is 3-6 all-time in overtime games against ranked teams ... Tech is 5-8 in double overtime games and 1-2 in triple overtime games.

Interesting Free Throw Note

In the Hokies' win over Wake Forest, Tech made eight of 16 free throw attempts, for 50 percent from the line ... The last time Tech shot 50 percent or worse from the line and won that basketball game came on Feb. 26, 2011 in Cassell Coliseum, when the Hokies made just eight of 19 attempts from the line and defeated No. 1 Duke, 64-60.

It's Been A While

With his career-high 10 assists in the loss at West Virginia, **Erick Green** posted the first double-digit assist total by a Hokie since Malcolm Delaney had 10 assists in the NIT loss to Baylor on March 21, 2009 ... That was the second of Delaney's two 10-assist games.

Doubles from the Wing

Jarell Eddie recorded his second doubledouble of the season with 15 points and 12 rebounds in the win over No. 15/17 Oklahoma State ... In doing so, that marks the most double-doubles in a season by a Virginia Tech wing or back court player since A.D. Vassallo recorded three double-doubles in the 2008-09 season (Malcolm Delaney recorded two double-doubles that same season) ... The most double-doubles recorded by a Tech wing player in a single season since the Hokies joined the ACC in the 2004-05 season is six, by Deron Washington in the 2007-08 season ... Erick Green recorded his first career double-double in the loss at West Virginia, with 23 points and a career-high 10 assists.

Less Than 50

Virginia Tech defeated Mississippi Valley State, 70-49 ... The 49 points scored is the fewest the Hokies have allowed an opponent this season and the fewest since a 48-47 loss at No. 20 Florida State on Feb. 16, 2012 ... The last time the Hokies limited an opponent to fewer than 50 points and won was a 47-45 win over No. 15 Virginia on Jan. 22, 2012 in John Paul Jones Arena.

Sharp Dressed Man

Sophomore Adam
Smith has joined the Hokie program, but he must sit out this season after transferring from UNC Wilmington ... He will have three seasons of eligibility beginning next fall ... He is able to practice with the

Hokies this season ... Smith has already made a name for himself for his natty attire on the bench at Virginia Tech home games.

Comfortable at the Line

Erick Green enters today's game shooting 80.1 percent from the free throw line for his career ... He has passed Brian Chase into eighth place in career free throw shooting percentage at Virginia Tech ... Green, along with junior wing **Jarell Eddie**, combined for 84.2 percent from the free throw line last season ... Eddie is 82.6 percent from the line in his career, but does not, at this point, have enough free throw attempts to qualify for the list ... Eddie's 86.8 percent from the line last season was the fifth-best season in Virginia Tech history ... This season, the duo is a combined 203-246 from the line, good for 82.5 percent.

All Together Now

When **Marquis Rankin** scored a career-high 10 points in the win over Mississippi Valley State, it marked the eighth different player to record a double-figure scoring game this season ... All eight



this season ... All eight *Marquis Rankin* scholarship players have now scored at least 10 points in a game this season.

Grabbing Boards

When **Cadarian Raines** grabbed a career-high and team season-high 13 rebounds in the loss at Maryland, it marked the first time a Hokie had grabbed at least 13 rebounds in a game since **Jarell Eddie** grabbed 14 rebounds in a

home loss to BYU on Jan. 25, 2012 ... Raines repeated the feat when he grabbed 13 rebounds in the win over Wake Forest.

90 and 80

Virginia Tech won consecutive games, 95-80 over VMI and 96-87 at UNC Greensboro ... This was the first time since Feb. 13 and 15, 2011 that Tech has scored 90-or-more points in back-to-back games ... This was also the first time since Dec. 10 and 17, 1989 that the Hokies allowed opponents 80-or-more points in back-to-back victories ... Tech scored 96 points in the win, the first time that the Hokies had scored that many points in a true road game since defeating Liberty, 101-70, in Lynchburg on Jan. 28, 1995 ... The 87 points for UNCG are the most points scored by an opponent in a true road game Tech victory since Dec. 28, 1993, when Tech defeated Florida Atlantic, 115-87, in Boca Raton, Fla. ... This is the first time since the 1988-89 season that Tech has scored 90-or-more points in three of the first six games of the season.

A Little More on 80

Tech scored at least 80 points in five consecutive games from Nov. 15 through Dec. 1 ... That was the first time Tech had scored at least 80 points in five consecutive games since Dec. 5 through 19, 1987, when Tech won five straight games by those numbers.

That's a Low Percentage

When the Hokies held Mississippi Valley State to just 13.8 percent from three-point range, it marked the fifth time this season that Tech had held its opponent to under 20.0 percent from behind the three-point arc ... The last time the Hokies held an opponent to less than 15.0 percent from three-point range was on March 1, 2012, when Clemson went 0-10 from behind the arc ... Tech also held the Delta Devils to 25.7 percent from the field, the first time Tech has held an opponent to under 30.0 percent from the field since holding Eastern Michigan to 28.1 percent from the field on Dec. 22, 2011.

They Are Free, After All

In the win at UNCG, Erick Green made all 16 of his free throw attempts ... That is the second-best performance at the line in Tech history ... Rod Wheeler made all 18 of his attempts against Richmond on Dec. 28, 1990 ... Green made 37 free throw attempts earlier this season ... In the win at UNCG, Jarell Eddie made nine of his 10 attempts ... Tech was 34-of-42 from the line in that game, shooting 81.1 percent ... In the win over lowa, the Hokies were 27-30 from the line, for 90.0 percent and in the win over No. 15/17 Oklahoma State, Tech was 27-33 from the line, for 81.1 percent and in the loss at West Virginia, Tech made eight of 10 attempts (80.0 percent).

Doubles in Threes

Tech made 14 three-point field goals in the win at UNC Greensboro which is the most threes for the Hokies in a game since the team joined the BIG EAST in 2000 and subsequently, the ACC in 2004 ... Research is ongoing to see if Tech had 14-or-more threes in a game since the Hokies set the school record with 16 threes against Marquette on Jan. 7, 1989 ... In the loss to No. 14/15 Miami, the Hokies made 10 three-pointers, the most in an ACC game this season and the most in an ACC game for the Hokies since Tech made 11 three-pointers in a 74-73 overtime win over Georgia Tech on Feb. 18, 2012 and the most in a regulation ACC game since making 13 threes in an 82-68 loss to No. 8 North Carolina in Blacksburg on Jan. 19, 2012.

500-Plus in the Cassell

The Hokies have a 526-161 overall record in Cassell, good for a .766 winning percentage ... Tech is 8-4 in Cassell Coliseum this season ... Tech was 11-7 last season and was 12-4 in Cassell the season before, the 50th year for the arena ... The win over Florida State on Jan. 8, 2011, was the 500th victory in the building ... The win over FSU in 2008 marked the Hokies' 600th game played in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech defeated Rhode Island, 86-63, on Nov. 20, 2002, in its 500th game in the arena ... Tech has had just one break-even home season and one losing season in Cassell Coliseum ... The 17 victories for the Hokies at home in the 2009-10 season set a new Cassell Coliseum and school record.

Welcome Back

The weekend of Dec. 14 and 15, the Hokies hosted the Men's Basketball Alumni Weekend ... The two-day event featured a wide range of events for the returning former players, including tours of facilities, receptions and a dinner on the court of the Hahn Hurst Basketball Practice Facility following the game against Georgia Southern ... The returning players were recognized at halftime of the game ... More than 50 former players attended, including former All-Americans Howard Pardue and Bimbo Coles, along with retired jersey honoree Ace Custis and Les Henson, famous for the "Henson Heave" shot to defeat Florida State in 1980.

Green was Honored

Erick Green was named the ACC Co-Player of the Week, for the week ending Nov. 25 ... This was the second-consecutive week he earned the award ... He led the Hokies to a pair of home wins, over lowa and No. 15/17 Oklahoma State ... He was named the National Player of the Week, for the week ending Dec. 2, in Sl.com's Seth Davis' Fast Break ... He was also named the College Hoops Player of the Week by NBCSports.com's CollegeBasketballTalk column.

Building Makes it Better?

A case can be made that the Hokies have shown marked improvement in many areas of their game since moving into the Hahn Hurst Basketball Basketball Practice Facility in August 2009 ... One such improvement comes to the forefront ... In the six years before the opening of the practice facilty, the Hokies shot a combined 66.2 percent from the free throw line ... Since the opening of the facility, the Hokies are shooting 73.1 percent from the free throw line.

Welcoming Back Old Foes

The Hokies welcomed back two traditional rivals to the schedule ... Tech defeated VMI, 95-80, on Nov. 15 in a rivalry that dates back to 1909 and lost to West Virginia in Morgantown, 68-67, on Dec. 8 ... Tech and WVU first met in basketball in 1921 and have played 75 times since then ... The teams last met in the 2003-04 season, the Hokies' last season as a member of the BIG EAST Conference.

300 and Counting

The Hokies have hit at least one three-pointer in every game since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... Tech has now hit a three in 323 consecutive games, the most in school history ... Since the three-point arc was added to college basketball for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one three in all but three games ... The last time that the Hokies did not record a three-point field goal in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003.

Stingy with the Ball

Erick Green enters today's game with 289 assists and just 154 turnovers in his career ... Each of the last two seasons, Green has had at least 40 more assists than turnovers and has more assists than turnovers in each of his first three seasons ... This season, Green has 84 assists to just 45 turnovers.

Lots of Youth

Among Virginia Tech's eight active scholarship players, **Erick Green** is the only senior and **Cadarian Raines** and **Jarell Eddie** are the only juniors ... Four players, **Robert Brown, C.J. Barksdale, Marquis Rankin** and **Joey van Zegeren**, played as freshmen last season, although van Zegeren only played eight minutes and was granted a medical redshirt ... **Marshall Wood** is the lone scholarship freshman this season.

The State We're In

With the loss to Virginia, Virginia Tech is 421-306 (.579) all-time against schools from Virginia ...Tech is 1-1 this season and was 2-1 against state schools last year ... The Hokies have played 14 schools from the state ... With the win over Norfolk State on Dec. 11, 2011, the only state Division I school that Tech has not played is Hampton ... Tech holds winning records against 10 of the schools and even records against two others.

Erick Green has scored in double figures in 52 of his last 53 games.

He was a four-year starter at power forward for the Virginia Tech teams of coach Bill Foster ... He led the Hokies to a record of 81-42, including the championship of the 1995 NIT and a 1996 appearance in the NCAA Tournament ... Custis still ranks 10th on the Virginia Tech career list for points scored (1,706), 6th in field goals made (660), 5th in career rebound average (9.5) and 7th in career steals (199) ... He is one of only three players in Virginia Tech history to surpass the 1,500 mark in both points and rebounds ... He is one of just four Tech players to have their jersey's retired and was inducted into the Virginia Tech Sports Hall of Fame in 2007.

Erick Green has scored in double figures in 23 consecutive games, 11 more than the next ACC players on the list, Olivier Hanlan of Boston College and Travis McKie of Wake Forest, with 11 such games each ... Green has 19 games this season of 20-or-more points, more than double the number of second-place Seth Curry of Duke (9) ... His 26 career games of 20-or-more points is seven more than second place Travis McKie of Wake Forest (19) ... Green is one of five ACC players to score 30-or-more points in a game this season and the only one with more than two such games.

Head Coach James Johnson

James Johnson begins his first season as Virginia Tech's head men's basketball coach. Director of Athletics Jim Weaver named Johnson to the position on May 1, 2012.

On Nov. 10, 2012, in his first game as a collegiate head coach, Johnson picked up his first head coaching victory, an 80-62 win over East Tennessee State in Cassell Coliseum. Johnson is now 11-9 as head coach of the Hokies. He is 1-1 against nationally-ranked teams. He earned his first career ACC victory in the overtime win at Georgia Tech and earned his first home ACC victory against Wake Forest.

No stranger to the Hokie Nation, Johnson spent the last five seasons on the men's basketball staff at Virginia Tech. He was an assistant coach from 2007-2011 before being promoted to associate head coach prior to last season. He had accepted an assistant coaches' position at Clemson on April 13 of this year, but returns to Blacksburg to take over the reins of the men's basketball program.

"I am very pleased to welcome James Johnson as the new head men's basketball coach at Virginia Tech," Weaver said. "He is an individual with 19 years of coaching experience, who has spent the last five years here at Virginia Tech. He knows and has recruited most of our current players. We believe that he is the right person at this moment in time."


Johnson joined the Hokies following two seasons as an assistant at George Mason. While at Mason, he focused on organizing the team's defensive efforts in practice and games. The Patriots were a combined 45-23 in his two seasons and advanced to the 2006 NCAA Final Four.

Before GMU, Johnson spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Penn State. He was the recruitment coordinator for the Nittany Lions. Prior to Penn State, Johnson had a one-year stint as an assistant at the College of Charleston and he spent two years as an assistant at Elon.

"Virginia Tech and the Hokie Nation have a special place in my heart and I am blessed and excited for the opportunity to become the head basketball coach," Johnson said. "I look forward to working with a great group of young men and moving forward with this program."

Johnson, a native of Powhatan, Va., was a four-year player and three-year starter at Ferrum College. A three-time

Defensive Player of the Year, he helped guide his team to two conference championships and a berth in the NCAA Division III Tournament. He was also voted his team's Most Valuable Player in 1993. In 2001, Johnson was selected as one of the Top 10 players in Ferrum basketball history. In September of 2009, Johnson was elected into the Ferrum College Athletic Hall of Fame.

After graduating from Ferrum with a bachelor of science in psychology in 1993, he immediately stepped into the coaching ranks at his alma mater and served as an assistant for two seasons. Johnson helped guide the Panthers to a regular-season conference title.

In 1995, Johnson moved on to Longwood College as an assistant and then spent one year at Hargrave Military Academy, where he worked with the post-graduate team. In 1997, he began a three-year run as an assistant at Old Dominion. Johnson is a member of the Black Coaches Association (BCA) and the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC). In March 2001, Rivals. com named Johnson one of the Top 20 Assistant Coaches at Mid-Major Division I Schools. He was a squad leader in the Army National Guard from 1989-91.

Erick Green scored 21 points to pace three players in double figures, as the Hokies made a winner of head coach James Johnson in his debut, downing East Tennessee State 80-62 at Cassell Coliseum in the season opener for both teams.

The Hokies' first-half shooting was just too much for ETSU to overcome, as Tech shot 56.5 percent from the floor (13 of 23) in running out to a 15-point lead at the break. The Buccaneers were within eight points with about six minutes left in the first half, but **Robert Brown** hit two 3-pointers sandwiched around a **Jarell Eddie** 3-pointer to give the Hokies a 15-point bulge, and the Buccaneers never recovered.

Green scored 14 of his 21 points in the first half and Brown added 13 for the Hokies, hitting three 3-pointers. Brown, coming off foot surgery this summer, finished with 16, while Eddie had 17 points and 10 rebounds for his second career double-double.

Nearly everything went right for Johnson in his debut. He planned to have his team play a more up-tempo style, and the Hokies scored 80 points – something they did just three times a year ago. They shot a respectable 46.6 percent from the floor and made 10 of 25 from beyond the 3-point arc. They also dished out 19 assists (six by Green) compared to 10 turnovers.

Cadarian Raines scored nine points and grabbed four rebounds for the Hokies, while **Marshall Wood**, a freshman, grabbed six rebounds and scored five points.

Freshman Lester Wilson came off the bench to lead the Buccaneers with 20 points. ETSU, which trailed by as many as 25 in the second half, shot just 38.7 percent from the floor (24 of 62)

Erick Green tied his career high with 25 points to lift the Hokies past Rhode Island 69-50 at Cassell Coliseum.

With the win, the Hokies moved to 2-0 overall on the season. Rhode Island fell to 0-2.

Green scored 17 of his 25 in the first half, as Tech jumped out to a 13-0 lead and never trailed. The Rams missed their first seven shots from the floor and didn't score in the first 5:08 of the game.

Rhode Island cut the lead to 28-24 on a basket by Xavier Munford with 1:59 left in the first half. But the Hokies scored the last eight points of the half – six of those coming on two Green 3-pointers – to take a 36-24 lead at halftime.

Rhode Island got no closer than 11 the rest of the game. The Rams had a chance to cut the lead to nine with 10:02 remaining, but Nikola Malesevic missed a layup, and Green responded for the Hokies by making two free throws with 9:46 left to push the lead back to 13.

Tech led by as many as 21 in the second half.

Malesevic's missed layup was part of a terrible shooting night for the Rams, who made just 33.9 percent from the floor (20 of 59). Even worse, they made just 1 of 21 from beyond the 3-point arc.

Green, in particular, was great on offense. He hit 8 of 15 from the floor, including four 3-pointers. He made 5 of 8 from the free-throw line, and he also dished out four assists.

Robert Brown scored 12 for the Hokies, and **Cadarian Raines** recorded his first career double-double, with 10 points and 12 rebounds.

As a team, the Hokies shot 45.6 percent from the floor and out-rebounded the Rams 42-37 after getting out-rebounded by East Tennessee State in the season opener.

Virginia Tech point guard **Erick Green** scored 23 points, including the 1,000th of his career, as the Hokies rolled past VMI 95-80.

Tech trailed in the early going, but a Green 3-pointer with 15:38 left in the first half sparked a 19-3 run in which five different players scored. A second Tech run late in the first half essentially put the game away. The Hokies led 35-21 at the media timeout with less than eight minutes left and then scored seven straight points out of the timeout to take a 42-21 bulge.

Tech led 46-30 at halftime and then opened the second half with a 12-2 run to build a 26-point lead. The Hokies, who are adapting to new coach James Johnson's fast-paced philosophies, would later lead by as many as 31. Only a 16-0 run by VMI late in the game against Tech's backups made the score respectable.

A Green jumper in that 12-2 run with 19:08 remaining in the game marked his 1,000th career point.

Green nailed 9 of 13 from the floor, including his lone 3-point attempt, and the Hokies, as a team, shot 52.9 percent. Four other players finished in double figures, with Jarell Eddie scoring 17, Cadarian Raines adding 14 and both Robert Brown and C.J. Barksdale each scoring 11.

Tech nailed 11 of 24 from beyond the 3-point arc, as Eddie and walk-on **Will Johnston** hit three 3-pointers and Brown and freshman Marshall Wood hit two each.

The Hokies' height and length bothered VMI the entire game, as Tech held the Keydets to just 35.5 percent from the floor in the first half and 40 percent for the game. The Keydets got a career-high 23 points from D.J. Covington.

VIRGINIA TECH 96, UNC GREENSBORO 87

The Virginia Tech tandem of Erick Green and Jarell Eddie each registered career highs and spearheaded a 14-1 run late in the game that helped the Hokies to a 96-87 nonconference victory over UNCG.

UNCG trailed by as many as 14 in the first half and by eight with less than 10 minutes to play. But the Spartans used a 14-2 run to take a 77-73 lead, grabbing their biggest lead on a basket by Trevis Simpson with 6:08 left in the game. Simpson scored 12 of the 14 points in the run and finished with 25 points.

But the Hokies responded. Green, who had been quiet in the second half, scored with 5:49 remaining to start a 14-1 run. He scored 10 of the 14 points in that run, and his two free throws with 1:22 left gave the Hokies an 87-78 lead.

UNCG cut the lead to four on a basket by Simpson with 54 seconds left, but the Hokies' free-throw shooting down the stretch was just too good. Tech made 18 of its final 22 free-throw attempts and shot 81 percent from the line.

Green went 12 of 12 from the free-throw line in the final 4:18. He made all 16 of his attempts for the game, which carried his performance on a night in which he made iust 4 of 15 shots.

Eddie and Green combined to score 25 of the Hokies' final 26 points. Eddie scored a game-high 28 points, hitting 7 of 9 from the floor and 9 of 10 from the free-throw line. He

nailed all five of his 3-point attempts.

UNCG stayed in the game with its 3-point shooting, as the Spartans hit 11 of 35 from beyond the arc. Derrell

Armstrong added 23 for the Spartans.

The Hokies also got 10 points from **Robert Brown**, nine points and nine rebounds from Cadarian Raines and nine points from Will Johnston. Also, Marshall Wood grabbed a career-high 11 rebounds.

The game turned out to be historic for Johnson, who became the first Tech coach to win his first four games in his inaugural season as the Hokies' coach since Bill Matthews went 4-0 to start the 1962-63 season.

VIRGINIA TECH vs. APPALACHIAN ST.

NOV. 23, 2012 • 2 P.M. • BLACKSBURG, VA.

Virginia Tech used a career-high 27 points from point

guard Erick Green to outlast Appalachian State 87-76. With the win, the Hokies moved to 5-0 on the season. The Hokies are 5-0 for the first time since the 1984-85.

The Hokies struggled somewhat against Appalachian State for the better part of 30 minutes. The Mountaineers, picked to finish fourth in the Southern Conference's North

Division, trailed just 60-58 after a 3-pointer by Nathan Healy with 10:41 remaining.

But Virginia Tech answered with a 13-2 run that put the game away. Green scored six points in the run, including a one-handed slam with 4:51 to go that capped the run and gave the Hokies a 73-60 lead. The Hokies built the lead to 79-64 on a three-point play by **Cadarian Raines** with 3:28 remaining, and the Mountaineers got no closer than 11.

Green, who became the first Tech player to score 20 points or more in the Hokies first five games to start a season since Bimbo Coles scored 20 or more in the first nine games of the 1989-90 season, made 8 of 16 from the floor and all 11 of his free-throw attempts. He has made 31 consecutive free throws. The Hokies made 30 of their 39 free-throw attempts. In contrast, the Mountaineers hit just 12 of 21 and turned the ball over 19 times.

Jarell Eddie added 23 points for the Hokies, making 7 of 9 from the floor, including 4 of 5 from beyond the 3-point arc. Eddie has made 14 of his past 18 shots from the floor. including 9 of his past 10 3-point attempts. He's shooting 57.7 percent from the floor this season, including 59.3 percent from beyond the 3-point arc.

Marshall Wood had a career-high 13 points and also grabbed a game-high eight rebounds for Virginia Tech, which shot 50 percent (26 of 52) from the floor.

APPALACHIAN STATE (1-4)

Erick Green scored 16 of his game-high 24 points in the second half to pace five players in double figures as the Hokies rolled to an eye-opening 95-79 victory.

The Hokies took control of the game with a 19-1 run that spanned the two halves. Tech Iowa's Roy Devyn Marble scored to give the Hawkeyes a 37-36 with 3:16 left in the first half, but the Hokies closed the half with a 10-1 run and took a 46-38 lead at the break.

Then, to open the second half, Tech went on a 9-0 run with Green scoring all nine points. His three-point play with 19:30 left in the game started the outburst, and he also hit two short jumpers before ending the run with two free throws at the 16:53 mark. That put the Hokies up 55-38.

The Hawkeyes answered with a 16-2 run to climb back in the game and cut the lead to 57-54 on a layup by Anthony Clemmons with 12 minutes left. But the Hokies scored 12 of the game's next 16 points, and lowa got no closer than seven, as the Hokies gradually pulled away.

The Hokies, who shot 52.5 percent from the floor and an impressive 90 percent from the free-throw line (27 of 30), score 95 points or more for the third time this season and scored 80 or more for the fourth straight time and the fifth time in six games. The last time Tech scored 80 or more in four straight games was in 1994.

Green connected on 8 of 15 from the floor and 8 of 9 from the free-throw line. He saw his streak of consecutive made free throws end at 37 straight.

Robert Brown added 18 points for Tech, just one short of his career high, while Jarell Eddie and C.J. Barksdale scored 11 each. Joey van Zegeren chipped in a career-high 10 points as part of a Tech bench that scored 22 points on the evening.

The Hawkeyes got 21 points from Aaron White and 18 from Marble

Erick Green scored 18 of his career-high 28 points in the second half and hit eight free throws in the final 1:16 to help Virginia Tech upset No. 15 Oklahoma State 81-71.

With the win, the Hokies moved to 7-0 overall on the season, which marks their best start since the 1982-83 team won its first seven games to start the season. Oklahoma State fell to 5-1 overall.

The Hokies trailed at halftime following a first half in which Green spent 11 minutes on the bench after picking up two quick fouls. But in the second half, he heated up and got the Hokies going.

Green scored Tech's first 10 points of the second half, helping the Hokies rally from a 36-32 halftime deficit. His basket with 16:52 remaining tied the game at 42.

Then Green's teammates got in the act. Midway through the second half, Tech went on a 14-4 run, grabbing a 58-50 lead on Jarell Eddie's basket with 9:16 remaining. Four different players scored in the run - but not Green.

Oklahoma State (5-1) cut the lead to 62-61 on a basket by Kamari Murphy with 4:58 left, but the Hokies outscored the Cowboys 19-10 the rest of the way, and Oklahoma State got no closer than three points the rest of the game.

Tech put the game away at the free-throw line, hitting its final 10 free throws and 13 of its final 15. The Hokies made 27 of 33 from the line, with Green connecting on 12 of 13. In contrast, the Cowbovs made just 11 of 15 from the line. Green scored more than 20 points for the seventh straight game to start the season – something no Tech player has done since Bimbo Coles opened the 1989-90 season by scoring 20 or more in the first nine games.

Robert Brown added 18 points for the Hokies. Eddie finished with his second double-double of the season. scoring 15 points and grabbing 12 rebounds. Cadarian Raines added 10 points.

Oklahoma State got 18 points from both Marcus Smart and Le'Bryan Nash. The bigger Cowboys lost the battle of the boards, as Tech out-rebounded Oklahoma State 41-31.

Virginia Tech guard Erick Green scored 23 points, but couldn't connect on a jumper at the buzzer, as the Hokies fell to West Virginia 68-67 in a nonconference game played at WVU Coliseum on Saturday afternoon.

The Hokies were in position to win the game after forward Robert Brown banked in a 3-pointer with 18 seconds remaining to give Tech a 67-66 lead. But West Virginia's Juwan Staten took advantage of some confusion on Tech's part, scoring on an open layup with five seconds remaining to give the Mountaineers a 68-67 lead. It was Staten's only basket of the game.

The Hokies called timeout with 3.4 seconds left after Staten's basket, and they got the ball into the hands of Green. The senior quard drove into the lane and lofted a jumper that bounced off the rim as time expired, enabling the Mountaineers to escape with a one-point victory.

Green scored 14 of his 23 points in the second half. He hit 8 of 19 from the floor for the game, including 2 of 5 from beyond the 3-point arc. He also dished out a career-high 10 assists.

Green and Brown teamed for 45 of the Hokies' 67 points. Brown scored a career-high 21 points, hitting 9 of 19 from the floor, including 2 of 7 from beyond the arc.

But the two of them weren't enough on a day in which Jarell Eddie played just 20 minutes because of foul trouble, the Hokies shot just 41.5 percent from the floor and Tech got out-rebounded 49-38. West Virginia finished with 23 offensive rebounds and 18 second-chance points.

West Virginia got huge games from a pair of unlikely sources. Junior center Aaric Murray scored a career-high 15 points and hit a career-high two 3-pointers. Also, sophomore Kevin Noreen, a 6-10 forward who came into the game averaging 1.3 points per game, finished with a double-double, scoring a career-high 14 points and grabbing a career-high 12 rebounds. Noreen hit two 3-pointers the first two of his career.

Erick Green scored 23 points and Marquis Rankin added a career-high 10 to lead Virginia Tech past Mississippi Valley State 70-49.

The Hokies took control with a 10-2 run to end the first half and an 8-2 run to start the second half - an 18-4 run total. A jumper by C.J. Barksdale ended the run with 15:57 remaining, giving the Hokies a 38-26 lead, and the Delta Devils got no closer than 10 points the rest of the game. Virginia Tech went on to lead by as many as 23 points.

The Hokies started hitting the boards in the second half and turned up the defensive pressure. The Hokies got out-rebounded by seven in the first half (24-17), but outrebounded Mississippi Valley State 51-45 for the game. They also held the Delta Devils to just 25.7 percent shooting from the floor (18 of 70).

But Green's 3-point attempt with 23 seconds to go was off the mark, and Tech fouled Cameron Baskerville with 19 seconds remaining. Baskerville nailed both free throws to give the Eagles a 76-71 lead, and after a Green layup cut the lead to 76-73 with 14 seconds left, Baskerville hit two more free throws with 13 seconds remaining to seal the game.

The Eagles did so in large part because of some outstanding 3-point shooting. They hit a season-high 11 3-pointers in 26 attempts, with Reed, freshman guard Cleon Roberts and junior Eric Ferguson combining for all of them. They also out-rebounded the Hokies 41-38.

But poor shooting probably hurt the Hokies more. Tech came into the game hitting 37.4 percent of its 3-point attempts. But the Hokies made just 6 of 27 from beyond the arc, with Eddie making just 3 of 13.

Eddie added 21 points for Tech, while **C.J. Barksdale** finished with 10 points and nine rebounds.

Virginia Tech fought back from a 13-point first half deficit and defeated Bradley, 66-65, in overtime in the semifinal of the 2012 Continental Tire Las Vegas Classic in the Orleans Arena on Saturday night.

Tech, now 9-2 on the season, trailed the Braves, 35-25, at the intermission, but Tech roared back and took a 55-53 lead with 2:03 remaining in regulation on a lay-up by **Erick Green**. Walt Lemon, Jr., hit a lay-up with nine seconds remaining to tie the game at 55-55 for Bradley, now 8-3 overall. Green got a good look at a final shot, but missed and the game went into overtime.

In the extra session, the Hokies fell behind 65-60 with 49 seconds remaining, but Tech forced some turnovers and got the score to 65-64 with 26 seconds remaining on a lay-up and free throw by Green. Tech then forced another BU turnover and Green made yet another lay-up with 21 seconds to play and Tech held off several Bradley threats and sealed the win on a defensive rebound by **Robert Brown**.

Green led all scorers with career-highs of 31 points and eight rebounds. **Cadarian Raines** tied his career-high of 16 points and added nine rebounds and three blocked shots. **Jarell Eddie** scored 12 points in the win. Dyricus Simms-Wards led the Braves with 15 points and Tyshon Pickett and Jordan Prosser added 10 points each.

The Hokies outshot BU, 41.1 percent to 36.5 percent and out rebounded the Braves, 43-36. Tech held Bradley to just 25.9 percent from the field in the second half.

The Hokies, who played their first game without injured forward **Marshall Wood**, were bolstered by the play of sophomore walk-on **Christian Beyer**, who played a career-high 27 minutes and also recorded career-highs of three points, nine rebounds and two steals.

The Virginia Tech Hokies fought back from an 11-point deficit with 13 minutes to play in regulation and defeated Georgia Tech, 70-65, in McCamish Pavilion on Saturday afternoon. With the win, the Hokies are now 10-6 overall and 1-2 in the ACC and the Yellow Jackets fall to 10-5 overall and are 0-3 in conference action.

The Hokies kept the game close throughout and trailed 25-22 at the intermission. Georgia Tech stretched the lead to 43-32 with 13:52 remaining in regulation. Then, the Hokies started getting stops defensively and cut the lead to 53-50 on a three-point field goal from Erick Green with 6:51 remaining in the second half. The Hokies' defense held the Yellow Jackets without a field goal for the last 3:44 of the second half. Cadarian Raines had a bucket with 1:05 remaining and Green tied the game with 24 seconds left in regulation. Georgia Tech got off one last shot, the the attempt missed and Jarell Eddie grabbed the rebound to send the game into overtime.

In the extra session, the Hokies scored the first seven points and never trailed in overtime. Eddie and Green iced the game with four free throws in the final 10 seconds of the overtime.

Green, the nation's leading scorer, led all scorers with 28 points, 20 points coming after halftime. **C.J. Barksdale** recorded his first career double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds and **Robert Brown**, who missed Wednesday's game with Boston College, came off the bench to score 10 points for the Hokies. Robert Carter Jr., led the Yellow Jackets with 12 points. Barksdale's 10 rebounds is a new career-high for the sophomore.

The Hokies out rebounded the taller Yellow Jackets, 43-32, and also outscored GT in the paint, 36-28. Virginia Tech held Georgia Tech to 36.1 percent from the field. Virginia Tech made 19 of their 24 free throw attempts, including 11 of 14 after halftime.

Robert Brown's short jumper in front of the goal with 12.3 seconds remaining lifted Virginia Tech to a 66-65 ACC victory over Wake Forest at Cassell Coliseum.

Brown, who had made one of his previously 10 attempts, had the ball with the shot clock winding down before driving to the lane. He put up a short jumper in front of the rim and was fouled by Wake Forest's Devin Thomas. He missed the free throw.

The Hokies survived a harrowing final 10 seconds. Wake Forest called a timeout with 8.8 seconds left to set up a final play, and guard C.J. Harris missed a contested jumper in the lane with 3 seconds remaining. Then Wake Forest forward Tyler Cavanaugh missed the put back. Virginia Tech's Jarell Eddie got the rebound as time expired.

The Hokies managed to win despite not getting a point from **Erick Green**, the nation's leading scorer at 24.8 points per game coming in, in the final 3:42. Eddie's 3-pointer with 1:39 left tied the game at 62, and after a Wake Forest turnover, Virginia Tech's **Marquis Rankin** hit a layup with 45 seconds left to give the Hokies a 64-62 lead. The basket was Rankin's only one of the game.

Wake Forest answered on a 3-pointer by Travis McKie with 30 seconds remaining. Virginia Tech then called a timeout with 24 seconds left, one that eventually led to Brown's basket.

Green led the Hokies with 22 points – 18 in the second half. It marked the 16th time this season he has scored at least 20 points in a game. Eddie added 18 for the Hokies, who shot 45 percent from the floor (27 of 60).

But the Hokies also got important contributions from Brown, who finished with four points, Rankin, and Cadarian Raines, who scored eight points, grabbed 13 rebounds, dished out three assists and blocked four shots.

McKie paced the Demon Deacons with 20 points and 15 rebounds, while Thomas added 12 points and eight rebounds. Harris finished with 10 points for Wake Forest, which shot 36.8 percent (25 of 68).

Erick Green scored a career-high 35 points, but it wasn't enough as Virginia got past Virginia Tech 74-58 in an ACC game played at Cassell Coliseum on Thursday night.

The Hokies led 17-10 in the first half after a basket by Green with 9:20 remaining, but the Cavaliers busted the game open, going on a 24-2 run to take a 34-19 lead. They never trailed again.

Virginia's Joe Harris scored 12 of his 17 points in the first half, including nine – on three 3-pointers – during that run, and Evan Nolte added eight of his career-high 18 points in that run, hitting two 3-pointers and a layup. Virginia hit 9 of 10 shots during that run, including the combined five 3-pointers by Harris and Nolte.

Tech trailed by double digits the entire second half. The Hokies cut the lead to 10 on three occasions, the last coming on two Green free throws that made the score 52-42 with 8:40 remaining. Nolte answered with a 3-pointer with 7:54 left, and Tech got no closer than 11after that.

Nolte, a freshman, came into the game averaging 6.4 points per game, but he hit five 3-pointers for the Cavaliers. He hit 6 of 12 from the floor, and he and Harris combined to hit nine of Virginia's season-high 11 3-pointers, as the Cavaliers shot 51 percent from the floor (26 of 51) and 47.8 percent from beyond the 3-point arc (11 of 23).

Green, the nation's leading scorer at 24.6 points per game coming in, certainly did his part with the career-high 35 points – the most by a player against the Cavaliers since 2006 and the most by an ACC player this season. He hit 11 of 18 from the floor, including 3 of 6 from beyond the 3-ponit arc, and 10 of 13 from the free-throw line. He also grabbed a career-high nine rebounds.

But no other Virginia Tech player scored in double figures. **Jarell Eddie** finished with nine points and nine rebounds.

Virginia Tech's **Erick Green** and **Jarell Eddie** combined for 44 points, but it wasn't enough, as the Hokies fell 77-70 to Clemson in an ACC game played at Littlejohn Coliseum.

Tech led 59-58 with 4:35 left in the game following a **Robert Brown** layup, but Clemson's Milton Jennings took the game over down the stretch. The senior scored 20 of his game-high 28 points in the second half, but 12 of those points came in the final 3:44. Jennings, who hit 16 of 18 from the free-throw line, hit 10 of 12 from the stripe in that stretch

The big blow for the Hokies came when they trailed 61-60 with less three minutes remaining. As the shot clock was winding down, Clemson's Damarcus Harrison nailed a 3-pointer from the corner to give the Tigers a 64-60 edge with 2:48 to go. Tech **C.J. Barksdale** scored on a stick-back with 2:29 remaining to cut the lead to two, but Jennings answered with a basket at the 2:02 mark, and the Hokies got no closer than four the rest of the way.

Harrison's 3-pointer was the last of Clemson's 10 3-pointers for the game. The Tigers, who came into the game shooting just 32 percent from behind the arc, nailed 10 of 21 (47.6 percent), with most of those coming against the Hokies' 2-3 zone.

K.J. McDaniels, who was shooting 30.8 percent from beyond the 3-point arc, hit a career-high five 3-pointers on his way to 17 points, while Harrison hit three 3's en route to 19 points.

Green, the nation's leading scorer coming in at 25.2 points per game, led the Hokies with 25 points. But the senior didn't hit a field goal in the second half until scoring on a layup with 37 seconds left. He tried to get the Hokies back in it in the final minute, scoring Tech's final eight points in the last 1:17 of the game.

Eddie added 19 points for the Hokies, who shot just 35 percent from the floor. Tech fell into a 12-0 hole to start the game, missing its first 10 shots, but the Hokies rallied to tie things at halftime.
