About Tonight's Game

The Hokies enter tonight's game 1-1 on the season ... VMI is also 1-1 overall.

Last Time Out: VT 71, JSU 62

The Hokies earned their first win of the season on Wednesday night, as they defeated Jacksonville State, 71-62, in Cassell Coliseum ... **Zach LeDay** once again led the Hokies, with 15 points and **Chris Clarke** recorded his first career double-double with 12 points and 11 rebounds ... **Justin Bibbs** had 11 points in the win.

Series Against The Keydets

This is the Hokies second-longest rivalry, which dates back to the 1908-09 season ... Tech is 89-43 all-time against the Keydets ... Tech has won the last four games in the series, including an 87-74 win last season in Cassell Coliseum ... The Hokies are 54-10 all-time in home games against VMI and 19-1 in Cassell Coliseum ... The Hokies are 152-64 all-time against members of the Southern Conference.

A Golden Opportunity

Virginia Tech sophomore wing **Justin Bibbs** won a gold medal as a member of the championship USA team at the FIBA U19 World Championship, held in late June and early July in Heraklion, Crete, Greece ... Bibbs becomes the first Hokie to win a gold medal in a sanctioned USA Basketball FIBA world championship.

Hopefully, First of Many

In the Hokies' win over Jacksonville State, freshman **Chris Clarke** recorded his first double-double of the season and his career with 12 points and 11 rebounds ... The last Virginia Tech freshman to record a double-double was **Justin Bibbs**, who scored 22 points and grabbed 11 rebounds against Syracuse on Jan. 3, 2015 ... Clarke has recorded double figures in both games this season.

Big Day on the Boards

The Hokies had 54 rebounds in the win over Jacksonville State ... That is the most rebounds in a game for Tech since Dec. 9, 2009, when the Hokies grabbed 59 rebounds against VMI in Cassell Coliseum ... The rebounding differential of +25 is the most for the Hokies since they outrebounded Longwood, 52-27, on Dec. 14, 2008, in Cassell Coliseum.

The Waiting is Over

Two Hokies, **Seth Allen** and **Zach LeDay**, were on the team last season, but did not play, due to NCAA transfer rules ... When Tech played Alabama State on Nov. 14, both came out of the gates with some gusto ... LeDay lead all players with 26 points and 15 rebounds ... Allen added 13 points and four assists.

More on LeDay's Day

Zach LeDay recorded a double-double in his first game as a Hokie against Alabama State ... He had 26 points and 15 rebounds, both career-highs for him, including his two seasons playing at South Florida ... The 26 points is the most by a Hokie since Jalen Hudson scored 32 points in the win over Wake Forest in the first round of the 2015 ACC Tournament ... The last Hokie to record a double-double in a season opener was Jarell Eddie, who scored 17 points and 10 rebounds in the 2013-14 season opening win over East Tennessee State ... The last Hokie to record a double-double in his first game as a Hokie was Dorian Finney-Smith, who had 10 points and 16 rebounds in the 2011-12 season opening win over East Tennessee State ... This is LeDay's second career double-double, as he had 15 points and 15 rebounds as a member of the USF Bulls against Seton Hall on March 12, 2013, his freshman season at USF.

Even More on LeDay's Day

The 26 points by **Zach LeDay** in the Alabama State game is the first time a Virginia Tech player scored 20-or-more-points in their Virginia Tech debut since Deron Washington scored 20 points in the 2004-05 season opener ... The last time a Hokie scored more than 26 points in a season-opener was Terry Taylor, who scored 28 points in the 2002-03 season-opener against St. Bonaventure in St. Thomas, V.I. ... It marks the first time that any Hokie scored 20-or-more-points in a season opener since Erick Green had 21 points in the 2012-13 season opening win over ETSU ... The last time a Hokie newcomer recorded a double-double of at least 20 points was Dale Solomon, who scored 23 points and had 11 rebounds in his Virginia Tech debut on Nov. 25, 1978 against Buffalo State ... LeDay's 26 points is the most by a player in his first Virginia Tech game since at least 1978, when the Hokies entered the Metro Conference.

LeDay's Boards

When **Zach LeDay** grabbed 15 rebounds in the Alabama State game, it marked the most rebounds for a Hokie since Marshall Wood grabbed 16 rebounds at NC State on Feb. 16, 2013.

400 and Counting

Justin Bibbs made a three-pointer on the first position of the Hokies' win over Jacksonville State ... In doing so, Tech has now hit a three in 400 consecutive games, the most in school history ... The Hokies have hit at least one three-pointer in every game since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... Since the three-point arc was added for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one three in all but three games ... The last time Tech did not record a three-point field goal in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003.

More on the VMI Series

The Hokies and the Keydets have played this series in Blacksburg, Lexington, Roanoke, Richmond and Lynchburg ... Despite playing 132 times since Feb. 27, 1909, the teams have played just two overtime games, both won by the Hokies ... From 1925 through 1962, all games in the series were Southern Conference games ... Tech won 53 of the 80 games.

Wilson On the Mend

Junior guard **Devin Wilson** has missed both of the Hokies' first two games due to a left groin injury ... He led the Hokies in minutes played in each of his first two seasons in Blacksburg, averaging 32.4 minutes per game.

Junior wing **Tyrone Oulaw** will miss the 2015-16 season due to a medical issue ... He will seek a medical redshirt ... Oulaw transferred to Virginia Tech this spring after one season at Lee College, a junior college in Texas ... He played as a freshman at UNC Greensboro and is a junior from Roxboro, North Carolina.

Hill on the Mend

Virginia Tech sophomore wing **Ahmed Hill** is on the mend from surgery, performed on August 11 ... Hill had a partial tear of the left patellar tendon and had successful surgery at LewisGale Montgomery Hospital by Dr. Tony McPherron ... He has been rehabbing the knee and a decision on his availability this season will be made in November.

Seth Allen and **Zach LeDay** each made their first starts as a Hokie in the season opener against Alabama State ... **Kerry Blackshear Jr.**, **Chris Clarke**, **Justin Robinson** and **Johnny Hamilton** all made their Tech debuts in the game ... In the win over Jacksonville State, Clarke and Robinson earned their first career starts.

Newcomers on This Year's Team

The Hokies welcome eight players who did not compete last season ... Two, **Seth Allen** and **Zach LeDay**, were on the team, but did not play, due to NCAA transfer rules ... Neither walk-on, **Greg Donlon** or **Matt Galloway**, played last season, but Donlon dressed for every game despite redshirting and Galloway was enrolled at Virginia Tech and was a team manager.

About This Year's Team

Virginia Tech has a roster of 15 players ... The breakdown is one senior (**Shane Henry**), four redshirt juniors, three true juniors, four sophomores and three freshmen ... The team has two walk-ons, redshirt junior **Greg Donlon** and junior **Matt Galloway** ... Six Hokies hail from the Commonwealth of Virginia.

500-Plus in the Cassell

The Hokies have a 548-184 overall record in Cassell Coliseum, good for a .749 winning percentage ... The win over Florida State on Jan. 8, 2011, was the 500th victory in the building ... Tech defeated Rhode Island, 86-63, on Nov. 20, 2002, in its 500th game in the arena ... Tech has had just one break-even home season and two losing seasons in Cassell Coliseum.

Buzz Williams Info

Buzz Williams begins his second season as the head coach of the Hokies ... In his eight seasons as a collegiate head coach, Williams has an overall record of 165-108 ... A complete bio on Coach Williams is available on page 4 of these notes.

A Couple of New Voices

Whether in Cassell Coliseum or on the radio, fans of Virginia Tech men's basketball will hear a couple of new voices this season ... Longtime radio voice Bill Roth left during the summer for a similar position at UCLA and he has been replaced by **Jon Laaser**, who spent the last several seasons in Richmond, working as the television and radio voice for VCU ... Also, **Mike Sparrer** is the new public address announcer for men's basketball at Cassell Coliseum ... No stranger to Hokie fans, Sparrer is also the PA voice for the Marching Virginians and has worked with numerous other sports at Virginia Tech.

Hudson's Big Day

Jalen Hudson scored a career-high 32 points in the win over Wake Forest in the opening round of the 2015 New York Life ACC Tournament ... That total set a new Virginia Tech record for points in an ACC Tournament game ... The old mark was 26 points by A.D. Vassallo against North Carolina in the 2009 ACC Tournament in the Georgia Dome ... The 32 points is tied for the third-most in an ACC Tournament first round contest ... The 32 points by Hudson is the most points in any game by a Virginia Tech freshman since the team joined the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... The last time any Virginia Tech player scored 30-or-more points in a game was Jarell Eddie, who scored 34 points against Winthrop last season ... The last time a Virginia Tech player scored 30-or-more points against an ACC team was Erick Green, who scored 35 points at Wake Forest in the final regular season game of the 2012-13 season ... Hudson made 10 of 10 free throw attempts ... It is the 10th time in school history that a Hokie has been perfect from the line with at least 10 attempts ... It is the first time it has occurred in an ACC Tournament game ... He was just the second ACC freshman to go 10-for-10 from the line.

New Name, Same Place

The Hokies will play this season in the same arena, Cassell Coliseum, but the playing surface has a new name and new markings ... The floor is now known as Virginia Tech Carilion Court at Cassell Coliseum ... This is in recognition of a generous sponsorship of Virginia Tech athletics by Carilion that will be used to fund scholarships and strategic initiatives, as well as to support public-health awareness ... Carilion was awarded naming privileges to the court for 10 years in recognition of a sponsorship that will provide \$500,000 a year over that time ... With the naming, Carilion will support student-athletes who are pursuing health careers, promote health awareness and the Carilion Clinic Children's Hospital, and honor the importance of the Virginia Tech Carilion partnership.



A New Look for Courtside

Beginning this season, a new look to Cassell Coliseum will take place,



as the Virginia Tech Department of Athletics unveiled plans for "Courtside at Cassell" ... This allows Hokie fans the opportunity to enjoy premium courtside seating at Cassell Coliseum ... Courtside at Cassell will consist of 14 brand new four-seat tables which will line the court across from the team benches and along the baseline ... Each four-seat table will consist of upgraded luxury seats and will be priced at \$20,000 for the men's basketball season plus the cost of season tickets ... Members of the media who previously occupied these courtside seat locations will be relocated above the team tunnel in sections 16, 17 and 18 to a newly constructed and expanded area ... The ADA wheelchair-accessible seating area will also be relocated from the baseline area to above the team tunnel with convenient access to concourse level amenities ... The number of ADA accessible seating locations will more than double as a result of this renovation ... Radio and TV media will remain on the floor.

Buzz's Bunch is a non-profit organization that Coach Buzz Williams created six years ago when he was first named head coach at Marquette University.

Buzz's Bunch is a way to bring together children with disabilities and help them to fall in love with the game of basketball. Since its creation, the group has evolved into so much more. Buzz's Bunch members create some unforgettable relationships and memories. Most of all, every player, coach, or staff member feels lucky to learn from these members and be touched by them.

Being a Buzz's Bunch member includes an invitation to a camp over the summer, which includes spending time with the team and staff, lunch and a free t-shirt. Additionally, there is a Buzz's Bunch calendar at the beginning of the year and another event over the winter. The team tries to keep in touch with members throughout the year and the organization changes with time as new opportunities exist.

More on Jalen Hudson's Day

The 32 points by **Jalen Hudson** was the fourth-highest point total by a freshman in an ACC Tournament game ... The record is Boston College's Olivier Hanlan's 41 points in the 2013 tournament first round game ... The second-highest total was 40 points by North Carolina's Harrison Barnes in the 2011 semifinals and the third-highest is 33 points by Georgia Tech's Mark Price in the 1983 semifinals ... Hudson was the ninth freshman to score at least 30 points in an ACC Tournament game.

That's A Record!

In the Duke game, **Devin Wilson** recorded a double-double with 10 points and 11 assists against the eventual national champions ... The 11 assists tied a career-high for Wilson and sets a new Tech record for assists in an ACC game ... It is also one assist shy of the Virginia Tech overall record for assists in a game.

The 300-Club

In the loss to eventual national champion Duke, **Justin Bibbs** scored his 300th point of the season ... In doing so, he became just the third Virginia Tech freshman to score 300 points in a season since the Hokies joined the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... The other two Hokies to do so were both in the 2007-08 season ... Jeff Allen scored 388 points in his freshman season and Malcolm Delaney scored 336 points that same season ... Bibbs finished with 332 points last season.

Smart Guys

Three Virginia Tech Hokies were named to the 2015 All-ACC Academic Men's Basketball team ... Seniors Will Johnston and Christian Beyer, along with sophomore **Devin Wilson** have earned the honor ... It marked the second appearance on the team by both Beyer and Johnston.

More Freshman Scoring Numbers

Last season's Virginia Tech's freshman class scored 1,144 points ... That is the most points by a freshman class since the Hokies joined the ACC in 2004-05.

Young Minutes

The 2014-15 Virginia Tech freshman class played 52.0 percent of the minutes ... That was the highest percentage of minutes for freshmen by any team in the ACC ... Second was Duke, at 48.9 percent ... In ACC play, the Hokies' freshmen played 52.6 percent, second was Duke at 51.3 percent.

Coming Next Year

Virginia Tech signed Khadim Sy to a National Letter of Intent to play basketball for the Hokies beginning in the fall of 2016 ... Khadim Sy (pronounced hah-DEEM SEE), a 6-10, 245 lbs. post player from Dakar, Senegal, is currently a senior at Oak Hill Academy in Mouth of Wilson, Virginia, where he is averaging 11.0 points, 7.5 rebounds and 3.0 blocked shots per game after two games this season.

Head Coach Buzz Williams



Buzz Williams begins his second season as the head men's basketball coach at Virginia Tech. Williams led the Hokies to an 11-22 overall record in his first season in Blacksburg.

In his inaugural season at Virginia Tech, Williams began building the culture that will allow the Hokies future success. The team went a long ways towards establishing an identity of hard work, accountability both on and off the court and a tough, competitive nature.

Williams came to Virginia Tech following six seasons as the head coach of the Marquette Golden Eagles. At Marquette, Williams had a record of 139-69 and led the team to five NCAA appearances, including a trip to the regional finals in the 2012-13 season, the same season the team won the Big East Conference regular season title. Williams led the Golden Eagles to a 69-39 Big East Conference record during his time in Milwaukee. Six Marquette players have made it to the NBA during Williams' tenure. In his eight seasons as a collegiate head coach, Williams has an overall record of 165-109.

"Buzz Williams' first season at Virginia Tech set a tone for the future," Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock said. "This program achieved on the

court, in the classroom and in the community. His focus and tireless work ethic is indelible throughout the program. His expectations and standards are high and we will continue to improve in all areas because of this environment."

Williams was an assistant at Marquette in the 2007-08 season. MU concluded the year 25-10 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2003.

His coaching career has included stints as an assistant, associate head and head coach. He has been at the NCAA Division I level for 19 seasons, and 2013-14 was his seventh campaign as a head coach. Williams has recruited and coached over 20 players who have earned all-conference accolades, including two league players of the year, two conference freshmen of the year and four Associated Press All-Americans.

Williams arrived in Milwaukee after serving for one season as the head coach at the University of New Orleans. He guided the Privateers to a 14-win campaign in 2006-07 and his roster featured Bo McCalebb, the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year. UNO claimed fourth place in the Sun Belt's Western Division and advanced to the league tournament quarterfinals. The squad claimed as many victories on the road that season as it had in the previous three seasons combined. His recruiting class for the 2007-08 season was ranked in the top-50 nationally by HoopScoopOnline.com.

Prior to UNO, Williams served as an as-

sistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Texas A&M for two seasons (2004-05 and 2005-06) under head coach Billy Gillispie. Both of his recruiting classes with the Aggies were ranked among the best in the nation and featured some of the top-ranked talent at the prep level. The squad made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 25 years in 2005-06 and the previous team posted the top turnaround in the nation, improving its win total in 2004-05 by 14 games compared to 2003-04.

Williams spent four seasons (2000-01 through 2003-04) at Colorado State, serving as an assistant the first three seasons before being promoted to associate head coach in 2003-04. Two of his recruiting classes were ranked among the 40-best in the nation, including the 2003 group, which was tabbed No. 1 in the Mountain West Conference. Colorado State made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 13 years during his tenure and he was named one of the top assistants in the country by HoopScoopOnline.com.

The Van Alstyne, Texas, native was previously an assistant at Northwestern State (1999-2000), Texas A&M- Kingsville (1998-99) and Texas-Arlington (1994-98). He earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Oklahoma City University in 1994 before completing his master's work in the same field at Texas A&M-Kingsville in 1999.

Williams is married to the former Corey Norman and the couple has two daughters, Zera and Addyson, and two sons, Calvin and Mason.

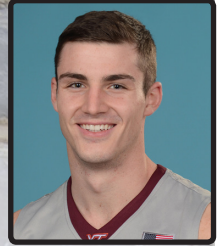

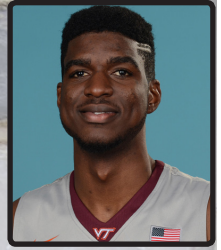
