About Today's Game

The Hokies enter today's game 8-10 overall and 0-5 in ACC action ... Virginia is 18-0 overall and 6-0 in conference play ... Virginia is ranked second in the AP poll and second in the coaches poll ... This is the first of two meetings between the two schools this season.

Last Time Out: 8/9 UND 85, VT 60

The Hokies fell to No. 8/9 Notre Dame, 85-60, in Cassell Coliseum on Thursday night ... **Ahmed Hill** led the Hokies with 13 points, **Jalen Hudson** added 12 points and **Devin Wilson** had 11 points for Tech ... The Hokies played the game without leading scorer **Justin Bibbs**, who missed his second consecutive game after suffering a concussion during practice last week.

Series Against the Cavaliers

This will be the 140th meeting between the two schools, in a series that began in 1915 and the two schools have met at least once every year since 1961... The Hokies are 53-86 all-time against the Cavaliers ... Tech has lost the last five meetings in the series, including both games last season ... Tech is 27-20 against Virginia in home games and 14-6 in games played in Cassell Coliseum in the series.

van Zegeren Leaves Team

Virginia Tech announced that forward **Joey van Zegeren** has left the Hokies' men's basketball team ... van Zegeren, who is scheduled to graduate in May, will remain on scholarship until graduation ... He had been suspended indefinitely on Jan. 3.

Sell Outs

The Hokies' home games against Virginia this afternoon and Duke on Feb. 25 are now officially sellouts ... These games mark Tech's first sellouts since the final home game of the 2011-12 season ... On Thursday night, the Hokies hosted No. 8/9 Notre Dame in front of a crowd of 7,451 ... That is the largest home attendance since Feb. 21, 2013, when 7,585 watched the Hokies and No. 6 Duke.

More About Tech - UVA

This is a renewal of the most-played rivalry for the Hokies ... The teams have played eight overtime games, including four since the Hokies joined the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... Along with Blacksburg and Charlottesville, the two teams have met in Roanoke, Richmond, Hampton, Salem, Lynchburg and Greensboro, N.C.

Bibbs Misses UNC, Notre Dame Games

Virginia Tech guard **Justin Bibbs** missed the North Carolina game on Sunday and the Notre Dame game on Thursday due to a concussion suffered in practice at the end of last week ... He is being re-evaluated daily and his status for the Virginia game is to be determined.

Leaving It All on the Court

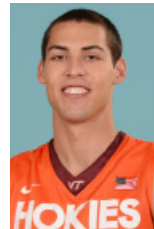
In the loss at No. 15/16 North Carolina, **Will Johnston** left it all on the court, literally ... After getting inadvertently hit in the nose on a rebound, the game had to be stopped multiple times to clean his blood ... Later in the first half, while diving for a loose ball near mid-court, Johnston opened a laceration on his left elbow, once again leading to numerous stoppages of play ... And to top it all off, later in the game, play had to be stopped so he could replace his shoe, which had come off during a loose ball.

Just Rewards

As the Hokies began classes for the spring semester, head coach **Buzz Williams** has announced that **Christian Beyer** has been awarded a scholarship for the semester, his final at Virginia Tech ... Beyer, a three-year member of the men's basketball team, has made three career starts for the Hokies (including last year at Notre Dame) and last spring, was named the recipient of the Skelton Award, given annually to the top academic male and female junior student-athlete at Virginia Tech ... In the Notre Dame game, Beyer came off the bench and made his first three-pointer of the season and seven points, three rebounds and a steal in just seven minutes of action, all coming in the second half.

Give to Us, Not to Them

Devin Wilson has begun ACC action this season taking great care of the ball ... After five games, Wilson has 24 assists and just eight turnovers in 164 minutes of action ... He leads the ACC in assist/turnover ratio in conference games only.

Home Sweet Home

The Hokies returned to Cassell Coliseum on Thursday night for a game against Notre Dame for the first time since Jan. 3 ... That ended a three-game road swing for the Hokies, the first of two such stretches this season ... Tech is one of four ACC teams with a stretch of three-consecutive road games, but the only ACC team with two such stretches.

Gimme That!

The Hokies recorded a season-high 13 steals at No. 15/16 North Carolina ... The last time the Hokies had 13-or-more steals in a game was March 5, 2011, when Tech had 14 steals at Clemson ... This is one of only nine times since joining the ACC that Tech has recorded 13-or-more steals in an ACC regular season game.

A Tough Stretch

The Hokies returned home to face No. 8/9 Notre Dame on Thursday night and No. 2/2 Virginia today ... Those games, along with the games at No. 6/7 Louisville and No. 15/16 North Carolina become the first time in school history that the Hokies have faced four-consecutive top-15 teams ... In addition to these four games, Tech has also played West Virginia, which was ranked No. 17/15 when the two teams met on Dec. 30 ... Also, the Hokies have faced current No. 20/19 Northern Iowa in Cancun, but the Panthers were not ranked at that time ... The last time an ACC school had such a stretch was North Carolina in the 2009 NCAA Tournament.

A Step Further

With No. 8/9 Notre Dame and No. 2/2 Virginia coming to Cassell Coliseum this week, it marks the first time that the Hokies have played consecutive games against top-10 teams since Feb. 28 and March 4, 2009, when Tech hosted No. 7 Duke and No. 2 North Carolina ... It is only the second time in school history this has happened.

Young Minutes

Virginia Tech freshmen are playing 51.0 percent of the minutes so far this season ... That is the highest percentage of minutes for freshmen by any team in the conference ... Second among ACC schools is Duke, at 46.3 percent ... The Hokies' percentage increases to 51.5 percent in ACC games.

Bibbs Continues Strong Start

Justin Bibbs scored 22 points against Syracuse, tying his then-career-high ... He followed that with a new career-high 25 points in the loss at Florida State ... Following his 15-point game at No. 6/7 Louisville, Bibbs now has 12 games in double-figures and four games of 20-or-more points ... That marks the first time that a Virginia Tech freshman has achieved that feat since Dell Curry recorded five games of 20-or-more points in his freshman season of 1983-84 ... His 12th game in double figures came on Jan. 13; last season, **Devin Wilson** was the only Tech freshman to record double figures in at least 12 games (it was 13 games for Wilson) and his 12th game came on Feb. 22.

Hokies vs. Ranked Teams

The Hokies are 13-53 against nationally-ranked teams since joining the ACC for the 2004-05 season ... Tech is 30-161 all-time against teams ranked in the AP poll ... Tech is 0-4 against ranked teams this season ... The last time the Hokies defeated a nationally-ranked team was Dec. 1, 2012, when Tech defeated No. 15 Oklahoma State, 81-71, in Cassell Coliseum ... These numbers are only for teams ranked in the AP poll.

Even More Bibbs

Justin Bibbs grabbed a career-high 11 rebounds in the loss to Syracuse to go along with his 22 points and recorded his first career double-double ... He also played a career-high 39 minutes in the game ... His double-double was the first by a Tech freshman this season and the first by a Tech freshman since Jan. 22, 2014, when Trevor Thompson had 10 points and 12 rebounds in a loss to Wake Forest.

Guess What? More Bibbs

Justin Bibbs scored 203 points in his first 15 games of the 2014-15 season ... He becomes the first Hokies freshman to reach 200-or-more points in his first 15 games since at least 2000-01 season, the year the Hokies joined the Big East Conference ... The previous high for a Tech freshman in that span was Zabian Dowdell, who scored 195 points in his first 15 games in the 2003-04 season.

Commonwealth Notes

Virginia Tech is 425-311 (.577) all-time against schools from Virginia ... Tech is 2-1 this season against Virginia schools and was 2-3 last season against state schools ... The Hokies have played 14 schools from the state all-time ... The only state Division I school that Tech has not played is Hampton ... Tech holds winning records against 10 of the schools and even records against two others ... Tech has played VMI, Radford and Liberty from the Commonwealth this year and today begins a home-and-home with Virginia during ACC play.

Production Off the Bench

So far this season, the Hokies have scored 1217 total points ... Of that number, 709 points have come from the starting five of each game and the remaining 508 points come from the reserves ... Tech's bench accounts for 41.7 percent of its scoring in games so far this season.

Taking Better Care

At the end of non-conference play on Dec. 30, the Hokies were averaging 13.8 turnovers per game ... Five games into the ACC schedule, Tech is averaging just 9.6 turnovers per ACC road game.

It is Better to Give

At West Virginia, **Devin Wilson** handed out his 200th career assist as a Hokie, in just his 44th game ... Wilson now has a career average of 4.6 assists per game, higher than Malcolm Delaney, Jamon Gordon, Al Young or Dell Curry, second through fifth on the Virginia Tech all-time assists list ... All-time leader **Binbo Coles** averaged 4.8 assists per game.

Youthful Points

The Hokies' five freshmen are averaging 36.0 points per game and the 612 points accounts for 50.3 percent of the team's scoring ... The group has made 42 of the 90 available starts for the team and has 23 games of double-figure scoring, including four games of 20-or-more points ... All five Hokie freshmen have scored in double figures in a game so far this season ... That marks the most freshmen to score in double figures in a game in a single season since the 2007-08 season, when Malcolm Delaney, Jeff Allen, Hank Thorns, Dorenzo Hudson and J.T. Thompson all had single games in double figures ... In all, 10 different Hokies recorded games in double figures during non-conference play this season.

A Young Three

In Tech's win over UMES, freshmen **Malik Müller**, **Justin Bibbs** and **Ahmed Hill** all scored in double-figures ... That marked the first time since Nov. 18, 2000 that three freshmen making their collegiate debuts for the Hokies all scored in double figures ... That night, a 92-68 win over VMI, Carlos Dixon (21 points), Chris Exilus (20 points) and Bryant Matthews (17 points) pulled off the same feat ... In the win over Presbyterian, three freshmen, Hill, Bibbs and **Jalen Hudson** scored in double-figures.

Little, Big Boards

In the win over Presbyterian, **Adam Smith** led the Hokies in rebounding, with seven boards ... The last time a Hokie, under 6-2, grabbed at least seven rebounds in a game was Hank Thorns, who had seven rebounds in a home win over Gardner-Webb on Nov. 14, 2008.

383 and Counting

The Hokies have hit at least one three-pointer in every game since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... Tech has now hit a three in 383 consecutive games, the most in school history ... Since the three-point arc was added to college basketball for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one three in all but three games ... The last time that the Hokies did not record a three-point field goal in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003.

Finally a Two

After hitting a three-pointer in the loss to No. 8/9 Notre Dame, **Will Johnston** has made 66 field goals and all but five of them have been three-pointers ... He made a career-high four three-pointers in the win over Furman, a feat he matched at FSU last season ... In the win over Morgan State, Johnston turned his lone two-pointer into a three-point play, hitting the free throw after being fouled.

Been a Long Time

Christian Beyer's 13 points in the win against Alabama A&M marks the first time a Virginia Tech walk-on has scored in double figures since Dec. 2, 2000, when Alex Martin scored 13 points against Syracuse in the finals of the 2000 Carrier Classic ... Beyer has since been awarded a scholarship for the second semester.

Combining the Two

When **Devin Wilson** recorded his first career double-double with 10 points and 11 assists in the win over Morgan State, it was the first time a Tech player had a non-points/rebounds double-double since Erick Green had 23 points and 10 assists in the loss at West Virginia on Dec. 8, 2012.

Cleaning the Glass

In the win over VMI, the Hokies grabbed a season-high 44 rebounds ... That is the most rebounds in a game since Tech grabbed 44 rebounds in a game was Dec. 21, 2013, when Tech had 44 rebounds at VCU ... The last time the Hokies had 44-or-more-rebounds in a win was on Dec. 10, 2012, when Tech grabbed 51 rebounds in a home win over Mississippi Valley State ... Tech had 43 rebounds earlier this season against Morgan State.

Bibbs was Honored

Freshman guard **Justin Bibbs** was named the ACC Rookie of the Week, for the week ending Dec. 28, 2014 ... Bibbs scored 20 points to lead the Hokies to the win over VMI and 13 points to go along with six rebounds and four assists in the win over Presbyterian.

The last time a Hokie under 6-6 had double-figures in rebounding was on March 10, 2007, when Jamon Gordon had 11 rebounds in a loss to NC State in the 2007 ACC Tournament in Tampa.

When referring to Virginia Tech, we ask that you please leave it at that - Virginia Tech ... Virginia Tech University is not now and never has been a name for the school ... Both excel in the classroom, as well, as Beyer won the 2014 Skelton Award, given annually by Virginia Tech to the top academic male and female student-athletes and Seymore attends Carolina on a Morehead-Cain Scholarship, the most prestigious academic scholarship awarded at UNC and is the senior class president at UNC ... Seymore tore his ACL against UAB and will miss the remainder of the season.

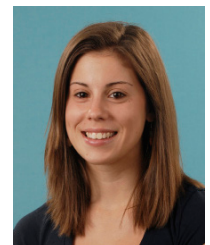

Head Coach Buzz Williams



Buzz Williams begins his first season as the head men's basketball coach at Virginia Tech. Williams comes to the Hokies following six seasons as the head coach of the Marquette Golden Eagles. At Marquette, Williams had a record of 139-69 and led the team to five NCAA appearances, including a trip to the regional finals in the 2012-13 season, the same season the team won the Big East Conference regular season title. Williams led the Golden Eagles to a 69-39 Big East Conference record during his time in Milwaukee. Six Marquette players have made it to the NBA during Williams' tenure.

"I am extremely excited about welcoming Buzz Williams to the Hokie Nation," Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock said at the time of Williams' hiring in March. "Buzz is a proven winner who has earned his way up through the ranks with a strong track record of success. I am confident he will energize our fan base and help make Virginia Tech basketball competitive in the Atlantic Coast Conference. I know he will recruit at the highest level."

"It's never easy to leave a great school like Marquette, where I spent seven wonderful years, six as the head coach," Williams said. "But this is a special situation to work at a place like Virginia Tech. I've heard tremendous things about this terrific institution and this is an outstanding opportunity to build a

program. My family and I look forward to becoming a part of this great university and community, and taking on the challenges associated with succeeding in the ACC."

Williams was an assistant at Marquette in the 2007-08 season. MU concluded the year 25-10 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2003.

His coaching career has included stints as an assistant, associate head and head coach. He has been at the NCAA Division I level for 19 seasons, and 2013-14 was his seventh campaign as a head coach. Williams has recruited and coached over 20 players who have earned all-conference accolades, including two league players of the year, two conference freshmen of the year and four Associated Press All-Americans.

Williams arrived in Milwaukee after serving for one season as the head coach at the University of New Orleans. He guided the Privateers to a 14-win campaign in 2006-07 and his roster featured Bo McCalebb, the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year. UNO claimed fourth place in the Sun Belt's Western Division and advanced to the league tournament quarterfinals. The squad claimed as many victories on the road that season as it had in the previous three seasons combined. His recruiting class for the 2007-08 season was ranked in the top-50 nationally by HoopScoopOnline.com.

Prior to UNO, Williams served as an assistant coach and recruiting

coordinator at Texas A&M for two seasons (2004-05 and 2005-06) under head coach Billy Gillispie. Both of his recruiting classes with the Aggies were ranked among the best in the nation and featured some of the top-ranked talent at the prep level. The squad made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 25 years in 2005-06 and the previous team posted the top turnaround in the nation, improving its win total in 2004-05 by 14 games compared to 2003-04.

Williams spent four seasons (2000-01 through 2003-04) at Colorado State, serving as an assistant the first three seasons before being promoted to associate head coach in 2003-04. Two of his recruiting classes were ranked among the 40-best in the nation, including the 2003 group, which was tabbed No. 1 in the Mountain West Conference. Colorado State made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 13 years during his tenure and he was named one of the top assistants in the country by HoopScoopOnline.com.

The Van Alstyne, Texas, native was previously an assistant at Northwestern State (1999-2000), Texas A&M- Kingsville (1998-99) and Texas-Arlington (1994-98). He earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Oklahoma City University in 1994 before completing his master's work in the same field at Texas A&M-Kingsville in 1999.

Williams is married to the former Corey Norman and the couple has two daughters, Zera and Addyson, and two sons, Calvin and Mason.
