Series Against The Hawks

The Hokies are 5-0 all-time against Maryland-Eastern Shore, with all five victories coming in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech won the most recent meeting, 82-66, in Cassell on Dec. 31, 2013 ... The Hokies are 25-0 all-time against schools currently in the MEAC.

New Faces

The Virginia Tech men's basketball team has a number of new faces, both on the court and with the basketball staff ... Junior college transfer **Shane Henry** and freshmen Justin Bibbs, Jalen Hudson, Ahmed Hill and **Satchel Pierce** will be available to play this season, along with redshirt freshman Malik Müller, who sat out last season ... Also new on the team this season are juniors **Seth** Allen and Zach LeDay, who must sit out this season due to transferring from Maryland and South Florida, respectively ... Along with new head coach **Buzz Williams**, new faces on the staff are assistant coaches Isaac Chew, Steve Roccaforte and Jamie McNeilly, along with director of basketball operations Jeff **Reynolds**, director of player personnel **Devin** Johnson and director of student-athlete developent Steve Thomas ... Also new to the Hahn Hurst Center are assistant AD for sports medicine Ernest Eugene, assistant to the head coach Lyle Wolf and administrative assistant Cara Jacobson.

Youthful

With all the new faces on the Virginia Tech roster, the Hokies have 12 players available for the 2014-15 season ... Of those 12 players, only nine began their careers as scholarship players ... Of those nine, there are three juniors (one of

whom is new to the Hokies this season), one sophomore and the rest are freshmen ... Five Virginia Tech players have career starts for the Hokies, led by 31 starts by sophomore **Devin Wilson**.

Monster Strides

Although he wasn't named the ACC's Most Improved Player last season, no one could argue that the Hokies'

Joey van Zegeren made major strides during his sophomore year to become a top-level post player in the league ... JVZ averaged 3.0 pc

soccer team ... Will has seven sisters in all.

a top-level post player in the league ... JVZ averaged 3.0 points and 2.8 rebounds in 14.3 minutes of action in his redshirt freshman season ... Last season, he averaged 6.4 points, 5.0 rebounds in 22.0 minutes of action ... Those numbers rose to 7.8 points and 5.6 rebounds in 25.2 minutes of action in ACC games ... JVZ set a new career-high of 14 points at Maryland in the next-to-last regular-season game and topped that with 21 points in the regular season finale at Georgia Tech ... Oh, and he was also named to the 2014 ACC All-Academic Men's Basketball team.

Devin Wilson Honored

Virginia Tech guard **Devin Wilson** was named to the 2014 ACC All-Freshman team by both the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association (ACSMA) and the ACC coaches' votes ... Wilson started all 31 games for the Hokies and led the Hokies in minutes played, assists and steals ... He set Virginia Tech freshman records for minutes played, assists and free throws attempted.

500-Plus in the Cassell

The Hokies have a 538-174 overall record in Cassell, good for a .756 winning percentage ... Tech was 8-10 in Cassell Coliseum last season ... The win over Florida State on Jan. 8, 2011, was the 500th victory in the building ... Tech defeated Rhode Island, 86-63, on Nov. 20, 2002, in its 500th game in the arena ... Tech has had just one break-even home season and two losing season in Cassell Coliseum ... The 17 victories for the Hokies at home in the 2009-10 season set a new Cassell Coliseum and school record.

Müller Returns

The NCAA ruled freshman guard **Malik Müller** ineligible for the 2013-14 season due to initial eligibility rules ... Müller was able to practice with the team last season ... He is now eligible to play four years and is listed as a redshirt freshman.

More on Müller

Malik Müller will play his first game for the Hokies tonight after redshirting last season, but the freshman guard was busy playing over the summer ... He had five games in double figures for his native Germany in FIBA U20 Championships in Crete this summer.

More on Will

Will Johnston joined the Hokies as a walk-on as a freshman in the 2011-12 season, seeing action in four games ... Prior to his junior season, Johnston was awarded a scholarship and remains on scholarship this season ... An outstanding student as well, Johnston was named to the 2014 All-ACC Men's Basketball Academic team.

Smart Group

Three current Hokies have earned All-ACC Academic team honors while at Virginia Tech ... Joey van Zegeren and Will Johnston were named to the team last season and Christian Beyer was named to the team in 2013

... Last year, Beyer won the Skelton Award, given annually to the top male studentathlete at Virginia Tech.

Finally a Two

After hitting a three-pointer against Miami in last season's ACC Tournament, **Will Johnston** has made 48 field goals and all but three of them have been three-pointers ... During last off-season, Johnston was awarded a scholarship for his efforts both on and off the court ... He made a career-high four three-pointers in the win over Furman, a feat he matched at FSU last season.

The Multi-Lingual Big Man

Communicating with **Joey van Zegeren** is easy for most students at Virginia Tech, regardless of nationality ... The redshirt junior from The Netherlands is fluent in five languages and has understanding of several others ... If you see him around campus, make sure to say "Hello", or "Hola", or "Hallo", or "Bonjour", or, well, you get the idea.

Schedule Odds & Ends

The Hokies play seven games against teams in the top 25 of last year's NCAA RPI ... Tech plays 10 games against top 50 teams and 13 against top 100 teams ... Tech plays nine games against teams in the 2014 NCAA Tournament, four games against NIT teams ... Four of the Hokies' nine ACC home games are against 2014 NCAA Tournament teams ... The Virginia Tech – VMI game will be the 132nd all-time meeting in the series, the second most-played rivalry and most-played non-conference rivalry for the Hokies ... Tech will play Radford for the eighth time; Radford is 12.9 miles from the Virginia Tech campus ... Tech will play five games against schools from the Commonwealth of Virginia, four in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech will play The Citadel for the first time since Feb. 16, 1966 ... This will be the 19th meeting between the two schools. Author Pat Conroy was on that Citadel team ... Of the nine home non-conference games, three are against teams from Virginia, two against teams from Maryland, two against teams from South Carolina.

350 and Counting

The Hokies have hit at least one three-pointer in every game since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... Tech has now hit a three in 365 consecutive games, the most in school history ... Since the three-point arc was added to college basketball for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one three in all but three games ... The last time that the Hokies did not record a three-point field goal in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003.

Devin Sets a Standard

Devin Wilson finished his freshman season with 148 assists for the season, the fifth-best single season tally by any Hokie, regardless of class ... That total set a new school record for assists in a single season by a freshman ... It eclipsed the old mark of 113, set by Hank Thorns in the 2007-08 season ... He ended the ACC season with 80 assists, a new school record for the Hokies ... The old mark was 78 assists in ACC play by Malcolm Delaney in the 2009-10 season.

Another Freshman Mark for Devin

Devin Wilson led all ACC freshmen in free throw attempts last season ... Wilson averaged 6.0 free throw attempts per game last season, fifth-best among all ACC players ... He shot more free throws (185) than the next two Hokies on the list combined (167)... Wilson shot 185 for the season, establishing a new Virginia Tech freshman record, besting the old mark of 164 free throws attempted by Dale Solomon in the 1978-79 season.

Dishing It Out

In the win over Furman last season, **Devin Wilson** recorded 11 assists ... The last Hokie freshman to record 11 assists in a single game was Dell Curry, who had 11 assists as a freshman against Maryland-Eastern Shore on Dec. 4, 1982 ... The 11 assists is also one assist shy of the Tech overall school record of 12, set by Dave Sensibaugh, Bimbo Coles and, most recently, Troy Manns in 1997 ... In the home win over Miami, Wilson had nine assists, his personal high in assists in an ACC game and ties the school's record for assists in an ACC game ... He matched that total of assists with nine in the NC State game.

And Yet Another Mark by Devin

Devin Wilson averaged 34.9 minutes played per game last season, highest on the team ... That is the most minutes averaged for a Tech freshman since entering the Big East Conference in 2000-01 season ... He set a new Virginia Tech record for minutes played by a freshman, with 1,081 minutes played this season, breaking the old mark of 1,024 minutes by Dell Curry in the 1982-83 season ... He played 46 minutes in the double overtime loss at Pittsburgh last season ... That 46 minutes played set a new school record for minutes played in an ACC game, a mark he shares with Jarell Eddie.

Seeing More Time


Entering last season, **Will Johnston** averaged 9.9 minutes played per game for his career ... Last season, Johnston averaged 19.9 minutes played per game overall and 22.8 mppg in ACC play a year ago ... Johnston played a then-career-high 34 minutes against Wake Forest and 31 minutes at Virginia, starting both games ... He returned to the starting line-up against NC State and played 33 minutes ... In the loss at Maryland in the final week of the regular season, Johnston set a new career-high with 38 minutes played.

All-Time Record

Virginia Tech is now 1366-1148 all-time in collegiate basketball, good for a .543 winning percentage ... Last season's game against Clemson marked the 2,500th game in school history ... This is the Hokies' 106th season of men's basketball.

There's a First Time for Everything

Will Johnston made his first collegiate start at Virginia in the 2012-13 season ... It marked the first time a walk-on had started for the Hokies since Joey Racer started in the home finale against NC State two seasons ago ... It was the first time that the Hokies have started a walk-on in a non-Senior Day situation since at least the 1999-2000 season ... In the loss at Notre Dame last season, walk-on Christian Beyer made his first collegiate start.

What is a Hokie?

That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics ... The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute ... With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body ... Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today ... Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention ... Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Our Name, Please

When referring to Virginia Tech, we ask that you please leave it at that - Virginia Tech ... Virginia Tech University is not now and never has been a name for the school ... The official name of the university is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University ... "Vah Tech", VPI, VPI&SU, VPI and SU and Va. Tech are also not recognized names and should not be used ... VT is acceptable as a shortended, agate form ... When referring to the school by its nickname, please use "Hokies" ... Your help in these matters is appreciated.

Head Coach Buzz Williams



Buzz Williams begins his first season as the head men's basketball coach at Virginia Tech. Williams comes to the Hokies following six seasons as the head coach of the Marquette Golden Eagles. At Marquette, Williams had a record of 139-69 and led the team to five NCAA appearances, including a trip to the regional finals in the 2012-13 season, the same season the team won the Big East Conference regular season title. Williams led the Golden Eagles to a 69-39 Big East Conference record during his time in Milwaukee. Six Marquette players have made it to the NBA during Williams' tenure.

"I am extremely excited about welcoming Buzz Williams to the Hokie Nation," Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock said at the time of Williams' hiring in March. "Buzz is a proven winner who has earned his way up through the ranks with a strong track record of success. I am confident he will energize our fan base and help make Virginia Tech basketball competitive in the Atlantic Coast Conference. I know he will recruit at the highest level."

"It's never easy to leave a great school like Marquette, where I spent seven wonderful years, six as the head coach," Williams said. "But this is a special situation to work at a place like Virginia Tech. I've heard tremendous things about this terrific institution and this is an outstanding

opportunity to build a program. My family and I look forward to becoming a part of this great university and community, and taking on the challenges associated with succeeding in the ACC."

Williams was an assistant at Marquette in the 2007-08 season. MU concluded the year 25-10 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2003.

His coaching career has included stints as an assistant, associate head and head coach. He has been at the NCAA Division I level for 19 seasons, and 2013-14 was his seventh campaign as a head coach. Williams has recruited and coached over 20 players who have earned all-conference accolades, including two league players of the year, two conference freshmen of the year and four Associated Press All-Americans.

Williams arrived in Milwaukee after serving for one season as the head coach at the University of New Orleans. He guided the Privateers to a 14-win campaign in 2006-07 and his roster featured Bo McCalebb, the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year. UNO claimed fourth place in the Sun Belt's Western Division and advanced to the league tournament quarterfinals. The squad claimed as many victories on the road that season as it had in the previous three seasons combined. His recruiting class for the 2007-08 season was ranked in the top-50 nationally by HoopScoopOnline.com.

Prior to UNO, Williams served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator

at Texas A&M for two seasons (2004-05 and 2005-06) under head coach Billy Gillispie. Both of his recruiting classes with the Aggies were ranked among the best in the nation and featured some of the top-ranked talent at the prep level. The squad made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 25 years in 2005-06 and the previous team posted the top turnaround in the nation, improving its win total in 2004-05 by 14 games compared to 2003-04.

Williams spent four seasons (2000-01 through 2003-04) at Colorado State, serving as an assistant the first three seasons before being promoted to associate head coach in 2003-04. Two of his recruiting classes were ranked among the 40-best in the nation, including the 2003 group, which was tabbed No. 1 in the Mountain West Conference. Colorado State made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 13 years during his tenure and he was named one of the top assistants in the country by HoopScoopOnline.com.

The Van Alstyne, Texas, native was previously an assistant at Northwestern State (1999-2000), Texas A&M- Kingsville (1998-99) and Texas-Arlington (1994-98). He earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Oklahoma City University in 1994 before completing his master's work in the same field at Texas A&M-Kingsville in 1999.

Williams is married to the former Corey Norman and the couple has two daughters, Zera and Addyson, and two sons, Calvin and Mason.
