Last Time Out: NU 81, VT 79 OT

The Hokies dropped a heart-breaker on Tuesday night, falling to Northwestern, 81-79, in overtime in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech trailed the entire second half until 55 seconds remaining in regulation, when **Seth Allen** hit a pair of free throws that sent the game into overtime ... Tech got a final look to tie the game in the extra session, but missed a 15-footer at the buzzer ... Allen led all scorers with 25 points, **Justin Bibbs** added 17 points and **Chris Clarke** recorded his second consecutive double-double with 11 points and 13 rebounds.

Series Against The Golden Lions

This will be the first meeting in the series between the two schools ... The Hokies are 2-1 all-time against current members of the Southwestern Athletic Conference.

Welcome Back, Alumni!

A Freshman Double

Chris Clarke recorded his second consecutive double-double with 11 points and 13 rebounds in the Northwestern game ... It's the first time a Virginia Tech freshman recorded consecutive double-doubles since Jeff Allen in the 2007-08 season ... Allen had 11 points and 12 rebounds in the regular season finale at Clemson and 10 points and 10 rebounds in the first round of the ACC Tournament against Miami.

20-Plus for Allen

Seth Allen scored 25 points in the Northwestern game ... That marks the first time a Hokie has scored 20-or-more points in consecutive games since Adam Smith had 26 points against Miami of Ohio and 22 points against Morgan State last season ... Allen had 23 points in the win over UAB on Nov. 28.

B-2-B OT

The Hokies lost to Northwestern, 81-77, in overtime on Dec. 1 and defeated UAB, 81-77 in overtime on Nov. 28 in Destin ... Prior to that, the last time the Hokies played back-to-back OT games was Feb. 8, 2006, when the Hokies won at Clemson, 75-74, in overtime and lost at Virginia, 81-77, in overtime on Feb. 11, 2006.

It Is Better to Give, A Lot

In the loss to Northwestern, **Devin Wilson** recorded five assists and just one turnover ... He now has 303 career assists, good for 4.5 assists per game ... Early in his junior season, Wilson is just 13 assists away from entering the top 10 in assists in school history.

New Guys

Seven games into the season, Tech has had nine, 15 points or higher scoring performances ... Of those nine times, eight have been by either **Zach LeDay** or **Seth Allen**, each who are new to the Hokies this season ... **Justin Bibbs'** 17 points against Northwestern is the only one of the nine not by LeDay or Allen.

Getting There

Entering today's game, the Hokies lead the nation in free throw attempts and are eighth in free throws made ... Tech is averaging 33.3 attempts and 21.6 makes per game ... Last season, the Hokies averaged 16.9 attempts and 10.8 makes per game.

Hokies in Overtime

With the overtime loss to Northwestern, the Hokies are now 62-48 all-time in overtime games ... Tech is 1-1 this season and was 1-1 in overtime games last season ... Tech is 27-24 in road overtime games, 27-11 in home overtime games, and 8-13 on neutral courts ... Tech is 14-7 in ACC overtime games ... Tech is 3-8 all-time in overtime games against ranked teams ... Tech is 5-9 in double-overtime games and 1-2 in triple overtime games.

Big Night on the Boards

In the Hokies' overtime win over UAB, **Chris Clarke** grabbed a career-high 16 rebounds en route to his double-double of 10 points and 16 rebounds ... The 16 rebounds are the most by a Hokie since Marshall Wood grabbed 16 rebounds at NC State on Feb. 16, 2013 ... It is also the most rebounds by a Tech freshman since Wood's performance in Raleigh on that day ... It is also the record for rebounds in an Emerald Coast Classic game.

Doubling Our Pleasure

With his 15 points, 10 rebound performance in the win over UAB, **Zach LeDay** recorded his fourth double-double of the season ... The last Hokies to record four double-doubles in a single season was Jarell Eddie, with four double-doubles in the 2013-14 season.

A Final Double Note

Zach LeDay and **Chris Clarke** both recorded double-doubles in the win over UAB ... In doing so, they become the first pair of Hokies to record double-doubles in the same game since C.J. Barksdale (14 points/10 rebounds) and Jarell Eddie (13 points/10 rebounds) pulled the feat against Radford in Cassell Coliseum on Nov. 29, 2013.

Really Young Again This Season

The Hokies once again this season field one of the youngest teams in the nation ... According to kenpom.com, Tech is 328 out of 350 NCAA Division I teams in experience, at just 1.15 years per player ... Tech is 14th out of 15 ACC teams in experience ... Tech has just one senior and only one player, junior **Devin Wilson**, who was on the squad two years ago ... Wilson missed the first three games of the season with a left groin strain.

Rise and Give Me 20

Zach LeDay scored 26 points in the first game of the season and followed that with 26 points in the fourth game, Tuesday night's win over NC A&T ... In doing so, he becomes the first Tech player with 25-or-more points in two of the first four games of the season since Erick Green scored 20-or-more in all four of the first four games of the 2012-13 season, including games of 25 points and 26 points.

Hokies in Overtime

With the overtime loss to Northwestern, the Hokies are now 62-48 all-time in overtime games ... Tech is 1-1 this season and was 1-1 in overtime games last season ... Tech is 27-24 in road overtime games, 27-11 in home overtime games, and 8-13 on neutral courts ... Tech is 14-7 in ACC overtime games ... Tech is 3-8 all-time in overtime games against ranked teams ... Tech is 5-9 in double-overtime games and 1-2 in triple overtime games.

A Golden Opportunity

Virginia Tech sophomore wing **Justin Bibbs** won a gold medal as a member of the championship USA team at the FIBA U19 World Championship, held in late June and early July in Heraklion, Crete, Greece ... Bibbs becomes the first Hokie to win a gold medal in a sanctioned USA Basketball FIBA world championship.

Wilson Returns

Junior guard **Devin Wilson** missed the Hokies' first three games due to a left groin injury ... He returned to action in the win over NC A&T, playing 23 minutes.

Hill on the Mend

Virginia Tech sophomore wing **Ahmed Hill** is on the mend from surgery, performed on August 11 ... Hill had a partial tear of the left patellar tendon and had successful surgery at LewisGale Montgomery Hospital by Dr. Tony McPherron.

Outlaw Out

Junior wing **Tyrone Outlaw** will miss the 2015-16 season due to a medical issue ... Outlaw transferred to Virginia Tech this spring after one season at Lee College, a junior college in Texas ... He played as a freshman at UNC Greensboro and is a junior from Roxboro, North Carolina.

Award-Winning Performance

For his play in the tournament, **Zach LeDay** was named to the Emerald Coast Classic All-Tournament team ... In the four games, LeDay averaged 18.8 points and 10.5 rebounds per game and he had two double-doubles.

That's Low

The Virginia Tech defense stepped it up in the win over VMI ... Tech allowed the Keydets to shoot just 25.7 percent from the field for the game, including just 20.5 percent (eight of 39) in the second half ... The 25.7 percent allowed is the lowest by a **Buzz Williams**-coached team and the lowest by the Hokies since Dec. 10, 2012, when Tech allowed Mississippi Valley State 25.7 percent from the floor.

Big Day on the Boards

The Hokies had 54 rebounds in the win over Jacksonville State ... That is the most rebounds in a game for Tech since Dec. 9, 2009, when the Hokies grabbed 59 rebounds against VMI ... The rebounding differential of +25 is the most for the Hokies since they outrebounded Longwood, 52-27, on Dec. 14, 2008, in Cassell Coliseum ... In the win over VMI, Tech out rebounded the Keydets, 49-37, Tech had 41 rebounds in the win over NC A&T and 46 rebounds in the win over UAB ... Tech is averaging 44.4 rebounds per game over the first seven games of the season ... Tech has grabbed at least 40 rebounds in six of the seven games this season.

Another Big Day for LeDay

Zach LeDay tied a career-high with 26 points and 12 rebounds in the win over NC A&T and, in doing so, extended his double-figure scoring streak to four games ... He recorded his third double-double in the Hokies' four games this season ... It is the first time a Hokies has had consecutive double-doubles since Jarell Eddie achieved the feat on Nov. 26 (14 points, 10 rebounds against Furman) and 29 (13 points, 10 rebounds vs. Radford), 2013 ... The streak of double figure scoring games moved to six with his play in the Emerald Coast Classic, including a 15 point, 10 rebound performance in the win over UAB, giving him four double-doubles in six games this season.

Hokies in NCAA Stats

In the most current release of NCAA stats (Dec. 4, 2015), the Hokies lead the nation in free throw attempts and are eighth in free throws made ... Tech is 17th in total rebounds per game, 25th nationally in rebound margin and 29th in offensive rebounds per game ... Individually, **Zach LeDay** is 14th in offensive rebounds per game and 16th in double-doubles.

More on LeDay's Day

Zach LeDay recorded a double-double in his first game as a Hokie ... He had 26 points and 15 rebounds, both career-highs for him, including his two seasons playing at South Florida ... The 26 points is the most by a Hokie since **Jalen Hudson** scored 32 points in the win over Wake Forest in the first round of the 2015 ACC Tournament ... The last Hokie to record a double-double in a season opener was Jarell Eddie, who scored 17 points and 10 rebounds in the 2013-14 season opening win over East Tennessee State ... The last Hokie to record a double-double in his first game as a Hokie was Dorian Finney-Smith, who had 10 points and 16 rebounds in the 2011-12 season opening win over East Tennessee State ... The 26 points by LeDay in the Alabama State game is the first time a Virginia Tech player scored 20-or-more-points in their Virginia Tech debut since Deron Washington scored 20 points in the 2004-05 season opener ... The last time a Hokie scored more than 26 points in a season-opener was Terry Taylor, who scored 28 points in the 2002-03 season-opener against St. Bonaventure in St. Thomas, V.I. ... It marks the first time that any Hokie scored 20-or-more-points in a season opener since Erick Green had 21 points in the 2012-13 season opening win over ETSU ... The last time a Hokie newcomer recorded a double-double of at least 20 points was Dale Solomon, who scored 23 points and had 11 rebounds in his Virginia Tech debut on Nov. 25, 1978 against Buffalo State ... LeDay's 26 points is the most by a player in his first Virginia Tech game since at least 1978, when the Hokies entered the Metro Conference.

Buzz's Bunch is a non-profit organization that Coach Buzz Williams created six years ago when he was first named head coach at Marquette University.

Buzz's Bunch is a way to bring together children with disabilities and help them to fall in love with the game of basketball. Since it's creation, the group has evolved into so much more. Buzz's Bunch members create some unforgettable relationships and memories. Most of all, every player, coach, or staff member feels lucky to learn from these members and be touched by them.

Being a Buzz's Bunch member includes an invitation to a camp over the summer, which includes spending time with the team and staff, lunch and a free t-shirt. Additionally, there is a Buzz's Bunch calendar at the beginning of the year and another event over the winter. The team tries to keep in touch with members throughout the year and the organization changes with time as new opportunities exist.

A New Look for Courtside

Beginning this season, a new look to Cassell Coliseum will take place,



as the Virginia Tech Department of Athletics unveiled plans for "Courtside at Cassell" ... This allows Hokie fans the opportunity to enjoy premium courtside seating at Cassell Coliseum ... Courtside at Cassell will consist of 14 brand new four-seat tables which will line the court across from the team benches and along the baseline ... Each four-seat table will consist of upgraded luxury seats and will be priced at \$20,000 for the men's basketball season plus the cost of season tickets ... Members of the media who previously occupied these courtside seat locations will be relocated above the team tunnel in sections 16, 17 and 18 to a newly constructed and expanded area ... The ADA wheelchair-accessible seating area will also be relocated from the baseline area to above the team tunnel with convenient access to concourse level amenities ... The number of ADA accessible seating locations will more than double as a result of this renovation ... Radio and TV media will remain on the floor.

What's Next?

The Hokies travel across the New River to take on Radford ... Game time is 7 p.m. at the Dedmond Center.

New Name, Same Place

The Hokies are playing this season in the same arena, Cassell Coliseum, but the playing surface has a new name ... The floor is now known as Virginia Tech Carilion Court at Cassell Coliseum ... This is in recognition of a generous sponsorship of Virginia Tech athletics by Carilion that will be used to fund scholarships and strategic initiatives, as well as to support public-health awareness ... Carilion was awarded naming privileges to the court for 10 years in recognition of a sponsorship that will provide \$500,000 a year over that time ... With the naming, Carilion will support student-athletes who are pursuing health careers, promote health awareness and the Carilion Clinic Children's Hospital, and honor the importance of the Virginia Tech Carilion partnership.



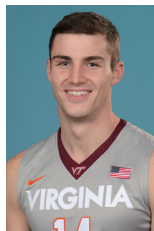

First of Many

In the Hokies' win over Jacksonville State, freshman **Chris Clarke** recorded his first double-double of the season and his career with 12 points and 11 rebounds ... The last Hokie freshman to record a double-double was **Justin Bibbs**, who scored 22 points and grabbed 11 rebounds against Syracuse on Jan. 3, 2015 ... Clarke recorded his second double-double of the season with 10 points and 16 rebounds in the win over UAB and followed that with a third double-double (11 points/13 rebounds) in the loss to Northwestern.

An Active Night

In the Hokies' win over VMI, **Johnny Hamilton** had his first big game for Tech ... The junior college transfer set career-highs with eight points, 11 rebounds and three blocked shots in the game, playing in 16 minutes of action.

Head Coach Buzz Williams



Buzz Williams begins his second season as the head men's basketball coach at Virginia Tech. Williams led the Hokies to an 11-22 overall record in his first season in Blacksburg.

In his inaugural season at Virginia Tech, Williams began building the culture that will allow the Hokies future success. The team went a long ways towards establishing an identity of hard work, accountability both on and off the court and a tough, competitive nature.

Williams came to Virginia Tech following six seasons as the head coach of the Marquette Golden Eagles. At Marquette, Williams had a record of 139-69 and led the team to five NCAA appearances, including a trip to the regional finals in the 2012-13 season, the same season the team won the Big East Conference regular season title. Williams led the Golden Eagles to a 69-39 Big East Conference record during his time in Milwaukee. Six Marquette players have made it to the NBA during Williams' tenure. In his eight seasons as a collegiate head coach, Williams has an overall record of 168-111.

"Buzz Williams' first season at Virginia Tech set a tone for the future," Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock said. "This program achieved on the

court, in the classroom and in the community. His focus and tireless work ethic is indelible throughout the program. His expectations and standards are high and we will continue to improve in all areas because of this environment."

Williams was an assistant at Marquette in the 2007-08 season. MU concluded the year 25-10 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2003.

His coaching career has included stints as an assistant, associate head and head coach. He has been at the NCAA Division I level for 19 seasons, and 2013-14 was his seventh campaign as a head coach. Williams has recruited and coached over 20 players who have earned all-conference accolades, including two league players of the year, two conference freshmen of the year and four Associated Press All-Americans.

Williams arrived in Milwaukee after serving for one season as the head coach at the University of New Orleans. He guided the Privateers to a 14-win campaign in 2006-07 and his roster featured Bo McCalebb, the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year. UNO claimed fourth place in the Sun Belt's Western Division and advanced to the league tournament quarterfinals. The squad claimed as many victories on the road that season as it had in the previous three seasons combined. His recruiting class for the 2007-08 season was ranked in the top-50 nationally by HoopScoopOnline.com.

Prior to UNO, Williams served as an as-

sistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Texas A&M for two seasons (2004-05 and 2005-06) under head coach Billy Gillispie. Both of his recruiting classes with the Aggies were ranked among the best in the nation and featured some of the top-ranked talent at the prep level. The squad made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 25 years in 2005-06 and the previous team posted the top turnaround in the nation, improving its win total in 2004-05 by 14 games compared to 2003-04.

Williams spent four seasons (2000-01 through 2003-04) at Colorado State, serving as an assistant the first three seasons before being promoted to associate head coach in 2003-04. Two of his recruiting classes were ranked among the 40-best in the nation, including the 2003 group, which was tabbed No. 1 in the Mountain West Conference. Colorado State made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 13 years during his tenure and he was named one of the top assistants in the country by HoopScoopOnline.com.

The Van Alstyne, Texas, native was previously an assistant at Northwestern State (1999-2000), Texas A&M- Kingsville (1998-99) and Texas-Arlington (1994-98). He earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Oklahoma City University in 1994 before completing his master's work in the same field at Texas A&M-Kingsville in 1999.

Williams is married to the former Corey Norman and the couple has two daughters, Zera and Addyson, and two sons, Calvin and Mason.

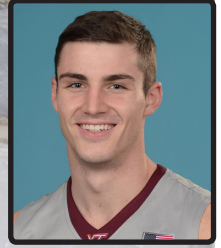

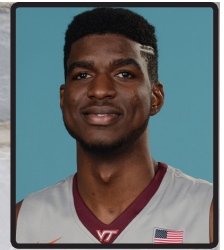

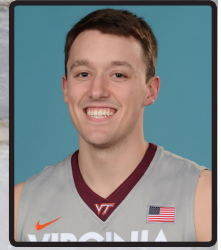
