The Hokies lost to No. 19/17 West Virginia, 88-63, in Cassell Coliseum on Wednesday afternoon ... Shane Henry scored a career-high 12 points to lead the Hokies ... Zach LeDay added 11 points and nine rebounds and Seth Allen scored 10 points fir Tech in the loss.

Series Against The Wolfpack

This is the 54th all-time meeting between the two schools, in a series that dates back to 1915 ... NC State leads the all-time series, 39-14 ... NCSU has won the last five meetings, most recently a 69-53 win in Raleigh last season ... Tech is 7-12 in home games in the series and 3-5 in games played in Cassell Coliseum ... This series has been played not only in Blacksburg and Raleigh, but also in Richmond, Lynchburg, Durham, Charlotte and Greensboro, and also Tampa, Florida.

Clarke Out

Freshman forward Chris Clarke suffered a fracture to the fifth metatarsal in his right foot and had successful surgery on Dec. 29 ... The injury occurred working out during the Christmas break ...

Justin Bibbs leads Division I and the ACC in three-point field goal percentage, at 60.0 percent ... He has made 33 of his 55 attempts this season and now shoots 47.6 percent from three for his career.

With his 11 points against West Virginia, **Zach LeDay** has now scored in double-figures in 11 of the Hokies' 13 games this season.

Doubling Our Pleasure

With his 10 point, 11 rebound performance against St. Joseph's, **Zach LeDay** recorded his seventh doubledouble of the season, in just 13 games ... The last Hokies to record seven double-doubles in a single season was Jeff Allen, with 15 double-doubles in the 2010-11 season.

Tough, Busy Week

While most of America looks at this time of year for some rest and time off, the Hokies take a totally 180 degree look at this week ... Beginning on this past Wednesday, the Hokies play three games in the six days, two against nationally-ranked teams and all three at Cassell Coliseum ... Then, after a few days off, the Hokies play their first ACC road game of the season at defending national champion and nationally-ranked, Duke.

Really Young Again This Season

The Hokies once again this season field one of the youngest teams in the nation ... According to kenpom.com, Tech is 319 out of 351 NCAA Division I teams in experience, at just 1.18 years per player ... Tech is 14th out of 15 ACC teams in experience ... Players new to the Virginia Tech program this season account for 60.6 percent of minutes played for the Hokies, second-highest among ACC teams ... Only Boston College at 65.5 percent is higher.

A Lot of Doubles

With **Zach LeDay's** double-double against St. Joseph's, the Hokies now have 12 double-doubles for the season, tied for the lead among ACC teams ... This is the most double-doubles for the Hokies in a single season since the 2010-11 season, when the Hokies recorded 18 double-doubles.

Bibbs' Big Night

In the Hokies' win over Grambling State, sophomore wing Justin Bibbs posted his top career game ... Playing just 29 minutes, Bibbs came off the bench to score a career-high 31 points, 21 points coming off of a sevenfor-10 performance from beyond the arc, also a career-high for him ... The seven threepointers ties a school record for threes in a game, co-held by Malcolm Delaney, Zabian Dowdell and Wally Lancaster, who was one of the first great three-point shooters in NCAA history ... The 31 points in the most by a Hokie this season and the most by a Virginia Tech player since **Jalen Hudson** scored 32 points in the win over Wake Forest in last season's ACC Tournament.

KB Jr. Earns ACC Rookie Honor

Kerry Blackshear Jr., was named the ACC

Rookie of the Week for the week ending Dec. 13, 2015 ... Blackshear put together his two best games of the season last week, with a career-high 13 points and eight rebounds at Radford and his first career doubledouble with 11 points and 10 rebounds against Lamar.

Swat!

In the loss to St. Joseph's, **Zach LeDay** recorded a career-high four blocked shots ... That is the most by a Hokie this season and the most by a Hokie since Joey van Zegeren blocked six shots against Morgan State on Nov. 30, 2014.

Freshmen Doubles

Kerry Blackshear Jr. and Chris Clarke have each recorded double-doubles far this season ... This is the first time since the 2007-08 season that two Hokies have recorded double-doubles in their freshman seasons ... Jeff Allen and JT Thompson accomplished the feat that season.

Big at the Break

The Hokies scored 51 points in the first half of the win over Lamar ... Tech topped that in the win over Grambling State, as they scored 52 second half points in the victory ... That is the most points the Hokies have scored in a half since scoring 52 points in the second half at Wake Forest on March 10, 2013.

Dishing It Out

Seth Allen recorded a career high (at Virginia Tech) seven assists in the win over Lamar ... That's the most assists by a Virginia Tech player this season and the most by a Tech player since **Devin Wilson** had 11 assists against Duke last

season ... **Justin Robinson** matched that mark in the win over Grambling State with a career-high seven assists.

It Is Better to Give, A Lot

In the loss to Northwestern, **Devin Wilson** recorded five assists and just one turnover, cracking the 300 career assists total ... Following the West Virginia game, he has 321 career assists, good for 4.3 assists per game ... Now in his junior season, Wilson

entered the top 10 in assists in school history at 10th place in the win over Grambling State, when he dished out four assists ... His 321 career assists is sixth among active ACC players.

Ending the Road Blues

When the Hokies defeated Radford, 74-65, at the Dedmon Center on Dec. 9, it marked the first win for Tech on an opponent's home court in more than two calendar years ... The last true road win for Tech was on Dec. 8, 2013, when the Hokies defeated Miami, 61-60, in the BankUnited Center to open ACC play in the 2013-14 season.

A Freshman Double Feat

Chris Clarke recorded his second consecutive double-double with 11 points and 13 rebounds in the Northwestern game ... It's the first time a Virginia Tech freshman recorded consecutive double-doubles since Jeff Allen in the 2007-08 season ... Allen had 11 points and 12 rebounds in the regular season finale at Clemson and 10 points and 10 rebounds in the first round of the ACC Tournament against Miami ... Kerry Blackshear Jr., also equaled that mark with double-doubles against Lamar and Grambling State.

Bibbs' Summer

USA Basketball named the 2015 USA Basketball Men's and Women's U19 World Championship Teams as co-recipients of the 2015 USA Basketball Team of the Year Award ... Virginia Tech's **Justin Bibbs** was a member of the men's gold medal winning team.

Gimme That!

In the Hokies' win over Arkansas-Pine Bluff, **Jalen Hudson** earned the start and then posted a careerhigh five steals in the contest ... That is the most steals in a game by a Hokie since Erick Green had five steals in a win over Mount St.

Mary's in Cassell Coliseum on Jan. 2, 2011 ... Hudson also led the Hokies in scoring with 15 points against the Golden Lions.

Good Point on Low Points

The Hokies held UAPB to just 45 points in the win ... That is the lowest point total by a Tech opponent since Feb. 15, 2014, when the Hokies held defending ACC Champion Miami to just 45 points in a 52-45 Virginia Tech victory.

20-Plus for Allen

Seth Allen scored 25 points in the Northwestern game ... That marks the first time a Hokie has scored 20-or-more points in consecutive games since Adam Smith had 26 points against Miami of Ohio and 22 points against Morgan State last season ... Allen had 23 points in the win over UAB on Nov. 28.

Buzz Williams Info

Buzz Williams begins his second season as the head coach of the Hokies ... Now in his ninth season as a collegiate head coach, Williams has an overall record of 172-113 ... A complete bio is available on page 5 of these notes.

Individually, **Justin Bibbs** leads the nation in three-point field goal percentage and **Zach LeDay** is 12th in double-doubles and offensive rebounds per game ... LeDay is 28th in total rebounds and 36th in rebounds per game.

New Name, Same Place

The Hokies are playing this season in the same arena, Cassell Coliseum, but the playing surface has a new name ... The floor is now known as Virginia Tech Carilion Court at Cassell Coliseum ... 553 in the Cassell

The Hokies have a 553-186 overall record in Cassell Coliseum, good for a .748 winning percentage ... The win over Florida State in 2011, was the 500th victory in the building ... Tech has had just one break-even home season and two losing seasons in Cassell Coliseum.

Three So Far

With Kerry Blackshear Jr.'s, doubledoubles in the wins over Lamar and Grambling, the Hokies now have three players to record double-doubles this season ... It marks the first time since the 2013-14 season that three different Hokies had doubledoubles in a single season.

Big Day on the Boards

The Hokies had 54 rebounds in the win over Jacksonville State ... That is the most rebounds in a game for Tech since Dec. 9, 2009, when the Hokies grabbed 59 rebounds against VMI ... The rebounding differential of +25 is the most for the Hokies since they outrebounded Longwood, 52-27, on Dec. 14, 2008, in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech has grabbed at least 40 rebounds in eight of the 10 games this season.

Head Cooch Buzz Williams



Buzz Williams begins his second season as the head men's basketball coach at Virginia Tech. Williams led the Hokies to an 11-22 overall record in his first season in Blacksburg.

In his inaugural season at Virginia Tech, Williams began building the culture that will allow the Hokies future success. The team went a long ways towards establishing an identity of hard work, accountability both on and off the court and a tough, competitive nature.

Williams came to Virginia Tech following six seasons as the head coach of the Marquette Golden Eagles. At Marquette, Williams had a record of 139-69 and led the team to five NCAA appearances, including a trip to the regional finals in the 2012-13 season, the same season the team won the Big East Conference regular season title. Williams led the Golden Eagles to a 69-39 Big East Conference record during his time in Milwaukee. Six Marquette players have made it to the NBA during Williams' tenure. In his eight seasons as a collegiate head coach, Williams has an overall record of 172-113.

"Buzz Williams' first season at Virginia Tech set a tone for the future," Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock said. "This program achieved on the court, in the classroom and in the community. His focus and tireless work ethic is indelible throughout the program. His expectations and standards are high and we will continue to improve in all areas because of this environment."

Williams was an assistant at Marquette in the 2007-08 season. MU concluded the year 25-10 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2003.

His coaching career has included stints as an assistant, associate head and head coach. He has been at the NCAA Division I level for 19 seasons, and 2013-14 was his seventh campaign as a head coach. Williams has recruited and coached over 20 players who have earned all-conference accolades, including two league players of the year, two conference freshmen of the year and four Associated Press All-Americans.

Williams arrived in Milwaukee after serving for one season as the head coach at the University of New Orleans. He guided the Privateers to a 14-win campaign in 2006-07 and his roster featured Bo McCalebb, the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year. UNO claimed fourth place in the Sun Belt's Western Division and advanced to the league tournament quarterfinals. The squad claimed as many victories on the road that season as it had in the previous three seasons combined. His recruiting class for the 2007-08 season was ranked in the top-50 nationally by HoopScoopOnline.com.

Prior to UNO, Williams served as an as-

sistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Texas A&M for two seasons (2004-05 and 2005-06) under head coach Billy Gillispie. Both of his recruiting classes with the Aggies were ranked among the best in the nation and featured some of the top-ranked talent at the prep level. The squad made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 25 years in 2005-06 and the previous team posted the top turnaround in the nation, improving its win total in 2004-05 by 14 games compared to 2003-04.

Williams spent four seasons (2000-01 through 2003-04) at Colorado State, serving as an assistant the first three seasons before being promoted to associate head coach in 2003-04. Two of his recruiting classes were ranked among the 40-best in the nation, including the 2003 group, which was tabbed No. 1 in the Mountain West Conference. Colorado State made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 13 years during his tenure and he was named one of the top assistants in the country by HoopScoopOnline.com.

The Van Alstyne, Texas, native was previously an assistant at Northwestern State (1999-2000), Texas A&M- Kingsville (1998-99) and Texas-Arlington (1994-98). He earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Oklahoma City University in 1994 before completing his master's work in the same field at Texas A&M-Kingsville in 1999.

Williams is married to the former Corey Norman and the couple has two daughters, Zera and Addyson, and two sons, Calvin and Mason.

Against VMI, the Virginia Tech defense allowed the Keydets to shoot just 25.7 percent from the field for the game, including just 20.5 percent (eight of 39) in the second half ... The 25.7 percent allowed is the lowest by a **Buzz Williams**-coached team and the lowest by the Hokies since Dec. 10, 2012, when Tech held Mississippi Valley State to 25.7 percent from the floor.

Now Boarding

In the Hokies' overtime win over UAB, **Chris Clarke** grabbed a career-high 16 rebounds en route to his double-double of 10 points and 16 rebounds ... The 16 rebounds are the most by a Hokie since Marshall Wood grabbed 16 rebounds at NC State on Feb. 16, 2013 ... It is also the most rebounds by a Tech freshman since Wood's performance in Raleigh on that day ... It is also the record for rebounds in an Emerald Coast Classic game.

A Final Double Note

Zach LeDay and Chris Clarke both recorded double-doubles in the win over UAB ... In doing so, they become the first pair of Hokies to record double-doubles in the same game since C.J. Barksdale (14 points/10 rebounds) and Jarell Eddie (13 points/10 rebounds) pulled the feat against Radford in Cassell Coliseum on Nov. 29, 2013 ... LeDay (19/10) and Kerry Blackshear Jr. (11/10) matched that feat in the win over Lamar.

New Guys

Thirteen games into the season, Tech has had 15, 15 points or higher scoring performances ... Of those 15 times, 11 have been by either **Zach LeDay** or **Seth Allen**, each who began their Hokie playing careers this season ... **Justin Bibbs**' 17 points against both Northwestern and Lamar and his 31 points against Grambling State and **Jalen Hudson's** 15 points in the win over UAPB are the only three of the 13 not by LeDay or Allen.

Hokies in Overtime

With the overtime loss to Northwestern, the Hokies are now 62-48 all-time in overtime games ... Tech is 1-1 this season and was 1-1 in overtime games last season ... 
