## The Series vs. Radford

This is the renewal of a series with the Hokies' closest Division I opponent ... Tech holds a 5-1 advantage in the all-times series ... The Hokies have won the last three meetings in the series, most recently an 80-50 victory in Cassell Coliseum in 2005 ... All previous meetings have been played in Cassell ... Tech was 131-48 all-time and 1-0 this season against teams currently in the Big South Conference.

## More on the Series With Radford

Geographically, Radford University is the closest Division I institution to the Virginia Tech campus, approximately eight miles ... The schools first met on the basketball court in 1987, a 70-56 win by the Hokies in Cassell Coliseum ... Although the Hokies and Highlanders have only played in Cassell Coliseum, the Hokies are 1-0 on RU's home court ... Tech defeated La Salle, 71-55, in the Dedmon Center on Jan. 13, 1996 ... The game was played in Radford due to maintenance on the roof of Cassell Coliseum.

## Last Time Out: VT 75, Furman 54

It was a total team effort, as the Hokies defeated Furman, 75-54, in Cassell Coliseum on Tuesday night ... Five Hokies scored in double figures, led by **Jarell Eddie**, who recorded his second straight double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds ... **Marshall Wood** and **Will Johnston** came off the bench to score 13 and 12 points, respectively ... **Devin Wilson** tied a Virginia Tech freshman record with 11 assists ... Tech held the Paladins to just 35.7 percent from the floor, including 23.5 percent from three-point percentage.

## Dishing It Out

**Devin Wilson** is in the midst of a remarkable assist streak ... In the loss to Seton Hall, he handed out a career-high eight assists ... In the win over Furman, Wilson recorded 11 assists ... The last Hokie freshman to record 11 assists in a single game was Dell Curry, who had 11 assists as a freshman against Maryland-Eastern Shore on Dec. 4, 1982 ... The 11 assists is also one assist shy of the Tech overall school record of 12, set by Dave Sensibaugh, Bimbo Coles and, most recently, Troy Manns in 1997.

## Dishing It Out, Part Deux

On the strength of **Devin Wilson's** 11 assists, the Hokies recorded a season-high 19 assists in the win over Furman ... It is the most assists for the Hokies since the opening game of last season, an 80-62 win over East Tennessee State in Cassell Coliseum.

## Eddie's Strong Showing Rewarded

**Jarell Eddie** was named to the All-Tournament team of the Coaches Vs. Cancer Classic ... In the two games in Brooklyn, Eddie combined for 42 points, 12 rebounds and four assists and registered his first double-double of the season ... He made a career-high six three-pointers in the loss to No. 1 Michigan State.

## Smith Likes the Big Time

**Adam Smith** scored 27 points in the loss to No. 1 Michigan State ... Smith, who transferred from UNC Wilmington last season, played against two "equity" conference teams at UNCW in the 2011-12 season, scoring 32 points against Maryland and 23 points against Wake Forest ... So far this season, Smith has scored 19 points against West Virginia, 27 points vs. Michigan State and 11 points in the loss to Seton Hall.

## Eddie Starts Fast

**Jarell Eddie** opened his senior season by leading all players with 18 points in the loss to USC Upstate ... He also grabbed a team-high-tying seven rebounds in a team-high 35 minutes of action ... In the win over West Virginia, Eddie scored 10 points and then led all scorers with 17 points in the win over Western Carolina ... Eddie set a new season-high, when he scored 21 points in the Hokies' win over VMI and topped that with 23 points in the loss to No. 1 Michigan State and made a career-high six three-pointers in the game ... In the loss to Seton Hall, Eddie recorded his first double-double of the season with 19 points and 11 rebounds, to go along with four blocked shots and four assists ... He made it two straight double-doubles with 14 points and 10 rebounds in the win over Furman ... He is the only Hokie to score in double figures in all seven games this season.

## Hitting Threes

The Hokies made a season-high 13 three-pointers in the loss to No. 1 Michigan State ... It is the most three-point field goals made by the Hokies since they made 14 threes in a win at UNC Greensboro on Nov. 19, 2012 ... With the 12 made three-pointers in the win over Furman, Tech has now made 10-or-more three-pointers in four consecutive games, the first time that has happened at least since the 1999-2000 season.

## Two With Twenty

In the loss to No. 1 Michigan State, **Adam Smith** scored 27 points and **Jarell Eddie** scored 23 points ... It marked the first time that two Hokies each had 20-or-more points in the same game since Jan. 9, 2013, when Erick Green scored 24 points and Eddie had 21 points in a loss to Boston College.

## Low Points for the Opposition

In the win over Furman, the Hokies allowed the Paladins just 54 points, including 17 points in the first half ... Both figures are season-lows for Tech opposition ... The 54 points is the lowest total allowed by Tech since Dec. 10, 2012, when Tech defeated Mississippi Valley State, 70-49, in Cassell Coliseum ... The 17 points allowed in the first half is the lowest point total in a half by a Tech opponent since the Hokies allowed Eastern Michigan just nine first half points on Dec. 22, 2011.

## Hot Night at the Line

In the loss to No. 1 Michigan State, the Hokies were 14-15 from the free throw line ... The 93.3 percent is Tech's highest free throw percentage in a game in which they have shot at least 10 free throws since Feb. 21, 2010, when the Hokies made 15-16 from the line in a loss at No. 6 Duke ... An interesting side note, the Hokies have made 25 of their last 26 free throw attempts against Big Ten Conference opponents (96.2 percent).

## That's A Lot of Points

The 105 points scored in the win over VMI on Nov. 18 is the most points scored in a game by the Hokies since March 18, 2009, a 116-108 double overtime victory over Duquesne in the first round of the 2009 NIT in Cassell Coliseum ... It is the most points scored in a regulation game (40 minutes) and in a regular season game by the Hokies since Dec. 7, 1994, a 110-75 win over VMI in Cassell Coliseum ... It is the first time the Hokies have scored more than 100 points in a game since Feb. 13, 2011, a 102-77 win over Georgia Tech in Cassell Coliseum.

## Lotsa Swats

Virginia Tech recorded 13 blocked shots in the win over West Virginia ... The last time Tech had reached double figures in blocked shots in a game was Feb. 10, 2010, when the Hokies blocked 12 shots in a win at NC State ... The last time Tech blocked more than 13 shots in a game was on Dec. 9, 2009, when the Hokies tied a school record of 15 blocks in a win over VMI in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech also blocked 15 shots in a win over Coastal Carolina on Dec. 4, 1993 ... Tech had nine blocked shots in the win over VMI.

### Wood Could

Marshall Wood had struggled offensively early in the season, but snapped out in a big way in the win over Furman ... Wood came off the bench and scored 13 points for the Hokies, making three-of-five three-point attempts ... Wood had made just three, three-pointers in the first six games of the season combined.

### Rebounding Differential

In the win over VMI, the Hokies outrebounded the Keydets, 52-31 ... The 21-rebound differential is the largest for the Hokies since outrebounding Oklahoma State, 47-24, on Dec. 31, 2011 in a 67-61 Tech win in Stillwater.

### Big Joey Comes Up Big

Joey van Zegeren continued his strong early-season improvement in the win over Furman ... The redshirt sophomore from The Netherlands tied a career-high with 10 points and added five rebounds in 22 minutes of action.

### Finally a Two

Will Johnston earned significant playing time last season and a lot was because of his three-point shooting ... After hitting a career-high four three-pointers in the win over Furman, he has now made 26 field goals and all but one of them have been three-pointers ... Johnston earned his first career start at Virginia last season ... During the off-season, Johnston was awarded a scholarship for his efforts both on and off the court.

### There's a First Time for Everything

Will Johnston made his first collegiate start at Virginia last year ... It marked the first time a walk-on had started for the Hokies since **Joey Racer** started in the home finale against NC State two seasons ago ... It was the first time that the Hokies have started a walk-on in a non-Senior Day situation since at least the 1999-2000 season ... Johnston also got the start at NC State and again in the win over Florida State and at Miami.

### Reaching a Level

In the win over Western Carolina, **Jarell Eddie** recorded his 800th career point ... He currently has 893 career points.

### Call It a Comeback

Virginia Tech trailed West Virginia, 29-12, with 8:21 remaining in the first half ... From that point forward, the Hokies outscored their rivals from Morgantown, 75-52, to claim an 87-82 victory ... The 17 points is the largest deficit overcome by the Hokies since Feb. 8, 2009, when Tech came back from an 18 point deficit in an overtime win at NC State.

### Big Lead in the Locker Room

Virginia Tech took a 38-18 lead into the locker room at halftime in the win over Western Carolina ... The 20-point lead was the Hokies' largest halftime lead since a 44-24 lead against Wake Forest in Cassell Coliseum on Jan. 15, 2011 ... The last time the Hokies led by more than 20 points at the half was a 50-11 lead over Mount St. Mary's in Cassell Coliseum on Jan. 2, 2011.

### What Returns

Despite graduating the nation's leading scorer, Erick Green, the Hokies returned 52.3 percent of their scoring from a season ago ... Tech also returned 81.3 percent of its rebounding.

### Waiting His Turn

**Trevor Thompson** did not play in the loss to USC Upstate, but head coach **James Johnson** told him immediately following that game to be prepared against West Virginia ... And Thompson took those words to heart, as he scored seven points, grabbed five rebounds and recorded three blocked shots in just 17 minutes of action against the Mountaineers.

### More on Trevor

In the win over VMI, **Trevor Thompson** recorded five blocked shots ... That is the most blocked shots by a Virginia Tech freshman since **Cadarian Raines** blocked five shots in a win over UMBC on Dec. 22, 2009 ... In the win over Western Carolina, he recorded his first career double-double ... He scored 15 points and grabbed 11 rebounds in just 21 minutes of action ... Its the first double-double by a Hokie freshman since **Marshall Wood** had 14 points and 16 rebounds in an overtime loss at NC State last season ... It was Tech's first double-double of the season.

### Law -Abiding Citizens

Tech's win over West Virginia featured one very interesting stat line ... The Hokies did not record a steal in the game, the first time since Jan. 9, 2013 in a home loss to Boston College that Tech did not record a steal.

### Barksdale Returns

**C.J. Barksdale** returned to action in the Hokies' 105-92 win over VMI on Monday night, following a three-game suspension for violation of team rules ... Barksdale scored 16 points, had six rebounds and three assists in just 26 minutes of action ... He earned the start in the Hokies game against Seton Hall.

### Hasn't Happened Often

When **Ben Emelogu** scored 22 points in the win over West Virginia, he became the first Tech freshman to score 20-or-more points in a game since Malcolm Delaney scored 20 points as a freshman in a loss at No. 5 North Carolina on Feb. 16, 2008 ... The last time a Virginia Tech freshman scored more than 22 points in a game was on Jan. 28, 2006, when A.D. Vassallo scored 29 points at Wake Forest ... This is just the 16th time since 1999 that a Hokie freshman has scored 20-or-more points in a game ... It took a great effort to even play in the Western Carolina game, as Emelogu was suffering from flu-like symptoms and recieved an IV prior to the game ... He scored 16 points in 27 minutes in that victory.

### The Wait is Over

**Adam Smith** may have been the most anxious of all the Hokies approaching the USC Upstate game ... Smith began his playing career at UNC Wilmington in the 2011-12 season and transferred to Virginia Tech last summer ... Due to NCAA regulations, Smith had to sit out last season ... He was able to practice with the team and was a valuable member of the scout team, since he possessed a quick release on his jumper that could mimic many of the best shooters in the league ... Smith continued to work hard on his game and earned the start in the back court for the Hokies in the season opener ... In the win over West Virginia, Smith scored 19 points and added 11 points in the win over VMI ... Smith scored 27 points in the loss to No. 1 Michigan State, his highest total as a Hokie and has scored in double-figures in each of the last four games.

### That's A Lot in A Little

The win over VMI was the final game in a stretch that saw the Hokies open the season with four games in the first nine days of the regular season.

### Mueller to Sit Out This Season

The NCAA has ruled freshman guard **Malik Mueller** ineligible for the 2013-14 season due to initial eligibility rules ... Mueller is able to practice with the team this season and will be eligible to play four years beginning next season.

### The W is What Counts

In the win over VMI on Nov. 18, the Hokies allowed the Keydets 92 points ... That is the most points allowed by the Hokies in a win since Jan. 2, 2010, when the Hokies defeated Seton Hall, 103-94, in overtime in Cancun, Mexico ... It is the most points allowed by the Hokies in a non-overtime win since a 107-92 win over Southern Mississippi Feb. 4, 1989 in Cassell Coliseum.

### Comfortable at the Line

**Jarell Eddie** is shooting 82.6 percent from the line in his career and is fourth in career free throw percentage on the all-time list at Virginia Tech ... Eddie's 86.8 percent from the line as a sophomore was the fifth-best season in Tech history ... He is also shooting 82.6 percent from the line this season, tops on the team.

### Hokies vs. No. 1

With the loss to Michigan State on Friday night, Virginia Tech is 4-8 all-time against teams ranked No. 1 in the AP poll ... Tech is 3-4 against No. 1 since joining the ACC ... The Hokies are 0-4 against top-ranked teams in neutral site games ... Tech is 0-2 against top-ranked Big Ten teams, a 101-74 loss to Indiana in Bloomington in 1975 ... These numbers are only for teams ranked in the AP poll.

### Hokies vs. Ranked Teams

With the loss at No. 1 Michigan State, the Hokies are 13-44 against nationally ranked teams since joining the ACC for the 2004-05 season ... Tech is 30-152 all-time against teams ranked in the AP poll ... Tech is 0-1 this season and was 1-4 against ranked teams last season ... The last time the Hokies defeated a nationally-ranked team was Dec. 1, 2012, when Tech defeated No. 15 Oklahoma State, 81-71, in Cassell Coliseum ... These numbers are only for teams ranked in the AP poll.

### The Floor General

The Hokies are starting **Devin Wilson** at point guard this season and the freshman has made a solid debut in his first four collegiate games ... Wilson played 34 minutes, second highest on the team and scored four points, had four rebounds and three assists, while committing just three turnovers in the loss to USC Upstate... It marked the first time the Hokies had started a freshman at the point in a season-opener since Nov. 9, 2007, when Hank Thorns got the start against Elon in the first game of the 2007-08 season (That's correct, Malcolm Delaney came off the bench in that, his first collegiate game) ... In the win over West Virginia, Wilson scored 16 points and handed out four assists ... He also made all eight of his free throw attempts ... He scored 13 points, had five rebounds and four assists in the win over VMI ... Wilson leads the team in assists, steals and minutes played so far this season.

### Excuse Them, They're New

In the win over West Virginia, the three leading scorers for the Hokies were all playing in just their second games in a Tech uniform ... **Ben Emelogu** (22 pts.), **Adam Smith** (19 pts.) and **Devin Wilson** (16 pts.) all made their Virginia Tech debuts just three days earlier ... Smith played two seasons ago as a freshman at UNC Wilmington and Emelogu and Wilson are both freshmen.

### Hokies' All-Time Record

Virginia Tech is now 1361-1130 all-time in collegiate basketball, good for a .546 winning percentage ... This is the Hokies' 105th season of men's basketball.

### Second Half Scoring

**Cadarian Raines** started the season with a new career-high, as he scored 17 points against USC Upstate ... The senior surpassed his old high mark of 16 points set last year against Bradley and Duke ... He was 7-10 from the field ... Most amazingly, all 17 points came in the second half ... **Adam Smith** improved upon that in the loss to No. 1 Michigan State, as he scored 24 of his 27 points after intermission.

### Barksdale Closed Strong

Entering the home game with Duke last season, **C.J. Barksdale** had five career games in which he had posted double figures in scoring ... Starting with the first Duke game, Barksdale had four consecutive games in double figures ... He had never had back-to-back double figures games before the Duke and Florida State games ... Barksdale scored 103 points in the 18 ACC games last season ... Sixty-five of those points came in the last six ACC regular season games, three of which were played against top 10 teams ... Over the last six ACC games, Barksdale made 17 of his 19 free throw attempts, good for a 89.5 percent from the line over that stretch ... He raised his free throw percentage to 76.6 percent for last season.

## All Together Now

When **Will Johnston** and **Joey van Zegeren** scored in double figures in the win over Furman, it marked the ninth and 10th different players to record a double-figure scoring game this season ... All eight scholarship players scored at least 10 points in a game in the previous four seasons.

## Staying Close to Home Early

The Hokies played their first four games, and seven of their first nine games, in the friendly confines of Cassell Coliseum ... Last weekend's games in the Coaches Vs. Cancer Classic in the Barclays Center in Brooklyn were the first road game of the season ... Tech will not play a true road game until Dec. 8, when it opens ACC play at defending champion Miami ... The Hokies will not play a true non-conference "road" game this season.

## Captain Ben

Although he is only a freshman, **Ben Emelogu** has been named a team captain this season for the Hokies ... The guard from Grand Prairie, Texas came to Tech during the summer and established himself with his teammates immediately, earning the honor ... Emelogu made his collegiate debut in the loss to USC Upstate, coming off the bench to score six points and had two assists and led all scorers with 22 points in the win over West Virginia and added 19 points in the win over VMI.

## 500-Plus in the Cassell

The Hokies have a 532-165 overall record in Cassell, good for a .763 winning percentage ... Tech is 4-1 in Cassell Coliseum this season and was 10-7 in Cassell last season ... Tech was 11-7 in the 2011-12 season and was 12-4 in Cassell the season before, the 50th year for the arena ... The win over Florida State on Jan. 8, 2011, was the 500th victory in the building ... Tech has had just one break-even home season and one losing season in Cassell Coliseum ... The 17 victories for the Hokies at home in the 2009-10 season set a new Cassell Coliseum and school record.

The redshirt sophomore from The Netherlands is fluent in five languages and has understanding of several others ... On the bench, Tech welcomes new Director of Men's Basketball Operations **Rob Harris** and video coordinator **Kenny Brown**.

## Hokies in Overtime

With the loss at NC State last season, the Hokies are now 59-45 all-time in overtime games ... Tech was 2-2 in overtime games last season ... Tech is 26-23 in road overtime games, 26-9 in home overtime games and 7-13 on neutral courts ... Tech is 12-5 in ACC overtime games ... Tech is 3-6 all-time in overtime games against ranked teams ... Tech is 5-8 in double-overtime games and 1-2 in triple overtime games.

## They Were the Champions, My Friend

On the weekend on Oct. 26, 2013, Virginia Tech welcomed the 1973 NIT Champion basketball team back to campus for their 40th reunion ... That team, coached by Don DeVoe, defeated New Mexico, Fairfield, Alabama and Notre Dame in Madison Square Garden to capture the school's first-ever NIT title ... Tech downed the Irish, 92-91 in overtime in the championship game ... Bobby Stevens hits a jumper at the buzzer to claim the win.

## Grabbing Boards

When **Marshall Wood** grabbed a career-high and team season-high 16 rebounds in the overtime loss at NC State last season, it marked the first time a Hokie had grabbed at least 16 rebounds in a game since Dorian Finney-Smith grabbed 16 rebounds on Nov. 12, 2012 at home against East Tennessee State ... The last time a Hokie grabbed more than 16 rebounds in a game was on Feb. 5, 2011, when Jeff Allen grabbed 19 rebounds at Boston College ... The 16 rebounds was also the most by an ACC freshman last season.

### 300 and Counting

The Hokies have hit at least one three-pointer in every game since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... Tech has now hit a three in 342 consecutive games, the most in school history ... Since the three-point arc was added to college basketball for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one three in all but three games ... The last time that the Hokies did not record a three-point field goal in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003.

### Five Doubles is Rare

When **Marshall Wood** recorded his first career double-double in the overtime loss at NC State last season, he became the fifth Hokie to record a double-double during that season (and the fourth to record his first career double-double last season) ... That was the first season since at least the 1989-90 season that five Hokies have recorded double-doubles in the same season ... Six games into this season, two Hokies, **Trevor Thompson** and **Jarell Eddie**, have recorded double-doubles for the Hokies.

### Big Green Things

Erick Green was the 2013 ACC Player of the Year, in a vote of the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association ... Green received 38 of the 76 votes cast ... Green became the first Virginia Tech player ever to win the award and the first Hokie since **Bimbo Coles** in 1988 in the Metro Conference to win a conference Player of the Year Award ... Green joins **Coles** and **Dell Curry** (Metro, 1986) to earn a conference player of the Year Award ... He was second ACC Player of the Year from a bottom half of the league team (the late **Len Bias** from Maryland in 1986) ... He was named First Team All-ACC by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association ... Green joined **Mason Plumlee** of Duke, **Shane Larkin** of Miami, **Joe Harris** of Virginia and **Richard Howell** of NC State on the first team ... He is the third Hokie to earn first team honors in the ACC, joining **Zabian Dowdell** in 2007 and **Malcolm Delaney** in 2010 and 2011 ... Green was the first Hokie ever to lead the nation in scoring ... He became just the second ACC player to earn that honor, following South Carolina's **Grady Wallace**, who led the nation in scoring (31.2 ppg) in the 1956-57 season ... Green is just the second Hokie to lead the ACC in scoring ... **Malcolm Delaney** averaged 20.2 ppg in the 2010 season.

### Scoring Combos

The Virginia Tech combo of **Erick Green** and **Jarell Eddie** averaged 37.3 points per game last season ... They were the highest-scoring set of teammates in the ACC in the 2012-13 season.

### Beyer Stepped In Well

**Christian Beyer** had the best game of his short Virginia Tech (to date) career, as he scored three points and grabbed nine rebounds in 27 minutes of action in the overtime win over **Bradley** last season ... **Beyer** was forced into increased playing time when **Marshall Wood** suffered a fractured foot on Dec. 15 ... He also led Tech with two steals ... **Beyer** had played a combined 15 minutes in the first 10 games of the season ... Add in the 25 minutes he played in the loss to Colorado State and **Beyer** averaged 26.0 minutes and 6.5 rebounds per game in Las Vegas ... In the loss at **BYU**, **Beyer** scored a career-high nine points and grabbed a career-high 11 rebounds ... He had six points and seven rebounds in the loss at Maryland and six points and eight rebounds in the loss to Boston College.

### Eddie, Beyer on Academic Team

Virginia Tech players **Jarell Eddie** and **Christian Beyer** were named to the 2012-13 All-Atlantic Coast Conference Academic Men's Basketball Team ... This was **Eddie's** second year on the 14-member team and **Beyer** made his first appearance on the squad.

### The State We're In

With the win over **VMI**, Virginia Tech is 422-307 (.579) all-time against schools from Virginia ... Tech is 1-0 this season against schools from the Commonwealth and was 1-2 last season against state schools ... The Hokies have played 14 schools from the state ... With the win over **Norfolk State** on Dec. 11, 2011, the only state Division I school that Tech has not played is **Hampton** ... Tech holds winning records against 10 of the schools and even records against two others ... Tech will play **VMI**, **Radford**, **VCU** and **UVa** from the Commonwealth this season.

### Welcoming Back Old Foes

The Hokies welcomed back two traditional rivals to the schedule last season and will add another this season ... Tech defeated **VMI**, 95-80, on Nov. 15 in a rivalry that dates back to 1909 and defeated **West Virginia**, 87-82, in **Blacksburg** on Nov. 12 ... Tech and **WVU** first met in basketball in 1921 and have played 78 times since then ... The teams had last met in the 2003-04 season, the Hokies' last season as a member of the **BIG EAST** Conference ... This season, the Hokies have added **Radford** back to the schedule ... Although the two schools have only met six times since first playing in 1987, the **Highlanders** are, geographically, the closest Division I school to Virginia Tech, sharing the **New River Valley**.

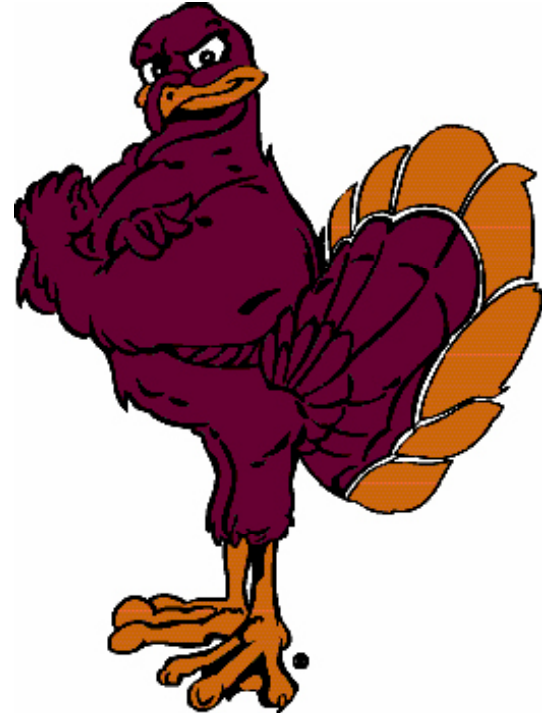

## Beecher Joins the Hall

Former Virginia Tech men's basketball player Bobby Beecher was inducted into the Virginia Tech Sports Hall of Fame on Nov. 5 ... As a senior, Beecher averaged 14.3 points and 7.9 rebounds to finish his Tech career eighth in scoring (1,548 pts.) and sixth in rebounds (797) ... He played in 128 of 129 games as a Hokie, starting 126. Currently, he still ranks third all-time at Tech in blocked shots (170) and stands in the top 10 in career rebounds, field goals made (640) and free-throw percentage (.807). He is 16th all-time in scoring ... Beecher, who was selected in the fourth round of the 1986 NBA Draft by the Sacramento Kings, earned his Tech degree in human services with an emphasis in family and child development ... Beecher was joined in the 2013 Class by MLB pitcher Joe Saunders, softball's Clarisa Crowell, PGA Tour member Johnson Wagner, VT tennis great Jimmy Milley and former NFL player John Engelberger.

# Head Coach James Johnson



James Johnson is in his second season as Virginia Tech's head men's basketball coach. Johnson's up-tempo style of offense energized the Hokie fan base in his first season and, with a fresh infusion of talent for the 2013-14 season, Tech will see a more pressure-oriented defense.

During Johnson's first season, senior guard Erick Green became the first Hokie ever to be named the Atlantic Coast Conference Player of the Year and to lead the nation in scoring. Johnson and the Hokies defeated No. 15 Oklahoma State in December in Cassell Coliseum, earning the new coach a victory in his first-ever game against a nationally-ranked team. Just as important, two Hokies, Jarell Eddie and Christian Beyer were named to the All-ACC Academic team. Johnson has renewed a pledge to better involve the program into the daily life of the Virginia Tech campus and the New River Valley community. In the past year, the program became a part of the Christmas Store, Special Olympics and other activities and charities in the area.

No stranger to the Hokie Nation, Johnson spent the previous five seasons on the men's basketball staff at Virginia Tech. He was an assistant coach from 2007-2011 before being promoted to associate head coach prior to last season. He had accepted an assistant coaches' position at Clemson on April 13 of this year, but returns to Blacksburg to take

over the reins of the men's basketball program. Director of Athletics Jim Weaver named Johnson to the position on May 1, 2012.

"I am pleased with Coach Johnson's first year as head coach," Weaver said. "He has surrounded himself with an excellent staff who cares about the players and their development in both the classroom and the basketball court."

Johnson joined the Hokies following two seasons as an assistant at George Mason. While at Mason, he focused on organizing the team's defensive efforts in practice and games. The Patriots were a combined 45-23 in his two seasons and advanced to the 2006 NCAA Final Four. Before GMU, Johnson spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Penn State. He was the recruitment coordinator for the Nittany Lions. Prior to Penn State, Johnson had a one-year stint as an assistant at the College of Charleston and he spent two years as an assistant at Elon.

"Virginia Tech and the Hokie Nation have a special place in my heart and I am blessed and excited for the opportunity to become the head basketball coach," Johnson said at the time of his hiring. "I look forward to working with a great group of young men and moving forward with this program."

Johnson, a native of Powhatan, Va., was a four-year player and three-year



starter at Ferrum College. A three-time Defensive Player of the Year, he helped guide his team to two conference championships and a berth in the NCAA Division III Tournament. He was also voted his team's Most Valuable Player in 1993. In 2001, Johnson was selected as one of the Top 10 players in Ferrum basketball history. In September of 2009, Johnson was elected into the Ferrum College Athletic Hall of Fame.

After graduating from Ferrum with a bachelor of science in psychology in 1993, he immediately stepped into the coaching ranks at his alma mater and served as an assistant for two seasons. Johnson helped guide the Panthers to a regular-season conference title. In 1995, Johnson moved on to Longwood College as an assistant and then spent one year at Hargrave Military Academy, where he worked with the post-graduate team. In 1997, he began a three-year run as an assistant at Old Dominion. Johnson is a member of the Black Coaches Association (BCA) and the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC). In March 2001, Rivals.com named Johnson one of the Top 20 Assistant Coaches at Mid-Major Division I Schools. He was a squad leader in the Army National Guard from 1989-91.

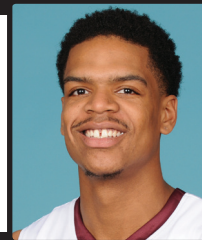

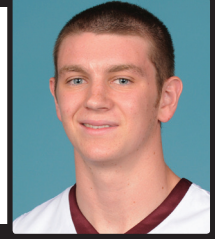

## USC UPSTATE 64, VIRGINIA TECH 63

Virginia Tech lost 64-63 to USC Upstate in men's basketball action Saturday afternoon at Cassell Coliseum. This was the season-opener for both teams.

The game was close throughout, with neither team leading by more than six points. Tech took a 15-9 lead on a 3-pointer by freshman **Ben Emelogu** with 13:33 remaining in the first half. The game was tied at 23 with 5:45 remaining before intermission, and the lead flipped back and forth for the rest of the half. The Spartans took a 33-31 lead into the locker room.

Upstate opened the second half on a 10-7 run and took a 43-38 lead with 16:40 remaining on a jumper by Ty Greene, but the Hokies were able to reclaim the lead and took a 58-53 lead with 8:51 remaining on a 3-pointer by **Will Johnston**. Upstate then went ahead 60-58 with 7:04 remaining on a lay-up by Torrey Craig. Following a lay-up by Tech senior **Cadarian Raines** to tie the game at 62 with 4:09 to play, the Hokies could manage only one free throw by senior **Jarell Eddie** in the final four minutes.

With USC Upstate leading 64-63 in the final minute, the Hokies were able to get a few chances to take the lead, but all fell short and the Spartans claimed the victory.

Eddie led all scorers with 18 points and led Tech with seven rebounds. Raines, who was held scoreless in the first half, tallied a career-high 17 points and grabbed four rebounds. Redshirt sophomore **Joey van Zegeren** also grabbed seven rebounds in the loss and recorded a career-high five blocked shots. Green led the Spartans with 17 points and Craig added 13 points. Ricardo Glenn had 10 points, and Jodd Maxey grabbed a game-high 10 rebounds.

The Hokies held the Spartans to just 37.5 percent from the floor and just five of 16 from beyond the 3-point arc (31.3 percent). Tech shot 39 percent from the field, including 36.4 percent from behind the 3-point arc. The rebounds were even at 39. The Hokies made just nine of 18 free-throw attempts, including 5 of 13 in the second half.

# GAME 2

## VIRGINIA TECH 87, WEST VIRGINIA 82

NOV. 12, 2013 • 1 P.M. • BLACKSBURG, VA.

Virginia Tech freshman **Ben Emelogu** scored a game-high 22 points, and **Adam Smith** made some key plays down the stretch to help the Hokies rally past West Virginia 87-82.

Smith scored 19 points for the Hokies who rallied from a 17-point deficit in the first half. He scored seven of Tech's last nine points in the game – all in the final 1:46.

His basket with 1:46 left in the game gave Tech an 80-77 lead. West Virginia cut the lead to 80-79 on a bucket by Juwan Staten with 44 seconds left.

Smith then made one of the biggest plays of the game. He drove to the basket, put up a shot and made it, getting fouled in the process. He made the free throw, and the three-point play gave the Hokies an 83-79 lead with 33.2 seconds remaining.

West Virginia's Remi Dibo then hit a 3-pointer with 23.7 seconds left to cut the lead to 83-82, but Smith answered again, hitting two free throws to push the lead to 85-82 with 16.2 seconds remaining.

West Virginia (1-1) had a chance to tie the game, but Nathan Adrian's 3-pointer was short, and Tech freshman **Devin Wilson** got the rebound. Wilson made two free throws with 5 seconds left to seal the game for Virginia Tech.

Emelogu scored 13 of his 22 in the first half, rallying the Hokies from that 17-point deficit. Tech went on a 12-1 run that ended with Emelogu's 3-pointer at the buzzer to cut the lead to 41-36 at halftime. The Hokies then scored the first eight points of the second half, using that 20-1 run spanning both halves to get back into the game.

Wilson finished with 16 points for the Hokies, making 4 of 7 from the floor and all eight of his free-throw attempts. **Jarell Eddie** had 10 points – all in the second half.

Dibo led West Virginia with 17 points, while Eron Harris added 16 for the cold-shooting Mountaineers. West Virginia shot just 35.7 percent from the floor (25 of 70).

## VIRGINIA TECH 79, WESTERN CAROLINA 61

NOV. 15, 2013 • 7 P.M. • BLACKSBURG, VA.

**Trevor Thompson** recorded his first double-double and **Jarell Eddie** had 17 points, as the Hokies led from start to finish in downing Western Carolina 79-61.

The Hokies (2-1) jumped out to 22-point, first-half lead and had a 20-point halftime lead. Eddie scored 10 of his 17 points in the first half for Tech, which shot 51.6 percent on 16-of-31 shooting in the first 20 minutes.

Western Carolina (2-2) scored just three points in the first eight minutes – all on free throws. The Catamounts missed their first 11 shots and didn't hit a field goal until Justin Browning's basket with 10:31 left in the first half.

The Catamounts shot just 22.2 percent on 6-of-27 shooting in the first half. They only made 32.8 percent (20 of 61) for the game, including 3-of-25 shooting from beyond the 3-point arc.

Thompson's three first-half dunks got the crowd in the game, and in the second half, he scored nine points. He finished with 15 points on 4-of-7 shooting from the floor and 7-of-11 shooting from the free-throw line and he added 11 rebounds.

It marked the second straight solid performance for the 6-foot-11 freshman, who did not play in the season opener against USC Upstate. He had seven points and five rebounds in 17 minutes in the Hokies' win over West Virginia.

The Catamounts cut the lead to 53-43 on two free throws by Browning with 7:43 left, but got no closer. But Thompson then hit two free throws, and after a turnover by Western Carolina's Brandon Boggs, the Hokies' **Devin Wilson** added two more free throws with 7:27 remaining to push the lead to 57-43. The Catamounts got no closer than 12 the rest of the game.

James Sinclair led the Catamounts with 16 points. Trey Sumler, who scored 29 points in the Catamounts' loss at Oregon, finished with 11 on just 5-of-14 shooting.

# GAME 4

VIRGINIA TECH 105, VMI 92

NOV. 18, 2013 • 7 P.M. • BLACKSBURG, VA.

Jarell Eddie tied a career high with five 3-pointers and scored 21 points to pace a balanced attack, as Virginia Tech held on late to down Virginia Military Institute 105-92.

Led by Eddie, the Hokies hit a season-high 11 3-pointers. Eddie shot 7 of 12 from the floor overall – including 5 of 5 from beyond the 3-point arc. He also made both of his free-throw attempts and grabbed six rebounds.

Eddie's shooting certainly opened things up for the Hokies, who topped the 100-point mark for the first time since the 2011 season. Five players scored in double figures for Tech, and every Hokie player who played in the game scored.

Freshman guard Ben Emelogu added 19 points off the bench for the Hokies and hit four 3-pointers. C.J. Barksdale, who was suspended for the first three games of this season by Johnson for a violation of team rules, scored 16 points and grabbed six rebounds in his season debut.

Tech led by as many as 20 in the second half after Adam Smith's 3-pointer with 13:50 remaining and appeared to be coasting toward an easy victory. But VMI started pressing, and the Hokies got sloppy with the ball. Eight of Virginia Tech's 16 turnovers came in the final 13 minutes of the game.

VMI cut the lead to 98-92 on two free throws by QJ Peterson with 1:18 left, but the Hokies scored the game's final seven points.

Barksdale scored on a lay-up with 1:10 left, and after a missed 3-pointer by Peterson, Smith hit a free throw to give the Hokies a 101-92 lead with 56 seconds to go. Trey Chapman then missed a 3-pointer, and Eddie got the rebound. He tossed it ahead to Barksdale, who broke free for a dunk to give the Hokies a 103-92 lead with 39 seconds left and all but seal the game.

Peterson missed a jumper with 33 seconds left and then fouled the Hokies' Will Johnston, who made two free throws with 31 seconds left to account for the final margin.

Rodney Glasgow and Peterson led VMI (3-2) with 22 points each. D.J. Covington added 20 points and five rebounds for the Keydets, who were out-rebounded 52-31 by the Hokies.

The Hokies fell 96-77 in their opening game of the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn. Jarell Eddie finished the game with a career-high six threes as part of a 23-point effort, while Adam Smith led the team with 27 points.

The Hokies (3-2) got out to a slow start as Michigan State (5-0) took an early 10-5 lead, but Tech controlled the boards early on and it would eventually pay off. The Spartans struggled from beyond the arc early, unable to connect on their first six attempts. Tech took advantage and eventually tied the game at 10 on a Ben Emelogu three. C.J. Barksdale followed it up with a bucket of his own to give the Hokies their first lead of the game nearing the midway point in the half.

Following the under-12 media timeout, the Hokies went on an 8-0 run for their largest lead of the night at 20-14. The game saw six lead changes over the next three minutes of play, but Michigan State began to pull away in the closing minutes of the half. The final five minutes of the first period were dominated by Michigan State's Adreian Payne, who scored 11 of the team's 15 points in that time frame.

Eddie neared yet another 20-point half as he had 17 at the break, including 4 threes, while Payne put up 20 by halftime, as neither team saw another player score more than six points in the first half.

Michigan State continued to roll in the second half as it opened with a 13-3 run. The Hokies scored just nine points in the first ten minutes of the second half, but midway through the period Smith came alive for Tech. He scored nine straight points for the Hokies and was the only consistent source of production for the squad in the later part of the game.

Barksdale neared a double-double for the Hokies, finishing with eight points and seven boards, while Smith also grabbed six rebounds and had five assists. Payne, as well as Brandon Dawson finished with double-doubles for the Spartans. Payne went for 29 and 10, while Dawson scored 12 points and brought down 10 rebounds.

Tech was forced to foul in the closing seconds of the game and a costly turnover with 12 seconds remaining went on to make it a two-possession game.

Emelogu got it back within two when he hit a three with four seconds left, but Edwin made both free throws on the ensuing foul to make it a four-point difference. The freshman struck again from beyond the arc in the final second but the Hokies remained just short as time ran out.

# GAME 7

## VIRGINIA TECH 75, FURMAN 54

NOV. 26, 2013 • 7 P.M. • BLACKSBURG, VA.

Virginia Tech's **Jarell Eddie** scored 14 points to lead the hot-shooting Hokies to a 75-54 nonconference win over Furman. Eddie's 14 points – his seventh straight game in double figures – paced five Tech players in double figures. The Hokies also got 13 points from **Marshall Wood**, a career-high 12 points from **Will Johnston** and 11 points from **Adam Smith**. Johnston hit four 3-pointers, while Wood and Smith hit three 3's each, as the Hokies hit 12 3-pointers.

The performance marked the fourth straight game in which the Hokies have made at least 10 3-pointers. Eddie made 6 of 15 from the floor, including two threes, and he also grabbed 10 rebounds for his second straight double-double. It marked the fifth double-double of his career.

Furman scored the first basket of the game on a jumper by Stephen Croone. But the Hokies answered with an 18-1 run to take control of the game and never trailed again.

In the second half, Tech built the lead to 22 points following a Wood 3-pointer with 14:30 left that gave the Hokies a 43-21 lead. Furman cut the lead to nine points on two occasions, the final coming on a Croone 3-pointer that sliced the lead to 51-42 with 7:40 remaining.

But the Hokies' Johnston answered with a 3-pointer with 7:11 remaining to start a 15-2 run that pushed the lead back to 66-44, and the Hokies weren't threatened again. Eddie scored seven of the 15 in that run.

Johnston, who played 26 minutes mainly because Ben Emelogu was out (concussion-like symptoms), knocked down 4 of 6 from beyond the arc. Wood, who reached double figures for the first time this season, made 4 of 8 from the floor, including 3 of 5 from beyond the arc.

Virginia Tech also got a career-high 11 assists from freshman point guard Devin Wilson, who became the first Tech freshman to record 11 assists in a game since Dell Curry dished out 11 against Maryland-Eastern Shore on Dec. 4, 1982.

Croone led the Paladins with 27 points. He hit 8 of 14 from the floor and 10 of 11 from the free-throw line. Larry Wideman added 13 points for the Paladins, who only had four players score in the game.
