Following a career-high five three-pointers in the win over Lamar, Justin Bibbs now second in Division I and first in the ACC in three-point field goal percentage, at 62.5 percent ... He has made 25 of his 40 attempts this season

and Chris Clarke have each recorded a doubledouble so far this season ... This is the first time since the 2007-08 season that two Hokies have recorded double-doubles in their freshman seasons ... Jeff

Allen and JT Thompson accomplished the feat that season.

Big at the Break

The Hokies scored 51 points in the first half of the win over Lamar ... That's the most points in a half this season and the most points in a half since the Hokies scored 51 points in the first half of an 87-74 win over VMI in Cassell Coliseum on Dec. 22, 2014.

Dishing It Out

Seth Allen recorded a career high (at Virginia Tech) seven assists in the win over Lamar ... That's the most assists by a Virginia Tech player this season and the most by a Tech player since **Devin Wilson** had 11 assists against Duke last season.

Wrapping Up the Lamar Game

Tech had six players score in double figures ... That's the first time that has happened since Tech had six players in double figures at Wake Forest last season ... The 35-point margin of victory is tied for the most by the Hokies this season ... Tech defeated Arkansas-Pine Bluff, 80-45, on Dec. 5, 2015 ... Tech has now won seven consecutive games on Dec. 13.

Ending the Road Blues

When the Hokies defeated Radford, 74-65, at the Dedmon Center on Dec. 9, it marked the first win for Tech on an opponent's home court in more than two calendar years ... The last true road win for Tech was on Dec. 8, 2013, when the Hokies defeated Miami, 61-60, in the BankUnited Center to open ACC play in the 2013-14 season.

USA Basketball has named the 2015 USA Basketball Men's and Women's U19 World Championship Teams as co-recipients of the 2015 USA Basketball Team of the Year Award ... Virginia Tech sophomore **Justin Bibbs** was a member of the men's gold medal winning

Hudson Racking Up the Steals

Last season, Jalen

Hudson recorded 17 steals in 32 games ... This season, he already has 11 steals in the first 10 games of the season, including eight steals in the last two games combined ... His 17 steals last season was third on the team and the 11 steals this season is second on the team to Chris Clarke's 12 steals.

Gimme That!

In the Hokies' win over Arkansas-Pine Bluff. Jalen Hudson earned the start and then posted a career-high five steals in the contest ... That is the most steals in a game by a Hokie since Erick Green had five steals in a win over Mount St. Mary's in Cassell Coliseum on Jan. 2, 2011 ... Hudson also led the Hokies in scoring with 15 points against the Golden Lions.

Good Point on Low Points

The Hokies held UAPB to just 45 points in the win ... That is the lowest point total by a Tech opponent since Feb. 15, 2014, when the Hokies held defending ACC Champion Miami to just 45 points in a 52-45 Virginia Tech victory.

A Freshman Double Feat

Chris Clarke recorded his second consecutive double-double with 11 points and 13 rebounds in the Northwestern game ... It's the first time a Virginia Tech freshman recorded consecutive double-doubles since Jeff Allen in the 2007-08 season ... Allen had 11 points and 12 rebounds in the regular season finale at Clemson and 10 points and 10 rebounds in the first round of the ACC Tournament against Miami.

20-Plus for Allen

Seth Allen scored 25 points in the Northwestern game ... That marks the first time a Hokie has scored 20-or-more points in consecutive games since Adam Smith had 26 points against Miami of Ohio and 22 points against Morgan State last season ... Allen had 23 points in the win over UAB on Nov. 28.

It Is Better to Give, A Lot

In the loss to Northwestern, **Devin Wilson** recorded five assists and just one turnover, cracking the 300 career assists total ... Following the Lamar game, he has 313 career assists, good for 4.4 assists per game ... Early in his junior season, Wilson is just three assists away from entering the top 10



in assists in school history ... His 313 career assists is fifth among active ACC players.

B-2-B OT

The Hokies lost to Northwestern, 81-79, in overtime on Dec. 1 and defeated UAB, 81-77 in overtime on Nov. 28 in Destin ... Prior to that, the last time the Hokies played back-toback OT games was Feb. 8, 2006, when the Hokies won at Clemson, 75-74, in overtime and lost at Virginia, 81-77, in overtime on Feb. 11, 2006.

Another Point on Points

The 35-point margin of victory for the Hokies in the 80-45 win over Arkansas-Pine Bluff, matched with an 88-53 win over Lamar, is the most for Tech since they defeated Monmouth, 91-46, on Nov. 14, 2011 in Cassell Coliseum.

Wilson Starts and Dishes

In the win at Radford, **Devin Wilson** earned his first start of the season for the Hokies and started again in the win over Lamar ... The junior point guard is no stranger to starting games at Virginia Tech, as he has started 61 of the 71 games in which he has played ... In those 71 starts, Wilson has recorded five-or-more assists in 30 of them, including five in the Radford win.

Three So Far

With Kerry Blackshear Jr.'s, doubledouble in the win over Lamar, the Hokies now have three players to record double-doubles this season ... It marks the first time since the 2013-14 season that three different Hokies had double-doubles in a single season.

Hokies in NCAA Stats

In the most current release of NCAA stats (Dec. 18, 2015), the Hokies are second in the nation in free throw attempts and fifth in free throws made ... Tech is 17th nationally in total rebounds per game, 22nd in rebound margin and 25th in offensive rebounds per game ... Individually, Justin Bibbs is second nationally in threepoint field goal percentage and Zach LeDay is eighth in double-doubles and 18th in offensive rebounds per game.

Doubling Our Pleasure

With his 19 point, 10 rebound performance in the win over Lamar, Zach **LeDay** recorded his sixth double-double of the season, in just 10 games ... The last Hokies to record six double-doubles in a single season was Jeff Allen, with 15 double-doubles in the 2010-11 season.

Really Young Again This Season

The Hokies once again this season field one of the youngest teams in the nation ... According to kenpom.com, Tech is 326 out of 351 NCAA Division I teams in experience, at just 1.14 years per player ... Tech is 14th out of 15 ACC teams in experience ... Tech has just one senior and only one player, junior **Devin Wilson**, who was on the squad two years ago ... Wilson missed the first three games of the season with a left groin strain.

New Guys

Ten games into the season, Tech has had 13, 15 points or higher scoring performances ... Of those 13 times, 10 have been by either Zach LeDay or Seth Allen, each who began their Hokie playing careers this season ... Justin Bibbs' 17 points against Northwestern and 17 points in the win over Lamar and Jalen Hudson's 15 points in the win over UAPB are the only three of the 13 not by LeDay or Allen.

Big Night on the Boards

In the Hokies' overtime win over UAB, Chris Clarke grabbed a career-high 16 rebounds en route to his double-double of 10 points and 16 rebounds ... The 16 rebounds are the most by a Hokie since Marshall Wood grabbed 16 rebounds at NC State on Feb. 16, 2013 ... It is also the most rebounds by a Tech freshman since Wood's performance in Raleigh on that day ... It is also the record for rebounds in an Emerald Coast Classic game.

Hamilton Suspended

On Dec. 5, head coach Buzz Williams and Virginia Tech Athletics have suspended junior center **Johnny Hamilton** from game competition for an undisclosed period until his academic performance improves.

Getting There

Entering tonight's game, the Hokies lead the nation in free throw attempts and are third in free throws made ... Tech is averaging 32.4 attempts and 21.1 makes per game ... Last season, the Hokies averaged 16.9 attempts and 10.8 makes per game ... Tech is scoring 26.4 percent of its points from the free throw line this season.

More from the Line

The Hokies were 31-40 from the free throw line in the win over UAPB ... That marks the third time this season the Hokies have shot at least 40 free throws in a game ... The 31 makes is the second highest total of the season, as is the 77.5 percent from the line ... The Hokies did not shoot 40-or-more free throws in any game last season ... The last time the Hokies shot 40-or-more free throws in a game was on Nov. 12, 2012, when Tech was 34-of-42 from the line in a win at UNCG.

A Final Double Note

Zach LeDay and Chris Clarke both recorded double-doubles in the win over UAB ... In doing so, they become the first pair of Hokies to record double-doubles in the same game since C.J. Barksdale (14 points/10 rebounds) and Jarell Eddie (13 points/10 rebounds) pulled the feat against Radford in Cassell Coliseum on Nov. 29, 2013 ... LeDay (19/10) and Kerry Blackshear Jr. (11/10) matched that feat in the win over Lamar.

Greg Donlon played the final 1:41 of the win over NC A&T ... It was the walk-on's first action since March 8. 2014 at Georgia Tech, as he redshirted last season ... In the win over NC A&T. Donlon scored a careerhigh four points, equaling his career total in points ... Donlon received a rousing ovation from the fans in Cassell Coliseum when he entered the contest ... 552 in the Cassell

The Hokies have a 552-185 overall record in Cassell Coliseum, good for a .749 winning percentage ... The win over Florida State in 2011, was the 500th victory in the building ... Tech defeated Rhode Island, 86-63, on in 2002, in its 500th game in the arena ... Tech has had just one break-even home season and two losing seasons in Cassell Coliseum.

That's Low

Against VMI, the Virginia Tech defense allowed the Keydets to shoot just 25.7 percent from the field for the game, including just 20.5 percent (eight of 39) in the second half ... The 25.7 percent allowed is the lowest by a **Buzz Williams**-coached team and the lowest by the Hokies since Dec. 10, 2012, when Tech held Mississippi Valley State to 25.7 percent from the floor.

Head Cooch Buzz Williams



Buzz Williams begins his second season as the head men's basketball coach at Virginia Tech. Williams led the Hokies to an 11-22 overall record in his first season in Blacksburg.

In his inaugural season at Virginia Tech, Williams began building the culture that will allow the Hokies future success. The team went a long ways towards establishing an identity of hard work, accountability both on and off the court and a tough, competitive nature.

Williams came to Virginia Tech following six seasons as the head coach of the Marquette Golden Eagles. At Marquette, Williams had a record of 139-69 and led the team to five NCAA appearances, including a trip to the regional finals in the 2012-13 season, the same season the team won the Big East Conference regular season title. Williams led the Golden Eagles to a 69-39 Big East Conference record during his time in Milwaukee. Six Marquette players have made it to the NBA during Williams' tenure. In his eight seasons as a collegiate head coach, Williams has an overall record of 171-111.

"Buzz Williams' first season at Virginia Tech set a tone for the future," Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock said. "This program achieved on the court, in the classroom and in the community. His focus and tireless work ethic is indelible throughout the program. His expectations and standards are high and we will continue to improve in all areas because of this environment."

Williams was an assistant at Marquette in the 2007-08 season. MU concluded the year 25-10 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2003.

His coaching career has included stints as an assistant, associate head and head coach. He has been at the NCAA Division I level for 19 seasons, and 2013-14 was his seventh campaign as a head coach. Williams has recruited and coached over 20 players who have earned all-conference accolades, including two league players of the year, two conference freshmen of the year and four Associated Press All-Americans.

Williams arrived in Milwaukee after serving for one season as the head coach at the University of New Orleans. He guided the Privateers to a 14-win campaign in 2006-07 and his roster featured Bo McCalebb, the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year. UNO claimed fourth place in the Sun Belt's Western Division and advanced to the league tournament quarterfinals. The squad claimed as many victories on the road that season as it had in the previous three seasons combined. His recruiting class for the 2007-08 season was ranked in the top-50 nationally by HoopScoopOnline.com.

Prior to UNO, Williams served as an as-

sistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Texas A&M for two seasons (2004-05 and 2005-06) under head coach Billy Gillispie. Both of his recruiting classes with the Aggies were ranked among the best in the nation and featured some of the top-ranked talent at the prep level. The squad made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 25 years in 2005-06 and the previous team posted the top turnaround in the nation, improving its win total in 2004-05 by 14 games compared to 2003-04.

Williams spent four seasons (2000-01 through 2003-04) at Colorado State, serving as an assistant the first three seasons before being promoted to associate head coach in 2003-04. Two of his recruiting classes were ranked among the 40-best in the nation, including the 2003 group, which was tabbed No. 1 in the Mountain West Conference. Colorado State made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 13 years during his tenure and he was named one of the top assistants in the country by HoopScoopOnline.com.

The Van Alstyne, Texas, native was previously an assistant at Northwestern State (1999-2000), Texas A&M- Kingsville (1998-99) and Texas-Arlington (1994-98). He earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Oklahoma City University in 1994 before completing his master's work in the same field at Texas A&M-Kingsville in 1999.

Williams is married to the former Corey Norman and the couple has two daughters, Zera and Addyson, and two sons, Calvin and Mason.

Tech are also not recognized names and should not be used ... VT is acceptable as a shortened, agate form ... When referring to the school by its nickname, please use "Hokies" ... Your help in these matters is appreciated.
