The Hokies are 8-7 on the season and 1-2 in ACC action.

The Tigers are 11-4 overall and 2-1 in the ACC after a 72-59 win over Duke on Saturday.

The Hokies lead the all-time series, 15-13.

BC 62, VT 59

The Hokies dropped a tight one to Boston College, 62-59, in Cassell Colisem on Saturday afternoon.

Adam Smith came off the bench to score a teamhigh 12 points for the Hokies.

C.J. Barksdale scored 11 points and Jarell Eddie added 10 points for the Hokies.

Joey van Zegeren tied a career-high with five blocked shots in the game.

Scoring 1,000

With his first three-pointer in the loss to #2/2 Syracuse, Jarell Eddie became the 44th player in school history to score 1,000 career points. Eddie currently has 1,013 points at Virginia Tech

and is 43rd in career scoring for the Hokies.

Game No. 2,500

Tonight is the 2,500th game in Virginia Tech men's basketball history.

On This Date

Tonight is the ninth anniversary of the Hokies' firstever ACC victory ... On Jan. 15, 2005, the Hokies defeated Clemson, 59-57, in Cassell Coliseum to mark the achievement.

Up Next

The Hokies take to the road for the first time in 2014, as they travel to Notre Dame on Sunday night. The game, shown on ESPNU, will tip-off at 6 p.m.

The Series vs. Clemson

The Hokies lead the all-time series, 15-13 and won the last meeting between the two schools, 69-61, in Cassell Coliseum on March 2, 2013 ... Tech is 9-5 in home games against the Tigers, including a 9-4 mark in Cassell Coliseum ... The Hokies are 4-3 against Clemson in ACC home games and have won the last three meetings in Cassell Coliseum.

Last Time Out: BC 62, VT 59

The Hokies fell to Boston College, 62-59, in Cassell Coliseum on Saturday afternoon ... Adam Smith came off the bench to lead the Hokies with 12 points, while C.J. Barksdale scored 11 points and Jarell Eddie added 10 points in the loss ... Tech committed a seasonlow six turnovers, but shot 35.1 percent from the floor and 57.1 percent from the line.

Reaching New Levels

With his three-point field goal at the 18:21 mark of the first half in the loss to #2/2 Syracuse, Jarell Eddie recorded his 1,000th career point ... He was the 44th player in Virginia Tech history to score 1,000 career points ... He has a

career point total of 1,013 points, 43rd on the all-time list.

Hokies and Tigers Keep It Close

The series between the Hokies and Tigers has had a habit of producing close games ... Since Tech joined the ACC in the 2004-05 season, 11 of the 15 games have been decided by five-or-fewer-points ... Almost all of the games have been decided in the last minute of the game ... Since Virginia Tech joined the ACC, Virginia Tech has scored a total of one more point than the Tigers ... In ACC play, only one of the Clemson - Virginia Tech match-ups has seen a double-figure victory, as Tech downed the Tigers, 70-59, in Cassell Coliseum on Feb. 6, 2010.

Remember the Date

Tonight's game is the second time that the Hokies and Tigers have met on Jan. 15 ... The first time was quite a memorable date in Virginia Tech men's basketball history, as the Hokies defeated Clemson, 59-57, in Cassell Coliseum in 2005 ... That game was the Hokies' first-ever ACC victory ... Carlos Dixon stole the ball and scored on a lay-up in the waning seconds to give Tech the win.

Being Stingy

In the loss to Boston College on Jan. 11, the Hokies committed a season-low six turnovers ... That is the fewest turnovers for the Hokies in a game since committing five turnovers in a loss at Clemson on Jan. 27 last season.

Increased Swats

The Hokies are third in the ACC and 29th in the nation in blocked shots this season ... Tech is averaging 5.8 blocked shots per game, up from an average of 3.9 blocked shots per game last season ... Three different Hokies have blocked five shots in a single game and three Hokies have reached double figures in blocks so far this season.

2,500 Games

Tonight's game against Clemson marks the 2,500th game in school history ... Virginia Tech is now 1365-1134 all-time in collegiate basketball, good for a .547 winning percentage ... This is the Hokies' 105th season of men's basketball.

Knowing the Opposition's Coach

Virginia Tech head coach James Johnson knows a little about the Clemson coaching staff ... Johnson joined Brad Brownell's staff at Clemson in mid-April of 2012, coming from his first stint at Virginia Tech ... However, a few days later, the opportunity arose for Johnson to return to Blacksburg to become the Hokies' head coach.

Dishing It Out

In the win over Furman, **Devin Wilson** recorded 11 assists ... The last Hokie freshman to record 11 assists in a single game was Dell Curry, who had 11 assists as a freshman against Maryland-Eastern

Shore on Dec. 4, 1982 ... The 11 assists is also one assist shy of the Tech overall school record of 12, set by Dave Sensibaugh, Bimbo Coles and, most recently, Troy Manns in 1997 ... Wilson also has two games of eight assists each ... His 74 assists are the most by a Hokie through 15 games since Bimbo Coles in the 1986-87 season ... Wilson is fourth in assists in the ACC, second among ACC freshmen.

And Hauling It In

Devin Wilson grabbed a career-high seven rebounds in the loss to UNCG ... It is the most rebounds for a Virginia Tech freshman point guard since Malcolm Delaney grabbed eight rebounds in a win over Boston College on Feb. 26, 2008.

And Scoring the Ball

Devin Wilson had "just" three assists in the win over Maryland-Eastern Shore, but concentrated more on scoring the ball ... While fellow freshman Ben Emelogu recorded a career-high nine assists and no turnovers. Wilson tied a career-best with 16 points ... He also made his second threepointer of the season.

JvZ Comes Up Big Joey van Zegeren

continues his strong showing for the Hokies ... JvZ earned his first start of the season in the win over Radford, grabbing six rebounds and blocking three shots and followed

that with nine points and seven rebounds in the win over Winthrop, including scoring eight points in the first four minutes of the game ... In the ACC overtime win at Miami, JvZ grabbed a career-high 10 rebounds, while adding eight points in a career-high 35 minutes of action ... He blocked three shots and grabbed five rebounds in the loss to VCU, but played just 20 minutes due to foul troubles ... In the loss to UNCG, JvZ scored a career-high 11 points and grabbed seven rebounds and he led the Hokies in rebounding in the loss to No. 2/2 Syracuse ... He tied his career-high with five blocked shots in the loss to Boston College.

Balanced Attack

When C.J. Barksdale led the Hokies in scoring in the loss to No. 2/2 Syracuse, he became the fifth different Hokie to lead the team in scoring so far this season ... Last season, only Erick Green and Jarell Eddie led the team in scoring in a game.

Cap & Gown

On Friday, Dec. 20, the Virginia Tech men's basketball team traveled to Richmond, Va., to play the next day against VCU in the Governor's Holiday Hoops Classic ... Before the bus rolled down the highway,

the team and, in particular, Cadarian Raines had something to do ... Raines earned his bachelor's degree in sociology from the College of Liberal Arts that morning in Cassell Coliseum and his teammates were all there to see the accomplishment ... After plenty of photos and congratulations from family, friends and teammates, Raines hopped on the bus for the three hour trip to the State Capital.

Juggling the Injuries

Fifteen games into the 2012-13 season, the Hokies had used just two starting lineups ... So far this season, head coach **James Johnson** has been forced to juggle his lineups game-by-game, due, primarily to injuries ... In the loss to Boston College, Johnson used his eighth different starting line-up ... In the end, Tech used six different starting line-ups last season.

First Start

In the loss to VCU, Ben **Emelogu** earned the first of what will surely be many career starts for the Hokies ... The freshman captain led the Hokies with 12 points, plus he tied a career-high with six rebounds ... He also started against UNCG,

scoring 11 points and grabbing five rebounds and had a career-high nine assists in the win over UMES ... Emelogu has started each of the last five games for the Hokies.

Smith Likes the Big Time

Adam Smith scored 27 points in the loss to No. 1 Michigan State ... Smith, who transfered

from UNC Wilmington last season, played against two "equity" conference teams at UNCW, scoring 32 points against Maryland and 23 points against Wake Forest ... So far this season, Smith has scored 19 points against West Virginia, 27 points vs. Michigan State and 11 points in the loss to Seton Hall.

Smith Injury Update

Adam Smith missed the win over Winthrop with a strained left calf muscle, but played limited minutes in the win at Miami ... He played in the loss to VCU, but left the game at halftime due to the injury ... Smith did not play in the loss to UNCG or the win over UMES ... He returned to action in the loss to No. 2/2 Syracuse, scoring nine points on three, three-pointers in 30 minutes of action ...He returned to double figures in the loss to Boston College, coming off the bench to score 12 points, the first time he had scored in double figures since scoring a season-high 28 points in the win over Radford on Nov. 29.

Dishing It Out, Part Deux

On the strength of **Devin Wilson's** 11 assists, the Hokies recorded a season-high 19 assists in the win over Furman ... It is the most assists for the Hokies since the opening game of last season, an 80-62 win over East Tennessee State in Cassell Coliseum.

Three in a Row

Tonight's game with Clemson is the final game of a three-game ACC homestand ... This is only the second time since the Hokies joined the ACC for the 2004-05 season that Tech has had a three-game ACC homestand ... In the 2007-08 season, the Hokies defeated Georgia Tech, Boston College and Wake Forest in late February and early March ... Later this season. Tech will have another three-game ACC homestand ... Tech has never had a threegame ACC road trip.

Spreading the Offense Around

When Will Johnston and Joey van

Zegeren scored in double figures in the win over Furman, it marked the ninth and 10th different players to record a double-figure scoring game this season ... Eight players scored at least 10 points in a game in the each of the previous four seasons.

Playing D

So far this season, the Hokies are allowing opponents just 39.0 percent from the field ... In 10 of the 15 games, including a five game stretch, the Hokies allowed its opponents less than 40.0 percent from the field ... Only one opponent this season, No. 1 Michigan State, has shot better than 50.0 percent from the field.

Always There When You Need Him

In the loss to VCU, Christian Beyer was forced into increased action due to injuries

and foul trouble ... The walkon from New Bern, N.C., was more than up to the task ... Coming off the bench, Bever saw 16 minutes of action, all coming in the second half ... He led the team with eight rebounds, including three off the offensive glass.

Early Start to Conference Play

The Hokies' 61-60 overtime win over Miami marked the conference opener for the Hokies and the Hurricanes ... This was the earliest date that Tech has won an ACC game, on the third-earliest date the Hokies had opened ACC play since joining the league in the 2004-05 season ... The earliest Tech ever opened an ACC season was on Dec. 4, 2005, a heartbreaking 77-75 loss at No. 1 Duke ... Tech also played arch-rival Virginia on Dec. 5, 2010.

Hokies vs. No. 1

With the loss to Michigan State, Virginia Tech is 4-8 all-time against teams ranked No. 1 in the AP poll ... Tech is 3-4 against No. 1 since joining the ACC ... The Hokies are 0-4 against top-ranked teams in neutral site games ... These numbers are only for teams ranked in the AP poll.

Hokies vs. Ranked Teams

With the loss to No. 2 Syracuse, the Hokies are 13-45 against nationally ranked teams since joining the ACC for the 2004-05 season ... Tech is 30-153 all-time against teams ranked in the AP poll ... Tech is 0-2 this season and was 1-4 against ranked teams last season ... The last time the Hokies defeated a nationally-ranked team was Dec. 1, 2012, when Tech defeated No. 15 Oklahoma State. 81-71, in Cassell Coliseum ... These numbers are only for teams ranked in the AP poll.

Keep Off the Glass

In the win over Winthrop, the Hokies outrebounded the Eagles, 37-22 ... The 22 rebounds by WU is the fewest by a Tech opponent since Boston College had 19 rebounds in a 66-65 Hokie win in Cassell Coliseum on Feb. 12, 2012 ... The 59 combined rebounds in the Winthrop game is the fewest in a Virginia Tech game since March 2, 2013, when Tech and Clemson combined for 54 rebounds in a 69-61 Hokies win in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech held Maryland-Eastern Shore to 26 rebounds on Dec. 31.

Two With Doubles

In the win over Radford, C.J. Barksdale (14 pts./10 rebs.) and Jarell Eddie (13 pts./10 rebs.) each recorded double-doubles ... It marked the first time since Jeff Allen (18 pts./15 rebs.) and Victor Davila (12 pts./10 rebs.) each recorded double-doubles in the win over No. 1 Duke on Feb. 26, 2011.

Doing It All

In the win over Winthrop, Jarell Eddie had perhaps his best, and unquestionably his busiest, night as a collegian ... Due to injuries, the Hokies played the game without guards Adam Smith and Ben Emelogu ... Eddie, who at times in his Tech career has played the power forward spot, was forced to not only start at his natural small forward position, but to also play both guard spots, including a run at the point ... Eddie proved he was up to the challenge, as he scored a career-high 34 points, tied a career-high with six three-pointers and grabbed a team-high seven rebounds in 37 minutes of action ... His 34 points are the most by a Hokie since Erick Green scored 35 points in the home loss to #14/15 Miami on Jan. 30, 2013.

Hitting Threes

The Hokies made a season-high 13 three-pointers in the loss to No. 1 Michigan State ... It is the most three-point field goals made by the Hokies since they made 14 threes in a win at UNC Greensboro on Nov. 19, 2012 ... With the 12 made three-pointers in the win over Furman, Tech made 10-or-more three-pointers in four consecutive games, the first time that has happened at least since the 1999-2000 season ... With the 12 three-point field goals in the overtime win at Miami, the Hokies have made at least 10 three-pointers in five of their 15 games, plus four more games of 8-or-more three-pointers.

Tripling on Doubles

In the loss to Seton Hall, **Jarell Eddie** recorded his first double-double of the season with 19 points and 11 rebounds, to go along with four blocked shots and four assists ... He made it two straight double-doubles with 14 points and 10 rebounds in the win over Furman and in the win over Radford, he pushed the streak to three consecutive double-doubles, with 13 points and 10 rebounds ... It marked the first time since Feb. 13, 15 and 19 of 2011 that a Hokie has had three consecutive double-doubles, when Jeff Allen recorded the last three of his seven consecutive double-doubles.

Hot From the Field

The Hokies made 29 of 48 attempts from the field in the win over Winthrop ... The 60.4 percent from the field is the highest percentage Tech has shot under **James Johnson** and the highest percentage the Hokies have made since shooting 62.5 percent from the floor (30 of 48) in a win over Monmouth on Nov. 14, 2011.

Hokies in Overtime

With the win at Miami, the Hokies are now 60-45 all-time in overtime games ... Tech is 1-0 this season and was 2-2 in overtime games last season ... Tech is 27-23 in road overtime games, 26-9 in home overtime games and 7-13 on neutral courts ... Tech is 13-5 in ACC overtime games ... Tech is 3-6 all-time in overtime games against ranked teams ... Tech is 5-8 in double-overtime games and 1-2 in triple overtime games.

Quite A Break

The VCU game was the Hokies' first game since winning their ACC opener at Miami on Dec. 8 ... The 13-day break was the longest for the Hokies since the 2007-08 season, when Tech opened the season on Nov. 9 with a win over Elon and did not play again until Nov. 22, when they defeated Eastern Washington in the Great Alaska Shootout in Anchorage.

Eddie is Honored

Jarell Eddie was named the ACC Player of the Week for the week ending Dec. 9, 2013 ... This is the first time that Eddie has won the award and is the first Hokie to earn the honor this season ... The same week, Tech women's basketball player Uju Ugoka won the same award for ACC women, marking the first time since joining the conference in 2004 that the Hokies have swept both the men's and women's award in the same week.

Low Points for the Opposition

In the win over Furman, the Hokies allowed the Paladins just 54 points, including 17 first half points... Both figures are season-lows for Tech opposition ... The 54 points is the lowest total allowed by Tech since Dec. 10, 2012, when Tech defeated Mississippi Valley State, 70-49, in Cassell Coliseum ... The 17 points allowed in the first half is the lowest point total in a half by a Tech opponent since Tech allowed Eastern Michigan nine first half points on Dec. 22, 2011.

Limited Trips to the Line

The Hokies attempted just three free throws in the win at Miami, making just one ... That was the fewest attempted and made free throws in a game for the Hokies since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season.

Mueller to Sit Out This Season

The NCAA has ruled freshman guard **Malik Mueller** ineligible for the 2013-14 season due to initial eligibility rules ... Mueller is able to practice with the team this season and will be eligible to play four years beginning next season.

Two With Twenty

In the loss to No. 1 Michigan State, **Adam Smith** scored 27 points and **Jarell Eddie** scored 23 points ... It marked the first time that two Hokies each had 20-or-more points in the same game since Jan. 9, 2013, when Erick Green scored 24 points and Eddie had 21 points in a loss to Boston College.

Eddie's Strong Showing Rewarded

Jarell Eddie was named to the All-Tournament team of the Coaches Vs. Cancer Classic ... In two games in Brooklyn, Eddie combined for 42 points, and 12 rebounds and registered his first double-double of the season ... He made a career-high six three-pointers in the loss to No. 1 Michigan State.

Hot Night at the Line

In the loss to No. 1 Michigan State, the Hokies were 14-15 from the free throw line ... The 93.3 percent is Tech's highest free throw percentage in a game in which they have shot at least 10 free throws since Feb. 21, 2010, when the Hokies made 15-16 from the line in a loss at No. 6 Duke ... An interesting side note, the Hokies have made 25 of their last 26 free throw attempts against Big Ten Conference opponents (96.2 percent).

Finally a Two

Will Johnston has earned significant playing time during the last two seasons, primarily because of his three-point shooting ... After hitting two three-pointers in the win over Maryland-Eastern Shore, he has now made 31 field goals and all but two of them have been three-pointers ... Johnston scored a two-point field goal against UMES ... Johnston earned his first career start at Virginia last season ... During the off-season, Johnston was awarded a scholarship for his efforts both on and off the court ... He made a career-high four three-pointers in the win over Furman.

There's a First Time for Everything

Will Johnston made his first collegiate start at Virginia last year ... It marked the first time a walk-on had started for the Hokies since Joey Racer started in the home finale against NC State two seasons ago ... It was the first time that the Hokies have started a walk-on in a non-Senior Day situation since at least the 1999-2000 season ... Johnston also got the start at NC State and again in the win over Florida State and at Miami last season and this season, got the start in the win over Winthrop, playing a career-high 30 minutes and again in the overtime win at Miami.

Rebounding Differential

In the win over VMI, the Hokies outrebounded the Keydets, 52-31 ... The 21-rebound differential is the largest for the Hokies since outrebounding Oklahoma State, 47-24, on Dec. 31, 2011 in a 67-61 Tech win in Stillwater.

Rankin Leaves Team

The last time Tech had reached double figures in blocked shots in a game was Feb. 10, 2010, when the Hokies blocked 12 shots in a win at NC State ... The last time Tech blocked more than 13 shots in a game was on Dec. 9, 2009, when the Hokies tied a school record of 15 blocks in a win over VMI in Cassell Coliseum ... Virginia Tech trailed West Virginia, 29-12, with 8:21 remaining in the first half ... From that point forward, the Hokies outscored their rivals from Morgantown, 75-52, to claim an 87-82 victory ... The 17 points is the largest deficit overcome by the Hokies since Feb. 8, 2009, when Tech came back from an 18-point deficit in an overtime win at NC State ... In the overtime win at Miami, the Hokies came back from a 13-point second-half deficit, the largest deficit overcome in a conference game by Tech since the NC State game.

The State We're In

With the loss to VCU, Virginia Tech is 423-308 (.579) all-time against schools from Virginia ...Tech is 2-1 this season against schools from the Commonwealth and was 1-2 last season against state schools ... The Hokies have played 14 schools from the state ... With the win over Norfolk State on Dec. 11, 2011, the only state Division I school that Tech has not played is Hampton ... Tech holds winning records against 10 of the schools and even records against two others ... Tech will play VMI, Radford, VCU and UVa from the Commonwealth this season.

500-Plus in the Cassell

The Hokies have a 537-168 overall record in Cassell, good for a .762 winning percentage ... Tech is 7-4 in Cassell Coliseum this season and was 10-7 in Cassell last season ... Tech was 11-7 in the 2011-12 season and was 12-4 in Cassell the season before, the 50th year for the arena ... The win over Florida State on Jan. 8, 2011, was the 500th victory in the building ... The win over FSU in 2008 marked the Hokies' 600th game played in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech defeated Rhode Island, 86-63, on Nov. 20, 2002, in its 500th game in the arena ... Tech has had just one break-even home season and one losing season in Cassell Coliseum ... The 17 victories for the Hokies at home in the 2009-10 season set a new Cassell Coliseum and school record ... Including all home games, the Hokies are 836-320 (.723).

Hasn't Happened Often

When **Ben Emelogu** scored 22 points in the win over West Virginia, he became the first Tech freshman to score 20-or-more points in a game since Malcolm Delaney scored 20 points as a freshman in a loss at No. 5 North Carolina on Feb. 16, 2008 ... The last time a Virginia Tech freshman scored more than 22 points in a game was on Jan. 28, 2006, when A.D. Vassallo scored 29 points at Wake Forest ... This is just the 16th time since 1999 that a Hokie freshman has scored 20-or-more points in a game .

Captain Ben

Although he is only a freshman, **Ben Emelogu** has been named a team captian this season for the Hokies ... The guard from Grand Prairie, Texas came to Tech during the summer and established himself with his teammates immediately, earning the honor ... It took a great effort to even play in the Western Carolina game, as Emelogu was suffering from flu-like symptoms and recieved an IV prior to the game ... He scored 16 points in 27 minutes in that victory.

The Floor General

Devin Wilson has made a solid debut at Virginia Tech ... Wilson played 34 minutes and scored four points, had four rebounds and three assists, while committing just three turnovers in the loss to USC Upstate... It marked the first time the Hokies had started a freshman at the point in a season-opener since Nov. 9, 2007, when Hank Thorns got the start against Elon in the first game of the 2007-08 season (That's correct, Malcolm Delaney came off the bench in that, his first collegiate game) ... In the win over West Virginia, Wilson scored 16 points and handed out four assists ... He had 11 points and eight assists in the win over Winthrop, playing a career-high 37 minutes ... Wilson leads the team in assists, steals and minutes played so far this season.

Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today ... Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention ... Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Excuse Them, They're New

In the win over West Virginia, the three leading scorers for the Hokies were all playing in just their second games in a Tech uniform ... Ben Emelogu (22 pts.), Adam Smith (19 pts.) and Devin Wilson (16 pts.) all made their Virginia Tech debuts just three days earlier ... Smith played two seasons ago as a freshman at UNC Wilmington and Emelogu and Wilson are both freshmen.

Staying Close to Home Early

The Hokies played their first four games, and seven of their first nine games, in the friendly confines of Cassell Coliseum ... The games in the Coaches Vs. Cancer Classic in Brooklyn were the first road game of the season ... Tech did not play a true road game until Dec. 8, when it defeated defending champion Miami, 61-60, in overtime in the Coral Gables ... The Hokies did not play a true non-conference "road" game this season.

Big Green Things

Erick Green was the 2013 ACC Player of the Year, in a vote of the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association ... Green received 38 of the 76 votes cast ... Green became the first Virginia Tech player ever to win the award and the first Hokie since Bimbo Coles in 1988 in the Metro Conference to win a conference Player of the Year Award ... Green joins Coles and Dell Curry (Metro, 1986) to earn a conference player of the Year Award ... He was second ACC Player of the Year from a bottom half of the league team (the late Len Bias from Maryland in 1986) ... He was named First Team All-ACC by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association ... Green joined Mason Plumlee of Duke, Shane Larkin of Miami, Joe Harris of Virginia and Richard Howell of NC State on the first team ... He is the third Hokie to earn first team honors in the ACC, joining Zabian Dowdell in 2007 and Malcolm Delaney in 2010 and 2011 ... Green was the first Hokie ever to lead the nation in scoring ... He became just the second ACC player to earn that honor, following South Carolina's Grady Wallace, who led the nation in scoring (31.2 ppg) in the 1956-57 season ... Green is just the second Hokie to lead the ACC in scoring ... Malcolm Delaney averaged 20.2 ppg in the 2010 season.

Tech's longest streak of 10-or-more home victories is 11 consecutive seasons, from 1975-76 through the 1985-86 season ... Tech was 10-7 in Cassell Coliseum last year ... Tech is 7-4 in Cassell Coliseum this season.

Law - Abiding Citizens

Tech's win over West Virginia featured one very interesting stat line ... The Hokies did not record a steal in the game, the first time since Jan. 9, 2013 in a home loss to Boston College that Tech did not record a steal.

Welcoming Back Old Foes

The Hokies welcomed back two traditional rivals to the schedule last season and added another this season ... Tech defeated VMI, 95-80, on Nov. 15 in a rivalry that dates back to 1909 and defeated West Virginia, 87-82,in Blacksburg on Nov. 12 ... Tech and WVU first met in basketball in 1921 and have played 78 times since then ... The teams had last met in the 2003-04 season, the Hokies' last season as a member of the BIG EAST Conference ... This season, the Hokies have added Radford back to the schedule, defeating the Highlanders, 81-56, on Nov. 29 ... Although the two schools have now met only six times since first playing in 1987, the Highlanders are, geographically, the closest Division I school to Virginia Tech, sharing the New River Valley ... The loss to VCU was the first meeting between the two schools since the 1994-95 season.

November Wins

The Hokies were 6-0 in games played in the month of November last year, marking the most wins by a Tech team in November ... The previous high was five wins in both the 2011-12 season and the 2005-06 season ... A disclaimer should be added, noting that the allowable start of the basketball season was moved up beginning with the 2004-05 season ... Prior to that, schedules could not begin before Thanksgiving weekend ... The Hokies had eight games scheduled in November this season and were 5-3 in November games in 2013.

They Were the Champions, My Friends

On the weekend on Oct. 26, 2013, Virginia Tech welcomed the 1973 NIT Champion basketball team back to campus for their 40th reunion ... That team, coached by Don DeVoe, defeated New Mexico, Fairfield, Alabama and Notre Dame in Madison Square Garden to capture the school's first-ever NIT title ... Tech downed the Irish, 92-91 in overtime in the championship game ... Bobby Stevens hits a jumper at the buzzer to claim the win.

Five Doubles is Rare

When Marshall Wood recorded his first career double-double in the overtime loss at NC State last season, he became the fifth Hokie to record a double-double during that season (and the fourth to record his first career double-double last season) ... That was the first season since at least the 1989-90 season that five Hokies have recorded double-doubles in the same season ... Nine games into this season, three Hokies, Trevor Thompson, Jarell Eddie and C.J. Barksdale, have recorded double-doubles for the Hokies.



Former Virginia Tech men's basketball player Bobby Beecher was inducted into the Virginia Tech Sports Hall of Fame on Nov. 5 ... As a senior, Beecher averaged 14.3 points and 7.9 rebounds to finish his Tech career eighth in scoring (1,548 pts.) and sixth in rebounds (797) ... He played in 128 of 129 games as a Hokie, starting 126. Currently, he still ranks third all-time at Tech in blocked shots (170) and stands in the top 10 in career rebounds, field goals made (640) and free-throw percentage (.807). He is 16th all-time in scoring ... Beecher, who was selected in the fourth round of the 1986 NBA Draft by the Sacramento Kings, earned his Tech degree in human services with an emphasis in family and child development ... Beecher was joined in the 2013 Class by MLB pitcher Joe Saunders, softball's Clarisa Crowell, PGA Tour member Johnson Wagner, VT tennis great Jimmy Milley and former NFL player John Engelberger.

Head Coach James Johnson



James Johnson is in his second season as Virginia Tech's head men's basketball coach. Johnson's up-tempo style of offense energized the Hokie fan base in his first season and, with a fresh infusion of talent for the 2013-14 season, Tech will see a more pressure-oriented defense.

During Johnson's first season, senior guard Erick Green became the first Hokie ever to be named the Atlantic Coast Conference Player of the Year and to lead the nation in scoring. Johnson and the Hokies defeated No. 15 Oklahoma State in December in Cassell Coliseum, earning the new coach a victory in his first-ever game against a nationally-ranked team.

Just as important, two Hokies, Jarell Eddie and Christian Beyer were named to the All-ACC Academic team. Johnson has renewed a pledge to better involve the program into the daily life of the Virginia Tech campus and the New River Valley community. In the past year, the program became a part of the Christmas Store, Special Olympics and other activities and charities in the area.

No stranger to the Hokie Nation, Johnson spent the previous five seasons on the men's basketball staff at Virginia Tech. He was an assistant coach from 2007-2011 before being promoted to associate head coach prior to last season. He had accepted an assistant coaches' position at Clemson on April 13 of this year, but returns to Blacksburg to take over the reins of the men's basketball program. Director of Athletics Jim Weaver named Johnson to the position on May 1, 2012.

"I am pleased with Coach Johnson's first year as head coach," Weaver said. "He has surrounded himself with an excellent staff who cares about the players and their development in both the classroom and the basketball court."


Johnson joined the Hokies following two seasons as an assistant at George Mason. While at Mason, he focused on organizing the team's defensive efforts in practice and games. The Patriots were a combined 45-23 in his two seasons and advanced to the 2006 NCAA Final Four. Before GMU, Johnson spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Penn State. He was the recruitment coordinator for the Nittany Lions. Prior to Penn State, Johnson had a one-year stint as an assistant at the College of Charleston and he spent two years as an assistant at Elon.

"Virginia Tech and the Hokie Nation have a special place in my heart and I am blessed and excited for the opportunity to become the head basketball coach," Johnson said at the time of his hiring. "I look forward to working with a great group of young men and moving forward with this program."

Johnson, a native of Powhatan, Va.,

was a four-year player and three-year starter at Ferrum College. A three-time Defensive Player of the Year, he helped guide his team to two conference championships and a berth in the NCAA Division III Tournament. He was also voted his team's Most Valuable Player in 1993. In 2001, Johnson was selected as one of the Top 10 players in Ferrum basketball history. In September of 2009, Johnson was elected into the Ferrum College Athletic Hall of Fame.

After graduating from Ferrum with a bachelor of science in psychology in 1993, he immediately stepped into the coaching ranks at his alma mater and served as an assistant for two seasons. Johnson helped guide the Panthers to a regular-season conference title. In 1995, Johnson moved on to Longwood College as an assistant and then spent one year at Hargrave Military Academy, where he worked with the post-graduate team. In 1997, he began a three-year run as an assistant at Old Dominion. Johnson is a member of the Black Coaches Association (BCA) and the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC). In March 2001, Rivals. com named Johnson one of the Top 20 Assistant Coaches at Mid-Major Division I Schools. He was a squad leader in the Army National Guard from 1989-91.



USC UPSTATE64, VIRGINIA TECH 63

Virginia Tech lost 64-63 to USC Upstate in men's basketball action Saturday afternoon at Cassell Coliseum. This was the season-opener for both teams.

The game was close throughout, with neither team leading by more than six points. Tech took a 15-9 lead on a 3-pointer by freshman **Ben Emelogu** with 13:33 remaining in the first half. The game was tied at 23 with 5:45 remaining before intermission, and the lead flipped back and forth for the rest of the half. The Spartans took a 33-31 lead into the locker room

Upstate opened the second half on a 10-7 run and took a 43-38 lead with 16:40 remaining on a jumper by Ty Greene, but the Hokies were able to reclaim the lead and took a 58-53 lead with 8:51 remaining on a 3-pointer by Will Johnston. Upstate then went ahead 60-58 with 7:04 remaining on a lay-up by Torrey Craig. Following a lay-up by Tech senior Cadarian Raines to tie the game at 62 with 4:09 to play, the Hokies could manage only one free throw by senior Jarell Eddie in the final four minutes.

With USC Upstate leading 64-63 in the final minute, the Hokies were able to get a few chances to take the lead, but all fell short and the Spartans claimed the victory.

Eddie led all scorers with 18 points and led Tech with seven rebounds. Raines, who was held scoreless in the first half, tallied a career-high 17 points and grabbed four rebounds. Redshirt sophomore **Joey van Zegeren** also grabbed seven rebounds in the loss and recorded a career-high five blocked shots. Green led the Spartans with 17 points and Craig added 13 points. Ricardo Glenn had 10 points, and Jodd Maxey grabbed a game-high 10 rebounds.

The Hokies held the Spartans to just 37.5 percent from the floor and just five of 16 from beyond the 3-point arc (31.3 percent). Tech shot 39 percent from the field, including 36.4 percent from beyond the 3-point arc. The rebounds were even at 39. The Hokies made just nine of 18 free-throw attempts, including 5 of 13 in the second half.

Virginia Tech freshman **Ben Emelogu** scored a gamehigh 22 points, and **Adam Smith** made some key plays down the stretch to help the Hokies rally past West Virginia 87-82.

Smith scored 19 points for the Hokies who rallied from a 17-point deficit in the first half. He scored seven of Tech's last nine points in the game – all in the final 1:46.

His basket with 1:46 left in the game gave Tech an 80-77 lead. West Virginia cut the lead to 80-79 on a bucket by Juwan Staten with 44 seconds left.

West Virginia (1-1) had a chance to tie the game, but Nathan Adrian's 3-pointer was short, and Tech freshman **Devin Wilson** got the rebound. Wilson made two free throws with 5 seconds left to seal the game for Virginia Tech.

Emelogu scored 13 of his 22 in the first half, rallying the Hokies from that 17-point deficit. Tech went on a 12-1 run that ended with Emelogu's 3-pointer at the buzzer to cut the lead to 41-36 at halftime. Trevor Thompson recorded his first double-double and **Jarell Eddie** had 17 points, as the Hokies led from start to finish in downing Western Carolina 79-61.

The Hokies (2-1) jumped out to 22-point, first-half lead and had a 20-point halftime lead. Eddie scored 10 of his 17 points in the first half for Tech, which shot 51.6 percent on 16-of-31 shooting in the first 20 minutes.

Barksdale scored on a lay-up with 1:10 left, and after a missed 3-pointer by Peterson, Smith hit a free throw to give the Hokies a 101-92 lead with 56 seconds to go. Trey Chapman then missed a 3-pointer, and Eddie got the rebound. He tossed it ahead to Barksdale, who broke free for a dunk to give the Hokies a 103-92 lead with 39 seconds left and all but seal the game.

Peterson missed a jumper with 33 seconds left and then fouled the Hokies' Will Johnston, who made two free throws with 31 seconds left to account for the final margin.

Rodney Glasgow and Peterson led VMI (3-2) with 22 points each. D.J. Covington added 20 points and five rebounds for the Keydets, who were out-rebounded 52-31 by the Hokies.

The Hokies fell 96-77 in their opening game of the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn. **Jarell Eddle** finished the game with a career-high six threes as part of a 23-point effort, while **Adam Smith** led the team with 27 points.

The Hokies (3-2) got out to a slow start as Michigan State (5-0) took an early 10-5 lead, but Tech controlled the boards early on and it would eventually pay off. The Spartans struggled from beyond the arc early, unable to connect on their first six attempts. Tech took advantage and eventually tied the game at 10 on a Ben Emelogu three. C.J. Barksdale followed it up with a bucket of his own to give the Hokies their first lead of the game nearing the midway point in the half.

Following the under-12 media timeout, the Hokies went on an 8-0 run for their largest lead of the night at 20-14. The game saw six lead changes over the next three minutes of play, but Michigan State began to pull away in the closing minutes of the half. The final five minutes of the first period were dominated by Michigan State's Adreian Payne, who scored 11 of the team's 15 points in that time frame.

Eddie neared yet another 20-point half as he had 17 at the break, including 4 threes, while Payne put up 20 by halftime, as neither team saw another player score more than six points in the first half

Michigan State continued to roll in the second half as it opened with a 13-3 run. The Hokies scored just nine points in the first ten minutes of the second half, but midway through the period Smith came alive for Tech. He scored nine straight points for the Hokies and was the only consistent source of production for the squad in the later part of the game.

Barksdale neared a double-double for the Hokies, finishing with eight points and seven boards, while Smith also grabbed six rebounds and had five assists. Payne, as well as Branden Dawson finished with double-doubles for the Spartans. Payne went for 29 and 10, while Dawson scored 12 points and brought down 10 rebounds.

Senior **Jarell Eddie** earned his first double-double of the season, but the Virginia Tech men's basketball team came up just short against the Seton Hall Pirates, dropping its final game of the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic, 68-67 in the Barclays Center in Brooklyn. Eddie finished the game with 19 points and 10 rebounds, to go along with four assists and a career-high four blocks. The Pirates were led by Fuquan Edwin, who hit a late three to take the lead and made four free throws down the stretch to seal win for his team.

Tech got out to an impressive start, going up 8-0 on the Pirates to begin the game. Adam Smith hit a pair of jumpers from beyond the arc and Eddie added another three to open play. A 7-0 run for Seton Hall made it a two-possession game, but Tech held on to the advantage until a 12-3 Seton Hall run tied things up at 29 with just under six minutes remaining in the first half.

The two teams would trade the lead five times in the closing minutes of the first half, but Seton Hall took the 38-36 lead into the break.

Despite evening the game back up 16 seconds into the new half, it didn't take long for Seton Hall to regain and maintain its first-half lead. Tech kept things close and never let the Pirates make the difference more than five points during the second half.

With under five minutes to play, the Hokies took their first lead since a C.J. Barksdale bucket to start off the second half. Ben Emelogu hit a three to tie it and finished off a fast break started by Eddie with a dunk to put the Hokies up 57-55. Seton Hall tied it up at 57, but Tech wouldn't trail again until a three from Edwin made it 62-61 with 27 seconds on the clock. Tech was forced to foul in the closing seconds of the game and a costly turnover with 12 seconds remaining went on to make it a two-possession game.

Emelogu got it back within two when he hit a three with four seconds left, but Edwin made both free throws on the ensuing foul to make it a four-point difference. The freshman struck again from beyond the arc in the final second but the Hokies remained just short as time ran out.

Virginia Tech's **Jarell Eddie** scored 14 points to lead the hot-shooting Hokies to a 75-54 nonconference win over Furman. Eddie's 14 points – his seventh straight game in double figures – paced five Tech players in double figures. The Hokies also got 13 points from **Marshall Wood**, a career-high 12 points from **Will Johnston** and 11 points from **Adam Smith**. Johnston hit four 3-pointers, while Wood and Smith hit three 3's each, as the Hokies hit 12 3-pointers.

The performance marked the fourth straight game in which the Hokies have made at least 10 3-pointers. Eddie made 6 of 15 from the floor, including two threes, and he also grabbed 10 rebounds for his second straight double-double. It marked the fifth double-double of his career. Furman scored the first basket of the game on a jumper

by Stephen Croone. But the Hokies answered with an 18-1 run to take control of the game and never trailed again. In the second half, Tech built the lead to 22 points following a Wood 3-pointer with 14:30 left that gave the Hokies a 43-21 lead. Furman cut the lead to nine points on two occasions, the final coming on a Croone 3-pointer that sliced the lead to 51-42 with 7:40 remaining.

But the Hokies' Johnston answered with a 3-pointer with 7:11 remaining to start a 15-2 run that pushed the lead back to 66-44, and the Hokies weren't threatened again. Eddie scored seven of the 15 in that run.

Johnston, who played 26 minutes mainly because Ben

Johnston, who played 26 minutes mainly because Ben Emelogu was out (concussion-like symptoms), knocked down 4 of 6 from beyond the arc. Wood, who reached double figures for the first time this season, made 4 of 8 from the floor, including 3 of 5 from beyond the arc.

Virginia Tech also got a career-high 11 assists from freshman point guard Devin Wilson, who became the first Tech freshman to record 11 assists in a game since Dell Curry dished out 11 against Maryland-Eastern Shore on Dec. 4. 1982.

Croone led the Paladins with 27 points. He hit 8 of 14 from the floor and 10 of 11 from the free-throw line. Larry Wideman added 13 points for the Paladins, who only had four players score in the game.

Virginia Tech guard **Adam Smith** scored 28 points to carry the Hokies past New River Valley rival Radford 81-56 in a nonconference game played Friday afternoon. Smith's 28 points were his career high as a Tech player, topping the 27-point outburst against Michigan State. He scored 32 in a game while at UNC Wilmington as a freshman before transferring to Tech before last season. Smith scored 17 of his 28 points in the first half for the Hokies, who used an 18-0 first-half run to break open the game against Radford, whose campus is only 15 miles from Tech's campus. Six different players scored in the run, and **Jarell Eddie**'s three-point play with 13:09 left in the half gave the Hokies a 23-5 lead.

The Hokies led by as many as 22 points in the half. Smith hit 7 of 12 from the floor and both of his free-throw attempts in the first 20 minutes. **C.J. Barksdale** added 10 points for the Hokies.

Radford (4-2), which made just four shots in the first 12:30 of the game, hit just 33.3 percent in the first half (10 of 30), including 1 of 10 from beyond the 3-point arc.

The Highlanders cut the lead to 62-48 on a 3-pointer by R.J. Price with 10:17 left in the game. But the Hokies scored six straight points, the last two coming on a basket by Barksdale with 7:57 remaining that pushed the Hokies' lead to 20. Virginia Tech wasn't threatened again.

Barksdale had 14 points and 10 rebounds for his second career double-double. Eddie added 13 points and 10 rebounds for his third double-double of the season and the sixth of his career.

The Hokies played without freshman guard **Ben Emelogu**, who sat out a second straight game with concussion-like symptoms. Emelogu, whom Johnson said would be re-evaluated on Sunday, is averaging 14 points per game.

Despite playing without **Adam Smith** and **Ben Emelogu** because of injuries, the Virginia Tech Hokies got a career night from **Jarell Eddie** and pulled away from pesky Winthrop to record an 81-63 victory over the Eagles.

Smith missed the game with a calf strain, while Emelogu sat out a third straight game with concussion-like symptoms. With those two out, the Hokies relied on Eddie, and the senior delivered in a big way.

Eddie scored a career-high 34 points, surpassing his previous career high of 28 points, which came at UNC Greensboro last season. He hit 13 of 18 from the floor, including 6 of 8 from beyond the 3-point arc.

Eddie's six 3-pointers were one shy of the school record set by Malcolm Delaney at North Carolina in 2011. His 13 baskets were a career high and his six 3-pointers tied a career high.

Eddle started going off midway through the first half, scoring 17 straight points for the Hokies at one stretch en route to a 20-point first half. He hit 7 of 11 from the floor in the first 20 minutes, including 5 of 7 from beyond the 3-point arc. Tech hit seven 3-pointers and shot 53.6 percent from the floor in bolting to a 42-33 halftime lead.

Winthrop managed to hang around, though, and cut the Tech lead to 55-53 on a basket by Keon Johnson with 7:40 left in the game. But Eddie answered with a basket to push the lead to 57-53 and start a 17-4 run that helped the Hokies pull away.

C.J. Barksdale added 13 points for the Hokies, and Devin Wilson pitched in 11 points and eight assists. The Hokies also got solid minutes from **Joey van Zegeren**, who made his second straight start, and **Cadarian Raines**, with van Zegeren scoring nine points and Raines added eight off the bench. A late run at the end of regulation helped lift the Virginia Tech men's basketball team past the Miami Hurricanes 61-60 in overtime on Sunday afternoon at the BankUnited Center. Senior **Jarell Eddie** led the Hokies with 24 points and eight rebounds, while Garrius Adams paced the Hurricanes with 14 points in each team's conference opener.

Eddie scored Tech's final 11 points as part of a 13-3 run in the last seven and a half minutes of the second half. Tech (7-3, 1-0 ACC) had numerous opportunities in the second half to regain a lead it hadn't seen since midway through the first half, but Miami (5-5, 0-1 ACC) had an answer and would not allow the Hokies to get within a possession.

Late in regulation, Tech freshman Devin Wilson was fouled and had the chance to tie it from the free-throw line, but he missed the front end of a 1-and-1. Miami's Adams was fouled on the rebound and made it a three-point game, going 1-for-2 from the line.

On the ensuing possession, Eddie was guarded tightly in the corner but pulled up anyway and nailed the 3-pointer to tie it up at 56 with 45 seconds on the clock. On Miami's next time down the court, Davon Reed airballed a 3 that sailed out of bounds with 14 seconds to play. Eddie's attempt at a final shot was blocked and things headed to

Adams was the first to strike in extra time for Miami, but Tech sophomore **Marshall Wood** quickly answered with a 3 for the Hokies. With Tech trailing by two and less than 30 seconds to play, Eddie hit a jumper to put the Hokies up 61-59. Adams was fouled on Miami's next possession, but he only made one of his two free throws with seven seconds left. Miami got the rebound, but an errant shot hit the back of the backboard, and the Hokies escaped.

Redshirt sophomore **Joey van Zegeren** had a career-high 10 rebounds by the half and neared a doubledouble by game's end, adding eight points. Freshman Ben Emelogu was the only other Tech player to score in double figures, finishing with 11 points, while Wilson finished the game with five assists.

James Kelly had 12 points and nine rebounds for the Hurricanes, while Reed added 10 points. Neither team shot particularly well in the game, both under 35 percent.

VCU guard Melvin Johnson scored 19 of his career-high 27 points in the first half and sparked a big first-half run, as the Rams downed the Hokies 82-52 in a Governor's Holiday Hoops Classic game played at the Richmond Coliseum.

Jarell Eddie and Ben Emelogu paced the Hokies with 12 points, but Tech shot just 35.4 percent from the floor and turned the ball over a season-high 27 times. VCU scored 42 points off the Hokies' turnovers.

Tech actually led early in this one, scoring the game's first six points. But after C.J. Barksdale's basket with 15:47 remaining that gave the Hokies an 8-6 lead, things fell apart.

The Rams scored 31 straight points to take a 37-8 lead. Johnson hit five of his six first-half 3-pointers in the run, and he capped the run with a 3-pointer that gave the Rams a 19-point bulge with 6:03 left in the half.

VCU's fullcourt pressure defense was just too much for the Hokies, who turned the ball over 15 times in the first 20 minutes and made just 8 of 24 from the floor (33 percent).

The Hokies, who are one of the best 3-point shooting teams in the nation, hit nine against the Rams, with Eddie hitting 4 of 7 from beyond the arc. Marshall Wood hit two, and Tech hit 9 of 20 for the game.

Making matters worse for the Hokies, they lost two players to injuries - Barksdale and guard Adam Smith. Barksdale sprained an ankle, while Smith re-aggravated a calf injury. Barksdale scored two points in seven minutes before leaving, while Smith scored three points in 15 minutes before his departure.

A career day from freshman **Devin Wilson** and a big response from senior **Jarell Eddie** helped lift the Virginia Tech men's basketball team past the University of Maryland-Eastern Shore, 82-66, in Cassell Coliseum Tuesday evening. Wilson scored 16 points for Tech, while Eddie was anything but flat against the Hawks, adding 17 points and nine rebounds.

Eddie rebounded from his performance against UNCG early, scoring Tech's first points of the game and although both teams scored right away, things got out to a slow start in the opening minutes. Following the first media timeout junior **C.J. Barksdale** went on a 5-0 run of his own to help spark the Hokies. Tech turned it into a 12-2 streak to go ahead 19-8 with just under 12 minutes left in the first half.

BOSTON COLLEGE 62, VIRGINIA TECH 59

JAN. 11, 2014 • NOON • BLACKSBURG, VA.

Boston College's Lonnie Jackson hit a 3-pointer in the final 30 seconds, and Virginia Tech missed a shot in the waning moments, all of which sent the Hokies to a 62-59 defeat.

Tech took a 59-58 lead on a 3-pointer by **C.J. Barksdale** with 1:36 remaining. BC's Olivier Hanlan turned the ball over on the Eagles' next possession, but the Hokies couldn't take advantage, as **Jarell Eddie** missed a 3-pointer with 47 seconds left.

BC then called a timeout with 33 seconds to go. After the timeout, Jackson got a good look from the left wing and hit the 3-pointer to give the Eagles a 61-59 edge with 27.4 seconds remaining.

The points marked Jackson's only points of the second half.

Tech got the ball up the court quickly and called a timeout with 22.8 seconds left. The Hokies ran the clock down before getting the ball into the hands of guard **Adam Smith**, who took a jumper from the baseline that came up short with two seconds to go.

BC's Joe Rahon got the rebound, and Smith fouled Rahon with a second remaining. Rahon made the first free throw, but missed the second one. Eddie got the rebound for the Hokies and time expired.

Jackson – who missed BC's first three games this season with a hamstring injury and had scored in double figures just once this season – came into the game averaging just 4.4 points per game. But he led BC with 17 points, hitting 6 of 11 from the floor, including five 3-pointers. Hanlan added 14.

Virginia Tech shot just 28.6 percent in the second half (8 of 28) and 35.1 percent for the game (20 of 57). The Hokies also missed nine free throws.

Smith led the Hokies with 12 points, and Barksdale added 11. Eddlie, Tech's leading scorer at 16.6 points per game, scored 10 for the Hokies, but made just 3 of 14 from the floor.
