### **About Tonight's Game**

The Hokies enter tonight's game 8-8 overall and 0-3 in ACC action ... North Carolina is 13-4 overall and 3-1 in conference play ... North Carolina is ranked 15th in the AP poll and 16th in the coaches poll.

### Last Time Out: Louisville 78, VT 63

The Hokies lost at No. 6/7 Louisville, 78-63, on Tuesday night in the KFC Yum! Center ... Adam Smith continued his hot shooting from the field, scoring 19 points for Tech and made 5-of-7 from three-point range ... Justin Bibbs added 15 points and Ahmed Hill scored 14 points in the loss ... Tech committed just eight turnovers in the loss.

### Series Against the Tar Heels

This will be the 78th meeting between the two schools, in a series that began in 1912 ... The Hokies are 13-64 all-time against the Tar Heels ... Tech has lost the last four meetings in the series, most recently, a 60-56 loss in Cassell Coliseum last season ... Tech is 5-29 against UNC in road games and 6-44 in conference games, coming in both the ACC and Southern Conferences ... This is the only meeting between the two schools this season ... Along with Blacksburg and Chapel Hill, this series has been played in Atlanta, Columbia, S.C., Roanoke, Charlotte, Greensboro, Raleigh, Durham and Winston-Salem.

### **Duke Game Sold Out**

The Hokies home game against Duke on Feb. 25 is now officially a sellout ... It marks Tech first sellout since the final home game of the 2011-12 season ... Next Sunday's rivalry game against Virginia is quickly approaching sellout status, with less than 100 tickets remaining.

### **Young Minutes**

Virginia Tech freshmen are playing 51.4 percent of the minutes so far this season ... That is the highest percentage of minutes for freshmen by any team in the conference ... Second among ACC schools is Duke, at 45.9 percent ... The Hokies' percentage increases to 53.8 percent in ACC games.

#### **Hokies vs. Ranked Teams**

The Hokies are 13-51 against nationally-ranked teams since joining the ACC for the 2004-05 season ... Tech is 30-159 all-time against teams ranked in the AP poll ... Tech is 0-2 against ranked teams this season ... The last time the Hokies defeated a nationally-ranked team was Dec. 1, 2012, when Tech defeated No. 15 Oklahoma State, 81-71, in Cassell Coliseum ... These numbers are only for teams ranked in the AP poll.

### Hokies vs. No. 15 Ranked Teams

The Hokies are 3-5 all-time against teams ranked No. 15 nationally ... Tech has won its last two games against teams ranked No. 15, most recently an 81-71 win over No. 15 Oklahoma State in Cassell Coliseum on Dec. 1, 2012 ... Tech is 1-1 in ACC games against No. 15 and 2-4 against No. 15 teams currently in the ACC ... These numbers are only for teams ranked in the AP poll.

# **Give to Us, Not to Them Devin Wilson** has begun ACC action this season

taking great care of the ball ... After thee games, Wilson has 20 assists and just two turnover in 102 minutes of action ... He leads the ACC in assist/turnover ratio in conference games only.

### **Bibbs Continues Strong Start**

**Justin Bibbs** scored 22 points in the loss to Syracuse, tying his then-career-high, set earlier this season against Miami University ... He followed that with a new career-high 25 points in the loss at Florida State ... Following his 15-point game in the loss at No. 6/7 Louisville, Bibbs now has 12 games in doublefigures so far this season and four games of 20-or-more points ... That marks the first time that a Virginia Tech freshman has achieved that feat since Dell Curry recorded five games of 20-or-more points in his freshman season of 1983-84 ... His 12th game in double figures came on Jan. 13; last season, **Devin Wilson** was the only Tech freshman to record double figures in at least 12 games (it was 13 games for Wilson) and his 12th game came on Feb.

### **Even More Bibbs**

Justin Bibbs grabbed a career-high 11 rebounds in the loss to Syracuse to go along with his 22 points and recorded his first career double-double ... He also played a career-high 39 minutes in the game ... His double-double was the

first by a Tech freshman this season and the first by a Tech freshman since Jan. 22, 2014, when Trevor Thompson had 10 points and 12 rebounds in a loss to Wake Forest.

### **Guess What? More Bibbs**

**Justin Bibbs** scored 203 points in his first 15 games of the 2014-15 season ... He becomes the first Hokies freshman to reach 200-or-more points in his first 15 games since at least 2000-01 season, the year the Hokies joined the Big East Conference ... The previous high for a Tech freshman in that span was Zabian Dowdell, who scored 195 points in his first 15 games in the 2003-04 season.

### **Taking Better Care**

At the end of non-conference play on Dec. 30, the Hokies were averaging 13.8 turnovers per game ... Three games into the ACC schedule, Tech is averaging just 8.3 turnovers per game ... Tech is averaging just 7.0 turnovers per ACC road game.

### Smith from 3

Adam Smith was limited to just five ACC games last season, due to a leg injury ... In those five games, Smith was 7-for-28 from three-point range (25.0 percent) ... This season, in the first three ACC games, Smith is 11-for-25 from beyond

the arc (44.0 percent) ... Smith has made five three-pointers in each of his last two games, both on the road ... He made six three-point field goals in the win over Morgan State, a new career-high ... The six threes is one off the school record of seven threes in one game, by three players, most recently Malcolm Delaney vs. UNLV on Nov. 28, 2010 ... Smith's previous career high was five threes, which he accomplished in the previous game, a win over Miami University in Mexico.

#### **Production Off the Bench**

So far this season, the Hokies have scored 1104 total points ... Of that number, 646 points have come from the starting five of each game and the remaining 458 points come from the reserves ... Tech's bench accounts for 41.5 percent of its scoring in games so far this season.

#### It is Better to Give

At West Virginia, **Devin Wilson** handed out his 200th career assist as a Hokie, in just his 44th game ... With his five assists in the loss at No. 6/7 Louisville, Wilson now has an average of 4.7 assists per game, higher than Malcolm Delaney, Jamon Gordon, Al Young or Dell Curry, second through fifth on the Virginia Tech all-time assists list ... All-time leader Bimbo Coles averaged 4.8 assists per game.

#### **Youthful Points**

The Hokies' five freshmen are averaging 35.4 points per game and the 557 points accounts for 50.5 percent of the team's scoring ... The group has made 37 of the 80 available starts for the team and has 21 games of double-figure scoring, including four games of 20-or-more points ... All five Hokie freshmen have scored in double figures in a game so far this season ... That marks the most freshmen to score in double figures in a game in a single season since the 2007-08 season, when Malcolm Delaney, Jeff Allen, Hank Thorns, Dorenzo Hudson and J.T. Thompson all had single games in double figures ... In all, nine different Hokies recorded games in double figures during nonconference play this season.

#### **Coming Up Big**

In the loss at No. 17/15 West Virginia, freshman post **Satchel Pierce** set new career highs with 10 points and five rebounds ... He made his points on five of seven from the field in the contest ... He became



the contest ... He became Satchel Pierce the fifth Hokie freshman to score in double

figures this season.

In the win over VMI, **Shane Henry** grabbed a career and team seasonhigh 13 rebounds ... That is the most rebounds by a Virginia Tech player since Feb. 16, 2013, when Marshall Wood grabbed 16 rebounds in an overtime game at NC State.

#### **Bibbs is Honored**

Freshman guard **Justin Bibbs** was named the ACC Rookie of the Week, for the week ending Dec. 28, 2014 ... Bibbs scored 20 points to lead the Hokies to the win over VMI and 13 points to go along with six rebounds and four assists in the win over Presbyterian.

### van Zegeren Suspended

Virginia Tech announced that forward Joey van Zegeren has been suspended indefinitely.

"Joey failed to meet the expectations we have for our team," Head Men's Basketball Coach Buzz Williams said. "He demonstrated a lack of discipline and self-control at practice and as such this suspension was warranted."

#### Finally a Two

After hitting two threepointers in the loss at Florida State, Will Johnston has made 62 field goals and all but five of them have been three-pointers ... He made a career-high four three-pointers in the win over Furman, a feat he



matched at FSU last season ... In the win over Morgan State, Johnston turned his lone twopointer into a three-point play, hitting the free throw after being fouled.

#### From 3!

Virginia Tech made eight three-point field goals in the first half of the win over Morgan State, the most three-pointers in a half this season ... Tech made 12 threes in the game, the most since Dec. 8, 2013, when Tech made 12 threes in the win at Miami ... The last time Tech made more than 12 threes in a game was Nov. 22, 2013, when the Hokies made 13 threes in the loss to No. 1 Michigan State.

### Combining the Two

When **Devin Wilson** recorded his first career double-double with 10 points and 11 assists in the win over Morgan State, it was the first time a Tech player had a non-points/ rebounds double-double since Erick Green had 23 points and 10 assists in the loss at West Virginia on Dec. 8, 2012.

#### Little, Big Boards

In the win over Presbyterian, Adam Smith led the Hokies in rebounding, with seven boards ... The last time a Hokie, under 6-2, grabbed at least seven rebounds in a game was Hank Thorns, who had seven rebounds in a home win over Gardner-Webb on Nov. 14. 2008.

### 381 and Counting

The Hokies have hit at least one threepointer in every game since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... Tech has now hit a three in 381 consecutive games, the most in school history ... Since the three-point arc was added to college basketball for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one three in all but three games ... The last time that the Hokies did not record a three-point field goal in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003.

### All-Time Record

Virginia Tech is now 1373-1157 all-time in collegiate basketball, good for a .543 winning percentage ... Last season's game against Clemson marked the 2,500th game in school history ... This is the Hokies' 106th season of men's basketball.

### A Young Three

In Tech's win over UMES. freshmen Malik Müller, Justin Bibbs and Ahmed Hill all scored in doublefigures ... That marked the first time since Nov. 18, 2000 that three freshmen making their collegiate debuts for the Hokies all scored in double figures ... That night, a 92-68 win over VMI, Carlos Dixon (21 points), Chris Exilus (20 points) and Bryant Matthews (17 points) pulled off the same feat ... In the win over Presbyterian, three freshmen, Hill, Bibbs and Jalen Hudson scored in double-figures.

Three current Hokies have earned All-ACC Academic team honors while at Virginia Tech ... Joey van Zegeren and Will Johnston were named to the team last season and Christian **Beyer** was named to the team in 2013 ... Last year, Beyer won the Skelton Award, given annually to the top male student-athlete at Virginia Tech.

### Cleaning the Glass

In the win over VMI, the Hokies grabbed a season-high 44 rebounds ... That is the most rebounds in a game since Tech grabbed 44 rebounds in a game was Dec. 21, 2013, when Tech had 44 rebounds at VCU ... The last time the Hokies had 44-or-more-rebounds in a win was on Dec. 10, 2012, when Tech grabbed 51 rebounds in a home win over Mississippi Valley State ... Tech had 43 rebounds earlier this season against Morgan State.

### **Big Boards**

In the loss at Penn State, Ahmed Hill grabbed a career-best nine rebounds ... It marks the most rebounds by a Virginia Tech player under 6-6 since Malcolm Delaney had nine rebounds in a home win over No. 23/25 Wake Forest on Feb. 16, 2010 ... The last time a Hokie under 6-6 had double-figures in rebounding was on March 10, 2007, when Jamon Gordon had 11 rebounds in a loss to NC State in the 2007 ACC Tournament in Tampa.

### **Dishing It Out**

In the win over Morgan State, **Devin** Wilson recorded 11 assists, matching his career high posted in last year's win over Furman ... The 11 assists is also one assist shy of the Tech overall school record of 12, set by Dave Sensibaugh, Bimbo Coles and, most recently, Troy Manns in 1997 ... In the home win over Miami last season, Wilson had nine assists, his personal high in assists in an ACC game and ties the school's record for assists in an ACC game ... He matched that total of assists with nine in the NC State game.

### Hot, Hot, Hot from the Field

The Hokies shot 61.0 percent from the field in the win over Liberty ... The last time the Hokies shot better than 61 percent from the field in a game was on Nov. 14, 2011, when Tech shot 62.5 percent from the floor in a win over Monmouth ... Tech shot 73.7 percent from the field in the second half vs. Liberty.

### It Runs in the Family

Virginia Tech senior **Will Johnston** is not the only student-athlete in his family ... Older sister, Paige, ran track at Arkansas ... Younger sister, Marie, runs track at Virginia Tech this season after transferring from Wake Forest ... Youngest sister, Kari, was a freshman on Virginia Tech's nationally-ranked women's soccer team ... Will has seven sisters in all.

### **Family Ties**

Tonight, a pair of brothers will be on opposite benches ... Tech senior Christian Beyer's stepbrother, Sasha Seymore, is a senior walk-on of the UNC team this season ... This is Beyer's third season on the Tech roster, while this is Seymore's first year on the Carolina squad ... Both excel in the classroom, as well, as Beyer won the 2014 Skelton Award, given annually by Virginia Tech to the top academic male and female studentathletes and Seymore attends Carolina on a Morehead-Cain Scholarship, the most prestigious academic scholarship awarded at UNC and is the senior class president at UNC ... Seymore tore his ACL against UAB and will miss the remainder of

### 500-Plus in the Cassell

The Hokies have a 545-177 overall record in Cassell Coliseum, good for a .755 winning percentage ... The win over Florida State on Jan. 8, 2011, was the 500th victory in the building ... Tech defeated Rhode Island, 86-63, on Nov. 20, 2002, in its 500th game in the arena ... Tech has had just one break-even home season and two losing season in Cassell Coliseum ... ### There's a First Time for Everything

Will Johnston made his first collegiate start at Virginia in the 2012-13 season ... It marked the first time a walk-on had started for the Hokies since Joey Racer started in the home finale against NC State two seasons ago and the first time that the Hokies have started a walk-on in a non-Senior Day situation since at least 1999 ... ### Head Coach Buzz Williams



Buzz Williams begins his first season as the head men's basketball coach at Virginia Tech. Williams comes to the Hokies following six seasons as the head coach of the Marquette Golden Eagles. At Marquette, Williams had a record of 139-69 and led the team to five NCAA appearances, including a trip to the regional finals in the 2012-13 season, the same season the team won the Big East Conference regular season title. Williams led the Golden Eagles to a 69-39 Big East Conference record during his time in Milwaukee. Six Marquette players have made it to the NBA during Williams' tenure.

"I am extremely excited about welcoming Buzz Williams to the Hokie Nation," Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock said at the time of Williams' hiring in March. "Buzz is a proven winner who has earned his way up through the ranks with a strong track record of success. I am confident he will energize our fan base and help make Virginia Tech basketball competitive in the Atlantic Coast Conference. I know he will recruit at the highest level."

"It's never easy to leave a great school like Marquette, where I spent seven wonderful years, six as the head coach," Williams said. "But this is a special situation to work at a place like Virginia Tech. I've heard tremendous things about this terrific institution and this is an outstanding opportunity to build a

program. My family and I look forward to becoming a part of this great university and community, and taking on the challenges associated with succeeding in the ACC."

Williams was an assistant at Marquette in the 2007-08 season. MU concluded the year 25-10 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2003.

His coaching career has included stints as an assistant, associate head and head coach. He has been at the NCAA Division I level for 19 seasons, and 2013-14 was his seventh campaign as a head coach. Williams has recruited and coached over 20 players who have earned all-conference accolades, including two league players of the year, two conference freshmen of the year and four Associated Press All-Americans.

Williams arrived in Milwaukee after serving for one season as the head coach at the University of New Orleans. He guided the Privateers to a 14-win campaign in 2006-07 and his roster featured Bo McCalebb, the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year. UNO claimed fourth place in the Sun Belt's Western Division and advanced to the league tournament quarterfinals. The squad claimed as many victories on the road that season as it had in the previous three seasons combined. His recruiting class for the 2007-08 season was ranked in the top-50 nationally by HoopScoopOnline.com.

Prior to UNO, Williams served as an assistant coach and recruiting

coordinator at Texas A&M for two seasons (2004-05 and 2005-06) under head coach Billy Gillispie. Both of his recruiting classes with the Aggies were ranked among the best in the nation and featured some of the top-ranked talent at the prep level. The squad made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 25 years in 2005-06 and the previous team posted the top turnaround in the nation, improving its win total in 2004-05 by 14 games compared to 2003-04.

Williams spent four seasons (2000-01 through 2003-04) at Colorado State, serving as an assistant the first three seasons before being promoted to associate head coach in 2003-04. Two of his recruiting classes were ranked among the 40-best in the nation, including the 2003 group, which was tabbed No. 1 in the Mountain West Conference. Colorado State made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 13 years during his tenure and he was named one of the top assistants in the country by HoopScoopOnline.com.

The Van Alstyne, Texas, native was previously an assistant at Northwestern State (1999-2000), Texas A&M- Kingsville (1998-99) and Texas-Arlington (1994-98). He earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Oklahoma City University in 1994 before completing his master's work in the same field at Texas A&M-Kingsville in 1999.

Williams is married to the former Corey Norman and the couple has two daughters, Zera and Addyson, and two sons, Calvin and Mason.
