The Series vs. WVU

This will be the 77th meeting in this series ... WVU leads the all-time series, 47-29 ... The Mountaineers won the last meeting, 68-67, in Morgantown last season ... Tech has won three of the last five in the series, including a 53-49 victory in the last meeting in Cassell Coliseum, on Feb. 28, 2004, the last meeting between the two schools as members of the Big East Conference ... Tech leads the series, 16-12, in home games and 15-9 in games played in Cassell Coliseum ... The Hokies are 38-52 all-time against schools currently in the Big 12 ... Tech was 1-1 against Big 12 schools last season, 1-0 in home games.

Last Time Out: USC Upstate 64, VT 63

The Hokies dropped the season-opener on Saturday afternoon to USC Upstate, 64-63 ... The game was close throughout and neither team led by more than six points ... Tech could muster just one made free throw in the final four minutes of action ... **Jarell Eddie** led all scorers with 18 points and seven rebounds and **Cadarian Raines** recorded a new career-high, with 17 points, all coming in the second half ... Tech held the Spartans to just 37.5 percent from the floor, but the Hokies were just 9-of-18 from the free throw line.

Second Half Raines

Cadarian Raines started the season with a new career-high, as he scored 17 points against USC Upstate ... The senior surpassed his old high mark of 16 points set last year against Bradley and Duke ... He was 7-10 from the field ... Most amazingly, all 17 points came in the second half.

Eddie Starts Fast

Jarell Eddie opened his senior season by leading all players with 18 points in the loss to USC Upstate ... He also grabbed a team-high-tying seven rebounds in a team-high 35 minutes of action.

Increasing Threes

Last season, the Hokies averaged 5.7 made three-point field goals per game ... In the USC Upstate games, Tech made eight three-pointers ... Five different Hokies combined to make those eight three-pointers ... The Hokies also shot four more threes than last season's average.

That's A Lot in A Little

Today's game is the midway point in a stretch that will see the Hokies open the season with three games in the first six days of the regular season ... Going past that, Tech will play its first four games in nine days.

Coaches Vs. Cancer

The Hokies will play two home games in conjunction with the Coaches Vs. Cancer Classic ... The season-opener against UCS Upstate and the Hokies' home game on Nov. 15 against Western Carolina are the Blacksburg games, before Tech travels to Brooklyn on Nov. 22 and 23 to play in the championship rounds of the tournament.

JVZ Claims His Territory

Perhaps no Hokie has shown more improvement over the off-season than redshirt sophomore post player **Joey van Zegeren** ... In the USC Upstate game, JVZ recorded a career-high five blocked shots and grabbed a team-high-tying seven rebounds in 22 minutes of action ... van Zegeren's improved play also has allowed him to play along side of **Cadarian Raines**, not just as a replacement to the fifth-year senior.

Barksdale Suspended

Virginia Tech has announced that junior forward **C.J. Barksdale** has been suspended for the first three games of the 2013-14 season, due to a violation of team rules ... He will be eligible to return for the home game against VMI on Monday, Nov. 18.

The Wait is Over

Adam Smith may have been the most anxious of all the Hokies approaching the USC Upstate game ... Smith began his playing career at UNC Wilmington in the 2011-12 season and transferred to Virginia Tech last summer ... Due to NCAA regulations, Smith had to sit out last season ... He was able to practice with the team and was a valuable member of the scout team, since he possessed a quick release on his jumper that could mimic many of the best shooters in the league ... Smith continued to work hard on his game and earned the start in the back court for the Hokies in the season opener.

Wilson Gets the Start

The Hokies started **Devin Wilson** at point guard on Saturday against USC Upstate and the freshman made a solid debut in his first collegiate action ... Wilson play 34 minutes, second highest on the team and scored four points, had four rebounds and three assists, while committing just three turnovers ... It marked the first time the Hokies had started a freshman at the point in a season-opener since Nov. 9, 2007, when Hank Thorns got the start against Elon in the first game of the 2007-08 season (That's correct, Malcolm Delaney came off the bench in that, his first collegiate game).

Tip-Off Marathon

Today's game is part of the Sixth Annual College Hoops Tip-Off Marathon on ESPN ... This marks the second time the Hokies have been part of the event, with the No. 22 Hokies losing at No. 3 Kansas State, 73-57, in a game that tipped off at 3 p.m., CST ... This season, a total of 18 games will be broadcast live over ESPN, ESPN2 and ESPNU.

Mueller to Sit Out This Season

The NCAA has ruled freshman guard **Malik Mueller** ineligible for the 2013-14 season due to initial eligibility rules ... Mueller will be able to practice with the team this season and will be eligible to play four years beginning next season.

Although he is only a freshman, **Ben Emelogu** has been named a team captain this season for the Hokies ... The guard from Grand Prairie, Texas came to Tech during the summer and established himself with his teammates immediately, earning the honor ... Emelogu made his collegiate debut in the loss to USC Upstate, coming off the bench to score six points and had out two assists.

Staying Close to Home Early

The Hokies will play their first four games, and and seven of their first nine games, in the friendly confines of Cassell Coliseum ... Tech will play in the Coaches Vs. Cancer Classic in the Barclays Center in Brooklyn on Nov. 22 and 23 for its first road games of the season ... Tech will not play a true road game until Dec. 8, when it opens ACC play at defending champion Miami ... The Hokies will not play a true non-conference "road" game this season.

Comfortable at the Line

Jarell Eddie is shooting 82.5 percent from the line in his career and is fourth in career free throw percentage on the all-time list at Virginia Tech ... Eddie's 86.8 percent from the line as a sophomore was the fifth-best season in Tech history.

Lots of New Faces

The Hokies welcome a wealth of new players to this year's team ... Freshmen **Devin Wilson, Ben Emelogu, Malik Mueller, Trevor Thompson** and **Maurice Kirby** have begun their Tech careers, as has redshirt sophomore **Adam Smith**, who sat out last season after transferring from UNC Wilmington ... On the bench, Tech welcomes new Director of Men's Basketball Operations **Rob Harris** and video coordinator **Kenny Brown**.

Eddie, Beyer on Academic Team

Virginia Tech players **Jarell Eddie** and **Christian Beyer** were named to the 2012-13 All-Atlantic Coast Conference Academic Men's Basketball Team ... This was Eddie's second year on the 14-member team and Beyer made his first appearance on the squad.

Five Doubles is Rare

When **Marshall Wood** recorded his first career double-double in the overtime loss at NC State last season, he became the fifth Hokie to record a double-double during that season (and the fourth to record his first career double-double last season) ... This is the first season since at least the 1989-90 season that five Hokies have recorded double-doubles in the same season.

A Different Game

Freshman forward **Trevor Thompson** is the son of a professional athlete ... However, his father, Ryan, never played pro basketball ... Ryan Thompson played nine seasons in Major League Baseball and was a member of the 2000 World Series champion New York Yankees.

What Returns

Despite graduating the nation's leading scorer, Erick Green, the Hokies return 52.3 percent of their scoring from a season ago ... Tech also returns 81.3 percent of its rebounding.

There's a First Time for Everything

Will Johnston made his first collegiate start at Virginia last year ... It marked the first time a walk-on had started for the Hokies since **Joey Racer** started in the home finale against NC State two seasons ago ... It was the first time that the Hokies have started a walk-on in a non-Senior Day situation since at least the 1999-2000 season ... Johnston also got the start at NC State and again in the win over Florida State and at Miami.

They Were the Champions, My Friend

On the weekend on Oct. 26, 2013, Virginia Tech welcomed the 1973 NIT Champion basketball team back to campus for their 40th reunion ... That team, coached by Don DeVoe, defeated New Mexico, Fairfield, Alabama and Notre Dame in Madison Square Garden to capture the school's first-ever NIT title ... Tech downed the Irish, 92-91 in overtime in the championship game ... Bobby Stevens hits a jumper at the buzzer to claim the win.

Barksdale Closed Strong

Entering the home game with Duke last season, **C.J. Barksdale** had five career games in which he had posted double figures in scoring ... Starting with the first Duke game, Barksdale had four consecutive games in double figures ... He had never had back-to-back double figures games before the Duke and Florida State games ... Barksdale scored 103 points in the 18 ACC games last season ... Sixty-five of those points came in the last six ACC regular season games, three of which were played against top 10 teams ... Over the last six ACC games, Barksdale made 17 of his 19 free throw attempts, good for a 89.5 percent from the line over that stretch ... He raised his free throw percentage to 76.6 percent for last season.

Big Green Things

Erick Green was the 2013 ACC Player of the Year, in a vote of the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association ... Green received 38 of the 76 votes cast ... Green became the first Virginia Tech player ever to win the award and the first Hokie since Bimbo Coles in 1988 in the Metro Conference to win a conference Player of the Year Award ... Green joins Coles and Dell Curry (Metro, 1986) to earn a conference player of the Year Award ... He was second ACC Player of the Year from a bottom half of the league team (the late Len Bias from Maryland in 1986) ... He was named First Team All-ACC by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association ... Green joined Mason Plumlee of Duke, Shane Larkin of Miami, Joe Harris of Virginia and Richard Howell of NC State on the first team ... He is the third Hokie to earn first team honors in the ACC, joining Zabian Dowdell in 2007 and Malcolm Delaney in 2010 and 2011 ... Green was the first Hokie ever to lead the nation in scoring ... He became just the second ACC player to earn that honor, following South Carolina's Grady Wallace, who led the nation in scoring (31.2 ppg) in the 1956-57 season ... Green is just the second Hokie to lead the ACC in scoring ... Malcolm Delaney averaged 20.2 ppg in the 2010 season.

Hokies vs. Ranked Teams

With the loss at No. 3/4 Duke last season, the Hokies are 13-43 against nationally ranked teams since joining the ACC for the 2004-05 season ... Tech is 30-151 all-time against teams ranked in the AP poll ... Tech was 1-4 against ranked teams last season ... These numbers are only for teams ranked in the AP poll.

Hokies in Overtime

With the loss at NC State last season, the Hokies are now 59-45 all-time in overtime games ... Tech was 2-2 in overtime games last season ... Tech is 26-23 in road overtime games, 26-9 in home overtime games and 7-13 on neutral courts ... Tech is 12-5 in ACC overtime games ... Tech is 3-6 all-time in overtime games against ranked teams ... Tech is 5-8 in double-overtime games and 1-2 in triple overtime games.

The Multi-Lingual Big Man

Communicating with forward **Joey van Zegeren** is easy for most students at Virginia Tech ... The redshirt sophomore from The Netherlands is fluent in five languages and has understanding of several others ... If you see him around campus, make sure to say "Hello", or "Hola", or "Hallo", or "Bonjour", or, well, you get the idea.

Finally a Two

Will Johnston earned significant playing time last season and a lot was because of his three-point shooting ... After going two-for-two from three-point range in the loss to USC Upstate, he has now made 21 field goals and all but one of them have been three-pointers ... He hit a career-high three, three-pointers in the win over VMI last year, for a career-high nine points ... He equalled the number of threes in the next game, as he hit three, three-pointers in the first half of the win at UNCG ... In the loss to Boston College, Johnston attempted his first two-pointer of the season and later in the game, made his first two-point field goal of the season ... Johnston played a career-high 22 minutes in the home loss to Maryland ... Johnston hit a pair of three-pointers in the loss to Georgia Tech ... Johnston earned his first career start at Virginia ... During the off-season, Johnston was awarded a scholarship for his efforts both on and off the court.

Hokies' All-Time Record

Virginia Tech is now 1357-1128 all-time in collegiate basketball, good for a .546 winning percentage ... This is the Hokies' 105th season of men's basketball.

All Together Now

When **Marquis Rankin** scored a career-high 10 points in the win over Mississippi Valley State last season, it marked the eighth different player to record a double-figure scoring game ... All eight scholarship players scored at least 10 points in a game last season.

Grabbing Boards

When **Marshall Wood** grabbed a career-high and team season-high 16 rebounds in the overtime loss at NC State last season, it marked the first time a Hokie had grabbed at least 16 rebounds in a game since Dorian Finney-Smith grabbed 16 rebounds on Nov. 12, 2012 at home against East Tennessee State ... The last time a Hokie grabbed more than 16 rebounds in a game was on Feb. 5, 2011, when Jeff Allen grabbed 19 rebounds at Boston College ... The 16 rebounds was also the most by an ACC freshman last season.

Win 10

With Virginia Tech's win over Clemson last season, it marked the 10th straight season that the Hokies had won at least 10 home games ... Tech's longest streak of 10-or-more home victories is 11 consecutive seasons, from 1975-76 through the 1985-86 season ... Tech was 10-7 in Cassell Coliseum last year.

SWAT

In the home loss to Maryland last season, **Cadarian Raines** tied his career high with five blocked shots, which also established a new ACC high for Raines ... It is the most blocked shots in a game for the Hokies since Raines blocked five shots in the Hokies' win over UMBC on Dec. 12, 2009 ... The last time a Hokie blocked more than five shots in a game was six by Cheick Diakite in a loss at Georgia on Dec. 9, 2008 ... He blocked three shots in the win over Clemson.

The State We're In

With the loss at Virginia on Feb. 12, 2013, Virginia Tech is 421-307 (.578) all-time against schools from Virginia ... Tech was 1-2 last season against state schools ... The Hokies have played 14 schools from the state ... With the win over Norfolk State on Dec. 11, 2011, the only state Division I school that Tech has not played is Hampton ... Tech holds winning records against 10 of the schools and even records against two others ... Tech will play VMI, Radford, VCU and UVa from the Commonwealth this season.

Beyer Stepped In Well

Christian Beyer had the best game of his short Virginia Tech (to date) career, as he scored three points and grabbed nine rebounds in 27 minutes of action in the overtime win over Bradley last season ... Beyer was forced into increased playing time when **Marshall Wood** suffered a fractured foot on Dec. 15 ... He also led Tech with two steals ... Beyer had played a combined 15 minutes in the first 10 games of the season ... Add in the 25 minutes he played in the loss to Colorado State and Beyer averaged 26.0 minutes and 6.5 rebounds per game in Las Vegas ... In the loss at BYU, Beyer scored a career-high nine points and grabbed a career-high 11 rebounds ... He had six points and seven rebounds in the loss at Maryland and six points and eight rebounds in the loss to Boston College.

300 and Counting

The Hokies have hit at least one three-pointer in every game since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... Tech has now hit a three in 336 consecutive games, the most in school history ... Since the three-point arc was added to college basketball for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one three in all but three games ... The last time that the Hokies did not record a three-point field goal in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003.

The Hokies have a 528-165 overall record in Cassell, good for a .762 winning percentage ... Tech is 0-1 in Cassell Coliseum this season and was 10-7 in Cassell last season ... Tech was 11-7 in the 2011-12 season and was 12-4 in Cassell the season before, the 50th year for the arena ... The win over Florida State on Jan. 8, 2011, was the 500th victory in the building ... The win over FSU in 2008 marked the Hokies' 600th game played in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech defeated Rhode Island, 86-63, on Nov. 20, 2002, in its 500th game in the arena ... Tech has had just one break-even home season and one losing season in Cassell Coliseum ... The 17 victories for the Hokies at home in the 2009-10 season set a new Cassell Coliseum and school record.

November Wins

The Hokies were 6-0 in games played in the month of November last year, marking the most wins by a Tech team in November ... The previous high was five wins in both the 2011-12 season and the 2005-06 season ... A disclaimer should be added, noting that the allowable start of the basketball season was moved up beginning with the 2004-05 season ... Prior to that, schedules could not begin before Thanksgiving weekend ... The Hokies have eight games scheduled in November this season.



Welcoming Back Old Foes

The Hokies welcomed back two traditional rivals to the schedule last season and will add another this season ... Tech defeated VMI, 95-80, on Nov. 15 in a rivalry that dates back to 1909 and lost to West Virginia in Morgantown, 68-67, on Dec. 8 ... Tech and WVU first met in basketball in 1921 and have played 75 times since then ... The teams last met in the 2003-04 season, the Hokies' last season as a member of the BIG EAST Conference ... This season, the Hokies have added Radford back to the schedule ... Although the two schools have only met six times since first playing in 1987, the Highlanders are, geographically, the closest Division I school to Virginia Tech, sharing the New River Valley.

Scoring Combos

The Virginia Tech combo of Erick Green and Jarell Eddie averaged 37.3 points per game last season ... They were the highest-scoring set of teammates in the ACC in the 2012-13 season.

Beecher Joins the Hall

Former Virginia Tech men's basketball player Bobby Beecher will be inducted into the Virginia Tech Sports Hall of Fame on Nov. 15 ... As a senior, Beecher averaged 14.3 points and 7.9 rebounds to finish his Tech career eighth in scoring (1,548 pts.) and sixth in rebounds (797) ... He played in 128 of 129 games as a Hokie, starting 126. Currently, he still ranks third all-time at Tech in blocked shots (170) and stands in the top 10 in career rebounds, field goals made (640) and free-throw percentage (.807). He is 16th all-time in scoring ... Beecher, who was selected in the fourth round of the 1986 NBA Draft by the Sacramento Kings, earned his Tech degree in human services with an emphasis in family and child development ... Beecher is joined in the 2013 Class by MLB pitcher Joe Saunders, softball's Clarisa Crowell, PGA Tour member Johnson Wagner, VT tennis great Jimmy Milley and former NFL player John Engelberger.

Head Coach James Johnson



James Johnson is in his second season as Virginia Tech's head men's basketball coach. Johnson's up-tempo style of offense energized the Hokie fan base in his first season and, with a fresh infusion of talent for the 2013-14 season, Tech will see a more pressure-oriented defense.

During Johnson's first season, senior guard Erick Green became the first Hokie ever to be named the Atlantic Coast Conference Player of the Year and to lead the nation in scoring. Johnson and the Hokies defeated No. 15 Oklahoma State in December in Cassell Coliseum, earning the new coach a victory in his first-ever game against a nationally-ranked team. Just as important, two Hokies, Jarell Eddie and Christian Beyer were named to the All-ACC Academic team. Johnson has renewed a pledge to better involve the program into the daily life of the Virginia Tech campus and the New River Valley community. In the past year, the program became a part of the Christmas Store, Special Olympics and other activities and charities in the area.

No stranger to the Hokie Nation, Johnson spent the previous five seasons on the men's basketball staff at Virginia Tech. He was an assistant coach from 2007-2011 before being promoted to associate head coach prior to last season. He had accepted an assistant coaches' position at Clemson on April 13 of this year, but returns to Blacksburg to take

over the reins of the men's basketball program. Director of Athletics Jim Weaver named Johnson to the position on May 1, 2012.

"I am pleased with Coach Johnson's first year as head coach," Weaver said. "He has surrounded himself with an excellent staff who cares about the players and their development in both the classroom and the basketball court."

Johnson joined the Hokies following two seasons as an assistant at George Mason. While at Mason, he focused on organizing the team's defensive efforts in practice and games. The Patriots were a combined 45-23 in his two seasons and advanced to the 2006 NCAA Final Four. Before GMU, Johnson spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Penn State. He was the recruitment coordinator for the Nittany Lions. Prior to Penn State, Johnson had a one-year stint as an assistant at the College of Charleston and he spent two years as an assistant at Elon.

"Virginia Tech and the Hokie Nation have a special place in my heart and I am blessed and excited for the opportunity to become the head basketball coach," Johnson said at the time of his hiring. "I look forward to working with a great group of young men and moving forward with this program."

Johnson, a native of Powhatan, Va.,

was a four-year player and three-year starter at Ferrum College. A three-time Defensive Player of the Year, he helped guide his team to two conference championships and a berth in the NCAA Division III Tournament. He was also voted his team's Most Valuable Player in 1993. In 2001, Johnson was selected as one of the Top 10 players in Ferrum basketball history. In September of 2009, Johnson was elected into the Ferrum College Athletic Hall of Fame.

After graduating from Ferrum with a bachelor of science in psychology in 1993, he immediately stepped into the coaching ranks at his alma mater and served as an assistant for two seasons. Johnson helped guide the Panthers to a regular-season conference title. In 1995, Johnson moved on to Longwood College as an assistant and then spent one year at Hargrave Military Academy, where he worked with the post-graduate team. In 1997, he began a three-year run as an assistant at Old Dominion. Johnson is a member of the Black Coaches Association (BCA) and the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC). In March 2001, Rivals.com named Johnson one of the Top 20 Assistant Coaches at Mid-Major Division I Schools. He was a squad leader in the Army National Guard from 1989-91.
